## "THE PUBLIC SERVICE ACT 1883."—REGULATIONS.

SALARIES—NON-CLERICAL DIVISION.

Act No. 773, Section 41, and Sub-section VIII.

WHEREAS by *The Public Service Act 1883*, section 15, it is enacted that the Non-Clerical Division shall include all persons whose appointment has been determined by priority of registration, in accordance with Regulations to be made as hereinafter provided, and also all persons permanently employed in the Public Service before the passing of this Act, who are not included under the other divisions of the Public Service; And whereas by section 17 of the said Act it is enacted that in the Non-Clerical Division the officers shall be paid such emoluments, salaries, allowances, and wages, in accordance with a fixed amount or a scale to be determined by Regulation, and as may be provided in the annual Appropriation Act: And whereas by section 41 of the said Act it is enacted that the Public Service Board shall make Regulations which shall have full force and effect as soon as approved by the Governor in Council, and may, subject to such approval, from time to time repeal, alter, and amend the same:—For determining a scale or amount to be paid to the persons employed in the different Departments included in the Non-Clerical Division, which, in the opinion of the Board, will be a fair equivalent for the work to be performed by such persons: And whereas the Public Service Board did make Regulations for such purposes, which Regulations were, on the 30th January 1885, approved by the Governor in Council: And whereas the said Regulations were from time to time amended by further Regulations made by the said Public Service Board and approved by the Governor in Council: And whereas it is expedient to alter the said Regulations: Now we, the undersigned, being the Members constituting the Public Service Board, in pursuance of the said powers, do make and declare the following alteration of the said Regulations, and declare that the same shall commence and come into operation as soon as approved as aforesaid:—

SPECIAL NOTICE TO HOLDERS OF ELECTORS' RIGHTS.  
It is hereby notified that holders of electors' rights issued on or before the 1st December 1886 must obtain renewed rights in lieu thereof, in order to have their names placed upon the General Lists to be made up on and after the 1st December next.  
Neglect of this precaution will result in the omission of the names of the persons so neglecting from the new Lists to be made up as aforesaid.  
The old right must in every case be delivered up to the Registrar, but the renewed right will be equally available for any election that may take place before the completion of the new Rolls in January next.

GRANT OF ONE HUNDRED AND FIFTY POUNDS (£150) FOR INVENTION OF MACHINERY FOR THRASHING PEASE.  
A SUM not exceeding One hundred and fifty pounds may be paid to any person or company who shall, in the opinion of the Minister of Agriculture, produce a machine capable of thrashing within twelve hours eight hundred bushels of pease without injury thereto.  
2. The reward shall be paid only to the inventor, or his agent, of such machine as shall most cheaply, efficiently, and rapidly perform the work required, and within the time aforesaid.  
3. Persons intending to compete for the reward must give notice in writing of their intention to the Secretary for Agriculture, Melbourne, not later than the 24th November next.  
4. One or more trials of the machines shall be made at such place or places and at such times as the Minister may direct.  
5. All costs and expenses of forwarding, attendance, and working the machines at the times to be appointed shall be paid by the persons entering the machines for competition.  
6. The Minister may appoint three or more judges to report upon the merits of the competing machines, and a decision of a majority of such judges shall be final.  
7. The judges may recommend payment of an amount or amounts the total of which shall not exceed One hundred and fifty pounds (£150) to the inventor or inventors, or his or their agent or agents, of the successful machine or machines, such amounts to be apportioned to the value to the colony of the said invention or inventions.

**BYE-LAW No. 58.**

THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS, by virtue of the powers and authorities vested in them by *The Victorian Railways Commissioners Act 1883*, do hereby make the following Bye-law for fixing the charges for Parcels, Carriages, and Luggage, and all Bye-laws conflicting therewith are hereby repealed:—

## PARCELS RATES.

1. The Rates for Parcels, whether prepaid or to pay, forwarded at the Owners' risk or at the risk of the Commissioners as common carriers, will be according to the rates and conditions here following:—

2. Newspaper Parcels under 7 lbs. in weight can be forwarded any distance on being stamped with a Halfpenny stamp (Freight or Postage) for each paper they contain if it is to the advantage of the Sender to do so.

3. Press Parcels or Despatches not exceeding 1 lb. each can be forwarded any distance on being stamped with one Penny stamp.

4. Single Newspapers 3s. 3d. per quarter, payable in advance.

5. Packed Parcels in hampers, crates, bags, cases, or other packages to be charged *quadruple* the above rates, and the onus of proving that Parcels are not packed to rest with consignors or consignees.

6. All Stamps affixed to Parcels must bear the *signature of the sender* as agreeing to the conditions of carriage, otherwise the Stamps will be treated as informal and cancelled, and the Parcels will be way-billed at Unstamped Parcels Rates.

7. When two or more Parcels are consigned to one person the above rates are charged on each Parcel separately.

PERISHABLES (TO BE PREPAID).

8. Fish, Fruit, Butter, Eggs, Milk, Dead Game or Poultry, Fresh Rabbit Skins, Ice, and Vegetables to be charged the above rates, stamped or not stamped, as the case may be, or *4th Class Goods Rates* (except Fish, which is charged as per Clause 8A) if carried at *owner's risk* and consigned on *owner's risk notes* (Form 86A), and *9d. per ton per mile* if carried at the *risk of the carrier*. The minimums as per Goods Tariff to be enforced. All Perishables carried at either of these rates to be prepaid in cash or stamps, and way-billed on the usual Parcels Way-bill, and must be at the station half an hour before train starting time.

8A. Fresh Fish by Passenger trains to be charged as follows on all lines, Suburban excepted, viz.:—

For the first 100 miles ... ..	4d. per ton per mile.
For every mile over 100, and not exceeding 200 ... ..	3d. per ton per mile.
For every mile over 200 ... ..	2d. per ton per mile.

With 1s. per ton terminal added—Minimum 3s. for any distance. Must be at the station half an hour before train starting time, and be consigned on Form 86A.

9. Bicycles, Feathers, Furniture, Glass, Hats, Bonnet or Hat Boxes, Cases of Millinery, Straw Bonnets, Mirrors (loose), Musical Instruments, Perambulators, Sulkies in Pieces, Pictures, Sewing Machines, Wickerwork, Live Sucking Pigs in cases, Wire Cages (loose), or other articles light or fragile, are considered admeasurement goods, and will be charged 50 per cent. additional on the above rates. Unstamped Parcels containing articles and property of a description not mentioned or specified in the first section of the Act of the Parliament of Victoria numbered 78, such articles and property being over £10 in value, shall, in addition to the amount chargeable by the foregoing scale of rates, be charged a further sum equal to one per centum upon the declared value thereof.

BOOKS LENT TO FREE OR PUBLIC LIBRARIES.

10. Books lent to Free or Public Libraries having paid full Parcels Rates one way will be returned free. A declaration that they have paid full rates, and giving the date, must accompany each consignment.

BOOKS ON HIRE.

11. Parcels of books on hire from circulating libraries having paid full Stamped Parcels Rates one way will be returned free. To obtain this concession, however, proprietors of libraries must enter into a bond that their parcels will contain nothing besides books for hire, and must adopt a distinctive label to be approved of by the Commissioners.

12. *Carrier's Stationery Parcels* pay ordinary rates.

13. *Consignee's Letters* 1d. each, prepaid by Freight Stamp.

14. Returned Empties by Passenger trains, if prepaid, will be carried according to the following scale, but only provided the Station-master is satisfied that the Packages have been previously sent at Parcels Rates by Passenger trains, and that they are unlocked or open for inspection when brought for carriage, and remain so until they are discharged from the van. If not prepaid, either by Stamps or Cash, ordinary Parcels Rates will be charged.

16. The Freight Stamp should be affixed, as nearly as possible, in the same relative position on the Parcel as is the postage stamp on a letter, that is, on the right-hand side and close to the address. Where the Package, being such as Meat, a Bag, a Crate, a Cage, &c., does not admit of this, the Freight Stamp should be attached on a separate and secure label.

17. In regard to Stamped Parcels upon which, when brought to a station to be carried by railway, charges have been already incurred, the Commissioners will not recognise such charges in any way, either by cash payment thereof or by account as "paid on."

18. Newspapers, in packages, and Press Parcels must be open at the sides, so that the contents can be ascertained. Packages entirely covered, or covered so that the contents cannot be ascertained, will be carried at the rates for ordinary Parcels. Milk Cans must be legibly stamped with the name of the station from which they are sent, so as to facilitate the punctual return of empty cans. The labels should be durable, made of wood or metal, and distinctly addressed. "Money Parcels," whether stamped or not, must be so addressed, and if over the value of £10 such value must be declared.

19. The Commissioners will not be common carriers of live poultry, nor are they to be received if tied by the legs; they must be in coops, cases, or crates.

20. The rates for Perishables do not include loading or unloading, in which the servants of the senders and consignees must assist if required. These rates are strictly conditional that the Regulations in reference thereto are complied with; in default thereof, the rates for ordinary Parcels will be charged.

21. All Parcels, whether stamped or not, must be brought to the station at least fifteen minutes before the time fixed for the departure of the train they are to be sent by.

22. The delivery of Stamped Parcels, after they have been carried by railway, may be made, irrespectively of the ownership thereof, to the person who, from his description of the Parcel or other evidence, appears to represent the owner or his agent, or to any licensed carrier.

23. Every care will be taken for the delivery of Parcels stamped, but without responsibility, as per conditions set forth on the Stamps, as the rates in Clause 1 are strictly conditional that Stamped Parcels to whomsoever delivered are, solely at the risk of the owner.

24. A receipt will be given, if demanded, for Parcels not stamped carried at the rates provided by Clause 1, and for Perishables carried at Goods Rates.

25. Receipt will be given for Stamped Parcels *only on the form approved of by the Commissioners.*

26. Each Stamped Parcel must be securely covered and addressed to its destination irrespectively of the writing upon the Freight Stamp. Separate Parcels which are merely tied together must each be stamped. Returned Empties, if securely tied together, may be prepaid by one or more stamps of the required value on the outside package.

27. When the Freight Stamps affixed are not of full value for the weight or distance, and the sender omits or refuses to affix the additional stamps necessary, the stamp will be cancelled and the Parcel forwarded at Unstamped Parcels Rates.

28. Freight Stamps will be sold at all stations, and also by licensed vendors.

29. The Parcels Clerk on receiving a Stamped Parcel for carriage will mark the Freight Stamp thereon with the name of the station. This mark is to be made on the right-hand side of the Freight Stamp. The receiving station will also mark the Stamp on the left-hand side of the Freight Stamp.

30. Nothing in these Regulations affects the rate for Gold, Live Stock, Wool, Dangerous Goods, Horses, Dogs, and the exceptions provided by the Act of Parliament of Victoria numbered 78.

31. Unstamped Parcels containing any of the articles mentioned in the first section of the Act of Parliament of Victoria numbered 78 shall be charged the following increased rates, namely:—Over £10 and under £50 in value, Double, and over £50 in value, Quadruple Unstamped Parcels Rates, as shown above.

32. Nothing in these rates affects the Parcels Rates now in force on the Suburban Lines.

33. Corpses, under 40 miles, 20s. each; above 40 miles, 6d. per mile. Corpses will not be forwarded, unless a certificate is produced from the medical attendant at time of decease setting forth that death was not caused by any contagious or infectious disease.

#### COMMERCIAL TRAVELLERS' SAMPLES.

34. Travellers travelling on first-class tickets will be allowed  $1\frac{1}{2}$  cwt. samples free. Anything over that weight will be carried at "Half Excess Luggage" Rates—minimum 1 cwt., and maximum 10 cwt. Over 10 cwt. a carriage truck must be employed, at 6d. per truck per mile—minimum 20 miles, and maximum weight 50 cwt. Travellers must produce an authority from the firms they represent. They can forward their samples by any ordinary train at these rates, notwithstanding they do not accompany them, on signing Risk Note Form (86D). Samples can be booked through, and the journey may be broken for a period not exceeding fourteen days. They must be way-billed through to final destination by the station of original departure, the remark "Journey broken" being made on way-bill, and signed by way-billing clerk. One of the Forms (91) must at the same time be filled up and handed to the traveller, who must present it at each station he stops at, where he will sign for his samples on taking delivery. On presenting them again for transmission, the Form to be handed to the Station-master, who will enter the next destination on it, initial it, and hand it back to the traveller. Samples sent under these Regulations must be fully prepaid. These rates will also apply to samples in excess of the quantity included in a periodical ticket, provided it is booked beforehand. *If found in excess at the conclusion of a journey, full Parcels Rates to be charged.* Travellers holding annual tickets for their samples as well as themselves, are allowed the privilege of 24 hours' free cloak-room, and of their samples preceding or following them *one train*, without being required to sign Risk Note Form (86D). Samples must be properly booked at the Parcels Office at least fifteen minutes before the train departure time; every information being given as to whether the traveller accompanies them or not, and the proper forms filled up and signed. Samples must be contained in Tins or Leather Packages of a handy size, and must have the firm's name or initials legibly painted on them. If contained in cases or other packages in which merchandise for sale is generally packed, ordinary Parcels Rates will be charged. Samples cannot be booked from one main line to another, with the journey to be broken at Melbourne. If it is intended to break the journey at Melbourne, they cannot be booked beyond that station, and must be booked afresh on resuming the journey. Travellers must claim their samples on arrival at destination; and, if they do not wish to take immediate delivery, must properly book them at the Cloak Room, otherwise they will be treated as overlanded, and charged full Parcels Rates. Any samples not booked in accordance with the foregoing Regulations will be charged as ordinary parcels.

#### CARRIAGE RATES.

35. Carriages, Gigs, Dog Carts, and Vehicles of a similar description will be charged for at the rate of 6d. per mile, subject, however, that the sum of £1 shall be the minimum charge in any case. Two vehicles belonging to the same owner, and loaded on one truck, 9d. per truck per mile, if owner accepts all risks. Three vehicles on same terms, 1s. per truck per mile; minimum Twenty shillings. For Vehicles sent for repair, Return Tickets available for four weeks will be issued at 50 per cent. additional on these rates.

Carriages, Gigs, Dog Carts, and Vehicles of a similar description, not taken delivery of within twenty-four hours after arrival, will be charged storage at the rate of 2s. 6d. each for the first day, 2s. for the second day, and 1s. 6d. for each succeeding day, or part of a day, until removed from the Railway premises. The Commissioners do not undertake to forward Carriages by any particular time or train; but when required to be sent, twenty-four hours' notice should be given, and they must be at the forwarding station one hour before the departure of the train.

LUGGAGE.

36. First class passengers are allowed to carry 84 lbs., Second class passengers 56 lbs., free of charge, the same to consist of *bonâ fide luggage only*, and to be contained in a bag, carpet bag, trunk, box, portmanteau, or valise, or any other package commonly used for its carriage. If in chests of drawers, cases, or other packages which usually contain merchandise, they will be charged as Parcels. All excess above that weight will be charged at the undermentioned "Excess Luggage" Rates. Passengers having Luggage must deliver it to the Station Porter fifteen minutes before the starting of the train, so as to give sufficient time to have it weighed (if in excess), checked, and stowed. No luggage will be allowed to be placed in the carriages unless of such size that it can be placed under or over the seat without inconvenience to other passengers; but the Commissioners do not hold themselves liable for the loss of luggage, whether free or at excess rates, unless the Regulations for the carriage of the same exhibited at all stations have been complied with.

Passengers must have their names, and the Station to which they are proceeding, distinctly marked on their luggage, and satisfy themselves that it is placed on the trains. *If left behind and forwarded by a subsequent train through neglect of this precaution, ordinary Parcels Rates will be charged.* To prevent mistakes, they should have all old labels removed from their luggage. The Commissioners will not hold themselves liable for any package not distinctly addressed, or for which the owner has not obtained a Luggage Check as per Regulations; nor for any package of luggage, whether "checked" or "Excess," whose value shall exceed the sum of £10, unless such value shall be declared at the time of booking; and a further sum equal to one per centum upon such declared value paid.

Excess luggage or dogs cannot be booked through from stations on the Northern and Western Lines to stations on the Southern Lines and *vice versâ*. They can only be booked to Melbourne, and the transfer between Spencer-street and Prince's bridge or Flinders-street must be looked after by owners.

A bicycle accompanied by the owner in the same train, he having no other luggage, and accepting all risks, to be charged as follows, viz:—

LEFT LUGGAGE OR CLOAK ROOM CHARGES.

38. Every large Parcel 6d.; every small Parcel 3d., for twenty-four hours. Over that time an extra charge of 2d. per diem on large, and 1d. per diem on small Parcels to be made. *Passengers' Luggage left in a train or at a station and subsequently claimed are also charged these rates; and likewise Parcels arriving at stations addressed "To be left till called for," if such Parcels are not taken delivery of in forty-eight hours after arrival at the respective stations.* The Commissioners will not, however, be responsible for any Parcel left in Cloak Room or Left Luggage Office whose value shall exceed the sum of £10, unless such value shall at the time of booking be declared, and a further sum equal to one per centum upon such declared value be paid.

Passengers who lose their Cloak-room Tickets must make a declaration to that effect (on Form 13D) before delivery can be given.

15 and 16 years of age, £45 per annum; 17 years, £55 per annum; 18 years and upwards, £65 per annum. Successful candidates will be allocated according to the requirements of the service.

Candidates must not be under 15 nor over 21 years of age; and must produce a certificate of having passed an examination by the Examiners appointed in that behalf in the following subjects, viz.:—Reading and explanation, dictation, writing, arithmetic, grammar, geography, as taught in the Sixth class of State schools.

Candidates must be strong, healthy, and active.

They must prepare their applications *in their own handwriting*, stating their age, and, where a standard is fixed, their exact height, without boots or socks, otherwise their names will not be registered.

For such examination they are to pay 10s. 6d. each into the hands of the Secretary.

In case the number of Candidates be more than three times the number of persons required, such Candidates will be reduced by lot to such number.

Minimum penalty for breach of Regulation, £10.

PUBLIC LIBRARY, MUSEUMS, AND NATIONAL GALLERY OF VICTORIA.

THE majority of the Trustees for the time being of the body politic and corporate named the Public Library, Museums, and National Gallery of Victoria do hereby repeal the Rules of the National Gallery, sections one to twenty-four, both inclusive, made on the 23rd day of December 1886, by the majority for the time being of the above-named Trustees, and in lieu thereof do hereby make the following rules, that is to say:—

THE NATIONAL GALLERY.

Rules for Students in the Schools of Drawing and Painting.

1. The period of studentship is limited to five years, but it may be extended from time to time by the permission of the trustees in favour of meritorious students on report from the director. It is divided into two courses; the first for drawing, the second for painting.

2. The year is divided into two terms, the first term commencing on the third Monday, and ending on the Saturday before the twenty-sixth Monday in the year, and the second term commencing on the twenty-eighth Monday, and ending on the Saturday before the forty-ninth Monday in the year.

3. An applicant for admission as a student shall submit specimens of drawing to the director. If such specimens be considered satisfactory, the applicant shall be admitted on probation, and shall prepare drawings within the school of drawing; and on the same being approved by the director, the applicant shall, on payment of fees, be registered as a student.

4. If an applicant for admission be found endeavouring to impose upon the director, by presenting drawings not being the applicant's unaided work, he or she shall not, for a period of two years, be admitted as a student.

5. At the end of each term students shall submit drawings to the trustees; and if at the end of the fourth term the drawings of any student be considered unsatisfactory by the trustees, he or she shall cease to be a student.

6. Before admission to the school of painting, a student shall submit to the trustees a drawing of a figure from the antique, a figure from life, a head from the antique, a head from life, and a perspective drawing, done in the school of drawing, and if such drawings be approved, shall be admitted.

7. Every third year a gold medal may be awarded for the best painting done in the school, or, in the case of a landscape, under the supervision of the director, by a student who has attended the school of painting for not less than three nor more than nine terms.

8. This gold medal will carry a travelling scholarship of £150 a year, tenable for three years.

9. The holder of this scholarship shall study painting in one of the great art schools of Europe, to be approved by the trustees, and shall, during each of the first two years, paint and present to the trustees a copy of some well-known painting by an old master.

10. During the third year he or she shall paint and present to the trustees an original picture.

11. The trustees shall have power to cancel the scholarship in case the above conditions be not complied with, or in case of improper conduct on the part of the holder.

12. An exhibition of the students' works shall be held annually in the month of June.

13. No student who has been awarded a first prize at the annual exhibition of the students' works shall be eligible to compete for a similar prize in the same department in subsequent years. But this will not disqualify such prize-holder from competing with the same or other painting for the travelling scholarship.

14. Students shall pay in advance to the librarian the term fee fixed by the trustees, and will not be admitted to the class-rooms except upon production of the receipt.

15. No person will be allowed to copy any picture, drawing, or work of art in the galleries of painting and sculpture without having first obtained permission in writing from the committee; and such permission shall specify the part or parts of any such picture, drawing, or work of art not to be included in the copy.

16. All students shall sign the students' book on every day they attend, before entering the gallery.

17. All students shall, when leaving the gallery, remove or carefully put away all materials used by them in drawing or painting.

18. The committee will not be responsible for the loss of or injury to property which any student may have left in the gallery.

19. Any irregularity or unbecoming conduct on the part of any student will subject the student so offending to suspension, on the written order of the director; and the offence, when proved to the satisfaction of the committee, shall subject such student to be excluded for such period as the committee may think fit; provided that in case of suspension the matter shall be reported by the director to the committee within three days.

20. No work done by students of the art schools under the supervision of the director is to be exhibited at any outside exhibition previous to being submitted for competition at the students' annual exhibition.

WHEREAS by the 133rd section of *The Land Act 1884* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make and alter or rescind rules and regulations, or to rescind any rules and regulations heretofore made, for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering in or upon such

public parks and reserves: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby rescind the Regulation made by the said Board on 19th May 1874, in respect of the land in the township of Bairnsdale, temporarily reserved by Order of 4th May 1874, as a site for the use of all present and future Friendly Societies at Bairnsdale.—(Corr. 87.R.26616.)

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, made in pursuance of *The Land Act 1869*, and bearing date the third day of October One thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, certain portions of Crown lands in the parishes therein specified were notified and proclaimed as roads: And whereas it is expedient to revoke in part the said proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the said proclamation bearing date as aforesaid so far only as it relates to the portion of land in the parish of Maribyrnong comprised within the boundaries defined by description hereunder, that is to say:—

Three acres one rood sixteen perches, county of Bourke, parish of Maribyrnong: Commencing at the south angle of allotment K of section 13; bounded thence by that allotment bearing N. 48° E. four chains and N. 0° 42' E. six chains thirty-six links; and thence by lines bearing respectively S. 47° 13' E. eight chains seventy-seven links, S. 64° 34' W. seven chains twenty-five links, and N. 89° 18' W. two chains ninety-four links to the point of commencement.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1884* it was amongst other things enacted that, notwithstanding anything therein before contained, the Governor might by Proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, should cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber or particular description of timber or bark, stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick, or other earth from such portions of Crown lands as were named in such Proclamation, or should exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any license granted under the authority of Part VIII. of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power conferred by the above-recited Act, do by this my Proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut, dig, or remove timber on or from the Crown lands in the parishes of Boreang and Jalur, and comprised within the boundaries hereunder described viz:—

Twenty-five thousand three hundred and forty-two acres, more or less, counties of Borung and Dundas, parishes of Boreang and Jalur, being agricultural and grazing blocks 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, and 17, parish of Boreang, and agricultural and grazing blocks 59, 65, 66, 67, 73, 74, 75, 76, 77, 78, 79, and 80, parish of Jalur.

The births of 1,301 children, viz., 675 boys and 626 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of September. In the month of August 1,430 births were registered, or 129 more than in the month under review. The births were 434 above the average of the month during the previous ten years, but only 216 above that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in September numbered 553, viz., 323 of males and 230 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 748, or 135 per cent. The deaths were fewer than those in August by 103, but exceeded the average of September during the previous ten years by 132. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have exceeded that average by 26.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was 3.50, and of deaths registered 1.49.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 73.1° on the 18th, and the lowest was 55.2° on the 20th. The mean temperature of the month (51.8°) was exactly two degrees below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (30.9°) took place on the 20th, viz., from a maximum of 66.1° to a minimum of 35.2°. The least range (8.4°) was on the 7th and 23rd, viz., on the first of those days, from a maximum of 52.9° to a minimum of 44.5°, and on the second from a maximum of 57.8° to a minimum of 49.4°. The mean daily range was 15.1°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.316 inches on the 13th, and the lowest was 29.316 inches on the 24th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.834 inches) was slightly below the average.

Rain fell on 19 days, the amount of rainfall being 2.71 inches. The average rainfall in September during the previous ten years was 2.16 inches, or rather more than half-an-inch (.55) below that in the month under notice.

Fog occurred on 1 day during the month.

Males contributed 58 per cent., and females 42 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 28 per cent. to that mortality, as against 34 per cent. in September 1886, 27 per cent. in September 1885, 38 per cent. in September 1884, 32 per cent. in September 1883, 35 per cent. in September 1882, 28 per cent. in September 1881, 36 per cent. in September 1880, 31 per cent. in September 1879, 30 per cent. in September 1878, and 38 per cent. in September 1877.

The deaths of 35 persons who had attained or passed the age of 75 years were recorded during the month, viz.:—Those of a laborer, aged 75, who died of cancer; a farmer and a laborer, each aged 75, a bootmaker and a female, each aged 76, and a female, aged 87, of heart disease; a female, aged 75, a laborer, aged 79, and a shepherd, aged 82, of asthma; a female, aged 75, a gardener, aged 77, a laundress, aged 80, and a draper, aged 84, of pneumonia; a gardener, aged 77, a cabinetmaker, aged 82, and a carpenter, aged 83, of bronchitis; a gentleman, aged 76, and a shipbuilder, aged 78, of disease of the bladder and prostate; a female boarding-house keeper, aged 77, of hemiplegia; a male, of no occupation, aged 78, of hernia; a female, aged 80, of Bright's disease; a female,

aged 80, and a female, aged 87, of congestion of the lungs; a female, aged 81, of diarrhoea; a cattle-dealer, aged 82, of paralysis; a cable-chain maker, aged 78, two females, each aged 78, a gentleman, aged 80, a gardener and a female, each aged 82, a male cook, aged 83, a female, aged 86, a female, aged 87, and a female, said to be aged 101, of old age.

Thirty-two deaths were ascribed to external causes during the month, of which 29 were set down to accident and 3 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A male infant, aged 18 months, died of fracture of the skull, caused by a kick from a horse; a fireman, aged 24, was killed by falling from an engine; a cabdriver, aged 47, died of compound fracture of the leg, the result of a fall from a vehicle; a plasterer, aged 26, and a laborer, aged 38, of injuries received through falling from a scaffold; a female, aged 37, of compression of blood on the brain, occasioned by a fall on the head; and a laborer, aged 45, of fracture of the skull, consequent on a fall whilst walking. A painter, aged 69, died of injuries to the head, caused by being thrown from a buggy; a boy, aged 14, was passed over by a cab; three railway porters, one aged 20 and two each aged 21, a foreman of the Railway Telegraph Department, aged 50, a female, aged 49, and a gentleman, aged 64, were passed over by railway trains. A carter, aged 35, died of tetanus supervening on an injury to the head; a male child, aged 1, and a female child, aged 3, of scalds; a female, aged 48, a laborer, aged 51, and a female, aged 65, of burns, the first through falling down stairs and upsetting a lamp; a school boy, aged 8, a girl, aged 10, a female, aged 26, a sailor, aged 45, and a miner, aged 55, were drowned; and a gardener, aged 45, was found drowned in the River Yarra; and a female infant, aged 14 days, and a male infant, aged 3 months, were overlain. The suicidal deaths were those of two males, of occupation unknown, aged 28 and 35 respectively, who shot themselves; and of a plasterer, aged 62, who poisoned himself with chlorodyne.

One hundred and twenty-two deaths, or 22 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—49 in the Melbourne Hospital, 10 in the Alfred Hospital, 4 in the Homoeopathic Hospital, 1 in the Children's Hospital, 7 in the Women's Hospital, 8 in the Immigrants' Home, 15 in the Benevolent Asylum, 4 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 13 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 5 in the Austin Hospital, 1 in the Melbourne Gaol, 1 in the Industrial Schools, 1 in the Infant Asylum, 2 in the Protestant Refuge, and 1 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 156, of which 96, or 62 per cent., were of males, and 60, or 38 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 112 were under one year of age, 18 were between one and two, 9 were between two and three, 9 were between three and four, and 8 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 397. Of these, 227, or 57 per cent., were males, and 170, or 43 per cent., were females; 18 were between five and ten, 9 were between ten and fifteen, 14 were between fifteen and twenty, 21 were between twenty and twenty-five, 23 were between twenty-five and thirty, 24 were between thirty and thirty-five, 33 were between thirty-five and forty, 26 were between forty and forty-five, 40 were between forty-five and fifty, 34 were between fifty and fifty-five, 32 were between fifty-five and sixty, 31 were between sixty and sixty-five, 36 were between sixty-five and seventy, 22 were between seventy and seventy-five, 17 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 18 were upwards of eighty.

In September, as compared with the previous month, deaths from specific febrile or zymotic diseases decreased from 60 to 34, and those from local diseases from 363 to 292. Under the zymotic head, deaths from measles fell from 14 to 4, those from whooping-cough from 4 to 1, those from typhoid fever from 9 to 7, and those from diarrheal diseases from 11 to 7. Under the local head, deaths from brain and nerve disorders fell from 77 to 69, those from heart affections from 59 to 47, those from lung and chest complaints from 129 to 97, and those from bowel and stomach diseases from 53 to 38. Eight deaths of child-bearing women occurred during the month, as against 4 in August. If these numbers be compared with the births registered during the same months, it will follow that 1 death of a mother took place to every 163 children born alive in the month under notice, and 1 to every 358 such children in the previous month.

BOROUGH ECHUCA WATER TRUST.—REGULATION.

The Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulation, made by the Borough Echuca Water Trust, in accordance with the powers conferred by sections 44, 54, and 56 of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1881*, No. 716, and also section 12 of *The Victorian Water Conservation Acts 1881-1883*, No. 829.

The Commissioners of the Borough Echuca Water Trust in pursuance of the powers conferred by sections 44, 54, and 56 of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1881*, No. 716, and also section 12 of *The Victorian Water Conservation Acts 1881-1883*, No. 829, do make the following regulation:—

Regulation No. 1.

Regulations for imposing, levying, and receiving water rates and charges within the Borough Echuca Water Trust district.

That the following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements within the district of the Borough Echuca Water Trust for the year 1887, namely, a rate of Five pounds per centum per annum on the annual valuation of lands and tenements respectively, the same to be payable in advance on the first day of every calendar month: provided always that the amount of rates payable in respect of any lands or tenements shall not be less than the minimum fixed in that behalf by the Governor in Council.

Meters.

The rate or charge for water supplied by meter shall be Three shillings per thousand gallons (1,000).

The charge for water supplied from the Trust stand-pipes shall be Three shillings per thousand gallons.

The foregoing regulation was duly made and adopted by the Commissioners of the Borough Echuca Water Trust, at their office, Echuca, on the First day of June. And the seal of the Trust was affixed thereto this Seventeenth day of June in the year One thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven—1887.

MOOROOPNA WATERWORKS TRUST.—REGULATIONS.

The Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations made by the Mooroopna Waterworks Trust, in accordance with the provisions of *The Victorian Water Conservation Acts* (Nos. 778 and 829).

REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS by Order of His Excellency the Governor in Council bearing date the thirteenth day of August 1886, the Councillors of the Shire of Rodney for the time being, and one other person named in such Order in Council, to wit, Samuel A. Edmonds, were appointed under the provisions and within the meaning of the Acts of the Parliament of Victoria, numbered 716 and 778, to be the Commissioners of the Waterworks Trust for the Waterworks District within the said shire.

Now the said Commissioners do hereby, pursuant to and in the exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon them by

*The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1883 and 1884*, do order and make the Regulations following:—

The following rates and charges are those which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by this Trust:—

1. (1.) For every house or tenement under Ten pounds sterling annual value, the sum of One pound sterling per annum.
- (2.) For every house or tenement of Ten pounds sterling annual value or over, an amount equal to Ten pounds per centum on the amount of the annual valuation.
2. (1.) That water may be supplied by the Trust by measurement, at the rate of Three shillings per one thousand gallons (or at such prices as may be specially agreed upon).
- (2.) That the charge for supplying one thousand gallons or any less quantity, at the standpipe at the water tower, be at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence for one thousand gallons.
- (3.) That water may be sold by meter for irrigation purposes, at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per one thousand gallons; but water shall not be supplied in such cases except by special permission granted on application to the Trust.
- (4.) For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, One pound per annum on each inch diameter of the cylinder.
- (5.) That the Trust may cause a meter or meters to be affixed in any case where they may consider it necessary, and such meter or meters may be provided and affixed at the expense of the consumer, and the water supplied to be charged for at the aforesaid rate.
- (6.) That the before-mentioned rate is made for one year, commencing on the first day of January 1887, and ending on the thirty-first day of December 1887, and shall be payable quarterly, in advance, on demand, on the first day of January, first day of April, first day of July, and first day of October; and the Secretary to the Trust for the time being shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rate.
- (7.) Any person or persons receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from his or her premises, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or who shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such offence.
- (8.) Any person who shall take or carry away water from any drinking-tap, trough, or private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such offence.
- (9.) Before any person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter or repair, uncover, or in any manner interfere with any pipe of the Trust, or any service-pipe, cock, or fittings connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall obtain from the Trust a license in that behalf to execute such work. Any unlicensed person uncovering, affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fittings as aforesaid shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such offence.
- (10.) Before any license shall be granted by the Trust, the person applying for the same shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent plumber.
- (11.) Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall wilfully offend by opening any ground, so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the Trust, without giving twenty-four hours' notice to the Trust in writing, of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Trust, without the permission in writing being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, valve, pipe-work, or engine, the property of the Trust, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
- (12.) Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, without giving twenty-four hours' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, or who shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of some officer of the Trust, or who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust of a strength and material not sanctioned by the Trust, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
- (13.) Iron piping of the following dimensions, namely:— Three-quarter inch diameter, or bore, galvanized, of approved quality, will only be allowed for external or internal services. Ordinary connections with submains must be made with proper ferrules, to which a length of not less than three feet of pipe must be attached. One service-pipe only to each tenement, &c., will be permitted. A service-pipe of greater diameter may be allowed by the express approval of the Trust on special application thereto.
- (14.) If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the Trust that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe, or otherwise as the Trust may deem fit, until the necessary repairs have been effected. The service-pipes from the main being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupiers (if any), and if none, the owners, shall in every instance in which any damage shall be caused

by reason of such service-pipe being leaky, or otherwise out of repair or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

(15.) Any person supplied with water by the Trust, who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

(16.) No meter shall be allowed to be affixed unless the dial of the same register two hundred thousand gallons, except by special permission of the Trust.

(17.) If any meter should cease registering, or be reported by the inspector as out of repair, or registering inaccurately, the Trust shall estimate and charge for the water consumed during the period such meter was not in working order, and until the same is repaired and re-fixed, either by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter, or during the corresponding period of the previous year, or the Trust may insert a check-meter on the service-pipe, such repairs may be executed by the Trust at the expense of the occupier or owner of such tenement; and all persons supplied with water by the Trust are required in the event of any breakage occurring in the pipes or meter, whereby any water may be wasted, to give notice to the Trust's officer within twelve hours of such occurrence; and, in the event of such notice not being given, such person or persons shall be liable for each such offence, to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, or the supply may be discontinued by the Trust.

(18.) Overflow-pipes to private baths or any other vessel will not be permitted.

(19.) Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, connecting any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water without first fixing thereto a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

(20.) Any person or persons guilty of a breach of any of the regulations or conditions herein mentioned, shall be liable to have his or her supply of water discontinued, by a resolution carried at a meeting of said Trust.

(21.) All communications signed by the Secretary to be taken as issued by the Trust.

(22.) In the construction of this bye-law the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation whether aggregate or sole.

WHEREAS by *The Irrigation Act 1886* it is provided that, upon the request, in writing, of the majority of the commissioners of any irrigation trust constituted before the passing of the *Irrigation Act*, the Governor in Council may, by Order in Council, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, declare such irrigation trust to be a trust under the said Act: And whereas the Leaghur and Meering Irrigation Trust is an irrigation trust duly constituted before the passing of the said *Irrigation Act 1886*: And whereas the majority of the commissioners of the said Leaghur and Meering Irrigation Trust have made a request, in writing, for an order by the Governor in Council declaring the said Leaghur and Meering Irrigation Trust to be a trust under the said *Irrigation Act 1886*: And whereas the Governor in Council, being satisfied that the requirements of the said Act have been duly complied with by the said majority of commissioners of the said Leaghur and Meering Irrigation Trust, and being satisfied that it is expedient and proper that the said request should be granted, has determined to grant the same, subject to the provisions hereinafter contained: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in accordance with the provisions of and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said *Irrigation Act 1886*, doth, for the purpose aforesaid, declare, order, and appoint:—

1. That the said Leaghur and Meering Irrigation Trust shall be, and the said irrigation trust is hereby declared to be, as from the date of this order, an irrigation and water supply trust under the said *Irrigation Act 1886*.
2. That the limits and boundaries of the district within which such irrigation and water supply trust shall have authority, and which shall henceforth be an irrigation and water supply district, shall be those contained within the limits and boundaries of the area of the said irrigation trust, the subject of this order, as such limits and boundaries are set out and described in the First Schedule hereto.

3. That the name of the said irrigation and water supply district shall be the "Leaghur and Meering Irrigation and Water Supply District," and the corporate name of the said irrigation and water supply trust shall be the "Leaghur and Meering Irrigation and Water Supply Trust."

4. That the scheme of the said Leaghur and Meering Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall be the irrigation of the said irrigation and water supply district, by means of water to be diverted from the Sheepwash Creek, and the distribution of such water upon the lands of the said district by means of channels and gravitation; and that the works to be constructed and maintained by the said Leaghur and Meering Irrigation and Water Supply Trust are those set out in the Second Schedule hereto.

5. The total amount of money to be expended on the scheme is Six hundred and fifty pounds sterling, and the sum to be expended, including the expense of obtaining the order constituting the said Leaghur and Meering Irrigation Trust, is not to exceed Six hundred and fifty pounds.

6. The number of persons to be elected as commissioners of the said Leaghur and Meering Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall be six, and the period for which such commissioners shall hold office shall be three years.

7. Any moneys which may be borrowed by the said Leaghur and Meering Irrigation and Water Supply Trust under this order and the provisions of *The Irrigation Act 1886* shall not, with any balances due, exceed the sum of Six hundred and fifty pounds.

8. No rate made by the said Leaghur and Meering Irrigation and Water Supply Trust under the provisions of *The Irrigation Act 1886* shall exceed the sum of £10 per centum upon the annual valuation of the property within the trust district subject to such rate.

#### FIRST SCHEDULE.

Commencing at the south-east angle of allotment 1A, parish of Leaghur; thence easterly by the southern boundary of the said allotment and a line in the same direction to a point in the eastern boundary of allotment 37; thence southerly by the eastern boundary of said allotment 37 to the south-east angle thereof; thence westerly by the south boundary of said allotment to the south-west angle thereof; thence northerly by the western boundary of said allotment and allotment 37A to the north-west angle of last-named allotment; thence easterly by a portion of the north boundary of allotment 37A to a point in line with the western boundary of allotment 38; thence by a line and the western boundary of allotments 38, 39, 40, 65, and 66, all in the parish of Leaghur, to the north-west angle of the last-named allotment; thence easterly by a portion of the northern boundary of said allotment 66 to the south-west angle of allotment 67; thence by the western boundary of allotment 67, parish of Leaghur, allotments 10 and 11, parish of Meering, and a line in the same direction to a point in the southern boundary of allotment 11B of the last-named parish; thence westerly by the southern boundary of said allotment 11B to the south-west angle of same; thence northerly by the east side of a road bounding allotments 11B, 12, and 13 to the north-west angle of the last-named allotment; thence easterly by the northern boundary and southerly by the eastern boundary of said allotment 13 to a point in line with the northern boundaries of allotments 5B and 5A to the north-east angle of last-named allotment; thence in a general direction southerly by the eastern boundaries of allotments 5A, 6, 6A, 7, 8, 9, and the reserve under 110th section of *The Land Act 1869* to the south-east angle of said reserve, all in the parish of Meering; thence in a general direction southerly by the eastern boundaries of allotments 2B, 2C, 2A, 4, 5, 5A, 6A, 6, 7, 7A, 1B, and 1A, all in the parish of Leaghur, to the south-east angle of the last-named allotment, the commencing point aforesaid.

#### TRAGOWEL PLAINS IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulation, made by the Tragowel Plains Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, under the provisions of *The Irrigation Act 1886*.

#### REGULATION.

The Commissioners of the Tragowel Plains Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 95 of *The Irrigation Act 1886*, do make the following Regulation:—

##### No. 4.

That regulation No. 2 be, and the same is hereby repealed, and the following adopted in lieu thereof:—

1. All water supplied from the works of the Trust for the irrigation of land shall be paid for by measure. All measurements of water shall be by gauges of such form and pattern as may be adopted and fixed by the Trust. The registration of the quantities of water delivered shall be made by the Trust's officers.

2. All irrigation or other outlets required from any of the channels or works of the Trust shall be constructed by the Trust

upon the application only of owners of the land to be supplied from such outlet or outlets, or of occupiers of the said land endorsed or approved by such owners.

3. All applications for the construction of irrigation outlets shall be dealt with by the duly appointed Committee of the Trust to manage and regulate the distribution of the available water, and known as the Water Committee, except when otherwise directed by the Trust.

4. Only one outlet shall be allowed to each owner or occupier of land up to three hundred and twenty acres, and one for every additional three hundred and twenty acres or fraction thereof, except in such cases where the Trust may order otherwise, or the full cost of construction of the said outlet is paid by the applicant.

5. Outlets may be fixed at any suitable spot most convenient to the applicant subject to the approval of the Engineer to the Trust.

6. All outlets, whether their cost of construction or only a portion thereof has been paid by the owner or occupier of the land to be supplied from such outlet, shall remain absolutely under the control of the Trust, and shall not be interfered with either by such owner or occupier or any other person in any way whatsoever, except with the express sanction of the Trust in writing and under the supervision of its engineer or other responsible officer.

7. The rate or price to be paid for water delivered from the works of the Trust for irrigation purposes shall be Sixpence per inch per acre for all land, including gardens, payment in all cases to be made in advance.

8. All persons agreeing to take water from the works of the Trust shall take delivery thereof through their respective outlets at such times, in such order, and in such manner as the Committee or the Trust shall direct. No person shall be supplied with a less quantity of water than is equal to the value of Twelve shillings and sixpence. And the delivery of water may be continued on Sundays and holidays as well as on ordinary working days.

9. Every person agreeing to take water from the works of the Trust shall receive notification of the dates and quantities in which it will be delivered to him.

10. The outlets for the delivery of water shall be opened only by the authorized officers of the Trust, and no person other than such officers shall, under any circumstances (unless by the express written sanction of the Trust), open any such outlet, or otherwise do any act that may permit of the escape of water from the channels or works of the Trust.

11. No person shall trespass along the works or upon the lands of the Trust to the hindrance of Trust servants, annoyance of adjacent landowners, damage to works or adjacent property or crops, and to stock depasturing on adjacent lands.

12. Any person who shall be guilty of an offence against this regulation shall be liable, for any such offence, to a penalty not exceeding the sum of Fifty pounds, which may be recovered in accordance with the provisions of section 247 of *The Irrigation Act 1886*.

The foregoing regulation was made by the Commissioners of the "Tragowel Plains Irrigation and Water Supply Trust," under and by virtue of section 95 of *The Irrigation Act 1886*, this thirtieth day of September 1887.

#### "THE IRRIGATION ACT 1886."

IN the matter of the petition of the Shire of Wimmera Waterworks Trust, praying that its waterworks district may be constituted an Irrigation and Water Supply District within the meaning of the said *Irrigation Act 1886*, and for the appointment and creation of a Trust in and for the same.

Pursuant to section 18 of the said Act, I hereby declare upon the said petition the matters following, viz:—

1. The scheme of the proposed works shall comprise a reservoir in the Victoria Valley on the Glenelg River; a reservoir in the Wartook Valley on the McKenzie River; minor reservoirs, storage basins, tanks, and weirs, throughout the Irrigation and Water Supply District; channels for the conveyance and distribution of the water impounded in the basins, or diverted from rivers or creeks; pumping machinery to aid in the distribution of the water, and such other works as may be necessary to provide for the conservation and distribution of water for domestic and stock supply, and for irrigation throughout the Trust district.

2. The reservoir in the Victoria (or Moora Moora) Valley shall be a national work. All the other proposed works shall be Trust works.

3. The amount it is proposed that the Board of Land and Works shall advance for Trust works, by way of loan, including the sum required for the purchase of existing works, is Three hundred and sixty-eight thousand three hundred and ninety-seven pounds (£368,397). The whole of this amount will not at once be placed to the credit of the Trust, but it will be made available in instalments, as follows:—

(a.) To recoup the existing Water Trust and complete the stock and domestic supply works, Sixty-six thousand one hundred and fifty-three pounds (£66,153).

(b.) To complete the Wartook Reservoir, Six thousand eight hundred and seventeen pounds (£6,817).

(c.) To carry out the works for distribution of the water from the Wartook Reservoir, Eighty thousand pounds (£80,000).

(d.) To complete the works for distribution of water from the Victoria Reservoir, national work, and to complete the scheme, Two hundred and fifteen thousand four hundred and twenty-seven pounds (£215,427). The said sums of £66,153, £6,817, and £80,000, may be made available immediately on the constitution of the Trust. The sum of £215,427 will not be made available, nor its payment to the Trust authorized, until the Trust has given a sufficient guarantee that the water of the Victoria Valley Reservoir will be fully utilized, and its construction has actually been agreed upon and undertaken.

4. The rate of interest to be paid by the Trust on such loan shall be Four pounds ten shillings per centum per annum.

5. The rate at which the Trust shall pay for water, when supplied from national works, shall be such sum, as will be equivalent to Four pounds ten shillings per centum on the cost of such national works, in respect of the right to use the whole of the available water from time to time impounded therein.

6. The quantity of water which the Trust shall be entitled and required to take from the Victoria (or Moora Moora) Valley Reservoir, shall be the whole of the water from time to time impounded therein; except such quantity (if any) as the Minister may consider necessary to be reserved for compensation water. But the Trust shall not be required to take such supply or to pay therefor, until the expiry of the date hereafter to be agreed upon between the Minister of Water Supply and the Trust.

7. The sources, other than national works, from which the Trust will be entitled to obtain its supply, shall be the McKenzie River, the Norton Creek, the Wimmera River, with the whole of their tributaries and affluents, and the lakes, lagoons and swamps supplied therefrom within the Trust district. And the Trust shall be entitled to take, control, and distribute, for the purposes of supply to its constituents, the water at any time contained or flowing therein; except such quantities as may from time to time be directed by the Minister, to be reserved for other purposes.

8. The power of rating to be given to the Trust shall be no more than Twenty per centum per annum upon the annual value of the property within the Irrigation and Water Supply District.

WHEREAS by The Local Government Act 1874 (38 Vict. No. 506) it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might, from time to time, make Orders, amongst other things, to subdivide or re-subdivide any municipal district into any number of subdivisions not exceeding eight; and every such Order should be published in the Government Gazette, and should take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas a petition purporting to be signed by more than one-fourth of the persons whose names are for the time being inscribed on the municipal roll of the Town of Williamstown has been presented to the Governor in Council, the substance and prayer of which petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the forty-sixth section of the said Act, and no counter petition has been received: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order abolish all previous subdivisions of the Town of Williamstown, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned doth hereby re-subdivide the said Town of Williamstown into four separate Wards, the names and boundaries of which shall be as follow, that is to say:—

**CENTRE WARD.**—Commencing at a point on the shore of Hobson's Bay in line with the western fence of the Graving Dock reserve; thence southerly by that fence to its intersection with the railway fence on the east side of Morris street; thence southerly and westerly by that fence to the centre of Ferguson street; thence easterly by the centre of Ferguson street to Hobson's Bay; thence by Hobson's Bay to the commencing point.

**NORTH WARD.**—Commencing at a point on the shore of Hobson's Bay in line with the centre of Ferguson street; thence westerly by the centre of that street to the eastern fence of the Williamstown Railway; thence north-westerly by that fence to a point in line with the centre of the North road; thence east across the Melbourne road and along the centre of the North road to a point in the centre of the Strand road; thence northerly by the centre of Strand road to a point at the Steam Ferry; thence to Hobson's Bay; thence by the shore of Hobson's Bay to the commencing point.

**SOUTH WARD.**—Commencing at the south-east angle of portion A, section 3, parish of Cut-Paw-Paw; bounded on the west by a line bearing north to the northern fence of the Melbourne and Geelong Railway; thence north-easterly by that fence to the crossing of the Newport Railway Station; thence across the railway line to the eastern fence of the Williamstown Railway

line; thence south-easterly by that fence and the western fence of the Graving Dock reserve to Hobson's Bay; thence southerly by the shore of Hobson's Bay and westerly by Port Phillip Bay to the commencing point.

**VICTORIA WARD.**—Commencing at a point in the middle of the Strand road at the Steam Ferry; thence by a line running southerly along the middle of the Strand road to its junction with the North road; thence by a line running west along the middle of the North road and across the Melbourne road to the eastern fence of the Melbourne and Williamstown Railway; thence north to the crossing at the Newport Railway Station; thence west across the railway line and along the northern fence of the Melbourne and Geelong Railway to the western boundary of the municipality; thence north by the said western boundary to the Stony Creek; thence east by the Stony Creek to the River Yarra Yarra; thence south by the River Yarra Yarra to the commencing point.

Wherever the line so described as aforesaid runs beside or along any river, creek, or road, whether such is specifically mentioned or not, the centre of such river, creek, or road shall be taken to be the boundary line.

And His Excellency the Governor, with the advice aforesaid, doth hereby further order that a Council consisting of twelve members be elected accordingly.

And the Honorable John Nimmo, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

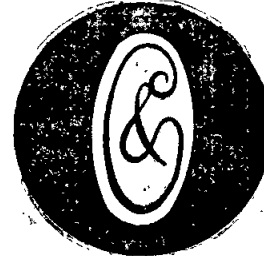
