SIXTH EXAMINATION.—NOTICE TO CANDIDATES FOR EMPLOYMENT.

THE Services of the following Persons will be required during the period to 31st October 1886, in the several Branches hereunder mentioned:—

ENGINEER-IN-CHIEF'S BRANCH.

4 Students for Engineering and Architecture. Rate of pay to be determined after one month's trial.

Candidates must not be under 15 nor more than 18 years of age; and must pass an Examination by the Examiners appointed in that behalf in the following subjects, viz.:—English, geography, arithmetic (including mensuration), euclid (first three books), algebra (to simple equations), trigonometry (as far as the solution of plain triangles), and drawing.

4 Lithographic Draughtsmen. Rate of pay to be determined after one month's trial.

Candidates must not be under 21 nor over 40 years of age; and must pass an Examination in tracing drawings (specially of bridges, land plans, sections, &c.), on lithographic transfer paper; also in writing and printing suitable for plans.

TRAFFIC BRANCH.

40 men for employment, either as Porters, Pointsmen, or Shunters, at 5s. per day.

Candidates must not be under 18 nor over 25 years of age, and be at least 5 feet 6 inches in height. They must read and write with facility.

15 Youths for Block Signal Boxes, at 3s. per day.

Must not be under 15 nor over 21 years of age. They must produce the State-school certificate that they can read, write, and have a knowledge of arithmetic; or must pass an Examination up to the standard of such certificate by the Examiners appointed in that behalf in the following subjects, viz.:—Reading, writing, and arithmetic.

40 Labourers, at 6s. per day.

Must not be under 21 nor over 35 years of age, and be at least 5 feet 6 inches in height. They must read and write with facility.

40 Carriage-cleaners, at 6s. per day.

Must not be under 21 nor over 40 years of age, and be at least 5 feet 6 inches in height. They must read and write with facility.

LOCOMOTIVE BRANCH.

40 Engine-cleaners, commencing at 5s. per day.

Candidates must not be under 20 nor over 23 years of age, and be at least 5 feet 6 inches in height. They must read and write with facility.

TELEGRAPH BRANCH.

2 Gas-fitters, at 10s. per day.

Candidates must not be under 21 nor over 40 years of age. They must prove to the Examiners that they have served apprenticeship of 7 years to their trade, or if they have served for 5 years they must have worked as journeymen the additional time required to complete the term of 7 years. They must read and write with facility.

VARIOUS BRANCHES.

35 Junior Clerks,

Of which 6 are required for Telegraph Branch. 15 and 16 years of age, £45 per annum; 17 years, £55 per annum; 18 years and upwards, £65 per annum. Successful candidates will be allocated according to the requirements of the service.

Candidates must not be under 15 nor over 21 years of age; and must produce a certificate of having passed an Examination by the Examiners appointed in that behalf in the following subjects, viz.:—Reading and explanation, dictation, writing, arithmetic, grammar, geography, as taught in the Sixth class of State schools.

Candidates must be strong, healthy, and active, and must prepare their applications in their own handwriting, and must, where a standard is fixed, state their exact height, without boots, also their age, otherwise their names will not be registered. They must *produce to the Examiners* satisfactory written testimony that they are of respectable character, and must furnish names of any persons or firms with whom they may have been employed during the previous two years. They must also produce to the said Examiners a certified extract from the register of their birth, or, in default, a statutory declaration as to their age last birthday, giving the date thereof; and before being finally approved they must pass the examination of a Railway Medical Inspector as being up to the standard height, where required, and free from bodily ailments, defects, and colour-blindness, or defective sight of any kind. For such examination they are to pay 10s. 6d. into the hands of the Secretary.

In case the number of Candidates be more than three times the number of persons required, such Candidates will be reduced by lot to such number.

If a greater number of Candidates obtain certificates from the Examiners than are required, such successful Candidates shall, in the presence of the Secretary, draw lots for the determination of the order of precedence for appointment in which their names shall be placed, and their appointments—subject to medical approval—will be made accordingly.

The persons in excess of the number required will be eligible for appointment in like order for a period of twelve months from the date of such determination without further examination.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1884* the Governor in Council is empowered among other things to make, alter, or rescind regulations and orders touching the granting of licenses for doing various matters and things under the said Act, and in particular for the purpose of taking and diverting water from any spring, lake, pool, or stream situated or flowing upon or through or bounded by any Crown lands in such manner and subject to such conditions as may be prescribed by such license and regulations for the purpose of supplying water power to mills or for any purpose: And whereas the Governor in Council, on the seventeenth day of March 1885, made certain regulations under the said Act in reference to water easement licenses, and it is desirable that certain of such regulations should be extended and other regulations made in reference to licenses to divert water for the purposes of irrigation or other purposes other than mill purposes: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, and of any other power and authority enabling him in that behalf, doth hereby make the regulations following:—

1. Clauses numbered 1 to 7, both inclusive, of the regulations made upon the seventeenth day of March 1885, relating to water easement licenses, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the twentieth day of March 1885, page 906, shall be read *mutatis mutandis* as part of these regulations.
2. Licenses under section 97 of *The Land Act 1884*, for the purposes of irrigation or for other purposes than mill purposes, shall be, by deed or instrument, in writing, in such form, and subject to the payment of such rent or fee and to such exceptions, reservations, forfeitures, covenants, and conditions as the Governor in Council may in each particular case direct.

WHEREAS by section 90 of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1885*, No. 778, it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, from time to time, after any trust has by Order in Council been duly constituted, make additional Orders relating to such waterworks or irrigation trust not inconsistent with the provisions of the said Act, and that the Governor in Council may in such additional Order in Council (among other things)—

1. Make any Order which might have been made in the Order in Council originally constituting such waterworks or irrigation trust;
2. Repeal any of the provisions of any previous Order in Council relating to such waterworks or irrigation trust;

And whereas by an Order in Council bearing date the twenty-third day of March 1886 the Governor in Council constituted a certain irrigation trust, known as the "Tragowel Plains Irrigation Trust," and in and by clause numbered 2 of the said Order in Council defined the limits and boundaries of the irrigation area of the said trust: And whereas it is expedient to repeal the said clause numbered 2 of the said Order in Council:

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the now in part recited Act, doth order that clause number 2 of the said Order in Council bearing date as aforesaid be and the same is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof it is hereby ordered and provided that the limits of the lands to be called an irrigation area within which such trust shall have authority shall hereafter be as follows:—

Commencing at the south-east angle of allotment 8, section D, parish of Mologa, on the southern boundary of the county of Gunbower; thence westerly along the said boundary to its intersection with the Loddon River; thence north-westerly along the said river to its intersection with the Twelve-mile Creek; thence north-easterly along the said creek to its intersection with the northern boundary of allotment 81, parish of Loddon; thence easterly to the north-east angle of the said allotment; thence north-easterly by a road to the north-west angle of allotment 88 of the same parish; thence easterly by the north boundary of the

said allotment to its intersection with Bannagher Creek; thence north-easterly and northerly along the said creek to its intersection with a road adjoining the most northern boundary of allotment 29, parish of Tragowel; thence easterly by the said road to the south-east angle of allotment 23 of the same parish; thence northerly by a road to its intersection with the Loddon River; thence north-easterly along the said river to its intersection with the road forming the southern boundary of allotment 4, section 3, parish of Kerang; thence easterly by that road to the south-east angle of allotment 5, section 3, in the same parish; thence south-easterly by a three-chain road to its intersection with the Pyramid Creek; thence southerly and easterly by the said creek to a point in a line with the western boundary of allotment 43, section B, parish of Macorna; thence southerly by a line and the eastern boundary of allotment 42, section B, to the south-east angle of the same allotment; thence easterly and south-easterly by a road to the north-east angle of allotment 41; thence southerly by a road to the north-west angle of allotment 30, section B, all in the parish of Macorna; thence south-westerly by a road to the south-east angle of allotment 28, in the parish of Mincha West; thence westerly by a road to the south-east angle of allotment 45; thence southerly by a road to the south-east angle of allotment 92; thence westerly by a road to the north-east angle of allotment 93, all in the parish of Mincha West; thence southerly by a road to the southern angle of allotment 40, section B, in the parish of Mologa; thence south-easterly by a road to the east angle of allotment 42, section C, in the same parish; thence southerly by a road to the south-east angle of allotment 8, section D, in the parish of Mologa, the point of commencement aforesaid.

1. For determining the period for which commissioners of any trust shall hold office, the time and manner of election, and the order of their retirement from office;
2. For determining the manner in which elections of any such commissioners shall be held and the manner of voting thereat;

And whereas on the twenty-third day of March A.D. 1886 the Governor in Council for the said purposes (among others), so far as these related to the Tragowel Plains Irrigation Trust, made certain regulations dated the said twenty-third day of March A.D. 1886 (and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 26th day of March 1886, page 835); And whereas it is expedient that certain of the provisions of the said regulations should be altered: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the said provisions of the now in part recited Act, doth order that clause number 4 of the said regulations, so far as the said clause set forth the boundaries of the ridings, numbers 1 and 4, of the irrigation area of the said Tragowel Plains Irrigation Trust, shall be, and the same is hereby repealed; and in lieu of the boundaries of the said ridings, numbers 1 and 4, as in and by the said clause respectively defined, the boundaries of the ridings so numbered shall hereafter respectively be as follow, namely:—

No. 1 RIDING.

Boundaries of ridings defined.—Commencing at the south-east angle of allotment 8, section D, parish of Mologa, on the southern boundary of the county of Gunbower; thence westerly along the said boundary to its intersection with Calivil Creek; thence north-westerly, north-easterly, and north-westerly by the said creek to its intersection with the three-chain road from Kerang to Echuca; thence south-easterly along the said road to its intersection with the Pyramid Creek; thence southerly and easterly by the said creek to a point in a line with the western boundary of allotment 43, section B, parish of Macorna; thence southerly by a line and the eastern boundary of allotment 42, section B, to the south-east angle of the same allotment; thence easterly and south-easterly by a road to the north-east angle of allotment 41; thence southerly by a road to the north-west angle of allotment 30, section B, all in the parish of Macorna; thence south-westerly by a road to the south-east angle of allotment 28, in the parish of Mincha West; thence westerly by a road to the south-east angle of allotment 45; thence southerly by a road to the south-east angle of allotment 92; thence westerly by a road to the north-east angle of allotment 93, all in the parish of Mincha West; thence southerly by a road to the southern angle of allotment 40, section B, in the parish of Mologa; thence south-easterly by a road to the east angle of

No. 4 RIDING.

THE WIMMERA UNITED WATERWORKS DISTRICT.
REGULATION.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulation, made by the Wimmera United Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1881* (No. 716. sec. 44).

The Commissioners of the Wimmera United Waterworks District, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 44 of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1881*, do make the following:—

REGULATION No. 6.

Regulation for the making of a Rate for the year 1886 on all the ratable property in that portion of the Wimmera United Waterworks District, of which notice has been given that the same has been supplied with water under the provisions of the Victorian Water Conservation Acts 1881-1885, and which notice was published in the *Government Gazette* of March 12th 1886, wherein the portion of the district so described as supplied with water is as follows, that is to say, the whole of the area of the Wimmera United Waterworks District, except the parishes of Hindmarsh, Joop, Jeparit, Batyik, Tarranyurk, Willenabrina, Yellangip, Katyil, and Dimboola.

Whereas the Governor in Council has, by an Order made the thirtieth day of April 1886, under the provisions of section 93 of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1881*, divided the Wimmera United Waterworks District into divisions, and directed that the necessary rates for paying interest on all moneys borrowed by the Wimmera United Waterworks Trust for the construction and maintenance of their waterworks, or to meet any other expenses in connection therewith, shall be levied in the following only of such divisions, viz.:—The Shire of St. Arnaud Division, the Shire of Kara Kara Division, the Shire of Dunnunkle Division, the Shire of Stawell Division, the Shire of Wimmera Division, and the Shire of Dimboola A Division; and has further directed that such rates be levied differentially as between such said several divisions, and that the proportion in which such several divisions shall be rated respectively one to another shall be as follows, that is to say, that the respective ratings in the pound sterling on the annual value of ratable property rated for municipal purposes in the said several divisions shall be—Shire of St. Arnaud Division, seven pence; Shire of Kara Kara Division, fifteen pence; Shire of Dunnunkle Division, fourteen pence; Shire of Stawell Division, nine pence; Shire of Wimmera Division, thirteen pence; Shire of Dimboola A Division, twenty-four pence.

The following rate is made on the annual value of all the ratable property in the said several divisions of the Wimmera United Waterworks District, according to the valuation for the time being on all such lands and tenements for the municipal rates of the Shires of St. Arnaud, Kara Kara, Dunnunkle, Stawell, Wimmera, and Dimboola, respectively, that is to say, on ratable property within the Shire of St. Arnaud Division, a rate of seven pence in the pound sterling of such valuation; in the Shire of Kara Kara Division, a rate of fifteen pence in the pound sterling of such valuation; in the Shire of Dunnunkle Division, a rate of fourteen pence in the pound sterling of such valuation; in the Shire of Stawell Division, a rate of nine pence in the pound sterling of such valuation; in the Shire of Wimmera Division, a rate of thirteen pence in the pound sterling of such valuation; and in the Shire of Dimboola A Division, a rate of twenty-four pence in the pound sterling of such valuation.

Such rate is hereby made payable on the first day of June 1886.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates.

The foregoing resolution, No. 6, was made by the Commissioners of the Wimmera United Waterworks Trust, under and by virtue of section 44 of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1881*, this eighteenth day of May 1886.

TRUST.—REGULATION.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulation made by the Yarrawonga Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1881* (No. 829, Sec. 20).

REGULATION No. 3.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Shire of Yarrawonga Waterworks Trust, that portion of whose waterworks district contained and described in a Proclamation dated the twelfth day of January One thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, as the "Town of Yarrawonga," has been proclaimed an "Urban District," for the purposes of the Water Conservation Acts 1881-1885, make the Regulations following:—

1. A water rate for the urban district of Yarrawonga shall be made by the Trust for each year, and shall be payable half-yearly in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July in each year.

2. The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of land and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the urban district, that is to say:—

(1.) For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of Twenty pounds annual value or under, the amount which at the rate levied for the year would be payable in respect of a tenement of Twenty pounds annual value.

(2.) For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of more than Twenty pounds annual value, the amount payable in respect of such at the rate levied for the year.

(3.) For every water-trough, supplied with water from the works of the Trust, the sum of Two pounds per annum.

(4.) For every steam-boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, Thirty shillings per annum for each horse-power of such steam-boiler.

(5.) For water supplied by measure (except in cases of special agreement) from the works of the Trust, Two shillings and sixpence for every one thousand gallons.

3. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case when the water is supplied by measure shall be—

1. If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge at Two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

2. If for other than domestic purposes only thirty thousand gallons per half-year, excepting as follows:—

Gardens and lawns, $\frac{1}{2}$ acre and less,	8,000 gals. per annum.
" " " " "	12,000 " "
" " " " "	16,000 " "
" " " " "	28,000 " "
" " " " "	40,000 " "

Livery and carriers' stables, for each stall or space of five feet 3,000 " "

Stand-pipe or hydrant water, for each load of 100 gallons or under ... One shilling.

And for each additional 100 gallons, or fraction of 100 gallons, after the first or any one load, to be paid for at the time of taking ... Sixpence.

3. All charges for water supplied by measure to be paid quarterly.

4. Every person who is supplied by the Trust with water by measure shall, at his own expense, provide a meter (which meter shall be submitted to and examined by the proper officer of the Trust, who, if he shall find the same correct and in proper working order, shall give his certificate to that effect), which when fixed shall be maintained and kept in proper working order by such person. The meter must be so placed as to be open for inspection and so as to be protected from injury, and with means of access thereto; the keys of the meter shall be in the possession of the Trust. No meter shall be connected with more than one separate and distinct inlet-pipe leading from the service-pipe, unless otherwise permitted by order of the Trust.

5. All service-pipes with the necessary stop-cocks shall be supplied and fixed at the cost of the person or persons requiring the same, under the direction and supervision of such officer or servant as the Trust may appoint.

6. All delivery-cocks to be of high pressure and of strong hard brass, and in all exposed places to be open and shut by a moveable key or handle.

7. Plumbers or other persons employed to lay on service-pipes and to fix meters, or to refix or relay the same, must satisfy the proper officer of the Trust that they are competent to perform the same in a workmanlike manner.

8. No meter shall be affixed unless the dial of the same is capable of registering one million (1,000,000) gallons.

9. The Trust may contract with any owner or occupier of premises or of any lands or tenements, who is entitled to be supplied with water from its works, or who is desirous of being so supplied, for the provision and laying on of a service-pipe from the pipes of the Trust to the boundaries of such land, premises, or tenement abutting on the street or road in which are the pipes of the Trust.

10. If any person shall waste water of the Trust by neglecting to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the Trust that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as to the Trust may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected.

11. No person supplied with water by the Trust shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, and any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach.

12. No person shall connect any service-pipe, or branch service-pipe with any steam-boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter.

13. No pipes shall be affixed to the main pipe, nor to any service-pipe or apparatus connected therewith, nor shall any alteration be made in any existing pipes or apparatus, without notice in writing of the intention so to do being given to the Trust, and the consent of the Trust thereto first had and obtained.

14. Overflow-pipes to private baths will not be permitted, the inlet-pipes to which must be visible and accessible, and attached to the bath above the bottom thereof, and the bath provided with a proper well-fitted and watertight ground outlet, plug, or cock.

15. All water-troughs must be fitted with approved self-acting taps to prevent overflow.

16. Water closets will not be allowed to be supplied direct from the main, but from a cistern only, so constructed that the water cannot flow continuously, and that not more than two gallons can escape at each flush.

17. No hose or pipe is to be applied to any pipes or taps for the purpose of watering the ground, or trees, or plants, or washing houses or walls, carriages or horses, or for any similar purpose, unless the water is charged for by measure.

18. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

19. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust, who shall take or carry away water from any drinking tap, trough, or private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

20. No person shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, nor shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of a duly authorized officer of the Trust appointed for the purpose, and any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach.

21. The service-pipes for conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of consumers, shall each have a stop-cock at the main, and shall in no case exceed the following diameters:—For the domestic supply of premises not exceeding Twenty pounds annual value, ½-inch diameter; for the domestic supply of premises exceeding Twenty pounds annual value, ¾-inch diameter; for the supply of water for other than domestic purposes, and for all supplies by meter, such diameter as the Trust shall authorize in each case.

22. The water supplied in the urban district of the Trust shall be received and used under and in accordance with these regulations, and the Victorian Water Conservation Acts 1881-1885, and such parts of the Public Works Statute 1865 as are incorporated therewith.

23. If any person, whether supplied with water by the Trust or otherwise, shall commit a breach of these regulations, such person shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each such offence, and such person, if supplied with water by the Trust, shall be liable to have the supply of water cut off from his premises, either by cutting the pipes by or through which such water is supplied, or otherwise, as the Trust may think fit, and such supply shall cease so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.

24. In the foregoing regulations, wherever the words "officer" or "servant" appears, the same shall be deemed to be taken and mean an officer or servant of the Trust duly authorized in that behalf.

The foregoing regulation, numbered (3) three, was made by the Commissioners of the Shire of Yarrowonga Waterworks Trust,

under and by virtue of Section 44 of the Victorian Water Conservation Act 1881, this third day of May 1886.

7. No person, except laborers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 133 of *The Land Act 1884*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

And any such order as aforesaid the said Local Board may revoke, but upon every fresh inspection a similar order may from time to time be made.

7. All houses, dairies, cowsheds, milk stores, milk shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated, and the drainage of all such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not.

8. All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows shall be regularly swept, and be kept perfectly clean, and shall, within twenty-four hours of any order to such effect from the Health Officer or Inspector of Nuisances, be fumigated, disinfected, or limewashed, as may be in any such order so directed.

9. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily.

10. If any person, or any member of the family of any person, registered as aforesaid, or not so registered but employed as a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor or member of the family of any visitor to any such person, shall be attacked by typhoid fever or any dangerous or infectious disease, the occupier of the house in which such person shall be, or (if he be the person attacked) his wife or other person in charge, shall immediately give notice thereof to the Local Board or Officer of Health, or to the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the Local Board of Health, and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said Local Board or the Officer of Health, by order served as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of any such cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, until danger, in the opinion of such Local Board or Officer of Health, no longer exists. And in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering, or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering, to milk cows or to handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business. Nor, if the person registered or conducting such business be himself the person suffering, shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until, in either case, all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk or of its contamination has ceased.

11. If at any time disease exists in the dairy or among the cows or cattle in any cowshed or dairy, or in the herds of any cowkeeper, dairyman, vendor or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the Local Board, Officer of Health, or nearest member of the police force, and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.

12. No cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep, or permit or suffer to be kept, any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.

13. In the interpretation of this bye-law words imputing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include

females, and the singular the plural and the plural the singular, and the word "person" shall include a corporation.

14. Every person guilty of any breach of this bye-law, or of any of its provisions, shall be liable, in the discretion of the convicting justices, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings, or, in the like discretion, to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

BYE-LAW No. 1.

For keeping free from noisome matter yards, stables, and places used for noxious trades, slaughter-yards, &c.; and for regulating management of earth-closets, privies, &c., disinfecting and deodorizing nightsoil and other offensive matter, and for regulating its removal and final deposit.

THE Local Board of Health in and for the Shire of Lowan, in the colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in "The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883," and every other power enabling the said local board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said local board, doth hereby make the following bye-law, being Bye-law No. 1 of the said Local Board of Health, that is to say:—

1. All former bye-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed, excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this bye-law coming into operation.

2. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This bye-law shall apply to and have operation in the townships of Nhill, Kaniva, Lillimur North, and Goroke, in the Shire of Lowan.

4. The occupier of every house and premises within the said townships shall cause the yard and ground belonging thereto or occupied in connection therewith to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all filth, rubbish, and refuse matter to be from time to time removed from such yard and ground; and if at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such filth, rubbish, or refuse matter so removed as aforesaid, the local board may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier.

5. The occupier of any land in the said townships on which there shall be erected any stable, cow-yard, cattle-shed, or pigsty shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state, in respect of cleanliness, as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all soil, dung, or other manure produced or accumulated therein to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of the same so produced or accumulated shall amount to one cubic yard. And if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect or fail to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid, the same shall be removed by the said Local Board of Health at the expense of such occupier.

6. The occupier of every house, building, or tenement within the said townships shall cause every cesspool already in existence, and until its abolition, to be emptied and cleaned from time to time as soon as any portion of the contents of such cesspool shall have so accumulated therein as to be within a distance of one foot from the top of the side-walls or lining of such cesspool. Provided that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom except between the hours of 10 p.m. and 4 a.m. And provided also that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom until such contents shall have had mixed therewith carbolic acid or some other efficient deodorizer sufficient in quality and quantity to effectually deodorize and disinfect the same.

7. Every occupier and every person having the management and control of any premises shall, once at least in every week, empty and cleanse, or cause to be emptied and cleansed, every earth-closet, privy, and place in the nature of an earth-closet for the reception of nightsoil on or belonging to such premises.

8. No person shall empty any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the reception of nightsoil except by means of a cart, carriage, or means of conveyance properly constructed and furnished with a sufficient covering so as to prevent the escape of the contents or any portion thereof or of effluvia therefrom.

9. All nightsoil, blood, offal, or other offensive matter or thing shall be removed to and deposited in such place or places only as may be appointed by the local board from time to time for the final reception of the same.

10. Every person placing or depositing, or causing or suffering to be placed or deposited or spread, or assisting in placing or depositing or spreading on any land, whether by way of manure or otherwise, any nightsoil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter removed from any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or other place, shall, immediately on the deposit or spreading thereof, cover the same or cause the same to be covered with a layer of earth not less than six inches in thickness.

11. The occupier of any premises within the above-named townships used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, process, or manufacture whatever, or used for the purpose of slaughtering, whether it be an abattoir or otherwise, shall cause any rubbish, blood, offal, bones, water, liquid, soil, or other offensive matter produced or accumulated thereon to be removed therefrom once in every 24 hours, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, or to exhale any offensive effluvia; and if such occupier shall neglect or fail to have removed therefrom any offensive matter whatever, it may be removed by the said local board at the expense of such occupier.

12. Every closet-pan shall be constructed of galvanized iron, properly riveted and soldered so as to be watertight, and with handles thereto, and of a capacity not exceeding three cubic feet.

13. No closet door or trap shall abut or open upon a street, lane, or right-of-way exceeding ten feet in width.

14. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds for every such breach, or of Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties—such portion not being less than Five shillings—to be paid. And any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty, notwithstanding that the Local Board of Health may be empowered by this bye-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such local board has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

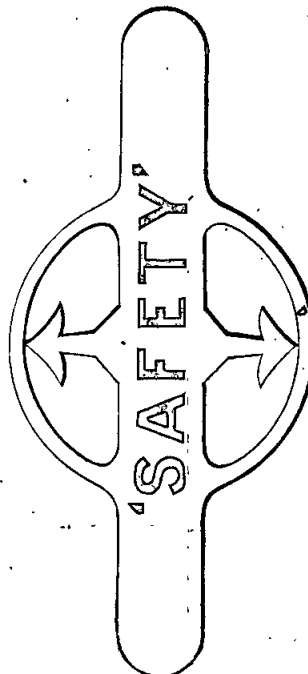

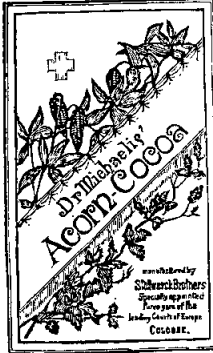

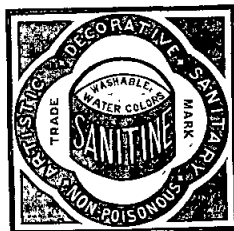
