## LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL.

I HEREBY notify that the subjoined Petition was addressed and presented to me on the 13th day of October 1886.

To the Honorable Sir James MacBain, Knight, President of the Legislative Council of Victoria.

The humble Petition of Thomas Drummond Wanliss, of Ballarat, in the Colony of Victoria, gentleman,

### RESPECTFULLY SHEWETH :

That on the ninth day of September last past, an election was held for one Member to serve in the Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria to represent the Electoral Province of Wellington.

That your Petitioner was a candidate at the said election.

That Henry Gore, Esquire, was the only other candidate at the said election.

That, as the result of the said election, the Returning Officer announced that the said Henry Gore, Esquire, had received 2,512 votes, and your Petitioner 2,511 votes, and thereupon the said Returning Officer publicly declared that Henry Gore, Esquire, had received the majority of votes, and was duly elected as Member as aforesaid, and such Returning Officer made his return accordingly.

That, on the taking of the poll for the said election, divers votes for the said Henry Gore were improperly admitted and counted thereat, and divers votes for your Petitioner were improperly rejected, set aside, and not counted at all.

That, in the taking of the said poll for the said election, divers ballot-papers which were polled on behalf of your Petitioner were wrongfully declared informal, and were not counted in the computation of votes polled on behalf of your Petitioner, whereby the actual vote polled on behalf of your Petitioner was under estimated, and so many votes omitted from the count in his behalf as would, if the count were now fairly made, result in giving the return for the said Electoral Province of Wellington to your Petitioner, setting aside the colorable majority on which the said Henry Gore has been wrongfully declared one of the Members elect for the said Electoral Province.

That divers votes were given at the said election by persons not of age, and therefore not entitled to vote in the said Electoral Province of Wellington at the time indicated, whereby the said Henry Gore obtained an apparent and colorable majority only, whereas in truth and in fact your Petitioner had a majority of the votes of the electors truly voted in the said Electoral Province of Wellington, at the said election, over the said Henry Gore, and was duly elected as a Member to serve in Parliament for the said Province, and ought to have been returned as such Member.

That, at the said election, divers electors were personated and votes colorably given at the poll for the said Henry Gore, some of the persons falsely represented as being present and voting being absent, and others dead; and that such votes should, for such reasons, be declared null and void, and struck from the said poll for the said Electoral District.

That divers votes, which your Petitioner is informed and believes were properly tendered and voted on behalf of your Petitioner in divers of the polling booths in the said election for the said Electoral Province of Wellington, were afterwards voted a second time for the said Henry Gore during the said election in other polling booths, in the same or other divisions of the said Electoral Province, and were wrongfully counted, to the detriment of your Petitioner.

That divers votes, which were duly tendered and voted on behalf of the said Henry Gore in divers of the polling booths for the said election for the said Province, were afterwards tendered and voted a second time on behalf of the said Henry Gore during the said election in other polling booths, in the same or other divisions of the said Electoral Province, and were wrongfully counted, to the detriment of your Petitioner.

That many persons who were registered as electors of the said Province in respect of freehold qualifications or as lessees or occupiers of lands or tenements in the said Province, or as the holders of certain electoral rights, and who voted at the said election for the said Province, became disqualified as electors for the said Province before and at the time of the holding of the said election for the said Province by reason of the non-retention by them of a sufficient qualification.

That the votes of such persons, as in the last paragraph mentioned, were improperly admitted at the said election for the said Province.

That divers votes were given at the said election by persons who neither at the time of the said election and voting, nor at all, were possessed of a sufficient qualification, and who therefore were not entitled to vote in the said Electoral Province of Wellington at the time indicated, whereby the said Henry Gore obtained an apparent and colorable majority only, whereas in truth and in fact your Petitioner had a majority of the votes of the electors truly voted in the said Electoral Province of Wellington at the said election over the said Henry Gore, and was duly elected as a Member to serve in Parliament for the said Province, and ought to have been returned as such Member.

That the votes of such persons who so voted as in the last paragraph mentioned were improperly admitted at the said election for the said Province.

That, if the votes of all those persons so disqualified and unqualified as in the last four paragraphs mentioned, but who, nevertheless, voted at the said election for the said Province, were struck off the roll, it would be found that your Petitioner had obtained a greater number of votes at the said election than the said Henry Gore.

That errors in computation were made in divers polling booths, whereby votes properly tendered and duly received on behalf of your Petitioner were not properly counted, whereby the said Henry Gore was made to appear to have received a larger number of votes than your Petitioner, for whom in reality the larger number of votes was polled.

Your Petitioner therefore respectfully prays—

That you will communicate the matter of this Petition to the Legislative Council, in order that the same be referred to the Committee of Elections and Qualifications.

That all and every the ballot-papers used, not used, and set aside at the taking of the poll at such election for Ballarat West may be again respectively examined and tallied with the poll-books used thereat, and that the votes in such ballot-papers be again counted, and that those improperly admitted in such taking of the poll be now rejected and struck out, and that those erroneously rejected or set aside at such taking of the poll be now admitted and counted as good votes, and that the votes given colorably for the electors who were personated, or by voters who voted twice at the said election, or by voters who did not retain a sufficient qualification, or by voters who, neither at the time of the said election and voting, nor at all, were possessed of a sufficient qualification, or were otherwise wrongfully given, be struck out.

That the said Committee may determine and report to the said Legislative Council that the said Henry Gore was not duly elected, and ought not to have been returned, at the said election; and that your Petitioner may be declared to have been duly elected at such election, and to be the person that ought to have been returned; and that the said return to said writ may be amended accordingly.

That your Petitioner may have such further or other relief as the circumstances of the case may require, or as to the said Committee may seem meet.

And your Petitioner will ever pray, &c., &c.

THE following amended rules and regulations regarding the management of the Government Remount and Landing Depot, Garden Reach, Calcutta, are published for general information in supersession of the rules previously circulated:—

## NOTIFICATION.

With a view to assist shippers of horses, and to save the risk and expense in landing and stabling horses imported to Calcutta, it is notified, for general information, that the Government of India have authorized arrangements being made at the Government Remount Landing Depot, 13 Garden Reach, for the reception of horses arriving from Australia under the terms laid down in the following revised rules and regulations.

In such cases as may appear necessary, the Government of India are also prepared to advance the amount of freight required to clear the consignment of horses from the ships, together with captains' and other fees connected with the voyage; such advances to be recovered from the shippers on payment by the Remount Agent of the value of the horses purchased by him:—

## Rules and Regulations.

1. Every shipper landing any horse or horses at the Government Remount and Landing Depot, Garden Reach, Calcutta, shall be subject to the rules hereinafter detailed, and to any such directions as the Remount Agent, Calcutta, may give regarding the horses stabled in Government stables, and every shipper shall sign an agreement on landing to this effect. He is also to agree that he will not remove any horse or horses without the special leave of the Remount Agent, and that he will immediately remove any horse or horses on being requested to do so by the Remount Agent.

2. No horse which has been once removed from the said depot or the said stables shall be re-admitted without the special sanction of the Remount Agent, and until after examination by the Government Veterinary Surgeon.

3. The depot shall be open for the reception of horses from the 15th of September to the end of the purchasing season, and only to horses arriving direct from the country in which they were bred. Horses arriving between the 1st March and the 14th September will be allowed to land, but will not be admitted to the stables or permitted to make any further use of the depot, and they must be removed at once; such horses will not be entitled to be submitted for purchase by Government until all the horses which are at the time stabled in the depot shall have been submitted for the approval of the Remount Agent.

4. The landing charge for every horse imported by shippers for private sale, and not intended to be submitted to the Remount Agent with a view to purchase on behalf of Government, will be Rs. 3; and in the event of such horse or horses not being removed within 24 hours from the time of landing, a charge of Rs. 2 for every week, or part of a week, during which such horse may remain at the Government stables.

5. The actual cost of landing the horses and surplus forage remaining at the end of the voyage will be borne by the shipper. The work will be carried out in the most economical way possible, the shipper and his assistants performing their due share of the work.

6. The shippers may, if they wish it, feed their horses on the remainder of the forage put on board their ships for the voyage. Grain, bedding, and fodder will be supplied as required, under instructions from the Remount Agent, to be paid for by the shipper at the price current rate furnished by the Collector of the 24-Pergunnahs.

7. The shippers will be charged as follows:—

I.—Stables and such native establishment as may be required at the rate of 2 annas 6 pies for each horse per day.

II.—All medicines, disinfecting powder, oil, wicks, and lanterns for night purposes, brooms and baskets, at 6 annas each horse.

III.—All costs incurred on account of rasping and clearing out hoofs, also clipping horses before inspection by the Remount Agent.

IV.—Cost of removing litter at the rate of 1 anna for each horse per week.

8. Veterinary attendance will be given by the veterinary surgeon free.

9. All horses intended for Government, whether landed at the Government landing depot or not, will be inspected with a view to purchase as soon as the Remount Agent considers them in fit condition for such inspection.

10. The Remount Agent can, if he considers it necessary, refuse to receive into the depot any horse or horses without assigning any reason for such refusal.

11. All charges, of every kind whatsoever, against the shipper will be recovered from him on payment being made for the remounts selected for Government by the Remount Agent.

On and after this date the temporary light at Sea Hill will be replaced by a fixed Dioptric Light of the 5th order, showing the following sectors of red and white light, viz. :—

White from S.S.W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  W. to S.  $\frac{1}{2}$  E.  
Red from S.  $\frac{1}{2}$  E. to S.E.  $\frac{1}{4}$  E.  
White from S.E.  $\frac{1}{4}$  E. to N.E.  $\frac{3}{4}$  E.  
Red from N.E.  $\frac{3}{4}$  E. to N.W. by N.  $\frac{1}{2}$  N.

The red sector visible between a S.  $\frac{1}{2}$  E. and S.E.  $\frac{1}{4}$  E. bearing gives, on its north-eastern edge, a line for clearing the Central Banks, and on its south-western edge, for hauling up for the anchorage under Sea Hill.

The red sector visible between a N.E.  $\frac{3}{4}$  E. and N.W. by N.  $\frac{1}{2}$  N. bearing gives, on its north-western edge, a mark for clearing the 34 fathoms line off the shoal extending from Division Point, and on its eastern edge leads up the entrance to the Narrows, vessels being clear of the west shore of Curtis Island while the red light is in sight.

The obscured sector between a S.E.  $\frac{1}{4}$  S. and S.E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  E. bearing is now done away with.

The tower from which the light is exhibited is 19 feet high, and the light, which is at an elevation of 90 feet above high water, is visible in the white sectors from a distance of 15 miles.

WHEREAS by The Local Government Act 1874 (38 Vict. No. 506) it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might, from time to time, make Orders, amongst other things, to subdivide or re-subdivide any municipal district into any number of subdivisions not exceeding eight; and every such Order should be published in the *Government Gazette*, and should take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas a petition purporting to be signed by more than one-fourth of the persons whose names are for the time being inscribed on the municipal roll of the Shire of Mornington has been presented to the Governor in Council, the substance and prayer of which petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the forty-sixth section of the said Act, and no counter petition has been received: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order abolish all previous subdivisions of the Shire of Mornington, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned doth hereby re-subdivide the said Shire of Mornington into three separate Ridings, the names and boundaries of which shall be as follow, that is to say :—

## NORTH RIDING.

Commencing at a point on the shore of Port Phillip Bay opposite the centre of a road forming the north boundary of allotment 90, parish of Lyndhurst; thence to and easterly by that road being the north boundaries of allotments 90, 89, 93, and 94 of said parish to the north-east angle of last-named allotment; thence south by the east boundaries of allotments 94, 85, and 84 to the south-west angle of the Banyan Water Holes pre-emptive section; thence east by the south boundary of that section to its south-east angle; thence south by a line being the west boundary of allotment 84 to the south-west angle thereof; thence east by

the south boundary of said allotment to the north-east angle of the parish of Frankston; thence southerly by the eastern boundary of that parish to the north-east angle of allotment 28a; thence easterly and south-easterly by the road forming the northern boundaries of allotments 6, 5, 4, and 3, parish of Tyabb, to the south-east angle of the allotment last named; thence south by the east boundary of allotments 12 and 13 to the south-east angle of the last-named allotment; thence westerly by the south boundary of allotments 13, 11, 10, 9, and 8 to the south-east angle of the parish of Frankston; thence west and north-west by the southern boundary of same parish to the shore of Port Phillip Bay; and thence northerly by the shore of said bay to the commencing point.

#### MARYBOROUGH WATERWORKS TRUST.— REGULATION.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulation, made by the Maryborough Waterworks Trust in pursuance of the provisions of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1881* (No. 716, sec. 44).

THE Commissioners of the Maryborough Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 44 of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1881*, do make the following Regulation:—

##### No. 1.

*Regulation for making a rate on all the rateable property in the Maryborough Waterworks District.*

1st. A rate of One shilling in the pound sterling, except as hereinafter mentioned, on the annual value of all the rateable property in the Maryborough Waterworks District, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements comprised within the said waterworks district for the municipal rates of the borough of Maryborough, is hereby made for the year commencing on the first day of January 1886 and ending on the thirty-first day of December 1886; provided that in pursuance of an Order of His Excellency the Governor in Council, dated the eighteenth day of May 1886, and made by virtue of the powers by section 95 of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1883*, the

sum of One pound ten shillings sterling shall be the minimum amount of rates to be paid annually by every owner of any house or tenement liable to be rated by the Maryborough Waterworks Trust when the valuation in respect to such house or tenement shall not exceed the sum of Thirty pounds sterling per annum.

2nd. Such rate to be paid in two equal instalments, the first of which instalments shall be due and payable on the first day of July 1886, and the second instalment shall be due and payable on the first day of January 1887.

3rd. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and collect the said rate.

4th. The foregoing Regulation No. 1 was made by the Commissioners of the Maryborough Waterworks Trust, under and by virtue of sub-section 4 of section 44 of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1881*, on the 31st day of May 1886, and confirmed on the 14th day of July 1886.

WHEREAS by The Mining Statute 1865 it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to make regulations, not being contrary to the provisions of the said Act, for the purposes mentioned in the forty-third section thereof, and such regulations from time to time to alter, add to, or rescind: Now therefore

His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present order make the following addition to clause 20 of the Regulations relating to licenses to cut, construct, and use races, drains, dams, and reservoirs, that is to say:—

Provided always that the Governor in Council may at any time during the term for which a license is granted, upon sufficient cause being shown, waive and dispense with the payment of the full rent reserved in such license for and during such period as there may, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, not be sufficient water to supply the quantity mentioned in the license. Provided further that the reduction in the rent of such license shall be proportional to the actual quantity of water available for the supply of the race, but shall not in any case exceed one-half of the annual rent reserved in such license.

And the Governor, with the advice aforesaid, doth hereby order that the above provisions shall extend to all water-right licenses now in force.

And the Honorable Duncan Gillies, Her Majesty's Minister of Mines for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

# STRATHFIELDSAYE CRICKET AND RECREATION RESERVE.—REGULATIONS.

WE, Matthew Rundell, Thomas Somerville, Charles Brennan, Albert Bruhn, and Thomas Holmes, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Cricket and Recreation Reserve at Strathfieldsaye, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 133 of *The Land Act 1884* :—

## REGULATIONS:

(1.) The reserve shall be parcelled out into the following divisions :—

- 1st. The pavilion, grand stand, members and ladies reserves.
- 2nd. The playing ground.
- 3rd. The remainder of the reserve.

(2.) All persons shall be admitted to the third division, free of charge, from sunrise to sunset, except on days whereon important cricket and football matches shall be played, and on days on which sports shall be held in the reserve.

(3.) No person shall enter at any time into any part of the first division except on production of a ticket issued by the Committee of Management duly authorizing such person in that behalf.

(4.) All persons paying for admission to the third division, or any part thereof, shall be supplied with a ticket of admission which they shall upon demand produce, and if required, surrender to any gatekeeper or other person having authority from the Committee of Management to demand the production or surrender of the same.

(5.) Persons renting or hiring for any cricket match or other event any booth or other erection in the reserve shall abide by any order given by the Committee of Management in reference thereto, or to the buildings or other erections for the time being thereon.

(6.) No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

(7.) No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

(8.) No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on or damage the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.

(9.) No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, sheep, goats, or pigs, or bring any dog therein unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

(10.) No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

(11.) Any person committing in the reserve, or in any of the buildings or erections for the time being thereon, any of the following offences shall be liable to be removed from the reserve, notwithstanding such person may have purchased and shall or may be in possession of a ticket of admission thereto or to any part thereof:—

- (1.) Assaulting any other person.
- (2.) Being drunk.
- (3.) Crossing or trespassing upon the playing ground during a cricket match or sports, or during practice at cricket, or when crossing or trespassing upon the ground would be injurious to it as a cricket ground.
- (4.) Using profane, indecent, or obscene language.
- (5.) Using any threatening, abusive, or insulting words.
- (6.) Behaving improperly or riotously.
- (7.) Being found in any part of the first, second, and third divisions and not producing upon demand, or not surrendering, if required, to any gatekeeper or other person having authority from the Committee of Management to demand production of the same, a ticket duly authorizing admission to that part wherein such person shall be found.
- (8.) Obtaining admission to any part of the first, second, or third divisions when disentitled to such admission under these regulations.

12. The following shall be the scale of fees which may be charged and taken for admission to the third division and to the grand stand on such days as the Committee of Management may appoint, viz.:—

For admission of each person to the third division during any cricket or football match such a sum as the Committee of Management may determine not exceeding One shilling.  
For admission of each person to the grand stand such a sum as the Committee of Management may determine not exceeding Two shillings.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 133 of *The Land Act 1884*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding (£5) Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding (£10) Ten pounds.

#### WOOLSTHORPE PUBLIC RECREATION RESERVE.—REGULATIONS.

WE, William Lindsay, jun., William Mackie, Thomas Oliver, James Davidson, John Latta, and William Harris, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Public Recreation in the town of Woolsthorpe, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works for approval:—

##### REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.
5. No person shall put into the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority of the Committee of Management first obtained.
7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person, except laborers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 133 of *The Land Act 1884*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such Regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

And whereas the Council of the Borough of Rutherglen, which is the municipal council in and for the municipality of the said borough, so thinks fit: Be it and it is by the said municipal council hereby ordered and directed that every shopkeeper keeping a shop of any of the classes named in the schedule to this Bye-law within the Borough of Rutherglen, and which are not in the classes named in the Third Schedule to "The Factories and Shops Act 1885," upon receiving license so to do from the Town Clerk of the said borough, which license the said Town Clerk is hereby empowered by the said municipal council, the council of the Borough of Rutherglen, to issue on its behalf upon application made for the same, may keep open his or her said shop after the hours in the said Act mentioned, and not later than the hour of Nine o'clock post meridian on every week day evening except that of Saturday, and on Saturday not later than half-past Ten o'clock.

## SHIRE OF BENALLA.

BYE-LAW UNDER "THE PUBLIC HEALTH AMENDMENT STATUTE 1883, No. 3."

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by "The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883," and of every other power enabling them in that behalf, the Local Board of Health for the Shire of Benalla, in the colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within its jurisdiction doth hereby make the bye-law following, that is to say:—

1. *Interpretation of terms.*—In the construction and for the purposes of this bye-law the following terms shall, if not inconsistent with the context or subject-matter, have the respective meanings hereby assigned to them, viz.:—

"House" shall mean and include dwellings of any kind, schools, hotels, licensed public-houses, factories, work-rooms, common or other lodging-houses, or other buildings or premises.

"Cesspool" shall mean any receptacle for night-soil, or for noxious or offensive matter below or above the ground.

"Street" shall mean and include any highway, and any public bridge, and any road, lane, footway, square, court, alley, or passage, whether a thoroughfare or not.

2. *Premises to be kept so as not to be a nuisance.*—Every occupier or person having the management or control of any house or premises shall cause the same to be kept in such a state as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

3. *Removal of refuse from houses.*—Every occupier of a house or premises shall remove therefrom all dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, or such other refuse-matter produced or accumulated thereon once every week, and in case of the default of such occupier the Local Board of Health may remove the same.

4. *Receptacles for house-refuse.*—Every occupier of a house or premises shall provide and keep thereon a box, or some other covered receptacle, for the temporary deposit of house-refuse, which box or receptacle shall be of such dimensions as that the same may, with contents thereof, when full, be readily and conveniently movable by one man; or so many such boxes or receptacles as may be necessary to contain all the house-refuse produced or accumulated on such premises during one week, and shall cause all house-refuse to be deposited as soon as conveniently may be in some such box or receptacle.

5. *Removal of refuse from places where animals are kept.*—Every occupier of land on which is erected any stable, shed, sty, yard, or other place for the keeping of animals, shall from time to time remove from such premises all dung, soil, or other manure produced or accumulated thereon once at least every week, and in case of the default of such occupier the Local Board may remove the same.

6. *Power to use refuse as manure.*—Nothing contained in the foregoing sections shall be taken to prevent the occupier of any premises from causing any dung, soil, or other refuse matter produced or accumulated on any premises to be at any time removed or to be used as manure on any garden or land, or to be kept for the purpose of being used on any garden or land, contiguous to such premises as manure so that the same be not so removed, kept, or used as to contravene any bye-law of the Local Board of Health, or as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

7. *Removal of refuse from places where noxious or offensive trades are carried on.*—Every occupier and every person having the management or control of premises used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, or manufactory whatsoever shall cause all rubbish, filth, offal, soil, or other offensive matters, and all waste products of such manufacture from which effluvia may arise to be removed from such premises once at least in

every twenty-four hours, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and so that no noxious or offensive effluvia arise therefrom; and if any such occupier or person shall neglect or fail to have removed any such offensive matter or waste products as aforesaid, the same may be removed by the Local Board of Health.

8. *Removal of blood from places where animals are slaughtered.*—Every occupier, licensee, or person having the management or control of any abattoir, slaughter-house, or place where any cattle or other animals are killed, shall cause all the blood from the animals killed therein, as soon as conveniently may be, to be collected in a fit receptacle to be provided for that purpose, and to be effectually deodorized by mixing therewith commercial sulphate of iron or chloride of lime in the proportion of one pound to the gallon, or some other efficient deodorizer, sufficient to effectually deodorize the same, and to be removed from the premises within twenty-four hours after such blood is shed.

9. *Removal of offal.*—Every occupier of any premises on which may be any offal shall forthwith effectually deodorize the same, and remove the same from the premises within twenty-four hours.

10. *Construction of privies.*—No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any privy except in the form of an earth-closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor whereof is at no point less than three inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and every such building shall be constructed with proper openings or flues to provide sufficient means of ventilation, and shall be provided with a suitable pan or other movable receptacle for night-soil, the contents whereof does not exceed four cubic feet, and with the requisite apparatus for the application of dry earth or some other deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan or receptacle and the contents thereof, and emptying and cleansing the same. Every privy attached to any school, hotel, licensed public-house, factory, work-room, or common lodging-house, and every public privy, shall be flagged or paved with some non-absorbent material, having a fall or inclination towards the door or other opening of at least half-an-inch to the foot.

11. *Supply of deodorizing material to earth-closets.*—Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall cause to be kept in every earth-closet belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in any pan or other receptacle in such earth-closet to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan or other receptacle.

12. *Emptying receptacles for night-soil.*—Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises, once at least in every week, shall empty or cleanse, or cause to be emptied or cleansed, every earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil on or belonging to such premises.

13. *Removal of night-soil to be by properly constructed conveyances.*—No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying, any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, except by means of a cart, carriage, or means of conveyance properly constructed, and furnished with a sufficient covering so as to prevent the escape of the contents or of any portion thereof, or of effluvia therefrom.

14. *Hours within which night-soil may be removed.*—No person shall empty, assist in emptying, or cause or permit to be emptied, any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for deposit of night-soil, except between the hours of eleven (11) p.m. and four (4) a.m., or until the contents thereof have been properly deodorized; and every person emptying, or causing to be emptied, any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, shall cause the night-soil taken therefrom to be removed so soon as the same is emptied.

15. *Construction of cesspools.*—Every cesspool shall be furnished with a water-tight cover or roof, and every cesspool formed or made below the surface of the ground shall be provided with water-tight walls or sides, which project on all sides at least six (6) inches above the surface of the ground.

16. *Emptying of cesspools.*—Every occupier of premises, and every person having the management or control of premises, on which there shall be any cesspool shall cause the same to be emptied once at least in every week.

17. *Times within which cesspools may be emptied.*—No person shall empty, or assist in emptying, or cause or permit to be emptied, any cesspool or place for the deposit of offal, blood, or other refuse and offensive matter, except by means of a cart, carriage, or other conveyance properly constructed, and furnished with a sufficient covering so as to prevent the escape of the contents, or of any portion thereof, or of any effluvia therefrom.

18. *Conveyances by which cesspools may be emptied.*—No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying, any cesspool or place for the deposit of offal, blood, or other refuse and offensive matter, except by means of a cart, carriage, or other conveyance properly constructed, and furnished with a sufficient covering so as to prevent the escape of the contents, or of any portion thereof, or of any effluvia therefrom.

19. *Disposal of refuse and offensive matter.*—No person shall place or deposit any dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, or soil, or any night-soil or other offensive matter, in any place so as to be a nuisance to any person or injurious to health.

20. *Night-soil, &c., removed from any earth-closet, &c., and deposited anywhere, to be covered with earth.*—Every person placing or depositing, or causing or suffering to be placed or deposited, or assisting in placing or depositing, on any land, whether by way of manure or otherwise, any night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter removed from any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or other place of deposit, shall immediately on the deposit thereof cover the same, or cause the same to be

covered, and shall keep the same covered, with a layer of earth not less than six (6) inches in thickness.

21. *Earth-closets, &c., not to be emptied into drains or sewers.*—No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying, any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter into any drain or sewer, or so that the contents thereof may find its way, or be likely to find its way, into any drain or sewer.

22. *Prevention of pollution of water.*—No person shall place, assist in placing, or cause or permit to be placed, in or so that the same may or may be likely to find its way into any water used or likely to be used by man or beast for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, any matter or thing likely to endanger the health of any persons using such water or drinks or milk or other produce of such dairy.

23. *Cesspools not to be emptied into water used for drinking or domestic purposes.*—No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying, any cesspool or place for the deposit of offal, blood, or other refuse matter into any water supplied used or likely to be used by stock or man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, or so that the contents thereof may find its way or be likely to find its way into any such water.

24. *Every accumulation or deposit of offensive matter so situated as to find its way, or be likely to find its way, into any water used or likely to be used by stock or man for drinking or domestic purposes, or likely to be used in any dairy, shall be deodorized and removed by the owner of the property upon which such accumulation or deposit is situated within one (1) week of notice given by the Local Board or by one of its officers.*

25. *Keeping of animals.*—No person shall keep any animal of any kind so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

26. *No swine, sheep, or cattle shall be kept on any butchers' premises for slaughtering purposes within the Central Riding of the Shire of Benalla.*

27. *Animals not to be so kept as to pollute water.*—No person shall keep any animal in such a manner as to pollute any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, so as to endanger the health of any person using such water or drinks or milk or other produce of such dairy.

28. *Supply of water to slaughter-houses.*—Every occupier or licensee or person having the management or control of a slaughter-house or abattoir shall cause the same to be supplied with a sufficient quantity of water for all purposes.

29. *Drainage of new buildings.*—Every person erecting or causing to be erected any new building shall cause the foundations thereof, and the ground over which such building is to be placed, to be rendered dry, sound, and well drained, so that no water soakage or damp shall lodge there.

30. *Drainage of existing buildings.*—Every owner of a building shall cause the same to be provided with proper and sufficient drains, so constructed as to prevent any nuisance arising therefrom, and to secure the healthfulness of the inmates of such building; and every tenant of a building under a lease of which fourteen years or upwards is unexpired shall be deemed an owner within the meaning of this section.

31. *Registration of cowkeepers, dairymen, and purveyors of milk.*—Every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall, on or before the first day of January in every year, register himself with the Local Board of Health in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the secretary of the Local Board of Health an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall with every such application pay a fee of Five (5) shillings.

32. Upon receipt of every such application and fee, the secretary for the Local Board of Health shall endorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received, and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application, in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

33. *Milk stores and shops to be kept clean.*—Every person following the trade of cowkeeper or dairyman shall cause every milk store or milk shop in his occupation, or under his management

or control, and every milk vessel used by him for containing milk for sale, to be kept thoroughly clean.

34. *Dairymen, &c., to report disease to the health officer.*—Every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, and every person having the management of any such trade, shall forthwith report in writing to the health officer the occurrence of any disease in any of his milch cows, or of any contagious or infectious disease in man or animal upon the premises upon which such trade is carried on.

35. *Penalties.*—If any person commit a breach of any of the provisions of this bye-law, he shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued. Provided the justices before whom any penalty imposed thereby is sought to be recovered may order the whole or part only (not being less than Five shillings) of such penalty to be paid. And every person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the foregoing penalty, notwithstanding that the Local Board of Health may be empowered by this bye-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such Local Board of Health have or have not taken advantage of such powers.

36. *Extent of application of bye-law.*—This bye-law, containing sections 1 to 36 inclusive, shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the Shire of Benalla, save and except section 26 which shall apply to and have operation only in that portion of the Shire of Benalla described therein.

The foregoing bye-law was adopted at a meeting of the Local Board of Health for the Shire of Benalla, held at the Council Chambers, Benalla, on the twenty-ninth day of March 1886.
