## LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL.

I HEREBY notify that the subjoined Petition was addressed and presented to me on the 20th day of October 1886.

*To the Honorable Sir James MacBain, Knight, President of the Legislative Council of Victoria.*

The humble Petition of John Noble Wilson, of Mair street, Ballarat, in the Colony of Victoria, estate agent, whose name is hereto subscribed,

RESPECTFULLY SHEWETH:

That, on the ninth day of September last past, an election was held for one Member to serve in the Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, to represent the Electoral Province of Wellington.

That your Petitioner was a registered elector of the said Province, and had a right to vote, and did vote at the said election.

That, at the said election, Henry Gore, Esquire, and Thomas Drummond Wanliss, Esquire, were the candidates, and, a poll having been taken, the returning officer announced that the said Henry Gore, Esquire, had received 2512 votes, and the said Thomas Drummond Wanliss, Esquire, 2511 votes; and thereupon the said returning officer publicly declared that the said Henry Gore, Esquire, had received the majority of votes, and was duly elected as Member as aforesaid, and such returning officer made his return accordingly.

That, on the taking of the poll for the said election, divers votes for the said Henry Gore were improperly admitted and counted thereat, and divers votes for the said Thomas Drummond Wanliss were improperly rejected, set aside, and not counted at all.

That, in the taking of the said poll for the said election, divers ballot-papers which were polled on behalf of the said Thomas Drummond Wanliss were wrongfully declared informal, and were not counted in the computation of votes polled on behalf of the said Thomas Drummond Wanliss, whereby the actual vote polled on behalf of the said Thomas Drummond Wanliss was under-estimated, and so many votes omitted from the count in his behalf as would, if the count were now fairly made, result in giving the return for the said Electoral Province of Wellington to the said Thomas Drummond Wanliss, setting aside the colorable majority on which the said Henry Gore has been wrongfully declared one of the Members elect for the said Electoral Province.

That divers votes were given at the said election by persons not of age, and therefore not entitled to vote in the said Electoral Province of Wellington at the time indicated, whereby the said Henry Gore obtained an apparent and colorable majority only; whereas in truth and in fact the said Thomas Drummond Wanliss had a majority of the votes of the electors truly voted in the said Electoral Province of Wellington, at the said election, over the said Henry Gore, and was duly elected as a Member to serve in Parliament for the said Province, and ought to have been returned as such Member.

That, at the said election, divers electors were personated and votes colorably given at the poll for the said Henry Gore, some of the persons falsely represented as being present and voting being absent, and others dead; and that such votes should, for such reasons, be declared null and void, and struck from the said poll for the said Electoral District.

That divers votes, which your Petitioner is informed and believes were properly tendered and voted on behalf of the said Thomas Drummond Wanliss in divers of the polling booths at the said election for the said Electoral Province of Wellington, were afterwards voted a second time for

the said Henry Gore during the said election in other polling booths, in the same or other divisions of the said Electoral Province, and were wrongfully counted, to the detriment of the said Thomas Drummond Wanliss.

That divers votes, which were duly tendered and voted on behalf of the said Henry Gore in divers of the polling booths for the said election for the said Province, were afterwards tendered and voted a second time on behalf of the said Henry Gore during the said election in other polling booths, in the same or other divisions of the said Electoral Province, and were wrongfully counted, to the detriment of the said Thomas Drummond Wanliss.

That many persons who were registered as electors of the said Province in respect of freehold qualifications, or as lessees or occupiers of lands or tenements in the said Province, or as the holders of certain electoral rights, and who voted at the said election for the said Province, became disqualified as electors for the said Province before and at the time of the holding of the said election for the said Province by reason of the non-retention by them of a sufficient qualification.

That the votes of such persons, as in the last paragraph mentioned, were improperly admitted at the said election for the said Province.

That divers votes were given at the said election by persons who neither at the time of the said election and voting, nor at all, were possessed of a sufficient qualification, and who therefore were not entitled to vote in the said Electoral Province of Wellington at the time indicated, whereby the said Henry Gore obtained an apparent and colorable majority only; whereas in truth and in fact the said Thomas Drummond Wanliss had a majority of the votes of the electors truly voted in the said Electoral Province of Wellington at the said election over the said Henry Gore, and was duly elected as a Member to serve in Parliament for the said Province, and ought to have been returned as such Member.

That the votes of such persons who so voted, as in the last paragraph mentioned, were improperly admitted at the said election for the said Province.

That, if the votes of all those persons so disqualified and unqualified as in the last four paragraphs mentioned, but who, nevertheless, voted at the said election for the said Province, were struck off the roll, it would be found that the said Thomas Drummond Wanliss had obtained a greater number of votes at the said election than the said Henry Gore.

That errors in computation were made in divers polling booths, whereby votes properly tendered and duly received on behalf of the said Thomas Drummond Wanliss were not properly counted, whereby the said Henry Gore was made to appear to have received a larger number of votes than the said Thomas Drummond Wanliss, for whom in reality the larger number of votes was polled.

Your Petitioner therefore respectfully prays—

That you will communicate the matter of this Petition to the Legislative Council, in order that the same be referred to the Committee of Elections and Qualifications.

That all and every the ballot-papers used, not used, and set aside at the taking of the poll at such election for the said Electoral Province of Wellington may be again respectively examined and tallied with the poll-books used thereat, and that the votes in such ballot-papers be again counted, and that those improperly admitted in such taking of the poll be now rejected and struck out, and that those erroneously rejected or set aside at such taking of the poll be now admitted and counted as good votes, and that the votes given colorably for the electors who were personated, or by voters who voted twice at the said election, or by voters who did not retain a sufficient qualification, or by voters who, neither at the time of the said election and voting, nor at all, were possessed of a sufficient qualification, or were otherwise wrongfully given, be struck out.

That the said Committee may determine and report to the said Legislative Council that the said Henry Gore was not duly elected, and ought not to have been returned at the said election; and that the said Thomas Drummond Wanliss may be declared to have been duly elected at such election, and to be the person that ought to have been returned; and that the said return to said writ may be amended accordingly.

That your Petitioner may have such further or other relief as the circumstances of the case may require, or as to the said Committee may seem meet.

And your Petitioner will ever pray, &c., &c.

An Act to amend "The Mining Companies Act 1871."

Prisoners convicted after the first day of November 1886, and sentenced to two years or upwards, will not be allowed the indulgences provided by sub-section of the 2nd clause of the Regulations of the 21st day of March 1876, if they have received similar indulgences when undergoing any previous sentence.

MARYBOROUGH WATERWORKS TRUST.—  
REGULATION.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulation, made by the Maryborough Waterworks Trust in pursuance of the provisions of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1881* (No. 716, sec. 44).

THE Commissioners of the Maryborough Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 44 of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1881*, do make the following Regulation:—

## No. 1.

Regulation for making a rate on all the rateable property in the Maryborough Waterworks District.

1st. A rate of One shilling in the pound sterling, except as hereinafter mentioned, on the annual value of all the rateable property in the Maryborough Waterworks District, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements comprised within the said waterworks district for the municipal rates of the borough of Maryborough, is hereby made for the year commencing on the first day of January 1886 and ending on the thirty-first day of December 1886; provided that in pursuance of an Order of His Excellency the Governor in Council, dated the eighteenth day of May 1886, and made by virtue of the powers by section 95 of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1883*, the sum of One pound ten shillings sterling shall be the minimum amount of rates to be paid annually by every owner of any house or tenement liable to be rated by the Maryborough Waterworks Trust when the valuation in respect to such house or tenement shall not exceed the sum of Thirty pounds sterling per annum.

2nd. Such rate to be paid in two equal instalments, the first of which instalments shall be due and payable on the first day of July 1886, and the second instalment shall be due and payable on the first day of January 1887.

3rd. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and collect the said rate.

4th. The foregoing Regulation No. 1 was made by the Commissioners of the Maryborough Waterworks Trust, under and by virtue of sub-section 4 of section 44 of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1881*, on the 31st day of May 1886, and confirmed on the 14th day of July 1886.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act Amendment Act 1883* (47 Vict. No. 786, sec. 3) it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council might make orders altering, for the purpose of adjustment, the boundaries of contiguous municipal districts or subdivisions without any petition: And whereas it has been deemed expedient to adjust the contiguous boundaries of the Shires of Newham and Romsey: Now therefore the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby adjust the boundaries of the said Shires of Newham and Romsey, and doth declare the boundaries of the said Shires as hereunder described and set forth to be in lieu of those previously proclaimed, which are hereby cancelled, that is to say:—

THE SHIRE OF NEWHAM RE-DEFINED.

Commencing at a point on the Campaspe River at the north-east angle of allotment 113, parish of Tylden; thence by the centre line of that river northwardly to the north-west angle of the parish of Woodend; thence by the north boundary of same parish east to the west boundary of the parish of Newham; thence north by that boundary to the boundary between the counties of Dalhousie and Bourke; thence easterly by that boundary to a point on the same true north of the junction of the Saltwater River and Deep Creek, parish of Rochford; thence south to that junction, and southerly by the Deep Creek and Monument Creek to a point in the latter east of the centre of a road forming the northern boundary of allotment 70A, parish of Rochford; thence west to the centre of a road proclaimed under the Land Act, and described in the *Government Gazette* of the 1st October 1886, page 2820; thence by the centre of said road southerly to the centre of the road forming the north boundary of allotment 78A; thence east to the centre of Monument Creek; thence south by said creek to its head in allotment 120, parish of Rochford; thence by a direct line to the south-west angle of said allotment; thence to and by the centre of the road forming the west boundaries of allotments 113, 118, and 117 to the boundary between the parishes of Rochford and Kerrie; thence west by the north boundary of allotment 86, parish of Kerrie, to the county boundary between Bourke and Dalhousie; thence by that boundary south-westerly to a point due south of the south-west angle of allotment X, parish of Trentham; thence north to that angle; thence north by a road to the north-west angle of allotment X; thence north-easterly to the south-east angle of allotment 67C; thence north to the north-west angle of allotment 78; thence north-westerly and north to the north-west angle of allotment 120A, parish of Tylden; thence north-east to the south-east angle of allotment 120; thence north to the north-east angle of allotment 115; and thence north-easterly along the three-chain Tylden main road to the point of commencement.

THE ROMSEY SHIRE RE-DEFINED.

Commencing at a point on the north boundary of the county of Bourke north of the north-east angle of suburban allotment 18, in the parish of Lancefield; thence southerly by the eastern boundaries of the parishes of Lancefield and Monegeetta to the south-east angle of the parish of Monegeetta; thence west by the south boundary of the said parish to a point in the centre of the Lancefield road west of the north-west angle of the parish of Havelock; thence southerly by the centre of the said road to the northern boundary of the parish of Bolinda; thence west to the north-west angle of that parish to the centre of the western branch of the Saltwater River; thence by the said river westerly to a point in the centre of a one-and-a-half chain road leading from Riddell's Creek to Sunbury; thence by the centre of the said road north-westerly and north to the northern boundary of the Mount Alexander and Murray River Railway; thence by that railway south-westerly and westerly to the centre of a road forming the western boundaries of allotments 7, 6, and 5 of section 35, parish of Gisborne; thence north and north-easterly by that road to the Macedon River; thence crossing that river to the south-west angle of block 6A, parish of Kerrie; thence by the south-western boundary of that allotment to the north-west angle of same; thence west by a one-chain road to the south-west angle of allotment 36, same parish; thence by the west and north boundary of said allotment to the south-east angle of allotment 41; thence northerly by the one-chain road forming the eastern boundary of allotments 41, 53, and 50 to the north-east angle of the allotment last named; thence west by the north boundary of allotments 50 and 51 and a line to the centre of the Barringo Creek; thence northerly by that creek to the south boundary of allotment 58; thence westerly by that boundary and north by the west boundary of said allotment and allotments 57 and 56 to the north-west angle of allotment last named; thence easterly by the north boundary of same allotment to the south-western boundary of the parish of Rochford; thence north-easterly by the centre of a road forming the western boundaries of allotments 117, 118, and 113, said parish, to the south-west angle of allotment 120; thence by a direct line easterly to the head of Monument Creek; thence northerly by that creek to the centre of the road forming the north boundary of allotment 78A, parish of Rochford; thence west by said road to the centre of a proclaimed road described in *Government Gazette* of the 1st October 1886, page 2820; thence northerly by the centre of the said road to the centre of a road forming the north boundary of allotment 70A, same parish; thence east to Monument Creek aforesaid; thence northerly by that creek and Deep Creek to the

junction of the latter with the Saltwater River; thence by a line true north to the Dividing Range, being the boundary between the counties of Bourke and Dalhousie; thence easterly by that boundary to the commencing point.

And the Honorable John Nimmo, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1874* (38 Vict. No. 506, § 19, 38, 39, and 49) it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might from time to time make Orders, amongst other things, to sever any portion of Victoria forming part of a municipal district from such municipal district, and annex the same to any other municipal district with which the portion so severed forms one continuous area, and from time to time make any apportionment of property rights and liabilities, and give any directions as to any matters and things that might be necessary to do justice as between the municipalities concerned; and every such Order should be published in the *Government Gazette*, and should take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor in the Act above recited are now exercised upon a petition signed by the requisite number of the ratepayers of the Shire of Caulfield therein described (notices of which said petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the forty-sixth section of the same Act): Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, doth by this present Order sever from the East St. Kilda Riding of the said Shire of Caulfield the portion of the shire described in such petition (the residue of the said riding to be henceforth the East St. Kilda Riding of the said shire of Caulfield), and doth direct that the portion so severed from such shire shall be annexed to the North Ward of the Borough of St. Kilda: And with the advice aforesaid doth hereby re-define the boundaries of the said Shire of Caulfield as hereby reduced, and of the said Borough of St. Kilda and the North Ward thereof, as hereby enlarged in manner following, that is to say:—

CAULFIELD SHIRE REDUCED AND RE-DEFINED.

Commencing at the intersection of Main Dandenong road with the Orrong road; thence south by the Orrong road to Inkermann road; thence west by Inkermann road to Hotham street; thence south by Hotham street to the Melbourne and Point Nepean Main road; thence south-easterly by that road to the north boundary of the parish of Moorabbin; thence east to the west boundary of the parish of Mulgrave; thence north by the west boundary of that parish to the Melbourne and Dandenong Main road; and thence north-westerly by said road to the point of commencement.

SHIRE OF CAULFIELD, EAST ST. KILDA RIDING, REDUCED AND RE-DEFINED.

Bounded on the north by Inkermann road; on the east by the Orrong road; on the south by the Glen Huntly road; and on the west by Hotham street.

The centre of the said roads and streets to be taken as the boundary line.

THE BOROUGH OF ST. KILDA ADDED TO AND RE-DEFINED.

Commencing at a point on the shore of Port Phillip Bay opposite the centre of Fraser street; thence north-easterly by that street to its intersection with Canterbury road; thence north-easterly again by a direct line to Queen's terrace opposite the centre of a street between blocks U and V; thence by that street to the Main Brighton road; thence east to and by High street to the Punt road; thence south by that road to Wellington street; thence east by that street and the Main Dandenong road to Orrong road; thence south by that road to Inkermann road, west by Inkermann road to Hotham street, south by Hotham street and the Main Brighton road to the Glen Huntly road; thence west by that road to St. Kilda street, south by that street to Park street, west by Park street to shore of Port Phillip Bay, and north-westerly by the shore of that Bay to the starting point. *Description of land.*—Two acres, county of Bourke, town of Footscray: Commencing at the south-east angle of the site, being the point of intersection of the northern side of Bunbury street by the western side of Cowper street; bounded thence by Bunbury street bearing N. 78° W. five chains; thence by lines bearing respectively N. 12° E. four chains and S. 78° E. five chains to Cowper street aforesaid; and thence by that street bearing S. 12° W. four chains to the point of commencement.

*Names of trustees.*—The Church of England Trusts Corporation for the Diocese of Melbourne.

*Power of disposition.*—To permit and suffer so much of the land as shall not be disposed of under the powers hereinafter specified to be used for the purposes for which it was granted or reserved by the Crown.

To permit and suffer, at the request of the incumbent or officiating minister having for the time being the spiritual charge of the parish or district in the diocese in which the land is situate, and the guardians or vestry of the church erected thereon, if such request be concurred in by the Bishop thereof or by the administrator of the affairs thereof during the vacancy of the see, the erection of buildings on any portion of the said land.

To lease or sell at the like request, if concurred in as aforesaid, any portion of the said land or any buildings or portion of any buildings thereon for such purposes and on such terms and conditions as shall in such request be specified.

*Purposes to which proceeds of disposition are to be applied.*—Moneys received from sales or leases to be paid to the Bishop or administrator aforesaid, to be dealt with for Church of England purposes in accordance with an agreement come to between such Bishop or administrator and the incumbent or officiating minister and the guardians or vestry aforesaid, but to be subject nevertheless to the payment or deduction therefrom of all costs, charges, and expenses incurred by the trustees, or for which they shall be liable in respect of the trust estate.

SHIRE OF LILLYDALE.

BYE-LAW NO. 7.

Under "The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883."

IN pursuance of the powers contained in "The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883," and of every other power enabling them in that behalf, the Local Board of Health for Shire of Lillydale, being the Municipal Council thereof, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution, doth hereby make the bye-law following, that is to say:—

1. Interpretation of terms.—In the construction and for the purposes of this bye-law the following terms shall, if not inconsistent with the context or subject-matter, have the respective meanings hereby assigned to them:—

"House" shall mean and include dwellings of any kind, schools, hotels, licensed public-houses, factories, work-rooms, common or other lodging-houses, or other buildings or premises.

"Cesspool" shall mean any receptacle for night-soil, or for noxious or offensive matter, below or above the ground.

"Street" shall mean and include any highway, and any public bridge, and any road, lane, footway, square, court, alley, or passage, whether a thoroughfare or not.

2. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This bye-law shall apply to and have operation in that portion of the said Shire of Lillydale comprised within a radius of one-half mile from the post office in the township of Lillydale.

4. The occupier of every house and premises within the said named radius shall cause the yard and ground belonging thereto, or occupied in connection therewith, to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all filth, rubbish, and refuse matter to be from time to time removed from such yard and ground. And if at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such filth, rubbish, or refuse matter so removed as aforesaid, the local board may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier.

5. The occupier of any land in the said named radius on which there shall be erected any stable, cow-yard, cattle-shed, or pigsty shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state, in respect of cleanliness, as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all soil, dung, or other manure produced or accumulated therein to be removed from such premises once at least in every week. And if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect or fail to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid, the same shall be removed by the said local board at the expense of such occupier.

6. The occupier of every house, building, or tenement within the said named radius shall cause every cesspool already in existence, and until its abolition, to be emptied and cleansed from time to time as soon as any portion of the contents of such cesspool shall have so accumulated therein as to be within a distance of one foot from the top of the sides, walls, or lining of such cesspool. Provided that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom except between the hours of Eleven p.m. and Five a.m. And provided also that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom until such contents shall have had mixed therewith carbolic acid, or some other efficient deodoriser, sufficient in quality and quantity to effectually deodorise and disinfect the same.

7. Every occupier and every person having the management and control of any premises shall, once at least in every week, empty and cleanse, or cause to be emptied and cleansed, every earth-closet, privy, and place in the nature of an earth-closet for the reception of nightsoil on or belonging to such premises.

8. No person shall empty or deposit the contents of any earth-closet, privy, or cesspool within fifty feet of any dwelling-house in such portion of the shire described as aforesaid, nor shall convey or cause to be conveyed through any public street or road the contents of any earth-closet, privy, or cesspool, except by means of a cart, carriage, or means of conveyance properly constructed, and furnished with a sufficient covering so as to prevent the escape of the contents or any portion thereof or of effluvia therefrom.

9. Every person placing or depositing, or causing or suffering to be placed, or deposited, or spread, or assisting in placing, or depositing, or spreading, on any land, whether by way of manure or otherwise, any nightsoil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter removed from any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or other place, shall, immediately on the deposit or spreading thereof, cover the same or cause the same to be covered, and shall keep the same covered, with a layer of earth not less than six inches in thickness.

10. The occupier of any premises within the said radius used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, process, or manufacture whatever, or used for the purpose of slaughtering, whether it be an abattoir or otherwise, shall cause any rubbish, blood, offal, bones, water, liquid, soil, or other offensive matter produced or accumulated thereon to be removed therefrom once in every forty-eight hours, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, or to exhale any offensive effluvia. And if such occupier shall neglect or fail to have removed therefrom any offensive matter whatever, it may be removed by the said local board at the expense of such occupier.

11. Every closet-pan shall be constructed of galvanized iron, properly riveted and soldered, so as to be watertight, and with handles thereto, and of a capacity not exceeding three cubic feet.

12. No closet-door or trap shall abut or open upon a street, lane, or right-of-way exceeding twenty feet in width.

13. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds for every such breach, or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties, such portion not being less than Five shillings, to be paid. And any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty, notwithstanding that the Local Board of Health may be empowered by this bye-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such local board has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

BYE-LAW No. 87.

WHEREAS by the forty-fifth section of *The Factories and Shops Act 1835*, numbered 802, it is enacted that the Municipal Council may, if it think fit, from time to time, make, alter, and repeal bye-laws in and for the municipality for *inter alia* permitting shops of any particular class (not included in the third schedule to the said Act), on obtaining a license to keep open after the hours in the said Act mentioned, and during such hours as shall be specified in such license, provided that a petition certified to by the Municipal Clerk as being signed by a majority of the shopkeepers keeping shops of such class within the municipal district shall have been previously presented to such Municipal Council: And whereas the Council of the City of South Melbourne, which is the municipal council in and for the municipality of the said city, has had presented to it petitions from shopkeepers keeping shops of each of the classes mentioned in the schedule to this bye-law, each of which petitions has been certified to by the Town Clerk of the said city, as the municipal clerk thereof, as being, to the best of his knowledge and belief, signed by a majority of the shopkeepers keeping shops of the class mentioned therein: And whereas the Council of the City of South Melbourne, which is the municipal council in and for the municipality of the said city, so thinks fit: Be it, and it is by the Municipal Council hereby ordered and directed, that any shopkeeper keeping a shop of any of the class named in the schedule to this bye-law within the City of South Melbourne, and which are not of the classes named in the third schedule to *The Factories and Shops Act 1835*, upon receiving license to do so from the Town Clerk of the said city, which license the said Town Clerk is hereby empowered by the said Municipal Council of the City of South Melbourne, to issue on its behalf, upon applications made for the same, may keep open his said shop after the hours in the said Act mentioned, and not later than the hour of eight o'clock, *post meridian*, on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday; not later than nine o'clock, *post meridian*, on Friday; and on Saturday not later than eleven o'clock, *post meridian*, in every week.
