THE following Commission, passed under the Royal Sign Manual and Signet, appointing The Honorable John Douglas, Esquire, C.M.G., to be Her Majesty's Special Commissioner for the Protected Territory in New Guinea, is published, at his request, for general information.

VICTORIA, by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Queen, Defender of the Faith, Empress of India; To Our Trusty and Well-beloved John Douglas, Esquire, Companion of Our Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Greeting:

WHEREAS we have been pleased to take under our protection and jurisdiction the southern and south-eastern shores of New Guinea, from the 141st meridian of east longitude eastward as far as East Cape, and thence north-westward as far as the 8th parallel of south latitude in the neighborhood of Mitre Rock, together with the territory lying south of a line from Mitre Rock proceeding along the said 8th parallel to the 147th degree of east longitude, then in a straight line in a north-westerly direction to the point of intersection of the 6th parallel of south latitude and of the 144th degree of east longitude, and continuing in a west-north-westerly direction to the point of intersection of the 5th parallel of south latitude and of the 141st degree of east longitude, together with the Trobriand, Woodlark, d'Entrecasteaux, and Louisiade Groups of Islands, and of all other islands lying between the 8th and 12th parallels of south latitude, and between the 141st and the 155th degrees of east longitude, and not forming part of the Colony of Queensland; And furthermore including all islands and reefs situate in the Gulf of Papua to the northward of the 8th parallel of south latitude:

And whereas we are minded to make provision for the conduct of our affairs within the said Protectorate:

Now know you that we do, by this our commission under our sign manual and signet, appoint you, the said John Douglas, to

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be, until our pleasure be further signified, our Special Commissioner for the aforesaid Protectorate, and as such Special Commissioner to act in our name and on our behalf, and in all respects to represent our Crown and authority in matters occurring therein, and further to take all such measures and to do all such matters and things in the said Protectorate as in the interest of our service you may think expedient, subject to such instructions as you may from time to time receive from us or through one of our principal Secretaries of State.

II. And we do require you, to the utmost of your power, to promote religion and civilization among the native inhabitants of the Protectorate, and you are especially to take care to protect them in their persons and in the free enjoyment of their lands and other possessions, and by all lawful means to prevent and restrain all violence and injustice which may in any manner be practised or attempted against them.

III. And we do hereby authorise and empower you, as occasion may require, to appoint all such officers as you may think necessary for our service in the said Protectorate, if provision shall have been made for their payment; and all such officers shall hold their offices during our pleasure.

IV. And we do hereby appoint that in the event of your death, incapacity, or absence, the powers and authorities hereby conferred shall, until our further pleasure be signified, become vested in our trusty and well-beloved Hugh Hastings Romilly, Esquire, or if he be absent or for any other reason be unable duly to exercise such powers and authorities, then in such person as our High Commissioner for the Western Pacific, or the person for the time discharging the function of such High Commissioner, shall appoint by an instrument under his hand and seal.

V. And we do hereby command and require all our officers and servants, and all other our loyal subjects in New Guinea and its vicinity, to be aiding and assisting unto you the said John Douglas in execution of this our commission, and unto any other person for the time being acting in execution thereof.

Given at our Court at Osborne House, Isle of Wight, this twenty-sixth day of December 1885, in the forty-ninth year of our reign.

“THE VICTORIAN WATER CONSERVATION ACT 1883.”—CONSTITUTION OF THE COHUNA IRRIGATION TRUST.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twentieth day of April 1886.

WHEREAS His Excellency the Governor in Council, by an Order in Council bearing date the twentieth day of April 1886, hath approved of the construction of certain works, without alterations or additions or restrictions of the plans and descriptions thereof, proposed to be carried out in the irrigation area hereinafter limited by an Irrigation Trust to be constituted under the provisions of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1883*.

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order order and appoint as follows:—

1. That an Irrigation Trust be constituted to construct, maintain, and continue the whole or any part of the works described in the plans and descriptions thereof in accordance with the provisions of this Order and of the said Act.
2. That the limits of the lands to be called an irrigation area within which such trust shall have authority shall be as follows:—

Portion No. 1.

Commencing at the intersection of Deep Creek with Gunbower Creek, near the west boundary of allotment 85 of Gunbower State Forest, parish of Gunbower; thence south-westerly along last-mentioned creek to a point in line with the southern boundary of allotment 8, section V; thence westerly along said boundary and by a road to the north-west angle of allotment 9; thence southerly by the western boundary of the said allotment to the south-east angle of allotment 10; thence westerly along southern boundary of said allotment to the south-west angle of the same; thence southerly by a road to the south-eastern angle of allotment 23, section IV, of same parish; thence north-westerly by a road to the south-east angle of allotment 34, section II, parish of Gunbower West; thence by a road north-westerly along southern boundary of the said allotment to the south-west angle of allotment 32 of section II, of the last-named parish; thence northerly along western boundary of the said parish to the south-east angle of allotment 16, section F, parish of Macorna; thence westerly by a road to the south-west angle of the same allotment; thence northerly along western boundary of the said allotment to the south-east angle of allotment 13; thence westerly along southern boundary of the same allotment to its western angle; thence northerly along the western boundary of the said allotment to the south-east angle of allotment 12; thence westerly along southern boundary of last-named allotment to its south-west angle; thence north-easterly by a road along the western boundary of the same allotment and allotment 11 to the north-west angle of the last-named allotment; thence easterly by a road to the south-east angle of allotment 30; thence northerly by a road to the south-east angle of allotment 2; thence westerly and northerly along southern and western boundaries of the same allotment to the south-east angle of allotment 1, section F; thence westerly along southern boundary of the same allotment to its south-western angle; thence northerly by a road to the north-west angle of allotment 25, in the parish of Gamawarra; thence westerly by a road to the south-west angle of allotment 35A; thence southerly by a road to the south-east angle of allotment 37; thence westerly by a road to the south-west angle of the same allotment; thence northerly, easterly, and northerly, and by a line due north to the intersection of such line with the road lying to the south of allotment 39; thence westerly by a road to the south-west angle of the said allotment; thence northerly along the western boundary of the said allotment to the south-west angle of allotment 40; thence westerly along southern boundary of the same allotment to the south-west angle of the said allotment; thence northerly, westerly, and northerly by the western boundary of the same allotment, and northerly by a road to the south-east angle of allotment 13—all in the parish of Gamawarra; thence northerly along western boundary of the said parish to the south-east angle of allotment 27, section A, parish of Kerang; thence westerly by a road to the south-west angle of allotment 13; thence northerly to the north-west angle of the same allotment; thence westerly by a road to the south-west angle of allotment 36, section B, of same parish; thence northerly by eastern boundary of allotment 37 to its north-eastern angle; thence westerly along northern boundary of the same allotment to its most north-western angle; thence northerly by the eastern boundary of allotments 38 and 39A to the north-east angle of the last-named allotment; thence westerly by the northern boundary of the said allotment to its most north-western angle—all in the parish of Kerang; thence northerly by a road to the southern angle of allotment 24, section F, parish of Murrabit West; thence north-westerly by a road to the most northern angle of allotment 20 of the same section; thence northerly by a two-chain road and a line to its intersection with Barr Creek; thence north-westerly by the said creek to a point at the intersection with the western boundary of T. Blain's 20-acre block; thence northerly by that line and the western boundary of the said allotment to its north-western angle; thence easterly to its north-east angle of the same allotment; thence south to the north-western angle of allotment 23, section A; thence easterly by the most northern boundary of the same allotment to the north-east angle of the same; thence south-easterly and southerly by a road to the south-east angle of allotment 2, section C;

thence easterly by a road to the north-east angle of allotment 27; thence southerly by a road to the south-west angle of allotment 10; thence easterly by a road to the north-east angle of allotment 23; thence southerly by a road to the south-west angle of allotment 22, section C, in the parish of Murrabit West; thence easterly by a road to its intersection with the western boundary of the parish of Murrabit; thence southerly and south-easterly along the said boundary to its intersection with the northern boundary of the parish of Kerang; thence south-easterly along the eastern boundary of the last-named parish to its intersection with the south-west angle of allotment 9, parish of Gannawarra; thence north-easterly by the three-chain Kerang to Koondrook road to the most northern angle of allotment 18, section E, parish of Murrabit; thence due east by a line to its intersection with the Gunbower Creek; thence south-easterly and southerly along the said creek to its intersection with the Deep Creek—the point of commencement aforesaid.

Portion No. 2.

A strip of land two chains on either side of centre line of Barr Creek: Commencing at a point on the centre of the said creek in line with the most western boundary of T. Blain's 20-acre block, section A, parish of Murrabit West; thence south-westerly by the centre of the said creek to a point in line with the most western boundary of A. Henderson's 20-acre block in the same parish; thence south-westerly by a line to its intersection with the Loddon River, near to the north-west angle of allotment 1, section C, of the said parish.

Portion No. 3.

A strip of land two chains wide on either side of Deep Creek: Commencing at the intersection of Deep Creek with the River Murray; thence north-westerly along the said creek to its intersection with Gunbower Creek.

Portion No. 4.

A strip of land two chains wide on either side of Yarram Creek: Commencing at the intersection of the same creek with the River Murray; thence south-westerly along the said creek to its intersection with Gunbower Creek.

Portion No. 5.

A strip of land two chains wide on either side of centre line of Gunbower Creek: Commencing at a point on the said creek due east of the most northern angle of allotment 18, section E, in the parish of Murrabit; thence easterly, south-easterly, north-easterly, and northerly along the centre of the said creek to its intersection with the River Murray.

3. The scheme for the irrigation of the said irrigation area shall be the diversion of water from the River Murray at Yarram and Deep Creeks down the Picanniny Barr, Gunbower Barr, Diving's, and portion of Leitch's Creeks, and the distribution of such water upon the lands of the said area by means of private pumping machinery and distribution channels; and the principal works shall be cuttings down the aforementioned creeks, the removal of all obstructions therein likely to impede the flow of the water, the construction of regulators at the Murray River oftakes, of dams at Koondrook and McDonald's Swamp, and a sluice weir at oftake of Barr Creek from the Gunbower, together with the purchase of existing waterworks.

4. That the name of the said irrigation area shall be "The Cohuna Irrigation Area," and the corporate name of the said irrigation trust shall be the "Cohuna Irrigation Trust."

5. That the amount of money proposed to be expended on the scheme being Seventeen thousand pounds, the sum which may be raised as a loan for the purpose of carrying out such scheme and of paying the preliminary costs and expenses of the applications for this order shall not exceed Seventeen thousand pounds.

6. That the number of persons to be elected as commissioners of the said Cohuna Irrigation Trust shall be nine, and the period for which such commissioners shall hold office shall be three years.

COHUNA IRRIGATION TRUST.—ELECTION
OF COMMISSIONERS.
REGULATIONS.

At the Executive Council Chambers, Melbourne, the twentieth day of April 1886.

WHEREAS by section 28 of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1883*, No. 778, it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, subject to the provisions of the said Act, from time to time make, alter, and repeal regulations relating to any irrigation trust constituted under the said Act for the purposes, among others, following:—

(a) For determining the period for which the commissioners of any trust shall hold office, the time and manner of election, and the order of their retirement from office.

(b) For determining the manner in which elections of any such commissioners shall be held, and the manner of voting thereat.

(c) For determining the manner in which any vacancies in the office of any such commissioners shall be filled up; and

(d) For determining questions as to the due election of any such commissioner.

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the said provisions of the now in part recited Act, doth for the purposes aforesaid, so far as these may relate to a certain irrigation trust duly constituted under the said Act, and known as the Cohuna Irrigation Trust, make the regulations following, viz:—

1. *Interpretation of terms.*—In these regulations, "the Minister" shall mean the Minister of Water Supply; "the trust" or "the said trust" shall mean the said Cohuna Irrigation Trust; and "the area," "the said area," or "the irrigation area" shall mean the lands as defined by the Order in Council constituting the said trust wherein the trust shall have authority.

2. *Period for which commissioners shall hold office.*—Subject to the provisions in reference to the first election of commissioners hereinafter contained, for securing the annual retirement of three commissioners, the period during which the commissioners of the said trust shall hold office shall be three years.

3. *Annual retirement of three commissioners.*—Three commissioners shall retire annually, but the retiring commissioner shall, subject to the provisions of the said Act, be eligible for re-election.

4. *Term of office of persons elected commissioners at first election.*—At the first election of the commissioners three of the persons elected commissioners shall hold office as such commissioners for the term of three years, three others of such persons shall hold office for the term of two years, and the remaining three persons elected as such commissioners shall hold office for the term of one year, and the particular term for which each such person so elected a commissioner shall hold office shall be determined in the manner following, that is to say:—

(A) *How term of office is ascertained when no poll taken.*—If the first election is made without a poll as in the case in these regulations provided, then the particular term for which each candidate elected as a commissioner shall hold office shall immediately upon such election be publicly determined by lot by the returning officer in such manner as to him may seem fit, and the returning officer shall thereupon immediately and publicly announce the term for which each individual candidate elected as a commissioner shall hold office as so determined, and shall report the same to the Minister.

(B) *How term of office ascertained when poll taken.*—If at the first election a poll shall be held as in these regulations provided, then of the nine candidates elected as commissioners the three candidates who shall have received the highest number of votes shall hold office as commissioners for the term of three years, and the three candidates who shall have received the next highest number of votes shall hold office for the term of two years, and the remaining three candidates who shall have been elected shall hold office for the term of one year; and if two or more than two candidates elected shall have obtained the same number of votes, then the returning officer shall determine by lot (as hereinbefore provided in the case of the first election if decided without ballot) the term or terms of three, two, or one year or years during which such candidates shall respectively hold office. But so that no candidate elected shall hold office for a shorter time than the term during which any other candidate who shall have obtained a less number of votes shall hold office. And the returning officer shall publicly declare the respective terms during which the several candidates shall hold office as so determined, and shall report the same to the Minister.

5. *Extraordinary vacancies, how filled, and term of office.*—Should any vacancy in the office of commissioner be occasioned by death, resignation, removal, disqualification, or any other cause whatever, an election shall forthwith be held to fill such vacancy, and the provisions contained in these regulations as to the nomination of candidates, the manner in which elections shall be held, and the mode of voting thereat, shall apply to any election in respect of such vacancy, and the person elected to fill such vacancy shall hold the office of commissioner during the unexpired portion of the term of office of the commissioner whose seat shall have become vacant.

6. *Date for first election of commissioners.*—Date of ordinary annual election.—The first election of commissioners of the said trust shall be held on the fifteenth day of May 1886, and the ordinary annual election shall be held on the fifteenth day of May in each succeeding year. Provided that whenever such date may fall upon a Sunday, or upon any day set apart as a public holiday, such election shall be held upon the day next following.

7. *Voters' list to be prepared.*—For the purposes of the first election of commissioners of the said trust, a voters' list shall be prepared by the persons upon whose petition the said trust has been constituted, and the said voters' list shall be forwarded to the Minister.

8. *Form of voters' list.—First Schedule.*—Such voters' list shall be in the form of the First Schedule hereto, and shall contain in regular numerical sequence and alphabetical order of surname the christian name or names, surname, and address, so far as these may be known, of each owner of not less than ten acres of land within the irrigation area of the said trust, and shall also specify the extent of, and indicate with reasonable certainty, the land of each such owner, and shall state the number of votes to which, under the provisions of the said Act, each such owner is entitled.

9. *Copy of voters' list to be available for inspection.—Second Schedule.*—Objections to list to be in writing and forwarded to Minister.—A copy of such voters' list shall be available for

inspection, without payment of fee or charge, at all reasonable hours in the day time, in some convenient place within or near to the irrigation area of the trust for a period of fourteen clear days; and a notice in the form, or to the like effect, of the Second Schedule hereto, setting forth the times and place at which such voters' list may be so inspected, shall be published in some newspaper ordinarily circulating within the said area, and such notice shall state that all objections to the said list must be forwarded in writing to the Minister within the time mentioned in the said notice.

10. *Grounds of objection to be stated.*—All objections to the said list shall be forwarded in writing to the Minister within sixteen days after the first day of the publication of such notice, and the ground or grounds of objection must be clearly set forth.

11. *Minister to revise and certify list.*—The Minister shall revise the said list and consider all objections thereto, and make such alterations and amendments therein as to him may seem just, and shall certify the list under his hand as correct, and no objection to the list when so certified shall be allowed.

12. *Certified list to be voters' roll.*—The list so revised and certified shall be the voters' roll for the purposes of the first election of the commissioners of the trust, but shall also be available for any election in respect of any extraordinary vacancy occurring within twelve months next after the date of the said first election.

13. *Voters' list to be prepared yearly.*—Before the thirty-first day of March in each year the officers of the trust shall prepare a voters' list in the form of the First Schedule hereto, and such list shall contain, in regular numerical sequence and in alphabetical order of surname, the christian name or names, surname, and address (so far as these may be known) of each owner of not less than ten acres of land within the irrigation area of the said trust, and shall also specify the extent of, and indicate with reasonable certainty, the land of each such owner, and shall state the number of votes to which, under the provisions of the said Act, each such owner is entitled.

14. *Copy of list to be available for inspection.*—*Third Schedule.*—A copy of such voters' list shall be available for inspection, without payment of any fee or charge, at all reasonable hours in the day time, in some convenient place within or near to the irrigation area of the trust, for a period of fourteen clear days; and a notice in the form, or to the like effect, of the Third Schedule hereto shall be published in some newspaper ordinarily circulating within the said area, and such notice shall state that all objections to the said list must be forwarded in writing to the chairman of the trust within the time mentioned in the said notice.

15. *Grounds of objections to list to be forwarded in writing to chairman of trust.*—All objections to the said list shall be forwarded in writing to the chairman of the trust within the time mentioned in the said notice, and the ground or grounds of objection must be clearly set forth.

16. *Special meeting of trust to be held to revise list.*—*List to be certified.*—In the month of April in each year a special meeting of the trust shall be held for the purpose of revising the said list; and all objections which may have been forwarded to the chairman under the preceding clause shall be considered by the commissioners then present; and the chairman may make such alterations and amendments in the said list as the commissioners or a majority of the commissioners present may determine to be just and necessary; and the list, when so revised, altered, and amended, shall be certified as correct under the hand of the chairman, and no objection to the list when so certified shall be allowed.

17. *Revised and certified list to be voters' roll.*—The list so revised and certified shall be the voters' roll for the purposes of any election (whether ordinary or extraordinary) of trust commissioners to be held within one year from the fifteenth day of May then next, the said day inclusive.

18. *Appointment of returning officer.*—*First election.*—For the purposes of the first such election, the Minister may appoint some fit and proper person, not being the owner of land within the irrigation area, to be returning officer; and such returning officer may appoint a deputy or deputies to assist him or to act in his room at such election, and such deputy or deputies may do all or any of the acts or things which the returning officer is hereby authorized or required to do.

19. *Chairman of trust to be returning officer.*—For every subsequent election, whether ordinary or extraordinary, the chairman of the trust for the time being shall be the returning officer; but if at the time of any election the office of chairman of the trust shall be vacant, the commissioners of the trust may by resolution appoint one of their number to be returning officer until the office of chairman of the trust shall again be filled; and the returning officer may appoint a deputy or deputies to assist him or to act in his room at any election, and such deputy or deputies may do all or any of the acts or things which the returning officer is hereby authorized or required to do.

20. *Returning officer not to be candidate.*—No person who acts as returning officer or deputy returning officer at any election shall be or become a candidate for the office of commissioner at such election.

21. *Notice of election.*—*Nomination of candidates.*—*Fourth Schedule.*—Twenty-one clear days before any election of commissioners under these regulations, the returning officer shall give public notice of such election by advertisement inserted in some newspaper generally circulating in the said area, and by such notice shall require all candidates at such election to be nominated at some place within the said area, to be named in such notice, in manner hereinafter mentioned, between the hours of ten o'clock in the forenoon and four o'clock in the afternoon on some day before a day (hereinafter called the day of nomination) not less than seven nor more than ten days after the time of giving such notice, and named therein; and any person desirous of nominating a candidate shall, before four o'clock in the afternoon

of the day next preceding the nomination day, cause to be delivered at the place aforesaid to the returning officer a nomination paper in the form of the Fourth Schedule, or to the like effect, stating therein the christian name and surname of such candidate, together with the other particulars required in and by the said schedule; and such nomination paper shall be signed by not less than four persons duly qualified to vote at such election, and also signed by the person named therein as a candidate in token of his assent to being so named.

22. *Candidate to lodge deposit.*—At the time of the delivery to the returning officer of any such nomination paper as aforesaid, the candidate named therein, or some person for him or on his behalf, shall pay into the hands of the returning officer the sum of Five pounds, to be dealt with as hereinafter provided; and no person who has not been so nominated as aforesaid, or by whom or on whose behalf such payment has not been so made, shall, within the subsequent provisions of these regulations, be or be deemed to be a candidate at any election of commissioners.

23. *Deposit how dealt with.*—Where a poll takes place for any election of commissioners, the moneys so paid as aforesaid to the returning officer by or on behalf of any candidate who may not afterwards have received at the said election a number of votes equal at least to one-fifth part of the votes given to such one of the persons declared elected at such election as has had the least number of votes thereat shall be forfeited to the corporate funds of the trust; and the returning officer shall forthwith after such election repay to each of the candidates who has so received at least such fifth part, whether declared elected or not, or who has been returned without a poll, or who has retired as herein provided, the moneys so paid by or for them respectively.

24. *Where number of candidates do not exceed number of commissioners to be elected.*—If at the expiration of the time limited as hereinbefore provided for the nominations of candidates the number of persons who have become candidates as aforesaid does not exceed the number of commissioners to be elected, the returning officer shall then declare such candidates to be duly elected, and they shall be deemed to be then duly elected accordingly.

25. *Where number of candidates exceeds number of commissioners to be elected.*—*Fifth Schedule.*—*Notice of poll.*—*Hours of polling.*—If, at the expiration of the time limited for the nomination of candidates, the number of candidates exceeds the number of commissioners to be elected, then the returning officer shall forthwith cause ballot-papers to be printed, with the christian names and surnames of all the candidates in full, in the form of the Fifth Schedule hereto, and shall also forthwith give public notice by advertisement in some newspaper generally circulating in the irrigation area, stating the names of the persons so nominated, and that a poll will be taken for the election of such commissioners upon the day named in such notice, at such place or places within the said area as the returning officer shall in and by such notice appoint, and such poll shall take place accordingly, and shall commence at ten o'clock in the forenoon and close at four o'clock in the afternoon.

26. *Retirement of candidates before polling-day.*—If at any election after a poll shall have been appointed as aforesaid any candidate for such election and two of the persons having signed the paper nominating him as aforesaid are desirous that he should retire from such candidature, such candidate and the persons aforesaid may sign and deliver to the returning officer not later than four clear days before the day of polling a notice in the form of the Sixth Schedule hereto, stating that such candidate so retires, and the said candidate or his agent shall thereupon publish in some newspaper generally circulating in the irrigation area a copy of such notice, and the returning officer, on sufficient proof of such publication as aforesaid, if the number of such candidates is by such retirement reduced to the number of persons to be elected at such election, shall on the day appointed for the election declare the remaining candidates duly elected, and if the said number is not so reduced shall omit the name of the person so retiring from the ballot-papers to be used at the said election, and if such papers are already printed shall erase such name therefrom, and such person shall not be capable of being elected at such election.

27. *Polling-booths may be hired.*—At such election the returning officer, or his deputy, shall provide suitable places for taking a poll, and may, if necessary, cause to be hired and used as a polling-booth any room which he may deem to be suitable at each of the places appointed for taking the poll, and may divide such room into compartments as to the returning officer, or his deputy, may seem most convenient.

28. *Returning officer or deputy to preside at polling-booth.*—The returning officer, or his deputy, shall preside at each polling-booth for taking a poll, and the returning officer may appoint poll clerks to attend in each booth at such election.

29. *Scrutineers may be appointed.*—Each candidate shall be entitled to appoint, in writing, one scrutineer to be present in each polling-booth, and the said returning officer, or his deputy, together with the scrutineers, poll clerks, and any voters, not exceeding four in number, actually engaged in voting, shall alone be permitted at any one time to enter or remain in the polling-booth.

30. *Pencils, &c., to be provided.*—The returning officer, or his deputy, shall provide pencils in each polling-booth for the use of the voters, and also a locked box, to be called the ballot-box, with a cleft or opening therein capable of receiving the ballot-papers, and such box shall be opened and exhibited to the scrutineers before the polling begins, and the box shall then be locked, and shall stand upon a table opposite the returning officer, or his deputy, who shall keep the key of such box.

31. *Mode of voting where voter is illiterate.*—*Fifth Schedule.*—The returning officer, or his deputy, shall deliver to every voter who requires the same a ballot-paper, or if such voter appears by the roll to be entitled to give more votes than one, then so many ballot-papers as may be equal to the number of votes which such voter so appears to be entitled to give,

such ballot-papers being in the form of Schedule Five hereto, and initialled by the returning officer; and every such voter shall, without leaving the booth, strike out from all or any of such papers the name of every candidate for whom he does not intend to vote. And in case any voter is unable to read or write, the returning officer, or his deputy, if so required, shall, in view of such one of the scrutineers as the voter may desire, strike out the name or names of such candidate or candidates as such voter may designate, and after such name or names have been so struck out, the ballot-paper, or ballot-papers, as the case may be, shall forthwith be deposited in the said box. Provided that all the ballot-papers to which any person may be entitled at the polling-booth shall be demanded and received by him at one and the same time, and no person having once demanded and received any such ballot-paper or papers, and voted by the same, shall at the same election receive any further ballot-papers, or exercise any further right of voting.

32. *Ballot-papers to be numbered.*—Before delivering any ballot-paper to the voter, the returning officer or his deputy shall write upon the back of each such ballot-paper, as near as practicable to the lower edge thereof, the number corresponding to the number set opposite to the voter's name in the roll, and shall thereupon, upon a copy of such roll, check off such voter's name as having voted, and mark against such name the number of ballot-papers delivered to such voter.

33. *Informal ballot-papers.*—If any voter suffer to remain upon his ballot-paper a greater number of names not struck out than the number of commissioners to be elected, the vote given on and by such paper shall be void and of no effect.

34. *What questions may be asked.*—At any election of commissioners, the returning officer or his deputy may, if he see fit, or if required to do so by any candidate or scrutineer shall, put to any person tendering his vote the questions or any of the questions following:—

- (1.) "Are you the person whose name appears as (A. B.) in the roll now in force for this trust being enrolled therein in respect of land in the parish of _____, and comprising (here specify the area of the land as given in the roll)?"
- (2.) "Have you already voted at the present election?"

And no other question shall be put to any person tendering his vote; and no person who shall refuse to answer any of the questions, or who shall not answer the first of such questions absolutely in the affirmative, and the second of such questions absolutely in the negative, shall receive a ballot-paper or be permitted to vote.

35. *False answer, polling twice, and personation.*—Every person who shall wilfully make a false answer to any of the questions aforesaid, or who shall poll more than once, or offer to poll more than once at the same election, or who shall depart or attempt to depart from any polling-booth after having received a ballot-paper without having deposited the same in the ballot-box as hereinbefore provided, or who shall personate any other person for the purpose of polling at such election, shall be guilty of a breach of these regulations; but nothing contained in this clause shall apply to any person only by reason of his exercising the right of voting as often as it appears by the roll he is entitled so to do.

36. *Result of polling how ascertained.*—Returning officer to have casting vote.—Immediately upon the close of the poll the returning officer or his deputy shall, in the presence of and subject to the inspection of so many of the scrutineers of the candidates as please to be present, proceed to ascertain the number of votes for each candidate; and such returning officer or his deputy shall abstain from inspecting the number written as aforesaid on any ballot-paper, and take care that the same is not seen by any person before being sealed up as herein provided; and the returning officer shall seal up the ballot-papers deposited in the booth, and as soon as conveniently may be on or after the day of the poll publicly declare the candidates not exceeding the number of commissioners to be elected or vacancies to be filled up who have received the greatest number of votes to have been duly elected commissioners; and if two or more candidates have received an equal number of votes, the returning officer shall in each case have the casting vote.

37. *Ballot-papers, how disposed of.*—In the case of the said first election of commissioners, the returning officer shall forthwith after the declaration of the poll endorse with a description of the contents thereof and sign the sealed parcels of ballot-papers, and forward the same to the Minister, who shall, as soon as may be after the first meeting of trust commissioners shall have been held, forward such sealed packet to the secretary to the trust, to be by him safely and secretly kept for six months then next ensuing, and then by him caused to be destroyed in the presence of three commissioners of the trust; but in all subsequent elections the parcel or parcels of ballot-papers so sealed, endorsed, and signed shall be delivered by the returning officer to the said secretary, to be by him safely and secretly kept for six months after such delivery, and then by him caused to be destroyed in the presence of three of the commissioners of the trust.

38. *Minister to determine questions arising upon first election.*—If any question arise as to the due election of any commissioner at the first election, the returning officer shall, at the request of any voter or candidate, submit such question in writing to the Minister, who shall decide the same, and such decision shall be final and binding.

39. *Questions arising upon subsequent elections to be determined by trust.*—If any question arise as to the due election of any commissioner at any subsequent election, whether ordinary or extraordinary, such question shall be determined by the commissioners of the trust at the first ordinary meeting held after the election; but no commissioner in respect of whose election such question shall have arisen shall act as a commissioner at such meeting, or be entitled to take any part in the proceedings thereof, or in any manner or at any time to act as a commissioner

until such question shall have been so determined, and the majority of the commissioners whose election is not in dispute shall form a quorum.

40. *Appeal to Minister from determination of trust.*—In event of any voter or candidate feeling aggrieved by the determination of the trust with reference to any such question as last aforesaid, he may appeal therefrom to the Minister within fourteen days from the date upon which the commissioners shall have determined the question, and the Minister may make such enquiry as to the merits of the question as may appear to him to be necessary, and determine such question in such manner as to him may appear just, and such determination of the Minister shall be final and binding.

41. *Failure to elect deemed to create extraordinary vacancies.*—If at any election of commissioners no vacancies or a number of vacancies less than the whole number which should have been filled up at such election are filled up, then the vacancies which are so not filled up shall severally be deemed extraordinary vacancies and to have occurred on the day appointed for such election.

Provided always that the commissioners eventually elected to fill such vacancies shall go out of office as if elected at such election.

42. *Penalty for breach of regulations.*—These regulations shall also be deemed to be regulations under section 95 of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1881*, and any person guilty of a breach of any of the provisions of these regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, to be recovered in a summary manner before justices of the peace.

43. *Interpretation.*—In these regulations words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, unless there is something in the context repugnant to or inconsistent with this interpretation.

44. *Expenses of election to be paid by trust.*—The expenses incurred by the returning officer, or under his direction, in connection with any election, shall be defrayed by the trust.

THE Commissioners of the Swan Hill Shire Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 20 of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1884*, do make the following Regulation:—

No. 3.

Regulation for making a rate on all the rateable property in the Urban Districts of Kerang and Castle Donnington.

(1.) A rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling on the annual value of all the rateable property in the Urban Districts of Kerang and Castle Donnington, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements comprised within the said Urban Districts for the municipal rates of the Shire of Swan Hill, is hereby made for the year commencing on the 1st day of January 1886 and ending on the 31st day of December 1886.

(2.) Such rate is hereby made payable in two equal instalments, the first of which instalments shall be due and payable on the 1st day of January 1886, and the second instalment shall be due and payable on the 1st day of July 1886.

(3.) Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rate.

THE CHAIGIE AND EGLINTON FARMERS' COMMON, proclaimed by Order of the 4th March 1861, and increased by Orders dated respectively the 11th November 1868 and the 22nd February 1869, is hereby diminished by deducting therefrom the Water and Road reserve, being allotment 7 of section 7A, containing thirty-seven acres two roods sixteen perches of land.—(86.W.24795.)

THE LACKEY COMMON, proclaimed by Order of the 27th August 1877, and increased by Orders dated respectively the 2nd December 1878 and the 7th August 1882, is hereby abolished.

1. The Government will not be bound to order from the contractor all the articles enumerated in the schedules, but only those articles, and such quantities of those articles, as it may be found necessary to order. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedules, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. The supplies are to be according to sample and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. 9. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of. All articles rejected must be immediately replaced by the contractor, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense deducted as in condition 6.

10. The members of boards of survey will be appointed by the Treasurer of the colony for the time being, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the survey fees and extra expense (if any) will be charged as in condition 6.

11. SHIRE OF TOWONG.

BYE-LAW No. 1.

For keeping free from noisome matter yards, stables, and places used for noxious trades, slaughter-yards, &c.; and for regulating management of earth-closets, privies, &c., disinfecting and decolorizing nightsoil and other offensive matter, and for regulating its removal and final deposit.

THE Local Board of Health in and for the Shire of Towong, in the colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in the "Public Health Amendment Statute 1883," and every other power enabling the said local board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said local board, doth hereby make the following bye-law, being Bye-law No. 1 of the said Local Board of Health, that is to say:—

1. All former bye-laws on the matter and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this bye-law coming into operation.

2. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This bye-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the said shire.

4. The occupier of every house and premises within the said shire shall cause the yard and ground belonging thereto, or occupied in connection therewith, to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all filth, rubbish, and refuse matter to be from time to time removed from such yard and ground; and if at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such filth, rubbish, or refuse matter so removed as aforesaid, the local board may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier.

5. The occupier of any land in the said shire on which there shall be erected any stable, cowyard, cattle-shed, or pigsty shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all soil, dung, or other manure produced or accumulated therein to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of the same so produced or accumulated shall amount to one cubic yard; and if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect or fail to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid, the same shall be removed by the said local board at the expense of such occupier.

6. The occupier of every house, building, or tenement within the said shire shall cause every cesspool already in existence, and until its abolition, to be emptied and cleaned from time to time as soon as any portion of the contents of such cesspool shall have so accumulated therein as to be within a distance of one foot from the top of the side walls or lining of such cesspool. Provided that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom except between the hours of Eleven p.m. and Five a.m. And provided also that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom until such contents shall have had mixed therewith carbolic acid or some other efficient deodorizer sufficient in quality and quantity to effectually deodorize and disinfect the same.

7. Every occupier and every person having the management and control of any premises shall once at least in every week empty and cleanse, or cause to be emptied and cleansed, every earth-closet, privy, and place in the nature of an earth-closet for the reception of nightsoil or belonging to such premises.

8. No person shall empty any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the reception of nightsoil, except by means of a cart, carriage, or means of conveyance properly constructed, and furnished with a sufficient covering so as to prevent the escape of the contents or any portion thereof or of effluvia therefrom.

9. All nightsoil, blood, offal, or other offensive matter or thing shall be removed to and deposited in such place or places only as may be appointed by the local board from time to time for the final reception of the same.

10. Every person placing or depositing, or causing or suffering to be placed or deposited or spread, or assisting in placing or depositing or spreading on any land, whether by way of manure or otherwise, any nightsoil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter removed from any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or other place, shall immediately on the deposit or spreading thereof cover the same, or cause the same to be covered, and shall keep the same covered, with a layer of earth not less than six inches in thickness.

11. The occupier of any premises within the shire used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, process, or manufacture whatever, or used for the purpose of slaughtering, whether it be an abattoir or otherwise, shall cause any rubbish, blood, offal, bones, water, liquid, soil, or other offensive matter produced or accumulated thereon to be removed therefrom once in every twenty-four hours, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, or to exhale any offensive effluvia; and if such occupier shall neglect or fail to have removed therefrom any offensive matter whatever, it may be removed by the said local board at the expense of such occupier.

12. Every closet-pan shall be constructed of galvanized iron, properly riveted and soldered so as to be watertight, and with handles thereto, and of a capacity not exceeding three cubic feet.

13. No closet door or trap shall abut or open upon a street, lane, or right-of-way exceeding ten feet in width.

14. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds for every such breach, or of Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties—such portion not being less than Five shillings—to be paid. And any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable

to the penalty, notwithstanding that the local board of health may be empowered by this bye-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such local board has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

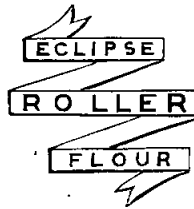
