Sir,—I have the honor to transmit to you, for information and publication in the colony under your Government, a copy of a Parliamentary Paper containing the Convention between the Governments of Great Britain and Spain respecting the commercial relations of the two countries, signed at Madrid on the 26th of April last.

The extension of the alcoholic scale, if and when adopted by Parliament, will also apply to Colonial Wines imported into the United Kingdom.

CONVENTION BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENTS OF GREAT BRITAIN AND SPAIN RESPECTING THE COMMERCIAL RELATIONS OF THE TWO COUNTRIES.

Signed at Madrid, April 26, 1886.

THE Government of Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and the Government of Her Majesty the Queen Regent of Spain, being desirous of facilitating the commercial relations of their respective countries, have named as their Representatives for that purpose:

The Government of Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Sir F. Clare Ford, Her Britannic Majesty's Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary at Madrid, &c., &c.;

The Government of Her Majesty the Queen Regent of Spain, His Excellency Señor Don Segismundo Moret y Prendergast, Minister of State, &c., &c.;

Who, being duly authorized by their respective Governments, have agreed upon the following Articles:—

ARTICLE I.

The Government of Her Majesty the Queen Regent of Spain will grant to the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and to Her Britannic Majesty's Colonies and foreign possessions, most-favoured-nation treatment in all that concerns commerce, navigation, and Consular rights and privileges in Spain, and in the Spanish Colonies and foreign possessions, co-extensive in amount of benefit with that accorded to France and Germany under the Treaties of the 6th February 1882, and the 12th July 1883.

The provisions of this Convention shall come into operation on the 1st July next, unless by mutual consent any other date may be fixed, and on condition that on that date the alcoholic scale, according to which duties are levied on Spanish wines on their introduction into the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, is modified in accordance with the terms of the following Article.

ARTICLE II.

The Government of Her Britannic Majesty will continue to grant to Spain, her Colonies and foreign possessions, most-favoured-nation treatment in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and in Her Britannic Majesty's Colonies and foreign possessions, in all that concerns commerce, navigation, and Consular rights and privileges.

El Gobierno de Su Magestad la Reina del Reino Unido de la Gran Bretaña é Irlanda á Sir F. Clare Ford, Enviado Extraordinario y Ministro Plenipotenciario de la Gran Bretaña en Madrid, &c., &c.;

El Gobierno de Su Magestad la Reina Regente de España al Excelentísimo Señor Don Segismundo Moret y Prendergast, Ministro de Estado, &c., &c.;

Quienes, debidamente autorizados por sus respectivos Gobiernos, han convenido en los siguientes Artículos:—

ARTICULO I.

El Gobierno de Su Magestad la Reina Regente de España concede al Reino Unido de la Gran Bretaña é Irlanda, y á las Colonias y Posesiones de Ultramar de Su Magestad Británica, el trato de la nación más favorecida en todo lo que se refiera al comercio, á la navegación y á los derechos y privilegios Consulares en España y en las Colonias y Posesiones Españolas, en los mismos términos y con iguales beneficios concedidos á Francia y á Alemania en virtud de los Tratados de 6 de Febrero de 1882 y 12 de Julio de 1883.

Las estipulaciones del presente Convenio empezarán á regir el 1º de Julio de 1886, á menos que las Altas Partes Contratantes señalasen de común acuerdo alguna otra fecha, y á condición de que para dicho día 1º de Julio la escala alcohólica que sirve de base á los derechos á que están sujetos los vinos Españoles á su entrada en el Reino Unido de la Gran Bretaña é Irlanda, se modifique en los términos que indica el Artículo siguiente.

ARTICULO II.

El Gobierno de Su Magestad Británica continuará concediendo, como hasta aquí, á España y á sus Colonias y Posesiones de Ultramar el trato de la nación más favorecida en el Reino Unido de la Gran Bretaña é Irlanda, así como también en las Colonias y Posesiones de Ultramar de Su Magestad Británica, en todo lo que se refiera al comercio, á la navegación y á los derechos y privilegios Consulares.

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They will, in addition, apply to Parliament for the necessary authority to provide that the limit of the lower half of the alcoholic scale shall extend up to but not exceed 30 degrees of proof spirit.

ARTICLE III.

The present Convention has been drawn up subject to the sanction of the Legislatures of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of Spain respectively. When approved, it shall remain in force until the 30th June 1892, and in case neither of the High Contracting Parties should have notified, twelve months before the said date, the intention of terminating it, the present Convention shall remain binding until the expiration of one year from the day on which either of the two High Contracting Parties shall have denounced it.

Sir Clare Ford to Señor Moret.

Madrid, April 26, 1886.

I have the honor to inform your Excellency that I have received the authorization of the Earl of Rosebery, Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, to sign with your Excellency the Convention which we had agreed to draw up for facilitating the commercial relations between Great Britain and Spain, and a copy of which I have the honor to transmit herewith to your Excellency.

I shall feel obliged if your Excellency will name a day when I can proceed to the Ministry of State in order to sign the Convention in question.

Before doing so, however, I have been instructed to place on record the following points, on which we are also agreed, but which it has not been thought necessary to insert in the body of the instrument which I propose to sign with your Excellency.

The first point refers to wines in bottle, which it is understood may be excluded, at the option of Her Majesty's Government, from the stipulations of Article II of the Convention.

The second point refers to a possible future division of the lower half of the alcoholic scale. It is understood that nothing in the Convention shall preclude Her Majesty's Government from dividing, if at some future time it shall be found desirable to do so, the present lower half of the alcoholic scale at a point not above 15 degrees, and treating wines below that point differently from wines above it.

It is further agreed that it shall be open to any British Colony to withdraw from the present Convention on notice to this effect being given by Her Majesty's Minister at Madrid to the Spanish Minister for Foreign Affairs within a year after the date of its signature.

The agreement on the part of the Government of Her Majesty the Queen Regent of Spain on the above points shall be deemed to be recorded by the reply which I have the honor to solicit your Excellency to be so good as address to me in a note on the subject.

Excelentísimo Señor,

Ministerio de Estado, Palacio, 26 de Abril 1886.

Al acusar á vuestra Excelencia recepcion de su nota de hoy, tengo el honor de manifestarle mi conformidad con su contenido, así como tambien con el proyecto de Protocolo que la acompañaba.

Resultados ambos de la discusion que entre nosotros ha mediado desde la venida de vuestra Excelencia á esta Corte, discusion encaminada á facilitar las relaciones comerciales entre la Gran Bretaña y España, el Protocolo y la nota son expresion fiel del acuerdo á que felizmente hemos llegado.

Cumpleme, pues, manifestar á vuestra Excelencia que el Gobierno Español, conforme con las tres indicaciones contenidas en su nota, entiende que el Gobierno de Su Magestad Británica queda autorizado para considerar excluidos de la rebaja que en la tarifa alcohólica ha de hacerse, los vinos que lleguen á Inglaterra embotellados.

Reconoce, igualmente, que la Convencion que vamos á firmar no impedirá al Gobierno de Su Magestad Británica dividir en dos la parte inferior de la escala alcohólica, esto es, la que termina en los 30 grados, de forma que los vinos inferiores á 15 grados puedan ser considerados de diferente manera que aquellos que excedan de este grado.

Por lo que á las Colonias de Su Magestad Británica se refiere, queda entendido que si dentro del año siguiente á la fecha de esta Convencion, y contado desde el día en que sea firmado, alguna de dichas Colonias declarase su deseo de retirarse de la presente Convencion, se entenderá que dicha Colonia queda excluida de las estipulaciones en la misma contenidas.

Espero que esta respuesta satisfará el deseo que vuestra Excelencia me indica al final de su nota, y que, en su virtud, podremos proceder á la firma del Protocolo, cuya traduccion Española acompaño á vuestra Excelencia para su exámen y confrontacion con el texto Inglés.

Al terminar esta respuesta á la nota que vuestra Excelencia se ha servido dirigirme en el día de hoy, y dar por terminada á satisfaccion de ambos países la negociacion que ha ocupado á vuestra Excelencia desde el principio de su mision, cumplo un grato deber expresando á vuestra Excelencia mi reconocimiento más sincero por la franqueza y lealtad con que ha conducido estas negociaciones, y por el verdadero interés con que, dentro de las instrucciones de su Gobierno, ha acogido las representaciones que, en nombre del de España, he tenido el honor de hacer, gracias á lo cual las relaciones mercantiles de España con Inglaterra quedan cimentados sobre una base sólida y equitativa, estrechándose así de una manera firme y duradera la amistad que de antiguo existe entre las dos naciones.

Excellency,

In acknowledging the receipt of your note of to-day, I have the honor to state that I agree with its contents, as, also, with the draft of Convention which it encloses.

The Convention and the note faithfully represent the agreement to which we have happily come, being the result of the discussion which was entered into since your arrival at this Court, with a view to facilitate the commercial relations between Great Britain and Spain.

It is my duty to inform your Excellency that the Spanish Government agree with the three points contained in your note, and consider that Her Britannic Majesty's Government are authorized to exclude from the reduction which is to be made in the alcoholic scale the wines which arrive in bottles into the United Kingdom.

They agree, also, that the Convention which we are about to sign will not hinder Her Britannic Majesty's Government from dividing into two parts the lower half of the alcoholic scale, that is to say, that part which terminates at 30 degrees, in such a way that the wines below 15 degrees may be treated differently from those above it.

With regard to Her Britannic Majesty's Colonies, it is understood that if, within a year after the date of this Convention, and reckoned from the day on which it is signed, any of the said colonies declare their intention to withdraw from the present Convention, the said colony will be excluded from the stipulations contained therein.

I trust that this reply will meet the wishes which were expressed in the concluding portion of your Excellency's note, and that, therefore, we may sign the Convention, a translation of which I enclose that you may examine it and compare it with the English text.

In concluding my reply to the note which your Excellency transmitted to me to-day, and considering as satisfactorily terminated for both countries the negotiations which have occupied your Excellency since the commencement of your mission, I fulfil a pleasing duty in conveying to your Excellency the expression of my most sincere gratitude for the frankness and loyalty with which you have conducted these negotiations, and for the sincere interest with which, acting within the instructions you had received from your Government, you have treated the representations which, in the name of Spain, I have had the honor to make to you, thanks to which the commercial relations between Spain and England will henceforth rest on a solid and just basis, thus strengthening, in a firm and lasting manner, the friendship which from of old exists between the two nations.

I have the honor to inform your Excellency that on the 26th ultimo I transmitted to the Earl of Rosebery a copy of the Convention which we had signed in duplicate on that day, for facilitating the commercial relations between Great Britain and Spain.

Her Majesty's Government had not previously seen the whole of the Spanish rendering of the English text of that Convention, and now that they have done so they have called my attention to one phrase in it which occurs at the end of Article II. The English text runs as follows:—

"They will, in addition, apply to Parliament for the necessary authority to provide that the limit of the lower half of the alcoholic scale shall extend up to, but not exceed, 30 degrees of proof spirit."

The Spanish translation is as follows:—

"Pedirá además al Parlamento la autorización necesaria para extender el límite inferior de la escala alcohólica de los vinos desde los 26 á los 30 grados inclusive."

Her Majesty's Government consider that the Spanish translation with regard to the portion of the Convention above quoted is not a correct version of the English, and I have been instructed by the Earl of Rosebery to inquire of your Excellency whether the Spanish Government understand the Spanish text to convey precisely the same meaning as the English expression, "shall extend up to but not exceed 30 degrees."

I shall feel obliged to your Excellency if you would kindly inform me whether that is so, and if you would be so good as to record the fact, and assure me that the Spanish words used in translating the English text do not cover the fractions of a degree between 30 and 31 degrees of the alcoholic scale.

Excelentísimo Señor,

Tengo el honor de manifestar á vuestra Excelencia, en respuesta á su nota de ayer, que ninguna diferencia existe entre el sentido de la traducción Española del último párrafo del Artículo II de la Convención de 26 de Abril y el texto Inglés.

La traducción literal de las palabras que vuestra Excelencia menciona sería esta:—

"Que el límite inferior de la escala alcohólica se extienda hasta, pero sin exceder, los 30 grados de fuerza alcohólica."

Pareciéndome mal sonante la inserción literal de estas palabras, por no prestarse, en mi sentir, á la buena lectura Española, tuve el honor de proponer á vuestra Excelencia la actual, que dice lo siguiente:—

"El límite inferior de la escala alcohólica de los vinos desde 26 hasta los 30 grados inclusive,"

cuyas palabras parecen á vuestra Excelencia no representaban la idea con exactitud. Para aclarar, pues, por completo la duda que parece haberse suscitado en la Cancillería Inglesa, bástame ratificar la inteligencia de las palabras referidas, reiterando que ellos tienen exactamente el mismo sentido que los del texto Inglés, y que el Gobierno Español entiende que la modificación de la escala alcohólica mencionada en el Artículo II se extenderá hasta pero no excederá de los 30 grados.

I have the honor to state to your Excellency, in reply to your note of yesterday, that there is no difference whatever between the sense of the Spanish translation of the last paragraph of the IIInd Article of the Convention of the 26th April and the English text.

The literal translation of the words which your Excellency mentions would be this:—

"Que el límite inferior de la escala alcohólica se extienda hasta, pero sin exceder, los 30 grados de fuerza alcohólica."

Considering that the literal rendering of those words did not, in my judgment, read well in Spanish, I had the honor to propose to your Excellency the present translation, which is as follows:—

"El límite inferior de la escala alcohólica de los vinos desde los 26 hasta los 30 grados inclusive,"

which words do not appear to your Excellency to clearly convey the idea. In order, therefore, to fully dispel the doubts which appear to have arisen in the British Chancery, it is enough for me to ratify the meaning of the words above referred to, and I repeat that they have the same as those of the British text, and that the Spanish Government consider that the alcoholic scale mentioned in the IIInd Article will extend to but is not to exceed 30 degrees.

Provided that not later than 10 a.m. on the day upon which the meeting is held, notice of request to obtain such telegram be given to the manager, or Postmaster of, or other officer in the office from which such telegram is to be issued, and at the same time the sum of Sixpence for each telegram ordered be paid, together with any amount necessary to cover cost of portage to places outside the limit of free delivery. At offices where no messengers are employed such telegrams must be called for by the addressees or their authorized agents.

The above arrangement only to be observed on occasions when the Postmaster-General may direct it to be carried out.

THE following information, compiled from a report received from Commander Rooke, H.M.S. *Miranda*, is hereby promulgated:—

The plan of Allier Bay (from a French Government Survey, in 1877) on Admiralty Chart No. 987, Plans of Islands in the South Pacific, corrected to September 1883, is very inaccurate.

Several heads of coral reefs not marked on the Chart exist. The deepest water between the reefs in the passage to Mua anchorage, indicated by a dotted line on the Chart, is 2½ fathoms, while a passage to the westward of the 2½-fathom shoal shown on the Chart, in which 3½ and 4½ fathoms are marked, is blocked by a reef, on which the *Miranda* touched.

The greatest caution is therefore necessary when proceeding to the inner of Mua anchorage. The services of the natives as pilots, although not altogether trustworthy, will be found useful.

Two channels, neither of which appear on the Chart, were pointed out to H.M.S. *Miranda* by the natives, and used with safety.

To enter by the Western Channel, which carries 14 to 15 feet at L.S.W., proceed according to the sailing directions in the Pacific Islands Directory, vol. 2 (Central Groups), 1885, page 28, up to passing Sail Rock; then bring a clump of trees on the summit of hill in line with the west extreme Nuku Fetau Island, bearing N. by E. ½ E., which will lead over the sand bank in 14 to 15 feet at low water. Nuku Fetau Island can be approached within one cable.

To leave the anchorage by the Eastern Channel, which is recommended by the officers of H.M.S. *Miranda*, as it is 50 yards wide, and has a least depth of 21 feet at L.S.W., steer for the left extreme of Faia Island until the left extreme of trees on Entrance Island comes on with Sail Rock, bearing S. 23° W. Proceed on this mark, passing close to the reef, and haul out for the centre of Nuku Atea Island, until the clump of trees on the hill comes on with the left extreme of Nuku Fetau, N. by E. ½ E.

The births of 1,023 children, viz., 534 boys and 489 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of July. In the month of June, 1,194 births were registered, or 171 more than in the month under review. The births were 221 above the average of the month during the previous ten years, but only 49 above that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in July numbered 610, viz., 340 of males and 270 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 413, or 68 per cent. The deaths outnumbered those in June by 31, and exceeded the average of July during the previous ten years by 148. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have exceeded that average by only 49.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was 2.96, and of deaths registered 1.77.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 65.1° on the 19th, and the lowest temperatures were 28.2° on the 7th and 28.1° on the 8th. These are the lowest temperatures ever recorded in Melbourne. The next lowest temperature recorded, viz., 29.9°, was in July 1884, and again in July 1885. Notwithstanding the cold experienced on certain days, the mean temperature of the month (47.5°) was one-tenth of a degree above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (30.8°) took place on the 18th, viz., from a maximum of 64.8° to a minimum of 34.0°. The least range (5.5°) was on the 29th, viz., from a maximum of 53.4° to a minimum of 47.9°. The mean daily range was 17.3°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.573° on the 15th, and the lowest was 29.584° on the 27th. The mean atmospheric pressure (30.136 inches) was slightly above the average.

Rain fell on 11 days, the amount of rainfall being .836 inch. In the month of July during the ten years 1877 to 1886 the average number of days' rain was 11, as in the month under review; and the average rainfall was 1.27 inch, or .434 inch above that in the month under review.

Fog occurred on 6 days.

Males contributed 56 per cent., and females 44 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 30 per cent. to that mortality, as against 26 per cent. in July 1885, 39 per cent. in July 1884, 32 per cent. in July 1883, 34 per cent. in July 1882, 33 per cent. in July 1881, 36 per cent. in July 1880, 29 per cent. in July 1879 and July 1878, 33 per cent. in July 1877, and 30 per cent. in July 1876.

The mortality amongst old people was very high during the month, as many as 42 having died at or after the age of 75 years. This, after that in August 1885, when 66 deaths were reported at these ages, is the highest number on record. Of those, in the month under notice—A fireman, aged 75, died of cancer of the liver; a female, aged 75, a bricklayer and a female, each aged 78, and a female, aged 79 of apoplexy; a gardener, and a bookseller (both inmates of the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum) aged 78 and 81 respectively, and a miner (an inmate of the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum) aged 84, of disease of the brain; a laborer, aged 78, and a female, aged 81, of disease of the heart; a wire worker, aged 77, a gardener, aged 82, and a gentleman, aged 87, of bronchitis; an undertaker, aged 75, a laborer, aged 80, a merchant, aged 82, a female, aged 86, and a gentleman, aged 87, of pneumonia; a female, aged 78, of Bright's disease of the kidneys; a gardener, aged 82 of disease of lungs; a female, aged 84, of diarrhoea; a shepherd, aged 85, of hepatitis; a carpenter, a gardener, a laborer, a mariner, and two females, each aged 75, two females, each aged 76, a chemist and a clerk, each aged 79, a farmer, a fellmonger and a female, each aged 80, a male pensioner, aged 81, a maltster, aged 83, a farmer, a laborer, and a shepherd, each aged 84, a female, aged 85, and a shoemaker, aged 87, of old age.

Twenty-six deaths were ascribed to external causes during the month, of which 20 were set down to accident, 2 to homicide, and 4 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A male child, aged 4, died of fracture of the skull, a dray-wheel having passed over him; a laborer, aged 46, of fracture of the spine, through being thrown from an express wagon; a cabdriver, aged 47, of fracture of the leg, caused by slipping off a doorstep; a female, aged 54, of gangrene of the thigh, consequent on falling into a cellar; a laborer, aged 18, of rupture of the liver, and a jockey, aged 24, of laceration of the brain, caused by falls from horses; a splitter, aged 41, was killed, being kicked on the knee by a horse; a signal boy, aged 18, a female, aged 51, and a gate-keeper, aged 69, were passed over by trains; a laborer, aged 42, died of tetanus, consequent on an injury to the foot; a female child, aged 1, a boy, aged 6, and a cook, aged 30, died of burns, the last two from their clothes catching fire; a clerk, aged 27, and a fireman, aged 45, were drowned in the river Yarra; a carpenter, aged 58, was found drowned in Hobson's Bay, near the Red Bluff, St. Kilda; a male infant, aged 9 days, was overlain; a farmer, aged 57, was choked with a piece of meat; and a clerk, aged 60, was suffocated in a bath. The homicidal deaths were those of two male infants who were murdered at birth. Of those whose deaths resulted from suicide, a pawnbroker's assistant and a clerk, aged 21, shot themselves; a laborer, aged 65, cut his throat; and a female, aged 19, drowned herself whilst of unsound mind.

One hundred and thirty-six deaths, or 22 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—65 in the Melbourne Hospital, 16 in the Alfred Hospital, 3 in the Children's Hospital, 5 in the Women's Hospital, 12 in the Immigrants' Home, 6 in the Benevolent Asylum, 11 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 8 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 5 in the Austin Hospital, 4 in the Melbourne Gaol, and 1 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 183, of which 103, or 56 per cent., were of males, and 80, or 44 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 127 were under one year of age, 30 were between one and two, 10 were between two and three, 8 were between three and four, and 8 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 427. Of these, 237, or 56 per cent., were males, and 190, or 44 per cent., were females; 23 were between five and ten, 9 were between ten and fifteen, 22 were between fifteen and twenty, 29 were between twenty and twenty-five, 32 were between twenty-five and thirty, 22 were between thirty and thirty-five, 34 were between thirty-five and forty, 18 were between forty and forty-five, 33 were between forty-five and fifty, 39 were between fifty and fifty-five, 39 were between fifty-five and sixty, 40 were between sixty and sixty-five, 30 were between sixty-five and seventy, 15 were between seventy and seventy-five, 20 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 22 were upwards of eighty.

As compared with the experience of the previous month, deaths in July from whooping-cough decreased from 10 to 7, those from typhoid fever from 29 to 21, those from cancer from 22 to 19, those from tabes mesenterica from 6 to 2, and those from premature birth from 23 to 16. On the other hand deaths from diphtheria increased from 5 to 7, those from diarrhoea from 4 to 10, those from nerve and brain disorders from 64 to 74, those from heart affections from 35 to 44, and those from bronchial and lung affections from 104 to 147. Five deaths of child-bearing women occurred as against 12 in June. Comparing these numbers with the births registered, it follows that 1 mother perished to every 205 children born alive, as against 1 to every 99 such children in the previous month.

CERTAIN BIRDS TO BE DEEMED "NATIVE GAME."

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament passed in the thirty-first year of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to protect Game" (31 Vict. No. 311), it is amongst other things enacted that for the purposes of the said Act the term "game" shall mean and include all birds and other animals mentioned in the first schedule to the said Act, and the terms "native game" shall mean and include all birds and other animals mentioned in the second schedule to the said Act; provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time after the passing of the said Act by proclamation to name any other bird or animal which shall be included in such first or second schedule respectively, and after the publication of any such proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, and the expiration of the period mentioned in such proclamation for the time of its coming into operation, the birds or other animals so named shall be deemed and considered as being thenceforward included in such schedule: And it is also enacted that the period of the year during which the said Act shall be in operation as regards all or any of the birds or other animals mentioned in the second schedule shall be from and after the first day of August until the thirtieth day of November in each year, or such other period as the Governor in Council may by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* from time to time direct: And whereas by a proclamation dated the fifteenth day of February One thousand eight hundred and seventy-five, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 26th February 1875, the "Magpie" was named as a bird to be included in the second schedule to the said Act annexed, and the period of the year during which the Act quoted shall be in operation as regards the bird named shall be from the first day of August to the twentieth day of December in each year, both days inclusive: And whereas it is deemed expedient to extend such period; for such purpose I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the said proclamation, and, with the advice of the Executive Council aforesaid, do hereby name the "Curlew" (*Oedienus grallarius*), "Laughing Jackass" (*Dacelo gigas*), "Magpies" (*Gymnorhina leucanota* and *G. tibicen*), "Magpie Lark" (*Grallina picata*), and "Mopokes" (*Podargus strigoides* and *Spiloglaux boobook*) as birds which shall be included in the second schedule to the said Act annexed on and after the date hereinafter mentioned for the coming into operation of this proclamation, and that the period of the year during which the said Act shall be in operation as regards the birds above mentioned shall be from the first day of January to the thirty-first day of December in each year, both days inclusive: And, with the advice aforesaid, I do appoint that this my proclamation shall come into operation upon the first day of September One thousand eight hundred and eighty-six.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-third day of August, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, and in the fiftieth year of Her Majesty's reign.

All candidates presenting themselves for examination must be provided with a book of logarithms, a 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and all necessary appliances (except paper) for plan drawing.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

I. A candidate must have passed the matriculation examination at the University of Melbourne, including English, Geography, Arithmetic, Geometry, Algebra, and Physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and must have served with some recognized surveyor for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

II. Or he must have served under articles for not less than four years some recognized surveyor, two years at least of such service to have been in the field; and must give satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

III. Or he must have completed the first and second year's course in the Engineering School of the Melbourne University, and must have served in the field for two years with some recognized surveyor.

IV. Or he must have completed the third year in the Engineering School of the Melbourne University, and have served one year in the field as above.

BYE-LAW No. 2, AS TO DAIRIES, DAIRY CATTLE, AND MILK.

THE Local Board of Health in and for the Shire of Kilmore, in the colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in "The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883," and every other power enabling the said Local Board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said Local Board, doth hereby make the following bye-law, being Bye-law No. 2 of the said Local Board of Health, that is to say:—

1. All former bye-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed.

2. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This bye-law shall apply to, and have operation in, the whole of the Shire of Kilmore.

REGISTRATION OF COWKEEPERS, DAIRYMEN, AND PURVEYORS OF MILK.

4. Every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, shall, on or before the first day of July in every year, register himself with the Local Board of Health in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the Secretary of the Local Board of Health an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall, with every application, pay a fee of Five shillings.

5. Upon receipt of every such application and fee the Secretary of the Local Board of Health shall endorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it was received, and of the payment of the fee, and file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly endorsed.

6. All paddocks, grounds, lands, and enclosures used as grazing ground for dairy cattle shall, whenever necessary, be inspected by any member or officer of the said Local Board, or by any person authorized, in writing, by the chairman or secretary of the said Local Board; and if, on inspection, such paddocks, grounds, or enclosures, or any one of them, are, or is likely, in the opinion of the officer or person so inspecting, to be prejudicial to health, by affecting the milk or otherwise, the said Local Board may, by an order, in writing, signed by the secretary, and served personally or left at the dwelling-house of the registered person, or in the case of an unregistered person, served personally or left at his dwelling-place or posted upon the land, prohibit the use of the same for the purpose of feeding dairy cattle, either absolutely or for any time named in such order. All cattle in dairies shall also be similarly inspected by a veterinary surgeon or other competent person, and any cows found to be diseased, or which from poverty or weakness are, in the opinion of the inspector, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, shall be forthwith removed from such dairy if ordered by such inspector or other officer as aforesaid. And any such order as aforesaid the said Local Board may revoke, but upon every fresh inspection a similar order may from time to time be made.

7. All houses, dairies, cowsheds, milk stores, milk shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person

following the trade of cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated, and the drainage of all such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not.

8. All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows shall be regularly swept and be kept perfectly clean, and shall within twenty-four hours of any order to such effect from the health officer or inspector of nuisances be fumigated, disinfected, or lime-washed, as may be in any such order so directed.

9. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily.

10. If any person or any member of the family of any person registered as aforesaid, or not so registered, but employed as a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor or member of the family of any visitor to any such person shall be attacked by typhoid fever or any dangerous infectious disease, the occupier of the house in which such person shall be, or (if he be the person attacked) his wife or other person in charge shall immediately give notice thereof to the Local Board or Officer of Health or to the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the Local Board of Health, and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said Local Board or the Officer of Health, by order served as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of any such cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk until danger, in the opinion of such Local Board or Officer of Health, no longer exists. And in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering, or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering, to milk cows or to handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business. Nor, if the person registered or conducting such business be himself the person suffering, shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until in either case all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk, or of its contamination, has ceased.

11. If at any time disease exists in the dairy or among the cows or cattle in any cowshed or dairy, or in the herds of any cowkeeper, dairyman, vendor, or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the Local Board, Officer of Health, or nearest member of the police force, and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.

12. No cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep or permit or suffer to be kept any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.

13. In the interpretation of this bye-law, words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural, and the plural the singular, and the word "person" shall include a corporation.

14. Every person guilty of any breach of this bye-law or of any of its provisions shall be liable in the discretion of the convicting justices to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings, or in a like discretion to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

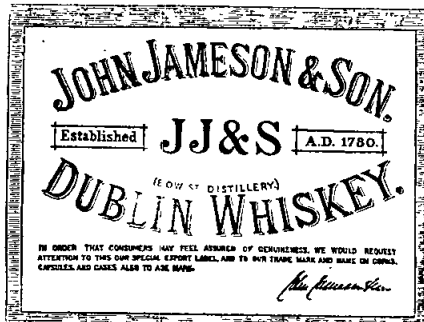

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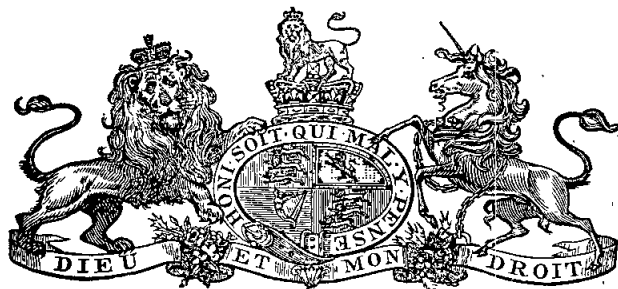
