GRANT OF ONE HUNDRED POUNDS (£100) FOR INVENTION OF MACHINERY FOR HARVESTING AND THRASHING PEASE.

A SUM not exceeding One hundred pounds may be paid to any person or company who shall, in the opinion of the Minister of Agriculture, produce a machine capable of thrashing, or thrashing and harvesting, within twelve hours, eight hundred bushels of pease without injury thereto.

2. The reward shall be paid only to the inventor, or his agent, of such machine as shall most cheaply, efficiently, and rapidly perform the work required, and within the time aforesaid.

3. Persons intending to compete for the reward must give notice, in writing, of their intention to the Secretary for Agriculture, Melbourne, not later than the 18th November next.

4. One or more trials of the machines shall be made at such place or places and at such times as the Minister may direct.

5. All costs and expenses of forwarding, attendance, and working the machines at the times to be appointed shall be paid by the persons entering the machines for competition.

6. The Minister may appoint three or more judges to report upon the merits of the competing machines, and a decision of a majority of such judges shall be final.

7. The judges may recommend payment of an amount or amounts, the total of which shall not exceed One hundred pounds (£100), to the inventor or inventors, or his or their agent or agents, of the successful machine or machines, such amounts to be apportioned to the value to the colony of the said invention or inventions.

AGRICULTURAL STATISTICS.

MEMORANDUM.--At the early date at which the Agricultural Statistics are collected, it is impossible to obtain a reliable estimate of the produce of Hops, Tobacco, or Vines. Most of the growers, however, have since sent in returns in compliance with circulars addressed to them by the Government Statist. In cases where these circulars have not been responded to, the produce has been estimated according to the average yield of the same crops prevailing in the district. It has hitherto been the practice not to obtain particulars of the yield of Tobacco and Vines until the next year's Agricultural Statistics were being collected, but this delay has been avoided on the present occasion by communicating directly with the growers.

These particulars relate to Municipalities in which there was only one grower of the crops referred to. They have been combined, in order that publicity might not be given to the operations of the individual cultivator. The Shires in which there was only one grower of Hops were Berwick, Glenelg, Hampden, Howqua, Narracan, Rutherglen, Seymour, Traralgon, Warragul, Warrambool, and Yackandandah; those in which there was only one grower of Tobacco were Chiltern, Mansfield, North Ovens, and Omeo; and those in which there was only one grower of Vines were Creswick, Dundas, Osborne, Grenville, Leigh, Moorabbin, Pyralong, Ripon, St. Arnaud, Tambo, Whittlesea, Winchelsea, Wyndham, and Yea; also the following Boroughs, Hawthorn, Maryborough, and Stawell. No returns are collected in cases where the crop does not cover one acre.

The births of 1,194 children, viz., 604 boys and 590 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of June. In the month of May, 1,101 births were registered, or 93 fewer than in the month under review. The births were 373 above the average of the previous ten years, but only 197 above that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in June numbered 579, viz., 310 of males and 269 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 615, or 106 per cent. The deaths were fewer than those in May by 52, but exceeded the average of June during the previous ten years by 149. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have exceeded that average by 57 only.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was 3.46, and of deaths registered 1.68.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 63.3° on the 7th, and the lowest was 33.0° on the 27th. The mean temperature of the month (49.1°) was rather under a third of a degree below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (27.5°) took place on the 6th, viz., from a maximum of 63.0° to a minimum of 35.5°. The least range (5.3°) was on the 25th, viz., from a maximum of 50.0° to a minimum of 44.7°. The mean daily range was 15.6°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.507 inches on the 15th, and the lowest was 29.840 inches on the 10th. The mean atmospheric pressure (30.250 inches) was more than a fifth of an inch above the average.

Rain fell on 12 days, the amount of rainfall being .814 inch, or rather more than three-quarters of an inch. The average rainfall of June during the previous ten years was 1.87 inch. Fog occurred on two days.

Males contributed 54 per cent., and females 46 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 30 per cent. to that mortality, as against 31 per cent. in June 1885, 32 per cent. in June 1884, 28 per cent. in June 1883, 35 per cent. in June 1882, 32 per cent. in June 1881, 36 per cent. in June 1880, 27 per cent. in June 1879, 20 per cent. in June 1878, 38 per cent. in June 1877, and 30 per cent. in June 1876.

The deaths of persons of 75 years or upwards were much above the average, and numbered 37, viz. —Those of a photographer and a builder, each aged 75, and a widow, aged 77, who died of cancer; a female, aged 75, of abdominal tumor; a female, aged 75, and a widow, aged 75, of apoplexy; a gentleman, aged 75, of broncho-pneumonia; a female, aged 76, of gut; a female, aged 76, and a male patient in the Kew Lunatic Asylum, aged 77, of brain disease; a shoemaker, aged 75, a gardener and an engineer, each aged 84, of heart disease; a gentleman, aged 75, of congestion of the lungs; a female, aged 78, a female, aged 83, and a female, aged 93, of the results of fractures or contusions, the nature of which was not stated; a female, aged 78, of gastritis; a female, aged 79, of cirrhosis of the liver; a female, aged 86, of phthisis; a female, aged 88, of paralysis; a female, aged 84, and a carpenter, aged 88, of bronchitis; a female, aged 75, two females and a laborer, each aged 78, a female, aged 82, a gentleman, aged 83, a female, aged 85, a gentleman, a laborer, and a female, each aged 86, two females, each aged 90, a female, aged 93, and a female, aged 94, of old age.

Thirty-two deaths were ascribed to external causes during the month, of which 25 were set down to accident, 2 to homicide, and 5 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A student at the Church of England Grammar School, aged 18, died of fracture of the spine; a laborer, aged 37, of fracture of the lower jaw; a contractor, aged 58, of compound fracture of the leg—in these three cases it was not stated how the accident was caused; a laborer, aged 22, of fracture of the leg, a tree falling upon him; a printer, aged 26, of injury to the leg, a dray wheel passing over him; a groom, aged 50, of fracture of the skull, caused by his being knocked down by a horse; a contractor, aged 58, of pyæmia, consequent on an injury to the foot with an adze whilst cutting wood; a female, aged 78, was killed by being knocked down by a railway engine; a laborer, aged 56, by a fall of earth; a waiter, aged 58, died of fracture of the spine, and a female, aged 83, of fractured thigh, both resulting from falling down stairs; a laborer, aged 60, of compound fracture of the thigh, caused by his falling from a window; a female, aged 93, of fracture of the thigh, caused by a fall; a gatekeeper, aged 39, and a female, aged 52, were killed by being passed over by trains; a female infant, aged 5 days, died of hæmorrhage from a wound in the throat, "there being no evidence to show if wilfully caused"; a laborer, aged 26, of a cut on the hand with a broken bottle, sustained whilst chopping wood; a contractor, aged 46, of a wound in the hand inflicted accidentally by himself with a chisel; 2 girls, aged 5 and 7 respectively, of shock, resulting from severe burns; 2 seamen, aged 35 and 46 respectively, and a commission agent, aged 46, were found drowned in the Yarra; a saddler, aged 72, was drowned in a bath; and a laborer, aged 53, died of suffocation, a piece of meat becoming impacted in his windpipe. The homicidal deaths were those of a female, aged 38, who died of injuries inflicted by her husband (Thomas Taylor), both being drunk; and of a hay and corn dealer, aged 41, who was wilfully murdered, his skull being fractured with some heavy instrument. Of those whose deaths resulted from suicide, a laborer, aged 41, allowed himself to be passed over by a railway train; a grocer, aged 36, a hawker, aged 56, and a traveller, aged 61, cut their throats; and a drover, aged 55, shot himself. With the exception of the last two, all were set down as laboring under insanity at the time of their committing self-destruction.

One hundred and twenty-five deaths, or 22 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—63 in the Melbourne Hospital, 18 in the Alfred Hospital, 3 in the Children's Hospital, 8 in the Lying-in Hospital, 6 in the Immigrants' Home, 7 in the Benevolent Asylum, 8 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 10 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 1 in the Melbourne Gaol, and 1 in the Protestant Refuge.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 175, of which 87, or 50 per cent., were of males, and 88, or 50 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 117 were under one year of age, 33 were between one and two, 8 were between two and three, 10 were between three and four, and 7 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 404. Of these, 223, or 55 per cent., were males, and 181, or 45 per cent., were females; 20 were between five and ten, 8 were between ten and fifteen, 15 were between fifteen and twenty, 27 were between twenty and twenty-five, 41 were between twenty-five and thirty, 22 were between thirty and thirty-five, 22 were between thirty-five and forty, 39 were between forty and forty-five, 28 were between forty-five and fifty, 34 were between fifty and fifty-five, 40 were between fifty-five and sixty, 31 were between sixty and sixty-five, 24 were between sixty-five and seventy, 16 were between seventy and seventy-five, 19 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 18 were upwards of eighty.

As compared with the experience of the previous month, deaths in June from zymotic diseases fell from 116 to 85. Under this head, deaths from dysentery and diarrhoea fell from 27 to 4, those from typhoid fever from 40 to 29, and those from erysipelas from 5 to 4. On the other hand, deaths from diphtheria increased from 3 to 5, those from croup from 5 to 7, and those from blood poisoning from 1 to 2, whilst there were 10 deaths from whooping-cough in both months. Under constitutional diseases, deaths from cancer fell from 27 to 22, and deaths from phthisis from 77 to 62. Diseases of the organs of respiration were unusually fatal during the month, the increase, as compared with May, being from 89 to 104 deaths. Metria, in conjunction with accidents of childbirth, caused 12 deaths during the month; comparing which number with the births (1,194), it follows that one death of a mother took place to every 99 children born alive, but if the three deaths of lying-in women above referred to of complaints independent of childbearing be added, the total of women dying during or shortly after parturition is brought up to 15, or one to every 80 births.

OFFICIAL NOTICE.—CAUTION TO SHIPOWNERS AND SHIPMASTERS.

Failure to give notice or to deliver up Certificate of Registry when a ship is actually or constructively lost or ceases to be British.

THE attention of masters and owners is called to the provisions of section 53 of *The Merchant Shipping Act 1854*, which are as follows:—

“If any registered ship is either actually or constructively lost, taken by the enemy, burnt, or broken up, or if by reason of a transfer to any persons not qualified to be owners of British ships, or of any other matter or thing, any such ship as aforesaid ceases to be a British ship, every person who at the time of the occurrence of any of the aforesaid events owns such ship or any share therein shall, immediately upon obtaining knowledge of any such occurrence, if no notice thereof has already been given to the registrar at the Port of Registry of such ship, give such notice to him, and he shall make an entry thereof in his register book; and except in cases where the certificate of registry is lost or destroyed, the master of every such ship so circumstanced as aforesaid shall immediately, if such event occurs in port, but if the same occurs elsewhere, then within ten days after his arrival in port, deliver the certificate of registry of such ship to the registrar, or, if there be no registrar, to the British Consular Officer at such port, and such registrar if he is not himself the registrar of her Port of Registry, or such British Consular Officer, shall forthwith forward the certificate so delivered to him to the registrar of the Port of Registry of the ship, and every owner and master who, without reasonable cause, makes default in obeying the provisions of this section, shall for each offence incur a penalty not exceeding One hundred pounds.”

And notice is hereby given that it is the intention of the Board of Trade to institute proceedings for the recovery of the prescribed penalty of One hundred pounds against any owner or part owner who fails to give the required notice to the registrar of the Port of Registry of his ship, and against any master who makes default in delivering up the certificate of registry to the registrar or consular officer, as the case may be, in contravention of this statutory requirement.

BYE-LAW No. 1.

For keeping free from noisome matters yards, stables, and places used for noxious trades, slaughter-yards, &c.; and for regulating management of earth-closets, privies, &c., disinfecting and deodorizing nightsoil and other offensive matters, and for regulating its removal and final deposit.

THE Local Board of Health in and for the Shire of Meredith, in the colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883, and every other power enabling the said local board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said local board, doth hereby make the following bye-law, being Bye-law No. 1 of the said Local Board of Health, that is to say:—

1. All former bye-laws on the matter and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed, excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this bye-law coming into operation.

2. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This bye-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the said shire of Meredith.

4. The occupier of every house and premises within the said shire of Meredith shall cause the yard and ground belonging thereto, or occupied in connection therewith, to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all filth, rubbish, and refuse matter to be from time to time removed from such yard and ground; and if at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such filth, rubbish, or refuse matter so removed as aforesaid, the local board may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier.

5. The occupier of any land in the said shire of Meredith on which there shall be erected any stable, cowyard, cattle-shed, or pigsty shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all soil, dung, or other manure produced or accumulated therein to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of the same so produced or accumulated shall amount to one cubic yard; and if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect or fail to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid, the same shall be removed by the said local board at the expense of such occupier.

6. The occupier of every house, building, or tenement within the said shire of Meredith shall cause every cesspool already in existence, and until its abolition, to be emptied and cleansed from time to time as soon as any portion of the contents of such cesspool shall have so accumulated therein as to be within a distance of one foot from the top of the side walls or lining of such cesspool. Provided that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom except between the hours of Eleven p.m. and Five a.m. And provided also that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom until such contents shall have had mixed therewith carbolic acid or some other efficient deodorizer sufficient in quality and quantity to effectually deodorize and disinfect the same.

7. Every occupier and every person having the management and control of any premises shall once at least in every week empty and cleanse, or cause to be emptied and cleansed, every earth-closet, privy, and place in the nature of an earth-closet for the reception of nightsoil on or belonging to such premises.

8. No person shall empty any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the reception of nightsoil except by means of a cart, carriage, or means of conveyance properly constructed, and furnished with a sufficient covering so as to prevent the escape of the contents or any portion thereof or of effluvia therefrom.

9. All nightsoil, blood, offal, or other offensive matter or thing shall be removed to and deposited in such place or places only as may be appointed by the local board from time to time for the final reception of the same.

10. Every person placing or depositing, or causing or suffering to be placed or deposited or spread, or assisting in placing or depositing or spreading on any land, whether by way of manure or otherwise, any nightsoil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter removed from any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or other place, shall immediately on the deposit or spreading thereof cover the same, or cause the same to be covered, and shall keep the same covered, with a layer of earth not less than six inches in thickness.

11. The occupier of any premises within the shire of Meredith used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, process, or manufacture whatever, or used for the purpose of slaughtering, whether it be an abattoir or otherwise, shall cause any rubbish, blood, offal, bones, water, liquid, soil, or other offensive matter produced or accumulated thereon to be removed therefrom once in every twenty-four hours, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, or to exhale any offensive effluvia; and if such occupier shall neglect or fail to have removed therefrom any offensive matter whatever, it may be removed by the said local board at the expense of such occupier.

12. Every closet-pan shall be constructed of galvanized iron, properly riveted and soldered so as to be water-tight, and with handles thereto, and of a capacity not exceeding three cubic feet.

13. No closet-door or trap shall shut or open upon a street, lane, or right-of-way exceeding ten feet in width.

14. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds for every such breach, or of Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties—such portion not being less than Five shillings—to be paid. And any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty, notwithstanding that the Local Board of Health may be empowered by this bye-law or otherwise to remedy such

breach, and whether such local board has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

BYE-LAW No. 2, AS TO DAIRIES, DAIRY CATTLE, AND MILK.

THE Local Board of Health in and for the Shire of Meredith, in the colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in "The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883," and every other power enabling the said local board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said local board, doth hereby make the following bye-law, being Bye-law No. 2 of the said Local Board of Health, that is to say:—

1. All former bye-laws on the matter and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed.

2. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This bye-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the Shire of Meredith.

Registration of Cowkeepers, Dairymen, and Purveyors of Milk.

4. Every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall, on or before the first day of October in every year, register himself with the Local Board of Health in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the Secretary of the Local Board of Health an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall with every such application pay a fee of One shilling:—

Application for Registration as a Dairyman or Cowkeeper.

To the Secretary of the Local Board of Health for the Shire of Meredith.

Sir,

I desire to be registered in accordance with the particulars in the schedule hereunder:—

5. Upon receipt of every such application and fee, the Secretary for the Local Board of Health shall indorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received, and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

6. All paddocks, grounds, lands, and enclosures used as grazing ground for dairy cattle shall, whenever necessary, be inspected by any member or officer of the said local board or by any person authorized, in writing, by the chairman or secretary of the said local board; and if on inspection such paddocks, grounds, or enclosures, or any one of them, are or is likely, in the opinion of the officer or person so inspecting, to be prejudicial to health, by affecting the milk or otherwise, the said local board may, by an order in writing signed by the secretary, and served personally or left at the dwelling-house of the registered person, or in the case of an unregistered person, served personally or left at his dwelling-place or posted upon the land, prohibit the use of the same for the purpose of feeding dairy cattle, either absolutely or for any time named in such order. All cattle in dairies shall also be similarly inspected by a veterinary surgeon or other competent person, and any cows found to be diseased, or which from poverty or weakness are, in the opinion of the inspector, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, shall be forthwith removed from such dairy if ordered by such inspector or other officer as aforesaid. And any such order as aforesaid the said local board may revoke, but upon every fresh inspection a similar order may from time to time be made.

7. All houses, dairies, cowsheds, milk stores, milk shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered

or not, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated; and the drainage of all such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatsoever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not.

8. All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows shall be regularly swept, and be kept perfectly clean, and shall within twenty-four hours of any such order to such effect from the health officer or inspector of nuisances be fumigated, disinfected, or limewashed, as may be in any such order so directed.

9. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily.

10. If any person, or any member of the family of any such person, registered as aforesaid, or not so registered but employed as a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor or member of the family of any visitor to any such person, shall be attacked by typhoid fever or any dangerous infectious disease, the occupier of the house in which such person shall be, or (if he be the person attacked) his wife or other person in charge, shall immediately give notice thereof to the local board or officer of health, or to the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the Local Board of Health, and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said local board or the officer of health, by order served as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending of and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of any such cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, until danger, in the opinion of such local board or officer of health, no longer exists. And in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering, or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering, to milk cows or to handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business. Nor, if the person registered or conducting such business be himself the person suffering, shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until, in either case, all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk or of its contamination has ceased.

11. If at any time disease exists in the dairy or among the cows or cattle in any cowshed or dairy or in the herds of any cowkeeper, dairyman, vendor or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the local board, officer of health, or nearest member of the police force; and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.

12. No cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep, or permit or suffer to be kept, any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking-yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.

13. In the interpretation of this bye-law words imputing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural, and the plural the singular, and the word "person" shall include a corporation.

14. Every person guilty of any breach of this bye-law, or any of its provisions, shall be liable, in the discretion of the convicting justices, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings, or in the like discretion to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings, for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all filth, rubbish, and refuse matter to be from time to time removed from such yard and ground; and if at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such filth, rubbish, or refuse matter so removed as aforesaid, the local board may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier.

5. The occupier of any land in the said borough on which there shall be erected any stable, cow-yard, cattle-shed, or pigsty shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state, in respect of cleanliness, as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all soil, dung, or other manure produced or accumulated therein to be from time to time removed from such premises so often as the quantity of the same so produced or accumulated shall amount to one cubic yard. And if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect or fail to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid, the same shall be removed by the said local board at the expense of such occupier.

6. All closets or privies shall be constructed and kept as earth-closets, and shall be supplied with a sufficient supply of dry earth, ashes, or other deodorizer for effectually disinfecting or deodorizing the contents of the closet-pan or box appertaining thereto.

7. Every occupier and every person having the management and control of any premises shall, once at least in every week, empty and cleanse, or cause to be emptied and cleansed, every earth-closet, privy, and place in the nature of an earth-closet for the reception of nightsoil on or belonging to such premises.

8. No person shall empty any earth-closet, privy, or place for the reception of nightsoil except by means of a cart, carriage, or means of conveyance properly constructed and furnished with a sufficient covering so as to prevent the escape of the contents or any portion thereof or of effluvia therefrom.

9. All nightsoil, blood, offal, or other offensive matter or thing shall be removed to and deposited in such place or places only as may be appointed by the local board from time to time for the final reception of the same.

10. Every person placing or depositing, or causing or suffering to be placed or deposited or spread on any land, whether by way of manure or otherwise, any nightsoil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter removed from any earth-closet, privy, or other place, shall, immediately on the deposit or spreading thereof, cover the same or cause the same to be covered, and shall keep the same covered, with a layer of earth not less than six inches in thickness.

11. The occupier of any premises within the borough used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, process, or manufacture whatever, or used for the purpose of slaughtering, whether it be an abattoir or otherwise, shall cause any rubbish, blood, offal, bones, water, liquid, soil, or other offensive matter produced or accumulated thereon to be removed therefrom once in every twenty-four hours, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, or to exhale any offensive effluvia; and if such occupier shall neglect or fail to have removed therefrom any offensive matter whatsoever, it may be removed by the said local board at the expense of such occupier.

12. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds for every such breach, or of Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties—such portion not being less than Five shillings—to be paid. And any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty, notwithstanding that the Local Board of Health may be empowered by this bye-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether the local board has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

THE Local Board of Health in and for the Borough of Talbot, in the colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in "The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883," and every other power enabling the said local board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said local board, doth hereby make the following bye-law, being Bye-law No. 2A of the said Local Board of Health, that is to say:—

1. All former bye-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed.

2. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This bye-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the borough of Talbot.

Registration of Cowkeepers, Dairy-men, and Purveyors of Milk.

4. Every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall, on or before the first day of September in every year, register himself with the Local

Board of Health in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the Secretary of the Local Board of Health an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall with every such application pay a fee of Two shillings and sixpence:—

Upon receipt of every such application and fee, the Secretary for the Local Board of Health shall indorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received, and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

6. All paddocks, grounds, lands, and enclosures used as grazing ground for dairy cattle shall, whenever necessary, be inspected by any member or officer of the said local board or by any person authorized in writing by the chairman or secretary of the said local board; and if, on inspection, such paddocks, grounds, or enclosures, or any one of them, are or is likely, in the opinion of the officer or person so inspecting, to be prejudicial to health, by affecting the milk or otherwise, the said local board may, by an order in writing signed by the secretary, and served personally or left at the dwelling-house of the registered person, or in the case of an unregistered person served personally or left at his dwelling-place or posted upon the land, prohibit the use of the same for the purpose of feeding dairy cattle either absolutely or for any time named in such order. All cattle in dairies shall also be similarly inspected by a veterinary surgeon or other competent person, and any cows found to be diseased, or which from poverty or weakness are, in the opinion of the inspector, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, shall be forthwith removed from such dairy if ordered by such inspector or other officer as aforesaid. And any such order as aforesaid the said local board may revoke, but upon every fresh inspection a similar order may from time to time be made.

7. All houses, dairies, cowsheds, milk stores, milk shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated, and the drainage of all such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not.

8. All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows shall be regularly swept, and be kept perfectly clean, and shall, within twenty-four hours of any order to such effect from the health officer or inspector of nuisances, be fumigated, disinfected, or limewashed, as may be in any such order so directed.

9. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and soured daily.

10. If any person, or any member of the family of any person, registered as aforesaid, or not so registered but employed as a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor or member of the family of any visitor to any such person, shall be attacked by typhoid fever or any dangerous or infectious disease, the occupier of the house in which such person shall be, or (if he be the person attacked) his wife or other person in charge, shall immediately give notice thereof to the local board or officer of health, or to the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the Local Board of Health, and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said local board or the officer of health, by order served as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of any such cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, until danger, in the opinion of such local board or officer of health, no longer exists. And in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering, or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering, to milk cows or to handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business. Nor, if the person registered or conducting such business be himself the person suffering, shall he

take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until, in either case, all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk or of its contamination has ceased.

11. If at any time disease exists in the dairy or among the cows or cattle in any cowshed or dairy, or in the herds of any cowkeeper, dairyman, vendor or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the local board, officer of health, or nearest member of the police force, and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.

12. No cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep, or permit or suffer to be kept, any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.

13. In the interpretation of this bye-law words imputing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural, and the plural the singular, and the word "person" shall include a corporation.

14. Every person guilty of any breach of this bye-law, or of any of its provisions, shall be liable, in the discretion of the convicting justices, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings, or in the like discretion, to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

Registration of Cowkeepers, Dairyman, and Purveyors of Milk.

4. Every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall, on or before the first day of June in every year, register himself with the Local Board of Health in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the Secretary of the Local Board of Health an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall with every such application pay a fee of Five shillings:—

All cattle in dairies shall also be similarly inspected by a veterinary surgeon or other competent person, and any cows found to be diseased or which from poverty or weakness are, in the opinion of the inspector, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, shall be forthwith removed from such dairy if ordered by such inspector or other officer as aforesaid; and any such order as aforesaid the said local board may revoke, but upon every fresh inspection a similar order may from time to time be made.

7. All houses, dairies, cowsheds, milk stores, milk shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not, shall be kept in such a state, in respect of cleanliness, as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated; and the drainage of all such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not.

All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows, shall be regularly swept and be kept perfectly clean, and shall, within twenty-four hours of any order to such effect from the health officer or inspector of nuisances, be fumigated, disinfected, or lime-washed as may be in any such order so directed.

9. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily.

10. If any person or any member of the family of any person registered as aforesaid or not so registered, but employed as a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor or member of the family of any visitor to any such person, shall be attacked by typhoid fever or any dangerous infectious disease, the occupier of the house in which such person shall be, or (if he be the person attacked) his wife or other person in charge shall immediately give notice thereof to the local board or officer of health, or to the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the Local Board of Health; and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said local board or the officer of health, by order served as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of any such cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk until danger in the opinion of such local board or officer of health, no longer exists. And in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering, or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering, to milk cows or to handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business. Nor, if the person registered or conducting such business be himself the person suffering, shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until, in either case, all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk or of its contamination has ceased.

11. If at any time disease exists in the dairy or among the cows or cattle in any cowshed or dairy or in the herds of any cowkeeper, dairyman, vendor or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the local board, officer of health, or nearest member of the police force, and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.

12. No cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep, or permit or suffer to be kept, any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking-yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.

13. In the interpretation of this bye-law words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural, and the plural the singular, and the word "person" shall include a corporation.

14. Every person guilty of any breach of this bye-law, or of any of its provisions, shall be liable, in the discretion of the convicting justices, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings, or in the like discretion to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

BYE-LAW No. 2.

For keeping free from noisome matter yards, stables, and places used for noxious trades, slaughter-yards, &c., and for regulating management of earth-closets, privies, &c., disinfecting and odorizing nightsoil and other offensive matter, and for regulating its removal and final deposit.

THE Local Board of Health in and for the Borough of Eaglehawk, in the colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in "The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883," and every other power enabling the said local board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said local board, doth hereby make the following bye-law, being Bye-law No. 2 of the said Local Board of Health, that is to say:—

1. All former bye-laws on the matter and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed, excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this bye-law coming into operation.

2. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This bye-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the said borough.

4. The occupier of every house and premises within the said borough shall cause the yard and ground belonging thereto, or occupied in connection therewith, to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all filth, rubbish, and refuse matter to be from time to time removed from such yard and ground; and if at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such filth, rubbish, or refuse matter so removed as aforesaid, the local board may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier.

5. The occupier of any land in the said borough on which there shall be erected any stable, cow-yard, cattle-shed, or pigsty shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state, in respect of cleanliness, as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all soil, dung, or other manure produced or accumulated therein to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of the same so produced or accumulated shall amount, in the case of horse cow-yard, and cattle-shed manure to four cubic yards, and in the case of pigsty manure to one cubic yard. And if at any time the owner of such premises shall neglect or fail to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid, the same shall be removed by the said local board at the expense of such occupier.

6. Nothing contained in this bye-law shall be taken to prevent the occupier or person having the management or control of any premises from causing any dung, soil (not being nightsoil), or other refuse matter produced or accumulated on any premises to be at any time removed, or to be used as manure on any garden or land, or to be kept for the purpose of being so used, so that the same be not so removed, kept, or used as to contravene any bye-law of the local board or to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

7. The occupier of every house, building, or tenement within the said borough shall cause every cesspool already in existence, and until its abolition, to be emptied and cleansed from time to time, as soon as any portion of the contents of such cesspool shall have so accumulated therein as to be within a distance of one foot from the top of the sides, walls, or lining of such cesspool. Provided that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom except between the hours of Eleven p.m. and Five a.m. And provided also that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom until such contents shall have mixed therewith carbolic acid, or some other efficient deodorizer, sufficient in quality and quantity to effectually deodorize and disinfect the same.

8. Every occupier and every person having the management and control of any premises shall, once at least in every fortnight, empty and cleanse, or cause to be emptied or cleansed, every earth-closet, privy, and place in the nature of an earth-closet for the reception of nightsoil on or belonging to such premises.

9. No person shall remove from off the premises the contents of any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the reception of nightsoil, except by means of a cart, carriage, or means of conveyance, properly constructed, and furnished with a sufficient covering, so as to prevent the escape of the contents or any portion thereof or of effluvia therefrom. In the said borough a nightman, licensed by the municipal authorities, shall be employed by the occupier of the premises for such removal of nightsoil.

10. All nightsoil, blood, offal, or other offensive matter or thing shall be removed to and deposited in such place or places only as may be appointed by the local board from time to time for the final reception of the same.

11. Every person placing or depositing, or causing or suffering to be placed or deposited or spread, or assisting in placing or depositing or spreading on any land, whether by way of manure or otherwise, any nightsoil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter removed from any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or other place, shall immediately on the deposit or spreading thereof cover the same, or cause the same to be covered, and shall keep the same covered with a layer of earth not less than six inches in thickness.

12. The occupier of any premises within the borough used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, process, or manufacture whatever, or used for the purpose of slaughtering,

whether it be an abattoir or otherwise, shall cause any rubbish, blood, offal, bones, water, liquid, soil, or other offensive matter produced or accumulated thereon to be removed therefrom once in every twenty-four hours, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, or to exhale any offensive effluvia; and if such occupiers shall neglect or fail to have removed therefrom any offensive matter whatever, it may be removed by the said local board at the expense of such occupier.

13. Every closet-pan shall be constructed of galvanized iron, properly riveted and soldered, so as to be water-tight, and with handles thereto, and of a capacity not exceeding three cubic feet.

14. No closet door or trap shall abut or open on a street, lane, or right-of-way exceeding ten feet in width.

15. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds for every such breach, or of Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties, such portion not being less than Five shillings, to be paid. And any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty, notwithstanding that the Local Board of Health may be empowered by this bye-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such local board has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

SHIRE OF BERWICK.

BYE-LAW No. 14.

"The Police Offences Statute 1865."—Part I.

IN accordance with the powers conferred by the 212 section, Part X., of "The Local Government Act 1874," the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Berwick order that the following portions of Part I. of the Police Offences Statute be a bye-law of the whole of the Shire of Berwick.

Any person guilty of any of the following offences, omissions, or neglects, shall, on conviction, pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds:—

(i.) Throwing any glass, filth, dirt, or rubbish or other matter of a similar nature upon any road or footway or public place.

(ii.) Kidding, driving, or wheeling any barrow or carriage upon or along any footpath.

(iii.) Placing any timber, bricks, or other building materials upon any footway, channel, surface drain, or carriage-road without the permission of the local authority having been first obtained.

(iv.) Burning any shavings or other materials upon any footway, carriage-road, or open public place.

(v.) Leaving any inflammable materials or matter in any public shed or place, or on any open space near any building, without having first obtained the permission of the local authority.

(vi.) Drawing or trailing any sledge, timber, or other heavy material upon any footway or carriage-road to the injury of such footway or carriage-road.

(vii.) Emptying any privy or cesspool or carting away any night-soil, or other offensive matter without a license from, and without having given such security as is required by, the local authority.

(viii.) Allowing any night-soil or other offensive matter to be spilt or otherwise cast into or upon any road, street, footway, or public place.

(ix.) Allowing the drippings of the eaves of any house to fall upon any public footway.

(x.) Placing any placard or other document, writing, painting on or otherwise detaching any house or building, or on any wall, lamp, fence, post, or gate, without the consent of the occupier or owner thereof.

(xi.) Opening any drain or sewer or removing the surface of any footpath or carriage-road without the permission of the local authority having been first obtained.

(xii.) Neglecting to clean all private yards, ways, passages, or avenues, by which neglect a nuisance by offensive smell or otherwise is caused.

(xiii.) Rolling any cask, beating any carpet, breaking in any horse, flying any kite, using any bows and arrows, or playing any game, to the annoyance of any person, in any public place; or obstructing any footpath or carriage-road, whether by allowing any cart or animal to remain across such footpath or carriage-road, or by placing goods thereon or otherwise.

(xiv.) Throwing or discharging any stone or other missile to the damage or danger of any person.

(xv.) Having any awning on any footway in any public street or thoroughfare not being seven feet clear above the footway, or hanging any goods on or under such awning over the footway.

(xvi.) Blasting any rock, stone, or timber in or near any public place without permission of the local authority, and not attending to any directions in regard thereto given by such local authority.

(xvii.) Furiously or negligently riding or driving through any public place.

(xviii.) Exposing in any public street or thoroughfare (except in any fair or market-place lawfully appointed for that purpose) any horse or other animal for show, hire, or sale.

(xix.) Making cellar-door or other opening from the footway of any street or public thoroughfare without the consent of the local authority.

(xx.) Discharging any firearms, or setting off any fireworks, or carrying any firearms, sword, dirk, dagger, or other offensive weapon within any township or public place, provided that the provisions last mentioned shall not apply to any justice or any person in Her Majesty's military or naval service, or any member of the police or other peace officer, or any member of a recognised volunteer corps, or any special constable, or any person actually in pursuit of any felon or offender.

No person, without a license first had and obtained from the local authority, shall erect, place, or set up, or build in any public place any hoarding or scaffolding, or place or erect any posts, bars, rails, boards, or other thing by way of enclosure for the purpose of making mortar or of depositing, sifting, screening, or slacking lime, brick, stone, sand, or any other materials for building or repairing any house or other tenement or erection, or for any other purpose; and such license as aforesaid shall specify therein the length of time for which such hoarding, scaffolding, posts, bars, rails, boards, or other thing when so erected or set up may be continued, and shall contain such other directions respecting the same as necessary. And if any person place, set up, erect, or build, or cause or permit to be erected, set up, or built any such hoarding or scaffolding, or any enclosed posts, bars, or rails, or any other matter or thing for the purpose aforesaid, or for any other purpose without such license, or contrary to the provisions and conditions of such license, or to be continued for any longer time than is allowed or expressed in such license, then and in any of the said cases such person shall forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, and also the sum of One pound per day for every day that the same has been and is set up and continued contrary to the provisions hereof; and the said local authority may, four days after notice, cause the same to be pulled down and removed, and the same and all materials thereof to be kept and detained until such person pays to such local authority all the penalties incurred by such person, together with the charges of pulling down, removing, and keeping the same; and if the same be not claimed and the said penalties and charges as aforesaid paid within the space of five days next after pulling down and removing thereof, such local authority may order or cause the same to be sold by public auction, and the proceeds thereof applied according to the provisions herein after mentioned respecting the appropriation of moneys arising from forfeitures. The shire council shall cause to be set out the breadth of the carriage and foot ways in the streets and public places, and shall cause the said footways to be marked by posts at the corners and intersections of the streets; and the carriage and foot ways when so set out shall be deemed to be the carriage and foot ways respectively of such public places.

SHIRE OF AVOCA.—BYE-LAW No. 3.

A Bye-law of the Shire of Avoca made under the 213th section of The Local Government Act 1874, and numbered 3, for the Regulation of Proceedings of Council, &c.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1874, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Avoca order as follows:—That the existing bye-law No. 1 is hereby repealed, and that the following provisions of the 13th Schedule of the Local Government Act 1874 be adopted, that is to say:—

- Part I.
- Part II.
- Part IV.
- Part V.—Subdivision 2.
- Part VI.
- Part VII.—Subdivision 2.
- Part VIII.
- Part IX.
- Part X.—Sections 36 and 71.

PART XI.—REGULATION OF PROCEEDINGS OF COUNCIL, OFFICERS, ETC.

1. *General conduct of business.*—In all cases not herein provided for, resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of Parliament, which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the council.

2. *Date of ordinary meetings.*—The ordinary meetings of the council shall be held on the first Wednesday in each month, commencing at Eleven o'clock a.m., the business to commence as soon as the legal quorum is present; but should such quorum not be present at the expiration of one hour after the said time appointed for meeting, the same shall be entered with a note of the councillors present in the minute-book; and such meeting shall accordingly be adjourned.

3. *Minutes of meeting to be read at next subsequent meeting.*—At every meeting of the council the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting, and the minutes of the proceedings of any committee presented at any such preceding meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings, and the said minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting shall then be signed as by this Act required; and the rough minutes of the proceedings of the council at any meeting shall be read at the close of such meeting.

4. *Order of business at meeting.*—After the signing of the minutes as aforesaid the order of business of an ordinary meeting shall be as follow, or as near thereto as may be practicable, but for the greater convenience of the council at any particular meeting thereof it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

- I.—Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
- II.—Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
- III.—Presentations of reports of committees.
- IV.—Payments.

- V.—Ordinary business.
- VI.—Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings.
- VII.—Extraordinary business and new rules and regulations.
- VIII.—Other motions of which previous notice has been given.
- IX.—Notices of motion.
- And the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.
5. *Special meetings.*—Special meetings of the council shall, on the requisition of three or more councillors be convened by the secretary, the object of such meeting being set forth in the requisition.
6. *Meetings to be conducted with open doors.*—The business of the council shall be conducted on all ordinary occasions with open doors, and shall be open to the public; but any two councillors present may require the exclusion of strangers until it has been decided by the council whether the question proposed to be brought forward shall be discussed publicly or otherwise.
7. *Divisions.*—Whenever a division shall be demanded by any councillor, the councillors voting in the affirmative shall first hold up their hands, and then those voting in the negative shall hold up their hands, and the result be declared by the chairman.
8. *Addresses to Governor.*—All addresses to the Governor shall be presented by the chairman and the clerk of the municipality, unless otherwise ordered by the council.
9. *Motions.*—All notices of motion shall be dated and numbered and given by the intending mover to the municipal clerk at the close of the meeting of council, or if not required by law to be given at a meeting, then three clear days prior to the next meeting of council; and such clerk shall enter the same in the notice of motion book in the order in which they may be received. And no motion involving an expenditure exceeding £20 shall be dealt with unless notice shall have been given in accordance with this section.
10. *Notice of motion to be given.*—No member shall make any motion initiating a subject for discussion but in pursuance of notice given as prescribed in the last preceding clause.
11. *Petitions.*—No motion except that for receiving the same shall, unless under most urgent circumstances, be made on any petition, memorial, or other like application until the next ordinary meeting of council after that at which it has been presented.
12. *Motions to be moved in order in motion book.*—Except by leave of the council, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received and recorded by the municipal clerk in the notice of motion book, and if not so moved or postponed shall be struck out.
13. *Motion to be proceeded with by councillor giving same except with consent.*—No motion entered in the notice of motion book shall be proceeded with in the absence of the councillor who gave notice of the same, unless by some other councillor producing written authority from him to that effect.
14. *Draft of address or petition to be submitted at previous meeting.*—No motion for an address or petition shall be entertained unless the mover shall at some previous meeting have submitted a draft of the same.
15. *Order, &c., of debate.*—Any councillor desirous of making a motion or amendment or taking part in discussion thereon shall rise and address the chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the councillor (if any) calling to order shall have been heard thereon, and the question of order disposed of, when the councillor in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject.
16. *Nature of motion to be stated.*—Any councillor desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the council thereon.
17. *Motion not to be withdrawn without leave.*—No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the council.
18. *Motion to be seconded.*—No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the council unless it be seconded, but a councillor may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order of the council by directing the president's or chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.
19. *Mover of motion.*—A councillor moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but a councillor merely seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.
20. *Designation of councillors.*—The councillors in meeting of council shall designate each other by their official titles, namely, that of president, chairman, or councillor, as the case may require.
21. *Priority of councillors.*—If two or more councillors rise to speak at the same time the chairman shall decide which is entitled to priority.
22. *Chairman to rise in addressing council.*—The chairman shall rise in addressing the council to discuss any question, and shall not leave the chair on such occasions.
23. *Councillor not to speak several times on same question.*—No councillor shall speak a second time on the same question, unless entitled to reply or in explanation when he has been misrepresented or misunderstood.
24. *Points of order.*—The chairman when called upon to decide on points of order or practice shall state the provision, rule, or practice which he deems applicable to the case without discussion or commenting on the same, and his decision as to order or explanation in each case shall be final.
25. *Councillors not to digress, &c.*—No councillor shall digress from the subject matter of the question under discussion, or comment upon the words used by any other councillor in a previous debate; and all imputations of improper motives and all personal reflections on councillors shall be deemed highly disorderly.
26. *Councillors to apologize for disorderly, &c., expression.*—Whenever any councillor shall make use of any expression disorderly or capable of being applied offensively to any other councillor, the councillor so offending shall be required by the chairman to withdraw the expression, and to make a satisfactory apology to the council.

27. *Councillor called to order to sit down.*—A councillor called to order shall sit down unless permitted to explain.
28. *Councillor twice offending guilty of an offence.*—Any councillor using offensive or disorderly language, and having been twice called to order or to withdraw and to apologize for such conduct and refusing to do so, shall be guilty of an offence.
29. *Strangers.*—Any person not being a councillor, who shall, having been admitted to any meeting of the council, be guilty thereof of any improper or disorderly conduct, or who shall not leave when lawfully requested by the chairman so to do, may be forthwith removed by him, and shall be deemed guilty of an offence.
30. *Councillor not attending order for call.*—Any councillor not attending in compliance with an order for a call of the whole council, without reasonable excuse to the satisfaction of the majority thereof, shall be guilty of an offence.
31. *Councillor may demand documents.*—Any councillor may of right demand the production of any of the documents of the council applying to the question under discussion.
32. *Voting.*—The council shall vote by show of hands, and any councillor present and not voting, not being disabled by law from so doing, shall be guilty of an offence.
33. *Question how declared.*—The chairman shall, in taking the sense of the council, put the question first in the affirmative, then in the negative, and the result thereof shall be recorded in the minutes.
34. *No second amendment until previous one disposed of.*—No second or subsequent amendment, whether upon an original proposition or on an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of.
35. *Effect of rejection of words in original motion.*—If any words of an original question be rejected, the insertion of other proposed words shall form the next question, whereupon any further amendment to insert other words may be moved.
36. *If amendment be negatived a second one may be moved.*—If an amendment be negatived, then a second may be moved to the question to which the first-mentioned amendment was moved, but only one amendment shall be submitted to the council for discussion at a time.
37. *Mover of motion to have right of reply.*—The mover of every original proposition, but not of any amendment, shall have a right to reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the chair; but no councillor shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question unless permission be given to explain or the attention of chair be called to a point of order.
38. *Motion for adjournment.*—No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the council; but if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration or the next on the notice paper shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment be made.
39. *Protests.*—Any councillor may protest against any resolution of the council, and notice of intention to protest shall in every case be given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution protested against; and the protest shall specify the reasons for protesting, and shall be entered three days at least before the next ordinary meeting of the council by the protesting councillor in a book to be kept for that purpose in the office of the municipal clerk, and signed by such councillor, and shall be also entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to protest shall have been given previously to the confirmation thereof; but such protest may be expunged from the minutes if declared by a majority of the council to be not in accordance with truth or in its terms disrespectful to the council.
40. *Lapsed questions.*—If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the number of the councillors present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted on motion upon notice.
41. *Lapsed order of the day may be restored.*—If a debate on any order of the day be interrupted by such insufficiency of number as aforesaid happening, such order may be restored to the notice-book for a future day on motion upon notice, and then such debate shall be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.
42. *Committees.*—Minutes of all proceedings of committees, as well as of their reports, numbered in consecutive order, shall be entered in the committee's minute-book, and, being signed by the chairman of the committee, shall be presented to the council; and the municipal clerk, when practicable, shall attend all meetings of committees.
43. *Meetings of the committee.*—The municipal clerk shall convene every committee within ten days of its first appointment, or at any other time thereafter by order of the council, or on the written order of the chairman of the committee or of any two members of the committee.
44. *Petitions.*—No petition shall be presented after the council shall have proceeded to the orders of the day.
45. *Petitions to be respectful.*—It shall be incumbent on every councillor presenting a petition to acquaint himself with the contents thereof, and to ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the council, and that the contents do not violate any bye-law or any provision hereof.
46. *Councillors to affix their names.*—Every councillor presenting a petition to the council shall write his name at the beginning thereof.
47. *Petitions to be in writing.*—Every petition shall be in writing, and not printed or lithographed, and shall contain the prayer of the petitioners at the end thereof, and be signed by at least one person on every skin or sheet on which it is written.
48. *To be signed by petitioners.*—Every petition shall be signed by the persons whose names are appended thereto by their names or marks, and by no one else, except in cases of incapacity by sickness.
49. *No letters, &c., to be attached.*—No letters, affidavits, or other documents shall be attached to any petition.
50. *Councillors confined to statement of certain facts.*—Every councillor presenting a petition to the council shall confine him-

self to a statement of the persons from whom it comes, of the number of signatures attached to it, of the material allegations contained in it, and to the reading of the prayer thereof.

51. *Appointments, &c., officers.*—No appointment to any permanent office at the disposal of the council shall take place until seven clear days' public notice shall have been given by advertisement in one or more newspapers circulating in the shire, inviting applications from qualified candidates for the same.

52. *Salaries of officers, &c.*—The salary or allowance attached to all offices and places at the disposal of the council shall in all cases be fixed before they proceed to appoint any person to fill the same, before the advertisement inviting applications as aforesaid, and shall be specified in such advertisement.

53. *No councillor, &c., to be surety for officer.*—No councillor or officer of the council, and no assessor or auditor of the municipality, shall be received as a surety for any officer appointed by the council or for any work to be done for the council.

54. *Adoption of amendment to quash motion.*—Upon the adoption of any amendment by the council, such amendment shall be held to have quashed the original motion.

55. *Councillor may require words taken down.*—Any councillor may require the secretary to take down any particular words used by a councillor immediately upon the same being uttered.

56. *Councillor may move for call of council without notice.*—It shall be competent for any councillor, without previous notice, to move a call of the whole council, for the consideration of any subject at the next or any subsequent meeting; and upon such motion being carried, seven days' notice thereof shall be given by the secretary to each councillor, by post or otherwise, of the day for which the order of the day or notice of motion for which such call is made is set down for consideration; and any councillor not in attendance when such order of the day or notice of motion comes under consideration, or not in attendance at the voting upon such question or any amendment thereof, shall be liable to a penalty of One pound, unless reasonable cause for such absence be shown to the satisfaction of the council, the fines to be applied by the council to charitable purposes.

57. *Revocation of motion.*—No resolution previously passed by the council shall be revoked or altered except in strict accordance with clause 150 of "The Local Government Act."

58. *Works to be let by tender.*—All contracts over £20 shall be made by tender, unless the council shall otherwise direct. All tenders shall be written on the council's printed forms, and shall be addressed to the president, and only opened at the time of their consideration by the council; and a preliminary cash deposit of 5 per cent. on the bulked sum shall be enclosed in and accompany each tender, which deposit shall, in the case of unsuccessful tenderers, be returned after the council meeting. All tenders not in accordance with these conditions shall be rejected as informal; the respective amounts, together with the names of the parties tendering, to be entered in every case on the minutes of the council.

59. *Penalty for non-acceptance of contract.*—Any contractor whose tender shall be accepted by the council and who fails or refuses to sign the contract within six days from the date of the notification of the acceptance of such contract shall forfeit the amount of his preliminary deposit, and be disqualified for twelve months from tendering directly or indirectly under the council.

60. *Preliminary deposit.*—The 5 per cent. preliminary deposit of any contractor whose tender shall have been accepted by the council shall be retained by the council, as security for the due fulfilment of his contract; such amount to be refunded to the contractor on production of the engineer's certificate of satisfactory completion of the works under the contract. But in the event of the non-performance of such works by the contractor, through any cause whatsoever, the council shall be entitled absolutely to forfeit such deposit as liquidated damages for breach of contract, and to retain the same for the use and benefit of the councillors and ratepayers of the shire.

61. *Progress payment.*—Advances may be made to contractors at a rate not exceeding 75 per cent. on the engineer's estimate of the value of work then done.

62. *Contractor and councillors to sign bond.*—When any tender shall have been accepted by the council, a contract bond shall be entered into, signed by the contractor, and also by the president and two other councillors, or, in the absence of the president, by the acting-president, who shall act as such at the meeting at which such tender shall have been accepted, and the contractor shall also be required to sign the plan and specification of the work for which his tender has been accepted.

63. *Delay in completion of work to be reported.*—In the event of any contractor not completing his contract within the term stipulated in the conditions thereof, the engineer shall immediately report thereon to the council.

64. *Allocation of revenue.*—All revenue accruing from rates, licenses, Government grants in aid, or otherwise, shall be, as a general rule, allocated to each riding wherein they are raised, or for whose benefit such grant is made, except in the execution of necessary works for the joint benefit of each riding.

65. *Payments by cheque only.*—All payments shall be made by cheque, and signed by three councillors, and countersigned by the secretary; and no cheque shall be given unless the account for which it is payable shall have been passed at a meeting of the council, or by a committee duly empowered so to do.

66. *Times during which shire offices are to be open.*—The shire office shall be open every day, except the days excepted by "The Local Government Act," and the days proclaimed as holidays under "The Civil Service Act," between the hours of Ten and Three, and on Saturdays from Ten to Twelve o'clock, during which hours the secretary shall attend to transact the ordinary business of the council. The surveyor shall attend during the hours of business at every meeting of the council, and at such committee meetings as he may be required.

67. *Valuers to serve notices, &c.*—The valuer or valuers appointed by the council shall visit and examine every rateable property within the shire, and after having valued such property, shall deliver or cause to be delivered to the owner or occupier thereof (or if such owner or occupier cannot be found,

the same to be left on the premises), a notice setting forth the amount at which such property is valued, together with other particulars sufficient to describe such property; and every such notice shall be signed by the valuer.

68. *Officers to furnish reports.*—The secretary and surveyor, and every other officer and servant shall, whenever called on to do so, furnish official reports to the council. The collector shall furnish detailed monthly reports to the council of the rates paid during the preceding month.

69. *Common seal.*—The secretary shall have the custody of the common seal of the corporation; and shall be empowered to affix the same to any corporate document requiring such affixture; and, also, in case of powers of attorney and other legal documents not relating to the corporation, the signatures to which require to be verified before the president by declaration; and, in any such case, the said seal shall and may be affixed by the secretary to the president's certificate accompanying the same, on the receipt of a fee of 10s. 6d. for each attestation.

70. *Collectors to make payments to treasurer.*—In all cases it shall be sufficient for the collectors to call once for any sum due on the rate-roll; and in the event of any such sum not being paid to him when he calls for it, he shall leave a notice bearing the date upon which he calls, demanding payment of such sum at the office of the council within 14 days from the date of such notice; wherein shall be stated that, in default of such payment, legal proceedings for the recovery of such sum shall be taken. Immediately on the receipt of the sum of £10 by the collectors, for rates or dog registrations, the same shall be paid to the shire treasurer.

71. *Plans, &c., to be property of council.*—The shire surveyor shall be the custodian of all plans and specifications of works executed, and hereafter to be executed, under the orders of the council; and all such plans and specifications shall be the property of the council, and the shire surveyor shall be responsible for the safe custody of the same.

72. *Suspension of rules.*—Any one or more of the rules or regulations contained in this subdivision may be suspended for a special purpose, on motion upon notice duly given, and shall not otherwise be suspended except by a unanimous vote of the council.

73. *Penalty.*—If any person shall be guilty of any wilful offence or misdemeanour, or wilful or negligent act of commission or omission, contrary to any provision contained in this subdivision, he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds.

CITY OF RICHMOND.

BYE-LAW No. 35.

A Bye-law for permitting shops of a particular class to keep open after the hours mentioned in "The Factories and Shops Act 1885."

WHEREAS by the forty-fifth section of "The Factories and Shops Act 1885," numbered 862, it is enacted that any municipal council may, if it think fit, from time to time make, alter, and repeal bye-laws in and for the municipality for *inter alia* permitting shops of any particular class (not included in the Third Schedule to the said Act) on obtaining a license to keep open after the hours in the said Act mentioned, and during such hours as shall be specified in such license, provided that a petition certified to by the municipal clerk as being signed by a majority of the shopkeepers keeping shops of such class within the municipal district, shall have been previously presented to such municipal council. And whereas the Council of the City of Richmond, which is the municipal council in and for the municipality of the said city, has had presented to it a petition from shopkeepers keeping shops of the class mentioned in the first schedule to this bye-law, which petition has been certified to by the town clerk of the said city as the municipal clerk thereof, as being, to the best of his knowledge and belief, signed by a majority of the shopkeepers keeping shops of the class mentioned therein.

And whereas the Council of the City of Richmond, which is the municipal council in and for the municipality of the said city, so thinks fit: Be it, and it is by the said municipal council hereby ordered and directed—That every shopkeeper keeping a shop of the class named in the first schedule to this bye-law, within the City of Richmond, and which is not of the classes named in the Third Schedule to "The Factories and Shops Act 1885," upon receiving license so to do from the town clerk of the said city, which license the said town clerk is hereby empowered by the said municipal council, the Council of the City of Richmond, to issue on its behalf, upon application made for the same, may keep open his said shop after the hours in the said Act mentioned, and not later than the hours mentioned in the second schedule hereto.

3. That persons employed in any shop licensed to remain open at night after the hours prescribed by "The Factories and Shops Act 1855," No. 862, in accordance with this bye-law, shall not be employed in such shops for more than eight hours in each full day and night.
