"THE PUBLIC SERVICE ACT 1883,"-REGULATIONS.

CLASSIFICATION OF PROFESSIONAL DIVISION.

Section 41, sub-section I.

CLASSIFICATION OF PROFESSIONAL DIVISION.

Section 41, sub-section I.

WHEREAS by The Public Service Act 1883, section 12, it is enacted that the Professional Division of the Public Service shall include all persons holding those offices, whether now existing or hereafter to be created, which require for their exercise some skill usually acquired only in some profession or other pursuit different from that required in the Clerical or Non-Clerical Division; and also the persons holding the offices of Inspector-General, Assistant Inspector-General, and Inspectors in the Education Department, as existing at the time of the passing of the said Act, or thereafter to be created: And whereas by section 17 of the said Act it is enacted that the officers in the Professional Division shall be paid such salaries, in accordance with a fixed amount or scale to be determined by regulation, and as may be provided in the annual Appropriation Act: And whereas by section 22 of the said Act it is enacted that the Public Service Board shall classify the work performed by all persons employed in offices doing professional work, in accordance with Regulations to be made by them in that behalf, and that such persons shall thereupon be placed in the Professional Division in the respective classes assigned to the work performed by them: And whereas by section 41 of the said Act it is enacted that the Public Service Board shall make Regulations which shall have full force and effect as soon as approved by the Governor in Council, and may, subject to such approval, from time to time repeal, alter, and amend the same:—For the arrangement of the Professional Division into as nany classes as the Public Service Board did make Regulations which, in the opinion of the Public Service Board, will be a fair equivalent for the work to be performed by such persons: And whereas the Public Service Board did make Regulations for such purposes, which Regulation were, on the 12th January 1885, approved by the Governor in Council: And whereas the said Reg

WHEREAS by The Public Service Act 1883, section 15, it is enacted that the Non-Clerical Division shall include all persons whose appointment has been determined by priority of registration, in accordance with Regulations to be made as hereinafter provided, and also all persons permanently employed in the Public Service before the passing of the Act, who are not included in the other divisions of the Public Service: And whereas by section 17 of the said Act it is enacted that in the Non-Clerical Division the officers shall be paid such emoluments, salaries, allowances, and wages, in accordance with a fixed amount or a scale to be determined by Regulation, and as may be provided in the annual Appropriation Act: And whereas by section 41 of the said Act it is enacted

A REGULATION OF THE ROMSEY SHIRE WATERWORKS TRUST, MADE UNDER THE 44TH SECTION OF "THE VICTORIAN WATER CONNERVATION ACT 1881," FOR THE PURPOSE OF IMPOSING, LEVYING, AND RECEIVING OF A BATE.

Regulation No. 7.

In pursuance of the powers granted and conferred by section 44 of The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1881, the Commissioners of the Ronsey Shire Waterworks Trust make the following Regulation:-

A rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling shall be imposed and levied on all the rateable property in the Waterworks District of the Shire of Romsey Waterworks Trust, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the Shire of Romsey in which such lands and tenements are situated, for one year, commencing on the first day of January 1887 and ending on the thirty-first day of December 1887.

Such rate shall be payable and collected in two equal portions or instalments of One shilling each; and the first portion or instalment shall be due and payable on the second day of January 1887, and the second portion or instalment shall be due and payable on the second day of July 1887.

Such persons as the Commissioners of the Romsey Shire Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive, collect and recover, the said rate.

Regulations in connection with the Vote of Nine thousand five hundred pounds (£9,500) for Fenciny and Improving Public Parks and Gardens under the control of Borough Councils, Trustees, Committees of Management, &c.

 1. A sum not exceeding Ten shillings shall be paid to the treasurer of the managing body of any public park or garden having a claim on the vote for every One pound expended by such body on fencing, preparation of land and planting, forming of roads and paths, and such other works as the Minister may approve, in such park or garden between 1st January 1886 and 31st December 1886, out of funds locally contributed, provided such claim be received by the Secretary for Agriculture on or before the 1st February 1887. Every statement of particulars of claim on the vote must be made in the form A, and be accompanied by a declaration in the form B.

WHEREAS by the 133rd section of The Land Act 1884 power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make and alter or reseind rules and regulations, or to rescind any rules and regulations heretofore made, for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering in or upon such public parks and reserves: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the Regulation following to be observed and enforced in respect of the land temporarily reserved, by Order of 19th Juno 1882, as a site for Camping and for affording access to Water in the parish of Longford.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

1. The burial ground will be open to the public from sunrise

1. The ournal ground will be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.

2. All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.

3. By the 19th section of The Cemeterics Statute 1864, any person making a vault, or creeting or placing a monument in the cemetery by and with the permission of the trustees under these rules, and upon payment of the charges therein mentioned, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep a vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the terms of such permission, to and for the sole and separate use of such person or persons and his or their representatives for ever.

4. Application for such permission to be made to the trustees. A certificate of permission will be granted to the party applying on payment of the proper charges in the form contained in Schedule A.

5. The charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such cemetery on a certificate of a minister of religion or other evidence proving to the satisfaction of the trustees that such person was a pauper, or that the relations and friends of the deceased are unable to pay the costs and charges.

6. Parties wanting brick graves or vaults will be required to construct them under the direction of the trustees, and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent in writing of the party entitled thereto must be left with the order.

7. Orders for interment to be given to the sexton (or other person appointed by the trustees) seven working hours prior to the hour fixed for the funeral. If not, an extra charge will be made.

8. The name, age, denomination, late place of residence, and probable cause of death of deceased must be stated at the time of giving the order for interment.

9. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones must be kept in repair and proper condition by and at the expense of the owners.

9. All monuments, Valuels, graves, and gravestones have been in repear and proper condition by and at the expense of the owners.

10. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave must be bricked up and covered by a slab or stone, slate, iron, or brick, to the satisfaction of the trustees. The trustees may leave a space of not exceeding two feet between each selected portion and any adjoining grave, or between two adjoining selected ground or grounds.

11. The plans of all monuments, tombstones, and fences to be submitted to the trustees for approval.

12. Any person wantonly or wilfully doing or causing to be done any damage to any monument, vault, tombstone, building, erection, railing, fence, tree, or plant in the cemetery is guilty of a misdemeanor, and being convicted thereof is hable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds or three months' imprisonment, as prescribed by the 35th section of the Act 27 Vict. No. 201.

13. No servant or other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.

14. The trustees reserve to themselves the right to make any alterations from time to time in these charges and regulations.

15. Until otherwise ordered, the usual hours fixed for interments will be from eight o'clock a.m. to six o'clock p.m. in the months of September to April inclusive, and from eight o'clock a.m. to four o'clock p.m. in the other four months.

Printed forms of tender and conditions of contract may be obtained from the Secretary, Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge at any station, by whom also information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per cental of 100 lbs. (net weight), including delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations, notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

Tenders, which should be upon the printed form, will be received for either oats, bran, hay, or straw (the particular kind of hay or straw offered to be stated); but if all be included in one tender it may be accepted for one article only, if advisable. Tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for one-third of the estimated amount of the contract within ten days after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts amounting to £150 and upwards, and one surety for contracts under £150.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Forage," and deposited in the Tender-Box, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne: or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

The decision of the Government will be made known by Gazette notice, and by letter to

- 1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed, except when otherwise directed by the police; the straw to be wheaten or oaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats (Victorian grown) and bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from oaten hay of the best quality; the maize to be of the best quality. The hay tenders pure tearlier whether the property of the pro must specify whether they are for oaten or wheaten hay.
- 2. The supplies are for police, telegraph, and other horses, and are to be delivered on the order of the officer in charge of the district or station. The quantities stated in the schedule being only approximate, it must be understood that the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned; and should new telegraph stations be formed, or additional horses required to be stationed at any of the stations, the contractor will be required to supply the additional forage. Should the additional number of horses, however, exceed two, the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station under the contract according to the foregoing schedule.
- 3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Botanic and Domain Gardens may be called upon to supply any other Government Departments within a radius of six miles from Melbourne, and for which no contracts have been taken, at the same rates.
- 4. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by the particulars of quantity, showing the net weight, to be endorsed on the back of the order, which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station, for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.
- 5. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and, on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the district, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.
- 6. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.
- 7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.
- 8. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 6.
- 9. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue either to the public service or to the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing: and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 6.
- 10. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or of the delay in delivering or replacing it when required, or refusal to execute orders, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding \$20\$, as the Treasurer of the colony for the time being may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.
- 11. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.
- 12. It will be competent for the Secretary of the Tender Board, on behalf of the Government, or for the contractor on his own behalf, to terminate the contract, by giving, in writing, a notice of three full calendar months to that effect, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the 1st day of a month, and provided that no such notice can be given before the 30th September 1887, and in the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.

THE Local Board of Health in and for the Shire of South Barwon, in the colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in "The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883," and every other power enabling the said Local Board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said Local Board, doth hereby make the bye-law following, being Bye-law No. 1 of the said Local Board of Health, that is to say:—

All houses, dairies, cowsheds, milk stores, milk shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated, and the drainage of all such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatover in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not. 6. All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows shall be regularly swept, and be kept perfectly clean, and shall, within twenty-four hours of any order to such effect from the beath officer or inspector of nuisances, be funnigated, disinfected, or lime-washed, as may be in any such order so directed.

7. All yessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly

disintected, or lime-washed, as may be in any such order so directed.

7. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily.

8. If any person or any member of the family of any person registered as a foresaid, ornot so registered, but employed as a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor or member of the family of any visitor to any such person shall be attacked by typhoid fever or any dangerous infectious disease, the occupier of any house in which such person shall be, or (if he be the person attacked) his wife or other person in charge shall immediately give notice thereof to the local board or officer of health or to the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the Local Board of Health, and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said local board or the officer of health, by order as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk for sale from any persons in the use and occupation of any such cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk until danger, in the opinion of such local board or officer of health, no longer exists. And in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering, to milk cows or to handle vossels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business. Nor, if the person registered or conducting such business be himself the person suffering, shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until in either case all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk, or of its contamination, has ceased.

9. If at any time disease exists in the dairy or among the cows or cattle in any cowshed or dairy or in the herds of any cowkeeper, dairyman, vendor, or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case

may be, shall immediately give notice to the local board, officer of health, or nearest member of the police force, and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.

10. No cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep or permit or suffor to be kept any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking yard in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.

11. In the interpretation of this bye-law words imputing the assuline gender shall be deemed and taken to include females,

11. In the interpretation of this bye-law words imputing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural and the plural the singular, and the word "person" shall include a corporation.

12. Every person guilty of any breach of this bye-law or of any of its provisions shall be liable, in the discretion of the convicting justices, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings, or in the like discretion to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

No person shall empty any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the reception of night-soil oxcopt by means of a cart, carriage, or means of conveyance properly constructed and functionals desired with a sufficient covering, so as to prevent the escape of the contents or any portion thereof, or of effluving therefrom.

9. All night-soil, blood, offal, or other offensive matter or thing shall be removed to and deposited in such place or places only as may be appointed by the local board from time, to time for the final reception of the same.

10. Every person placing or depositing, or causing or suffering to be placed, or deposited, or spread, or assisting in placing, or depositing, or spreading on any land, whether by way of manure or otherwise, any night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter removed from any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or other place, shall, immediately on the deposit or spreading thereof, cover the same, or cause the same to be covered, and shall keep the same covered, with a layer of earth not less than six inches in thickness.
