PUBLIC AND BANK HOLIDAYS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

**I**N pursuance of the provisions contained in the eighty-eighth section of *The Public Service Act 1883*, and in the fifth section of *The Bank Holidays Act 1873*, I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation appoint

TUESDAY THE 15TH DAY OF NOVEMBER INSTANT

to be observed as a Public and Bank Half-Holiday at Castlemaine from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon;

WEDNESDAY THE 16TH DAY OF NOVEMBER INSTANT

to be observed as a Public and Bank Half-Holiday at Casterton, Merino, and Sandford, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon; as a Public and Bank Holiday within the Shire of Metcalfe, and as a Public Holiday within the Borough of Malmesbury;

THURSDAY THE 17TH DAY OF NOVEMBER INSTANT

to be observed as a Public and Bank Holiday within the Borough of Malmesbury and the Shire of Metcalfe;

WEDNESDAY THE 23RD AND THURSDAY THE 24TH DAYS OF NOVEMBER INSTANT \*

to be observed as Public and Bank Half-Holidays at Eaglehawk from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon on each day;

THURSDAY THE 24TH DAY OF NOVEMBER INSTANT

to be observed as a Public and Bank Holiday within the Shire of Kilmore.

"THE FACTORIES AND SHOPS ACT 1885."

**I**N compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the 29th section of *The Factories and Shops Act 1885* (49 Vict. No. 862), and after due inquiry, I, the Chief Secretary of Victoria, being the responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being administering the said Act, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of the said section 29 in the

WORKROOMS OF MESSRS. A. MILLER AND Co., 94 MOORABOOL STREET, GEELONG,

from the date hereof to the 31st December 1887, upon these express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said workrooms more than seven females for more than fifty-four hours in any one week in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without her consent.
3. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such workrooms for the information of all concerned.
