Reefs in Sunda Strait.

THE Commander of H. N. M. surveying vessel *Blommendal* has giving the following information concerning some reefs in Sunda Strait:—

1°. The reef between Brabands Island and Lenning Point, on which the vessel *Hoop van Capellen* touched, is a small coral reef, with 2 fathoms least water, lying with—
Lighthouse on Fourth Point bearing S. 47° W.
Brabands Island bearing N. 56° W. distant 2,070 yards.
Distance from the nearest shore at Lenning Point, 440 yards.
This reef is not marked by discolored water.

2°. The Winsor Rock, with a least depth of 2½ fathoms, stones, lies on the following bearings:—
Highest summit of Toppers Island S. 62° E. distant 3,100 yards.
Highest summit of Thwart Way S. 46° W. and with highest summit of G. Batoer and north side of Toppers Island in line, or highest summit of Toppers Island and lighthouse of Merak in line.

This danger is marked by tide-rips.

At a distance of about 60 yards all round soundings of from 5 to 13 fathoms are obtained, the depth then quickly increasing to about 30 fathoms.

3°. The Catherine Rocks, composed of two uncovering stones and visible at least 3 miles, are surrounded by a reef extending 490 yards in a N. N. E. — S. S. W. direction and 280 yards wide, the south-south-west extremity of which is distant 160 yards from the rocks.

4°. An isolated small coral reef, with 3½ fathoms least water over it, lies 650 yards N. N. W. from these rocks, with 6 fathoms between. As this danger is not marked by discolored water, mariners shall give the shore a berth of 1 mile, and remain in no less than 12 fathoms of water.

5°. The Tims Rock, 33 yards in extent, and visible at a distance of at least 3 miles, is not surrounded by a reef as is shown on the chart, but it may anywhere be passed close by.

6°. The reef, reported 1 mile south of Hog Point, has been unsuccessfully searched for; from 57 to 62 fathoms have been sounded on and around the spot. In consideration of this search this danger has been removed from the charts. Bearings true.

THE GLEN GRANT AND TARNAGULLA UNITED FARMERS' COMMON (within the shire of Marong).—The portion of the Glen Grant and Tarnagulla United Farmers' Common within the shire of Marong, constituted a separate common by Order of the 21st October 1867, is hereby diminished by deducting therefrom fifty-six acres three rods thirty-six perches of land, being suburban allotment 14, town of Marong, and allotment 1076, parish of Marong.—(85.M.44516.)

THE ANDERSON'S BAWN COMMON, proclaimed by Order of 14th February 1876, is hereby abolished.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Mallee Amending Act 1885* it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council might from time to time by Order in Council proclaim any fence described in such Order to be a vermin-proof fence within the meaning of the said Act, and a sufficient fence within the meaning of *The Fences Statute 1874*, for the purposes of the now in part recited Act, and he might also by any such Order in Council proclaim any fence described in any such Order to be a sufficient fence within the meaning of the said Statute throughout Victoria, or within any portion thereof specified in such Order, and he might at any time revoke any such Order: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this Order proclaim the fence hereinafter described to be a vermin-proof fence within the meaning of *The Mallee Amending Act 1885*, and a sufficient fence within the meaning of *The Fences Statute 1874*, aforesaid, that is to say:—

A wire-netting fence 3 feet 4 inches in height, made of wire-netting, which shall not be less than 3 feet in width, and of a mesh not exceeding 1½ inches, and which shall be 4 inches in the ground, or shall have 4 inches thereof properly secured to the surface of the ground; such wire-netting to be attached by wire or staples to substantial post-stakes or iron standards with two barbed wires extending from one post-stake or standard to another, the lower wire being placed 4 inches above the netting, and the upper wire 4 inches above the lower, erected on the line subdividing the portions A and B of Mallee Block No. 25.

PARISH OF BUNGAREE.—REGULATIONS.

WE, John Devereux, William Anderson (junior), David Burke, Thomas Richards, George Blood, Henry Brown, and Joseph P. Smith, the duly appointed committee of management of the reserve for public recreation in the parish of Bungaree, having framed the following regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering in or upon the said reserve, submit the said regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 133 of *The Land Act 1884* :—

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset, except upon such days as may be set apart by the committee of management for the holding therein of fêtes, or for the use thereof for any other special purpose, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) may be charged and taken for admission of every adult person to the reserve.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein without the authority in writing of the committee of management first obtained.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, or stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or otherwise damage the fences, trees, seats, or other property in the reserve, or roll or throw stones therein.
5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs, without the permission in writing of the committee of management first obtained: Provided always that all moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority in writing of the committee of management first obtained.
7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, or vend or dispose of in the reserve fruit, provisions, refreshments of any kind, or other articles of any description, without the consent in writing of the committee of management first obtained.
8. No person, except laborers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
9. No person shall make any holes in or in any way interfere with the surface of the reserve without the consent in writing of the committee of management first obtained.

10. No person shall carry or discharge firearms in the reserve, except for military purposes, without the authority in writing of the committee of management first obtained.

11. Any person or society using the reserve for fêtes or other special purposes shall hand over to the committee of management such sum or sums as it may determine, the whole of which shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve.

12. Any person or society using the reserve for any purpose may be required to deposit a sum not exceeding Ten pounds (£10), which the committee of management may determine, by way of guarantee that due care will be taken to prevent any damage to the gates, fences, walks, trees, shrubs, plants, or other property within the reserve; and the committee of management may make good any such damage, and deduct the cost from the sum of money deposited as aforesaid; and any person or society so using the reserve shall abide by these regulations and by any order given by the committee of management in reference to the reserve.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 133 of *The Land Act 1884*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall on conviction forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).

The wood is to be split out of large forest timber of either red or white gum, box or she-oak (no other kind will be received), perfectly sound, and cut into billets not exceeding nor less than two feet in length, and not less than four inches by four inches in thickness. Neither burnt wood, heart wood, nor outside pieces of bark will be received.

Melbourne district will include a radius of six miles from the General Post Office.

Tenders will be accepted or rejected separately.

Tenderers are to specify the kind or kinds of wood, and the proportions of each kind tendered for.

The firewood for Yarra Bend is to be tendered for at per ton weight, as well as at per ton measurement.

Printed forms of tender may be obtained from the Secretary to the Tender Board, Melbourne, the Sheriff at Geelong, and the Medical Superintendent, Sunbury Asylum, by whom also any information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

Security will be required in cash, Government debentures, or bank deposit-receipt. Such receipt to be in favour of the Secretary, Tender Board.

The security will be calculated at Ten per cent. upon contracts not exceeding £1,000, and at Five per cent. over that sum, but the amount will in no case exceed that above stated.

Tenderers must state the security proposed, whether in debentures, bank deposit-receipt, or cash deposit.

Tenders must be accompanied by a bank draft payable to the order of the Secretary of the Tender Board, or by bank notes, for Ten per cent. of the amount of security required (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers. CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The firewood to consist of either box, she-oak, red or white gum, and must be dry, perfectly sound, and of good burning quality. The charcoal must be made from redgum and be of the best quality, free from dirt or other impurities.

2. The orders will be issued by the departments requiring the supplies; and should an order not be complied with within forty-eight hours, it will be competent for the department concerned to purchase at the contractor's risk, and to deduct from the contractor's account the extra expense (if any) over and above the contract price.

3. The contractor for wood will be bound to place it in stacks for measurement on such ground as may be pointed out. The stacks are to be two feet wide by five feet high, with space between each stack for measuring; and the billets are all to lie the same

way, viz., crossways of the stacks in the form of a cord, and are to be laid as closely and solidly as possible in the stack, and to the satisfaction of the officer receiving the supply. In case the firewood for Yarra Bend is required to be supplied at per ton weight, the contractor will be bound to weigh the wood upon the Asylum weigh-bridge. Each load to be tarred separately. The weigh-bridge ticket to be rendered in support of the account. Firewood, when ordered by weight, is not to be stacked by the contractor, but it must be deposited on such ground as may be pointed out.

4. As soon as the orders shall have been completed, the contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form, with the order attached thereto, to the department supplied. Accounts will be payable at the Treasury, Melbourne, Ballarat, or Geelong, as the contractor may require.

5. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the supply as to the quality, the same is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final.

6. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account.

7. If from any cause injury would accrue to the public service by waiting for a board of survey, the head of the department, or officer in charge of station, will have the power to reject such articles as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected article, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense, if any, will be charged, as in condition 6.

8. A repetition of irregularity in the quality or quantity of the supplies, or of delay in delivering or replacing them when required, or of refusal to execute orders, will subject the contractor to such mulct not exceeding £50 as the Treasurer of the colony for the time being may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

9. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.

10. It will be competent for the Secretary to the Tender Board on behalf of the Government, or the contractor for charcoal or firewood on his own behalf, to terminate the contract, by giving, in writing, a notice of three full calendar months; it being understood that such notice can be given only from the first day of a month, and within the period for which the contract is made.

THE SHEEP-DIP.

This invention consists of a water-tight tank, of any convenient length, depth, and width. It may be thirty feet long, eight feet deep, and four feet wide, more or less. The sheep yards are at one end of the tank, and at the other end there is a battened inclined plane, at an easy gradient, from the bottom of the tank up to the surface of the ground where the sheep land. Opposite to the end where the sheep land there are one or more yards with a water-tight floor so constructed that as the surplus liquid drains from the sheep it flows back into the tank. The sheep are thrown into the tank at the other end, are dipped under the surface of the liquid, are retained in the tank for any convenient time, and then allowed to land. When the surplus liquid has drained from the sheep they are turned out. The special principle claimed for dressing sheep in large numbers in a given time is in a water-tight tank, a battened sloping landing enabling the sheep to land without handling, and a water-tight draining yard from which all surplus liquid flows back into the tank.

THE SWING-GATE.

This invention consists in providing a lane of any convenient length and width—say twenty feet by sixteen inches, more or less—sufficient to let the sheep pass along singly. A small yard connects the lane with the main receiving yard into which the sheep to be drafted are mustered. At the other end of the lane and opposite to the centre of it a post is fixed in the ground, and on it is hung a light gate of any convenient width—say five feet, more or less. This gate extends within the open end of the narrow lane, and it can be moved only from one side to the other within the end of the lane. The post on which the gate is hung is the end of a fence dividing two enclosures. As the sheep to be drafted come along the lane towards the gate the operator stands with his hand on the gate and his eye fixed on the approaching sheep at a point from six to eight feet or more distant in the lane. He thus sees both sorts as they approach him, and by moving the gate from side to side with a gentle movement he divides the one sort from the other, and each sort enters one of the two enclosures. Three or more sorts may be drafted at one operation by providing gates opening into the lane from either side of it. The sheep are drafted without being caught or touched by hand, and as they run through at the rate of about from fifty to one hundred per minute, twenty thousand may be drafted in a morning before breakfast. The special principle claimed for drafting sheep without handling or touching them consists in providing a gateway so narrow as to allow sheep egress only in single file, with a moveable gate to divide the running single file of sheep into two sorts, whilst a long narrow lane or race regulates the approach of the sheep and enables the man moving the gate to perceive to which sort each sheep belongs.

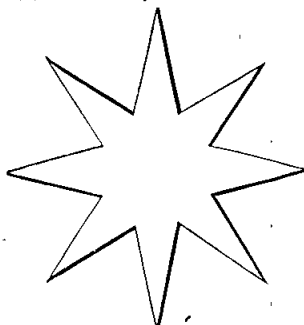

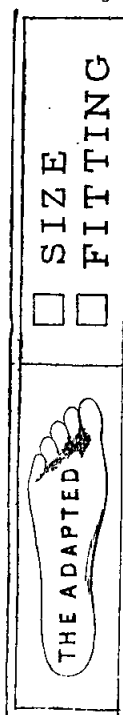
