RELATING TO CHALLENGER PASSAGE.—WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

SIR,—His Excellency the Governor having forwarded to me, for remarks and suggestions, a letter from the Jarrahdale Timber Company, requesting that the Governor would be pleased to authorize that vessels of 18 feet draught (instead of 16 feet) be permitted to navigate the Challenger Passage, I have the honor to furnish, for His Excellency's information, the appended remarks and suggestions, drawn up from a re-examination of the main channels connecting Cockburn Sound with the ocean, completed during February and March 1886 by Staff-Commanders Coghlan and Jarrad, R.N.

1. The main channels connecting Cockburn Sound with the ocean have been re-surveyed, to ascertain if the depths had increased (as reported) since the survey made by Staff-Commander Archdeacon, R.N., in 1872. Our re-examination of the Challenger Pass proves that the alleged increase of depth in that channel has not taken place. The principal channel (Challenger Pass) communicates with the ocean about midway between Garden and Carnac Islands, and is barely half a cable (100 yards) wide at its narrowest part, between Stag Rocks and Flat Ledge. The depths vary from 19 to 36 feet, the former depth being found on small rocky heads, which obstruct the channel, with from 27 to 36 feet close around them. There are no natural leading marks to guide a vessel clear of these dangers. A current usually sets obliquely across the channel, either to the N.E. or S.W., according to the direction of the wind; and, therefore, a sailing vessel cannot always avoid the 19-foot rocks, and might be carried over them before the leadsmen could call the soundings. A considerable ocean swell is usually experienced in the channel, for which an allowance must be made of from 2 to 3 feet. Therefore, I would suggest to His Excellency the Governor that the present regulations, which prohibit vessels of over 16 feet draught from passing through the Challenger Pass could not be altered without danger to navigation.

2. A close re-examination was also made of the channel nearest to Garden Island (called on the charts "North Channel"), with the view of ascertaining whether or not a better channel than the Challenger Pass existed in that locality, as, from a general view of the published chart, appeared to be indicated. Our re-survey, however, led to the discovery of several additional sunken dangers, with from 9 to 18 feet on them, and deep water close around; and clearly shows that vessels should not attempt "North Channel" (unless compelled by circumstances to do so),

but proceed by the Challenger Pass, and, also, that 16 feet is the greatest draught that can be taken through the latter channel in safety.

3. The rocks recently discovered in the "North Channel" are remarkable sandstone pinnacles, the sounding-lead rolling off their summits suddenly into the deep water which surrounds them. Although the soundings give little or no indication of the approach to these dangers, the bright yellow pinnacle rocks can readily be discerned from a boat during smooth water and a clear sky.

4. Appended is a description of the principal dangers discovered, which His Excellency the Governor may deem of sufficient importance to local navigation as to necessitate a "Notice to Mariners" being published in the *Gazette*.

AUSTRALIA.—WEST COAST.

APPROACHES TO COCKBURN SOUND: NORTH CHANNEL,
CHALLENGER PASS.

The following information has been received from Staff-Commander J. E. Coghlan, R.N., in charge of Admiralty Survey of Western Australia, the result of a recent examination of a portion of the approaches to Cockburn Sound (Fremantle).

[All bearings are Magnetic. Variation 5° Westerly, in 1886.]

FIVE-FATHOM BANK.

Hawley Shoal (on which the vessel of that name struck when crossing the Five-fathom Bank) has 16 feet on it and from 27 to 30 feet close around. From the centre of the shoal, Rottnest Island lighthouse bears N.N.W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W.; Buckland Hill obelisk open of west extreme of Carnac Island, N.E.; Haycock Hill on Garden Island, east, distant 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ miles; and base of conspicuous sand-patch on Garden Island, S.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ S.

A Rock, with 18 feet on it and from 26 to 30 feet close around, lies E. by S., distant 2 cables from Hawley Shoal.

A Rock, with 18 feet on it and from 28 to 30 feet close around, lies S.E., distant 3 cables from Hawley Shoal.

Clearing Mark.—The obelisk over Jervoise Bay in line with Entrance Rocks (north-west extreme of Garden Island) bearing E. $\frac{1}{2}$ N., leads over the Five-fathom Bank, between Casuarina and Hawley Shoals, in not less than 28 feet.

NORTH CHANNEL.

Jewish Rock, with 9 feet on it and 24 feet close around, lies nearly in mid-channel between North-West Spit and Sea Reef, with the followings marks and bearings:—Rowboat Rock just open northward of West Rock, bearing N. by E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E.; summit of conspicuous clump of trees north of Buckland Hill obelisk just open south of Flat Rock, N. E. $\frac{1}{2}$ N.; conspicuous sand-patch on Garden Island in line with rocky point under Haycock Hill, S. by E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E.; Challenger Rock buoy in line with westernmost (small) Straggler Rock, N. $\frac{1}{2}$ W.; and Inner Rock buoy open southward of Woodman Point Quarantine Station, E. $\frac{1}{2}$ N.

A Rock, with 17 feet on it and from 22 to 26 feet close around, lies S.E., distant 1 cable, from Jewish Rock.

Bishop Rock, the shoalest head of a cluster of pinnacles, has 10 feet on it and 34 feet close around, with the following marks and bearings:—Rowboat Rock, in line with western extreme of Carnac Island, N. by E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E.; and obelisk over Jervoise Bay, in line with northern of two conspicuous clumps of trees, E. $\frac{1}{2}$ S.

Seven Stones Rocks are a cluster of seven pinnacles, with from 7 to 12 feet over them, and 2 to 40 feet closes around them. The southernmost pinnacle, with 12 feet on it, lies N.N.W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W., distant 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ cables, from the northern extreme of Surface Reef.

Pinnacle Rock, with 17 feet on it and from 26 to 28 feet close around, lies S. $\frac{1}{2}$ W., distant $\frac{1}{2}$ cable, from the shoalest portion (15 feet) of the Three-fathom bank.

A Rock, with 14 feet on it and from 31 to 38 feet close around, lies S.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E., distant 1 cable, from Bishop Rock.

A Rock, with 9 feet on it and 24 feet close around, lies N.W., distant 1 cable, from the northern extreme of Surface Reef.

VICTORIAN MILITARY FORCES.—REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS by *The Discipline Act 1870* it was provided that the Governor in Council might make rules and regulations for the employment, removal, or dismissal, and for the better government of persons engaged by virtue of the said Act, and for enforcing good order and discipline among them, and otherwise carrying out the said Act, and from time to time annul, alter, or amend the same and substitute others in lieu thereof: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following addition to the Regulations for the Victorian Military Forces, that is to say:—

Part 3, section 1 (to follow paragraph *g*, page 33).

REGULATIONS FOR THE PERMANENT FORCES.—FATIGUE PARTIES.

All requisitions for fatigue parties should show the nature of the work for which the fatigue party is required, the hours at which work is to commence and terminate each day, and the period for which the work will last, or, if that is uncertain, the probable period. The requisition should be signed by the officer responsible for the performance of the work which the fatigue party has to carry out, and it will be his duty, when the period during which the work will last is not specified in the requisition, to report to the officer furnishing the fatigue party immediately the work is finished, in order that the fatigue party may not be unnecessarily furnished.

In the event of the fatigue party not arriving at the time and place specified, an immediate report will be made to the Assistant Adjutant-General, as well as to the officer whose duty it was to furnish the fatigue party, and this officer will be held responsible, failing a satisfactory explanation, for any loss which may result. Similar reports will be furnished on every day on which a fatigue party may be absent or late; failing despatch of these reports the responsibility will rest upon the officer superintending the work.

Should work be required to last continuously for more than eight hours the officer furnishing the fatigue party will arrange for the relief of the party, if necessary; and in all such cases the officer superintending the work will state in his requisition the most convenient hours for relief.

If fatigue parties are required for work before sunrise or after sunset, or on Sundays or public holidays, it must be so stated in the requisition—in all such cases double working pay will be granted.

REGULATION No. 3.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Shire of Yarrowonga Waterworks Trust, that portion of whose waterworks district contained and described in a Proclamation dated the twelfth day of January One thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, as the "Town of Yarrowonga," has been proclaimed an "Urban District," for the purposes of the Water Conservation Acts 1881-1885, make the Regulations following:—

1. A water rate for the urban district of Yarrowonga shall be made by the Trust for each year, and shall be payable half-yearly in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July in each year.

2. The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of land and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the urban district, that is to say:—

- (1.) For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of Twenty pounds annual value or under,

- the amount which at the rate levied for the year would be payable in respect of a tenement of Twenty pounds annual value.
- (2) For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of more than Twenty pounds annual value, the amount payable in respect of such at the rate levied for the year.
- (3) For every water-trough, supplied with water from the works of the Trust, the sum of Two pounds per annum.
- (4) For every steam-boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, Thirty shillings per annum for each horse-power of such steam-boiler.
- (5) For water supplied by measure (except in cases of special agreement) from the works of the Trust, Two shillings and sixpence for every one thousand gallons.
3. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case when the water is supplied by measure shall be—
1. If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge at Two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.
 2. If for other than domestic purposes only thirty thousand gallons per half-year, excepting as follows:—

Gardens and lawns, $\frac{1}{2}$ acre and less,	8,000 gals. per annum.

3. All charges for water supplied by measure to be paid quarterly.
4. Every person who is supplied by the Trust with water by measure shall, at his own expense, provide a meter (which meter shall be submitted to and examined by the proper officer of the Trust, who, if he shall find the same correct and in proper working order, shall give his certificate to that effect), which when fixed shall be maintained and kept in proper working order by such person. The meter must be so placed as to be open for inspection and so as to be protected from injury, and with means of access thereto; the keys of the meter shall be in the possession of the Trust. No meter shall be connected with more than one separate and distinct inlet-pipe leading from the service-pipe, unless otherwise permitted by order of the Trust.
5. All service-pipes with the necessary stop-cocks shall be supplied and fixed at the cost of the person or persons requiring the same, under the direction and supervision of such officer or servant as the Trust may appoint.
6. All delivery-cocks to be of high pressure and of strong hard brass, and in all exposed places to be open and shut by a moveable key or handle.
7. Plumbers or other persons employed to lay on service-pipes and to fix meters, or to refix or relay the same, must satisfy the proper officer of the Trust that they are competent to perform the same in a workmanlike manner.
8. No meter shall be affixed unless the dial of the same is capable of registering one million (1,000,000) gallons.
9. The Trust may contract with any owner or occupier of premises or of any lands or tenements, who is entitled to be supplied with water from its works, or who is desirous of being so supplied, for the provision and laying on of a service-pipe from the pipes of the Trust to the boundaries of such land, premises, or tenement abutting on the street or road in which are the pipes of the Trust.
10. If any person shall waste water of the Trust by neglecting to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the Trust that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as to the Trust may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected.
11. No person supplied with water by the Trust shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, and any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach.
12. No person shall connect any service-pipe, or branch service-pipe with any steam-boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter.
13. No pipes shall be affixed to the main pipe, nor to any service-pipe or apparatus connected therewith, nor shall any alteration be made in any existing pipes or apparatus, without notice in writing of the intention so to do being given to the Trust, and the consent of the Trust thereto first had and obtained.
14. Overflow-pipes to private baths will not be permitted, the inlet-pipes to which must be visible and accessible, and attached to the bath above the bottom thereof, and the bath provided with a proper well-fitted and watertight ground outlet, plug, or cock.
15. All water-troughs must be fitted with approved self-acting taps to prevent overflow.
16. Water closets will not be allowed to be supplied direct from the main, but from a cistern only, so constructed that the water cannot flow continuously, and that not more than two gallons can escape at each flush.

17. No hose or pipe is to be applied to any pipes or taps for the purpose of watering the ground, or trees, or plants, or washing houses or walls, carriages or horses, or for any similar purpose, unless the water is charged for by measure.
18. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
19. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust, who shall take or carry away water from any drinking tap, trough, or private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
20. No person shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, nor shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of a duly authorized officer of the Trust appointed for the purpose, and any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach.
21. The service-pipes for conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of consumers, shall each have a stop-cock at the main, and shall in no case exceed the following diameters:—For the domestic supply of premises not exceeding Twenty pounds annual value, $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch diameter; for the domestic supply of premises exceeding Twenty pounds annual value, $\frac{3}{4}$ -inch diameter; for the supply of water for other than domestic purposes, and for all supplies by meter, such diameter as the Trust shall authorize in each case.
22. The water supplied in the urban district of the Trust shall be received and used under and in accordance with these regulations, and the Victorian Water Conservation Acts 1881-1885, and such parts of the Public Works Statute 1865 as are incorporated therewith.
23. If any person, whether supplied with water by the Trust or otherwise, shall commit a breach of these regulations, such person shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each such offence, and such person, if supplied with water by the Trust, shall be liable to have the supply of water cut off from his premises, either by cutting the pipes by or through which such water is supplied, or otherwise, as the Trust may think fit, and such supply shall cease so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.
24. In the foregoing regulations, wherever the words "officer" or "servant" appears, the same shall be deemed to be taken and mean an officer or servant of the Trust duly authorized in that behalf.

The foregoing regulation, numbered (3) three, was made by the Commissioners of the Shire of Yarrowonga Waterworks Trust, under and by virtue of Section 44 of the Victorian Water Conservation Act 1881, this third day of May 1886.

THE WIMMERA UNITED WATERWORKS DISTRICT.
REGULATION.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulation, made by the Wimmera United Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1881* (No. 716, sec. 44).

THE Commissioners of the Wimmera United Waterworks District, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 44 of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1881*, do make the following:—

REGULATION No. 6.

Regulation for the making of a Rate for the year 1886 on all the ratable property in that portion of the Wimmera United Waterworks District, of which notice has been given that the same has been supplied with water under the provisions of the Victorian Water Conservation Acts 1881-1885, and which notice was published in the *Government Gazette* of March 12th 1886, wherein the portion of the district so described as supplied with water is as follows, that is to say, the whole of the area of the Wimmera United Waterworks District, except the parishes of Hindmarsh, Joop, Jeparit, Batyik, Tarranyurk, Willenabrina, Yellangip, Katyil, and Dimboola.

Whereas the Governor in Council has, by an Order made the thirteenth day of April 1886, under the provisions of section 93 of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1883*, divided the Wimmera United Waterworks District into divisions, and directed that the necessary rates for paying interest on all moneys borrowed by the Wimmera United Waterworks Trust for the construction and maintenance of their waterworks, or to meet any other expenses in connection therewith, shall be levied in the following only of such divisions, viz.:—The Shire of St. Arnaud Division, the Shire of Kara Kara Division, the Shire of Dunnunkle Division, the Shire of Stawell Division, the Shire of Wimmera Division, and the Shire of Dimboola A Division; and has further directed that such rates be levied differentially as between such said several divisions, and that the proportion in which such several divisions shall be rated respectively one to another shall be as follows, that is to say, that the respective ratings in the pound sterling on the annual value of ratable property rated for municipal purposes in the said several divisions shall be—Shire of St. Arnaud Division, seven pence; Shire of Kara Kara Division, fifteen pence; Shire of Dunnunkle Division, fourteen pence; Shire of Stawell Division, nine pence; Shire of Wimmera Division, thirteen pence; Shire of Dimboola A Division, twenty-four pence.

The following rate is made on the annual value of all the ratable property in the said several divisions of the Wimmera United Waterworks District, according to the valuation for the time being on all such lands and tenements for the municipal rates of the Shires of St. Arnaud, Kara Kara, Dunmunkle, Stawell, Wimmera, and Dimboola, respectively, that is to say, on ratable property within the Shire of St. Arnaud Division, a rate of seven pence in the pound sterling of such valuation on ratable property; in the Shire of Kara Kara Division, a rate of fifteen pence in the pound sterling of such valuation; in the Shire of Dunmunkle Division, a rate of fourteen pence in the pound sterling of such valuation; in the Shire of Stawell Division, a rate of nine pence in the pound sterling of such valuation; in the Shire of Wimmera Division, a rate of thirteen pence in the pound sterling of such valuation; and in the Shire of Dimboola A Division, a rate of twenty-four pence in the pound sterling of such valuation.

Such rate is hereby made payable on the first day of June 1886. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates.

The contractor must pay the minister's fee for reading; the burial service should it be claimed, and he will be reimbursed thereon producing the minister's receipt, which must specify that the burial service was duly and properly performed, and that he received the fee for so doing; the receipt must also specify the name, age, and denomination of deceased, the name and denomination of the minister who performed the burial service, and the hour when the service was performed.

8. The account is to be rendered monthly to the officer ordering the service for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne. The charge for the minister's fee should be included in the account for the funeral.

9. SHIRE OF DUNDAS.

BYE-LAW No. 1.

For keeping free from noisome matter yards, stables, and places used for noxious trades, slaughter-yards, &c.; and for regulating management of earth-closets, privies, &c., disinfecting and deodorizing nightsoil and other offensive matter, and for regulating its removal and final deposit.

THE Local Board of Health in and for the Shire of Dundas, in the colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in "The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883," and every other power enabling the said local board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said local board, doth hereby make the following bye-law, being Bye-law No. 1 of the said Local Board of Health, that is to say:—

1. All former bye-laws on the matter and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this bye-law coming into operation.

2. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This bye-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the said shire.

4. The occupier of every house and premises within the said shire shall cause the yard and ground belonging thereto, or occupied in connection therewith, to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all filth, rubbish, and refuse matter to be from time to time removed from such yard and ground; and if at any time the occupier of any pre-

mises shall neglect or fail to have such filth, rubbish, or refuse matter so removed as aforesaid, the local board may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier.

5. The occupier of any land in the said shire on which there shall be erected any stable, cowyard, cattle-shed, or pigsty shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all soil, dung, or other manure produced or accumulated therein to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of the same so produced or accumulated shall amount to one cubic yard: and if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect or fail to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid, the same shall be removed by the said local board of health at the expense of such occupier.

6. The occupier of every house, building, or tenement within the said shire shall cause every cesspool already in existence, and until its abolition, to be emptied and cleansed from time to time as soon as any portion of the contents of such cesspool shall have so accumulated therein as to be within a distance of one foot from the top of the side walls or lining of such cesspool. Provided that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom except between the hours of Ten p.m. and Four a.m. And provided also that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom until such contents shall have had mixed therewith carbolic acid or some other efficient deodorizer sufficient in quality and quantity to effectually deodorize and disinfect the same.

7. Every occupier and every person having the management and control of any premises shall once at least in every week empty and cleanse, or cause to be emptied and cleansed, every earth-closet, privy, and place in the nature of an earth-closet for the reception of nightsoil on or belonging to such premises.

8. No person shall empty any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the reception of nightsoil except by means of a cart, carriage, or means of conveyance properly constructed, and furnished with a sufficient covering so as to prevent the escape of the contents or any portion thereof or of effluvia therefrom.

9. All nightsoil, blood, offal, or other offensive matter or thing shall be removed to and deposited in such place or places only as may be appointed by the local board from time to time for the final reception of the same.

10. Every person placing or depositing, or causing or suffering to be placed or deposited or spread, or assisting in placing or depositing or spreading on any land, whether by way of manure or otherwise, any nightsoil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter removed from any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or other place, shall immediately on the deposit or spreading thereof cover the same, or cause the same to be covered with a layer of earth not less than six inches in thickness.

11. The occupier of any premises within the shire used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, process, or manufacture whatever, or used for the purpose of slaughtering, whether it be an abattoir or otherwise, shall cause any rubbish, blood, offal, bones, water, liquid, soil, or other offensive matter produced or accumulated thereon to be removed therefrom once (in every twenty-four hours), and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, or to exhale any offensive effluvia: and if such occupier shall neglect or fail to have removed therefrom any offensive matter whatever, it may be removed by the said local board at the expense of such occupier.

12. Every closet-pan shall be constructed of galvanized iron, properly riveted and soldered so as to be watertight, and with handles thereto, and of a capacity not exceeding three cubic feet.

13. No closet door or trap shall abut or open upon a street, lane, or right-of-way exceeding ten feet in width.

14. Every person who shall by any act be guilty of any breach of this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds for every such breach, or of Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties—such portion not being less than five shillings—to be paid. And any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty, notwithstanding that the local board of health may be empowered by this bye-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such local board has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

BYE-LAW No. 2, AS TO DAIRIES, DAIRY CATTLE, AND MILK.

THE Local Board of Health in and for the Shire of Dundas, in the colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in "The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883," and every other power enabling the said local board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying

the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said local board, doth hereby make the following bye-law, being Bye-law No. 2 of the said Local Board of Health, that is to say:—

1. All former bye-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed.

2. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This bye-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the Shire of Dundas.

REGISTRATION OF COWKEEPERS, DAIRYMEN, AND PURVEYORS OF MILK.

4. Every person carrying on the trade of cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall, on or before the first day of June in every year, register himself with the Local Board of Health in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the secretary of the Local Board of Health an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall with every such application pay a fee of Ten shillings (10s.).

5. Upon receipt of every such application and fee, the secretary for the Local Board of Health shall indorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received, and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

6. All paddocks, grounds, lands, and enclosures used as grazing ground for dairy cattle shall, whenever necessary, be inspected by any member or officer of the said local board or by any person authorized, in writing, by the chairman or secretary of the said local board; and if on inspection such paddocks, grounds, or enclosures, or any one of them, are or is likely, in the opinion of the officer or person so inspecting, to be prejudicial to health, by affecting the milk or otherwise, the said local board may, by an order in writing signed by the secretary, and served personally or left at the dwelling-house of the registered person, or in the case of an unregistered person, served personally or left at his dwelling-place or posted upon the land, prohibit the use of the same for the purpose of feeding dairy cattle, either absolutely or for any time named in such order. All cattle in dairies shall also be similarly inspected by a veterinary surgeon or other competent person, and any cows found to be diseased, or which from poverty or weakness are, in the opinion of the inspector, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, shall be forthwith removed from such dairy if ordered by such inspector or other officer as aforesaid. And any such order as aforesaid the said local board may revoke, but upon every fresh inspection a similar order may from time to time be made.

7. All houses, dairies, cowsheds, milk stores, milk shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall be thoroughly and effectually lighted and ventilated; and the drainage of all such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not.

8. All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows shall be regularly swept, and be kept perfectly clean, and shall within twenty-four hours of any order to such effect from the health officer or inspector of nuisances be fumigated, disinfected, or limewashed, as may be in any such order so directed.

9. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily.

10. If any person, or any member of the family of any person, registered as aforesaid, or not so registered but employed as a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor or member of the family or any visitor to any such person, shall be attacked by typhoid or any dangerous infectious disease, the occupier of the house in which such person shall be, or (if he be the person attacked) his wife or other person in charge, shall immediately give notice thereof to the local board or officer of

health, or to the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the Local Board of Health, and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said local board or the officer of health, by order served as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of any such cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, until danger, in the opinion of such local board or officer of health, no longer exists. And in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering to milk cows or to handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business. Nor, if the person registered or conducting such business be himself the person suffering, shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until, in either case, all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk or of its contamination has ceased.

11. If at any time disease exists in the dairy or among the cows or cattle in any cowshed or dairy or in the herds of any cowkeeper, dairyman, vendor or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the local board, officer of health, or nearest member of police force, and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.

12. No cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep, or permit or suffer to be kept, any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.

13. In the interpretation of this bye-law, words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural, the plural the singular, and the word "person" shall include a corporation.

14. Every person guilty of any breach of this bye-law, or of any of its provisions, shall be liable, in the discretion of the convicting justices, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings, or in the like discretion to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings, for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

The foregoing bye-law was duly made, ordered, and passed by the Local Board of Health (being the Municipal Council) in and for the Shire of Dundas this 5th day of May, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-six.
