QUARANTINE STATION.

It having been recently deemed necessary, in the interests of the community, to prohibit for a time the transmission of letters from the Quarantine Station, the Governor in Council, with a view to reduce as far as possible inconvenience to persons detained at that station, authorized the transmission thence, for a fortnight from the 15th January 1887, of telegrams from private individuals to places within the colony without any fees being charged for their transmission, it being conditioned that such telegrams were to be of real necessity and not of too great frequency from any one person.

PILOT REGULATIONS.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the amendment of Clause 27 of the Pilot Regulations, by the substitution in the 8th line thereof of the word "six" for "five."

The amended regulation will read as follows, viz.:-

The amended regulation will read as follows, viz.:—

27. Charge of cruising station.—On leaving the cruising station, the pilot in charge shall cause the flag to be hauled down and kept so until the station is again taken up, and insert in the log of the day's proceedings the names of all pilots on board at the time of leaving the station, and the bearings of known visible objects on shore at the time. The pilot in charge of the relieving vessel shall also insert the names of all pilots of his company relieving the station which shall at no time be less than six, and every endeavour shall be made by the company on the cruising station to keep that number of pilots on board by relay; and he shall also insert the bearings of known visible objects from the vessel when taking up the station. This rule shall apply, as far as practicable, to vessels obliged to leave the cruising station from having shipped all pilots of her company, and also to the vessel relieving her; and until the relieving vessel is outside the inner boundary, she is not to be considered as having taken up the cruising station.

KYNETON SHIRE WATERWORKS TRUST.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined regulation, made in pursuance of the provisions of *The Victorian Water Conservation Acts, Nos. 716, 778, and 829.*

REGULATION NO. V.

REGULATION NO. V.

The Chairman and Commissioners of the Kyneton Shire Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an urban district, for the purposes of the The Victorium Water Conservation Act 1883, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by The Victorian Water Conservation Acts 1881, 1883, and 1884, make the regulation following:—

A rate of One shilling in the pound sterling shall be imposed and levied on all the rateable property in the waterworks district of the Kyneton Shire Waterworks Trust liable in respect of rates levied by the said Trust according to the valuation for the time being of such rateable property for the municipal rate of the municipal district in which such rateable property is situate, for one year commencing on the first day of January One thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven. Such rate shall be payable and collected in two equal portions or instalments, and the first instalment shall be due and payable on the first day of January One thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, and the second instalment on the first day of July One thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, and the second instalment on the first day of July One thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven. Such persons as the Commissioners of the Kyneton Shire Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rate.

Tenders are required to be written on a form, printed copies of which may be had gratuitously on application at any post office in the colony, and are to be forwarded (if by post, PREPAID AND REGISTERED) for receipt at the General-Post Office by the hour and date first above mentioned, addressed to the Honorable the Postmaster-General, with the words "Tender for Mail Service No." endorsed on the cover, or placed in the tender-box at the General Post Office.

2. Tenderers are requested to describe by their numbers, as below, the mail services for which they tender.

3. The amount of the tender must be stated AT RATE PER ANNUM in words as well as figures.

5. The amount of the tender must be stated at hate the arrows in words as seed as figures.

4. Every tender must bear the bond fide signature and address of the tenderer, and bear the names of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the fulfilment of the contract in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of the contract.

5. Every tender must be accommanied by cash marked

sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of the contract.

5. Every tender must be accompanied by cash, marked cheque, bank draft, or a bank deposit-receipt to the credit of the Deputy Postmater-General for a sum equal to TRN PER CENT. of the annual amount named in the tender; this deposit to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government within ten days of being notified that the documents are ready for execution. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient.

6. The money or other security deposited by unsuccessful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, on the bond and contract being duly signed.

7. The money or other security deposited by unsuccessful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, and on their signing receipts for the respective amounts.

8. In the event of a new line of railway, or a new railway station on an existing line being opened for traffic, and it being decided that the mails shall be conveyed by rail, the Postmaster-General shall have the power of cancelling the contract for any mail service running in the vicinity of the railway without compensation to the contractor, or shall have power to alter the

points of arrival and departure of the mails; and in the event of the travelling distance on any mail line being in such manner increased or diminished, all payments for the service subsequent to the alteration shall be computed on the basis of the average mileage-rate of the contract.

- 9. In the event of it being found necessary, from any cause, to absolutely cancel a contract, the Postmaster-General shall have full power to do so, provided that, unless the contract be cancelled on account of any fault on the part of the contractor, or on account of the opening of a railway line or a new railway station, payment shall be made to the contractor as compensation of a sum equal to ten per cent. of the moneys which would have become due on the unexpired period of the contract if the latter had been continued for the full term of three years.

The occupier of any land in the said shire on which there shall be erected any stable, cow-yard, cattle-shed, or pig-sty shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all soil, dung, or other manure produced or accumulated therein to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of the same so produced or accumulated shall amount to three cubic yards; and if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect or fail to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid, the same shall be removed by the said local board at the expense of such occupier.

8. All nightsoil, blood, offal, or other offensive matter or thing shall be removed to and deposited in such place or places only as may be appointed by the local board from time to time for the final reception of the same.

9. Every person placing or depositing, or causing or suffering to be placed or deposited or spread, or assisting in placing or depositing or spreading on any land, whether by way of manure or otherwise, any nightsoil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter removed from any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or other place, shall immediately on the deposit or spreading thereof cover the same, or cause the same to be covered, and shall keep the same covered, with a layer of earth not less than six inches in thickness.

11. Every closet-pan shall be constructed of galvanized iron, properly riveted and soldered, so as to be water-tight, and with handles thereto, and of a capacity not exceeding three cubic feet.

6. All paddocks, grounds, lands, and enclosures used as grazing ground for dairy cattle shall, whenever necessary, be inspected by any member or officer of the said local board, or by any person authorized, in writing by the chairman or secretary of the said local board; and if, on inspection, such paddocks, grounds, or enclosures, or any one of them, are, or is likely, in the opinion

of the officer or person so inspecting, to be prejudicial-to health, by affecting the milk or otherwise, the said local board may, by an order in writing signed by the secretary, and served personally or left at the dwelling-house of the registered person, or in the case of an unregistered person, served personally or left at his dwelling-place, or posted upon the land, prohibit the use of the same for the purpose of feeding dairy cattle either absolutely or for any time named in such order. All cattle in dairies shall also be similarly inspected by a veterinary surgeon or other competent person, and any cows found to be diseased, or which from poverty or weakness are, in the opinion of the inspector, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, shall be forthwith removed from such dairy if ordered by such inspector or other officer as aforesaid. And any such order as aforesaid the said local board may revoke, but upon every fresh inspection a similar order may from time to time be made.

7. All houses, dairies, cowsheds, milk stores, milk shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated, and the drainage of all such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not.

8. All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows shall be regularly swept and be kept perfectly clean, and shall within twenty-four hours of any order to such effect from the health officer or inspector of nuisances be funniquated, disinfected, or lime-washed, as may be in any such order so directed.

feeted, or lime-washed, as may be in any such order so directed.

9. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily.

10. If any person or any member of the family of any person registered as aforesaid, or not so registered, but employed as a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor or member of the family of any visitor to any such person shall be attacked by typhoid fever, or any dangerous infectious disease, the occupier of the bouse in which such person shall be, or (if he be the person attacked) his wile or other person in charge shall immediately give notice thereof to the local board or officer of health, or to the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the Local Board of Health, and thercupon it shall and may be lawful for the said local board or the officer of health, by order served as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of any such cowkeeper, dairyman or purveyor of milk until danger, in the opinion of such local board, or officer of health, no longer exists. And in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering, to milk cows or to handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business. Nor, if the person registered or conducting such business be himself the person suffering, shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until, in either case, all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk or of its contamination has ceased.

11. If at any time disease exists in the dairy or among the cows or cattle in any cowshed or dairy, or in the herds of any cowkeeper, dairyman, vendor or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the local board, officer of health, or nearest member of the police force, and

such breach shall be committed or continued.


