

CHANGES IN DESIGNS, ETC., OF GOLD AND SILVER COINS AND ISSUE OF A NEW SILVER COIN.

THE following Despatch from the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies to His Excellency the Governor, and its Enclosure, are published for general information.

SIR,—I have the honor to transmit to you, for the information of the colony under your Government, the accompanying copy of a Proclamation, issued by Her Majesty the Queen, by and with the advice of the Privy Council, respecting certain changes in the designs, &c., of the Gold and Silver Coins, and the issue of a new Silver Coin called the Double-Florin.

I have to request that you will take steps to publish this Proclamation in the usual manner in the colony under your Government.

A PROCLAMATION.

Victoria R.

Whereas by an Act passed in the thirty-third year of our reign intitled *An Act to Consolidate and Amend the Law relating to the Coinage and Her Majesty's Mint*, it is amongst other things enacted:

That we, by and with the advice of our Privy Council, shall from time to time, by proclamation, determine the design for any coin:

We have, therefore, thought fit to order that certain of the coins made at the Mint, mentioned in the first schedule to the aforesaid Act, of the weight and fineness specified in that schedule, shall bear designs as follows:—

That every Five pound piece should have for the obverse impression our effigy, with the inscription "Victoria D.G. Britt: Reg: F.D." and for the reverse the image of St. George armed, sitting on horseback, attacking the dragon with a sword, and a broken spear upon the ground, and the date of the year, with a graining upon the edge; and that every Two pound piece should have the same obverse and reverse impression and inscription in all respects as the Five pound piece, with a graining upon the edge; and that every Sovereign should have the same obverse and reverse impression and inscription in all respects as the Five pound piece, with a graining upon the edge; and that every Half-sovereign should have for the obverse impression the aforesaid effigy, with the inscription "Victoria Dei Gratia," and for the reverse the ensigns armorial of the United Kingdom contained in a garbished shield surmounted by the royal crown, with the inscription "Britanniarum Regina Fid: Def:" and the date of the year, with a graining upon the edge; and that every Crown should have the same obverse and reverse impression and inscription in all respects as the Five pound piece, with a graining upon the edge; and that every Half-crown should have for the obverse impression the aforesaid effigy, with the inscription "Victoria Dei Gratia," and for the reverse the ensigns armorial of the United Kingdom contained in a plain shield surrounded by the garter bearing the motto, "Honi soit qui mal y pense," and the collar of the garter with the inscription "Britanniarum Regina Fid: Def:" and the date of the year, with a graining upon the edge; and that every Florin should have for the obverse impression the aforesaid effigy, with the inscription "Victoria Dei Gratia," and for the reverse the ensigns armorial of the United Kingdom contained in four shields arranged crosswise, each shield crowned, and between the shields four sceptres surmounted by orbs, a thistle, and a harp, and a Star of the Garter in the centre, with the inscription "Britt: Reg: Fid: Def:" and the date of the year, with a graining upon the edge; and that every Shilling should have for the obverse impression the aforesaid effigy, with the inscription "Victoria Dei Gratia Britt: Regina F.D.," and for the reverse the ensigns armorial of the United Kingdom contained in a plain shield surrounded by the garter bearing the motto, "Honi soit qui mal y pense," and the date of the year, with a graining upon the edge; and that every Sixpence should have the same obverse and reverse impression and inscription in all respects as the Shilling, with a graining upon the edge; and that certain other pieces of silver money called "The Queen's Maundy Monies," of Fourpence, Threepence, Twopence, and One Penny, should have for the obverse impression the aforesaid effigy, with the inscription "Victoria Dei Gratia Britt: Regina F.D.," and for the reverse the respective figures "4," "3," "2," "1" (according to the denomination or value of the piece), in the centre, with the date of the year placed across the figure, and encircled by an oak wreath surmounted by the royal crown, with a plain edge.

And whereas by the aforesaid Act it is also enacted that it shall be lawful for us, by and with the advice of our Privy Council, from time to time by proclamation to determine the denominations of coins to be coined at the Mint, and it is by the said Act provided that any coin of gold, silver, or bronze, of any other denomination than that of the coins mentioned in the first schedule to the aforesaid Act, which is hereafter coined at the Mint, shall be of a weight and fineness bearing the same proportion to the weight and fineness specified in that schedule as the denomination of such coin bears to the denominations mentioned in that schedule.

We have, therefore, further thought fit to order that a new coin, to be called a Double-Florin, should be coined, of the standard weight of 349.06090 grains, and of the fineness of thirty-seven-fortieths fine silver and three-fortieths alloy, and should pass and be received as current and lawful money of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, at the rate of Four shillings, or one-fifth of a Pound; and that every such coin should have the same obverse and reverse impression and inscription in all respects as the Florin, with a graining upon the edge.

And whereas pieces of money of the above descriptions respectively have been coined at our Mint, and will be coined there in pursuance of orders which we have given for that purpose, we have, therefore, by and with the advice of our Privy Council, thought fit to issue this our Royal Proclamation, and we do hereby ordain, declare, and command that the said pieces of money respectively so coined, and to be coined as aforesaid, shall be current and lawful money of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and that this our Royal Proclamation shall come into operation on the date hereof.

Given at our Court, at Windsor, this thirteenth day of May, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, and in the fiftieth year of our reign.

No. 311), it is amongst other things enacted that for the purposes of the said Act the term "game" shall mean and include all birds and other animals mentioned in the first schedule to the said Act; and the term "native game" shall mean and include all birds and other animals mentioned in the second schedule to the said Act; provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, at any time after the passing of the said Act, by proclamation to name any other bird or animal which shall be included in such first or second schedule respectively, and after the publication of any such proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, and the expiration of the period mentioned in such proclamation for the time of its coming into operation, the birds or other animals so named shall be deemed and considered as being thenceforward included in such schedule: And it is also enacted that the period of the year during which the said Act shall be in operation as regards all or any of the birds and other animals mentioned in the second schedule shall be from and after the first day of August until the thirtieth day of November in each year, or such other period as the Governor in Council may by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* from time to time direct: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby name the "Lyre Bird" (*Menura superba*) as a bird which shall be included in the second schedule to the said Act annexed upon the expiration of the period hereafter mentioned for the coming into operation of this proclamation, and that the period of the year during which the said Act shall be in operation as regards the "Lyre Bird" aforesaid shall be from the first day of January to the thirty-first day of December in each year, both days inclusive: And, with the advice aforesaid, I do appoint that this my proclamation shall come into operation upon the first day of November, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven.

**BOROUGH ECHUCA WATER TRUST—REGULATION.**

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulation, made by the Borough Echuca Water Trust, in accordance with the powers conferred by sections 44, 54, and 56 of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1881*, No. 716, and also section 12 of *The Victorian Water Conservation Acts 1881-1883*, No. 829.

The Commissioners of the Borough Echuca Water Trust in pursuance of the powers conferred by sections 44, 54, and 56 of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1881*, No. 716, and also section 12 of *The Victorian Water Conservation Acts 1881-1883*, No. 829, do make the following regulation:—

**Regulation No. 1.**

Regulations for imposing, levying, and receiving water rates and charges within the Borough Echuca Water Trust district.

That the following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements within the district of the Borough Echuca Water Trust for the year 1887, namely, a rate of Five pounds per centum per annum on the annual valuation of lands and tenements respectively, the same to be payable in advance on the first day of every calendar month: provided always that the amount of rates payable in respect of any lands or tenements shall not be less than the minimum fixed in that behalf by the Governor in Council.

**Meters.**

The rate or charge for water supplied by meter shall be Three shillings per thousand gallons (1,000).

The charge for water supplied from the Trust stand-pipes shall be Three shillings per thousand gallons.

The foregoing regulation was duly made and adopted by the Commissioners of the Borough Echuca Water Trust, at their office, Echuca, on the First day of June. And the seal of the Trust was affixed thereto this Seventeenth day of June in the year One thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven—1887.

# MOOROOPNA WATERWORKS TRUST.— REGULATIONS.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations made by the Mooroopna Waterworks Trust, in accordance with the provisions of *The Victorian Water Conservation Acts* (Nos. 778 and 829).

## REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS by Order of His Excellency the Governor in Council bearing date the thirteenth day of August 1886, the Councillors of the Shire of Rodney for the time being, and one other person named in such Order in Council, to wit, Samuel A. Edmonds, were appointed under the provisions and within the meaning of the Acts of the Parliament of Victoria, numbered 716 and 778, to be the Commissioners of the Waterworks Trust for the Waterworks District within the said shire.

Now the said Commissioners do hereby, pursuant to and in the exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon them by *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1883 and 1884*, do order and make the Regulations following:—

The following rates and charges are those which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by this Trust:—

1. (1.) For every house or tenement under Ten pounds sterling annual value, the sum of One pound sterling per annum.
- (2.) For every house or tenement of Ten pounds sterling annual value or over, an amount equal to Ten pounds per centum on the amount of the annual valuation.
2. (1.) That water may be supplied by the Trust by measurement, at the rate of Three shillings per one thousand gallons (or at such prices as may be specially agreed upon).
- (2.) That the charge for supplying one thousand gallons or any less quantity, at the standpipe at the water tower, be at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence for one thousand gallons.
- (3.) That water may be sold by meter for irrigation purposes, at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per one thousand gallons; but water shall not be supplied in such cases except by special permission granted on application to the Trust.
- (4.) For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, One pound per annum on each inch diameter of the cylinder.
- (5.) That the Trust may cause a meter or meters to be affixed in any case where they may consider it necessary, and such meter or meters may be provided and affixed at the expense of the consumer, and the water supplied to be charged for at the aforesaid rate.
- (6.) That the before-mentioned rate is made for one year, commencing on the first day of January 1887, and ending on the thirty-first day of December 1887, and shall be payable quarterly, in advance, on demand, on the first day of January, first day of April, first day of July, and first day of October; and the Secretary to the Trust for the time being shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rate.
- (7.) Any person or persons receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from his or her premises, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or who shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such offence.
- (8.) Any person who shall take or carry away water from any drinking-tap, trough, or private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such offence.
- (9.) Before any person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter or repair, uncover, or in any manner interfere with any pipe of the Trust, or any service-pipe, cock, or fittings connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall obtain from the Trust a license in that behalf to execute such work. Any unlicensed person uncovering, affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fittings as aforesaid shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such offence.
- (10.) Before any license shall be granted by the Trust, the person applying for the same shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent plumber.
- (11.) Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall wilfully offend by opening any ground, so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the Trust, without giving twenty-four hours' notice to the Trust in writing, of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Trust, without the permission in writing being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, valve, pipe-work, or engine, the property of the Trust, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
- (12.) Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, without giving twenty-four hours' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, or who shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of some officer of the Trust, or who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust of a strength and material not sanctioned by the Trust, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

(13.) Iron piping of the following dimensions, namely:—  
Three-quarter inch diameter, or bore, galvanized, of approved quality, will only be allowed for external or internal services. Ordinary connections with submains must be made with proper ferrules, to which a length of not less than three feet of pipe must be attached. One service-pipe only to each tenement, &c., will be permitted. A service-pipe of greater diameter may be allowed by the express approval of the Trust on special application thereto.

(14.) If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the Trust that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe, or otherwise as the Trust may deem fit, until the necessary repairs have been effected. The service-pipes from the main being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupiers (if any), and if none, the owners, shall in every instance in which any damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky, or otherwise out of repair or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

(15.) Any person supplied with water by the Trust, who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

(16.) No meter shall be allowed to be affixed unless the dial of the same register two hundred thousand gallons, except by special permission of the Trust.

(17.) If any meter should cease registering, or be reported by the inspector as out of repair, or registering inaccurately, the Trust shall estimate and charge for the water consumed during the period such meter was not in working order, and until the same is repaired and re-fixed, either by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter, or during the corresponding period of the previous year, or the Trust may insert a check-meter on the service-pipe, such repairs may be executed by the Trust at the expense of the occupier or owner of such tenement; and all persons supplied with water by the Trust are required in the event of any breakage occurring in the pipes or meter, whereby any water may be wasted, to give notice to the Trust's officer within twelve hours of such occurrence; and, in the event of such notice not being given, such person or persons shall be liable for each such offence, to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, or the supply may be discontinued by the Trust.

(18.) Overflow-pipes to private baths or any other vessel will not be permitted.

(19.) Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, connecting any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water without first fixing thereto a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

(20.) Any person or persons guilty of a breach of any of the regulations or conditions herein mentioned, shall be liable to have his or her supply of water discontinued, by a resolution carried at a meeting of said Trust.

(21.) All communications signed by the Secretary to be taken as issued by the Trust.

(22.) In the construction of this bye-law the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation whether aggregate or sole.

## VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

EXCURSIONS TO MELBOURNE IN CONNECTION WITH THE VICTORIA RACING CLUB SPRING MEETING ON 29TH OCTOBER, 1ST, 3RD, AND 5TH NOVEMBER, DERBY, CUP, OAKS, AND STEEPCHASE DAYS.

Return tickets, at Holiday Excursion Fares, will be issued for Melbourne only by all stations (Deniliquin and Mathoura included), from 24th October to 9th November inclusive. Excursion passengers may travel by all ordinary and extra trains to Melbourne on the day the ticket is issued, and return by any train up to the night of the 15th November inclusive. Passengers may also travel by express trains, provided there is ample room. Northern System.—Extra trains will leave Sandhurst on 28th October, at 7 p.m.; 29th October, at 11.50 a.m.; 31st October, at 6.40 and 11.50 a.m., and 3 and 7 p.m.; 1st and 5th November, at 6.40 a.m.; and 9th November, at 3 p.m. These trains will

stop at Castlemaine, Kyneton, Woodend, and Sunbury only, except the 3 p.m., which will stop at Castlemaine and Kyneton, and all stations between Kyneton and Melbourne. Extra trains for passengers, returning after the races, will leave Melbourne at 7.55 p.m. on 1st and 5th November, calling at all stations to Sandhurst; and on 7th and 9th November an extra train will leave Melbourne at 6.44 a.m., calling at Sunbury, Woodend, Kyneton, Castlemaine, and Sandhurst only. Single fares to or from the course: First class, 2s.; second class, 1s. 6d. Tickets will be sold daily for any and all the race days at Spencer street, Prince's Bridge, and Flinders street, on and from Friday, 28th October, and also at Messrs. T. Cook and Son, of the Exchange, on 29th and 31st October, 1st, 3rd, and 5th November. On Derby, Cup, and Steeplechase Days an extra office will be open at the General Post Office for the sale of Railway race tickets for the day only.

#### ALTERATIONS IN SUBURBAN TRAINS ON RACE DAYS.

**Williamstown Line.**—On Cup Day the ordinary time-table will be suspended from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. During the busy portions of the day trains will run every few minutes to Footscray and Williamstown, and at other times every half-hour. On Saturdays, the 29th October and 5th November, extra trains will run to Footscray at short intervals during the busy portion of the day.

### GRANT OF ONE HUNDRED AND FIFTY POUNDS (£150) FOR INVENTION OF MACHINERY FOR THRASHING PEASE.

A SUM not exceeding One hundred and fifty pounds may be paid to any person or company who shall, in the opinion of the Minister of Agriculture, produce a machine capable of thrashing within twelve hours eight hundred bushels of pease without injury thereto.

2. The reward shall be paid only to the inventor, or his agent of such machine as shall most cheaply, efficiently, and rapidly perform the work required, and within the time aforesaid.

3. Persons intending to compete for the reward must give notice in writing of their intention to the Secretary for Agriculture, Melbourne, not later than the 24th November next.

4. One or more trials of the machines shall be made at such place or places and at such times as the Minister may direct.

5. All costs and expenses of forwarding, attendance, and working the machines at the times to be appointed shall be paid by the persons entering the machines for competition.

6. The Minister may appoint three or more judges to report upon the merits of the competing machines, and a decision of a majority of such judges shall be final.

7. The judges may recommend payment of an amount or amounts the total of which shall not exceed One hundred and fifty pounds (£150) to the inventor or inventors, or his or their agent or agents, of the successful machine or machines, such amounts to be apportioned to the value to the colony of the said invention or inventions.

THE subjoined Rules and Regulations for the undermentioned Cemeteries have been submitted to the Governor in Council, in accordance with section 9 of *The Cemeteries Statute 1864* (27 Vict. No. 201).

## CARLSRUHE CEMETERY.

1. All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.
2. By the 19th section of *The Cemeteries Statute 1864*, any person making a vault, or erecting or placing a monument in the cemetery, by and with the permission of the trustees under these rules, and upon payment of the charges therein mentioned, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep a vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the tenor of such permission, to and for the sole and separate use of such person or persons and his or their representatives for ever.
3. Application for such permission to be made at the office of the secretary. A certificate of permission, in the form set out in the schedule, will be granted to the party applying for such permission, on payment of the proper charges.
4. Orders for interment to be given to the secretary of the cemetery; only such order to be given between the hours of 9 a.m. and 3 p.m. the previous day.
5. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug. Parties wanting brick graves or vaults will be required to construct them under the directions of the surveyor; and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent in writing of the party entitled thereto must be left with the order.
6. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death of deceased must be stated at the time of giving the order.
7. The time fixed for the funeral to be the time when the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.
8. Until otherwise ordered, the usual hours fixed for the performance of funerals will be from the hours of 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. in the months of September to April inclusive, and 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. in the other four months, except on Sundays, when the only hours for funerals will be from 2 to 5 o'clock throughout the year.
9. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owner.
10. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of freestone, slate, or iron.
11. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and plan of every monument or tablet proposed to be erected, and a copy of every epitaph or inscription, to be submitted to the trustees for approval, who are required by the 7th section of the Act to determine and fix the position of any monument, according to description, size, and character thereof, having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the said cemetery in an appropriate manner. In the erection of tablets, copper clamps must be used.
12. No servant or other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.
13. The grounds will be open from sunrise to sunset.
14. Any person who shall behave indecorously, or commit any trespass, injury to trees, flowers, or erections, or otherwise infringe the said statute of the regulations for protection of the cemetery, will be proceeded against according to the provisions of the said statute.
15. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these charges or regulations.

## NHILL PUBLIC CEMETERY.

1. All the charges must be paid to the secretary when orders are given, or before the ground is broken or a vault re-opened.
2. On application for permission to make a vault or erect a monument in the cemetery being made to the trustees, a certificate of permission will be granted on payment of the proper fees.
3. Charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such cemetery on the certificate of a minister of religion, or other evidence proving to the satisfaction of the trustees that such person was a pauper, and that the relatives of the deceased were unable to pay the usual fees; subject to the directions of the Governor in Council. *Vide* section 7, *Cemeteries Act 1864*.
4. Order for interment to be given either to the secretary or at the office of the trustees on the previous day, when a form of instruction must be filled up and given to the sexton.
5. The sexton shall dig all ordinary graves, unless otherwise specially ordered, on payment of the proper fees. Parties requiring brick graves or vaults will be required to construct them under the direction of the trustees or any two of them.
6. The time fixed for the funeral must be the time the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.
7. The usual hours for the performance of funerals shall be from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. from September to April inclusive, and from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. in the other four months.
8. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones must be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.
9. Plan of every monument or headstone must be submitted to the trustees for their approval.
10. All persons destroying the fences or in any manner injuring the cemetery will be prosecuted as the law directs.

11. Every coffin in a vault must be bricked in, or cemented, or covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron.

12. A plan of the ground and a register will be kept, which may be examined.

13. The ground will be open daily from sunrise to sunset.

14. The trustees reserve to themselves the right of making any alterations from time to time in these regulations and charges, subject to the approval of His Excellency the Governor in Council.

15. No interments shall be less than six feet in depth for adults and children over seven years of age, nor less than four feet in depth for children under seven years of age.

8. All persons found destroying the fences or in any manner injuring the cemetery will be prosecuted as the law directs.

9. The trustees, if required, will cause all common graves to be dug.

10. When a meeting of trustees is required, the same shall be called by the secretary, three to form a quorum.

11. The friends of deceased persons must erect all monuments, tombs, or fences under the direction of the trustees or whom they may appoint; and plans of every stone, tomb, monument, and pedestal, and a copy of every inscription or epitaph must be submitted to the trustees for their approval prior to the erection of the same.

12. Any fence, monument, gravestone, or epitaph placed in the cemetery contrary to the foregoing rule may be removed by the trustees without notice to and at the expense of the owner.

13. No grave to be at a less depth than five feet.

14. The trustees reserve to themselves the right to make any alteration from time to time in these regulations, subject to the approval of the Governor in Council.



**WE**, Charles Brown Fisher, the Honorable Sir William John Clarke, the Honorable William Pearson, William Leonard, Robert Power, George Watson, Harrie Smith, Septimus Miller, and Matthew O'Shanassy, constituting an absolute majority in number of the Committee of the Victoria Racing Club, do hereby, in exercise of our powers under *The Victoria Racing Club Act 1871*, make the Bye-laws following, that is to say:—
