NOTICE TO CANDIDATES FOR MASTERS' AND MATE'S CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY AND OTHERS.

VICTORIA.—EXAMINATIONS IN COLOR BLINDNESS.

Amended Regulations.

THE Board have made the following arrangements for the examination of persons as to their ability to distinguish colors. Previous Regulations on this subject are hereby cancelled:—

1. Examinations in color are open to any person serving or about to serve in the mercantile marine.

2. Any person, including the holders of certificates of competency, or persons about to apply for certificates of competency, if desirous of being examined *in colors only* must make application on Form Exn. 2^a, and pay a fee of One shilling.

3. He must on the appointed day attend for examination at the examiner's office; and if he passes he will receive a certificate to that effect.

4. If he fails it will be open to him to be examined again in colors as often as he pleases on payment of the fee of One shilling at each fresh attempt.

5. The application of a candidate who is presenting himself for examination for a master's or mate's certificate must be made on Form Exn. 2. Such examination will commence with the color test; and if the candidate does not at the time of making application hold a certificate of competency of any grade, and should fail to distinguish correctly any one of the colors used in the test, he will not be allowed to proceed with the examination in navigation and seamanship.

6. The fee he has paid for examination for a certificate of competency will include the fee for the color test, and, with the exception of One shilling, will in such event be returned to him.

7. A candidate for examination for a certificate of competency who at the time of making application does not possess a certificate, and who fails to pass the color test, may not be re-examined until after the lapse of three months from the date of his first failure. If he fails a second time he will be allowed a third trial at the expiration of another three months from the date of his second failure. A fresh fee must be paid at each succeeding examination.

8. It is therefore obviously to the advantage of candidates for certificates of competency to apply in the first instance to be examined in *colors only* on Form 2^a.

9. A candidate who holds a certificate of competency, and who on presenting himself for examination for a certificate of a higher grade is unable to pass the color test, will notwithstanding be permitted to proceed with the examination in navigation and seamanship for the certificate of the higher grade.

10. Should he pass this examination, the following statement will be written on the face of the higher certificate which may be granted to him, viz.: "This officer has failed to pass the examination in colors."

11. Should he fail to pass the examination in navigation and seamanship, a like statement, relating to his being color blind, will be made on his inferior certificate before it is returned to him.

12. Holders of certificates which bear the statement of their having failed to pass in colors, and who may desire to have the statement removed from their certificates; must obtain the special permission of the Board.

PENAL ESTABLISHMENTS AND GAOLS.—
REGULATIONS RELATING TO VISITORS.

IN pursuance of the provisions of sec. 9 of an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, intitled *An Act to Consolidate the Law relating to Gaols*, the Governor in Council has revoked all existing regulations relating to visitors to penal establishments and gaols, and to prisoners or persons detained therein, and has made the following regulations in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

RULES TO REGULATE VISITS TO PENAL ESTABLISHMENTS AND GAOLS, AND PRISONERS OR PERSONS DETAINED THEREIN.

1. *Penal establishment, Pentridge, and the Melbourne Gaol.*—Visitors wishing to inspect the penal establishment at Pentridge, or the Melbourne Gaol, will be admitted only on Tuesdays and Thursdays, between the hours of one and three o'clock, and only upon the written order of the Honorable the Chief Secretary or the Inspector-General of Penal Establishments.

2. *Country gaols.*—Visitors wishing to inspect country gaols will be admitted at reasonable hours on any working day at the discretion of the various gaolers.

3. *Number of visitors at one time.*—Parties of persons visiting the penal establishments and gaols are not to exceed six (6) in number; not more than three (3) such parties will be allowed to visit in any one day.

4. *Visits to persons remanded or committed.*—The relatives, friends, or legal advisers of persons remanded for re-examination or committed for trial may see such persons, at reasonable hours, twice a week, at the discretion of the gaoler, or oftener by orders from either the committing magistrate, the sheriff, Inspector-General of Penal Establishments, or a visiting justice, unless the gaoler may have a sufficient reason why such visitor should not be admitted. In such case an intimation of the reason for not allowing the interview must be forwarded forthwith to the Inspector-General of Penal Establishments for the time being.

5. *Persons in default of finding sureties and others.*—The relatives, friends, and legal advisers of persons who may be detained in default of finding sureties to keep the peace, or to be of good behaviour, or on fraud summons, or on affiliation orders, or for contempt of court, or on maintenance orders, or detained for safe custody only, may see such persons at reasonable hours once a week at the discretion of the gaoler.

6. *Convicted prisoners.*—The relatives and friends of convicted prisoners, except those in the "A" division at Pentridge subject to the mark system, may visit such prisoners, under such restrictions as may be considered necessary by the Inspector-General of Penal Establishments for the time being for the security of the prison, at intervals of not less than three (3) months.

7. *Officer to be present, &c.*—Visits by relatives and friends of prisoners, or of persons detained, must always be made in the presence of an officer, and no prisoner, or person detained, shall be allowed, under any circumstances, to speak to or to hold any communication with visitors or strangers without the authority of the officer in charge.

8. *Legal advisers.*—Members of the legal profession may see their clients, as referred to in clauses 4 and 5, in private, if required, but convicted prisoners can only be seen on an order of the Inspector-General of Penal Establishments, and in the presence of an officer.

9. *Signing documents, &c.*—The relatives, friends, or legal advisers of prisoners, or persons detained, are not to leave with such prisoners or persons any written or printed letter or paper, or other communication, without the sanction of the Inspector-General of Penal Establishments; neither will they be allowed to obtain the signatures of such prisoners or persons to any document without such sanction.

10. *Special visits.*—In case of the sickness of a prisoner, or person detained, or of other special circumstances, the gaoler may allow the relatives or friends of such prisoner or person to visit them at other times than as herein provided, on an order from the Inspector-General of Penal Establishments.

11. *Name and address of visitor.*—The gaoler may demand the name and address of any visitor, and, if he deem it necessary, he may refuse such visitor admission unless such visitor submit to be searched.

12. *Book of visitors' names.*—A book is to be kept by the gaoler in which the names of visitors shall be entered by the visitors themselves, or, in case of refusal, by the attending officer.

13. *Visitors acting improperly.*—If any visitor misbehave, or act improperly, the gaoler may compel such visitor to at once leave the prison, and may refuse such visitor admission till the facts shall have been duly reported to (if necessary) and decided upon by the Inspector-General of Penal Establishments.

14. *Gaoler, definition of.*—The word "gaoler" shall mean the governor of the gaol, keeper, or officer in charge of any gaol, or person acting in that capacity.

By-law.

AT a meeting of the Mining Board of the Mining District of Beechworth, begun and holden at Beechworth on Monday the 21st day of September, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, it is ordained by the said Board as follows, that is to say:—

BY-LAW No. 55.—RESIDENCE AND BUSINESS SITES.

1. Any person being the holder of a miner's right or business license may occupy a parcel of Crown lands outside of a proclaimed township or village, not exceeding one acre, as a residence or business site, provided no portion of such land shall encroach on any road, street, or thoroughfare, or be within fifteen (15) feet of any residence or business site, race, claim, or watercourse.

2. Any person taking possession of a residence or business site shall do so by erecting posts at each angle of its boundaries, and shall, within four days after taking such possession, register the same with the registrar. The fee for registration shall be 2s. 6d., and for every annual renewal thereof 1s.

3. When any residence or business site is taken possession of contiguous to any road, street, thoroughfare, race, claim, or watercourse, its frontage to such road, street, thoroughfare, race, claim, or watercourse shall not exceed 132 feet and its depth 330 feet.

4. When any residence or business site is taken possession of within the boundaries of any proclaimed township or village, its frontage shall not exceed 66 feet and its depth 165 feet.

5. If the holder of any residence or business site fails to put a habitable dwelling thereon, and to occupy it for the aforesaid purposes, within twenty-one days from the taking possession thereof, his title thereto shall be deemed to be absolutely forfeited and abandoned.

6. The lawful holder of any residence or business site who shall have thereon a dwelling-house or place of business may absent himself for thirty consecutive days without rendering such site liable to forfeiture, and for a further period not exceeding three months, provided he shall register such absence with the registrar, and shall post a copy of the certificate of such registration on some conspicuous part of the building, such certificate to be in the form of Schedule M.

7. From and after the passing of this by-law, By-law No. 41 of this Board shall be and the same is hereby repealed.

SHIRE OF RODNEY CONSTITUTED.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1874* (38 Vict. No. 506) it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might from time to time make Orders, amongst other things, to constitute any part of Victoria containing ratable property capable of yielding upon a rate not exceeding One shilling in the pound on the annual value thereof, estimated under the provisions of the said Act, the sum of Five hundred pounds, a shire: And it was also enacted that every Order constituting any new municipality should constitute the same as either a borough or a shire, and should—1. Assign a name to such borough or shire. 2. Describe the boundaries thereof. 3. Determine of how many members the council should consist. 4. Determine whether the municipal district constituted should be subdivided or not: and every such Order constituting any new municipality having for its municipal district portion of a previously existing municipal district, should operate to sever such portion from such previously existing municipal district: and that every Order under the provisions of Part I. of the said Act should be published in the *Government Gazette*, and should take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas a petition, signed by a majority of the ratepayers of a portion of the Shire of Waranga, has been presented to the Governor in Council in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, praying that the area therein described might be severed from that shire and constituted a separate municipality under the designation of the "Shire of Rodney": And whereas the substance and prayer of such petition have been published in the manner directed by the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in compliance with the prayer of the said petition, doth by this present Order sever from the Shire of Waranga the portion described therein, and forming portion of the East and Central Ridings thereof, and doth direct that the portion so severed be constituted a separate municipality under the name or title of the "Shire of Rodney," as hereinafter defined; and, with the advice aforesaid, doth re-define the boundaries of the Shire of Waranga and its East and Central Ridings, as hereby reduced, in manner following, that is to say:—

THE SHIRE OF RODNEY—CONSTITUTED AND DEFINED.

Commencing at a point in the centre of the Goulburn River, north of the north-west angle of the parish of Undera; thence south-easterly by the centre of that river to a point bearing N. 23° 52' E. six chains fifty links from an angle in the south-western side of the main road from Echuca to Shepparton, wherein the straight line forming a part of the east boundary of the most eastern timber reserve, in the parish of Mooroopna, impinges; thence south-westerly by a direct line to that angle; thence easterly by the southern side of the said road to the centre of the Goulburn River; thence southerly by that river to a point east of the south-east angle of the parish of North Murchison; thence westerly, northerly, and westerly again to and by the road forming the southern boundary of that parish to the south-west angle thereof; thence north by the road forming the west boundary of said parish to the road forming the south boundary of the parish of Girgare East at the south-east angle thereof; thence west by said road to the south-west angle of said parish; thence north by the road on the west boundaries of Girgare East and Kyabram East to the north-west angle of the parish last named; thence east by the road on the north boundary of the said parish to the south-east angle of the parish of Taripta; and thence north by the road on the east boundary of the said parish to the commencing point.

THE SHIRE OF WARANGA—REDUCED AND RE-DEFINED.

Commencing at the centre of the Campaspe River opposite the road bounding portion 34, parish of Bonn, on the west; thence to and by that road south to the centre of a road bounding allotment 34, parish of Bonn, on the south; thence east by that road, and thence north-easterly by a road bounding the said allotment on the east, being the main road from Rummymede to Echuca, to a road bounding allotments 44 to 46, parish of Bonn, on the north; thence east along that road to the western boundary of the parish of Corop; thence further east by that road to the east boundary of Corop parish; thence north by the said east boundary to the north-west angle of portion 45, parish of Carag Carag; thence east by a road bounding allotments 45, 48, and 49 of the last-named parish to the north-east angle of allotment 49; thence further east by that road to the eastern boundary of the parish of Girgare; thence south by that boundary to the south-east corner of said parish; thence east by the road forming the south boundary of the parish of Girgare East to the north-west angle of the parish of North Murchison; thence south by the west, and east by the southern boundary of the last-named parish to the Goulburn River; thence southerly by that river to its junction with Sandy Creek; thence westerly and northerly by that creek to a point bearing S. 81° 30' E. from the east angle of allotment 2A of section 23 (C. P. Davies'), parish of Redanstele; thence north-westerly by a direct line to that angle; thence north-westerly by the said allotment to the road forming the north-west boundary thereof; thence south-westerly by that road to the road along the south side of allotment 23A of section 23 (J. Barker's), and allotment 1A, parish of Crosbie (D. Wilkie's); thence westerly by that road to a road along the west side of allotment 3 of section D (H. C. Johnson's); thence north by that road to the

north boundary of the last-named parish; thence west by that boundary and the north boundary of the parishes of Weston and Avedale to the Campaspe River aforesaid; and thence north-easterly by that river to the point of commencement.

The bearings are given with reference to the true meridian.

THE EAST RIDING OF WARANGA SHIRE—REDUCED.

Commencing at a point on the Goulburn River due south of the south-west angle of the parish of Murchison; thence north to and by the west boundary of that parish and east by the north boundary thereof to the shire boundary in the centre of the Goulburn River; thence southerly and south-westerly by the shire boundary to the commencing point.

WARANGA SHIRE—CENTRAL RIDING REDUCED.

R.; thence west by the northern boundary of that pre-emptive right to its western boundary; thence south by the western boundary of the said pre-emptive section to its south-west angle; thence by a road bearing west to the north-west angle of allotment 49, parish of Burrumboot; thence south to the north-west angle of allotment 3, parish of Burrumboot; thence west to the north-west angle of allotment 2, parish of Burrumboot; thence south to the north-west angle of allotment 96, parish of Colbinabbin; thence west to the north-west angle of allotment 97 of the same parish; thence by a line bearing south to its intersection with the southern boundary of the shire, and by the southern boundary of the shire eastward to the commencing point.

Whenever the line described herein runs beside or along a river, creek, or road, whether specifically described or not, the centre of such river, creek, or road shall be taken to be the boundary-line.

No. 506) it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might from time to time make Orders, amongst other things, to subdivide or re-subdivide any municipal district into any number of subdivisions not exceeding eight; and every such Order should be published in the *Government Gazette*, and should take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas a petition purporting to be signed by more than one-fourth of the persons whose names are for the time being inscribed on the municipal roll of the Shire of Narracan has been presented to the Governor in Council, the substance and prayer of which petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the forty-sixth section of the said Act, and no counter petition received: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order abolish all previous subdivisions of the Shire of Narracan, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned doth hereby re-subdivide the said Shire of Narracan into four separate Ridings, the names and boundaries of which shall be as follow, that is to say:—

THE NORTH RIDING.—Commencing at a point on the western boundary of the shire where the Gippsland Railway line crosses the Moe River; thence north, easterly, south-easterly, and south-westerly by the said shire boundary to a point where the said Gippsland Railway crosses the Morwell River; thence westerly by the said railway line to the commencing point.

THE EAST RIDING.—Commencing at a point on the Gippsland Railway line immediately north of the north-east angle of allotment 160, parish of Moe; thence south to and by the east boundary of that allotment to its south-east angle; thence south-easterly by a direct line to the north-east angle of allotment 41, same parish; thence south by the road forming the east boundary of that allotment to the north-west angle of allotment 59; thence east by the road on the north boundary of the last named allotment to its north-east angle; thence south by the road forming the east boundaries of allotments 59, 58, 57, 55, 52, 51, and 146 to the south-east angle of the allotment last named; thence south-westerly by the road forming the south-eastern boundaries of said allotment 146 and allotment 147, parish of Moe, and of allotments 55, 54, and 53, parish of Allambee East, to the western angle of allotment 47, said parish; thence south-easterly by the

PUPIL SURVEYORS AND DRAUGHTSMEN.

APPLICATIONS will be received, addressed to the Secretary to the Board of Examiners, up to Thursday the 15th April next, from Candidates desirous of being appointed as Pupil Surveyors and Draughtsmen in connection with this department.

Conditions.

An applicant for appointment must be not more than twenty years or less than sixteen years of age. He will be required to produce a medical certificate to the effect that he is of sound constitution, and not affected with any physical infirmity which would interfere with the proper exercise of his profession. He will also be required to produce satisfactory evidence of having received a good general education, including a competent knowledge of Euclid, algebra, and arithmetic, also a specimen of his plan drawing.

Competitive Examination.

Having duly complied with the foregoing requirements, he will undergo a competitive examination in trigonometrical computation, plotting, and plan drawing, when the competitors to whom shall be awarded a sufficient number of points by the Board of Examiners will be recommended for appointment, subject to the regulations of the department as to probation.

Term of Service.

The pupil's service in the department shall be for a term of four years, the first two of which will be served in the office, where he will be engaged in drawing and computing. He will then (if thought necessary) be examined in trigonometry, including computation of areas and reduction of traverse surveys, also plotting from field-book and plan drawing. If his progress up to this time is not deemed satisfactory he will be liable to be dispensed with, but, if satisfactory, he will be placed under a departmental surveyor for two years for field practice.

Afterwards he will have the privilege of attending for two months at the Melbourne Observatory, where he will be instructed in such branches of practical astronomy as are necessary for the duties he may be called on to perform as a qualified surveyor.

He will be allowed to present himself at the next ensuing examination for land surveyors (without payment of fees), for the purpose of obtaining the formal certificate of the Board of Examiners as to his qualifications.

Remuneration.

He will receive the following remuneration during the term of his pupilage:—1st year, £52; 2nd year, £58; 3rd year, £66; 4th year, £72.

Subject to Regulations.

During the whole term of his pupilage and service in the department he shall be subject to the Regulations for the Public Service of Victoria dated 31st December 1884, or any subsequent substituted or additional regulations.

YARRAWONGA.—SITE FOR SHOWYARDS.—REGULATIONS RESCINDED.
