NOTICE.—HIGH COMMISSION, WESTERN PACIFIC.

BRITISH subjects desiring to Register purchases of Land made by them in the Islands of the Western Pacific are hereby notified that they can do so by forwarding the original deeds (or copies thereof, if certified to be correct under the hand of a commissioned officer in Her Majesty's Naval service, or any consular officer, or any Judicial or Deputy Commissioner for the Western Pacific) to the Secretary to the High Commission, Suva, Fiji.

The notification dated the 2nd January 1884, with reference to the Registration of Land Purchases, published in the *Fiji Royal Gazette* of the 4th and 11th January 1884, is, so far as it relates to the refusal to permit such registration, hereby cancelled.

HIGH COMMISSION, WESTERN PACIFIC.—NOTICE.

APPLICATIONS from time to time having been made to the High Commissioner with regard to the Registration in the office of the Commissioner of Purchases of Land made by British subjects in certain islands in the Pacific Ocean, it is hereby notified for general information that Her Majesty's Government, after full consideration of the question, has decided that as the Registration of these land transactions would be liable to be construed as a confirmation of them by the Imperial Government, carrying with it some obligation to uphold such transactions, and possibly to give special protection to the purchasers, no such Registration shall be permitted.

It is therefore to be understood by all persons concerned that Her Majesty's Government will accept no responsibility in regard to transactions relating to land in the Pacific Ocean not being in British territory.

WHEREAS by *The Discipline Act 1870* it was provided that the Governor in Council might make rules and regulations for the employment, removal, or dismissal, and for the better government of persons engaged in virtue of the said Act, and for enforcing good order and discipline among them, and otherwise carrying out the said Act, and from time to time amend, alter, or amend the same and substitute others in lieu thereof: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following additions to the Regulations for the Victorian Military Forces, that is to say:—

PART IV., SECTION III.

Paragraph 21—

After the words "following items," the remainder of the paragraph is cancelled, and the following sub-paragraphs are inserted in lieu thereof:—

1. Clothing.—Provision of all authorised clothing for warrant, and non-commissioned officers and men (great coats excepted), including lace, buttons, chevrons, forage caps, and badges.
2. Orderly-rooms.—Lighting, cleaning, water, stationery, furniture; also expenses incidental to care and protection of stores, and to making good Government property, lost or damaged, the loss or damage of which cannot be traced to individuals, and is not chargeable to Government.
3. Expenses in connection with parades and camps.
4. Expenses incidental to target practice and prizes, not exceeding fifteen (15) per centum of the effective money.
5. Battalion bands.
6. Cost of all supplies received from the Ordnance Stores on repayment, or any other expenditure authorised by the Council of Defence.
7. It is to be distinctly understood that the effective allowance is not to be used for the payment of supplies made to individuals, or for the expenses of individuals which are not authorised by the regulations.

And the Honorable James Lorimer, Her Majesty's Minister of Defence for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

SOUTH CHANNEL, GEELONG.—LIGHTS.

PILOTS, masters of vessels, and others are hereby informed that, on and after the 1st of October 1886, lights will be exhibited from two beacons erected on the North Bank at the Eastern and Western entrance to the South Channel, Geelong.

The lights will be of the ordinary jetty type, elevated twenty-one (21) feet above the mean level of the sea, and will be visible in clear weather about six (6) miles distant.

From the eastern entrance a red light will be shown towards Point Henry and the Bird Rock, with a sector of white light marking a clear passage off the Point Wilson and Wilson Spit buoys.

From approaching vessels the light will be seen on the following bearings:—

Red from S.E. by E. round southerly to W. ½ N.	} Magnetic
White from W. ½ N. to N.W. by W., and	
Red from N.W. by W. round northerly to E. ½ N.	

the remaining sector over the North Bank being obscured.

A white light will be exhibited from the western entrance to the channel, visible to approaching vessels from the following bearings:—W. ½ S. round northerly to S. ½ W. (magnetic).

Caution.—The arc of the white light at the eastern entrance covers the Point Lillias, outer cut, and channel entrance buoys; mariners are therefore warned that the cutting of such light is solely for the purpose of marking the Point Wilson and Wilson Spit buoys, and care should be taken not to foul the buoys first mentioned.

THE SHIRE OF KARA KARA WATERWORKS TRUST AND THE ST. ARNAUD SHIRE WATERWORKS TRUST.—ADJUSTMENT OF LIABILITIES.

REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF LAND SURVEYORS.

INTENDING candidates must give notice of their intention in writing, and must forward to the Board documentary evidence that they have complied with the following preliminary conditions; and, upon their applications being approved by the Board, shall pay the prescribed fee of £4 4s. into the Treasury, Melbourne, or any Receipt and Pay Office, and forward receipt for same to the Secretary to the Board.

All candidates presenting themselves for examination must be provided with a book of logarithms, a 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and all necessary appliances (except paper) for plan drawing.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

I. A candidate must have passed the matriculation examination at the University of Melbourne, including English, Geography, Arithmetic, Geometry, Algebra, and Physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and must have served with some recognized surveyor for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

II. Or he must have served under articles for not less than four years some recognized surveyor, two years at least of such service to have been in the field; and must give satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

III. Or he must have completed the first and second year's course in the Engineering School of the Melbourne University, and must have served in the field for two years with some recognized surveyor.

IV. Or he must have completed the third year in the Engineering School of the Melbourne University, and have served one year in the field as above.

NOTE.—By service in the field is to be understood the survey and subdivision of land.

A candidate whose application shall have been approved as showing that he has complied with either of the above conditions will be eligible for examination.

SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

- Construction, adjustment, and use of instruments: Principles of construction, manipulation, adjustment, and use of following instruments, viz.:—
Theodolite,
Level,
Box sextant,
Prismatic compass,
Chain.
- Principles and practice of land surveying: Details of field practice, including the keeping of field-notes; Topographical surveying; Setting out block surveys; Laying out roads; Setting out of curves.
- Plane trigonometry (practical).
- Computations connected with land surveying: Reduction of traverses; Computations connected with the setting out of roads and curves; Elimination of discrepancies in measurements and observations in the field; Computation of areas, including irregular and curved boundaries.
- Determination of latitude, true meridian, and azimuth.
- Leveling and mensuration of earthwork.
- Plotting: Plotting from field-notes by protractor and by ordinates.
- Charting: Construction of maps and charts; Compilation of charts from detached plans and notes; Reduction of bearings to common datum.
- Drawing: Mechanical work of map drawing; Hill shading; Writing.

CERTIFICATES WITHOUT EXAMINATION.

Certificates will be granted by the Board without examination to gentlemen who shall produce evidence satisfactory to the examiners that they have complied with the following conditions, and shall have paid the prescribed fee. But such certificates shall state on the face of them that they have been granted without examination:—

I. Having passed some examination (equivalent in the opinion of the Board to that prescribed in Victoria) in Great Britain, the United States of America, India, or some British colony, and producing evidence of having successfully practised as a surveyor for not less than twelve months in some of the Australian colonies.

II. Or producing evidence satisfactory to the Board of the possession of sufficient professional qualifications and experience, and of having successfully practised as a surveyor for not less than twelve months in some of the Australian colonies.

WHEREAS by a Statute of the Parliament of Victoria No. 310, intitled *An Act to amend the Laws relating to or affecting the Public Health*, it was enacted, that in case it should appear to the Governor in Council that burials in any cemetery, under any law relating to public cemeteries, or in any other burial-ground or place of burial whatsoever, should be wholly discontinued, or should be discontinued subject to any exception or qualification, the Governor in Council might, by an Order to be published in the *Government Gazette*, direct that after a time to be mentioned in such Order, not being less than three months from the date thereof, burials in such cemetery, or burial-ground, or place of burial, should be discontinued wholly, or subject to any exceptions or qualifications mentioned in the same, or in any subsequent Order, and might from time to time postpone the time mentioned in such Order for the discontinuance of burials, or otherwise vary any such Order, whether the time appointed for the discontinuance of burials thereunder, or other operation of such Order, should or should not have arrived: And whereas it appears to the Governor in Council expedient that burials in the grounds attached to the Geelong and Abbotsford Convents should be discontinued: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order direct that all burials in the grounds attached to the Convents aforesaid shall be wholly discontinued on and after the 30th November 1886.

And the Honorable John Lamont Dow, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Crown Lands for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

“THE MALLEE AMENDING ACT 1885.”—VERMIN-PROOF FENCES.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Mallee Amending Act 1885* it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council might from time to time by Order in Council proclaim any fence described in such Order to be a vermin-proof fence within the meaning of the said Act, and a sufficient fence within the meaning of *The Fences Statute 1874*, for the purposes of the now in part recited Act, and he might also by any such Order in Council proclaim any fence described in any such Order to be a sufficient fence within the meaning of the said Statute throughout Victoria, or within any portion thereof specified in such Order, and he might at any time revoke any such Order: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this Order proclaim the fences hereinafter described to be vermin-proof fences within the meaning of *The Mallee Amending Act 1885*, and sufficient fences within the meaning of *The Fences Statute 1874*, aforesaid, that is to say:—

1. A wire-netting fence, 3 feet 4 inches in height, made of wire-netting which shall not be less than 3 feet in width, and of a mesh not exceeding 1½ inches, and which shall be 4 inches in the ground, or shall have 4 inches thereof properly secured to the surface of the ground: such wire-netting to be attached by wire or staples to substantial posts, stakes, or iron standards, with two barbed wires extending from one post, stake, or standard to another, the lower wire being placed 4 inches above the netting, and the upper wire 4 inches above the lower, erected and extending from that portion of the fence from the meridian to north-west angle of Block No. 25 eight miles, and thence south to Lake Tyrrell eight miles forty-nine chains.

2. A wire-netting fence of 3 feet 1 inch wire-netting, 16 gauge and 4-inch mesh, let into the ground 3 inches, posts 6 feet 2 inches high, 2 feet in ground, 14 stakes 4 x 3, 9 feet apart, driven 15 inches into the ground, between each post, netting stapled to posts and stakes, and a barbed wire stapled to tops of posts and stakes, erected on the eastern side of Lake Tyrrell, Mallee Block 24, and extending for a distance of two miles and a half.

3. A wire-netting fence of 4 feet wire-netting, 16 gauge and 4-inch mesh, let into the ground 3 inches, posts 6 feet 2 inches high, 2 feet in ground, 14 stakes 4 x 3, 9 feet apart, driven 15 inches into the ground, between each post, netting stapled to posts and stakes, and a barbed wire stapled to tops of posts and stakes, erected on the eastern side of Lake Tyrrell, Mallee Block 24, and extending for a distance of thirteen miles and a half.

4. A wire-netting fence of 3 feet 6 inches netting, 16 gauge, 1½-inch mesh, let into the ground 3 inches, posts 6 feet, 22 inches in ground and 4 feet 2 inches out of ground, 12 feet apart, with two barbed wires stapled to posts, erected south of Mallee Block 48, Lake Coorong. Length of fence five miles.

5. A wire-netting fence of 3 feet netting, 17 gauge, 1½ inch mesh, let into the ground 3 inches, posts 6 feet, 22 inches in ground and 4 feet 2 inches out of ground, 12 feet apart, with two barbed wires stapled to posts and a plain wire between each post, erected south of Mallee Block 48, Lake Coorong, and extending to a length of forty-five chains.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1884* it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time and from time to time, under regulations to be made for such purpose, to proclaim any Crown lands as a common, and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, or mining board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees should be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees should be disposed of, and at any time to alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite two or more commons, or add to such common any section which may have been taken up within the area of such common and subsequently abandoned; and it was also enacted that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons should be published and all objections thereto should be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundred and twenty-fifth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby diminish, alter, or abolish (as the case may be) the undermentioned commons, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

THE CARLSRUHE FARMERS' COMMON, proclaimed by Order of the 23rd February 1863, is hereby abolished.—(72.E.23856.)

THE HORSHAM TOWN COMMON, proclaimed by Order of the 10th November 1863, and increased by Orders dated respectively the 6th November 1865, the 22nd October 1866, the 27th May 1867, and the 3rd September 1872, is hereby altered by deducting therefrom the portions not included within the boundaries hereinafter described, and the land within such boundaries shall hereby constitute and be the Horsham Town Common, that is to say:—Nine hundred and sixty acres, more or less, county of Borung, parishes of Horsham and Bungallally: Commencing at a point on the east boundary of allotment 4, parish of Horsham, where the eastern side of the Tramway reserve abuts thereon; thence south by a road to a point bearing east from the northernmost angle of allotment 20A, parish of Bungallally; thence west by a line, and south-westerly by the last-mentioned allotment and C. CUTTING, DIGGING, OR REMOVING TIMBER FROM CERTAIN CROWN LANDS PROHIBITED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1884* it was amongst other things enacted that, notwithstanding anything thereinbefore contained, the Governor might by Proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, should cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber or particular description of timber or bark, stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick, or other earth, from such portions of Crown lands as were named in such Proclamation, or should exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any license granted under the authority of Part VIII. of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power conferred by the above-recited Act, do hereby declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber on or from the Crown lands in the township of East Murchison comprised within the boundaries as defined by description hereunder, that is to say:—

EAST MURCHISON.—Eighty acres, more or less, county of Moira, township of East Murchison: Commencing at a point on the right bank of the Goulburn River where the northern side of the road from Rushworth to Seymour intersects it; bounded thence by the said road bearing easterly to the south-west angle of section 1; thence by that section, a line, and allotment 1 bearing northerly, and by the said allotment, allotment 2, a line, allotment 3, and a line bearing easterly to the north-west angle of allotment 4; thence by a line and allotments 24 and 23 bearing northerly, and by allotment 25 and a line bearing westerly to the aforesaid river; and thence by that river southerly to the point of commencement.—(86.S.37830.)

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE IN THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF ST. ARNAUD FOR SHOW YARDS FOR THE USE OF THE ST. ARNAUD PASTORAL AND AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY.

WE, William Wood Watson, George Powell, James Malcolm, William Edwin Wheeler, and Thomas Benjamin Golden, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve in the Municipal District of St. Arnaud for Show Yards for the use of the St. Arnaud Pastoral and Agricultural Society, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 133 of *The Land Act 1884*—

Regulations.

1. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
2. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, flowers, buildings, fixtures, or any property of the St. Arnaud Pastoral and Agricultural Society within the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
3. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, gates, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.
4. No person shall put into the reserve any animal without the permission, in writing, of the committee of management.
5. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without first obtaining the authority, in writing, of the committee of management.
6. No person, except laborers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 133 of *The Land Act 1884*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

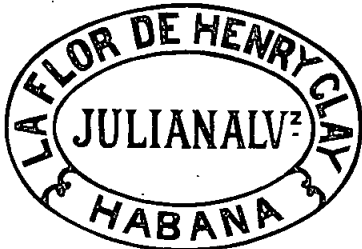

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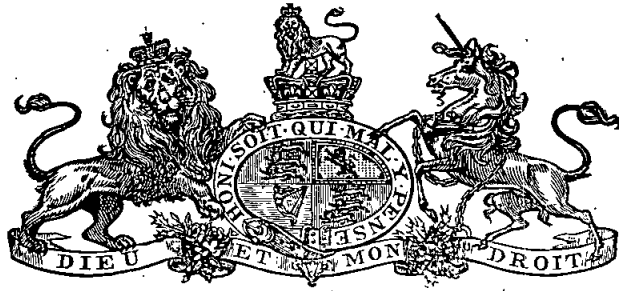
