PUBLIC AND BANK HOLIDAYS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in the eighty-eighth section of *The Public Service Act 1885*, and in the fifth section of *The Bank Holidays Act 1873*, I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation appoint

FRIDAY THE 30TH DAY OF DECEMBER INSTANT

a special day to be observed as a Bank Holiday within the Shire of Lillydale and the East Riding of the Shire of Eltham;

TUESDAY THE 3RD DAY OF JANUARY NEXT

to be observed as a Public and Bank Holiday within the Borough of Port Fairy.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-ninth day of December, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, and in the fifty-first year of Her Majesty's reign.

GOD SAVE THE QUEEN!

“THE FACTORIES AND SHOPS ACT 1885.”

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the 29th section of *The Factories and Shops Act 1885* (49 Vict. No. 862), and after due inquiry, I, the Chief Secretary of Victoria, being the responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being administering the said Act, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of the said section 29 in

ALL THE WOOLLEN FACTORIES OF VICTORIA

for a further period of three months from the 1st January 1888, upon these express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factories any female or any male under the age of sixteen for more than fifty-six hours in any one week, or more than ten hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That no female or male under the age of sixteen who is paid weekly wages shall be so employed without receiving overtime payment for the extra work she or he is called upon to perform.
3. That no female or male under the age of sixteen shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without her or his consent.
4. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in each such factory for the information of all concerned.
