# SIXTH EXAMINATION .- NOTICE TO CANDIDATES FOR EMPLOYMENT.

THE Services of the following Persons will be required during the period to 31st October 1886, in the several Branches hereunder mentioned:—

### Engineer-in-Chief's Branch.

4 Students for Engineering and Architecture. Rate of pay to be determined after one mouth's trial.

Candidates must not be under 15 nor more than 18 years of age; and must pass an Examination by the Examiners appointed in that behalf in the following subjects, viz.:—English, geography, arithmetic (including mensuration), euclid (first three books), algebra (to simple equations), trigonometry (as far as the solution of plain triangles), and drawing.

4 Lithographic Draughtsmen. Rate of pay to be determined after one month's trial.

Candidates must not be under 21 nor over 40 years of ago; and must pass an Examination in tracing drawings (specially of bridges, land plans, sections, &c.), on lithographic transfer paper; also in writing and printing suitable for plans.

Candidates must not be under 20 nor over 23 years of age, and be at least 5 feet 6 inches in height. They must read and write with facility.

2 Gas-fitters, at 10s. per day.

Candidates must not be under 21 nor over 40 years of age. They must prove to the Examiners that they have served apprenticeship of 7 years to their trade, or if they have served for 5 years they must have worked as journeymen the additional time required to complete the term of 7 years. They must read and write with facility.

# VARIOUS BRANCHES.

35 Junior Clerks,

Of which 6 are required for Telegraph Branch. 15 and 16 years of age, £45 per annum; 17 years, £55 per annum; 18 years and upwards, £65 per annum. Successful candidates will be allocated according to the requirements of the service.

Candidates must not be under 15 nor over 21 years of age; and must produce a certificate of having passed an Examination by the Examiners appointed in that behalf in the following subjects, viz.:—Reading and explanation, dictation, writing, arithmetic, grammar, geography, as taught in the Sixth class of State schools.

Candidates must be strong, healthy, and active, and must prepare their applications in their own handwriting, and must, where a standard is fixed, state their exact height, without boots, also their age, otherwise their names will not be registered. They must produce to the Examiners satisfactory written testimony that they are of respectable character, and must furnish names of any persons or firms with whom they may have been employed during the previous two years. They must also produce to the said Examiners a certified extract from the register of their birth, or, in default, a statutory declaration as to their age last birthday, giving the date thereof; and before being finally approved they must pass the examination of a Railway Medical Inspector as being up to the standard height, where required, and free from bodily ailments, defects, and colour-blindness, or defective sight of any kind. For such examination they are to pay 10s. 6d. into the hands of the Secretary.

In case the number of Candidates be more than three times the number of persons required, such Candidates will be reduced by lot to such number.

If a greater number of Candidates obtain certificates from the Examiners than are required, such successful Candidates shall, in the presence of the Secretary, draw lots for the determination of the order of precedence for appointment in which their names shall be placed, and their appointments—subject to medical approval—will be made accordingly.

The persons in excess of the number required will be eligible for appointment in like order for a period of twelve months from the date of such determination without further examination.

### REGULATION No. 3.

The Chairman and Commissioners of the Shire of Yarrawonga Waterworks Trust, that portion of whose waterworks district contained and described in a Proclamation dated the twelfth day of January One thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, as the "Town of Yarrawonga," has been proclaimed an "Urban District," for the purposes of the Water Conservation Acts 1881-1885, make the Regulations following:—

- A water rate for the urban district of Yarrawonga shall be made by the Trust for each year, and shall be payable half-yearly in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July in each year.
- 2. The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of land and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the urban district, that is
  - (1.) For every house or tonement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of Twenty pounds annual value or under, the amount which at the rate levied for the year would be payable in respect of a tenement of Twenty pounds annual value.

    (2.) For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of more than Twenty pounds annual value, the amount payable in respect of such at the rate levied for the year.

    (3.) For every water-trough, supplied with water from the works of the Trust, the sum of Two pounds per annum.

    (4.) For every steam-boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, Thirty shillings per annum for each horse-power of such steam-boiler.

    (5.) For water supplied by measure (except in cases of special agreement) from the works of the Trust, Two shillings and sixpence for every one thousand gallons.
- 3. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case when the water is supplied by measure shall be
  - e when the water is supplied by measure shall be—

    1. If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge at Two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

    2. If for other than domestic purposes only thirty thousand gallons per half-year, excepting as follows:—

Every person who is supplied by the Trust with water by measure shall, at his own expense, provide a meter (which meter shall be submitted to and examined by the proper officer of the Trust, who, if he shall find the same correct and in proper working order, shall give his certificate to that effect), which when fixed shall be maintained and kept in proper working order by such person. The meter must be so placed as to be open for inspection and so as to be protected from injury, and with means of access thereto; the keys of the meter shall be in the possession of the Trust. No meter shall be connected with more than one separate and distinct inlet-pipe leading from the service-pipe, unless otherwise permitted by order of the Trust.

5. All service-pipes with the necessary stop-cocks shall be

5. All service-pipes with the necessary stop-cocks shall be supplied and fixed at the cost of the person or persons requiring the same, under the direction and supervision of such officer or servant as the Trust may appoint.

- All delivery-cocks to be of high pressure and of strong hard brass, and in all exposed places to be open and shut by a move-able key or handle.
- 7. Plumbers or other persons employed to lay on service-pipes and to fix meters, or to refix or relay the same, must satisfy the proper officer of the Trust that they are competent to perform the same in a workmanlike manner.
- 8. No meter shall be affixed unless the dial of the same is capable of registering one million (1,000,000) gallons.
- 9. The Trust may contract with any owner or occupier of premises or of any lands or tenements, who is entitled to be supplied with water from its works, or who is desirous of being so supplied, for the provision and laying on of a service-pipe from the pipes of the Trust to the boundaries of such land, premises, or tenement abutting on the street or road in which are the pipes of the Trust.
- 10. If any person shall waste water of the Trust by neglecting 10. If any person shall waste water of the Trust by neglecting to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the Trust that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as to the Trust may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected as to the Trust m have been effected.
- 11. No person supplied with water by the Trust shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, and any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach.
- 12. No person shall connect any service-pipe, or branch service-pipe with any steam-boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter.
- 13. No pipes shall be affixed to the main pipe, nor to any service-pipe or apparatus connected therewith, nor shall any alteration be made in any existing pipes or apparatus, without notice in writing of the intention so to do being given to the Trust, and the consent of the Trust thereto first had and obtained.
- 14. Overflow-pipes to private baths will not be permitted, the inlet-pipes to which must be visible and accessible, and attached to the bath above the bottom thereof, and the bath provided with a proper well-fitted and watertight ground outlet, plug, or cock.
- 15. All water-troughs must be fitted with approved self-acting taps to prevent overflow.
- 16. Water closets will not be allowed to be supplied direct from the main, but from a cistern only, so constructed that the water cannot flow continuously, and that not more than two gallons can escape at each flush.
- 17. No hose or pipe is to be applied to any pipes or taps for the purpose of watering the ground, or trees, or plants, or washing houses or walls, carriages or horses, or for any similar purpose, unless the water is charged for by measure.
- 18. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
- 19. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust, who shall take or carry away water from any drinking tap, trough, or private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
- 20. No person shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, nor shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of a duly authorized officer of the Trust appointed for the purpose, and any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach.
- 21. The service-pipes for conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of consumers, shall each have a stop-cock at the main, and shall in no case exceed the following diameters:—For the domestic supply of premises not exceeding Twenty pounds annual value, \$\frac{1}{2}\$-inch diameter; for the domestic supply of premises occeding Twenty pounds annual value, \$\frac{1}{2}\$-inch diameter; for the supply of water for other than domestic purposes, and for all supplies by meter, such diameter as the Trust shall authorize in each case.
- 22. The water supplied in the urban district of the Trust shall be received and used under and in accordance with these regulations, and the Victorian Water Conservation Acts 1881-1885, and such parts of the Public Works Statute 1865 as are incorporated therewith.
- 23. If any person, whether supplied with water by the Trust or otherwise, shall commit a breach of these regulations, such person shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each such offence, and such person, if supplied with water by the Trust, shall be liable to have the supply of water cut off from his premises, either by cutting the pipes by or through which such water is supplied, or otherwise, as the Trust may think fit, and such supply shall cease so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.
- 24. In the foregoing regulations, wherever the words "officer" or "servant" appears, the same shall be deemed to be taken and mean an officer or servant of the Trust duly authorized in that behalf.

The foregoing regulation, numbered (3) three, was made by the Commissioners of the Shire of Yarrawonga Waterworks Trust,

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 183 of The Land Act 1884, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desixt from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

All former bye-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed, excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the Government Gazette.

And if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect or fail to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid, the same shall be removed by the said Local Board of Health at the expense of such occupier.

6. The occupier of every house, building, or tenement within the said townships shall cause every cesspool already in existence, and until its abolition, to be emptied and cleaned from time to time as soon as any portion of the contents of such occupier.

Every occupier and every person having the management and control of any promises shall, once at least in every week, empty and cleanse, or cause to be emptied and cleansed, every earth-closet, privy, and place in the nature of an earth-closet for the reception of nightsoil or other officient and control of any promises sh

less than six inches in thickness.

The occupier of any premises within the above-named townships used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, process, or nanufacture whatever, or used for the purpose of slaughtering, whether it be an abattoir or otherwise, shall cause any rubbish, blood, offal; bones, water, liquid, soil, or other offensive matter produced or accumulated thereon to be removed therefrom once in every 24 hours, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, or to exhale any offensive effluvia; and if such occupier shall neglect or fail to have removed therefrom any offensive matter whatever, it may be removed by the said local board at the expense of such occupier.

12. Every closet-pan shall be constructed of galvanized iron, properly riveted and soldered so as to be watertight, and with handles thereto, and of a capacity not exceeding three cubic feet.

For keeping free from noisone matter yards, stables, and places used for nozious trudes, staupher-yards, dc., and for regulating the management of earth-closets, privies, dc., disinfecting and decdorizing nightsoil and other offensive matter, and for regulating its removal and final deposit.

THE Local Board of Health in and for the Shire of Numurkah, in the colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in the "Public Health Amendment Statute 1883," and every other power enabling the said local board in this behalf, and for the purposes of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said local board, doth hereby make the following bye-law, being bye-law 0.6 of the said Local Board of Health, that is to say:—

1. All former bye-laws on the matter and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed, excepting as to acts done,

ponalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this bye-law coming into operation.

2. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the Government Gazette.

3. This bye-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the said shire of Numurkah.

4. The occupier of every house and premises within the said shire shall cause the yard and ground belonging thereto, or occupied in connection therewith, to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all filth, rubbish, and refuse matter to be removed from time to time from such yard and ground; and if at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such fifth, rubbish, or refuse matter so removed as aforesaid, the local board may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier.

5. The occupier of any land in the said shire on which there shall be erected any stable, cow-yard, cattle-shed, or pisty shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state, in respect of cleanliness, as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all soil, dung, or other manure produced or accumulated therein to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of the same so produced or accumulated shall amount to one cubic yard. And if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect or fail to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid, the same shall be removed by the said local board at the expense of such occupier.

6. The occupier of every house, building, or tenement within the said shire, within one month from the date of confirmation of this bye-law, shall cause every cesspool already in existence to be forthwith emptied and cleansed, re-filled with clay and henceforth abolished, and in lieu thereof shall substitute pans as hereinafter described. Provided that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discha

therefrom until such contents shall have had mixed therewith carbolic acid, or some other efficient decodorizer, sufficient in quality and quantity to effectually decodorize and disinfect the same.

7. Every occupier and every person having the management and control of any premises shall, once at least in every week, empty and cleanse, or cause to be emptied and cleansed, every earth-closet, privy, and place in the nature of an earth-closet for the reception of nightsoil on or belonging to such premises.

8. No person shall empty any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the reception of nightsoil, except by means of a cart, carriage, or means of conveyance, properly constructed, and furnished with a sufficient covering, so as to prevent the escape of the contents or any portion thereof, or of effluvia therefrom.

9. All nightsoil, blood, offal, or other offensive matter or thing shall be removed to and deposited in such place or places only as may be appointed by the local board from time to time for the final reception of the same.

10. Every person placing or depositing, or causing or suffering to be placed, or deposited, or spread, or assisting in placing, or depositing, or spreading on any land, whether by way of manure or otherwise, any nightsoil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter removed from any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or other place, shall immediately on the deposit or spreading thereof cover the same, or cause the same to be covered, and shall keep the same covered with a layer of earth not less than six inches in thickness.

11. The occupier of any premises within the shire used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, process, or manufacture whatever, or used for the purpose of slaughtering, whether it be an abactior or otherwise, shall cause any rubbish, blood, offal, bones, water, liquid, soil, or other offensive matter produced or accumulated therefrom once in every twenty-four hours, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a muisance or injurious to he

And every such person shall with every such application pay a fee of. Two shillings and sixpence per annum.

All paddocks, grounds, lands, and enclosures used as grazinig ground for dairy cattle shall, whenever necessary, be inspected by any member or officer of the said Local Board, or by any person authorized in writing by the chairman or secretary of the said Local Board, and if on inspection such paddocks, grounds, or enclosures, or any one of them are or is likely, in the opinion of the officer or person so inspecting, to be prejudicial to health by affecting the milk or otherwise, the said Local Board may, by an order in writing signed by the secretary and served personally or left, at the dwelling house of the registered person, or, in the case of an unregistered person, served personally or left at his dwelling place or posted upon the land, prohibit the use of the same for the purpose of feeding dairy cattle either absolutely or for any time named in such order. All cattle in dairies shall also be similarly inspected by a veterinary surgeon or other competent person, and any cows found to be diseased or which from poverty or weakness are, in the opinion of the inspector, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, shall be forthwith removed from such dairy if ordered by such inspector or other officer as aforesaid; and any such order as aforesaid the said Local Board may revoke, but upon every fresh inspection a similar order may from time to time be made.

7. All houses, dairies, cowsheds, milk-stores, milk-shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not, shall be kept in such a state, in respect of cleanliness, as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated; and the drainage of all such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lei in any way whateve

9. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily.

10. If any person or any member of the family of any person registered as a foresaid or not so registered, but employed as a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor or member of the family of any visitor to any such person shall be attacked bytyphoid fever or any dangerous infectious disease, the occupier of the house in which such person shall be, or (if he be the person attacked), his wife or other person in charge shall immediately give notice thereof to the Local Board or officer of health or to the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the Local Board or the officer of health, by order served as afore-said, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of any such cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, until danger in the opinion of such Local Board or officer of health no longer exists. And in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering, to milk cows or to health no longer exists. And in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering, to milk cows or to handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business. Nor if the person suffering shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until in either case all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk or of its contamination has ceased.

11. If at any time disease exists in the dairy or among the cows or cattle in any cowshed or dairy or in the herds of any cowkeeper, dairyman, vendor or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the Local Board, officer of health, or nearest member of the police force, and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsover.

12. No cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep or permit or suffer to be kept any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or shaltered.


