BYE-LAW No. 40.

THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS, in pursuance of the powers conferred by *The Victorian Railways Commissioners Act 1883*, do hereby make the following Bye-law, and all previous Bye-laws conflicting therewith are hereby repealed:—

CHARGES ON GOODS ARE FIXED AS FOLLOWS:—

1. Thistle Eradicator, in Casks, to be carried under Special Class A Rates and Conditions.
2. Furniture, in Vans, to be charged Third Class on Gross Weight of Van and Furniture, with a minimum of 2 tons. Returned Empty Vans, First Class, actual weight.
3. New Machinery and Cast-iron Pipes, manufactured at Sandhurst and sent to Toongabbie, to be carried at a Class lower than Classification Rates.
4. The minimum for Guano, and Artificial Manures (Colonial Manufacture), in the Agricultural Produce Class, is reduced to 3s. 9d. for distances under 67 miles, and 10 cwt. for distances over 67 miles; otherwise, Miscellaneous Class Rate, with First Class minimums.

REBATES ON GOODS FOR RIVERINA.

- (a) Goods forwarded from Melbourne, Williamstown, or Port Melbourne to Yarrawonga, and conveyed thence by River, Rail, or Teams to any Station on the Murray below the Murrumbidgee Junction, or to any Station on the Darling or Murrumbidgee Rivers or their Tributaries, or to a destination north of or intersected by an imaginary line drawn straight from Jingelic on the Murray to Gerogery on the New South Wales Line; thence to the south-east corner of Coree Station; thence in a northerly direction to the Singorambah blocks, to include in that line Coree, Yankoo, and Goolgumblah Stations; thence in a westerly direction along the south boundary of the River back-blocks to the intersection of the Murrumbidgee River at Balranald, to include Keri Keri Station, will be allowed the under-mentioned Rebates, on production of certificates, or such other proof as the Commissioners may deem sufficient, that they have been duly received at their destination.

WHEREAS by *The Discipline Act 1870* it was provided that the Governor in Council might make rules and regulations for the employment, removal, or dismissal, and for the better government of persons engaged by virtue of the said Act, and for enforcing good order and discipline among them, and otherwise carrying out the said Act, and from time to time annul, alter, or amend the same and substitute others in lieu thereof: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following addition to the Regulations for the Victorian Military Forces, that is to say:—

MILITIA AMBULANCE CORPS.

The formation of a Militia Ambulance Corps is sanctioned.

The following will be the establishment of the corps:—

One surgeon-major, or surgeon, from the fixed establishment of medical officers, who will be in command.
One sergeant-major (hospital sergeant) to the Victorian Artillery as instructor and quartermaster,
One sergeant-compounder,
Two sergeants,
Three corporals,
Thirty-two privates.

The sergeant-compounder, sergeants, corporals, and privates, shall be either volunteers from the militia specially approved or men specially enlisted for the service, and will be borne in equal proportions on the rolls of the battalions of metropolitan infantry in which they will be passed into the ranks, and with which they will perform six night drills in each half-year, all other drills being carried out under the orders of the officer commanding the corps, who will call a sufficient number of half-day parades and night drills to enable full pay, as laid down in the regulations, to be earned.

During encampments, or when called out for active service, non-commissioned officers and men will receive an allowance of Two shillings and sixpence per diem, in addition to the pay of the rank.

The non-commissioned officers will be supernumerary of their rank in their respective battalions, but will be borne on the establishment as privates.

The officer commanding the corps will furnish half-yearly, that is to say, on the 1st of July and 1st of January in each year, a return showing the drills performed by each member to the officer commanding his battalion, to enable him to draw pay, and such returns will be attached as vouchers to the pay lists, on which every non-commissioned officer and man belonging to the corps will be distinguished by the letters A.C. after his name.

The strength of the corps may be augmented on occasion of active service or encampments by ten (10) privates from each of the country battalions, who have undergone a course of training and are certified by the medical officer of their respective corps to be efficient.

And the Honorable James Lorimer, Her Majesty's Minister of Defence for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

No. 506, secs. 19-20) it was enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might make Orders exercising certain powers therein set forth, amongst others to sever any portion of Victoria forming part of a municipal district from such municipal district, and annex the same to any other municipal district with which the portion so severed forms one continuous area, and from time to time make any appointment of property, rights, and liabilities, and give any directions as to any matters and things that might be necessary to do justice as between the municipalities concerned: And it was further enacted that, where, in consequence of the exercise of any of the powers contained in the above in part recited section, any rights, liabilities, or matters require to be adjusted, the Governor in Council might by any Order settle and adjust the same: And whereas the Governor in Council, by an Order made on the twenty-sixth day of May 1885, severed a certain area from the Shire of Swan Hill, and constituted a separate municipality under the name of the Shire of Gordon, and in consequence of such severance it has become necessary to adjust the

accounts between the said shires: And whereas such adjustment has been made, and the matters have been duly considered: Now therefore I, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby order and direct the Council of the said Shire of Swan Hill to pay to the said Council of the Shire of Gordon the sum of Three thousand six hundred and thirty-two pounds thirteen shillings and five pence sterling in full settlement of all demands as and between the said Shires of Swan Hill and Gordon consequent upon making the Order of the twenty-sixth day of May 1885 aforesaid.

FORAGE AND TRAVELLING EXPENSES TO POLICE MAGISTRATES, ETC.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has rescinded, from the 30th June last, the Order, bearing date the 24th February 1885, on the subject of allowances for Forage and Travelling Expenses to Police Magistrates when travelling on duty, and has substituted in lieu thereof the Allowances and Regulations relating thereto following, to take effect from and inclusive of 1st July 1886, that is to say:—

SCHEDULE OF ALLOWANCES FOR FORAGE AND TRAVELLING EXPENSES TO POLICE MAGISTRATES, WARDENS, AND CORONERS OF VICTORIA WHEN TRAVELLING ON DUTY.

Clause 1.—Police Magistrates shall be paid the actual cost of the necessary means of conveyance for the performance of their official duties on accounts supported by vouchers, or they may be allowed commuted allowances in lieu of the whole or part of such cost, to be fixed by the Minister, who shall also have power to increase or reduce such allowances at any time.

Clause 2.—Police Magistrates shall, in addition to either of the foregoing allowances, be entitled to the following allowances for personal expenses and livery of horses, or the Minister may fix a commuted allowance in lieu thereof, and may increase or reduce such commuted allowance at any time:—

Clause 3.—A Relieving Police Magistrate or any other Police Magistrate who is required to perform temporarily, in addition to his own duties, either those of a Police Magistrate or those of a Licensing Magistrate, outside his own district, shall, in addition to the foregoing, be paid a relieving allowance of ten shillings for each full day during which such relieving or other Police Magistrate is doing relieving duty or acting as Licensing Magistrate in, or in charge of, or in travelling to and from the district or districts other than his own. Such daily allowance shall not be paid for any days for which leave of absence may be granted nor for any other days which the Minister may think proper to except, nor for any relieving duty performed in a Melbourne or suburban district, unless sanctioned by the Minister. A Police Magistrate, not being a permanent Relieving Police Magistrate, when acting temporarily or as Licensing Magistrate out of his district, and who has a commuted allowance for his own district under clause one, shall not, except by sanction of the Minister, be paid in addition thereto either the actual cost of conveyance or a commuted allowance for the district in which he acts temporarily, unless the travelling by horse or conveyance, &c., in his own district is up to the standard on which the commuted allowance for such district was based.

Clause 4.—A Police Magistrate, having a commuted allowance under clause one, who keeps a horse or horses of his own for the performance of his duties, and is absent from duty either on leave or through illness for a period over a fortnight, but not exceeding a month, shall be paid for such period at the rate of half his commuted allowance only. A Police Magistrate, having a commuted allowance under clauses one and two, who keeps a horse or horses of his own for the performance of his duties, and is so absent, shall be paid at the rate of one-half of that part of his commuted allowance which is left after deducting the portion representing the personal and livery allowances. Except under special circumstances, and upon the approval of the Minister, no commuted allowance shall be paid for any period exceeding one month, nor shall any such allowance be paid to a Police Magistrate who has not kept a horse or horses during any period of absence.

NOTES.

All questions as to the interpretation and intention of these regulations shall be decided by the Minister.

These regulations shall not apply to a Police Magistrate when travelling on duty for any other Department, nor to a Police Magistrate of another colony acting within Victoria, nor to any Coroner of Victoria who is not also a Police Magistrate.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Fisheries Act 1873* it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council might, from time to time, by proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, close any natural oyster bed, and during the duration of such proclamation it shall not be lawful for any person to take any oysters or oyster brood from such bed: And whereas it is deemed expedient to close the natural oyster beds at Western Port: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby close the natural oyster beds at Western Port, and during the duration of this proclamation render it illegal for any person to take any oysters or oyster brood from the beds mentioned.

The flagstaff near the lighthouse of the second order at Java's fourth point in Sunda Strait will before long act as a Semaphore. The shipping tidings received from this Semaphore will be published by the care of the Government in the post and telegraph office at Batavia.

A post and telegraph office will also be erected near the lighthouse for the use of the shipping in Sunda Strait, and will bear the name of post and telegraph office at Anjer.

A master attendant will be placed there for giving necessary information and assistance to vessels.

Measures will be taken that fresh water can be supplied without cost from a reservoir near the Bodjong River, in the immediate neighbourhood of the lighthouse.

The limits of the roads of Anjer will be fixed accordingly to the new place.

As soon as the Semaphore of Anjer is in service, that on the island Great Merak will be withdrawn; the post and telegraph office at New Anjer, near Great Merak, being intended to be demolished.

The submarine cable from Java to Sumatra will be taken up from the island Dwars in den Weg till the Java coast, and landed again at Anjer.

The telegraph buoys will be accordingly taken away and buoys put on the cable where it comes ashore at Anjer.

The precise date that the described measure will be accomplished shall be duly made known so far as necessary; regulations about anchoring near the new laid cable shall be published.

THE Governor in Council has, in accordance with the provisions contained in the 127th section of *The Transfer of Land Statute*, consented to the Regulations hereinafter set forth respecting the description and delineation of land in a certificate of title.

By virtue and in pursuance of *The Transfer of Land Statute*, I, Edward de Verdon, Esquire, the Commissioner of Titles, with the consent of the Governor in Council, do hereby make the Regulations hereinafter set forth, respecting the description and delineation of land in a certificate of title.

REGULATIONS.

1. That on an application to bring land under *The Transfer of Land Statute* or for an amended certificate—

(a) The land included in the certificate to be issued shall, unless the Commissioner of Titles otherwise direct, be described in the map thereon by its abutments in addition to dimensions.

(b) Where the land consists of a subdivisional allotment or allotments of land subdivided under the 134th section of the Statute, and of which subdivision a map or plan has been deposited with the Registrar under that section, the adjoining subdivisional allotments with their subdivisional numbers shall, unless the Commissioner of Titles otherwise direct, be shown on the map in the margin of the certificate, as abutments of the land comprised therein; and the allotment or allotments constituting the said land shall be described in the body of the certificate by their subdivisional number or numbers, together with a reference to the deposited plan by its registered number.

(c) No tie-line or connection distance between the land comprised in any such certificate and any point outside such land shall, unless the Commissioner of Titles so direct, be shown on the map on such certificate, notwithstanding that, in the case of an amending certificate, such tie-line or connection distance is shown on the certificate before amendment.

2. That upon any tie-line or connection distance shown on any certificate already or hereafter issued being proved to the satisfaction of the Commissioner of Titles to be erroneous, he shall order the same to be struck out; and no tie-line or connection distance shall be substituted therefor unless the Commissioner of Titles so direct.

3. That any tie-line or connection distance shown on any certificate hereafter issued or amended shall be from and to such points as the Commissioner of Titles shall direct or approve of.

4. That upon any tie-line or connection distance being struck out by order of the Commissioner of Titles, the same shall be initialed by the Registrar of Titles, and the number of the order written in the margin.

5. All alterations (if any) necessary to be made in the form of certificate given in the Third schedule to the Statute, to give effect to the above Regulations or any of them, are hereby authorised to be made for that purpose.

NOTICE TO APPLICANTS AND CERTIFICATE HOLDERS.

THE Commissioner of Titles has made the following regulation for observance in the Office of Titles.

I, EDWARD DE VERDON, Esquire, Commissioner of Titles, in exercise of the powers vested in me by the *Transfer of Land Statute*, do hereby make the regulation hereinafter set forth:—

REGULATION.

From and after the date hereof, until further order of the Commissioner of Titles, no land shall be brought under the operation of the *Transfer of Land Statute*, or Certificate of Title be amended as to the description of land therein, except on the basis of a survey and plan made for the purpose, to be furnished at the cost of the applicant or registered proprietor, unless the Commissioner of Titles expressly otherwise direct; and such plan shall, in addition to dimensions, show particulars of the actual boundaries, as defined on the ground by bound-marks or improvements (if any), together with the abutments and adjoining properties, with the names of the owners and occupiers thereof when ascertainable with reasonable diligence.

CIRCULAR.

THE attention of Land-owners, and of Surveyors practising under the *Transfer of Land Statute*, is directed to the following rules and instructions with regard to surveys and plans required by the Office of Titles:—

APPLICATIONS.

1. Every application to bring land under the Act must be accompanied by a plan of the land made from an actual survey

made for the purpose of the application, showing the nature of the boundaries as marked on the ground or defined by buildings, fences, or other improvements at the date of the application. Improvements of whatever nature on the boundaries, or abutting or adjacent on either side, by which the position of the recognised boundaries are indicated on the ground, must be accurately shown on the plan. The names and addresses of owners, and the names of occupiers of adjoining lands, must also be given in all cases where obtainable; and, in the absence of the original survey marks or buildings or other improvements defining the boundaries, such plan will not be considered complete unless and until it shows, whenever practicable, that there is or is not sufficient land left to supply the quantity belonging to the adjoining owners under the most liberal interpretation of their rights.

2. If the application refers to part of an original grant, the survey shall embrace, in addition to the part being dealt with, so much of the boundaries of the original grant as may be necessary to define the position of such part in reference to such boundaries.

3. If several adjoining grants or certificates are to be consolidated in one certificate of title, the survey may be limited to the external boundaries of the property included.

4. If, on the contrary, a large property is to be brought under the Act in more than one certificate of title, the plan must show the nature of the external boundaries of the land to be comprised in each certificate.

TRANSFERS.

5. Subdivision plans to be lodged under the 134th section of the *Transfer of Land Statute* must be prepared in accordance with the Regulations and Instructions for the guidance of Surveyors, issued by the Department of Lands and Survey, 1st January 1886, or any subsequent modification thereof, and—

a. Should be plotted to scales of tens, viz., 10, 20, 30, 40, &c.; the scale may be feet and inches or links, but both are not to be used on the same plan.

b. No land outside of the existing certificate, grant, or document of title is to be included in any subdivision thereof. Surveyors, when employed to make a subdivision of any land, are particularly requested to make themselves acquainted with the certificates or grants of the owners, and to adhere strictly to this rule. If the documents of title do not accord with the boundaries as found on the ground, and the case is one where such boundaries should prevail, the documents of title should be brought into harmony therewith before the subdivision is proceeded with.

c. The widths of all roads, lanes, or rights-of-way are to be inserted in figures.

d. The bearings, lengths of lines, and area of each allotment to be given.

e. The allotments are to be numbered consecutively, and, if in sections, the numbers of the sections must also be given. There must be no two allotments in any one section of the same number.

f. All buildings, fences, or other improvements abutting on or immediately adjacent to the land subdivided must be shown.

g. If a part only of the land in a certificate or grant is subdivided, then such part must be connected by measurement with the nearest corner of the land contained in such certificate.

h. The title of the plan must be in accordance with clause 16.

AMENDMENT OF TITLES.

6. Every application to amend the definition of a parcel in a certificate of title, either as regards its position or dimensions, must be accompanied by a plan similar to that required for bringing land under the Act.

7. Attention is directed generally to the Regulations and Instructions for the guidance of Surveyors under the *Transfer of Land Statute*, issued by the Lands and Survey Department, 1st January 1886, and especially to clauses 2 and 25.

8. The above instructions are in all cases subject to any special regulations made by the Commissioner of Titles under the provisions of the *Transfer of Land Statute Amendment Act No. 87* in respect of any particular survey.

SHEEP IMPORTED FOR SLAUGHTER INTO NEW SOUTH WALES FROM VICTORIA.

REGULATIONS.

THE following copy of a Proclamation published in the New South Wales Government Gazette of 13th July 1886 is published for general information.

WHEREAS by section 29 of an Act passed in the forty-first year of the reign of Her present Majesty intituled *The Diseases in Sheep Acts Amendment Act of 1878* it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time by Proclamation in the *Gazette* suspend, for any period not exceeding six months, such of the provisions of the *Sheep Act of 1866* relating to the introduction of imported sheep from the neighbouring colonies as will admit of fat sheep arriving by sea, from any colony in which disease is not known or suspected to exist, being taken direct to the abattoirs on Glebe Island, Fort Jackson, for slaughter, under such regulations as may be set forth in the said Proclamation. And whereas the disease called scab in sheep is not known or suspected to exist in the colony of Victoria: Now, therefore, I, Charles Robert Baron Carrington, the Governor aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby suspend, to the extent and for the purpose aforesaid, the provisions of sections 52, 53, and 54 of *The Diseases in Sheep Act of 1866* with respect to fat sheep imported from the said colony of Victoria for the further period of six months from the fourth instant; and I do hereby declare and set forth the following regulations as those under which such sheep may be so imported and landed for slaughter as aforesaid, namely:—

1st. The owner of such sheep shall give Inspector for the port immediate notice of their arrival, and shall produce to him a certificate from the Inspector of the port from which such sheep were shipped, setting forth that he had examined such sheep, and that to the best of his knowledge and belief they were the produce of the colony from which they were shipped, and were free from disease and infection.

2nd. Such sheep shall not be allowed to leave the vessel by which they arrive until they have been examined by the Inspector.

3rd. Upon being inspected and found free from infection, such sheep shall be taken direct to the abattoirs on Glebe Island, and there delivered into the charge of the Inspector of Slaughter-houses to be slaughtered under his supervision.

4th. Any person failing to comply with or aiding or being concerned in the breach of any of the provisions of these regulations shall incur a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every sheep with respect to which any such penalty is incurred.

Given under my hand and seal, at Government House, Sydney, this eighth day of July in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, and in the fiftieth year of Her Majesty's reign.

SHIRE OF HAMPDEN.

BYE-LAWS NOS. 5, 6, AND 7.

Bye-laws of the Shire of Hampden, made under the 213th section of "The Local Government Act 1874," and numbered 5, 6, and 7.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by "The Local Government Act 1874," the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Hampden order as follows:—

No. 5.—*Regulations of Proceedings of Council Officers, &c.*
1st. In all cases not herein provided for resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of Parliament, which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the council.

2nd. At every meeting of the council the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon, except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings, and the said minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting shall then be signed, as by this Act required.

3rd. After the signing of the minutes as aforesaid, the order of business of an ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable; but, for the greater convenience of the council at any particular meeting thereof, it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

I.—Reading of copies of letters sent by the authority of the council.

II.—Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.

III.—Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.

IV.—Presentation of minutes or reports of committees.

V.—Payments.

VI.—Ordinary business.

VII.—Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings.

VIII.—Extraordinary business, and new rules and regulations.

IX.—Other motions of which previous notice has been given.

X.—Notices of motion.

And the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

4th. Whenever a division shall be demanded by any councillor, or when the chairman shall take the sense of the council, the councillors voting in the affirmative shall first hold up their hands, and then those voting in the negative shall hold up their hands, and the result be declared by the chairman and recorded on the minutes.

5th. All notices of motion shall be dated and numbered, shall be read aloud, and given by the intending mover to the municipal clerk at the close of the meeting of the council; and such clerk shall enter the same in the notice of motion book in the order in which they may be received.

6th. No councillor shall make any motion initiating a subject for discussion but in pursuance of notice given, as prescribed in the last preceding clause.

7th. No motion, except that for receiving the same, shall, unless under most urgent circumstances, be made on any petition, memorial, or other like application, until the next

ordinary meeting of the council after that at which it has been presented.

8th. Except by leave of the council, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received, and recorded by the municipal clerk in the notice of motion book, and if not so moved or postponed shall be struck out.

9th. No motion entered in the notice of motion book shall be proceeded with in the absence of the councillor who gave notice of the same, unless some other councillor producing written authority from him to that effect.

10th. Any councillor desirous of making a motion or amendment, or taking part in discussion thereon, shall rise and address the chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the councillor calling to order shall have been heard thereon and the question of order disposed of, when the councillor in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject.

11th. Any councillor desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the council thereon.

12th. No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without leave of the council.

13th. No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the council unless it be seconded, but, at the request of the mover, it shall be recorded in the minutes.

14th. A councillor moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but a councillor merely seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

15th. The mover of every original motion, but not of any amendment, shall have a right to reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the chair. No councillor shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question unless entitled to reply, or permission be given to explain, or the attention of the chairman be called to a point of order.

16th. The councillors, in meeting of council, shall designate each other by their official titles—namely, that of president, chairman, or councillor, as the case may require.

17th. If two or more councillors rise to speak at the same time the chairman shall decide which is entitled to priority.

18th. The chairman shall rise in addressing the council to discuss any question, but shall not leave the chair on such occasions.

19th. The chairman, when called upon to decide on points of order or practice, shall state the provision, rule or practice, which he deems applicable to the case, without discussing or commenting on the same, and his decision as to order or explanation in such case shall be final.

20th. No councillor shall digress from the subject-matter of the question under discussion, or comment upon the words used by any other councillor in a previous debate, and all imputations of improper motives and all personal reflections on councillors shall be deemed highly disorderly.

21st. Whenever any councillor shall make use of any expression disorderly or capable of being applied offensively to any other councillor, the councillor so offending shall be required by the chairman to withdraw the expression, and to make a satisfactory apology to the council.

22nd. Any councillor called to order shall sit down, unless permitted to explain, or until entitled to proceed in terms of Rule 12.

23rd. Any councillor using offensive or disorderly language, and having been twice called to order, or to withdraw and to apologize for such conduct, and refusing to do so shall be guilty of an offence.

24th. Any person not being a councillor who shall, having been admitted to any meeting of the council, be guilty thereof of any improper or disorderly conduct, or who shall not leave when lawfully requested by the chairman, so to do may be forthwith removed by him, and shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

25th. It shall be competent for any councillor without previous notice to move for a call of the whole council for the consideration of any subject at the next or any subsequent meeting, and, upon such motion being carried, due notice thereof, and of the date of meeting, shall be given by the secretary to each councillor; and any councillor not attending in compliance with such an order for a call of the whole council without reasonable excuse to the satisfaction of the majority thereof shall be guilty of an offence.

26th. Any councillor may of right demand the production of the documents of the council applying to the question under discussion.

27th. The council shall vote by show of hands, and any councillor present and not voting, not being disabled by law from so doing, shall be guilty of an offence.

28th. At every meeting of the council all motions or amendments shall be committed to writing, shall bear the names of their mover and seconder, and shall be delivered to the chairman immediately on their being moved and seconded. They shall be entered in the minute book, and, in case of a division, the names of councillors voting *pro* and *con* shall be recorded upon them.

29th. No second or subsequent amendment, whether upon an original motion or on an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of.

30th. If any words of an original question be rejected, the insertion of other proposed words shall form the next question, whereupon any further amendment to insert other words may be moved.

31st. If an amendment be negatived then a second may be moved to the question to which the first-mentioned amendment was moved, but only one amendment shall be submitted to the council for discussion at a time.

32nd. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the council, but if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice-paper, shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment be made.

33rd. Any councillor may protest against any resolution of the council by delivering his protest in writing to the secretary, duly signed, at the meeting of the council at which such resolution is passed, and the protest shall state the reasons for protesting, and

the secretary shall enter the same in the minute book; but such protest may be expunged from the minutes if declared by a majority of the council to be not in accordance with truth or in its terms to be disrespectful to the council.

34th. If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the want of a quorum for the transaction of business, such debate may be resumed at next meeting at the point where it was so interrupted.

35th. Minutes of all proceedings of committees, as well as of their reports, shall be entered in the committee's minute book, and, being signed by the chairman of the committee, shall be presented to the council; and the municipal clerk when practicable shall attend all meetings of committees.

36th. The resolution of the council appointing committees shall fix a quorum and name a convener.

37th. It shall be incumbent on every councillor presenting a petition to acquaint himself with the contents thereof, and to ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the council, and that the contents do not violate any bye-law or any provision of the statute, and the councillor presenting such petition shall endorse his name thereon.

38th. Every petition shall be in writing, and not printed or lithographed, and shall contain the prayer of the petition at the end thereof, and be signed by at least one person on every skin or sheet on which it is written.

39th. Every petition shall be signed by the persons whose names are appended thereto by their names or marks, and by no one else.

40th. Every councillor presenting a petition to the council shall confine himself to a statement of the persons from whom it comes, of the number of signatures attached to it, and to the reading thereof.

41st. No appointment to any permanent office at the disposal of the council when the salary exceeds Twenty pounds per annum shall take place until seven days' public notice shall have been given, by advertisement by one or more newspapers circulating in the shire, inviting applications from qualified candidates for the same.

42nd. No councillor or officers of the council, and no assessor or auditor of the municipality, shall be received as a surety for any officer appointed by the council, or for any work to be done for the council.

43rd. In all cases of security being given for the faithful performance of any duty or contract, the expense of preparing such security shall be borne by the person providing the same.

44th. All plans and specifications for any public works shall be prepared at least six days prior to the same being considered and ordered upon, and be open for inspection by any ratepayer during that time.

45th. The common seal of the municipality shall be kept in a box having two locks, of one of which locks each councillor shall have a key, and of the other of which locks the key shall be kept by the municipal clerk, and the corporate seal shall not be affixed to any document unless the chairman of the municipality and one other member of the council, or in the absence of such chairman, unless two councillors be present, and such councillors shall sign or initial the document sealed.

46th. Any one or more of the rules or regulations contained in this subdivision may be suspended for a special purpose on motion upon notice only given, and shall not otherwise be suspended except by a unanimous vote of the council.

47th. If any person shall be guilty of any wilful offence or misfeasance, or wilful or negligent act, or commission or omission contrary to any provision contained in this subdivision, he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds.

48th. All bye-laws heretofore made for regulating the proceedings of the council are hereby repealed.

No. 6.—To prevent the damaging of trees within the shire.

If any person shall wilfully and without the authority of the council cut, break, bark, root up, or otherwise destroy or damage the whole or any part of any tree, sapling, shrub, or underwood growing in or upon any street, road, or place under the management of the council, although the injury done shall not be to the amount of One shilling, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

No. 7.—To compel the carrying of lights on carriages and carts.

1st. The owner of every hackney carriage or stage carriage used in plying for hire or passengers, and of every private vehicle, and velocipede travelling or being driven within the shire of Hampden after sunset and before sunrise shall cause the same to be provided with proper carriage lights, and the driver or conductor of such carriage shall keep the same properly lighted while such carriage shall be used; and every owner or driver offending against this section shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Forty shillings.

2nd. The driver of every cart which shall, during the hours after sunset and before sunrise of the following day, be in any street or public place shall keep a light attached to or suspended from the off or right side of such cart, so as to be plainly visible to the driver of any carriage proceeding along or through such street or place in a contrary direction to that in which such first-mentioned cart shall be directed, and in the case of a night-cart only such light shall be such and be so disposed as to appear white in front and red at the outer side; and every driver who

shall fail to comply with this section shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Forty shillings.

BYE-LAW No. 13, AS TO DAIRIES, DAIRY CATTLE, AND MILK.

THE Local Board of Health in and for the City of Collingwood, in the colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in "The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883," and every other power enabling the said local board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said local board, doth hereby make the following bye-law, being Bye-law No. 13 of the said Local Board of Health, that is to say:—

1. All former bye-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed.

2. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This bye-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the City of Collingwood.

Registration of Cowkeepers, Dairy-men, and Purveyors of Milk.

4. Every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall, on or before the first day of October in every year, register himself with the Local Board of Health in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the Secretary of the Local Board of Health an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall with every such application pay a fee of Five shillings:—

5. Upon receipt of every such application and fee, the Secretary for the Local Board of Health shall indorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received, and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

6. All paddocks, grounds, lands, and enclosures used as grazing ground for dairy cattle shall, whenever necessary, be inspected by any member or officer of the said local board or by any person authorized, in writing, by the chairman or secretary of the said local board; and if on inspection such paddocks, grounds, or enclosures, or any one of them, are or is likely, in the opinion of the officer or person so inspecting, to be prejudicial to health, by affecting the milk or otherwise, the said local board may, by an order in writing signed by the secretary, and served personally or left at the dwelling-house of the registered person, or in the case of an unregistered person, served personally or left at his dwelling-place or posted upon the land, prohibit the use of the same for the purpose of feeding dairy cattle, either absolutely or for any time named in such order. All cattle in dairies shall also be similarly inspected by a veterinary surgeon or other competent person, and any cows found to be diseased, or which from poverty or weakness are, in the opinion of the inspector, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, shall be forthwith removed from such dairy if ordered by such inspector or other officer as aforesaid. And any such order as aforesaid the said local board may revoke, but upon every fresh inspection a similar order may from time to time be made.

7. All houses, dairies, cowsheds, milk stores, milk shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated; and the drainage of all such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not.

8. All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows shall be regularly swept, and be kept perfectly

clean, and shall within twenty-four hours of any order to such effect from the health officer or inspector of nuisances be fumigated, disinfected, or linewashed, as may be in any such order so directed.

9. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily.

10. If any person, or any member of the family of any person, registered as aforesaid, or not so registered but employed as a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor or member of the family of any visitor to any such person, shall be attacked by typhoid fever or any dangerous infectious disease, the occupier of the house in which such person shall be, or (if he be the person attacked) his wife or other person in charge, shall immediately give notice thereof to the local board or officer of health, or to the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the Local Board of Health, and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said local board or the officer of health, by order served as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of any such cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, until danger, in the opinion of such local board or officer of health, no longer exists. And in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering, or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering, to milk cows or to handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business. Nor, if the person suffering, shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until, in either case, all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk or of its contamination has ceased.

11. If at any time disease exists in the dairy or among the cows or cattle in any cowshed or dairy or in the herds of any cowkeeper, dairyman, vendor or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the local board, officer of health, or nearest member of the police force; and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.

12. No cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep, or permit or suffer to be kept, any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking-yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.

13. In the interpretation of this bye-law words imputing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural, and the plural the singular, and the word "person" shall include a corporation.

14. Every person guilty of any breach of this bye-law, or any of its provisions, shall be liable, in the discretion of the convicting justices, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings, or in the like discretion to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings, for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

The foregoing bye-law was duly made, ordered, and passed by the Local Board of Health (being the Municipal Council) in and for the City of Collingwood, this sixteenth day of June, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-six.

SHIRE OF SEYMOUR.

BYE-LAW No. 2.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in "The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883," and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, the Local Board of Health for the Shire of Seymour, being the Municipal Council thereof, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within its jurisdiction, doth hereby make the bye-law following, that is to say:—

1. *Interpretation of terms.*—In the construction and for the purpose of this bye-law the following terms shall, if not inconsistent with the context or subject-matter, have the respective meanings hereby assigned to them:—

"House" shall mean and include dwellings of any kind, schools, hotels, licensed public-houses, factories, work-shops, common or other lodging-houses, or other buildings or premises.

"Cesspool" shall mean any receptacle for night-soil, or for noxious or offensive matter below or above the ground.

"Street" shall mean and include any highway, and any public bridge, and any lane, road, footway, square, court, alley, or passage, whether a thoroughfare or not.

2. *Refuse to be kept so as not to be a nuisance.*—Every occupier or person having the management or control of any house or premises shall cause the same to be kept in such a state as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

3. *Removal of refuse from houses.*—Every occupier of a house or premises shall remove therefrom all dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, or other such refuse-matter produced or accumulated thereon once every week, and in case of default of such occupier the Local Board of Health may remove the same.

4. *Receptacles for house-refuse.*—Every occupier of a house or premises shall provide and keep thereon a box, or some other covered receptacle, for the temporary deposit of house-refuse, which box or receptacle shall be of such dimensions as the same may, with the contents thereof, when full, be readily and con-

veniently movable by one man; or so many such boxes or receptacles as may be necessary to contain all the house-refuse produced or accumulated on such premises during one week, and shall cause all house-refuse to be deposited as soon as conveniently may be in some such box or receptacle.

5. *Removal of refuse from places where animals are kept.*—Every occupier of land, on which is erected any stable, shed, sty, yard, or other place for the keeping of animals, shall from time to time remove from such premises all dung, soil, or other manure produced or accumulated thereon as often as the same shall amount to two cubic yards, or once at least every week, and in case of the default of such occupier the Local Board of Health may remove the same.

6. *Power to use refuse as manure.*—Nothing hereinbefore contained shall be taken to prevent the occupier of any premises from causing any dung, soil, or other refuse matter produced or accumulated on any premises to be at any time removed or to be used as manure on any garden or land contiguous to such premises as manure so that the same be not so removed, kept, or used to contravene any bye-law of the Local Board of Health, or so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

7. *Removal of refuse from places where noxious or offensive trades are carried on.*—Every occupier and every person having the management or control of premises used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, or manufactory whatsoever shall cause all rubbish, filth, offal, soil, or other offensive matters, and all waste products of such manufacture from which effluvia may arise to be removed from such premises once at least in every forty-eight hours, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and so that no noxious or offensive effluvia arise therefrom; and if any such occupier or other such person shall neglect or fail to have removed any such offensive matter or waste products as aforesaid, the same may be removed by the Local Board of Health.

8. *Removal of blood from places where animals are slaughtered.*—Every occupier, licensee, or person having the management or control of an abattoir, slaughter-house, or place where any cattle or other animals are killed, shall cause all the blood from the animals killed therein, as soon as conveniently may be, to be collected in a fit receptacle to be provided for that purpose, and to be effectually deodorized by mixing therewith commercial sulphate of iron or chloride of lime in the proportion of one pound to the gallon, or some other efficient deodorizer, sufficient effectually to deodorize the same, and to be removed from the premises within forty-eight hours after such blood is shed.

9. *Removal of offal.*—Every occupier of any premises on which may be any offal shall forthwith effectually deodorize the same, and remove the same from the premises within twenty-four hours.

10. *Construction of privies.*—No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any privy except in the form of an earth-closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor whereof is at no point less than three inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and every such building shall be constructed with proper openings or flues to provide sufficient means of ventilation, and shall be provided with a suitable pan or movable receptacle for night-soil, the contents whereof does not exceed five cubic feet, and with the requisite apparatus for the application of dry earth or some other deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan or receptacle and the contents thereof, and emptying and cleansing the same. Every privy attached to any school, hotel, licensed public-house, factory, work-room, or common lodging-house, and every public privy, shall be flagged or paved with some non-absorbent material having a fall or inclination towards the door or other opening of at least half-an-inch to the foot.

11. *Supply of deodorizing material to earth-closets.*—Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall cause to be kept in every earth-closet belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in any pan or other receptacle in such earth-closet to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan or other receptacle.

12. *Emptying receptacles for night-soil.*—Every occupier and every person having the management and control of any premises once at least in every week shall empty or cleanse, or cause to be emptied or cleansed, every earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil on or belonging to such premises.

13. *Removal of night-soil to be by properly-constructed conveyances.*—No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying, any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, except by means of a cart, carriage, or means of conveyance properly constructed, and furnished with a sufficient covering so as to prevent the escape of the contents or any portion thereof, or of effluvia therefrom.

14. *Hours within which night-soil may be removed.*—No person shall empty, assist in emptying, or cause or permit to be emptied, any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, except between the hours of ten p.m. and five a.m., or until the contents thereof have been properly deodorized, and every person emptying, or causing to be emptied, any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, shall cause the night-soil taken therefrom to be removed as soon as the same is emptied.

15. *Construction of cesspools.*—Every cesspool shall be furnished with a water-tight cover or roof, and every cesspool formed or made below the surface of the ground shall be constructed with water-tight walls or sides which project on all sides at least six inches above the ground.

16. *Emptying of cesspools.*—Every occupier of premises, and every person having the management or control of premises, on which there shall be any cesspool shall cause the same to be emptied once at least in every week.

17. *Time within which cesspools may be emptied.*—No person shall empty, or assist in emptying, or cause or permit to be

emptied, any cesspool or place for the deposit of offal, blood, or other refuse and offensive matter, except between the hours of ten p.m. and five a.m., or until such contents have been properly deodorized, and every person emptying or causing to be emptied any such cesspool or place shall cause the night-soil taken therefrom to be removed so soon as the same is emptied.

18. *Conveyances by which cesspools may be emptied.*—No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying, any cesspool or place for the deposit of blood or other refuse or offensive matter, except by means of a cart, carriage, or other conveyance properly constructed, and furnished with sufficient covering so as to prevent the escape of the contents, or any portion thereof, or of any effluvia therefrom.

19. *Disposal of refuse and offensive matter.*—No person shall place or deposit any dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, or soil, or any night-soil or other offensive matter, in any place so as to be a nuisance to any person or injurious to health.

20. *Night-soil, &c., removed from any earth-closet, &c., and deposited anywhere, to be covered with earth.*—Every person placing or depositing, or causing or suffering to be placed or deposited, or assisting in placing or depositing, on any land, whether by way of manure or otherwise, any night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter removed from any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or other place of deposit, shall immediately on deposit thereof cover the same, or cause the same to be covered, with a layer of earth not less than six inches in thickness.

21. *Earth-closets, &c., not to be emptied into drains or sewers.*—No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying, any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter into any drain or sewer, or so that the contents thereof may find its way, or be likely to find its way, into any drain or sewer.

22. *Prevention of pollution of water.*—No person shall place, assist in placing, or cause or permit to be placed, in or so that the same may be likely to find its way into any water used by or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, any matter or thing likely to endanger the health of any person using such water or drink or milk or other produce of such dairy.

23. *Cesspools not to be emptied into water used for drinking or domestic purposes.*—No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying, any cesspool or place for the deposit of offal, blood, or other refuse matter into any water supplied used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, or so that the contents or any portion of the contents thereof may find its way or be likely to find its way into any such water.

24. *Every accumulation or deposit of offensive matter so situated as to find its way or be likely to find its way into any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purpose, or likely to be used in any dairy, shall be deodorized and removed by the owner of the property upon which such accumulation or deposit is situated within one week of notice given by the Local Board or by one of its officers.*

25. *Keeping of animals.*—No person shall keep any animal of any kind so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

26. *Animals not to be so kept as to pollute water.*—No person shall keep any animal in such a manner as to pollute any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, so as to endanger the health of any person using such water or drink or milk or other produce of such dairy.

27. *Supply of water to slaughtering-houses.*—Every occupier or licensee or person having the management or control of any slaughter-house or abattoir shall cause the same to be supplied with a sufficient quantity of water for all purposes.

28. *Drainage of new buildings.*—Every person erecting or causing to be erected any new building shall cause the foundations thereof, and the ground over which such building is to be erected, to be rendered dry, sound, and well drained, so that no water soakage or damp shall lodge there.

29. *Drainage of existing buildings.*—Every owner of a building shall cause the same to be provided with proper and sufficient drains, so constructed as to prevent any nuisance arising therefrom, and to secure the healthfulness of the inmates of such building; and every tenant of a building under a lease of which fourteen years or upwards is unexpired shall be deemed an owner within the meaning of this section.

30. *Registration of cowkeepers, dairymen, and purveyors of milk.*—Every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall, on or before the first day of October in every year, register himself with the Local Board of Health in the manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the secretary for the Local Board of Health an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall with every such application pay a fee of Ten shillings.

33. *Dairymen, &c., to report disease to health officer.*—Every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, and every person having the management of any such trade, shall forthwith report in writing to the health officer the occurrence of any disease in any of his milk cows, or of any contagious or infectious disease in man or animal upon the premises upon which such trade is carried on.

34. *Bye-law Number One, as made by the Local Board of Health for the Shire of Seymour and dated the eighth day of July 1875, is hereby repealed.*

35. *Extent of application of bye-law.*—This bye-law No. 2, and numbered by sections one to thirty-six, shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the Shire of Seymour, and shall come into operation after its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

36. *Penalties.*—If any person commit a breach of any of the foregoing sections of this bye-law, he shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued. Provided the justices before whom any penalty imposed hereby is sought to be recovered may order the whole or part only (not being less than Five shillings) of such penalty to be paid. And every person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the foregoing penalty, notwithstanding that the Local Board of Health may be empowered by these bye-laws or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such Local Board of Health have or have not taken advantage of such powers.

A Bye-law for the registration of cowkeepers, dairymen, and purveyors of milk, being of the Local Board of Health Bye-law No. 2.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883, and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, the Local Board of Health for the Shire of South Shepparton, which is the Council of the said shire, doth hereby make the following Bye-law, that is to say:—

1. Every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall, on or before the first day of September in every year, register himself with the Local Board of Health in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the Secretary of the Local Board of Health an application in the following form or to the like effect; every such person shall with every such application pay a fee of One shilling:—

2. Upon receipt of every such application and fee, the Secretary for the Local Board of Health shall endorse the same with a memorandum of the date upon which it is received and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

3. Every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman shall cause every milk store or milk shop in his occupation, or under his management or control, and every milk vessel used by him for containing milk for sale, to be kept thoroughly clean. He shall sweep and cleanse his premises daily, and shall cause all animal excreta and filthy matter therein to be collected and placed where least offensive, and removed from the premises weekly at furthest; and he shall, in the months of April and October in every year, specially cleanse in the following manner the premises wherein he shall keep any cow, that is to say:—All dung, litter, and other matter shall be removed therefrom, and the doors, stalls, and woodwork thoroughly washed with water. Thereafter a coating of limewash; made up by mixing freshly burned lime with water, each gallon of limewash containing one-fifth of a pint of carbolic acid, shall be applied to the walls, floors, ceilings, and every other part of the premises with which animals or their excreta have come in contact.

4. Every person following the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, and every person having the management of any such trade, shall forthwith report, in writing, to the Health Officer the occurrence of any disease in any of his milch cows, or of any contagious or infectious disease in man or animal upon the premises upon which such trade is carried on.

5. Neither he nor any person under his direction or control, whilst suffering from any infectious or contagious disease, or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering, shall milk any cow or handle any vessel used in his business for containing milk, nor in any way take part or assist in the conduct of the business of a dairyman, as far as regards the extraction, distribution, or storage of the milk, until all danger of the communication of infection to the milk, or of contamination thereof shall have ceased, and he shall have furnished satisfactory certificate to the Health Officer that such danger no longer exists; and he shall not mix the milk of a diseased cow with other milk, and shall not sell or use the same for human food or food for any other animal.

Every person who shall commit a breach of this bye-law shall, for every such breach, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings.

This bye-law was made and passed by the Local Board of Health of the Shire of South Shepparton the 10th day of May 1886.
