By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

I THE Governor of Victoria, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in Her Majesty's name, to the Bill passed by the Parliament of Victoria, the title whereof is hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

"An Act to give effect in Victoria to Probates and Letters of Administration granted in the United Kingdom or any of the other Australasian Colonies."

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this eighth day of November, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, and in the fifty-first year of Her Majesty's reign.

SPECIAL NOTICE TO HOLDERS OF ELECTORS' RIGHTS.

IT is hereby notified that holders of electors' rights issued on or before the 1st December 1886 must obtain renewed rights in lieu thereof, in order to have their names placed upon the General Lists to be made up on and after the 1st December next.

Neglect of this precaution will result in the omission of the names of the persons so neglecting from the new Lists to be made up as aforesaid.

The old right must in every case be delivered up to the Registrar, but the renewed right will be equally available for any election that may take place before the completion of the new Rolls in January next.

Intending applicants for electors' rights are cautioned to carefully ascertain whether they are fully qualified under the law; inasmuch as a penalty on conviction is imposed upon persons knowingly and wilfully obtaining electors' rights when not qualified.

GRANT OF ONE HUNDRED AND FIFTY POUNDS (£150) FOR INVENTION OF MACHINERY FOR THRASHING PEASE.

A SUM not exceeding One hundred and fifty pounds may be paid to any person or company who shall, in the opinion of the Minister of Agriculture, produce a machine capable of thrashing within twelve hours eight hundred bushels of pease without injury thereto.

2. The reward shall be paid only to the inventor, or his agent, of such machine as shall most cheaply, efficiently, and rapidly perform the work required, and within the time aforesaid.

3. Persons intending to compete for the reward must give notice in writing of their intention to the Secretary for Agriculture, Melbourne, not later than the 24th November next.

4. One or more trials of the machines shall be made at such place or places and at such times as the Minister may direct.

5. All costs and expenses of forwarding, attendance, and working the machines at the times to be appointed shall be paid by the persons entering the machines for competition.

6. The Minister may appoint three or more judges to report upon the merits of the competing machines, and a decision of a majority of such judges shall be final.

7. The judges may recommend payment of an amount or amounts the total of which shall not exceed One hundred and fifty pounds (£150) to the inventor or inventors, or his or their agent or agents, of the successful machine or machines, such amounts to be apportioned to the value to the colony of the said invention or inventions.

TRAGOWEL PLAINS IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulation, made by the Tragowel Plains Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, under the provisions of *The Irrigation Act 1886*.

REGULATION.

The Commissioners of the Tragowel Plains Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 95 of *The Irrigation Act 1886*, do make the following Regulation:—

No. 4.

That regulation No. 2 be, and the same is hereby repealed, and the following adopted in lieu thereof:—

1. All water supplied from the works of the Trust for the irrigation of land shall be paid for by measure. All measurements of water shall be by gauges of such form and pattern as

may be adopted and fixed by the Trust. The registration of the quantities of water delivered shall be made by the Trust's officers,

2. All irrigation or other outlets required from any of the channels or works of the Trust shall be constructed by the Trust upon the application only of owners of the land to be supplied from such outlet or outlets, or of occupiers of the said land endorsed or approved by such owners.

3. All applications for the construction of irrigation outlets shall be dealt with by the duly appointed Committee of the Trust to manage and regulate the distribution of the available water, and known as the Water Committee, except when otherwise directed by the Trust.

4. Only one outlet shall be allowed to each owner or occupier of land up to three hundred and twenty acres, and one for every additional three hundred and twenty acres or fraction thereof, except in such cases where the Trust may order otherwise, or the full cost of construction of the said outlet is paid by the applicant.

5. Outlets may be fixed at any suitable spot most convenient to the applicant subject to the approval of the Engineer to the Trust.

6. All outlets, whether their cost of construction or only a portion thereof has been paid by the owner or occupier of the land to be supplied from such outlet, shall remain absolutely under the control of the Trust, and shall not be interfered with either by such owner or occupier or any other person in any way whatsoever, except with the express sanction of the Trust in writing and under the supervision of its engineer or other responsible officer.

7. The rate or price to be paid for water delivered from the works of the Trust for irrigation purposes shall be Sixpence per inch per acre for all land, including gardens, payment in all cases to be made in advance.

8. All persons agreeing to take water from the works of the Trust shall take delivery thereof through their respective outlets at such times, in such order, and in such manner as the Committee or the Trust shall direct. No person shall be supplied with a less quantity of water than is equal to the value of Twelve shillings and sixpence. And the delivery of water may be continued on Sundays and holidays as well as on ordinary working days.

9. Every person agreeing to take water from the works of the Trust shall receive notification of the dates and quantities in which it will be delivered to him.

10. The outlets for the delivery of water shall be opened only by the authorized officers of the Trust, and no person other than such officers shall, under any circumstances (unless by the express written sanction of the Trust), open any such outlet, or otherwise do any act that may permit of the escape of water from the channels or works of the Trust.

11. No person shall trespass along the works or upon the lands of the Trust to the hindrance of Trust servants, annoyance of adjacent landowners, damage to works or adjacent property or crops, and to stock depasturing on adjacent lands.

12. Any person who shall be guilty of an offence against this regulation shall be liable, for any such offence, to a penalty not exceeding the sum of Fifty pounds, which may be recovered in accordance with the provisions of section 247 of *The Irrigation Act 1886*.

"THE MALLEE AMENDING ACT 1885."—VERMIN-PROOF FENCES.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Mallee Amending Act 1885* it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council might from time to time, by Order in Council, proclaim any fence described in such Order to be a vermin-proof fence within the meaning of the said Act, and a sufficient fence within the meaning of *The Fences Statute 1874*, for the purposes of the now in part recited Act, and he might also by any such Order in Council proclaim any fence described in any such Order to be a sufficient fence within the meaning of the said Statute throughout Victoria, or within any portion thereof specified in such Order, and he might at any time revoke any such Order: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this Order proclaim the fences hereinafter described to be vermin-proof fences within the meaning of *The Mallee Amending Act 1885*, and sufficient fences within the meaning of *The Fences Statute 1874*, aforesaid, that is to say:—

A wire-netting, 36 x 1½ x 17, and 5 wires run through posts, alternately long and short, 9 feet apart, long posts to be 6 feet 8 inches long, square on top, having at the smaller end 6 inches x 2 inches, or 4 inches x 4 inches, or 8 inches x 4 inches, to be put 20 inches in ground, bored for 5 wires; short posts to be of same dimensions, 4 feet 4 inches long, 14 inches in the ground, and bored for 1 wire; posts to be of pine, buloak, or gum; straining posts 7 feet 6 inches long every 200 yards, 30 inches in ground, and a similar post every 100 yards, with wires running through; wires to be well strained and fastened only at straining posts, braced every 3 feet with No. 17 wire; first wire to be 3 inches above netting, the 4 inches, 5 inches, 5 inches, and 6 inches making a fence 4 feet 8 inches high, strained every 100 yards, wire-netting to be laced to wire above with No. 17 wire, and put 3 inches in ground.

2. A wire-netting, 36 x 1½ x 17, attached to substantial posts, 50 yards apart, between each post 7 firm stakes to be driven 15 inches in ground, to which netting is also to be attached; 4 inches above netting a thick-set 4-barbed wire, 6 inches above a plain wire, then 7 inches above a thick-set 4-barbed wire running on top of posts and stakes, the netting to be 4 inches in ground; netting, barbed and plain wire to be braced together five times between each stake or post.
