FROM NEW CALEDONIA AND FIJI DISCONTINUED.**

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony bearing date the twenty-fourth day of August One thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, and issued in pursuance of *The Public Health Statute 1865*, it was notified that New Caledonia and Fiji were infected with Dengue Fever, and that it was probable that such disease might be brought from such places to Victoria: And whereas the circumstances which led to the issue of such Proclamation have ceased to exist: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the Proclamation hereinbefore mentioned.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twelfth day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, and in the forty-ninth year of Her Majesty's reign.

VICTORIAN NAVAL FORCES REGULATIONS.

THE Governor in Council has cancelled paragraph 5 of the Victorian Naval Regulations, and has substituted the following in lieu thereof:—

TRAINING SEAMEN.

Seamen between the ages of 20 and 25 years may be entered as training seamen on probation for six months, at 3s. 6d. per diem; and if found suitable in character and ability they may, at the expiration of this term, be re-engaged and sworn in to complete 5 years from date of joining.

Training seamen who have served their probationary term may, at or before the completion of their 5 years' engagement, if found competent, be rated or re-engaged as able seamen, and sworn in for a further term of 5 years at the pay of 4s. 6d. per diem, and 6d. per diem deferred pay.

SHIRE OF YARRAWONGA WATERWORKS TRUST.

Regulation for the Prevention and Remedying of the Waste, Undue Consumption, Fouling, or Contamination of Water contained in or supplied from any part of the Works, and for the Protection of the Water and every part of the Works from Trespass, and Injury.

Regulations of the Shire of Yarrowonga Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the Water Conservation Act 1881, made by the said Trust the day of December One thousand eight hundred and eighty-five.

REGULATIONS.

1. No person shall permit, allow, or cause to enter within the fence enclosing any reservoir or aqueduct of the Trust containing water provided for domestic purposes any cattle, goats, pigs, geese, dogs, or other animals.
2. No person shall allow any foul or deleterious matter injurious to health to run into or to be placed where, by its proximity to any water provided for domestic purposes, where and by whom it may so pollute the water, or render it unfit for use or injurious to health. Nor shall any person bathe or wash in or otherwise pollute such water.
3. No person being in charge of or the owner of any travelling flocks of sheep or herds of cattle shall permit the same to travel continuously, or drive the same, to graze along the bank of any creek or stream forming part of any waterworks of the Trust set apart for the supply of water for domestic purposes within one chain of the channel thereof, so as to foul or pollute any water therein, or render it unfit for use or injurious to health. Nor shall any person take such cattle or sheep to camp, nor place them in camp, where by their proximity to any reservoir, aqueduct, or stream containing water provided for domestic purposes, such water may be polluted, fouled, rendered unfit for use, or injurious to health.
4. No person shall break or otherwise damage the gates or fences of any enclosure, or break or otherwise damage any weir, sluice-gate, dam, tank, or any pump, trough, platform, or appliance belonging to or under the control of the Trust. Nor shall any person cut or damage the bed or channel of any stream or watercourse, nor dam up or draw off or divert any water from the same, or from any creek, without the written authority of the Trust or their officer duly appointed.
5. No person shall open or shut any sluice-gate, valve, or other appliances for regulating the supply or distribution of water, without the written authority of the Trust or their officer duly appointed.
6. Subject to the foregoing Regulations, the water, where used other than for purposes of irrigation or the supply of factories, or where otherwise expressly provided, shall be for the use of the public for domestic purposes and for the watering of stock.

Every person committing a breach of these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 44 of the Water Conservation Act 1881, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence.

WHEREAS by *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1881* it was amongst other things enacted that, at the expiration of two months after the notice of any application should have been first advertised in the *Government Gazette*, the Minister, if satisfied that the provisions of the now in part recited Act

have been substantially complied with, should submit such application, and the general plan and description therein referred to, and all petitions which have been received in respect of such application to the Governor in Council, together with any recommendations as to the granting of the application or as to any alterations or additions he might think desirable in the proposed waterworks; and the Governor in Council might thereupon approve of the construction of such proposed waterworks, with or without any alterations or additions in the general plan and description thereof, or might disapprove of the construction of such waterworks, and should make an Order in Council accordingly: And it was further enacted that, if the Governor in Council should approve of the construction of such waterworks, with or without alterations, or additions, or restrictions of any such general plan and description, a Waterworks Trust should be constituted to construct, maintain, and continue the whole or any part of the waterworks therein described, in accordance with the provisions of such Order and of the now in part recited Act: And every Order approving the construction of any proposed waterworks, and of the constituting of a Waterworks Trust for the purpose, should state:—

(a.) The amount of money which the Governor in Council would grant as a loan for the purpose of carrying out the same, and paying the cost and expense of the plans and application for the same; and also the rate of interest which would be charged for such loan, such rate being at least One-half per centum more than the rate payable by the Government on the Public Loan out of which such loan might be granted.

(b.) Should proclaim the limits of the lands, whether within or without the municipal districts of the council or councils applying for the proposed waterworks, within which such Trust should have authority, to be called a Waterworks District.

(c.) Should state what are the principal works to be constructed; and

(d.) Should contain such provisions (not inconsistent with the now in part recited Act) as, according to the nature of the application and the facts and circumstances of each case, the Governor in Council should think fit:

And it was further enacted by section 79 of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1883*, No. 778, that, whenever a waterworks district was either wholly or with the exception of the waterworks or proposed waterworks thereof within one municipal district, the Governor in Council might appoint the municipal council for the time being of such municipal district, together with one or more persons not being members of such municipal council, to be the Waterworks Trust of such waterworks district: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Acts, has approved of a general plan and description, as set forth in a certain application of the president and ratepayers of the Shire of Bacchus Marsh, for a loan of Three thousand five hundred pounds sterling to carry out certain waterworks for the supply of a waterworks district under the said Act, embracing such portions of the Shire of Bacchus Marsh as are shown on the plan accompanying the said application, together with general plan and description therein referred to, deposited in the Department of Mines and Water Supply, Melbourne, and doth hereby order and appoint as follows:—

(1.) The construction of the said waterworks.

(2.) The Municipal Council of the Shire of Bacchus Marsh for the time being, and one other Commissioner, to be the Waterworks Trust of such waterworks district.

(3.) That the amount of the loan hereby granted shall be Three thousand five hundred pounds sterling, for the purpose of carrying out approved works and paying the cost and expense of the plans and application for the same; and that the interest to be charged for such loan shall be at the rate of Four pounds ten shillings per centum per annum, payable half-yearly.

(4.) That the limits of the land within which the said Waterworks Trust shall have authority shall be that portion of the Shire of Bacchus Marsh included within the boundaries hereunder described, viz:—

Part 1.—*Weir Site*.—Commencing at a point distant fourteen chains twenty-one links from the north-west angle of allotment three of section ten, in the parish of Gorrooburghap, by a line bearing south seventy-two degrees two minutes west; thence north thirty-seven degrees thirty-nine minutes west two chains seventy links; thence south fifty degrees twenty three minutes west two chains twelve links; thence south forty-one degrees twenty-five minutes east eighteen chains two links; and thence north seventy-four degrees twenty-six minutes east two chains fourteen links to the commencing point, being partly in allotment two of section ten, parish of Gorrooburghap, and partly in allotment four of section two, parish of Korkuperrimul.

TOWN OF WARRNAMBOOL.—FRIENDLY SOCIETIES' RECREATION GROUND.—REGULATIONS.

WE, Charles Scoborio, Edward Wilson, Henry Richter, John Alfred Shaddock, Michael John Murphy, Hugh William Sheridan, Thomas King, Richard Stancombe Harris, Christopher Beattie, Henry Phillips, Dennis Sutton, Robert Jones, George Strang, and Thomas Smith, the duly appointed trustees of the reserve in the town of Warrnambool for Friendly Societies' Recreation Ground, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance-fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 133 of *The Land Act 1884*:-

Regulations.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset, except on such days as may be set apart by the trustees for the holding therein of sports, fêtes, shows, or other amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding two shillings and sixpence may be charged and taken for admission to the reserve of every adult.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones or other missiles in the reserve, or break or deposit glass bottles therein.
5. No person shall put in the reserve cattle, goats, or pigs.

6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the trustees.

7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the trustees first obtained.

8. No person, except laborers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

9. Any society or person renting or hiring any building, erection, or enclosure for the occasion of any sports, fêtes, shows, or other amusements, may be required to deposit any sum not exceeding Ten pounds (£10) which the trustees may determine by way of guarantee that due care will be taken of such building, erection, or enclosure, and the gates, fences, walks, trees, shrubs, plants, or other property in the reserve, and the trustees may make repairs or make good any damage or loss sustained by such building, erection, enclosure, gates, fences, walks, trees, shrubs, plants, or other property during the period covered by the renting or hiring, and may deduct the costs of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited as aforesaid; and every society or person so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations, and by any order given by the trustees in reference to the reserve, or the buildings, erections, or enclosures for the time being thereon.

10. All persons entering the reserve shall confine themselves to the roads or paths therein.

11. Children under ten (10) years of age shall not be admitted into the reserve unless accompanied by and in charge of adult persons.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 133 of *The Land Act 1884*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).

RESERVE FOR CRICKET AND OTHER PURPOSES OF PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE PARISH OF RINGWOOD.—REGULATIONS.

THE Council of the Shire of Lillydale, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land temporarily reserved, by Order of 5th October 1885, as a site for Cricket and other purposes of Public Recreation in the parish of Ringwood, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 133 of *The Land Act 1884*—

Regulations.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.

5. No person shall put in or allow to wander into the reserve any cattle, goats, pigs, or poultry.

6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the committee of management.

7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained.

8. No person, except laborers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 133 of *The Land Act 1884*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

SHIRE OF LILLYDALE.

A By-law of the Shire of Lillydale made under section 213 of "The Local Government Act 1874" and section 50 of "The Local Government Act Amendment Act 1883," and numbered 6, for the adoption of the undermentioned provisions of the 13th Schedule of the said Act.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by "The Local Government Act 1874," the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Lillydale order as follows:—

That the whole of subdivision 4 of Part I. of the 13th Schedule of "The Local Government Act 1874," relating to crossings over footways and channels, is hereby adopted in and for the Shire of Lillydale.

Every person who wilfully and without lawful excuse rides or drives any horse or other animal, or drives or wheels any carriage cart or other vehicle, upon along or across any footway or any water channel or gutter, herein called channel, by the side of any street or road, save in each such case upon and by or at some crossing to be made as hereinafter mentioned, shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds, and shall also pay to the council such sum not exceeding Ten pounds by way of compensation for any damage done by him to the footway or channel as the justice adjudicating upon the information shall on the hearing thereof order.

If any land shall front to adjoin or abut upon the footway of any street or road, and if access with horses and vehicles from such street or road to such land or to some sufficient way appurtenant thereto cannot be had without riding driving or wheeling the same respectively upon or across the said footway or the channel (if any) lying along the outer edge thereof, and if the owner of such land shall desire that a crossing for horses and other animals and for vehicles be made as herein provided over such footway and channel, and shall give a notice in writing of such his desire to the council, and in such notice describe the land in question and the proposed work by reference to the specification deposited as hereinafter mentioned, such specification being in accordance with the provisions hereof and with such regulation as may be in force in that behalf, it shall be lawful for such owner, after seven clear days from the giving such notice and not before (with no unnecessary delay or obstruction), at his own cost and under the inspection of such officer as the council shall have appointed for the purpose, to make such crossing according to the tenor of such notice and specification, and not otherwise, and the owner of such land shall afterwards in like manner maintain the same.

Every such owner who desires as aforesaid that any such crossing shall be made shall, before giving notice to the council as herein provided, deposit with the municipal clerk a specification describing the proposed work with respect to each of the several matters hereby or by any such regulation in force in that behalf required or provided.

Unless within the period of seven days after the receipt of any such notice as aforesaid the council shall give notice to the person giving the same that (if the fact be so) such notice or the specification referred to therein and deposited is not in accordance with the provisions of such regulation as aforesaid, such notice and specification shall thereafter, so far only as affects the liability of such person to any penalty, be deemed to be in accordance therewith.

In streets or roads in which, at the site of any such proposed crossing, there is a curb of stone or wood along the outer edge of the footway, the crossing so far as the footway extends shall have on both sides a curb not higher in any part than the surface of the footway at that part and similar in all respects to such first mentioned curb, and such curb shall approach to and join the street curbing in gentle curves outwards, and such crossings shall be of such width, and the surface thereof so far as the footway extends shall have such inclination outwards, and be depressed so far below the footway as shall have been respectively appointed by some regulation in that behalf, and shall with respect to the channel be so laid or constructed as not to raise or obstruct the same or any part thereof.

In streets or roads in which, at the site of any such proposed crossing, there is no such curbing as in the last preceding section mentioned, the crossing over the channel shall be such suitable bridge as shall leave a free passage for the water underneath the same, and shall be of such materials form length size strength and fall as shall have been respectively appointed by some regulation in that behalf, and the surface of such crossing so far as the footway extends shall be so made good by paving macadamising gravelling or otherwise that the necessary traffic by animals or vehicles over the same shall not cause any damage thereto, but that such crossing shall be as sound and commodious for the passage of persons using the footway as the other portions of such footway adjoining such crossing.

No person making any crossing shall be deemed guilty of an offence by reason only of some departure in making such crossing from the notice or specification relating thereto, unless the officer of the council appointed as hereinbefore provided to inspect the making of the crossing shall have reported in writing such departure to the council within three days after the same shall have occurred, and unless such person, being served by the council within three days after such report with a notice so to do, shall for the space of seven clear days after such notice have failed to correct or supply such departure.

If any crossing shall have been made in any respect contrary to this bye-law or any regulation in force hereunder, it shall be lawful for the council if they shall see fit to cause the same to be altered so as to conform hereto and to such regulation respectively, and to recover in manner in "The Local Government Act 1874," provided the expenses of such alteration from the owner of the land to which such crossing shall lead; but they shall not so recover in those cases of departure from the notice or specification which the council or their officer might respectively have given notice of or reported, but failed to give notice of or report respectively in manner and within the time provided in the preceding sections hereof.

If any private street or road shall meet at an angle the footway of any public street or road, and there shall be no crossing upon and across such footway and the channel adjacent thereto from such private street or road, to such public street or road, it shall be lawful for the council if they shall see fit to make in accordance with any regulation in force within that behalf a crossing upon and over such footway and channel of the description hereinbefore provided with respect to other crossings, and to recover from the owner of each of the tenements abutting on such private street or road such portion of the expenses of such making as shall bear to the whole of such expenses the same proportion as the rateable value of such tenement bears to the whole rateable value of all the tenements so abutting.

If any crossing across or over any footway or channel to any land or way appurtenant thereto, or to any private street or road, shall have been made before the coming into operation of this subdivision, but shall in any respect not be in accordance with any regulation made hereunder, the council may if they shall see fit cause the same to be altered so as to conform to such regulation; and if such crossing shall have been made contrary to any bye-law in force at the time of making the same, the council may recover the expenses of such alteration in manner in the last two preceding sections mentioned, according as one or the other may be applicable to the case.

If any crossing shall be out of repair, and the person liable hereunder to maintain or repair the same shall, for seven days after notice from the council to that effect, neglect properly and completely to repair the same, he shall forfeit for every day that such crossing shall remain so unrepaired a sum of forty shillings, and the council may, if they shall see fit, effect such repair and recover the same from such person before any justice.

It shall be lawful for the council from time to time to make regulations for all or any of the purposes following, that is to say:—

For regulating the width depression and inclination of crossings across or over footways and channels, and the materials for making and constructing the same, the mode of laying and bedding such materials, the length width size strength and fall of bridge crossings and the said inclination and fall, either absolutely or with relation to the levels inclination or fall of the footway or channel or otherwise in like manner.

SHIRE OF BANNOCKBURN.

LOCAL BOARD OF HEALTH.

Bye-law No. 1.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in "The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883" and of every other power enabling them in that behalf, the Local Board of Health for the Shire of Bannockburn, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within its jurisdiction, doth hereby make the bye-law following that is to say:—

1. *Interpretation of terms.*—In the construction and for the purposes of this bye-law the following terms shall, if not inconsistent with the context or subject-matter, have the respective meanings hereby assigned to them:—

"House" shall mean and include dwellings of any kind, schools, hotels, licensed public-houses, factories, work-rooms, common or other lodging-houses, or other buildings or premises.

"Cesspool" shall mean any receptacle for night-soil or for noxious or offensive matter below or above the ground.

"Street" shall mean and include any highway, and any public bridge, and any road, lane, footway, square, court, alley, or passage, whether a thoroughfare or not.

2. *Premises to be kept so as not to be a nuisance.*—Every occupier or person having the management or control of any house or premises shall cause the same to be kept in such a state as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

3. *Removal of refuse from houses.*—Every occupier of a house or premises shall remove therefrom all dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, or such other refuse matter produced or accumulated thereon once every week; and in case of the default of such occupier, the Local Board of Health may remove the same.

4. *Receptacles for house refuse.*—Every occupier of a house or premises shall provide and keep thereon a box or some other covered receptacle for the temporary deposit of house refuse, which box or receptacle shall be of such dimensions as that the same may, with the contents thereof, when full, be readily and conveniently movable by one man, or so many such boxes or receptacles as may be necessary to contain all the house refuse produced or accumulated on such premises during one week; and shall cause all house refuse to be deposited as soon as conveniently may be in some such box or receptacle.

5. *Removal of refuse from places where animals are kept.*—Every occupier of land on which is erected any stable, shed, sty, yard, or other place for the keeping of animals shall from time to time remove from such premises all dung, soil, or other manure produced or accumulated thereon once at least every week; and in case of the default of such occupier, the Local Board may remove the same.

6. *Power to use refuse as manure.*—Nothing contained in the foregoing section shall be taken to prevent the occupier of any premises from causing any dung, soil, or other refuse matter produced or accumulated on any premises to be at any time removed, or to be used as manure on any garden or land, or to be kept for the purpose of being used on any garden or land contiguous to such premises as manure, so that the same be not so removed, kept, or used as to contravene any bye-law of the Local Board of Health, or so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

7. *Removal of refuse from places where noxious or offensive trades are carried on.*—Every occupier and every person having the

management or control of premises used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, or manufactory whatsoever shall cause all rubbish, filth, offal, soil, or other offensive matters, and all waste products of such manufacture from which effluvia may arise, to be removed from such premises once at least in every twenty-four hours, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and so that no noxious or offensive effluvia arise therefrom; and if any such occupier or person shall neglect or fail to have removed any such offensive matter or waste products as aforesaid, the same may be removed by the Local Board of Health.

8. *Removal of blood from places where animals are slaughtered.*—Every occupier, licensee, or person having the management or control of an abattoir, slaughter-house, or place where any cattle or any other animals are killed, shall cause all the blood from the animals killed therein, as soon as conveniently may be, to be collected in a fit receptacle to be provided for that purpose, and to be effectually deodorized by mixing therewith commercial sulphate of iron or chloride of lime in the proportion of 1 lb. to the gallon, or some other efficient deodorizer sufficient to effectually deodorize the same, and to be removed from the premises within twenty-four hours after such blood is shed.

9. *Removal of offal.*—Every occupier of any premises on which may be any offal shall forthwith effectually deodorize the same, and remove the same from the premises within twenty-four hours.

10. *Construction of privies.*—No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any privy, except in the form of an earth-closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor whereof is at no point less than 3 inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and every such building shall be constructed with proper openings or flues to provide sufficient means of ventilation, and shall be provided with a suitable pan or other movable receptacle for night-soil, the contents whereof does not exceed three cubic feet, and with the requisite apparatus for the application of dry earth or some other deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan or receptacle and the contents thereof, and emptying and cleansing the same. Every privy attached to any school, hotel, licensed public-house, factory, workroom, or common lodging-house, and every public privy, shall be flagged or paved with some non-absorbent material, having a fall or inclination towards the door or other opening of at least half-an-inch to the foot.

11. *Supply of deodorizing material to earth-closets.*—Every occupier and every person having the management and control of any premises shall cause to be kept in every earth-closet belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in any pan or other receptacle in such earth-closet to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficiently to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan or other receptacle.

12. *Emptying receptacles for night-soil.*—Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises once at least in every week shall empty or cleanse, or cause to be emptied or cleansed, every earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil on or belonging to such premises.

13. *Removal of night-soil to be by properly-constructed conveyances.*—No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, except by means of a cart, carriage, or means of conveyance properly constructed and furnished with a sufficient covering so as to prevent the escape of the contents or any portion thereof, or of effluvia therefrom.

14. *Hours within which night-soil may be removed.*—No person shall empty, assist in emptying, or cause or permit to be emptied any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, except between the hours of Nine p.m. and Six a.m., or until the contents thereof have been properly deodorized; and every person emptying or causing to be emptied any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil shall cause the night-soil taken therefrom to be removed so soon as the same is emptied.

15. *Emptying of cesspools.*—Every occupier of premises and every person having the management or control of premises on which there shall be any cesspool already in existence shall cause the same to be emptied once at least every second week.

16. *Times within which cesspools may be emptied.*—No person shall empty, or assist in emptying, or cause or permit to be emptied, any cesspool or place for the deposit of offal, blood, or other refuse and offensive matter, except between the hours of Nine p.m. and Six a.m., or until such contents have been properly deodorized; and every person emptying or causing to be emptied any cesspool shall remove or cause to be removed the contents thereof so soon as the same is emptied.

17. *Conveyances by which cesspools may be emptied.*—No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying any cesspool or place for the deposit of offal, blood, or other refuse and offensive matter except by means of a cart, carriage, or other conveyance properly constructed and furnished with a sufficient covering so as to prevent the escape of the contents, or any portion thereof, or any effluvia therefrom.

18. *Disposal of refuse and offensive matter.*—No person shall place or deposit any dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, or soil, or any night-soil or other offensive matter, in any place so as to be a nuisance to any person or injurious to health.

19. *Night-soil, &c., removed from any earth-closet, &c., and deposited anywhere to be covered with earth.*—Every person placing

or depositing, or causing or suffering to be placed or deposited, or assisting in placing or depositing, on any land, whether by way of manure or otherwise, any night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter removed from any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or other place of deposit, shall immediately on the deposit thereof cover the same or cause the same to be covered, and shall keep the same covered, with a layer of earth not less than six (6) inches in thickness.

20. *Earth-closets, &c., not to be emptied into drains or sewers.*—No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter into any drain or sewer, or so that the contents thereof may find its way or be likely to find its way into any drain or sewer.

21. *Prevention of pollution of water.*—No person shall place, assist in placing, or cause or permit to be placed, in or so that the same may or may be likely to find its way into any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or likely to be used in any dairy, any matter or thing likely to endanger the health of any persons using such water or drinks, or milk or other produce of such dairy.

22. *Cesspools not to be emptied into water used for drinking or domestic purposes.*—No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying any cesspool or place for the deposit of offal, blood, or other refuse matter into any water supplied, used, or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, or so that the contents or any portion of the contents thereof may find its way, or be likely to find its way, into any such water.

23. Every accumulation or deposit of offensive matter so situated as to find its way, or be likely to find its way, into any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or likely to be used in any dairy, shall be deodorized and removed by the owner of the property upon which such accumulation or deposit is situated within one week of notice given by the Local Board or by one of its officers.

24. *Keeping of animals.*—No person shall keep any animal of any kind so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

25. *Animals not to be so kept as to pollute water.*—No person shall keep any animal in such a manner as to pollute any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, so as to endanger the health of any person using such water or drinks, or milk or other produce of such dairy.

26. *Supply of water to slaughter-houses.*—Every occupier or licensee or person having the management or control of a slaughter-house or abattoir shall cause the same to be supplied with a sufficient quantity of water for all purposes.

27. *Drainage of new buildings.*—Every person erecting or causing to be erected any new building shall cause the foundations thereof, and the ground over which such building is to be placed, to be rendered dry, sound, and well drained, so that no water, soakage, or damp shall lodge there.

28. *Drainage of existing buildings.*—Every owner of a building shall cause the same to be provided with proper and sufficient drains, so constructed as to prevent any nuisance arising therefrom, and to secure the healthfulness of the inmates of such building; and every tenant of a building under lease of which fourteen years or upwards is unexpired shall be deemed as owner within the meaning of this section.

29. *Milk stores and shops to be kept clean.*—Every person following the trade of cowkeeper or dairyman shall cause every milk store or milk shop in his occupation, or under his management or control, and every milk vessel used by him for containing milk for sale, to be kept thoroughly clean.

30. *Dairywomen, &c., to report disease to the health officer.*—Every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, and every person having the management of any such trade, shall forthwith report, in writing, to the health officer the occurrence of any disease in any of his milk cows, or of any contagious or infectious disease in man or animal upon the premises upon which such trade is carried on.

31. *Extent of application of bye-law.*—This bye-law, containing sections numbered one (1) to thirty two (32) both inclusive, shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the place or places within the jurisdiction of the Local Board of Health for the Shire of Bannockburn, and shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

32. *Penalties.*—If any person commit a breach of any of the provisions of the foregoing bye-law he shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10, or to a penalty not exceeding £5 for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued. Provided the justices before whom any penalty imposed hereby is sought to be recovered may order the whole or part only (not being less than Five shillings) of such penalty to be paid. And every person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the foregoing penalty, notwithstanding that the Local Board of Health may be empowered by this bye-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such Local Board of Health have or have not taken advantage of such powers.

BYE-LAW No. 11, AS TO DAIRIES, DAIRY CATTLE, AND MILK.

THE Local Board of Health in and for the Shire of Talbot, in the colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in "The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883," and every other power enabling the said local board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said local board, doth hereby make the following bye-law, being bye-law No. 11 of the said local board of health, that is to say:—

1. All former bye-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed.

2. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This bye-law shall apply to and have operation in and over every portion of the shire.

REGISTRATION OF COWKEEPERS, DAIRYMEN, AND PURVEYORS OF MILK.

4. Every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall, on or before the first day of February in every year, register himself with the local board of health in manner following, that is to say:—By signing and forwarding to the secretary of the local board of health an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall, with every such application, pay a fee of Twenty shillings.

I desire to be registered in accordance with the particulars in the schedule hereunder:—

5. Upon receipt of every such application and fee, the secretary for the local board of health shall endorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received, and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

6. All paddocks, grounds, lands, and enclosures used as grazing ground for dairy cattle shall, whenever necessary, be inspected by any member or officer of the said local board, or by any person authorized, in writing, by the chairman or secretary of the said local board, and if on inspection such paddocks, grounds, or enclosures, or any one of them, are or is likely in the opinion of the officer or person so inspecting to be prejudicial to health, by affecting the milk or otherwise, the said local board may, by an order in writing signed by the secretary, and served personally or left at the dwelling house of the registered person, or in the case of an unregistered person served personally or left at his dwelling place or posted upon the land, prohibit the use of the same for the purpose of feeding dairy cattle, either absolutely or for any time named in such order. All cattle in dairies shall also be similarly inspected by a veterinary surgeon or other competent person, and any cows found to be diseased, or which from poverty or weakness are, in the opinion of the inspector, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, shall be forthwith removed from such dairy if ordered by such inspector or other officer as aforesaid. And any such order as aforesaid the said local board may revoke, but upon every fresh inspection a similar order may from time to time be made.

7. All houses, dairies, cowsheds, milk stores, milk shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated; and the drainage of all such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not.

8. All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows shall be regularly swept, and be kept perfectly clean, and shall within twenty-four hours of any order to such effect from the health officer or inspector of nuisances be fumigated, disinfected, or lime-washed, as may be in any such order so directed.

9. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily.

10. If any person, or any member of the family of any person, registered as aforesaid, or not so registered but employed as a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor or member of the family of any visitor to any such person, shall be

attacked by typhoid fever or any dangerous infectious disease, the occupier of the house in which such person shall be, or (if he be the person attacked) his wife or other person in charge, shall immediately give notice thereof to the local board or officer of health, or to the nearest member of the police force who shall immediately inform the local board of health, and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said local board or the officer of health, by order served as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of any such cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, until danger, in the opinion of such local board or officer of health, no longer exists. And in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering, or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering, to milk cows or to handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business. Nor, if the person registered or conducting such business be himself the person suffering, shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until, in either case, all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk or of its contamination has ceased.

11. If at any time disease exists in the dairy or among the cows or cattle in any cowshed or dairy or in the herds of any cowkeeper, dairyman, vendor, or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the local board, officer of health, or nearest member of the police force, and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.

12. No cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep, or permit or suffer to be kept, any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.

13. In the interpretation of this bye-law, words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural and the plural the singular, and the word "person" shall include a corporation.

14. Every person guilty of any breach of this bye-law, or of any of its provisions, shall be liable, in the discretion of the convicting justices, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings, or in the like discretion to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

The foregoing bye-law was duly made, ordered, and passed by the Local Board of Health (being the Municipal Council) in and for the Shire of Talbot this 11th day of January in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-six.

REGULATIONS FOR THE ADMISSION, FREE OF DUTY, OF QUEENSLAND SUGAR RETURNED BORDERWISE FROM NEW SOUTH WALES OR SOUTH AUSTRALIA INTO THIS COLONY.

1. Every shipment of sugar exported for return to this colony borderwise, as above, must be entered out in the usual way as if for export, with a declaration that the whole of the sugar so entered is for return to Queensland; and, in addition to the manufacturer's mark, each bag must be marked Q.S., with certain progressive numerals to be obtained at the Custom House.

2. The proper officer will then give a certificate in triplicate that the sugar in question is of Queensland growth and manufacture, and that it is being forwarded to Sydney or Port Adelaide, as the case may be, for return to Queensland, borderwise.
