BASS STRAIT—WILSON PROMONTORY.

Anser Group—Sunken Rock northward of Cleft Island.

Telegraphic information has been received from the Government of Victoria of the existence of a sunken rock lying northward of Cleft Island, Anser Group.

This rock is stated to lie with Cleft Island bearing south, distant 7 cables, with 10 feet water over it.

Approximate position, lat. 39° 58' S., long. 146° 18' E.

NOTE.—Pending examination of the locality, mariners should not pass between the islands of the Anser Group.

AUSTRALIA—EAST COAST.

GREAT SANDY STRAIT.

(1) *Wide Bay Bar—Alteration in the direction of Leading Lights and Beacons.*

The Queensland Government has given notice, dated 12th August 1885, that the leading lights and square beacons near Hook Point now lead across Wide Bay Bar on a S.W. by W. $\frac{3}{4}$ W. bearing.

(2) *Leading Lights at Johnstone River Entrance.*

Also, that on 11th August 1885, the undermentioned leading lights would be exhibited at Johnstone River entrance (Gladly Inlet):—

1. Two white lights are shown, one on Flying Fish Point, the other on the shore on the further side of the bight of the river; these lights kept in line bearing W. by N. lead across the Outer Bar.
2. A green light is shown on the southern extremity of the rocks off Flying Fish Point.
3. At the Pilot Station on Coquette Point, a red light and a white light are shown; these lights kept in line bearing S.W. by W. lead across the flats between Flying Fish and Coquette Points.

DIRECTIONS.—Entering at night, cross the Outer Bar with the two white leading lights in line bearing W. by N., and when the water deepens, steer towards the green light on the rocks, passing it at the distance of 50 feet; then proceed along the Flying Fish Point shore, bring the red and white lights in line, and cross the flats towards Coquette Point. When the water deepens and that point is approached, proceed up the river.

Position of Flying Fish Point light, lat. 17° 30' S., long. 146° 6' E.

AUSTRALIA—EAST COAST.

PORT HINCHINBROOK.

Leading Lights at Rockingham Channel Entrance.

The Queensland Government has given notice that, on the 26th August 1885, the following leading lights would be exhibited at Rockingham Channel entrance, to enable vessels to cross the bar and enter the channel at night, viz:—

1. Two white lights, which kept in line bearing S.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ W., lead half a cable southward of the Fairway buoy. The outer light, elevated 10 feet above high water, is situated one mile southward of Lucinda Point, south side of Rockingham Channel entrance. The inner light, elevated 36 feet above high water, is distant 230 yards from the outer light.
2. One white light on Lucinda Point, elevated 10 feet above high water, and visible between the bearings of S. by E. $\frac{1}{4}$ E. and S.E., or between the third red and third black buoys.
Approximate position, lat. 18° 31' S., long. 146° 22' E.
3. Two lights on the shore about three-quarters of a mile W. by N. from Lucinda Point, both elevated 33 feet above high water; and bearing from each other E. by N. and W. by S., distant 179 yards. The front light is red and the rear light white. The red light (at the Pilot Station) is obscured between the bearings of S.W. $\frac{3}{4}$ W. and S.S.E. $\frac{1}{4}$ E., and is again visible through a small sector from S.S.E. $\frac{1}{4}$ E. (in line with the black buoy at the anchorage) to S.E. $\frac{1}{4}$ S.

DIRECTIONS.—Vessels intending to cross the bar must bring the two white lights in line bearing S.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ W., before Hillock Point bears northward of N.N.W. Keep these white lights in line until the red and white lights are nearly in line; a vessel will then be about three-quarters of a cable from the second red buoy. Proceed with the red and white lights in line bearing W. by S., until the white light on Lucinda Point opens out on a S. by E. $\frac{3}{4}$ E. bearing, she will then be one cable distant from the third red buoy. Then, if proceeding up the channel, steer N.W. by W. $\frac{1}{4}$ W. for the Bluff.

If going to the anchorage off Dungeness, steer W.N.W. (being careful to keep within the white light on Lucinda Point, the western limit of which is on a S.E. bearing) until the small sector of red light at the Pilot Station is opened out on a S.S.E. $\frac{1}{4}$ E. bearing, when a vessel may anchor in 3½ fathoms, the water deepening farther to the northward and westward to 7 fathoms. While within this sector of red light, vessels are clear of the banks extending off the mouth of Enterprise Channel.

(The bearings and courses are magnetic. Variation 6½° easterly in 1885.)

NEW ZEALAND.

COOK STRAIT—NORTH ISLAND.

Foul Ground off Cape Palliser.

The Government of New Zealand has given notice, resulting from a survey of the neighbourhood of Cape Palliser, off which the British steam vessel *Ionic* is reported to have struck on 28th June 1885, that sunken rocks project about 7 cables southward of the easternmost of the two points forming the cape, and that foul ground extends for a distance of 1½ miles from the shore.

NOTE.—It is yet recommended that vessels should not round Cape Palliser within the distance of 2 miles.

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HYDROGRAPHIC NOTICES.—NEW GUINEA AND NEW HEBRIDES.

THE following Notices to Mariners, which have been received from the Rear-Admiral commanding the Australian Station, are published for general information.

Hydrographic information with reference to the vicinity of
Su-a-u (Stacey Island, South Cape).

H.M.S. *Lark*, July 1885.

All bearings are magnetic.

Sunken Barrier Reef.—To the southward of Su-a-u the Sunken Barrier Reef extends in patches, in an E. $\frac{1}{2}$ S'y direction, at a distance of from four to five miles from the coast. The least water obtained on it, when reduced to L.W.S., was five and a half fathoms, coral; with from 40, decreasing to 20 fathoms between the barrier and the shore.

Deep Channel.—A convenient channel, with 40 and 50 fathoms between two patches, lies S. $\frac{1}{2}$ W. from the highest point of Su-a-u; which point is at the eastern end of the island, and not the western, as shown on Chart No. 2123 (corrected to June 1885).

Coast Line.—From Guna (Rugged Point) the coast line runs generally in an E.N.E'y direction with Monoli Point one mile distant; between which and the point, one mile further again to the eastward, is a bay with the small village of Naguna on its shores. Trending N.E. by E. from the second point for nearly another mile, it passes the villages of Sapouri and Garihi, and then bears northerly forming the west side of the Arotau Channel (to Bertha Lagoon).

This channel is barely a quarter of a mile wide, and very little longer; when soundings cease just as the lagoon—skirted with mangroves, and one vast mud flat at low water—commences to open out.

On the eastern side of the channel the coast line runs S'y. (with a bay about the centre) for half a mile, and then easterly for a quarter of a mile to Magilion Point, the northern side of the pass between the mainland and Su-a-u, there is a rock, always above water, with two and three fathoms, to its N.E'd. in the anchorage ground off this coast. It lies one and a half cables off shore and four and a half cables to the westward of Magilion Point. From this point the coast line runs N.E. by E. and E.N.E. for three miles, towards Catamaran Bay.

Coast Hills.—Behind Guna the land rises abruptly for 1000 feet; which, thence, it nearly maintains close to and in a direction parallel with the coast line; to Hadahada hill, whence it falls gradually towards the lagoon. On the other side of the channel it rises again to Lalieta Peak, 1200 feet above sea level, it then falls at once, the land along the coast to the eastward being low.

Su-a-u (Stacey Island, South Cape) lies off this coast; it is somewhat in the form of a crescent with the horns pointing S.E., two miles long, and narrow, except in its easterly portion, where it rises to an elevation of nearly 800 feet, the western end being 400 feet in height.

Fringing Reef.—It stands on a slightly fringing reef. The bay in the crescent is foul ground; here also the fringing reef grows further off the shore than anywhere else.

Vehi (or Wedge Island), of small extent and 120 feet high, lies half a mile W.S.W. from the south point of Su-a-u.

Rocks.—There are two rocks W.N.W. of Vehi. The outer one, which is always above water, is three cables distant from Vehi. There is also a three and a half fathom patch within quarter of a mile of the western shore of Su-a-u.

The channel between Su-a-u and the mainland is one and a quarter miles broad abreast Monoli Point, with three rocky patches right in its centre.

Stapleton Patches.—The easternmost of these, with three fathoms water, is very small, and lies half a mile north of the N.W. point of Su-a-u. The other two, with three and three quarters and three and a quarter fathoms, are S.E. by E. of Monoli Point, distant four and a half and seven cables respectively.

The channel gradually contracts to the N.E'd, to a width of only one and a half cables between the fringing reefs of the mainland and the northern point of Su-a-u Island.

Current.—A current sets through this channel; in July it was almost continuously to the westward, and at a rate of half to one and a half knots in the narrows.

Anchorage.—A good berth for small vessels in the S.E. Monsoon is to the eastward of the rock in the anchorage, in ten fathoms mud, with the Mission Flagstaff on the north point of Su-a-u, bearing S.E. by E. and the extreme of Mangilion Point N.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. For large vessels and for the N.W. Monsoon, the best anchorage is to the westward of the rock with the extremes of Su-a-u bearing E. by S. $\frac{1}{2}$ S. and S.W. by W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W., the depth being ten fathoms, mud.

Cawston Rock, with only one fathom on it, lies midway between the mainland and the eastern point of Su-a-u. It bears north from the latter, distant eight cables.

Baibesika (or Tissot Island), with two prominent peaks, the westernmost of which is 530 ft. above sea level, lies E.S.E. of Su-a-u, the channel between them being eight cables wide in the narrowest part. A lengthened search failed to find or give any indication of the sunken danger reported to exist half a mile N.W. of this island.

Ship Patches.—The easternmost of these patches, with three and three quarter fathoms, lies half a mile N.E. by N. of the N.E. point of Baibesika, and they extend thence three quarters of a mile to the W.N.W., three and three quarter fathoms being the least water, and the bottom rocky.

Directions.—In rounding the west end of Su-a-u a berth must be given to the rock to the W.N.W. of Vehi. A vessel of deep draught should then haul up and keep close to the island until the Stapleton patches are passed, when she can either bring up in the Sound in fourteen fathoms, or proceed to the anchorage recommended to the westward of the rock.

A vessel under sail entering from this direction in the S.E. Monsoon should hug the island, over which the wind comes very variably; this, with a westerly set, makes it difficult to fetch the anchorage without a tack.

To make the anchorage round the east side of the island, keep close to the western side of Baibesika, and then make for the eastern point of Su-a-u. If passing to the eastward of Baibesika, hug the N.E'n point of that island, to avoid the ship patches, and then steer for the right extreme of Su-a-u; keeping close along the fringing reef on the N.E. side of that island, to give a good berth to the Cawston Rock.

A vessel under sail should shorten in good time if intending to anchor off the Mission Station, as the room for rounding to is not great. Borrow towards Mangilion Point, off which the reef runs for a very short distance.

Water.—This has the reputation of being one of the best watering places on the coast. It may be obtained within a quarter of a mile to the eastward of the narrows; either from the mainland, or the island.

Natives.—The natives are apparently quiet and docile; during the stay, off and on, of a month, they became great friends. They are cannibals.

Provisions.—Yams, taro, sweet potatoes, pumpkins, bananas, and coconuts may be obtained from the natives in small quantities; also pigs occasionally; fish are not very plentiful. Ginger and betel nut are grown here.

Climate.—In July a great deal of rain was experienced. The atmosphere was very misty during the S. Easters.

Information has been received from Lieutenant and Commander Cross, H.M.S. *Undine*, of the discovery of several shoal patches, in addition to those already known, in the passage between Mallicolo and Tomman or Uru Islands, New Hebrides.

2. The 2-fathom patch on the Chart No. 856, 2 cables north of the N.W. point of Tomman or Uru Island, is of much larger extent than shown, and has only 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ fathoms over it on the north and west sides. The new patches fixed by Lieutenant and Commander Cross have from 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ to 2 fathoms over them, and are situated respectively W. $\frac{1}{2}$ S. 1 cable, S. $\frac{1}{2}$ W. 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ cables, and N.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ N. 2 cables from the 2-fathom patch.

3. The 2-fathom patch on the N.W. side is of larger extent than shown, and there is another shoal patch of 2 fathoms on the spot marked G.c.r.l. between it and the shore.

4. The N.E. portion of the bay is described as foul and un-ven, and Lieutenant and Commander Cross adds:—"This anchorage has nothing to recommend it, as it is bad holding-ground and badly sheltered from wind and sea. It is within 10 miles of the very good harbor of South-West Bay, Mallicolo Island."

5. This notice affects plan on Charts Nos. 856, Anchorages in the New Hebrides, and No. 1380, New Hebrides, New Caledonia, and Loyalty Islands. Bearings given are magnetic.

REGULATION No. 23.

A Regulation of the Borough of Hamilton, made under the Second Section of the Act to amend "The Police Offences Statute 1865," 42 Victoria No. 630, and numbered 23, for preventing the assembly of persons on the carriage-ways and footways of the Borough.

IN pursuance of the Act 42 Victoria No. 630, section 2, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Hamilton make the following regulation:—

No two or more persons shall be permitted to assemble or stand together on any part of any footway or carriage-way within the limits of the Borough of Hamilton, after being requested by any police constable on duty to move away from where such persons may be so assembled or standing together.

In case of any person or persons being requested to move away as hereinbefore provided, and such person or persons thereupon refusing or omitting to move away as requested, the police constable making the request is hereby authorized to ask from such person or persons his or their name or names and place or places of residence, and in case any such person or persons shall refuse to state to the constable his or their name or names and place or places of residence such constable may apprehend and deal with such person or persons in the mode prescribed by section 56 of "The Police Offences Statute 1865," 28 Victoria No. 265.

BOROUGH OF STAWELL.

LOCAL BOARD OF HEALTH.

Bye-law No. 1.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in "The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883," and of every other power enabling them in that behalf, the Local Board of Health for the Borough of Stawell, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within its jurisdiction, doth hereby make the bye-law following, that is to say:—

1. *Interpretation of terms.*—In the construction and for the purposes of this bye-law, the following terms shall, if not inconsistent with the context or subject-matter, have the respective meanings hereby assigned them:—

"House" shall mean and include dwellings of any kind, schools, hotels, licensed public-houses, factories, work-rooms, common or other lodging-houses, or other buildings or premises.

"Cesspool" shall mean any receptacle for night-soil or for noxious or offensive matter below or above the ground.

"Street" shall mean and include any highway, and any public bridge, and any road, lane, footway, square, court, alley, or passage, whether a thoroughfare or not.

2. *Premises to be kept so as not to be a nuisance.*—Every occupier or person having the management or control of any house or premises shall cause the same to be kept in such a state as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

3. *Removal of refuse from houses.*—Every occupier of a house or premises shall remove therefrom all dust and mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, or such other refuse matter produced or accumulated thereon once every week; and in case of the default of such occupier, the Local Board of Health may remove the same.

4. *Receptacles for house refuse.*—Every occupier of a house or premises shall provide and keep thereon a box or some other covered receptacle for the temporary deposit of house refuse, which box or receptacle shall be of such dimensions as that the same may, with the contents thereof, when full, be readily and conveniently removable by one man, or so many such boxes or receptacles as may be necessary to contain all the house refuse produced or accumulated on such premises during one week; and shall cause all house refuse to be deposited as soon as conveniently may be in some such box or receptacle.

5. *Removal of refuse from places where animals are kept.*—Every occupier of land on which is erected any stable, shed, sty, yard, or other place for the keeping of animals shall from time to time remove from such premises all dung, soil, or other manure produced or accumulated thereon as often as the same shall amount to two cubic yards, or once at least every week; and in case of the default of such occupier, the Local Board may remove the same.

6. *Power to use refuse as manure.*—Nothing hereinbefore contained shall be taken to prevent the occupier of any premises from causing any dung, soil, or other refuse matter produced or accumulated on any premises to be at any time removed, or to be used as manure on any garden or land, or to be kept for the purpose of being used on any garden or land contiguous to such premises as manure, so that the same be not so removed, kept, or used as to contravene any bye-law of the Local Board of Health, or so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

7. *Removal of refuse from places where noxious or offensive trades are carried on.*—Every occupier and every person having the management or control of premises used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, or manufactory whatsoever shall cause all rubbish, filth, offal, soil, or other offensive matters, and all waste products of such manufacture from which effluvia may arise, to be removed from such premises once at least in every twenty-four hours, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and so that no noxious or offensive effluvia arise therefrom; and if any such occupier or person shall neglect or fail to have removed any such offensive matter or waste products as aforesaid, the same may be removed by the Local Board of Health.

8. *Removal of blood from places where animals are slaughtered.*—Every occupier, licensee, or person having the management or control of an abattoir, slaughter-house, or place where any cattle or other animals are killed, shall cause all the blood from the animals killed therein, as soon as conveniently may be, to be collected in a fit receptacle to be provided for that purpose, and to be effectually deodorized by mixing therewith commercial sulphate of iron or chloride of lime in the proportion of 1 lb. to the gallon, or some other efficient deodorizer sufficient to effectually deodorize the same, and to be removed from the premises within twenty-four hours after such blood is shed.

9. *Removal of offal.*—Every occupier of any premises on which may be any offal shall forthwith effectually deodorize the same, and remove the same from the premises within twenty-four hours.

10. *Construction of privies (sec. 37).*—No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any privy, except in the form of an earth-closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor whereof is at no point less than 3 inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and every such building shall be constructed with proper openings or flues to provide sufficient means of ventilation, and shall be provided with a suitable pan or other movable receptacle for night-soil, the contents whereof does not exceed three cubic feet, and with the requisite apparatus for the application of dry earth or some other deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan or receptacle and the contents thereof, and emptying and cleansing the same. Every privy attached to any school, hotel, licensed public-house, factory, workroom, or common lodging-house, and every public privy, shall be flagged or paved with some non-absorbent material, having a fall or inclination towards the door or other opening of at least half-an-inch to the foot.

11. *Supply of deodorizing material to earth-closets.*—Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall cause to be kept in every earth-closet belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in any pan or other receptacle in such earth-closet to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan or other receptacle.

12. *Emptying receptacles for night-soil.*—Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises once at least in every week shall empty or cleanse, or cause to be emptied or cleansed, every earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil on or belonging to such premises.

13. *Night-soil to be removed by licensed nightmen only.*—No person shall empty any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, except by means of a night-cart duly licensed by the municipality.

14. *Removal of night-soil to be by properly constructed conveyances.*—No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, except by means of a cart, carriage, or means of conveyance properly constructed and furnished with a sufficient covering so as to prevent the escape of the contents or of any portion thereof, or of effluvia therefrom.

15. *Hours within which night-soil may be removed.*—No person shall empty, assist in emptying, or cause or permit to be emptied any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, except between the hours of Eleven o'clock p.m. and Five o'clock a.m., or until the contents thereof have been properly deodorized; and every person emptying or causing to be emptied any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil shall cause the night-soil taken therefrom to be removed so soon as the same is emptied.

16. *Construction of cesspools.*—Every cesspool shall be furnished with a watertight cover or roof, and every cesspool which shall be formed or made below the surface of the ground shall be constructed with watertight walls or sides which project on all sides at least 6 inches above the surface of the ground.

17. *Emptying of cesspools.*—Every occupier of premises and every person having the management or control of premises on which there shall be any cesspool shall cause the same to be emptied once at least in every week.

18. *Times within which cesspools may be emptied.*—No person shall empty, or assist in emptying, or cause or permit to be emptied, any cesspool or place for the deposit of offal, blood, or other refuse and offensive matter, except between the hours of 11 p.m. and 5 a.m., or until such contents have been properly deodorized; and every person emptying or causing to be emptied any cesspool shall remove or cause to be removed the contents thereof so soon as the same is emptied.

19. No person shall empty any cesspool or place for the deposit of offal, blood, or other refuse and offensive matter, except by means of a night-cart duly licensed by the municipality.

20. *Conveyances by which cesspools may be emptied.*—No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying any cesspool or place for the deposit of offal, blood, or other refuse and offensive matter except by means of a cart, carriage, or other conveyance properly constructed and furnished with a sufficient covering so as to prevent the escape of the contents, or any portion thereof, or of any effluvia therefrom.

21. *Disposal of refuse and offensive matter.*—No person shall place or deposit any dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, or soil, or any night-soil or other offensive matter, in any place so as to be a nuisance to any person or injurious to health.

22. *Night-soil, &c., removed from any earth-closet, &c., and deposited anywhere to be covered with earth.*—Every person placing or depositing, or causing or suffering to be placed or deposited, or assisting in placing or depositing, on any land, whether by way of manure or otherwise, any night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter removed from any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or other place of deposit, shall immediately on the deposit thereof cover the same or cause the same to be covered, and shall keep the same covered, with a layer of earth not less than six (6) inches in thickness.

23. *Earth-closets, &c., not to be emptied into drains or sewers.*—No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter into any drain or sewer, or so that the contents thereof may find its way or be likely to find its way into any drain or sewer.

24. *Prevention of pollution of water.*—No person shall place, assist in placing, or cause or permit to be placed, in or so that the same may or may be likely to find its way into any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, any matter or thing likely to endanger the health of any persons using such water or drinks, or milk or other produce of such dairy.

25. *Cesspools not to be emptied into water used for drinking or domestic purposes.*—No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying any cesspool or place for the deposit of offal, blood, or other refuse matter into any water supplied, used, or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, or so that the contents or any portion of the contents thereof may find its way, or be likely to find its way, into any such water.

26. Every accumulation or deposit of offensive matter so situated as to find its way, or be likely to find its way, into any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or likely to be used in any dairy, shall be deodorized and removed by the owner of the property upon which such accumulation or deposit is situated within one week of notice given by the Local Board or by one of its officers.

27. *Keeping of animals.*—No person shall keep any animal of any kind so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

28. *Animals not to be so kept as to pollute water.*—No person shall keep any animal in such a manner as to pollute any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, so as to endanger the health of any person using such water or drinks, or milk or other produce of such dairy.

29. *Supply of water to slaughter-houses.*—Every occupier or licensee or person having the management or control of a slaughter-house or abattoir shall cause the same to be supplied with a sufficient quantity of water for all purposes.

30. *Drainage of new buildings.*—Every person erecting or causing to be erected any new building shall cause the foundations thereof, and the ground over which such building is to be placed, to be rendered dry, sound, and well drained, so that no water, soakage, or damp shall lodge there.

31. *Drainage of existing buildings.*—Every owner of a building shall cause the same to be provided with proper and sufficient drains, so constructed as to prevent any nuisance arising therefrom, and to secure the healthfulness of the inmates of such building; and every tenant of a building under a lease of which fourteen years or upwards is unexpired shall be deemed an owner within the meaning of this section.

32. *Registration of cowkeepers, dairymen, and purveyors of milk.*—Every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall, on or before the first day of February in every year, register himself with the Local Board of Health in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the secretary of the Local Board of Health an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall with every such application pay a fee of (5s.) Five shillings.

33. Upon receipt of every such application and fee, the secretary of the Local Board of Health shall endorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received, and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

34. *Milk stores and shops to be kept clean.*—Every person following the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall cause every milk store or milk shop in his occupation, or under his management or control, and every milk vessel used by him for containing milk for sale, to be kept thoroughly clean.

35. *Dairymen, &c., to report disease to the health officer.*—Every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, and every person having the management of any such trade, shall forthwith report, in writing, to the health officer the occurrence of any disease in any of his milk cows, or of any contagious or infectious disease in man or animal upon the premises upon which such trade is carried on.

36. *Extent of application of bye-laws.*—This bye-law, containing sections numbered 1 to 37, shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the place or places within the jurisdiction of the Local Board of Health for the Borough of Stawell.

37. *Penalties.*—If any person commit a breach of any of the provisions of this bye-law he shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10, or to a penalty not exceeding £5 for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued. Provided the justices before whom any penalty imposed hereby is sought to be recovered may order the whole or part only (not being less than five shillings) of such penalty to be paid. And every person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the foregoing penalty, notwithstanding that the Local Board of Health may be empowered by these bye-laws or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such Local Board of Health have or have not taken advantage of such powers.

REGULATIONS FOR THE ADMISSION, FREE OF DUTY, OF QUEENSLAND SUGAR RETURNED BORDERWISE FROM NEW SOUTH WALES OR SOUTH AUSTRALIA INTO THIS COLONY.

1. Every shipment of sugar exported for return to this colony borderwise, as above, must be entered out in the usual way as if for export, with a declaration that the whole of the sugar so entered is for return to Queensland; and, in addition to the manufacturer's mark, each bag must be marked Q.S. with certain progressive numerals to be obtained at the Custom House.

2. The proper officer will then give a certificate in triplicate that the sugar in question is of Queensland growth and manufacture, and that it is being forwarded to Sydney or Port Adelaide, as the case may be, for return to Queensland, borderwise. Such certificate must show thereon the name of the shipper, name of the ship, marks and numbers of the bags, and name of Border Customs Station where it is intended the sugar shall enter Queensland. One copy of the certificate will be sent to the Customs authorities at Sydney or Port Adelaide, one to the Customs Officer on the Border, and the other must accompany the sugar *in transitu* for production to the Queensland Border Customs Officers.

3.
