REVISED REGULATIONS RESPECTING NAVAL CADETS.

THE following despatch from the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies to His Excellency the Governor, and its enclosure, are published for general informa-

SIR,—With reference to my circular despatch of the 1st of July 1887. I have the honor to transmit to you, for information in the Colony under your government, copies of revised regulations respecting Naval Cadets.

REGULATIONS RESPECTING NAVAL CADETS.

In operation for the Examinations in November 1887 and June 1888.

For alterations to be made in November 1888, see Memorandum attached.

FOR THE INFORMATION OF CANDIDATES.

1. Appointments to naval cadetships will be made by limited competition, with the undermentioned exceptions :=

Four cadetships given annually to sons of gentlemen in the Colonies, on the recommendation of the Secretary of State for the Colonies.

Service cadetships, the total number of which is not to exceed

ervice cadetships, the total number of which is not to exceed five in any one year. Service cadets will be selected by the Board of Admiralty from (a) sons of officers of the army, navy, or marines who have been killed in action, or who have been lost at sea on active service, or killed on duty, or who have died of wounds received in action or injuries received on duty within six months from the date of such action or injury, (b) sons of officers of the navy who have performed long or distinguished service, and who hold or have held rank or relative rank on the active list not lower than that of commander. Not more than two such latter service cadets will be

on the active list not lower than that of commander. Not more than two such latter service cadets will be nominated annually.

Applications for service cadetships should be addressed to the Military Secretary, Horse Guards, if the candidate is the son of an officer of the Army; to the secretary of the Admiralty, if the candidate is the son of an officer of the navy or marines; and to the Military Secretary, India Office, if the candidate is the son of an officer of the Indian Army.

Colonial and service cadets will be entered on passing the test examination as specified in paragraphs 9 and 10, and will in all other respects be subject to these regulations.

The educational examination of all candidates will be conducted by the Civil Service Commissioners (address Cannon Row, Westminster), who will deal with all questions connected with such examination and will announce the results. A fee of ten shillings will be required from each candidate.

- Except in special circumstances, not more than one-third of the number of candidates actually presenting themselves before the Civil Service Commissioners will be entered.
- The nomination of candidates for naval cadetships will be made by the First Lord, by individual members of the Board, and by the Secretaries to the Board of Admiralty.

A flag officer or a commodore lat class appointed to the chief command of a station, or to a separate command, and a captain, on first appointment as such to the command of a ship, will be allowed to nominate one candidate, provided the privilege is exercised within six months of appointment.

No captain will be entitled to nominate more than one candidate during the time he holds the rank of captain, but a flag officer or a commodore 1st class may claim the privilege each time he is appointed to a command as above.

- In the event of a candidate's nomination being cancelled before he has commenced the examination, the officer who nominated him will be allowed to select another candidate for the same or following examination.
- 4. The nominations will be made half-yearly, as soon as convenient after the report of the last examination has been received from the Civil Service Commissioners.
- 5. The examinations will be held in London and at Portsmouth, and will commence on the second Wednesday in June and the last Wednesday in November in each year, and the appointments will date from the 15th July and 15th January following respectively.
- 7. Every candidate must be in good health, and free from any physical defect of body, impediment of speech, defect of sight or hearing, and also from any predisposition to constitutional or hereditary disease or weakness of any kind, and in all respects well developed and active in proportion to his age. Before being

examined by the Civil Service Commissioners he will be required to pass the medical examination according to the prescribed regulations, and must have been found physically fit for the navy; rejection at such examination will finally exclude him from the navy.

- 8. The candidate will be required to produce (1) a certificate of the date of his birth,* or a declaration thereof made before a magistrate; (2) a certificate of good conduct from the masters of the school or schools at which he may have been educated during the two previous years, or, if educated at home, from his tutor or the clergyman of the parish in which he resides; and (3) proofs of good health.
- 9. Candidates will be tested by examination in the following
 - (1.) Arithmetic: including proportion, vulgar and de-
 - cimal fractions

 (2. Algebra: including fractions and simple equations of one unknown quantity

 (3. Geometry: definitions, postulates, axioms, and subjects, of the first twenty-six propositions of Euclid's Elements
 - (4.) English: writing from dic- spelling 75 tation handwriting 25 100 reading with intalligence and residue. 175 reading with intelligence and parsing easy 100
 - sentences ... 200
 - parsing, and speaking (6.) Scripture history
- Candidates will be further examined in any two of the following subjects they may select:-

Elementary mathematics: miscellaneous questions in arithmetic, algebra (including quadratic equations), and geometry to the end of the first book of Euclid's Elements

Latin: reading, parsing, and translating, by aid of a dictionary, Latin into English and English into Latin

Geography and English History 300

The final order of merit will be determined by the sum of the marks obtained in the test as well as in the further examination.

In arithmetic the candidate will be required to obtain five-tenths, and in each of the other subjects of the test examination four-tenths of the marks allotted thereto. In English the candi-date must obtain four-tenths of the marks allotted for each of the two subdivisions of the subject.

- 10. Colonial and service cadets will be appointed on passing the test examination; they must, however, obtain 660 marks in the aggregate, as well as the proportion of marks in arithmetic and other subjects required from the candidates who compete.
- 11. A candidate who passes the test examination, but does not succeed in the competition, will be entitled to compete at the next examination, provided he is within the limits of age at that time. No candidate will be allowed to compete more than twice. A candidate who fails to pass the test will not be entitled to another trial, but he will be allowed to compete at the next examination if he receives a fresh nomination and is still within the limits of age.
- 12. A candidate who, owing to illness, fails to appear at the examination for which he has obtained his nomination may receive a second nomination, provided he is still within the limits of age.
- a second nomination, provided he is still within the limits of age.

 13. For all cadets entered under these regulations the payment will be at the rate of £70 per annum for the period in the Britannia, to be paid half-yearly in advance to the accountant-general of the navy. But the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty reserve the power of selecting, from among the cadets entered at each half-yearly examination, a number, not to exceed 10, being sons of officers of the navy, army, or marines, or of civil officers under the Board of Admiralty, with respect to whom the annual payment will be £40 only. In this selection their lordships will have regard solely to the pecuniary circumstances of the cadet.
- 14. The period of training on board the *Britannia* will be four terms; there will be two terms in each year. The first term of each year will be from February to July, the second from September to December.

 The vacations will be five weeks at Christmas, two weeks at Easter, and six weeks at Midsummer.

- 15. (a.) Examinations in seamanship and study will be held at
- (a.) Examinations in seamanship and study will be held at the end of each term.

 (b.) Cadets who fail at the end of their second term to obtain 40 per cent. of marks in mathematical subjects will be discharged.

 (c.) Cadets who fail at the final examination to obtain 40 per cent. in theoretical and 50 per cent. in technical subjects will be discharged.

 (d.) Cadets reported to the Admiralty for unsatisfactory conduct will be "warned;" should they be again reported they will be discharged. Any cadet, however, who is reported for unsatisfactory conduct during his final term will be discharged without being allowed to present himself at the examination for passing out of the Britannia.

 (c.) Any cadet who shall at any time appear to their lord-ships to be unfit for the naval service, for any reason whatever, will be removed from the Britannia, and it must be understood that this rule will apply to those who are considered unfit from insufficient physical development or weakness of constitution, although no actual organic disease may have been developed.

- 16. It is to be distinctly understood that the period of training 16. It is to be distinctly understood that the period of training on board the Britannia is a time of probation, and the parent or guardian of every cadet will be required to sign a declaration (on the admission of the cadet to the Britannia), to the effect that he shall be immediately withdrawn on the receipt of an official intimation of his being considered unfit for the navy.
- 17. Cadets will, on passing out of the Britannia, rank according to the amount of sea time they obtain at their final examination, and those who obtain equal amounts of sea time will rank in the order of merit in which they pass out of the Britannia.
- 18. The parent or guardian of every cadet will be required to provide outfit under the regulations in force.
- 19. No pay or pocket money will be allowed by Government to cadets in the Britannia.

Note.—The apparent increase of population—or that obtained by adding the excess of registered births over registered deaths to the excess of recorded arrivals over recorded departures—in the third quarter of 1887 was 9,912, as against 8,186 in the previous quarter, 10,749 in the corresponding quarter of 1886, and 8,062 in that quarter of 1885. If, however, allowance be made for the estimated number of unrecorded departures, the net increase of population during the quarter will be reduced to 8,643, viz., 4,469 males and 4,174 females as shown above.

The allowance made for supposed unrecorded departures during the whole period since the census of 1881 was taken has been 34,722, viz., 27,749 of males and 6,973 of females, and the apparent population has been reduced by these numbers. Had no reduction been made in the estimate, the population would apparently have amounted at the end of September to 1,062,471, viz., 573,172 males and 489,299 females.

MARYBOROUGH MINING DISTRICT. BYR-LAW No. 4.

A T a meeting of the Mining Board of the Maryborough Mining District, begun and holden at Maryborough, in the said district, on the twenty-fifth day of October One thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, it was ordained by the said Board as follows, that is to say:—

- 1. Repealing clause.—Bye-law dated the 13th January 1880 and bye-laws numbered 2 and 3 enacted by the Mining Board of the Maryborough Mining District are hereby repealed, and the following bye-law substituted in lieu thereof. Provided that nothing therein contained shall in any manner affect the right, title, interest, liability, or obligation existing at the time when this bye-law shall come in force.
- right, title, interest, liability, or obligation existing at the time when this bye-law shall come in force.

 2. Interpretation clause.—In the construction and for the purpose of this bye-law, the following terms, if not inconsistent with the context or subject-matter, shall have the respective meanings hereby assigned to them, that is to say:—The words "mining registrar" shall mean and be interpreted to mean the mining registrar of the division for which he shall have been appointed. The words "mining tenement" shall mean and include any parcel or parcels of Crown land held or occupied for the purpose of mining for gold, or any share or interest therein, or any race, dam, or reservoir held or occupied for conveying or storing of water, or any share or interest therein, or any Crown land held or occupied as the site for machinery, or for a road, tramway, channei, drain, or other easement or share or interest therein; and words importing the singular number shall include the plural number, and words importing the plural number shall include the plural number, and words importing the masculine gender shall include females. The words "payable gold" shall mean any quantity of quartz, stone, earth, or other auriferous substance, obtained by any miner or miners which shall pay the expenses of crushing or washing the same as the case may be, and which shall also pay the miner or miners while actually employed in raising such substance the current rate of wages in that particular district. The term "worked and abandoned ground" shall mean alluvial, the greater portion of which has been worked out. The term "worked sinking" shall mean alluvial ground where water is struck below the surface drift, and where slabbing and water baling may be necessary for the working thereof. slabbing and water baling may be necessary for the working thereof.

ALLUVIAL WORKINGS.

- 3. Claims, how to be marked.—Any miner, or miners, marking out a claim in alluvial sinking shall evidence his or their boundary by firuly driving in a substantial peg at each corner of the claim, such pegs to be kept visible during the working of the
- 4. Prospecting for new goldfields.—Prospectors previous to discovering payable gold shall be protected in holding an area of two hundred (200) yards square, provided they are searching for gold at a greater distance than one quarter of a mile from any other gold workings; and at a greater distance than one mile they shall be protected in holding an area of four hundred (400) yards square, so long as they continue to work their prospecting claims in a bond fide manner; and on obtaining payable gold they shall mark off their claims in accordance with the following section:—
- 5. Extent of claim.—The first miner or party of miners so prospecting, discovering payable gold, shall be entitled to an extent of prospecting claim as specified in the following table of distances from any other alluvial gold workings:—

- 6. Prospecting for new or lost leads.—The first miner or party of miners commencing and continuing to sink or prospect for a new or lost lead of gold less than a quarter of mile distant from any alluvial gold workings, and discovering a payable deposit of gold therein, shall be entitled to an area of ground of one hundred (100) feet square in dry sinking, and two hundred (200) feet square in wet sinking, provided that all prospecting claims under this section shall be at least three hundred (300) yards. apart.
- 7. Discovering payable gold.—Any prospector discovering payable alluvial gold neglecting to report the same to the mining registrar, or to have his prospecting claim registered, or to obtain a certificate of registration in the form of Schedule I. hereunto annexed, within seven days after such discovery shall not be entitled to more than an ordinary sized claim. A copy of the certificate of registration shall be kept posted on the claim until the same be worked out, abandoned, or forfeited.
- 8. Information to adjoining claimholders. The owner or owners of alluvial prospecting claims shall, on the application of adjoining claimholders, give every information in his or their power as to the course of the gold and the quantity he or they are obtaining from his or their prospecting claim.

DRY SINKING AND SUBFACING-ORDINARY CLAIMS.

- 9. Extent of claim in new ground.—The extent of an ordinary claim in new dry alluvial ground shall be for one miner, forty-two (42) feet square; two miners, sixty (60) feet square; three miners, seventy-two (72) feet square; four miners, eighty-four (84) feet square.
- 10. Worked and abandoned ground.—The extent of claim in dry alluvial sinking in ground, the greater part of which has

- been previously worked and abandoned, shall be for one miner, one hundred (100) feet square; two miners, one hundred and fortr-two (142) feet square; three miners, one hundred and seventy-four (174) feet square; four miners, two hundred (200) feet square.
- 11. Shepherding.-All claimholders, or their agents, must be 11. Saepaerang.—All claimmonders, or their agents, must be present on his or their claim every day, one hour, between eleven o'clock a.m. and twelve at noon, until the shaft thereon has been bottomed. Any miner or miners not complying herewith shall be deemed to have abandoned his or their claim or share, unless in case of dispute he or they can justify such non-compliance under section 86 of this bye-law: Provided always that in the case of any claimholder under 14 years of age, such claimholder must be represented by a competent miner.
- such claimholder must be represented by a competent miner.

 12. Amalgamation.—The holders of adjoining dry alluvial claims may amalgamate them by posting on some conspicuous place near the centre of such claims, a notice in writing containing the number of claims amalgamated, and the name of each shareholder, and such notice shall be kept posted until the claim is abandoned; and such amalgamated claim shall be worked every working day by at least two of the shareholders, and all shareholders or their agents shall be present on their claim during shepherding hours, until the shaft thereon has been bottomed, except those shareholders who may be employed on the night shift, and bond fide working on such claim, but in no case shall there be more than three shareholders recognized as being employed on the night shift; and when the shaft thereon has been bottomed the full number of shareholders shall be employed therein or otherwise be upon such claim.

Mode of working.—All claimholders or their agents, within six (6) claims in every direction from any shaft which has struck water, and in amalgamated wet alluvial claims, one half the shareholders shall sink their shafts every lawful day until the well is completed, and shall bale their due proportion of water daily until it be exhausted, or the water prove too heavy, and the work and baling be stopped with the consent of adjoining claimholders, and in amalgamated claims the full number of shareholders shall be employed as soon as the shaft is bottomed; and beyond six (6) claims in every direction from any shaft which has struck water the claimholders shall be allowed to hold their claims unworked, provided they or their agents are all present on such claims every day from eleven o'clock anu. until twelve o'clock noon.

Neglecting to work, dc.—During the sinking of any wet alluvial shaft or shafts any miner or miners neglecting to work them, or cause them to be worked in accordance with the preceding section, will be deemed to have committed a breach of this bye-law; and persons shepherding neglecting to be present every lawful day, between the hours of eleven colock a.m. and twelve colock noon, such claim, share, or shares therein shall be deemed abandoned.
- 18. Forfeiture.—If any miner or miners in prospecting or ordinary alluvial claims, shall neglect to work, or cause to be worked his or their claim after the shaft thereon has been bottomed, for a longer period than 48 consecutive hours, the same shall be liable to forfeiture, unless, in case of dispute, he or they can justify such neglect under any of the provisions of this bye-law.

RESERVOIRS, RACES, AND WATER-COURSES.

19. Reservoirs, races, and water-courses.—Any miner or miners or company wishing to out or construct a reservoir for the storing of water for mining or domestic purposes, or to cut any race or water-course for the conveyance of water from or to any reservoir, river, creek, or any tail-race, may do so subject to the following conditions:—

ing conditions:—

Conditions.—The persons intending to cut or construct such reservoir, race, or tail-race shall, in case of a reservoir, erect a post not less than two inches square, and standing at least two feet out of the ground at each angle of the ground they wish to take up, and in case of a race or tail-race, shall erect a post as a foresaid at distances of not less than twelve hundred (1,200) feet apart on the line of such proposed race or tail-race, and shall make application to the mining surveyor for the division in which such reservoir, race, or tail-race is situated to survey the same; and within seven days

- after such survey the persons shall apply to the mining registrar for the division as aforesaid for registration of such reservoir, race, or tail-race, and such mining registrar shall thereupon give to such applicant or applicants a certificate of registration of such reservoir, race, or tail-race, in the form in the Schedule hereunto aumexed, marked II., but in no case shall the extent of ground for a reservoir exceed fifty thousand (50,000) square yards, inclusive of water-shed.
- 20. Priority of water-rights.—Water-rights shall take precedence according to the date of registration, and if at any time the supply of water shall become insufficient, the person or company being last registered shall cease to enjoy such right during such deficiency of water, as against any party or company antecedently registered.
- pany antecedently registered.

 21. Water-gauge.—All races or water-courses shall have placed at the head of the race, at the place from where the water is diverted, a box for the purpose of gauging or measuring the quantity of water flowing into the race or water-course, such gauge-box to be at least twelve (12) feet long, with a fall of half an inch to the foot, and the gauge or measurement which shall be considered a sluice-head shell be such a quantity of water as will pass through an aperture at the top end of the above-named gauge-box of twenty (20) inches wide and three (3) inches deep, or sixty (60) square inches.
- 22. Quantity of water allowed to each race.—The quantity of water or number of sluice-heads for any water-course shall be in proportion to the number of miners forming the party or company constructing or being in possession of any race, at the following scale, that is to say—One or two miners, one sluice-head of water; four miners, two sluice-heads of water. And so on at the rate of one sluice-head to every additional three miners.
- 23. Width allowed on each side of race.—Any person or persons occupying a race or tail-race for the conveyance of water for mining purposes, shall be entitled to a width of ten feet on each side of such race, measuring from the centre thereof: Provided always that where the depth of a cutting exceeds twelve feet, or where a tunnel is required, the width shall be twenty feet on each side of such race, measuring from the centre thereof.
- 24. Races may be constructed through claims.—Any miner or miners shall be entitled to cut and construct any race, tail-race, or drain for mining purposes through any claim or claims held by any other miner or miners, or under, over, or across any other race, tail-race, or drain: Provided always that such first-mentioned race, tail-race, or drain be cut, constructed timbered, framed, and formed in such a manner as not to injure the claim, race, tail-race, or drain through or across which it may be cut or constructed.
- 25. Water-races may be extended or altered.—Any miner or miners may extend his or their race or water-course, or tailrace beyond the point for which he or they were originally registered, or make any alteration or deviation therein, provided that no such extension or alteration shall interfere with any registered right obtained by any other miner or miners subsequent to the application for said alteration or extension.
- 26. Water to be left running in creeks, &c.—In all river beds and main creeks from which water is diverted for mining purposes, there shall at all times be left running at least one sluice-head of water for general use; and in all tributary creeks from which water is diverted for mining purposes, there shall be left remaining in its natural channel a quantity of water not less than half a sluice-head.
- 27. Commencing and continuing the formation of races.—Any miner or party of miners shall, within one calendar month from the registration with the mining registrar, begin to form such race, and having begun shall not stop work for a longer period than six consecutive working days during the formation thereigh. periou vuon tion thereof:
- 28. Protection to water-rights during drought.—The race or claim, or right to the water, may be held unworked or unused when the supply of water is insufficient, provided the same be registered.
- 29. Extent of sluicing claim.—The extent of mining claims for sluicing purposes in new surfacing or ground previously worked and unoccupied, shall not exceed forty (40) yards in length by a width of sixty (60) yards for each miner forming the party.
- 30. Beds of creeks or rivers.—The extent of claim in the beds of creeks or rivers shall be for each miner twenty (20) yards along the course of said creek of river, by a breadth not exceeding twenty-two (22) yazds.
- PUDDLING-MACHINES, PUDDLING-CLAIMS, WATER-DAMS, ETC.
- 31. Puddling-machines, water-dams, &c.—Any miner or miners may erect a puddling-machine, or form water-dams, or, take up any unoccupied or abandoned site of any puddling-machine or water-dam, or registering the site with the mining registrar, subject to conditions as hereinafter provided.
 - oject to conditions as hereinafter provided.

 Conditions.—A notice of the intention to register any such site of a puddling-machine, water-dam, or any other site of a machine, engine, or water-dam, not otherwise specially provided for, shall be kept posted on a conspicuous part of the claim for a period of not less than seven (7) days, where it is intended to erect or construct any of the above-named machines or water-dams, and also a copy at the mining registrar's office for the same period previous to the registration thereof; and any objections to such registration shall be made to the mining register in writing, stating the nature of the objections, with the name of the person or each of the persons objecting; and any such objections must be made within the above-named seven days.

- 32. Certificate.—A certificate of registration, in the form of Schedule III., hereunto annexed, shall be given by the mining registrar in case of registration.
- 33. Area of site for puddling-machine, water-dam, and storage of sludge.—'The area for the site of any horse puddling-machine, water-dam, or sludge-dam, shall be two hundred (200) yards in length by a width of one hundred (100) yards.
- 34. Extent of claim for puddling.—The extent of mining claim for the holders of puddling-machines shall be, in old ground, one hundred and fifty (150) feet square for every miner employed thereon.
- 35. Catch-drains.—The owner or owners of any catch-drain cut and constructed for collecting and conveyance of water to any water-dam, shall be protected in the possession thereof for a distance not exceeding three hundred and fifty (350) yards from any such water-dam: Provided such catch-drains are on the higher side of the water-dam bank.
- 36. Claims may be held unworked.—All mining claims for puddling may be held unworked for any time that there may be an insufficiency of water for the working thereof, provided a notice to that effect be kept posted thereon.
- notice to that effect be kept posted thereon.

 37. Forfeiture of sites for puddling-machines, water-dams, and sludge-dams.—When any miner or miners in possession of a site for a puddling-machine, water-dam, or sludge-dam shall not erect a puddling-machine on such site for a period of two months after registration, or having erected a puddling-machine shall leave the same unworked for a period of two months, or shall not use such water-dam or sludge-dam for a period of two months after registration, except as provided in section 36, then such site for a puddling-machine or such water-dam or sludge-dam shall be forfeitable, and may by a court of competent jurisdiction be declared forfeited, and the miner or miners who shall first make application to have such forfeiture enforced shall have priority of right to be put in possession of such forfeited site for a puddling-machine, water-dam, or sludge-dam.

 38. Abandoned site.—When any puddling-machine erected on

Abandoned site.—When any puddling-machine erected on any site under this bye-law shall be left unworked, or any water-dam or sludge-dam shall be left unused for a period of three months, except as provided in section 36 hereof, then such site for a puddling-machine, water- and sludge-dam shall be deemed to be and shall be treated as ground abandoned.
- 39. Space to be left between puddling-machines and water-dams.

 —Any miner or miners taking possession of a site for a puddling-machine or water-dam shall leave a space of two hundred (200) yards between the boundary of such site and the boundary of the site of the puddling-machine or water-dam nearest thereto.
- 40. Protection for water-dams.—Any miner or miners having lawful possession of a water-dam, in compliance with this byelaw, shall be protected against any other miner or miners, person or persons using any water therefrom, domestic purposes excepted; and no person or persons shall be allowed to take water from such dam for any other purpose without the authority in writing of the owner thereof, nor shall any person or persons drive or allow his or their cattle into any reservoir or vertar-dam hald under this hyallow or in any way defiled destroy. water-dam held under this bye-law, or in any way defile, destroy, or damage the same.
- 41. Water for domestic use.—Any water-hole, water-dam, or other depository of water necessary for domestic purposes shall be protected for such purposes: Provided that a notice in writing is affixed on a post, at least six feet high, close to such water-hole or water-dam, and signed by at least four miners or holders of business licenses, stating that it is reserved for domestic purposes only. And no person or persons shall use the water for any other than domestic purposes. And such water-hole or water-dam shall not exceed one acre.
- water-dam shall not exceed one acre.

 42. Disposing of sludge.—No person or persons shall cause or permit sludge, tailings, or water, to flow from his or their claim or dam, or to accumulate so as to cause injury to any public road or thoroughfare, or to any claim, drive, water-nee, water-dam, water-hole for domestic purposes, old or new workings, puddling-machine, or to any other machinery, or to any garden or place of residence held under miner's right or business license, belonging to any other person or persons.
- 43. Machines, tailings, &c., obstructing creeks.—It shall not be lawful for any person or persons to hold, place, construct, or erect any machine, water-dam, bank of earth, or building of any sort, on, upon, or over any oresk, so as to impede the passage of water or sludge in any channel or creek.

RESIDENCE AREAS.

- 44. No person shall be entitled to occupy any land as a "residence area" unless such area shall for the time being be registered by the mining registrar or other proper officer, and unless such person shall be registered as the holder of such area, and the number of the miner's right or business license by virtue of which he is entitled to occupy such area is also registered. The extent of a residence or business area shall not exceed one (1) acre, and any such area shall not have a frontage to any road or street, or the continuation of any road or street exceeding one hundred and thirty-two feet by a depth of three hundred and thirty feet (132 feet by 339 feet).
- 45. Any person may be the holder at any one and the same time of not more than one residence area in addition to the residence area on which he may actually reside or on which he may reside and carry on his business, but no person shall be the holder of a residence area situated within a distance of ten miles from any other residence area held by him.

 A separate miner's right or business license shall be held for each residence area of which any person may be the holder.
- 46. If at any time after four months from the registration of a residence area it shall be proved to the satisfaction of any warden that there is no habitable dwelling thereon erected,

and that there has not been a habitable dwelling thereon erected for a period of at least three consecutive months, such warden shall make an order that the registration of such residence area he cancelled, and such registration shall thereupon be cancelled by the mining registrat or other proper officer, and the land so registered shall on such cancellation cease to be a residence area, and no second registration shall be effected by the same person of the whole or any part of a residence area within a period of six months.

47. The holder of a residence area may at any time after he

47. The holder of a residence area may at any time after he has resided thereon for a period of at least twelve months let his interest in the occupation of the surface thereof to any person at a monthly or weekly rental, and between such holder and such person there shall exist the same rights as between any landlord and his tenant.

48. The holder of a residence area may at any time after he has resided thereon for a period of at least twelve months sell or transfer his interest in the occupation of the surface of such area to any other holder of a miner's right or business license.

Nor.—It is enacted by The Residence Areas Act 1884 that when buildings or other improvements have been erected or made upon a residence area, and that the holder has been in possession for a period of, at least, two years and a half, and if there be no objections on the ground of its being auriferous or other reasons, the holder shall have the exclusive right of purchasing the said residence area at a price to be determined by an appraiser appointed by the Board of Land and Works.

40. Machinery sites.—Any miner or miners, or any company, may take possession of and occupy as a site for the erection of or as a site on which is already erected machinery for the crushing and extraction of gold or silver from quariz or other auriferous or argentiferous substances, any extent of Crown lands not exceeding six acres; such sites shall be registered with the mining registrar, and surveyed by the mining surveyor for the division in which such sites are situate, and the mining registrar shall give to the party or parties registering such site a certificate of such registration in the form in the Schedule annexed marked III.: Provided that the owner or owners of any such machinery as aforesaid, erected on such aforesaid site, shall once in every three months give to the mining registrar or mining surveyor for the division in which such site is situate a full, true, and complete return, as far as shall be in their power, of the quantity of quartz or other auriferous or other argentiferous substances which may have been reduced or crushed by them, together with the locality from which such substances were obtained, and the yield of gold or silver therefrom.

REGISTERED EXTENDED CLAIMS.

50. Interpretation.-Wet alluvial ground, new or previously worked, where horse-power or steam machinery is required for the working and baling of water therefrom, may be taken up and occupied as a registered extended claim or claims, subject to the following conditions:—

1. Claims must be registered.— Every claim taken up under this section must be registered with the mining registrar, who shall give to the applicants a certificate of registration in the form of Schedule I. hereunto annexed; and such certificate shall contain the name or names of the owner or owners, together with the name or title under which the claim is to be worked.

Marking claims.—Seven days previous to the registration of any such claim, the applicant or applicants shall mark off the land to be applied for by firmly affixing in the ground a post, standing not less than three (3) feet above the surface, at each angle of the land; and an application, in the form of Schedule V. hereunto annexed, shall be posted near the centre of such land, such notice to be kept posted until the application is disposed of.

3. Within four days after the expiration of the afore-said seven days the applicant or applicants shall, in writing, request the mining surveyor for the division in which such claim is situated to survey the same, and shall pay the fees for such survey.

151. Objections.—Any person or persons objecting to the registration of such claim may lodge with the mining registrar their objection, in writing, within the aforesaid seven days, and on the receipt of such objections he shall not register the applicant or applicants until the objections are disposed of; and any person or persons objecting failing to prosecute the objections within fourteen days from the date of lodging the same, the mining registrar shall proceed to register the applicant or applicants for such claim or claims as if no objections had been lodged. lodged.

52. Classification of claims.—For the purposes of this bye-law registered extended claims shall be classified and known by the following names or titles, that is to say— A single claim.—The area held by one miner by virtue of a miner's right.

53. Extent and form of claims.-The extent of registered exb3. 54. Time of commencing and mode of working.—Within two months after the registration of any claim the owner or owners

themselves, or their agents, shall bond fide proceed to work regularly upon such claim or claims, according to the usual course and practice of efficient mining, by so many miners as shall be required, until the claim is opened out sufficiently to adult of the full number of miners for which the claim is registered being employed therein.

55. Penalties, &c.—The owner or owners of any registered extended claim neglecting to commence work on their claim, as required by the preceding section, or at any time during the working thereof, neglecting to work or cause to be worked, or bale their due proportion of water from such claim, for a period of twenty-eight consecutive days, shall be liable on conviction thereof to a penalty not exceeding £10, and for a second offence on conviction thereof to a penalty may be enforced by any duly qualified miner or miners, or mining registrar, and be recoverable in a summary way before any justice being also a warden; provided that no second information shall be laid until fourteen days after the date of the first conviction; and if after the lapse of twenty-eight days from the infliction of any second penalty the owner or owners shall neglect to work, or cause to be worked, such claim, the same may be declared forfeited: Provided always, that if it shall appear to the court that work has not been bond fide commenced and continued in such claim within one (1) month after the lapse of the two (2) months allowed for registration, the said court may at once declare the right of such persons to the claim forfeited, and the persons enforcing such forfeiture shall be deemed to have a prior right to be put in possession of such claim.

Quartz claims may be held in reserve.—When any person or persons, or any company holding a claim under any of the before-mentioned classes, or an amalgamated claim, requires to suspend operations thereon for the purpose of creeting or repairing machinery, or through scarcity of water to crush quartz taken therefrom, or whon by reason of any influx of water which will prevent any claim under classes nos. 1, 2, and 3, or an amalgamated claim, from being efficiently worked until the holders of one adjoining claim are down to the same depth as such claim, the works thereon are unavoidably suspended, such person or persons, or such company, or some person duly authorized on their behalf, may make a statutory declaration in the form in the Schedule hereunto annexed marked IX, setting forth fully the reason for desiring to suspend the work upon the claim, and shall deliver such declaration, or duly certified copy thereof, to the mining registrar, and the said registrar shall upon the receipt of such declaration register such claim, to be held in reserve and unworked, as follows:—In case of repairing machinery, any period not exceeding six (6) months. - 70. Parties entitled to all deposits, &c., of gold.—The owner or owners of any quartz claim under any of the aforesaid classes, or of an amalgamated claim, shall be entitled to all reefs, veins, leaders, and alluvial deposits of gold within their claim: Provided that persons in possession of any such claim neglecting to work the reef in accordance with the provisions of this bye-law while working the alluvial ground shall be liable to have the area reduced to an ordinary alluvial claim.

Inspection by and information to mining officers.—The owner or owners of any claim under any of the aforesaid classes, and of any amalgamated claim, shall permit the mining surveyor, mining registrar, or other duly authorized officer, to inspect the workings and operations of such claim, and to take measurements thereof once in every three (3) months, if required, and shall render all the assistance in their power to such officer when making such inspection and measurements; and shall also furnish to such officer as aforesaid, if required, once in every three (3) months, a full, true, and correct statement as to the working operations which may have been carried on in such claim, the quantity of quartz and other substances which has been reduced or otherwise treated from such claim, the yield of gold therefrom, the number of miners and other persons employed in such claim, and such other general information not inconsistent with this clause, for the previous three (3) months, ending at such date as such officer shall determine.

GENERAL REGULATIONS.

- 72. How to take possession of any claim.—Any miner or miners considering himself or themselves justified in taking possession of any claim, water-right, or any other easement or share therein respectively, may do so provided that no other person or persons is or are then in possession or occupation thereof respectively; but in the event of any other miner or miners so in possession disputing the right of possession, the first-named person or persons shall apply to a court of competent jurisdiction to inquire into the subject-mater in dispute; but in no case shall any person take forcible possession of, or commence to work in, any claim after his right to take possession thereof has been disputed, without forfeiting all right or title he may have acquired therein.

 73. Wall.—A wall of two (2) feet in width shall be left.

Wall.—A wall of two (2) feet in width shall be left between all claims, except in quartz reef claims, marked out under this bye-law, by the miner or miners last marking out; and any party neglecting to leave such wall, the necessary ground may be deducted from the claim of the party so neglecting, and shall be assigned as a wall; and any such wall may be worked by either of the adjoining claimholders, provided that they secure the ground properly with sufficient timber.
- 74. Presence of parties marking claims.—It shall not be ecessary for all shareholders to be present at the marking out
- 75. Marking ground in excess.—Where any miner or miners have marked out more ground than he or they are entitled to under this bye-law, any other miner or miners may mark off such excess on any side of the claim, and the miner or miners having marked too much ground shall not be entitled to a wall taken from him or them.
- 76. Measurement of disputed ground.—In all cases where the right to certain ground forms matter of dispute between miners, each claim shall be measured from the boundary pegs opposite to the side of the claims in dispute, and no party shall be protected from encroachment unless the boundary pegs shall have been kept visible during the working of the claim.
- 77. Destroying or removing pegs, notices, &c.—No person shall remove, destroy, or cover over any pegs marking the boundary of any claim, or shall efface, remove, or destroy any notice posted on any claim; or shall willully out a channel so as to cause the escape of water from any water-dam, water-race, or tail-race that is being used by any miner or miners; nor shall it be lawful for any shareholder or shareholders in any claim to remove the pegs or to alter the boundaries of such claim without the censent of a majority of the shareholders of such claim.

- 78. Tunnelling.—Where in alluvial ground hills can be worked more efficiently by tunnelling, registered claimholders may hold, in addition to their claim or claims, sufficient ground for such tunnel, with twelve (12) feet on each side from the centre of their tunnel, as a protection to the same, for any distance along its course not exceeding one thousand (1,000) yards, and with a space of three hundred (300) feet square at the mouth of tunnel, for the crection of such machinery or other purposes.
- 79. Owners of alluvial claims entitled to all reefs and other deposits.—The owner or owners of any alluvial claim shall be entitled to work all quartz reefs, veins, leaders, and other deposits of gold within the area of such claim.
- 80. Prevention of accidents.—No persons shall be allowed to remove logs or any other substance from the top of any shaft to a lower level than four (4) feet above the surface, nor to cut any drain into any shaft whereby any claim, shaft, or workings may be damaged.
- 81. Protection to parties applying for ground.—Any miner or miners posting any authorized notice, or marking off any ground to be applied for under this bye-law, shall be protected in holding the same from the time of marking or posting such notice till the application is disposed of.

 82. Alluvial claims may be held in reserve.—When by reason of any influx of storm or other water, or scarcity of water, the works upon a claim cannot be prosecuted, or when the owner or owners of a claim require to suspend mining operations upon such claim for the purpose of procuring and erecting, or repairing machinery thereon, may do so, on obtaining registration from the mining registrar, setting forth the cause of such stoppage, and posting a copy thereof on the claim. REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR CRICKET AND OTHER PURPOSES OF PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE TOWN OF MACEDON.

IN THE TOWN OF MACEDON.

WE, George Nicholls, Thomas William Scott, John Flynn, William Thomas Willey, and Augustus Cork, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Cricket and other purposes of Public Recreation in the Town of Macedon, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 133 of The Land Act 1884.

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public, free of charge, from sunrise to sunset, except on such days, not exceeding twelve (12) in any one year, as the reserve may be set apart for special purposes, on any of which days a sum not exceeding One shilling may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the

2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences or trees or scats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.

5. No person shall put into the reserve any cattle, goats, or

6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority in writing of the com-mittee of management.

7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth, or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained.

8. No person, except laborers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

9. All moneys received by the committee of management shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve.

be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 133 of The Land Act 1884, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for such offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).

First.—That no person shall be allowed to use the sea shore or beach, the jetty and outlet of Kananook Creek (save in enclosed sea baths at this time existing or hereafter to be erected) for the purpose of bathing, or shall bathe, between these two points, viz.:—From a line with Nolan street to a line with Playne street, township of Frankston, and which points are defined by boards erected by order of the Council.

Second.—That no person shall be allowed to use the sea shore or beach for the purpose of bathing, or shall bathe, unless clad in some covering or bathing dress, between the point before named in a line with Nolan street and a point opposite the Sweet Water Creek bridge at Frankston, and which points are defined by boards erected by order of the Council.

Third.—That no person shall be allowed to use the sea shore or beach or jetty for the purpose of bathing, or shall bathe, (save in enclosed sea baths at this time existing or hereafter to be erected) between these two points, viz.:—From a point opposite the Royal Park Reserve Esplanade, Mornington, and a point nearly in line with Cook street, township of Mornington, and which points are defined by boards erected by order of the Council.

Fourth.—That no male person before the hours of half-past seven o'clock a.m., and after the hour of four o'clock p.m., or

BYE-LAWS OF THE WOMEN'S HOSPITAL.

THE Corporation of "The Women's Hospital and Infirmary for Diseases peculiar to Women's doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on them by An Act for Hospitals and Charitable Institutions, No. 220, make the Bye-laws following:—

OBJECTS.

1. The objects of the Women's Hospital and Infirmary for Diseases peculiar to Women are to afford relief to such women as the committee may deem fit subjects for in or out-door relief. Also to assist in the education and proper training of females in the special duties of midwives and nurses.

SEAL.

2. The seal of the corporation shall be an elevation of the building, with the words "Seal of the Women's Hospital, Melbourne," round it, and shall be kept in the custody of the superintendent, and shall be affixed only by an order of the connittee, in the presence of two members of committee and the superintendent, or some one deputted in his place; all of whom shall sign their names as witnesses.

LIFE MEMBERS.

3. Every contributor to the corporation of twenty pounds and upwards in one sum shall be a life member, and any person who, in the opinion of the committee, has conferred some signal benefit on the charity, irrespective of contribution, may be elected a life member thereof by the committee, and all life members shall have the privilege of voting and of recommending annually one in-door patient and six out-door patients.

ANNUAL CONTRIBUTORS.

4. Every annual contributor to the corporation of one pound and upwards shall be deemed a member of the corporation for the current year, and shall be entitled to vote at all meetings of contributors, and to recommend patients for admission to the hospital as follows:—

And so on, in proportion to the amount of subscription, which must be paid in advance.

VOTING.

5. Every contributor to the corporation shall be entitled to be as follows:—

No first yearly payment shall entitle to a vote at a general meeting within three months from the date of such payment. Every life member specially elected under bye-law 3 shall be entitled to one vote.

6. The executor first named in any will under which the corporation shall receive the sum of £50 and upwards shall be enrolled a life member thereof, and be entitled to vote at all meetings as a contributor of equal amount.

7. Any member of the corporation being absent from the colony of Victoria may, by his attorney duly appointed for that pumpose under power of attorney, exercise all the privileges to which such member is entitled; but such power of attorney shall be produced to the secretary at least three days before the privilege is exercised.

8. Every corporation, firm, or partnership subscribing to the funds of the corporation may exercise any privilege acquired by so doing through some one member of the same.

OFFICERS

OFFICERS.

9. There shall be a president and two vice-presidents, and an honorary treasurer, each of whom shall be elected at the annual meeting, and all of whom shall be carofficio members of the committee of management.

10. The number of the committee shall consist of twenty-two ladies and ten gentlemen exclusive of the office-hearers, and in every year one-third of the elected members of the committee shall retire by rotation, but shall be eligible for re-election.

11. There shall be an honorary lady secretary, a resident medical officer or officers, a superintendent, and a matron, all of whom shall be appointed by the committee, and any other officer that the committee may think necessary.

GENERAL AND SPECIAL MEETINGS.

GENERAL AND SPECIAL METINGS.

12. An annual general meeting shall be held on or before the 15th day of August in each year, of which not less than seven days notice shall be given by advertisement in two of the daily newspapers published in Melbourne, for the purpose of transacting the general business of the corporation, receiving from the committee a report and abstract of the general concerns of the institution for the past year ending the 30th June, together with a statement of the receipts and expenditure; the election of the aforexaid office-bearers and members of the committee, under bye-laws 9 and 10; the election of two auditors, and for transacting any other business of which due notice shall have been given. All elections shall be ity ballot, conducted under the direction of the president or chairman for the time being.

13. The committee may call a special general meeting of the contributors on giving seven days notice thereof by advertisement in two of the daily newspapers published in Melbourne, specifying the object in the form of a resolution, to which object alone the discussion shall be confined; they shall also call a special general meeting of twe written requisition of twelve contributors (not being of the committee), under restrictions similar to the preceding, upon any matter connected with the corporation.

14. At all meetings of contributors twelve shall constitute a

similar to the preceding, upon any matter connected when the corporation.

14. At all meetings of contributors twelve shall constitute a quorum. If no quorum is present within half an hour of the time appointed, the meeting shall stand adjourned for the following week, at the same day and hour.

15. All questions at any meeting shall be determined by a majority of the votes of those present, and, in case of an equal division of votes, the chairman shall have a casting vote in addition to any prayious vote.

COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT.

COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT.

16. The general business of the corporation shall be managed by the committee, who shall have the appointment of the bankers, superintendent, and all officers and servants of the corporation, and allow such salary, allowance, or recompense to them respectively, during their service or employment, as the committee shall from time to time see fit. All engagements between the committee and the salaried officers or servants shall be terminable on one month's notice, given by either side; and any salaried officer or servant shall be liable to immediate dismissal in the event of inefficiency, irregularity of conduct, or disobedience to the orders of the committee. The committee shall also have power to enter into contracts for the supply of provisions and other articles for the use of the corporation, to make such regulations as may be necessary for the internal management of the same, and to direct payment of accounts. All disbursements of the funds of the corporation shall be made by cheque, to be signed by the president, honorary treasurer, and superintendent, or in their absence by such deputies as the committee may appoint, but no such disbursement shall be made unless by direction of the committee of management.

17. The committee of management shall meet at the hospital at least once in every week, on a stated day, to transact current business. Four members to form a quorum, but a less number may admit and discharge patients. Minutes of the proceedings shall be recorded, to be read and confirmed at the next meeting. If a member of committee is absent from four consecutive meetings, the seat may be declared vacant; any vacancy from this or any other cause shall be filled by the committee temporarily appointing thereto some contributor to the hospital, until the next annual needing.

pointing thereto some contributor to the hospital, and the annual neeting.

18. No alteration shall be made in the salaries without a special notice to the full committee for that purpose.

19. The president, or, in his or her absence, one of the vice-presidents, shall preside at all meetings of the committee or corporation, and in their absence a deputy shall be chosen by the meeting.

20. No member of the committee shall supply the corporation with any article of trade, or be concerned or interested in any contract with the corporation.

21. The committee may, from time to time, make regulations under these bye-laws for the transaction of the business of the corporation. No proposition to make or amend any regulations shall be entertained unless one month's previous notice shall have been given; and no motion to rescind or alter a resolution shall be submitted unless one month's previous notice of the same be given.

HONORARY MEDICAL OFFICERS,

22. There shall be eight honorary medical officers, four of whom shall have charge of the infirmary and out-door departments, the remaining four shall have charge of the midwifery department. The present staff shall have the choice of department.

department. The present stant stant mave the choice of teparaments.

23. No person shall be an honorary medical officer in this corporation, unless, in addition to the requirements of the Medical Practitioners Statute 1865, he possess a degree in medicine of an Australian university, or a degree in medicine of one of the recognised universities of the United Kingdom, or of some foreign university recognised by the University of Melbourne, or be a member or licentiate of the Royal College of Physicians of London, Edinburgh, or Iteland; and, in addition to the above, he shall possess a degree in surgery of some university in the

Australian colonies or in the United Kingdom, or be a member, fellow, licentiate, of some college of surgeons in the United Kingdom, and shall have been engaged in the actual practice of his profession not less than five years; one year of actual practice in a hospital for the treatment of diseases poculiar to women is to be considered and counted as equal to two years of ordinary practice, but not more than one year is to be thus counted in favor of any one candidate. The appointment shall be made at a general meeting of contributors.

24. The committee shall cause an election to be held for the appointment of four additional medical officers during the month of March 1888, in accordance with the bye-laws hereinafter contained, relating to the election of honorary medical officers.

25. All the present honorary medical officers, and the four honorary medical officers as to be elected during March 1888, shall continue in office until September 30th, 1891, and shall thereupon retire. All subsequent appointments shall be for a term of four years. Any interim appointment shall be only for the unexpired term of the vacancy. All retiring officers to be eligible for re-election.

26. In addition to the eight honorary medical officers appointed under Rule 22, the committee may, in their discretion, appoint the Lecturer on Obstetries at the Melbourne University to be ex-officio a member of the honorary medical staff of this huspital, provided he be qualified under Rule 23; any such lecturer so appointed shall be attached to the midwifery department only, and his appointment shall be for such time as the committee think fit, and the committee may define his duties in connection with the aforesaid department.

27. Before the 15th of February 1888, the committee shall insert an advertisement in some daily newspaper, published in Melbourne, notifying that four additional honorary medical officer becomes vacant by effluxion of time, or from any other cause, the committee shall give public notice by advertisement as aforesai

be duly elected; or, in their discretion, may from time to time postpone the election and advertise anew as hereimbefore directed; provided that no vacancy shall remain unfilled for more than six weeks.

29. Where, at the expiration of the time so fixed, there are more than a sufficient number of duly qualified candidates for the positions vacant, the committee shall convene a general meeting of members for the election by such meeting by ballet of some one or more of such candidates to fill the vacant office or offices, as the case may be; and shall give not less than seven days' notice in some daily newspaper, published in Melbourne, of such meeting, and of the names of such candidates.

30. The first election of the four additional honorary medical officers shall be an election to the position of honorary medical officers to the institution; but all subsequent elections of these officers shall be in respect to either the midwifery department or the infirmary and out-door department, and all elections shall be held and conducted accordingly, subject to Rule 22. If any difference arise in respect to which department any of the honorary medical officers, to be elected in March 1888, shall be attached, the same shall be decided by a majority of the honorary medical officers.

31. No honorary medical officer shall be absent from the hospital for more than fourteen consecutive days, without permission from the committee. If absent for more than seven days, one of the other honorary medical officers or consulting officers shall be appointed to take charge of his patients; and, in case of absence on leave for more than a month, the committee may appoint a qualified locum tenus during absence, who shall be subject to the same rules as the honorary medical officers.

32. The committee may by an absolute majority of their body suspend any honorary medical officer, and in that event shall, within seven days thereafter, convene a general meeting confirm the same, the office of the person so suspended shall theroupon beco

HONORARY PATHOLOGIST.

HONORARY PATHOLOGIST.

35. There shall be an honorary pathologist who shall be appointed by the committee, and conform to the rules for the honorary medical staff of the hospital. He shall make post-mortem examinations when necessary, and keep such records of the pathological appearances of the cases, as the committee of management may direct.

36. Each honorary officer shall, when practicable, give clinical instructions to the students attending the hospital, and shall permit students to witness his practice.

RESIDENT MEDICAL OFFICER.

RESIDENT MEDICAL OFFICER.

37. The resident medical officer shall undertake the general supervision of the hospital professional work performed by the paid staff or students, subject to the regulations of the committee defining the duties. He shall be responsible for the medical and surgical stores, and see that the medicines are of proper quality and appropriately administered, and that the orders of the honorary staff are carried into effect.

MEDICAL STUDENTS.

MEDICAL STUDENTS.

38. Medical students may attend the practice of the hospital, subject to such regulations as the committée and the honorary medical staff may direct.

39. Students while attending midwifery work in the hospital shall not engage in other hospital work, either in wards or outpatients' departments, neither are they to dissect or attend pathology, or visit any patient suffering from any infectious or contagious disease.

SUPERINTENDENT.

40. The superintendent must give to the committee a fidelity guarantee to the extent of £250. He must devote the whole of his time to the service of the hospital. He shall have the supervision and control of the hospital and grounds, and be responsible to the committee for the due and efficient performance of the duties of all salaried officers and servants, except such duties as relate to matters of a professional character; and shall be the recognised channel of communication between the committee and the officials or servants. He shall attend all committee meetings and act as secretary thereto, keep all books and accounts, and conduct the general clerical business of the hospital as directed by the committee. He shall receive all monies paid at the hospital and pay the same into the hospital bank account.

THE COLLECTOR.

41. The collector shall give a fidelity guarantee for £100 or more, as the committee may determine. He shall keep a correct record of all money received by him on behalf of the corporation, and pay the same into the hospital bank account, and make such returns as required by the committee, and at such times as they may deem most convenient.

MATRON.

MATRON.

42. The matron shall be mistress of the household, and have control of the nurses and servants, and shall hire and discharge the same, subject to the approval of the committee. She shall daily visit the wards of the hospital, and conduct the household affairs generally in accordance with the regulations of the committee, and shall report any irregularity or negligence she may observe, or any suspension of the nurses or servants, to the superintendent at once, and to the committee at their next meeting. meeting.

NURSES AND PUPIL NURSES.

43. The nurses and pupil nurses shall reside in the hospital, and, subject to the directions of the committee and the resident medical officers, be under the control and supervision of the matron, and obey all her orders and directions.

GRATUITIES.

44. No paid official connected with this institution shall accept of any gratuity from any patient, either in the form of a testimonial or otherwise.

ADMISSION OF IN-PATIENTS.

ADMISSION OF IN-PATIENTS.

45. In-patients shall be admitted on the ticket of a contributor, subject to the approval of the committee or of the resident medical officer. Contributors, before recommending a patient to the committee, are expected, from personal inquiry, to satisfy themselves that the case is one needing charitable relief. Any themselves that the case is one needing charitable relief. Any case of emergency which the resident medical officer may admit on his own discretion shall be reported to the committee, and all paticulars respecting it shall be recorded; the committee shall have the power of admitting patients unable to procure subscribers tickets, provided they pring satisfactory references.

46. Each patient shall keep her person scrupulously clean, and as far as she is able assist the nurses in maintaining the wards in proper condition, and make herself generally useful according to the directions of the matron. No patient shall bring into the hospital any spirituous liquors. Any patient guilty of misconduct shall be liable to instant dismissal by the resident medical officer, who shall report the same to the committee at their next meeting.

OUT-PATIENTS.

47. Out-patients, on the ticket of a subscriber, and subject to the approval of the committee or resident medical officer, shall receive such medicines and medical advice as the case may require, on days fixed for that purpose. The committee shall have the power of admitting patients unable to procure subscribers' tickets, provided they bring satisfactory references.

SPIRITUAL CONSOLATION.

48. Any in-patient desiring spiritual consolation shall at all times be accessible to the minister of her religion, who shall perform the duties of his office at the bedside of the patient in such a way as not to disturb other patients.

VISITORS AND FRIENDS.

VISITORS AND FRIENDS.

49. Subscribers may visit the hospital on Tuesdays and Fridays, between the hours of two and four o'clock p.in.; and the public and friends of patients may visit the hospital on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays, between the hours of two and three o'clock p.m.; but no visitor shall be allowed to enter the wards without the permission of the resident surgeons or matron.

50. No infant shall be taken from the hospital unaccompanied by its mother, for the purpose of being adopted, unless with the consent of the mother and of the committee, given in writing, and countersigned by the secretary.

51. All rules and bye-laws heretofore made shall, one month after the confirmation of the bye-laws hereinbefore set forth, by a general meeting of contributors specially convened for that purpose, and their publication in the Government Gazett, be and the same are hereby rescinded; but such rescinding shall not affect any rights or privileges acquired thereunder.


