REFERRING to Notice to Mariners dated the 27th December 1862, pilots, masters of vessels, and others are hereby informed that, on and after the 1st November 1886, the *low* leading light to the entrance of Port Phillip will be *altered* by exhibiting the white light of the western sector four degrees further to the eastward, thereby bringing the eastern edge of the *Lonsdale Rock* within the range of such *white* sector.

The *low* light therefore, on and after the date mentioned, will be seen from approaching vessels on the following bearings:—

Western white sector from N.E. by E. to N.E. half N.
Leading red sector from N.E. half N. to N.N.E.
Eastern white sector from N.N.E. round northerly to W. by N.

Caution.

THE following information, received from Lieutenant and Commander Field, of H.M.S. *Dart*, is hereby promulgated:—

1. A small detached patch ¾ cable in extent, and having 11 feet least water at L.W.S., has been discovered during the recent survey of the D'Entrecasteaux Channel, South Coast of Tasmania. It is situated 2½ cables S.S.E. ¾ E. from the northern

entrance point of Oyster Cove, and 8½ cables W. by S. ¾ S. from Wood Cutter's Point.

2. The following clearing mark leads 1½ cables to the eastward of the Zuidpool Rock, D'Entrecasteaux Channel, southern extremity of Partridge Island, seen just clear of the bushes on the northern point of Bruni Peninsula, bearing S. 22° W. A black can-buoy is moored precisely over the rock, but is liable to shift.

3. The keeper of Bruni Island Light-house having repeatedly reported a heavy break about 2 miles S.S.W. of the light-house, the locality has been carefully examined, and the least depth of water found was 12 fathoms.

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

BYE-LAW No. 37.

THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS, in pursuance of the powers conferred by *The Victorian Railways Commissioners Act 1883*, do hereby make the following Bye-law; and all previous Bye-laws conflicting therewith are hereby repealed:—

CHARGES ON GOODS ARE FIXED AS FOLLOWS:—

1. The minimum charges for safety trucks of 10s. up to 40 miles, and 3d. per truck per mile over 40 miles, set forth in the SAWN TIMBER RATES of 1st July, 1885, Clause 3, are hereby repealed, and the additional percentages mentioned in the said clause will only be charged on long lengths.
2. Tram rails from Williamstown or Port Melbourne Pier to Melbourne to be charged 4s. 6d. per ton; from Port Melbourne Pier to Spencer-street Station, 5s. per ton.
3. The minimum for Grass Seed, in the Miscellaneous Class, is reduced to ONE ton for distances of 36 miles and upwards.
4. Copper Regulus to be carried under Agricultural Produce Class Rates and Conditions from Wodonga to Melbourne, Williamstown, or Port Melbourne.

FARES FOR CONVEYANCE BY PASSENGER TRAINS ARE FIXED AS FOLLOWS:—

5. Monthly and Quarterly Tickets will be issued to persons over 16 years and up to any age attending School, College, or University, at two-thirds adults rate, provided they are not in receipt of any remuneration whatsoever from any situation, on production of the usual certificate, signed by the Principal or Registrar.

THE SHIRE OF LOWAN RE-SUBDIVIDED.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the eleventh day of May 1886.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1874* (38 Vict. No. 506) it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might from time to time make Orders, amongst other things, to subdivide or re-subdivide any municipal district into any number of subdivisions not exceeding eight; and every such Order should be published in the *Government Gazette*, and should take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas a petition purporting to be signed by more than one-fourth of the persons whose names are for the time being inscribed on the municipal roll of the Shire of Lowan has been presented to the Governor in Council, the substance and prayer of which petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the forty-sixth section of the said Act, and no counter petition received: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order abolish all previous subdivisions of the Shire of Lowan, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned doth hereby re-subdivide the said Shire of Lowan into three separate Ridings, the names and boundaries of which shall be as follow, that is to say:-

THE WEST RIDING.

Commencing at the north-west angle of Mallee Allotment No. 179, being a point on the west boundary of the colony and of the shire; thence east by the north boundary of Mallee Allotments Nos. 179 to 183; thence north to the north-west angle of Mallee Allotment 184; thence east again by the north boundaries of Mallee Allotments 184 to 187; thence north again to the north-west angle of Mallee Allotment 188; thence east again by the north boundary of Mallee Allotments 188, 189, and 190, the north-east angle of the allotment last-named; thence north by the east boundary of Mallee Allotment 187 to the north-west angle thereof; thence further north by the east boundary of the parish of Lawloit; thence west by the north boundary of said parish to its north-west angle; thence north by the east boundary of the parish of Miram Piram and west by the north boundary thereof and part of the parish of Yarrock to the south-west angle of the parish of Peechember; thence north by the west boundary of the parishes of Peechember, Dahwedarre, and of Mallee Allotment 25 to the south boundary of Mallee Block 39a; thence east to south-east angle of said block 39a; thence north by the east boundary of Mallee Blocks 39 b, 38 b, 37 b, 32 b, and part of 31 b, to the boundary between the shires of Lowan and Swan Hill; thence west by that boundary to the western boundary of the colony, being the shire boundary, and thence southerly by that boundary to the commencing point.

THE EAST RIDING.

PROPOSED SEVERANCE OF AREA.

IN pursuance of the provisions of *The Local Government Act 1874* (No. 506, sec. 46), the substance and prayer of a petition, in accordance with the 44th section of the said Act, which has been presented to His Excellency the Governor, are published, viz.:-

The petitioners purport to constitute a majority of the rate-payers in the portion of the Shire of Caulfield which is described in their petition, and they desire that the area so described may be severed from the Shire of Caulfield and annexed to the Borough of St. Kilda.

Area described in the petition :-

Commencing at the junction of the centre of Great Dandenong road and Hotham street; thence easterly along the centre of the Dandenong road to the centre of Orrong road; thence southerly by the centre of Orrong road to the centre of Inkerman street; thence westerly by the centre of Inkerman street to the centre of Hotham street; thence northerly by the centre of Hotham street to the commencing point.

Petitioners state that the area sought to be severed was previously included in the Borough of St. Kilda, and was annexed to Caulfield in the year 1876, and that they believe it will be to their interests to be re-annexed to the said borough for the following reasons:—That the portion desired to be severed is more thickly populated than the other portions of the shire, and has a proportionately larger rateable value; that a fair proportion of revenue derived from rates paid by them is not expended on permanent works in the portion of the shire wherein they reside, but is expended upon works in other portions of the shire. That the roads in the Borough of St. Kilda which adjoin the portion sought to be severed are much better constructed and kept than those in the shire. That they are practically disfranchised in regard to municipal matters, and they have no interests in common with the Caulfield Shire. That they are still included in the postal district of St. Kilda, which causes great loss of time in delivery of letters through being addressed to Caulfield; they believe that if the severance is granted the value of their property will be largely increased.

The petitioners therefore pray that the area above described be severed from the said Shire of Caulfield and annexed to the North St. Kilda Ward of the Borough of St. Kilda.

No. 3.

Regulation for making a rate on all the rateable property in the Urban Districts of Kerang and Castle Donnington.

(1.) A rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling on the annual value of all the rateable property in the Urban Districts of Kerang and Castle Donnington, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements comprised within the said Urban Districts for the municipal rates of the Shire of Swan Hill, is hereby made for the year commencing on the 1st day of January 1886 and ending on the 31st day of December 1886.

(2.) Such rate is hereby made payable in two equal instalments, the first of which instalments shall be due and payable on the 1st day of January 1886, and the second instalment shall be due and payable on the 1st day of July 1886.

(3.) Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rate.

REGULATIONS.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Borough of Horsham Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Victorian Water Conservation Acts 1883-1884, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the Victorian Water Conservation Acts 1881-1884, repeal the Regulations numbered 1 and 2 of the Regulations made by the said Waterworks Trust dated the 14th day of July 1885, and approved by the Governor in Council on the 27th day of July 1885, and do hereby make the Regulations following in lieu thereof:—

The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the said Urban District, that is so say:—

1. (1.) For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of twenty pounds annual value or under, the sum of One pound per annum.

(2.) For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of more than twenty pounds annual value, an amount equal to five per cent. on the amount of the municipal valuation.

(3.) For every water trough, not exceeding twelve feet in length, supplied with water by the Trust, the sum of Two pounds per annum, and for every additional five feet, or

fractional part thereof in length of such trough, a further sum of One pound per annum.

(4.) Every trough situated in a paddock shall be supplied through a meter affixed by the consumer, according to the directions of the Trust, provided, nevertheless, that the minimum charge for the water supplied to such trough shall not be less than the charge made for troughs supplied under the preceding clause.

(5.) For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, One pound per annum on each inch of the diameter of the cylinder.

(6.) For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, Two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons (or at such price as may be specially agreed upon); and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of gardens and lawns or other lands where water is supplied by the Trust for the purposes of irrigation or for ornamental purposes shall be as follows:—

One-sixteenth of an acre and less, per annum, 8,000 gallons.

Exceeding one-sixteenth of an acre, but not exceeding one-eighth of an acre, per annum, 12,000 gallons.

Exceeding one-eighth of an acre, but not exceeding one-quarter of an acre, per annum, 16,000 gallons.

Exceeding one-quarter of an acre, but not exceeding half an acre, per annum, 28,000 gallons.

Exceeding half an acre, but not exceeding one acre, per annum, 40,000 gallons.

And at the rate of 40,000 gallons per acre for every additional acre, and proportionately according to the foregoing scale for every fractional part of an acre.

In livery and carriers' stables supplied by the Trust with water by measurement, the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be two thousand gallons per stall used for stabling horses. In open sheds used for the above purposes, each space of five feet shall be charged for as a stall.

2. That each syphon pump must have a meter affixed, and that Two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons be charged for all water registered at such meter.

3. The before-mentioned rate is made for one year, commencing on the first day of January One thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, and ending on the thirty-first day of December One thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, and shall be payable half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st January and the 1st July 1886. Such persons as the Commissioners of the Borough of Horsham Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, and receive, and collect, and recover the said rate.

"FACTORIES AND SHOPS ACT 1885."

FINAL NOTICE.—Section 3 of the above Act states that a Factory or Workroom is a building or place in which six or more persons are engaged in working for hire or reward in any handicraft, or in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale, and any building or place in which steam or other mechanical power is used, but shall not include any dwelling, office, building, or place in which the persons engaged in working are shown, to the satisfaction of the Chief Inspector, to be all members of the same family, nearly related one to the other by blood or marriage, and in which steam or other mechanical power is not used, nor any dwelling, office, building, or place in which the employment is not carried on for more than three months in any year.

Section 9 requires that every Factory or Workroom shall be registered and the fee paid, as per First Schedule of the Act, on or before the 30th April 1886, or in default a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

Those occupiers of Factories who have forwarded notice to register, but who have failed to pay their fees and complete their registration as provided by Section 9, are now liable to prosecution.

Those occupiers who have not yet taken any steps to register are also now liable to prosecution as provided by Sections 6 and 9.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by The Land Act 1834 it was amongst other things enacted that, notwithstanding anything therein before contained, the Governor might by Proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, should cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber or particular description of timber or bark, stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick, or other earth, from such portions of Crown lands as were named in such Proclamation, or should exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any license granted under the authority of Part VIII of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power conferred by the above-recited Act, do hereby declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber on or from the Crown lands in the parish and municipal district of Heathcote, temporarily reserved by Order of the 30th March 1886 for the growth and preservation of Timber, and described in the Government Gazette of the 2nd April 1886 (85.H.26894).

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this eleventh day of May, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, and in the forty-ninth year of Her Majesty's reign.

Power of disposition.—With the consent of the General Assembly of the religious denomination mentioned in the Act 22 Vict. SHIRE OF MORTLAKE.—LOCAL BOARD OF HEALTH.

BYE-LAW NO. 1.

THE Local Board of Health in and for the Shire of Mortlake, in the colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in "The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883" and every other power enabling the said Local Board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said Local Board, doth hereby make the following Bye-law No. 1 of the said Local Board of Health, that is to say:—

1. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. This bye-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the said shire of Mortlake.

3. The occupier of every house and premises within the said shire of Mortlake shall cause the yard and ground belonging thereto or occupied in connection therewith to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all filth, rubbish, and refuse matter to be from time to time removed from such yard and ground; and if at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such filth, rubbish, or refuse matter so removed as aforesaid, the Local Board cause the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier.

4. The occupier of any land in the said shire of Mortlake on which there shall be erected any stable, cow-yard, cattle-shed, or pigsty, shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state, in respect of cleanliness, as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health; and shall cause all soil, dung, and other manure produced or accumulated therein to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of the same produced or accumulated shall amount to one cubic yard; and if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect or fail to have such soil, dung, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid, the same shall be removed by the said Local Board at the expense of such occupiers.

5. The occupier of every house, building, or tenement within the said shire of Mortlake shall cause every cesspool already in existence, and until its abolition, to be emptied and cleansed from time to time, as soon as any portion of the contents of such cesspool shall have so accumulated therein as to be within a distance of one foot from the top of the sides, walls, or lining of such cesspool. Provided that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom except between the hours Eleven p.m. and Five a.m. And provided also that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom until such contents shall have had mixed therewith carbolic acid or some other efficient deodorizer sufficient in quality and quantity to effectually deodorize and disinfect the same.

6. Every occupier and every person having the management and control of any premises shall once at least in every week empty and cleanse, or cause to be emptied or cleansed, every earth-closet, privy, and place in the nature of an earth-closet for the reception of night-soil on or belonging to such premises.

7. No person shall empty an earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the reception of night-soil except by means of a cart, carriage, or means of conveyance properly constructed and furnished with a sufficient covering so as to prevent the escape of the contents or any portion thereof or of effluvia therefrom.

8. All night-soil, blood, offal, or other offensive matter or thing shall be removed to and deposited in such place or places only as may be appointed by the Local Board from time to time for the final reception of the same.

9. Every person placing or depositing, or causing or suffering to be placed, or deposited, or spread, or assisting in placing, or depositing, or spreading on any land, whether by way of manure or otherwise, any night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter removed from any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or other place, shall immediately on the deposit or spreading thereof cover the same, or cause the same to be covered, and shall keep the same covered, with a layer of earth not less than six inches in thickness.

10. The occupier of any premises within the shire used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, process, or manufacture whatever, or used for the purpose of slaughtering, whether it be an abattoir or otherwise, shall cause any rubbish, blood, offal, bones, water, liquid soil, or other offensive matter produced or accumulated thereon to be removed therefrom once in every twenty-four hours, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, or to exhale any offensive effluvia; and if such occupier shall neglect or fail to have removed therefrom any offensive matter whatever it may be removed by the said Local Board at the expense of such occupier.

11. Every closet-pan shall be constructed of galvanized iron, properly riveted and soldered so as to be watertight, and with handles thereto, and of a capacity not exceeding three cubic feet.

12. No closet door or trap shall abut or open on a street, lane, or right-of-way exceeding ten feet in width.

REGISTRATION OF DAIRYMEN AND PURVEYORS OF MILK.

13. Every person carrying on the trade of cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, shall, on or before the first day of June in every year, register himself with the Local Board of Health in the manner following, that is to say, by signing and

forwarding to the Secretary of the Local Board of Health an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall with every such application pay a fee of One shilling:—

14. Upon receipt of every such application and fee the secretary for the said Local Board of Health shall indorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received, and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule of such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

15. All paddocks, grounds, lands, and enclosures used as grazing ground for dairy cattle shall, whenever necessary, be inspected by any member or officer of the said Local Board or by any person authorized in writing by the chairman or secretary of the said Local Board; and if, on inspection, such paddocks, grounds, or enclosures, or in any one of them, are or is likely, in the opinion of the officer or person so inspecting, to be prejudicial to health, by affecting the milk or otherwise, the said Local Board may, by an order in writing, signed by the secretary, and served personally or left at the dwelling house of the registered person, or in the case of an unregistered person, served personally or left at his dwelling place or posted upon the land, prohibit the use of the same for the purpose of feeding dairy cattle, either absolutely or for any time named in such order. All cattle in dairies shall also be similarly inspected by a veterinary surgeon or other competent person, and any cows found to be diseased, or which from poverty or weakness are, in the opinion of the inspector, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, shall be forthwith removed from such dairy if ordered by such inspector or other officer as aforesaid. And any such order as aforesaid the said Local Board may revoke, but upon every fresh inspection a similar order may from time to time be made.

16. All houses, dairies, cowsheds, milk stores, milk shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated, and the drainage of all such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not.

17. All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows shall be regularly swept and be kept perfectly clean, and shall within twenty-four hours of any order to such effect from the health officer or inspector of nuisances be fumigated, disinfected, or lime-washed, as may be in any such order so directed.

18. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily.

19. If any person or any member of a family of any person registered as aforesaid, or not so registered, employed as a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor to any such person, shall be attacked by typhoid fever or any dangerous infectious disease, the occupier of the house in which such person shall be, or (if he be the person attacked) his wife or other person in charge shall immediately give notice thereof to the Local Board or Officer of Health or to the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the Local Board of Health, and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said Local Board or Officer of Health by order served as aforesaid to prohibit absolutely the sale and sending and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of any such cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk until danger, in the opinion of such Local Board or Officer of Health, no longer exists. And in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering, or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering, to milk cows or to handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business. Nor, if the person registered or conducting such business be himself the person suffering, shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until in either case all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk, or of its contamination, has ceased.

20. If at any time disease exists in the dairy or among the cows or cattle in any cowshed or dairy, or in the herds of any cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk the registered person,

owner, occupier or other person in charge as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the Local Board Officer of Health, or nearest member of the police force, and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatever.

21. No cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep or permit or suffer to be kept any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.

22. In the interpretation of this bye-law, words imputing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural, and the plural the singular, and the word "person" shall include a corporation.

23. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds for every such breach, or of Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties, such portion not being less than Five shillings, to be paid; and any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty notwithstanding that Local Board of Health may be empowered by this bye-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such Local Board has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

The foregoing bye-law was duly made, ordered, and passed by the Local Board of Health (being the municipal council) in and for the Shire of Mortlake this second day of April, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-six.

For keeping free from noisome matter yards, stables, and places used for noxious trades, slaughter-yards, &c.; for regulating management of earth-closets, privies, &c., disinfecting and deodorizing nightsoil and other offensive matter, and for regulating its removal and final deposit.

THE Local Board of Health in and for the Shire of Narracan, in the colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in the "Public Health Amendment Statute 1883," and every other power enabling the said local board in this behalf, and for the purposes of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said local board, doth hereby make the following bye-law, being bye-law No. 1 of the said Local Board of Health, that is to say:—

1. All former bye-laws on the matter and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed, excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this bye-law coming into operation.

2. This bye-law shall come into operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This bye-law shall apply to and have operation in the townships of Moe, Trafalgar, Yarragon, Boolarra, and Mirboo North, in the shire of Narracan.

4. The occupier of every house and premises within the said townships of Moe, Trafalgar, Yarragon, Boolarra, and Mirboo North shall cause the yard and ground belonging thereto, or occupied in connection therewith, to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all filth, rubbish, and refuse matter to be from time to time removed from such yard and ground; and if at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such filth, rubbish, or refuse matter so removed as aforesaid, the local board may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier.

5. The occupier of any land in the said townships of Moe, Trafalgar, Yarragon, Boolarra, and Mirboo North on which there shall be erected any stable, cow-yard, cattle-shed, or pigsty shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state, in respect of cleanliness, as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all soil, dung, or other manure produced or accumulated therein to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of same so produced or accumulated shall amount to one cubic yard. And if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect or fail to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid, the same shall be removed by the said local board at the expense of such occupier.

6. The occupier of every house, building, or tenement within the said townships of Moe, Trafalgar, Yarragon, Boolarra, and Mirboo North shall cause every cesspool already in existence, and until its abolition, to be emptied and cleansed from time to time as soon as any portion of the contents of such cesspool shall have so accumulated therein as to be within a distance of one foot from the top of the side walls or lining of such cesspool.

7. Every occupier and every person having the management and control of any premises shall, once at least in every week, empty and cleanse, or cause to be emptied and cleansed, every earth-closet, privy, and place in the nature of an earth-closet for the reception of nightsoil or of belonging to such premises.

8. No person shall empty any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the reception of nightsoil, except by means of a cart, or carriage, or means of conveyance, properly constructed, and furnished with a sufficient covering, so as to prevent the escape of any portion thereof. In either of the said townships of Moe, Trafalgar, Yarragon, Boolarra, and Mirboo North where a nightman is licensed by the municipal authorities, such nightman shall be employed by the occupier of the premises for such removal of nightsoil.

9. All nightsoil, blood, offal, or other offensive matter or thing shall be removed to and deposited in such place or places only as may be appointed by the local board from time to time for the final reception of the same.

10. Every person placing or depositing, or causing or suffering to be placed, or deposited, or spread, or assisting in placing, or depositing, or spreading on any land, whether by way of manure or otherwise, any nightsoil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter removed from any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or other place, shall immediately on the deposit or spreading thereof cover the same, or cause the same to be covered with a layer of earth not less than six inches in thickness.

11. The occupier of any premises within the said townships of Moe, Trafalgar, Yarragon, Boolarra, and Mirboo North used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, process, or manufacture whatever, or used for the purpose of slaughtering, whether it be an abattoir or otherwise, shall cause any rubbish, blood, offal, bones, water, liquid, soil, or other offensive matter produced or accumulated thereon to be removed therefrom once in every twenty-four hours, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, or to exhale any offensive effluvia; and if such occupier shall neglect or fail to have removed therefrom any offensive matter whatever, it may be removed by the said local board at the expense of such occupier.

12. Every closet-pan shall be constructed of galvanized iron, properly riveted and soldered, so as to be watertight, and with handles thereto, and of a capacity not exceeding three cubic feet.

13. No closet door or trap shall abut or open upon a street, lane, or right-of-way exceeding ten feet in width.

14. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty of £10 (Ten pounds) for every such breach, or of Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties, such portion not being less than Five shillings, to be paid. And any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty, notwithstanding that the local board of health may be empowered by this bye-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such local board has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

BYE-LAW No. 8.

For keeping free from noisome matter yards, stables, and places used for noxious trades, slaughter-yards, &c.; and for regulating management of earth-closets, privies, &c., disinfecting and deodorizing nightsoil and other offensive matter, and for regulating its removal and final deposit.

THE Local Board of Health in and for the Shire of Waranga, in the colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in "The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883," and every other power enabling the said local board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said local board, doth hereby make the following bye-law, being Bye-law No. 8 of the said Local Board of Health, that is to say:—

1. All former bye-laws on the matter and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this bye-law coming into operation.

2. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This bye-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the said shire.

4. The occupier of every house and premises within the said shire shall cause the yard and ground belonging thereto, or occupied in connection therewith, to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all filth, rubbish, and refuse matter to be from time to time removed from such yard and ground; and if at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such filth, rubbish, or refuse matter so removed as aforesaid, the local board may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier.

5. The occupier of any land in the said shire on which there shall be erected any stable, cowyard, cattle-shed, or pigsty shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all soil, dung, or other manure produced or accumulated therein to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of the same so produced or accumulated shall amount to one cubic yard; and if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect or fail to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid, the same shall be removed by the said local board at the expense of such occupier.

6. The occupier of every house, building, or tenement within the said shire shall cause every cesspool already in existence, and until its abolition, to be emptied and cleansed from time to time as soon as any portion of the contents of such cesspool shall have so accumulated therein as to be within a distance of one foot from the top of the sides, walls, or lining of such cesspool.

Provided that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom except between the hours of Eleven p.m. and Five a.m. And provided also that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom until such contents shall have had mixed therewith carbolic acid or some other efficient deodorizer sufficient in quality and quantity to effectually deodorize and disinfect the same.

7. Every occupier and every person having the management and control of any premises shall once at least in every week empty and cleanse, or cause to be emptied and cleansed, every earth-closet, privy, and place in the nature of an earth-closet for the reception of nightsoil on or belonging to such premises.

8. No person shall empty any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the reception of nightsoil except by means of a cart, carriage, or means of conveyance properly constructed, and furnished with a sufficient covering so as to prevent the escape of the contents or any portion thereof or of effluvia therefrom.

9. All nightsoil, blood, offal, or other offensive matter or thing shall be removed to and deposited in such place or places only as may be appointed by the local board from time to time for the final reception of the same.

10. Every person placing or depositing, or causing or suffering to be placed or deposited or spread, or assisting in placing or depositing or spreading on any land, whether by way of manure or otherwise, any nightsoil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter removed from any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or other place, shall immediately on the deposit or spreading thereof cover the same, or cause the same to be covered, and shall keep the same covered, with a layer of earth not less than six inches in thickness.

11. The occupier of any premises within the shire used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, process, or manufacture whatever, or used for the purpose of slaughtering, whether it be an abattoir or otherwise, shall cause any rubbish, blood, offal, bones, water, liquid, soil, or other offensive matter produced or accumulated thereon to be removed therefrom twice at least in every week, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, or to exhale any offensive effluvia; and if such occupier shall neglect or fail to have removed therefrom any offensive matter whatever, it may be removed by the said local board at the expense of such occupier.

12. Every closet-pan shall be constructed of galvanized iron, properly riveted and soldered so as to be watertight, and with handles thereto, and of a capacity not exceeding three cubic feet.

13. No closet door or trap shall abut or open upon a street, lane, or right-of-way exceeding ten feet in width.

14. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds for every such breach, or of Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties—such portion not being less than Five shillings—to be paid. And any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty, notwithstanding that the local board of health may be empowered by this bye-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such local board has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

2. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This bye-law shall apply to and have operation in the Shire of Waranga.

REGISTRATION OF COWKEEPERS, DAIRYMEN, AND PURVEYORS OF MILK.

4. Every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall, on or before the first day of in every year, register himself with the Local Board of Health in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the secretary of the Local Board of Health an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall with every such application pay a fee of 1s. (one shilling.)

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5. Upon receipt of every such application and fee, the secretary for the Local Board of Health shall indorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received, and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

6. All paddocks, grounds, lands, and enclosures used as grazing ground for dairy cattle shall, whenever necessary, be inspected by any member or officer of the said local board or by any person authorized, in writing, by the chairman or secretary of the said local board; and if on inspection such paddocks, grounds, or enclosures, or any one of them, are or is likely, in the opinion of the officer or person so inspecting, to be prejudicial to health, by affecting the milk or otherwise, the said local board may, by an order in writing signed by the secretary, and served personally or left at the dwelling-house of the registered person, or in the case of an unregistered person served personally or left at his dwelling-place or posted upon the land, prohibit the use of the same for the purpose of feeding dairy cattle, either absolutely or for any time named in such order. All cattle in dairies shall also be similarly inspected by a veterinary surgeon or other competent person, and any cows found to be diseased, or which from poverty or weakness are, in the opinion of the inspector, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, shall be forthwith removed from such dairy if ordered by such inspector or other officer as aforesaid. And any such order as aforesaid the said local board may revoke, but upon every fresh inspection a similar order may from time to time be made.

7. All houses, dairies, cowsheds, milk stores, milk shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated; and the drainage of all such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not.

8. All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows shall be regularly swept, and be kept perfectly clean, and shall within twenty-four hours of any order to such effect from the health officer or inspector of nuisances be fumigated, disinfected, or limewashed, as may be in any such order so directed.

9. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily.

10. If any person, or any member of the family of any person, registered as aforesaid, or not so registered but employed as a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor or member of the family of any visitor to any such person, shall be attacked by typhoid fever or any dangerous infectious disease, the occupier of the house in which such person shall be, or (if he be the person attacked) his wife or other person in charge, shall immediately give notice thereof to the local board or officer of health, or to the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the Local Board of Health, and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said local board or the officer of health, by order served as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of any such cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, until danger, in the opinion of such local board or officer of health, no longer exists. And in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering to milk cows or to handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business. Nor, if the person registered or conducting such business be himself the person suffering, shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until, in either case, all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk or of its contamination has ceased.

11. If at any time disease exists in the dairy or among the cows or cattle in any cowshed or dairy or in the herds of any cowkeeper, dairyman, vendor or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the local board, officer of health, or nearest member of the police force, and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.

12. No cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep, or permit or suffer to be kept, any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.

13. In the interpretation of this bye-law, words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural and the plural the singular, and the word "person" shall include a corporation.

14. Every person guilty of any breach of this bye-law, or of any of its provisions, shall be liable, in the discretion of the convicting justices, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings, or in the like discretion to a penalty not

exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings, for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

If any person, or any member of the family of any person, registered as aforesaid, or not so registered but employed as a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor or member of the family of any visitor to any such person, shall be attacked by typhoid fever or any dangerous infectious disease, the occupier of the house in which such person shall be, or (if he be the person attacked) his wife or other person in charge, shall immediately give notice thereof to the Local Board or Officer of Health, or to the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the Local Board of Health, and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said Local Board or the Officer of Health, by order served as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of any such cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, until danger, in the opinion of such Local Board or Officer of Health, no longer exists. Nor, if the person registered or conducting such business be himself the person suffering, shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until, in either case, all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk or of its contamination has ceased.

11. If at any time disease exists in the dairy or among the cows or cattle in any cowshed or dairy, or in the herds of any cowkeeper, dairyman, vendor or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the Local Board, Officer of Health, or nearest member of the police force, and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.

12. No cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep, or permit or suffer to be kept, any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.

SHIRE OF KILMORE.

BYE-LAW No. 1.

For keeping free from noisome matter yards, stables, and places used for noxious trades, slaughter-yards, &c.; and for regulating the management of earth-closets, privies, &c., disinfecting and deodorizing nightsoil and other offensive matter, and for regulating its removal and final deposit.

THE Local Board of Health in and for the Shire of Kilmore, in the colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in the Public Health Amendment Statute 1883, and every other power enabling the said local board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said local board, doth hereby make the following bye-law, being Bye-law No. 1 of the said Local Board of Health, that is to say:—

1. All former bye-laws on the matter and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed, excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this bye-law coming into operation.

2. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This bye-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the said Shire of Kilmore.

4. The occupier of every house and premises within the said shire shall cause the yard and ground belonging thereto or occupied in connection therewith to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all filth, rubbish, and refuse matter to be from time to time removed from such yard and ground; and if at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such filth, rubbish, or refuse matter so removed as aforesaid, the local board may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier.

5. The occupier of any land in the said shire on which there shall be erected any stable, cow-yard, cattle-shed, or pigsty shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state, in respect of cleanliness, as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all soil, dung, or other manure produced or accumulated therein to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of the same so produced or accumulated shall amount to one cubic yard. And if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect or fail to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid, the same shall be removed by the said local board at the expense of such occupier.

6. The occupier of every house, building, or tenement within the said shire shall cause every cesspool already in existence, and until its abolition, to be emptied and cleansed from time to time as soon as any portion of the contents of such cesspool shall have so accumulated therein as to be within a distance of one foot from the top of the sides, walls, or lining of such cesspool. Provided that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom except between the hours of Eleven p.m. and Five a.m. And provided also that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom until such contents shall have had mixed therewith carbolic acid or some other efficient deodorizer sufficient in quality and quantity to effectually deodorize and disinfect the same.

7. Every occupier and every person having the management and control of any premises shall, once at least in every week, empty and cleanse, or cause to be emptied or cleansed, every earth-closet, privy, and place in the nature of an earth-closet for the reception of nightsoil on or belonging to such premises.

8. No person shall empty any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the reception of nightsoil except by means of a cart, carriage, or means of conveyance properly constructed and furnished with a sufficient covering so as to prevent the escape of the contents or any portion thereof or of effluvia therefrom.

9. All nightsoil, blood, offal, or other offensive matter or thing shall be removed to and deposited in such place or places only as may be appointed by the local board from time to time for the final reception of the same.

10. Every person placing or depositing, or causing or suffering to be placed or deposited or spread, or assisting in placing or depositing or spreading on any land, whether by way of manure or otherwise, any nightsoil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter removed from any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or other place, shall, immediately on the deposit or spreading thereof, cover the same or cause the same to be covered, and shall keep the same covered, with a layer of earth not less than six inches in thickness.

11. The occupier of any premises within the shire used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, process, or manufacture whatever, or used for the purpose of slaughtering, whether it be an abattoir or otherwise, shall cause any rubbish, blood, offal, bones, water, liquid, soil, or other offensive matter produced or accumulated thereon to be removed therefrom once in every twenty-four hours, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, or to exhale any offensive effluvia; and if such occupier shall neglect or fail to have removed therefrom any offensive matter whatever, it may be removed by the said local board at the expense of such occupier.

12. Every closet-pan shall be constructed of galvanized-iron, properly riveted and soldered so as to be watertight, and with handles thereto, and of a capacity not exceeding three cubic feet.

13. No closet door or trap shall abut or open upon a street, lane, or right-of-way exceeding ten feet in width.

14. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty of Ten

pounds for every such breach, or of Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties—such portion not being less than Five shillings—to be paid, and any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty, notwithstanding that the local board of health may be empowered by this bye-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such local board has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

That shops within the Borough of Port Melbourne of the particular classes hereinafter named (not included in the Third Schedule of "The Factories and Shops Act 1885") may, upon being duly licensed, keep open or be kept open as follows, that is to say:—Grocers' shops, pawnbrokers' shops, and drapers' and outfitters' shops, until Nine o'clock of the evening of every day of the week, except Saturday and Sunday, and on Saturday until Eleven o'clock of the evening; Bakers' shops, until Nine o'clock of the evening of every day of the week, except Saturday and Sunday, and on Saturday until Twelve o'clock midnight; Butchers' shops, until Eleven o'clock of the evening of Saturday; Boot-dealers' shops, until Eight o'clock of the evening of every day of the week, except Saturday and Sunday.

2. That the Town Clerk of the Borough of Port Melbourne be authorized, and he is hereby authorized, to issue to any person or persons making personal application at his office, and who keep a shop or shops of any one of the classes named in section 1 hereof, a license to keep open such shop or shops in accordance with the terms of section 1 aforesaid.

BYE-LAW No. 90.

A Bye-law of the City of Prahran, made under Section 45 of "The Factories and Shops Act 1885," for the licensing of certain shops, to wit the shops of Drapers and Clothiers, Toy-men and Fancy Goods Dealers, Ironmongers, China and Glassware Dealers, Perfumery Sellers (being Hairdressers), Cooked Meat Sellers, Second-hand Clothes Dealers, Jewellers and Silversmiths, and Boot and Shoe Dealers, to keep open after the statutory hours of closing within the City of Prahran.

WHEREAS by "The Factories and Shops Act 1885" it is provided that any Municipal Council may (if it think fit) from time to time make, alter, and repeal Bye-laws in and for the Municipality for all or any of the purposes therein set forth, that is to say (*inter alia*) for permitting shops of any particular class (not included in the third schedule of such Act) on obtaining a license to that end to keep open after the hours therein specified, and during such hours as shall be specified in such license.

china and glassware dealers, perfumery sellers (being hairdressers), cooked meat sellers and second-hand clothes dealers, jewellers and silversmiths, and boot and shoe dealers, within the said municipal district respectively have been previously to this date presented to the Municipal Council (being the Council of the said City of Prahran).

Now the Council of the City of Prahran, in pursuance of the powers and authorities to it given and in it vested by "The Factories and Shops Act 1885," doth hereby order and direct as follows, that is to say:—

Shops of the class of drapers and clothiers, toy-men and fancy goods dealers, ironmongers, china and glassware dealers, cooked meat sellers, second-hand clothes dealers, jewellers and silversmiths, and boot and shoe dealers, on obtaining a license so to do from the Municipal Clerk may be kept open on each and every evening of the week (except Sundays and Saturdays) until the hour of Eight of the clock, and on each Saturday evening until the hour of Ten of the clock.

Shops of the class of perfumery sellers (being hairdressers) on obtaining a license as aforesaid may be kept open on each and every evening of the week (except Sundays and Saturdays) until the hour of Eight of the clock, and on each Saturday evening until the hour of Eleven of the clock.

Any shopkeeper of any of the classes above specified failing or neglecting to close his shop in accordance with the provisions of this bye-law 90 of this city of Prahran, made in pursuance of the said Act, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence, being a first offence, a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings, and shall on every second or subsequent conviction for any such offence forfeit and pay for every such second or subsequent offence a sum not exceeding Five pounds.

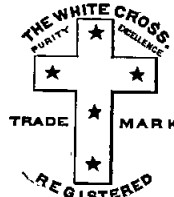

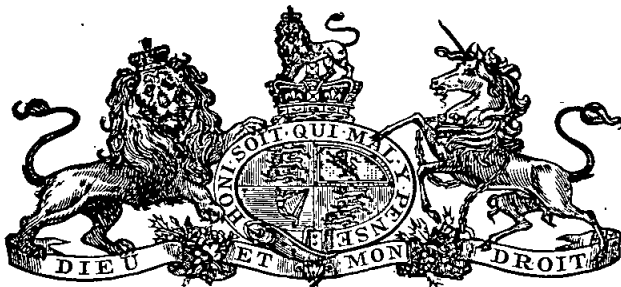
