The births of 1,135 children, viz., 597 boys and 538 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of November 1886, included were 7 cases of twins and 80 cases of illegitimate births. In the month of October 1,005 births were registered, or 130 less than in the month under review. The births were 390 above the average of the month during the previous ten years, but 231 above that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in November numbered 665, viz., 363 of males and 302 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 470, or 71 per cent. The deaths were more numerous than those in October by 175, and exceeded the average of November during the previous ten years by 199. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have exceeded that average by only 100.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was 3.29, and of deaths registered 1.93.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 95.4° on the 24th, and the lowest was 43.8° on the 15th. The mean temperature of the month (61.3°) was unusually high, being nearly 2½ degrees above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (41.5°) took place on the 24th, viz., from a maximum of 95.4° to a minimum of 53.9°. The least range (9.6°) was on the 25th, viz., from a maximum of 60.1° to a minimum of 50.5°. The mean daily range was 21.8°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.272" on the 14th, and the lowest was 29.469" on the 24th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.919 inches) was slightly above the average.

Rain fell on 6 days, the amount of rainfall being 2.67 inches. The average rainfall of November during the previous ten years was 2.93 inches.

Males contributed 55 per cent., and females 45 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 54 per cent. to that mortality, as against 48 per cent. in November 1885, 53 per cent. in November 1884, 45 per cent. in November 1883, 49 per cent. in November 1882, 38 per cent. in November 1881, 41 per cent. in November 1880, 39 per cent. in November 1879, 35 per cent. in November 1878, and 42 per cent. in the November of 1877 and 1876.

Twenty-four of the deaths were of persons who had attained the age of 75 years or upwards, viz.:—Those of a female, aged 75, who died of cerebral effusion; a female, aged 75, of apoplexy; a female, aged 75, of dropsy; a carpenter, aged 76, of hepatitis; a builder, aged 76, of hæmiplegia; a male, of no occupation, aged 76, of asthma and bronchitis; a female storekeeper, aged 76, of apoplexy; a female, aged 76, of chorea; a male, aged 77, of sanguineous apoplexy; a gentleman, aged 80, of broncho-pneumonia; a female, aged 81, of cause unknown (died suddenly); a gentleman, aged 81, of gout; a gentleman, aged 83, of heart disease; a builder, aged 86, of ascites; a female, aged 75, a female, aged 78, a labourer, aged 79, a labourer, aged 80, a female, aged 81, a gentleman, aged 81, a baker, aged 85, a labourer, aged 85, a female, aged 87, and a female aged 88, of old age.

Twenty-four deaths were ascribed to external causes during the month, of which 20 were set down to accident, 2 to homicide, and 2 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A male child, aged 5, sustained dislocation of the neck by falling off a fence; a boy, aged 12, died of injury to the brain—caused by jumping off a tramcar in motion; a gentleman, aged 22, of a fractured thigh; a manufacturer, aged 33, of fracture of arm and ribs, caused by a piece of machinery falling upon him; a jockey, aged 35, of fracture of the pelvis, caused by a horse falling upon him whilst riding a steeplechase; a platelayer, aged 45, was killed by a train passing over him; a clerk, aged 26, died of scalds received by the explosion of a boiler; a female, aged 66, of accidental burns; a male child, aged 2 years, of severe scalds; a tinsmith, aged 42, and a female, aged 45, were poisoned, the former by hydrochloric, and the latter by carbolic acid; 2 male children, aged 1 and 4 respectively, and a labourer, aged 18, were accidentally drowned; a quarryman, aged 41, a groom, aged 62, and a female, aged 66, were "found drowned"; a seaman, aged 42, was suffocated by choking whilst eating his dinner; 2 male infants, aged 1 and 2 months respectively, died of suffocation, the latter in bed. The homicidal deaths were those of a female infant, whose skull was fractured at birth, and of a male infant, who was wilfully exposed when only one day old. Of the suicidal deaths, a waiter, aged 45, shot himself; and a gardener, aged 32, put an end to his life by drowning.

Ninety-five deaths, or 14 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—41 in the Melbourne Hospital, 13 in the Alfred Hospital, 1 in the Homoeopathic Hospital, 4 in the Children's Hospital, 1 in the Women's Hospital, 13 in the Immigrants' Home, 2 in the Benevolent Asylum, 4 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 5 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 6 in the Austin Hospital, 4 in the Melbourne Gaol, and 1 in the Infant Asylum.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 357, of which 193, or 54 per cent., were of males, and 164, or 46 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 294 were under one year of age, 44 were between one and two, 10 were between two and three, 2 were between three and four, and 7 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 308. Of these, 170, or 55 per cent., were males, and 138, or 45 per cent., were females; 19 were between five and ten, 6 were between ten and fifteen, 11 were between fifteen and twenty, 19 were between twenty and twenty-five, 26 were between twenty-five and thirty, 22 were between thirty and thirty-five, 25 were between thirty-five and forty, 25 were between forty and forty-five, 19 were between forty-five and fifty, 29 were between fifty and fifty-five, 24 were between fifty-five and sixty, 23 were between sixty and sixty-five, 25 were between sixty-five and seventy, 11 were between seventy and seventy-five, 12 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 12 were upwards of eighty.

Deaths from specific febrile or zymotic diseases rose from 50 in October to 137. This was owing to the marked increase in the mortality from diarrheal diseases, which usually attends the setting in of the warm weather. These caused 111 deaths, as against only 13 in October; deaths from diphtheria also increased from 4 to 7. On the other hand, deaths from whooping-cough fell from 10 to 5, deaths from typhoid fever from 6 to 1, and deaths from measles from 4 to 3. Also, as a result of the increased heat, deaths from atrophy, debility, and inanition (almost entirely of infants or young children) increased from 21 to 61. Five deaths of child-bearing women took place in November, or 1 death of a mother to every 227 births registered, a proportion much below the average.

WHEREAS by The Licensing Act 1885 it was enacted that the Licensing Court for each Licensing District should, in the month of December in every year, hold an annual sitting of the Court at the place appointed, of which annual sitting one month's previous notice should be given in the Government Gazette: Provided that the Governor in Council might, by an Order in Council, extend the time for the holding of such Court by a period not exceeding two months from the thirty-first day of December: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order extend the time for the holding of the undermentioned Licensing Courts as hereunder specified (that is to say):—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said mill any female or any male under the age of sixteen for more than fifty-four hours in any one week, or more than ten hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That no such female or male under the age of sixteen shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without her or his consent.
3. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory for the information of all concerned.

**VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.**

**ANNUAL TICKETS FOR ALL LINES.**

Holders of annual tickets for all lines desiring to renew for 1887 are requested to send in their names to the Booking Office, Spencer street, as early as possible, so that the metals may be prepared in time.

**CHRISTMAS AND NEW YEAR'S EXCURSIONS.**

Holiday excursion tickets will be issued to and from all stations (suburban lines excepted) from the 20th December to the 5th January, both dates inclusive (Sundays excepted), available for return for one calendar month from date of issue. Example:—An excursion ticket issued on the 22nd December will be available till the 22nd January. When the last day falls on a Sunday, the ticket will be available till next day. The journey must be commenced on the day the ticket is issued, but after a distance of 15 miles has been travelled, the journey may be broken at the discretion of the passenger.

**Sydney Excursion Tickets.**—From the 15th December to the 5th January, both dates inclusive, excursion tickets will be issued at Melbourne to Sydney at the following return fares:—1st class, 45 6s. 6d.; 2nd class, £4 1s. These tickets will be available for two calendar months from date of issue, but will not be available by the express trains on the New South Wales lines.

**Luggage.**—Excursion passengers will only be allowed to carry such luggage free as can be stowed under the seats without inconvenience to other passengers, and those who have luggage for the van are required to be at the station half-an-hour before the train starts. Stamped parcels rate will be charged for it. All luggage should be plainly addressed with the owner's name and the station it is for.

**Horses and Vehicles.**—From the 22nd December to the 8th January, both dates inclusive, the Department cannot engage to forward horses and vehicles by passenger train, unless accommodation can be provided by special arrangement.

**Commercial Travellers' Samples.**—From the 22nd December to the 8th January, commercial travellers' samples will not be taken to or from roadside stations except by mixed or goods trains.

**Parcels.**—On the 24th December, parcels must be at the Melbourne Parcels Office thirty minutes before starting-time of ordinary trains.

Printed forms of tender and conditions of contract may be obtained from the Secretary, Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge at any station, by whom also information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per cental of 100 lbs. (net weight), including delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations, notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

Tenders, which should be upon the printed form, will be received for either oats, bran, hay, or straw (the particular kind of hay or straw offered to be stated); but if all be included in one tender it may be accepted for one article only, if advisable. Telegrams will not be entertained.

Tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for one-third of the estimated amount of the contract within ten days after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts amounting to £150 and upwards, and one surety for contracts under £150.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Forage," and deposited in the Tender-Box, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known by *Gazette* notice, and by letter to accepted tenderers.

## CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed, except when otherwise directed by the police; the straw to be wheaten or oatn, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats (Victorian grown) and bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from oatn hay of the best quality; the maize to be of the best quality. The hay tenders must specify whether they are for oatn or wheaten hay.

2. The supplies are for police, telegraph, and other horses, and are to be delivered on the order of the officer in charge of the district or station. The quantities stated in the schedule being only approximate, it must be understood that the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned; and should new telegraph stations be formed, or additional horses required to be stationed at any of the stations, the contractor will be required to supply the additional forage. Should the additional number of horses, however, exceed two, the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station under the contract according to the foregoing schedule.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Botanic and Domain Gardens may be called upon to supply any other Government Departments within a radius of six miles from Melbourne, and for which no contracts have been taken, at the same rates.

4. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by the particulars of quantity, showing the net weight, to be endorsed on the back of the order, which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station, for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

5. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and, on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the district, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.

6. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.

8. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 6.

9. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue either to the public service or to the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 6.

10. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or of the delay in delivering or replacing it when required, or refusal to execute orders, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Treasurer of the colony for the time being may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

11. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.

12. It will be competent for the Secretary of the Tender Board, on behalf of the Government, or for the contractor on his own behalf, to terminate the contract, by giving, in writing, a notice of three full calendar months to that effect, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the 1st day of a month, and provided that no such notice can be given before the 30th September 1887, and in the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.

Any shopkeeper within the municipality failing to close and keep closed his shop in accordance with the provisions of *The Shops and Factories Act 1885*, or of this bye-law thereunder, shall be liable to a penalty of Ten (10) shillings for the first offence, and to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds (£2) for a second or any subsequent offence within twelve months.

*A Bye-law making rates and charges for water supplied within the Water Supply District of the Shire of Chiltern.*

**BYE-LAWS** Nos. 4 and 6 of the Shire of Chiltern, dated May 5, 1881, and Nov. 6, 1885, are hereby repealed.

The Council of the Shire of Chiltern doth hereby, pursuant to and in the execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by "The Local Governing Bodies Loan Act 1872," No. 448, and the Amending Act of 1874 No. 500, and the "Local Government Act 1874," No. 506, make the following rate upon all lands and tenements within the Water Supply District of Chiltern, such rate to take effect from the first day of January 1886. And the said rate shall be due and payable half-yearly, on the 30th day of June 1886 and the 31st December 1886, and on the same days of those months in each succeeding year.

The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied other than by measure for domestic purposes.

1st. On every house and tenement of the annual value of £10 and under—Ten per centum per annum on the amount of the valuation.

2nd. On every house and tenement of the value of £10 and not exceeding £20—One pound per annum.

3rd. On every house and tenement above the annual value of £20 and not exceeding £30—One pound five shillings per annum.

4th. On every house and tenement above the annual value of £30 and not exceeding £40—One pound ten shillings per annum.

5th. On every house and tenement above the annual value of £40 and not exceeding £50—One pound fifteen shillings per annum.

6th. On every house and tenement above the annual value of £50 and not exceeding £60—Two pounds per annum.

7th. On every house and tenement above the annual value of £60 and not exceeding £80—Two pounds ten shillings per annum.

8th. On every house and tenement above the annual value of £80 and not exceeding £100—Three pounds per annum.

9th. On every house and tenement above the annual value of £100 and not exceeding £150—Four pounds per annum.

10th. On every house and tenement above the annual value of £150 and not exceeding £250—Five pounds per annum.

11th. On every house and tenement above the annual value of £250—Six pounds per annum.

12th. Water from the stand-pipes and public taps will be supplied to licensed persons only at the following rates:—

A licence to cart water for sale (with horse and dray) from the stand-pipes—One pound per annum.

A licence to cart water (with horse and dray) for the use of the licensee only—Ten shillings per annum.

A licence to carry away water from the public taps other than by horse and dray—Five shillings per annum.

13th. Water for steam boilers will be supplied by measure or by special agreement.

14th. Water troughs—Five shillings per annum.

15th. Livery stables—Ten shillings per stall (one stall allowed for every £50 of annual value).

16th. Hotel, with stabling (not being livery stables)—Four shillings per stall (one stall allowed for every £50 of annual value).

#### SHIRE OF CHILTERN.

##### BYE-LAW No. 8.

*A Bye-law for regulating the supply of water within the Water Supply District of Chiltern.*

**BYE-LAWS** Nos. 4 and 6 of the Shire of Chiltern, dated 5th May 1881 and 6th Novr. 1885, are hereby repealed.

The Council of the Shire of Chiltern doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred in and by the "Public Works Statute 1865," No. 289, and the "Local Government Act 1874," No. 506, make the following regulations for the supply and control of water within the Water Supply District of Chiltern.

1st. The council may cause meters to be affixed in any case where they may consider it necessary, such meters to be provided and fixed at the expense of the consumers, and the water supplied to be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons over and above the amount for which they are rated. Syphon-pumps will not be allowed unless the water is supplied by measure. No meter shall be affixed until the register shall be approved by the council.

2nd. If any meter cease registering, and during the time it is undergoing repair, the council shall estimate and charge for the water consumed by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter, or during the corresponding period of the preceding year.

3rd. The council reserves the right to make the supply from the mains intermittent instead of continuous, and to fix the hours during which such intermittent supply shall be turned on to each portion of the town.

4th. The council also reserves the right to forbid the use of hose for watering the streets or footpaths of the town at any time when it may be considered necessary. Any person watering the streets or footpaths with a hose after receiving notice from the council not to do so will be liable to a penalty of £2 for each offence.

5th. A supply of water for domestic purposes shall not include a supply of water for irrigation (which term "irrigation" shall include any mechanical or artificial contrivance for carrying water to the roots of plants without labor, or for water power, or for fountains, or for any ornamental purpose).

6th. Any person receiving water from the council who shall allow any unlicensed person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

7th. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the council who shall take or carry away water from any drinking-tap, trough, or private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

8th. Any person who shall offend by opening any ground so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the council, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the council, without the permission, in writing, of the council being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine, the property of the council, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

9th. Any person who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the council, without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the council, or who shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of some officer of the council, or who shall lay any leaden or other pipe to communicate with the pipe of the council of a strength and material not sanctioned by the council, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the council. Wrought-iron and lead piping, of approved quality only, will be allowed to be fixed for either internal or external services. No service of a larger bore than 3-inch will be permitted unless by special consent of the council.

10th. If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the council into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the council that such service-pipe requires repairing, the council may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off such service-pipe or otherwise as the said council may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected. The service-pipes from the main being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupier (if any), and if none, the owner, shall in every instance in which any change shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky or otherwise out of repair or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the council.

11th. Any person supplied with water by the council who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the council.

12th. Any person connecting any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam-boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the metre, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the council.

13th. Overflow-pipes to private baths will not be permitted.

14th. If any person supplied with water by the council does or causes to be done anything in contravention of any of these regulations, or fails to pay his rates when due, or fails to do anything which under any of these regulations ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the council may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of injury remains or is not remedied.

15th. In the construction of this Bye-law the word "council" shall mean the Shire Council of Chiltern.
