**ORDER OF THE COUNCIL OF THE SHIRE OF LOWAN MADE ON THE SIXTH DAY OF OCTOBER, 1886.**

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by section 365 and 366 of *The Local Government Act 1874*, the Council of the Shire of Lowan, do hereby order that the land hereunder described shall be a public highway from and after the date of publication of such order in the *Government Gazette*, namely:—All that piece of land, being part of Crown allotment B, parish of Kaniva, in the county of Lowan; Commencing at the south-east angle of said Crown allotment; thence running northerly along the eastern boundary of said allotment fifty-nine chains twenty-six links; thence west one chain; thence south fifty-nine chains twenty-six links; thence east one chain to the commencing point, containing about five acres three roods and twenty-eight perches. Also, all that piece of land in the parish of Kaniva, county of Lowan; Commencing at the north-east angle of the said Crown allotment B; thence running north twenty-six chains forty-two links to the five-chain road; thence west by southern boundary of said five-chain road one chain; thence south twenty-six chains forty-two links to the northern boundary of said Crown allotment B; and thence east one chain to the commencing point, containing about two acres two roods and twenty-three perches.

WHEREAS by *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1881* it was amongst other things enacted that, at the expiration of two months after the notice of application should have been first advertised in the *Government Gazette*, the Minister, if satisfied that the provisions of the now in part recited Act have been substantially complied with, should submit such application, and the general plan and description therein referred to, and all petitions which have been received in respect of such application, to the Governor in Council, together with any recommendations as to the granting of the application, or as to any alterations or additions he might think desirable in the proposed Waterworks: And the Governor in Council might thereupon approve of the construction of such proposed Waterworks, with or without any alterations or additions in the general plan and description thereof, or might disapprove of the construction of such Waterworks, and should make an Order in Council accordingly: And it was further enacted that, if the Governor in Council should approve of the construction of such Waterworks, with or without alterations, or additions, or restrictions of any such general plan and description, a Waterworks Trust should be constituted to construct, maintain, and continue the whole or any part of the Waterworks therein described, in accordance with the provisions of such Order and of the now in part recited Act: And every Order approving the construction of any proposed Waterworks, and of the constituting of a Waterworks Trust for the purpose, should state—

(a) The amount of money which the Governor in Council would grant as a loan for the purpose of carrying out the same and paying the cost and expense of the plans and application for the same; and also the rate of interest which would be charged for such loan, such rate being at least One-half per centum more than the rate payable by the Government on the Public Loan out of which such loan might be granted.

(b) Should proclaim the limits of the lands, whether within or without the municipal districts of the council or councils applying for the proposed Waterworks, within which such Trust should have authority, to be called a Waterworks District.

(c) Should state what are the principal works to be constructed; and

(d) Should contain such provisions (not inconsistent with the now in part recited Act) as according to the nature of the application and the facts and circumstances of each case the Governor in Council should think fit.

And it was further enacted by Section 79 of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1881*, No. 778, that whenever a Waterworks District is either wholly or with the exception of the Waterworks or proposed Waterworks thereof within one municipal district, the Governor in Council may appoint the municipal council for the time being of such municipal district together with one or more persons not being members of such municipal council to be the Waterworks Trust of such Waterworks District: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the said Acts, has approved of a general plan and description as set forth in a certain application of the Municipal Council of the Shire of Wimmera for a Loan of Fifty thousand pounds sterling, to carry out certain Waterworks for the supply of a Waterworks District under the said Acts, embracing the Shire of Wimmera as shown on the plan accompanying the said application, together with general plan and description therein referred to, deposited in the Department of Mines and Water Supply, Melbourne, and doth hereby order and appoint as follows:—

(1.) The construction of the said Waterworks.

(2.) The Municipal Council of the Shire of Wimmera for the time being, and one other Commissioner, to be the Waterworks Trust of such Waterworks District.

(3.) That the amount of the loan hereby granted shall be Fifty thousand pounds sterling, for the purpose of carrying out approved works, and paying the cost and expense of the plans and application for the same; and that the interest to be charged for such loan shall be at the rate of Four pounds ten shillings per centum per annum, payable half-yearly.

(4.) That the limits of the land within which the said Waterworks Trust shall have authority (to be called a Waterworks District) shall be the lands included within the Shire of Wimmera, and more particularly described in the *Government Gazette* of the 6th of November 1885, No. 106, page 3028, excluding the Borough of Horsham, the site of the Longerenong Weir and Regulator, and the portion of the Reserve within two chains thereof.

(5.) That the principal work proposed to be constructed consists of a channel from the McKenzie Creek, near Rosebrook, in the parish of Burrong, to the Natimuck Creek, in the parish of Nurrabiel.

(6.) That the said Trust shall also be empowered to take over from the Wimmera United Waterworks Trust and from the Municipal Council of the Shire of Wimmera such Waterworks, and upon such terms and conditions as may hereafter by Order in Council be approved.

(7.) The corporate name of Waterworks Trust shall be the Shire of Wimmera Waterworks Trust.

WHEREAS by section 90 of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1881*, No. 778, it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time, after any Trust has by Order in Council been duly constituted, make additional Orders relating to such Waterworks or Irrigation Trust not inconsistent with the provisions of the now in part recited Act, and that the Governor in Council may in such additional Orders in Council—

(a) Make any Order which might have been made in the Order in Council originally constituting such Waterworks or Irrigation Trust;

(b) Increase or diminish the extent of the Waterworks District of such Waterworks Trust; and

(c) Repeal any of the provisions of any previous Order in Council relating to such Waterworks or Irrigation Trust:

And whereas by section 19 of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1881*, No. 829, it is enacted that when the Waterworks District of any Waterworks Trust has been or is about to be increased or diminished, the Governor in Council may make such Order as appears just for (amongst other things) determining what persons shall cease or continue to be Commissioners of the Waterworks Trust thereof, and for how long the same shall so continue, and for determining all other matters and things which it appears desirable or proper so to determine:

And whereas by an Order in Council bearing date the fourth day of October 1882 a certain Waterworks Trust known as the Wimmera United Waterworks Trust was duly constituted, having authority as such Waterworks Trust within certain lands the limits whereof were in and by the said Order in Council duly proclaimed and defined:

And whereas by a certain further Order in Council bearing date the second day of February 1886 the extent of the Waterworks District of the said Wimmera United Waterworks Trust, as proclaimed and defined by the said Order in Council bearing date the fourth day of October 1882, was increased by the addition thereto of certain other lands duly defined in and by such further Order in Council:

And whereas by a certain other further Order in Council bearing date the sixteenth day of February 1886 the extent of the Waterworks District of the said Wimmera United Waterworks Trust as proclaimed and increased by the said Orders in Council respectively bearing date the fourth day of October 1882 and the second day of February 1886 was diminished by the excision therefrom of certain lands the boundaries whereof were in and by such Order in Council bearing date the sixteenth day of February 1886 duly set forth:

And whereas by the said further Order in Council bearing date the sixteenth day of February 1886 the Waterworks District of the said Wimmera United Waterworks Trust was re-defined, and it was therein ordered that the said Wimmera United Waterworks Trust should continue to consist of two members from each of the Shire Councils of the Shire Districts of Wimmera, Dunmunkle, Dimboola, St. Arnaud, and Stawell, and one member from the Shire Council of the Shire District of Kara Kara, and one other Commissioner:

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the now in part recited Acts, doth order—

1. That the extent of the Waterworks District of the said Wimmera United Waterworks Trust as so re-defined shall be and the same is hereby diminished by the excision therefrom of the lands bounded as follows, namely:—

Portion No. 1.—Commencing at the intersection of the Horsham and Longerenong Main Road with the centre of the Yarrambiack Creek; thence westerly, north-westerly, and south-westerly by said road to its intersection with the north-eastern angle of the Horsham Nine Mile Village Reserve; thence westerly by its northern boundary to its north-west corner; thence southerly by its western boundary to its intersection with the centre of the Horsham and Natimuck Main Road; thence by said road in a general direction westerly to its intersection with the centre of the Wimmera River; thence northerly by centre of said river to the south boundary of the parish of Dimboola; thence easterly by the said boundary of that parish and the south boundary of the parish of Kewell West to the south-east angle of the latter parish; thence northerly by the eastern boundaries of the parishes of Kewell West, Wallup, and Cannum to the north-west angle of the parish of Werrigar; thence easterly by the northern boundary of that parish to its intersection with the centre of the Yarrambiack Creek; thence southerly by centre of said creek to the commencing point aforesaid.

Portion No. 2.—Also the Reserves on the north and south sides of the Wimmera River, commencing at the north-east corner of allotment 17, parish of Dooen, and extending easterly along the said river to the Yarriambiack Creek, excepting the site of the Longerenong Weir and Regulator, and the portion of the Reserve within two chains thereof.

Portion No. 3.—Commencing at the intersection of the Horsham and Longerenong Road with the centre of the Yarriambiack Creek; thence westerly to the western boundary of that creek; thence by that western boundary southerly to its junction with the Wimmera River; thence easterly to the centre of the said Yarriambiack Creek; thence northerly by the centre of the said creek to the commencing point aforesaid.

2. That clause 2 of the said further Order in Council bearing date the sixteenth day of February 1886 so far as it relates to the Waterworks District of the said Wimmera United Waterworks Trust, comprising any portion of the Shire of Wimmera, excepting the site of the Longerenong Weir and Regulator, and the portion of the Reserve within two chains thereof, shall be and the same is hereby repealed.

3. That clause 3 of the said further Order in Council bearing date the sixteenth day of February 1886 shall be and the same is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof it is hereby ordered—

That the said Wimmera United Waterworks Trust shall hereafter consist of two members from each of the Shire Councils of the Shire Districts of Dummunkle, Dimboola, St. Arnaud, and Stawell, one member from the Shire Council of the said Shire District of Kara Kara, and one other Commissioner.

REGULATIONS OF THE MELBOURNE HARBOR TRUST COMMISSIONERS. IN pursuance of *The Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1876, The Melbourne Harbor Trust Act Amendment Act 1883, and The Melbourne Harbor Trust Further Amendment Act 1885*, the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners make the following regulations:—

Regulations for the Construction of Tramways.

“1. No person shall construct or erect any tramway upon, over, or above any part of the property vested in the Commissioners, unless he has first obtained a license from them for that purpose.”

“2. All applications for a license as aforesaid shall be in writing, addressed to the Commissioners and signed by the applicant, and shall be accompanied by plans and specifications of the proposed work, and of the materials of which the same is to be constructed.”

“3. Every license shall be for such period, not exceeding seven years, and in such form, and subject to such terms, payments, conditions, and stipulations as the Commissioners may, in their discretion, appoint; but no license shall be granted unless the Commissioners shall have obtained from some person approved of, or appointed by them a valuation, signed and certified by such person according to the best of his judgment and belief, of the true and fair worth or value of such license to the applicant for the same.”

Regulations for Working Drays.

“1. No person shall cart or convey any sand or stone ballast upon, over or along any wharf unless he is the holder of a carter's license, entitling him to use the wharf for such purpose.”

“2. This regulation shall be read and construed together with the Regulations of the Commissioners, made on the 4th day of December 1884, and the 31st day of July 1885, respectively.”

Amendment Regulation No. 15.

“15. Every vessel lying in the Bay and not alongside any wharf shall be provided with a good and sufficient gangway ladder. Every vessel lying in the port alongside any wharf or alongside any vessel moored to any wharf shall be provided with a good and sufficient stage for the use of persons coming from or going on board such vessel, and every such stage shall be made of not less than two (2) inch planks, and to be at least three (3) feet broad for passenger steamers, and two (2) feet broad for other vessels, with cross battens and ropes on both sides from the vessel to the wharf or from vessel to vessel supported by wooden or iron stanchions not less than three (3) feet high, and also with a good and sufficient net to be approved by the Harbor-master. So much of this regulation as refers to providing nets shall not extend or apply to tug steamers or small vessels which trade within Port Phillip Bay, or to vessels moored to any wharf, in the Yarra Yarra or the Saltwater Rivers.”

Amendment of Regulation No. 19.

“19. No vessel, lighter, boat, or raft shall be anchored in any fairway, or in the channel of any river, but if detained there, it shall lie close over on either side of such fairway, channel or river; nor shall any cable, chain-hawser, or rope be placed across any such fairway, channel, or river, without permission from the Harbor-master; and the Harbor-master may define, by bearings or otherwise as he may deem most convenient, the limits of any fairway.”

In witness whereof the said Commissioners have hereunto affixed the common seal, this 22nd day of July, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-six.

## VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

## ANNUAL TICKETS FOR ALL LINES.

Holders of annual tickets for all lines desiring to renew for 1887 are requested to send in their names to the Booking Office, Spencer street, as early as possible, so that the metals may be prepared in time.

## CHRISTMAS AND NEW YEAR'S EXCURSIONS.

Holiday excursion tickets will be issued to and from all stations (suburban lines excepted) from the 20th December to the 5th January, both dates inclusive (Sundays excepted), available for return for one calendar month from date of issue. Example:—An excursion ticket issued on the 22nd December will be available till the 22nd January. When the last day falls on a Sunday, the ticket will be available till next day. The journey must be commenced on the day the ticket is issued, but after a distance of 15 miles has been travelled, the journey may be broken at the discretion of the passenger.

*Sydney Excursion Tickets.*—From the 15th December to the 5th January, both dates inclusive, excursion tickets will be issued at Melbourne to Sydney at the following return fares:—1st class, £5 6s. 6d.; 2nd class, £4 1s. These tickets will be available for two calendar months from date of issue, but will not be available by the express trains on the New South Wales lines.

*Luggage.*—Excursion passengers will only be allowed to carry such luggage free as can be stowed under the seats without inconvenience to other passengers, and those who have luggage for the van are required to be at the station half-an-hour before the train starts. Stamped parcels rate will be charged for it. All luggage should be plainly addressed with the owner's name and the station it is for.

*Horses and Vehicles.*—From the 22nd December to the 8th January, both dates inclusive, the Department cannot engage to forward horses and vehicles by passenger train, unless accommodation can be provided by special arrangement.

*Commercial Travellers' Samples.*—From the 22nd December to the 5th January, commercial travellers' samples will not be taken to or from roadside stations except by mixed or goods trains.

*Parcels.*—On the 24th December, parcels must be at the Melbourne Parcels Office thirty minutes before starting-time of ordinary trains.

*North Melbourne and Newmarket Stations.*—From 9 a.m. on the 24th December to 9 a.m. on 25th December, tickets will not be issued at North Melbourne or Newmarket stations for country stations, nor by the early trains on 27th December and 1st January, and down country trains will not stop there. On the same dates, the up North-Eastern train will not stop at Newmarket. The 5.10 p.m. down and the 6.50 a.m. up mixed trains are excepted from the foregoing arrangement.

*Goods Sheds Holidays.*—The 25th and 27th December and 1st January will be observed as holidays in the goods branch, and goods trains will not run. Perishable goods will, however, be delivered at all stations on application. Consignees of powder can ascertain from the Station-master at Footscray when explosives will be received in lieu of these dates.

*Seaside Excursions.*—The issue of these tickets at the principal stations will continue as already advertised (see posters at all stations).

At stations where the bags can be at once emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations, notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

Tenders, which should be upon the printed form, will be received for either oats, bran, hay, or straw (the particular kind of hay or straw offered to be stated); but if all be included in one tender it may be accepted for one article only, if advisable. Telegrams will not be entertained.

Tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for one-third of the estimated amount of the contract within ten days after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts amounting to £150 and upwards, and one surety for contracts under £150.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Forage," and deposited in the Tender-Box, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known by *Gazette* notice, and by letter to accepted tenderers.

## CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed, except when otherwise directed by the police; the straw to be wheaten or oats, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats (Victorian grown) and bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from oats of the best quality; the maize to be of the best quality. The hay tenders must specify whether they are for oats or wheaten hay.

2. The supplies are for police, telegraph, and other horses, and are to be delivered on the order of the officer in charge of the district or station. The quantities stated in the schedule being only approximate, it must be understood that the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned; and should new telegraph stations be formed, or additional horses required to be stationed at any of the stations, the contractor will be required to supply the additional forage. Should the additional number of horses, however, exceed two, the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station under the contract according to the foregoing schedule.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Botanic and Domain Gardens may be called upon to supply any other Government Departments within a radius of six miles from Melbourne, and for which no contracts have been taken, at the same rates.

4. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by the particulars of quantity, showing the net weight, to be endorsed on the back of the order, which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station, for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

5. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and, on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the district, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.

6. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.

8. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 6.

9. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue either to the public service or to the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 6.

10. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or of the delay in delivering or replacing it when required, or refusal to execute orders, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulet, not exceeding £20, as the Treasurer of the colony for the time being may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

11. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.

12. It will be competent for the Secretary of the Tender Board, on behalf of the Government, or for the contractor on his own behalf, to terminate the contract, by giving, in writing, a notice of three full calendar months to that effect, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the 1st day of a month, and provided that no such notice can be given before the 30th September 1887, and in the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.

## SHIRE OF BELLARINE.

BYE-LAW No. 16, AS TO DAIRIES, DAIRY CATTLE, AND MILK.  
THE Local Board of Health in and for the Shire of Bellarine, in the colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in "The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883" and every other power enabling the said Local Board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said Local Board, doth hereby make the following bye-law, being Bye-law No. 16 of the said Local Board of Health, that is to say:—

1. All former bye-laws on the matters and things herein-after provided for are hereby repealed.
2. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.
3. This bye-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the shire.

*Registration of Cowkeepers, Dairymen, and Purveyors of Milk.*

4. Every person carrying on the trade of cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall, on or before the first day of January in every year, register himself with the Local Board of Health in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the secretary of the Local Board of Health an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall with every such application pay a fee of two shillings and sixpence:—

To the Secretary of the Local Board of Health for the Shire of Bellarine.

5. Upon receipt of every such application and fee, the secretary for the Local Board of Health shall indorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received, and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

6. All paddocks, grounds, lands, and enclosures used as grazing ground for dairy cattle shall, whenever necessary, be inspected by any member or officer of the said local board or by any person authorized in writing by the chairman or secretary of the said local board; and if, on inspection, such paddocks, grounds, or enclosures, or any one of them, are or is likely, in the opinion of the officer or person so inspecting, to be prejudicial to health, by affecting the milk or otherwise, the said local board may, by an order in writing signed by the secretary, and served personally or left at the dwelling-house of the registered person, or in the case of an unregistered person, served personally or left at his dwelling-place, or posted upon the land, prohibit the use of the same for the purpose of feeding dairy cattle either absolutely or for any time named in such order. All cattle in dairies shall also be similarly inspected by a veterinary surgeon or other competent person, and any cows found to be diseased, or which from poverty or weakness are, in the opinion of the inspector, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, shall be forthwith removed from such dairy if ordered by such inspector or other officer as aforesaid. And any such order as aforesaid the said local board may revoke, but upon every fresh inspection a similar order may from time to time be made.

7. All houses, dairies, cowsheds, milk stores, milk shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated, and the drainage of all such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not.

8. All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows shall be regularly swept, and be kept perfectly

clean, and shall, within twenty-four hours of any order to such effect from the health officer or inspector of nuisances, be fumigated, disinfected, or lime-washed, as may be in any such order so directed.

9. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily.

10. If any person, or any member of the family of any person, registered as aforesaid, or not so registered but employed as a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor or member of the family of any visitor to any such person, shall be attacked by typhoid fever or any dangerous infectious disease, the occupier of the house in which such person shall be, or (if he be the person attacked) his wife or other person in charge, shall immediately give notice thereof to the local board or officer of health, or to the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the Local Board of Health, and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said local board or the officer of health, by order served as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of any such cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, until danger, in the opinion of such local board or officer of health, no longer exists. And in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering, or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering, to milk cows or to handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business. Nor, if the person registered or conducting such business be himself the person suffering, shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until, in either case, all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk or of its contamination has ceased.

11. If at any time disease exists in the dairy or among the cows or cattle in any cowshed or dairy, or in the herds of any cowkeeper, dairyman, vendor or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the local board, officer of health, or nearest member of the police force, and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.

12. No cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep, or permit or suffer to be kept, any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.

13. In the interpretation of this bye-law words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural, and the plural the singular, and the word "person" shall include a corporation.

14. Every person guilty of any breach of this bye-law, or of any of its provisions, shall be liable, in the discretion of the convicting justices, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings, or, in the like discretion, to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

THE Local Board of Health in and for the Town of Warrnambool, in the colony of Victoria, being the municipal council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in "The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883" and every other power enabling the said local board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said local board, doth hereby make the following bye-law, being Bye-law No. 2 of the said Local Board of Health, that is to say:—

1. All former bye-laws on the matters and things herein-after provided for are hereby repealed.

2. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This bye-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the said town.

*Registration of Cowkeepers, Dairymen, and Purveyors of Milk.*

4. Every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall, on or before the first day of March in every year, register himself with the Local Board of Health in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the Secretary of the Local Board of Health an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall with every such application pay a fee of two shillings and sixpence:—

6. All paddocks, grounds, lands, and enclosures used as grazing ground for dairy cattle shall, whenever necessary, be inspected by any member or officer of the said local board, or by any person authorized in writing by the chairman or secretary of the said local board, and if on inspection such paddocks, grounds, or enclosures, or any one of them are or is likely, in the opinion of the officer or person so inspecting, to be prejudicial to health by affecting the milk or otherwise, the said local board may, by an order in writing signed by the secretary and served personally or left at the dwelling-house of the registered person, or, in the case of an unregistered person, served personally or left at his dwelling-place or posted upon the land, prohibit the use of the same for the purpose of feeding dairy cattle either absolutely or for any purpose named in such order. All cattle in dairies shall also be similarly inspected by a veterinary surgeon or other competent person, and any cows found to be diseased or which from poverty or weakness are, in the opinion of the inspector, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, shall be forthwith removed from such dairy if ordered by such inspector or other officer as aforesaid; and any such order as aforesaid the said local board may revoke, but upon every fresh inspection a similar order may from time to time be made.

7. All houses, dairies, cowsheds, milk stores, milk shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not, shall be kept in such a state, in respect of cleanliness, as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated; and the drainage of all such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not.

8. All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows shall be regularly swept and be kept perfectly clean, and shall, within twenty-four hours of any order to such effect from the health officer or inspector of nuisances, be fumigated, disinfected, or lime-washed as may be in any such order so directed.

9. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily.

10. If any person or any member of the family of any person registered as aforesaid or not so registered, but employed as a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor or member of the family of any visitor to any such person, shall be attacked by typhoid fever or any dangerous infectious disease, the occupier of the house in which such person shall be, or (if he be the person attacked) his wife or other person in charge shall immediately give notice thereof to the local board or officer of health, or to the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the Local Board of Health; and thereupon it shall and may be ordered for the said local board or the officer of health, by order served as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of any such cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk until danger, in the opinion of such local board or officer of health, no longer exists. And in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering, or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering, to milk cows or to handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business. Nor, if the person registered or conducting such business be himself the person suffering, shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until, in either case, all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk or of its contamination has ceased.

11. If at any time disease exists in the dairy or among the cows or cattle in any cowshed or dairy or in the herds of any cowkeeper, dairyman, vendor or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the local board, officer of health, or nearest member of the police force, and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.

12. No cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep, or permit or suffer to be kept, any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking-yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.

13. In the interpretation of this bye-law words imputing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural and the plural the singular, and the word "person" shall include a corporation.

14. Every person guilty of any breach of this bye-law, or of any of its provisions, shall be liable, in the discretion of the convicting justices, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings, or in the like discretion to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

SHIRE OF MERRIANG LOCAL BOARD OF HEALTH.  
BYE-LAW No. 1, UNDER "THE PUBLIC HEALTH AMENDMENT STATUTE 1883."

IN pursuance of the powers contained in "The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883," and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, the Local Board of Health for Shire of Merriang being the Municipal Council thereof, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within its jurisdiction, doth hereby make the Bye-law following, that is to say:—

1. *Interpretation of terms.*—In the construction and for the purpose of this bye-law the following terms shall, if not inconsistent with the context or subject-matter, have the respective meanings hereby assigned to them:—

"House" shall mean and include dwellings of any kind, schools, hotels, licensed public-houses, factories, work-rooms, common or other lodging-houses, or other buildings or premises.

"Cesspool" shall mean any receptacle for night-soil, or for noxious or offensive matter below or above the ground.

"Street" shall mean and include any highway, and any public bridge, and any road, lane, footway, square, court, alley, or passage, whether a thoroughfare or not.

2. *Premises to be kept so as not to be a nuisance.*—Every occupier or person having the management or control of any house or premises shall cause the same to be kept in such a state as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

3. *Removal of house refuse.*—The occupier of any house, building, or other tenement, or premises within the shire of Merriang, shall cause the yard or ground adjacent or belonging thereto to be kept in a cleanly condition, and so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, or other such refuse-matter produced or accumulated on such premises, to be collected in one place upon such yard or ground, and to be there kept in an inoffensive condition, and so as that the same shall not be productive of any nuisance, and shall cause all refuse-matter so collected to be from time to time removed from such yard, ground, or premises as often as such refuse-matter shall amount to a quantity equal to two cubic yards; and if at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such rubbish or refuse-matter so removed as aforesaid, the local board may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier. Nothing contained in this bye-law shall be construed or taken to prevent the occupier of any premises from causing any manure, ashes, or other refuse-matter as aforesaid, produced or accumulated thereon, to be kept for the purpose of being used for manure on any garden, or on any land contiguous to such premises, provided such manure, ashes, or other refuse-matter shall not, when so used or previous to the removal thereof for use as manure on any garden or land as aforesaid, be kept or used so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

4. *Removal of offal.*—Every occupier of any premises on which may be any offal shall forthwith deodorize the same, and remove the same from the premises within twenty-four hours.

5. *Stables, cowsheds, and pigsties.*—The occupier of any land within the shire of Merriang, on which there shall be erected any stable, cowyard, cattle shed, or pigsty, shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state, in respect of cleanliness, as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health; and shall cause all dung, soil, or other manure produced or accumulated thereon, to be collected in one place in the yard of such premises, and to be there kept in an inoffensive condition and so as not to be productive of any nuisance; and shall cause such dung, soil, or other manure, to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of the same so collected or accu-

mulated shall amount to three cubic yards; and if at any time the occupier of any such premises shall neglect or fail to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid, the same shall be removed by the Local Board of Health at the expense of such occupier. Nothing in this bye-law shall be construed or taken to prevent the occupier of any such premises as aforesaid from causing the dung, soil, or other manure produced or accumulated thereon, to be used as manure on any garden or on any land contiguous to such premises, provided that such dung, soil, or other manure shall not, when so used or previous to removal thereof for use as manure for any garden or land as aforesaid, be kept or used so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

6. *Abattoirs and slaughter-houses.*—The occupier of every abattoir, slaughter-house, or place used for the purpose of having cattle or other animals killed therein, shall cause such abattoir, slaughter-house, or place to be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause the blood accumulated therein to be collected in a fit receptacle to be provided for that purpose, which receptacle shall be emptied of its contents at least once in every twenty-four hours. Before any blood shall be removed from any premises as hereinbefore mentioned, the occupier of such premises shall cause to be mixed therewith a quantity of chloride of zinc, perchloride of iron, Condy's fluid, chloride of lime, or some other efficient deodorizer, sufficient to effectually deodorize and disinfect the same.

7. *Offensive trades.*—The occupier of any premises within the shire of Merriang, used for the purpose of any trade, business, process, or manufacture whatsoever, causing effluvia, shall cause all rubbish, filth, offal, soil, or other offensive matter, produced or accumulated thereon, to be removed therefrom at least once in every twenty-four hours, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health; and if the occupier of any such premises shall neglect or fail to have removed therefrom any such offensive matter as aforesaid, such refuse-matter may be removed by the Local Board of Health, or its officers, at the expense of such occupier.

8. *Construction of privies.*—No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any privy except in the form of an earth-closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor whereof is at no point less than 3 inches above the surface of the adjoining ground; and every such building shall be constructed with proper openings or flues to provide sufficient means of ventilation, and shall be provided with a suitable pan or other movable receptacle for night-soil, the contents whereof does not exceed ten gallons, and with the requisite apparatus for the application of dry earth or some other deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan or receptacle and the contents thereof, and emptying and cleansing the same. Every privy attached to any school, hotel, licensed public-house, factory, work-room, or common lodging-house, and every public privy, shall be flagged or paved with some non-absorbent material, having a fall or inclination towards the door or other opening of at least half-an-inch to the foot.

9. *Supply of deodorizing material to earth-closets.*—Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall cause to be kept in every earth-closet belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in any pan or other receptacle in such earth-closet to be immediately, on the deposit thereof, covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan or other receptacle.

10. *Emptying receptacles for night-soil.*—Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises, once at least in every fortnight, shall empty or cleanse, or cause to be emptied or cleansed, every earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil in or belonging to such premises, or as soon as any portion of the contents of such earth-closet, privy, or cesspool, shall have accumulated therein so as to be within a distance of three inches from the top in the case of an earth pan, and six inches from the top in the case of a cesspool. No privy cesspool shall have connected therewith or attached thereto any pipe or other appliance capable of being used for the purpose of discharging or removing the contents of such cesspool upon or under the surface of any adjoining land, or into any drain or sewer.

11. *Construction of cesspool.*—Every cesspool shall be furnished with a water-tight cover or roof, and every cesspool which shall have been formed or made below the surface of the ground shall have water-tight walls or sides, which project on all sides at least six inches above the surface of the ground.

12. *Disposal of refuse and offensive matter.*—No person shall place or deposit any dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, or soil, or any night-soil or other offensive matter, in any place so as to be a nuisance to any person or injurious to health: All night-soil placed on any land for the purpose of manure or otherwise shall be immediately covered, and shall be kept covered with at least six inches of sound dry earth.

13. *Deposit of rubbish manure, &c.*—No person shall deposit or cause or suffer to be deposited in or on any street, road, right-of-way, lane, passage, or water-channel, or in any creek, river, or reservoir, or in any other public place (not being a manure depot duly appointed by the Local Board of Health as a place for the deposit of such manure, rubbish, or other such refuse-matter) any dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, offal, manure, dung, or soil; and for the purposes of this bye-law any unsold or reserved public lands, other than any manure depot as aforesaid, shall be deemed or taken to be a public place as before-mentioned.

14. *Earth-closets, &c., not to be emptied into drains or sewers.*—No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying, any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter into any drain or sewer, or so that the contents thereof may find its way, or be likely to find its way, into any drain or sewer.

15. *Prevention of pollution of water.*—No person shall place, assist in placing, or cause or permit to be placed, in, or so that the same may or may be likely to find its way into any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, any matter or thing likely to endanger the health of any persons using such water or drinks, or milk, or other produce of such dairy.

16. *Keeping of animals.*—No person shall keep any animal of any kind so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health, or in such a manner as to pollute any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, so as to endanger the health of any person using such water or drinks or milk or other produce of such dairy.

17. *Supply of water to slaughter-houses.*—Every occupier or licensee or person having the management or control of a slaughter-house or abattoir shall cause the same to be supplied with a sufficient quantity of water for all purposes.

18. *Drainage of new buildings.*—Every person erecting or causing to be erected any new buildings shall cause the foundations thereof, and the ground over which such building is to be placed, to be rendered dry, sound, and well drained, so that no water soakage or damp shall lodge there.

19. *Drainage of existing buildings.*—Every owner of a building shall cause the same to be provided with proper and sufficient drains, so constructed as to prevent any nuisance arising therefrom, and to secure the healthfulness of the inmates of such building; and every tenant of a building under a lease of which fourteen years or upwards is expired shall be deemed an owner within the meaning of this section.

20. All former bye-laws on the matter and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed, excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this bye-law coming into operation.

21. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

22. This bye-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the said shire.

23. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds for every such breach, or of Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties—such portion not being less than Five shillings—to be paid. And any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty, notwithstanding that the Local Board of Health may be empowered by this bye-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such local board has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

BYE-LAW No. 2, AS TO DAIRIES, DAIRY CATTLE, AND MILK.

THE Local Board of Health in and for the Shire of Merriang, in the colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in "The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883," and every other power enabling the said Local Board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said Local Board, doth hereby make the following bye-law, being Bye-law No. 2 of the said Local Board of Health, that is to say:—

1. All former bye-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed.

2. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This bye-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the Shire of Merriang.

*Registration of Cowkeepers, Dairymen, and Purveyors of Milk.*

4. Every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper, dairymen, or purveyor of milk shall, on or before the first day of February in every year, register himself with the Local Board of Health in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the secretary of the Local Board of Health an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall with every such application pay a fee of Two shillings and sixpence:—

To the Secretary of the Local Board of Health for the Shire of Merriang.

5. Upon receipt of every such application and fee, the secretary for the Local Board of Health shall indorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received, and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

6. All paddocks, grounds, lands, and enclosures used as grazing ground for dairy cattle shall, whenever necessary, be inspected by any member or officer of the said local board or by any person authorized, in writing, by the chairman or secretary of the said local board; and if on inspection such paddocks, grounds, or enclosures, or any one of them, are, or is likely, in the opinion of the officer or person so inspecting, to be prejudicial to health, by affecting the milk or otherwise, the said local board may, by an order in writing signed by the secretary, and served personally or left at the dwelling-house of the registered person, or in the case of an unregistered person, served personally or left at his dwelling-place or posted upon the land, prohibit the use of the same for the purpose of feeding dairy cattle, either absolutely or for any time named in such order. All cattle in dairies shall also be similarly inspected by a veterinary surgeon or other competent person, and any cows found to be diseased, or which from poverty or weakness are, in the opinion of the inspector, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, shall be forthwith removed from such dairy if ordered by such inspector or other officer as aforesaid. And any such order as aforesaid the said local board may revoke, but upon every fresh inspection a similar order may from time to time be made.

7. All houses, dairies, cowsheds, milk stores, milk shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated; and the drainage of all such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not.

8. All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows shall be regularly swept, and be kept perfectly clean, and shall within twenty-four hours of any order to such effect from the health officer or inspector of nuisances be fumigated, disinfected, or lime-washed, as may be in any such order so directed.

9. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily.

10. If any person, or any member of the family of any person, registered as aforesaid, or not so registered but employed as a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor or member of the family of any visitor to any such person, shall be attacked with typhoid fever or any dangerous infectious disease, the occupier of the house in which such person shall be, or (if he be the person so attacked) his wife or other person in charge, shall immediately give notice thereof to the local board or officer of health, or to the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the Local Board of Health, and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said local board or the officer of health, by order served as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of any such cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, until danger, in the opinion of such local board or officer of health, no longer exists. And in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering, or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering, to milk cows or to handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business. Nor, if the person registered or conducting such business be himself the person suffering, shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until, in either case, all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk or of its contamination has ceased.

11. BYE-LAW No. 1.

*For keeping free from noisome matter yards, stables, and places used for noxious trades, slaughter-yards, &c., and for regulating management of earth-closets, privies, &c., disinfecting and deodorizing night-soil and other offensive matter, and for regulating its removal and final deposit.*

THE Local Board of Health in and for the Shire of Bet Bet, in the colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in "The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883," and every other power enabling the said Local Board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said Local Board, doth hereby make the following bye-law, being Bye-law No. 1 of the said Local Board of Health, that is to say:—

1. All former bye-laws on the matter and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed, excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this bye-law coming into operation.

2. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This bye-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the said Shire of Bet Bet.

4. The occupier of every house and premises within the said shire shall cause the yard and ground belonging thereto, or occupied in connection therewith, to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all filth, rubbish, and refuse matter to be from time to time removed from such yard and ground; and if at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such filth, rubbish, or refuse matter so removed as aforesaid, the local board may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier.

5. The occupier of any land in the said shire on which there shall be erected any stable, cow-yard, cattle-shed, or pigsty, shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state, in respect of cleanliness, as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health; and shall cause all soil, dung, or other manure produced or accumulated therein to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of the same so produced or accumulated shall amount to one cubic yard; and if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect or fail to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid, the same shall be removed by the said local board at the expense of such occupier.

6. The occupier of every house, building, or tenement within the said shire shall cause every cesspool already in existence, and until its abolition, to be emptied and cleansed from time to time as soon as any portion of the contents of such cesspool shall have so accumulated therein as to be within a distance of one foot from the top of the sides, walls, or lining of such cesspool. Provided that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom except between the hours of Eleven p.m. and Five a.m. And provided also that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom until such contents shall have had mixed therewith carbolic acid or some other efficient deodorizer sufficient in quality and quantity to effectually deodorize and disinfect the same.

7. Every occupier and every person having the management and control of any premises shall, once at least in every week, empty and cleanse, or cause to be emptied and cleansed, every earth-closet, privy, and place in the nature of an earth-closet for the reception of night-soil on or belonging to such premises.

8. No person shall empty any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the reception of night-soil except by means of a cart, carriage, or means of conveyance properly constructed and furnished with a sufficient covering, so as to prevent the escape of the contents or any portion thereof, or of offensive matter or thing shall be removed to and deposited in such place or places only as may be appointed by the local board from time to time for the final reception of the same.

9. All night-soil, blood, offal, or other offensive matter or thing shall be removed, placed, or deposited, or spreading or suffering to be placed, or deposited, or spread, or assisting in placing, or depositing, or spreading on any land, whether by way of manure or otherwise, any night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter

removed from any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or other place, shall, immediately on the deposit or spreading thereof, cover the same, or cause the same to be covered, and shall keep the same covered, with a layer of earth not less than six inches in thickness.

11. The occupier of any premises within the shire used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, process, or manufacture whatever, or used for the purpose of slaughtering, whether it be an abattoir or otherwise, shall cause any rubbish, blood, offal, bones, water, liquid, soil, or other offensive matter produced or accumulated thereon to be removed therefrom once in every twenty-four hours, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, or to exhale any offensive effluvia; and if such occupier shall neglect or fail to have removed therefrom any offensive matter whatever it may be removed by the said local board at the expense of such occupier.

12. Every closet-pan shall be constructed of galvanized iron, properly riveted and soldered, so as to be watertight, and with handles thereto, and of a capacity not exceeding three cubic feet.

13. No closet door or trap shall abut or open on a street, lane, or right-of-way exceeding ten feet in width.

14. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds for every such breach, or of Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties—such portion not being less than Five shillings—to be paid. And any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty notwithstanding that the Local Board of Health may be empowered by this bye-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such local board has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

And any such order as aforesaid the said local board may revoke, but upon every fresh inspection a similar order may from time to time be made.

7. All houses, dairies, cowsheds, milk stores, milk shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated, and the drainage of all such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not.

8. All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows shall be regularly swept, and be kept perfectly clean, and shall, within twenty-four hours of any order to such effect from the health officer or inspector of nuisances, be fumigated, disinfected, or lime-washed, as may be in any such order so directed.

9. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily.

10. If any person or any member of the family of any person registered as aforesaid, or not so registered, but employed as a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor or member of the family of any visitor to any such person shall be attacked by typhoid fever or any dangerous infectious disease, the occupier of the house in which such person shall be, or (if he be the person attacked) his wife or other person in charge shall immediately give notice thereof to the local board or officer of health or to the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the Local Board of Health, and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said local board or officer of health, by order served as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of any such cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk until danger, in the opinion of such local board or officer of health, no longer exists. And in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering, or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering, to milk cows or to handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business. Nor, if the person registered or conducting such business be himself the person suffering, shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until in either case all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk, or of its contamination, has ceased.

11. If at any time disease exists in the dairy or among the cows or cattle in any cowshed or dairy or in the herds of any cowkeeper, dairyman, vendor, or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the local board, officer of health, or nearest member of the police force, and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.

12. No cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep, or permit, or suffer to be kept, any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.

13. In the interpretation of this bye-law, words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural, and the plural the singular, and the word "person" shall include a corporation.

14. Every person guilty of any breach of this bye-law or any of its provisions shall be liable, in the discretion of the convicting justices, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings, or in the like discretion to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

All cattle in dairies shall also be similarly inspected by a veterinary surgeon or other competent person, and any cows found to be diseased, or which from poverty and weakness are, in the opinion of the inspector, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, shall be forthwith removed from such dairy if ordered by such inspector or other officer as aforesaid. And any such order as aforesaid the said Local Board may revoke, but upon every fresh inspection a similar order may from time to time be made.

7. All houses, dairies, cowsheds, milk stores, milk shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated, and the drainage of all such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman whether registered or not.

9. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily.

10. If any person, or any member of the family of any person, registered as aforesaid or not so registered, but employed as a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor or member of the family of any visitor to any such person, shall be attacked by typhoid fever or any dangerous infectious disease, the occupier of the house in which such person shall be or (if

he be the person attacked) his wife or other person in charge, shall immediately give notice thereof to the Local Board, or officer of health, or to the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the Local Board of Health, and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said Local Board or officer of health, by order served as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of any such cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, until danger, in the opinion of such Local Board or officer of health, no longer exists. BYE-LAW No. 1.

*For keeping free from noisome matter yards, stables, and places used for noxious trades, slaughteryards, &c.; and for regulating management of earth-closets, privies, &c., disinfecting and deodorizing nightsoil and other offensive matters, and for regulating its removal and final deposit.*

THE Local Board of Health in and for the Shire of Darebin, in the Colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in "The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883," and every other power enabling the said Local Board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said Local Board, doth hereby make the following bye-law, being Bye-Law No. 1 of the said Local Board of Health, that is to say:—

1. All former bye-laws on the matter and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed, excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this bye-law coming into operation.

2. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This bye-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the said Shire.

4. The occupier of every house and premises within the said Shire shall cause the yard and ground belonging thereto, or occupied in connection therewith, to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all filth, rubbish, and refuse matter to be from time to time removed from such yard and ground. And if at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such filth, rubbish, or refuse matter so removed as aforesaid, the local board may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier.

5. The occupier of any land in the said Shire on which there shall be erected any stable, cow-yard, cattle-shed, or pigsty shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state, in respect of cleanliness, as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all soil, dung, or other manure produced or accumulated therein to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of the same so produced or accumulated shall amount to three cubic yards. And if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect or fail to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid, the same shall be removed by the said local board at the expense of such occupier.

6. The occupier of every house, building, or tenement within the said Shire shall cause every cess-pool already in existence, and until its abolition, to be emptied and cleansed from time to time as soon as any portion of the contents of such cess-pool shall have so accumulated therein as to be within a distance

of one foot from the top of the side walls or lining of such cesspool. And provided also that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom until such contents shall have had mixed therewith carbolic acid or some other efficient deodorizer, sufficient in quality and quantity to effectually deodorize and disinfect the same.

7. Every occupier and every person having the management and control of any premises shall, once at least in every week, empty and cleanse, or cause to be emptied and cleansed, every earth-closet, privy, and place in the nature of an earth-closet for the reception of nightsoil on or belonging to such premises.

8. All nightsoil, blood, offal, or other offensive matter or thing shall be removed to and deposited in such place or places only as may be appointed by the local board from time to time for the final reception of the same.

9. Every person placing or depositing, or causing or suffering to be placed or deposited or spread, or assisting in placing or depositing or spreading, on any land, whether by way of manure or otherwise, any nightsoil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter removed from any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or other place, shall, immediately on the deposit or spreading thereof, cover the same or cause the same to be covered, and shall keep the same covered, with a layer of earth not less than six inches in thickness.

10. The occupier of any premises within the Shire used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, process, or manufacture whatever, or used for the purpose of slaughtering, whether it be an abattoir or otherwise, shall cause any rubbish, blood, offal, bones, water, liquid, soil, or other offensive matter produced or accumulated thereon to be removed therefrom once in every twenty-four hours, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, or to exhale any offensive effluvia. And if such occupier shall neglect or fail to have removed therefrom any offensive matter whatever, it may be removed by the said local board at the expense of such occupier.

11. Every closet-pan shall be constructed of galvanized iron, properly riveted and soldered so as to be watertight, and with handles thereto, and of a capacity not exceeding three cubic feet.

12. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds for every such breach, or of Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties, such portion not being less than Five shillings, to be paid. And any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty, notwithstanding that the Local Board of Health may be empowered by this bye-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such local board has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

Nor, if the person registered or conducting such business be himself the person suffering, shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until in either case all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk, or of its contamination, has ceased.

11. If at any time disease exists in the dairy or among the cows or cattle in any cowshed or dairy, or in the herds of any cowkeeper, dairyman, vendor or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the Local Board, Officer of Health, or nearest member of the police force, and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.

12. No cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, shall keep or permit or suffer to be kept any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.

13. In the interpretation of this bye-law, words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural and the plural the singular, and the word "person" shall include a corporation.

14. Every person guilty of any breach of this bye-law, or of any of its provisions, shall be liable in the discretion of the convicting

justices to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings, or in a like discretion to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

The foregoing bye-law was duly made, ordered, and passed by the Local Board of Health (being the Municipal Council) in and for the Shire of Darebin this eighteenth day of October in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-six.

#### SHIRE OF MARONG.

*A Bye-law of the Shire of Marong, made under section 213 of the Local Government Act 1874, and numbered 3, relating to obstructions to roads and streets by cattle.*

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1874, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Marong order as follows:—

If any cattle shall be found upon any land not being a common, and such that there is no fence whether upon the same land or any other dividing such first-mentioned land from any street or road, whether public or private, without any person having charge of such cattle, the owner of such cattle shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings for every head of such cattle, and the proper officer of the Council may seize such cattle and place the same at some neighbouring place of safe custody; and any justice, if such owner be not known, upon proof of the issue of a summons in the usual form addressed to such owner as "owner" only, without otherwise naming or describing him, such cattle and the place of seizure being duly described therein, and of the publication of such summons in some newspaper commonly circulating in the neighbourhood, may, after the expiration of twenty-four hours from such publication, proceed with respect to such owner not appearing as if personal service of a summons stating his name had been effected—or, if such owner appear, then as in other cases—and the justice may order the cattle to be sold, and the money arising from the sale, after deducting the said penalty and costs awarded, and reasonable expenses, to be estimated and assessed by the justice, of seizing, keeping, and selling the said cattle, shall be paid, if demanded within one month, to the owner of the cattle; and if not so demanded, then to the municipal fund; and if the said money shall not be sufficient for all the purposes aforesaid, the amount whereby the same falls short, or, if no such sale be ordered, the whole of the said amount, may be recovered from the said owner, if and when known, in like manner as other penalties and sums adjudged or ordered to be paid by justices are to be recovered.

If any cattle be at any time found in any street without any person having the charge thereof, the owner of such cattle shall forfeit for every head of such cattle a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings; and if such cattle shall, by reason of having been so found at large, have been impounded by the Council, the amount of such penalty and costs, if adjudged, respectively before the release or sale of such cattle, shall be added to the pound fees and charges payable in respect of such cattle, and the amount thereof, or such lesser amount (if any), as after the sale of the cattle may remain in the hands of the poundkeeper, shall be paid over by him accordingly; and if the proceeds of any sale of such cattle shall not be sufficient, after paying the lawful fees and charges aforesaid, to satisfy such penalty and costs, or if such penalty and costs shall have been adjudged after the release or sale of the cattle, the same, or so much thereof as remains unpaid, shall and may be recovered from the owner of the cattle in like manner as other penalties and costs adjudged by justices are by law to be recovered; and if, in the case of any information under this section, the owner be not known, then the provisions of the last preceding section, so far as necessary to give the adjudicating justice jurisdiction, shall apply.

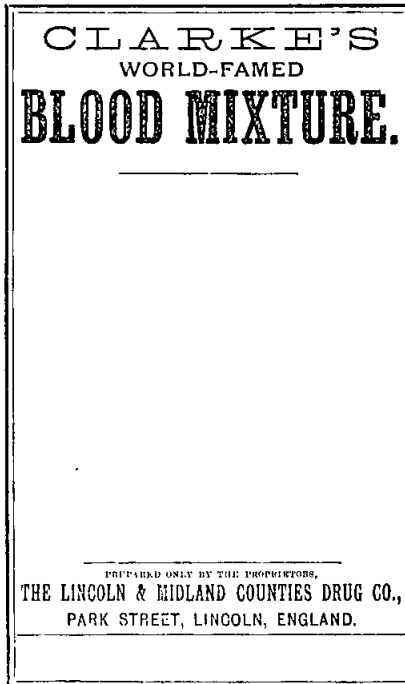

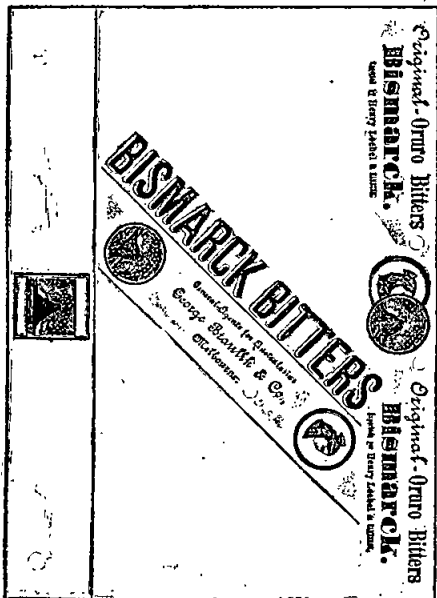
