GREETING:

WHEREAS it is deemed advisable to hold an International Exhibition of Works of Industry and Art, at Melbourne, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, in commemoration of the centenary of the founding of the first Colony of Australia, to be called "The Centennial International Exhibition, Melbourne, 1888": Know ye that by the power and authority vested in me by the Act numbered Four hundred and twenty-two, I, the Governor of the said Colony, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, relying on your loyalty, integrity, learning, and ability, have constituted and appointed and by these presents do constitute and appoint you the said George Higinbotham, Sir James MacBain, Peter Lalor, Sir William John Clarke, Frederick Thomas Sargood, James Munro, William Mountford Kinsey Vale, Joseph Bosisto, Robert Murray Smith, William Cain, Thomas Houlden Thompson, Patrick Hayes, Lambert L. Mount, William Trenwith, John Blyth, and Henry Byron Moore, to be Commissioners to take measures for the holding of such International Exhibition, and to carry out and superintend such Exhibition; and for the erecting, altering, and maintaining of suitable grounds and buildings for the purposes of such Exhibition; you keeping the entire control and management thereof until otherwise determined, and for appointing and regulating the charges for admission to such buildings, premises, or grounds, or the rent or hire of any part thereof or otherwise, and the application of the proceeds towards the objects and the expenses of the said Exhibition; and for appointing the purposes of public enjoyment and entertainment for which such buildings, premises, and grounds, or any part thereof may be used and applied; and for obtaining such exhibits as may, in your judgment, be necessary to illustrate the progress of industry and art elsewhere; and for securing the most effective display of all articles sent for public exhibition, their safe custody, their due return to their owners, or their disposal otherwise, as may be arranged; and for determining as to the nature, number, and value of the prizes to be awarded to the exhibitors and the impartial distribution thereof; and generally to do and execute all other matters and things whatsoever deemed necessary by you for the full accomplishment of the duties entrusted to you by this Commission: And further, I do hereby, with the advice aforesaid, constitute and appoint you the said George Higinbotham to be President, and you the said Sir James MacBain, Peter Lalor, Sir William John Clarke, and Frederick Thomas Sargood, to be the Vice-Presidents of this Commission: And do further constitute and appoint you the said Commissioners to be also the Executive Commissioners for the said Exhibition: And for your assistance in the due execution of this Commission I do hereby appoint George Theodore Agans Lavater, Esquire, to be Secretary to this Commission: And lastly with the advice aforesaid, I do, by these presents, ordain that this Commission shall continue in full force and virtue until otherwise determined; and that you, the said Commissioners, or any five or more of you, shall and may from time to time, and at any place or places, proceed in the execution thereof, and of every matter and thing therein contained, although your proceedings may not be continued from time to time by adjournment.

WESTERN PACIFIC.—HIGH COMMISSION.

CLAIMS TO LAND.

BRITISH subjects, desiring to register claims to land purchased in the Western Pacific, may forward for registration a statement of such claim to the Secretary to the High Commissioner, Suva, Fiji.

The statement should set forth the name by which the land claimed is known, together with a description of its boundaries; also the name of the group, island, and place therein in which such land is situated. Whenever possible the statement should be accompanied by a sketch or plan of the land and locality. Such plan should not be larger than 14 x 8 inches.

The Registry will only record the particulars of the claim of the party registering, and such registration will not be regarded as the record of a warranted title, under which Her Majesty's Government guarantee to protect the holder.

A record will be kept of any statement the claimant may desire to make with reference to the title under which he claims.

If desired, copies will be filed in the High Commissioner's Office of all deeds and documents in support of claims to land, on production of the originals, or of copies certified to be correct by one of Her Majesty's Judicial or Deputy Commissioners for the Western Pacific, or by an officer in command of one of Her Majesty's ships, or by any British Consular Officer in the Western Pacific.

Search will be made at the instance of any person requesting it, and copies supplied of all entries in the Register of Claims, as also of the registry of deeds and other documents filed.

CUTTING AT STEWART'S ISLAND, GREAT SANDY ISLAND STRAIT. Notice is hereby given that a Cutting is now completed through the Channel on the West side of Stewart's Island, giving a depth of 11 feet at low water. The red buoy on the spit is replaced by a white beacon, the sides of the channel being marked at its southern end by two black and three red beacons, and the Cutting at its northern end by a black and a red beacon abreast of one another. The line of the centre of the Cutting is marked by two triangular beacons, painted white, placed on the bank to the northward of the Cutting and to the eastward of Moonboom Island. A second red beacon is also placed on the western edge of this bank.

Directions.—When coming from the southward, after passing the tide scale (which still shows the water on the Flats by the old channel, and 5 feet less than the water in the new channel), leave the white beacon on the port hand, passing in mid channel between it and the first red beacon, and continuing a mid-channel course between the black and red beacons. When the triangular leading beacons are in line, keep them in that position until a cable's length past the red and black beacons abreast the north end of Stewart's Island, then haul over for Moonboom Island, and passing the two red beacons placed on the western edge of the bank on the starboard hand, proceed up the channel as formerly.

ARAFURA SEA, VERNON ISLANDS, NORTHERN TERRITORY.

CAPTAIN MACLEAR, of H.M.S. *Flying Fish*, reports the discovery of a Shoal off the East Vernon Island, Northern Territory. Approximate position, latitude $12^{\circ} 4' 15''$ south, longitude $131^{\circ} 10' 45''$ east. Right tangent, north extreme of East Island, N. $80^{\circ} 30'$ W., magnetic, 3 miles. Variation, $2^{\circ} 30'$ east. Extent of shoal, about a quarter of a mile, with general depths of from five to six fathoms, coral and rock. Least water on pinnacle in above position is thirteen feet L.W.S., reduced to tides observed in August.

STRAIT OF SUNDA.

Telegraph-cable shifted.

THE direction of the telegraph-cable in the Strait of Sunda (see Notice to Mariners No. 13, Hydrographic Office, Batavia, 1884) has undergone the following alteration:—

From the curve off the Varkenshoek the cable runs to a point southward of Thwartway, in latitude $6^{\circ} 1' S.$ and longitude $105^{\circ} 49' 52'' E.$

From here in a S.E. & S. direction to a point on shore, about 160 yards eastward of the entrance of the Bodjong River.

Near this point are:—

A white cable-house (inside) and

A white beacon (outside).

S.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ S. and N.W. $\frac{1}{2}$ N. of each other.

On the cable 2 nun-buoys are moored, with "Telegraaf-kabel" on the side, supporting an iron vane with the Netherlands colors and the word "Telegraaf."

The outer-buoy lies in 18 fathoms of water on the following bearings:—

Flagstaff in line with lighthouse ... S.S.E.

Beacon in line with cable-house ... S.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ S.

The inner-buoy lies in 6½ fathoms on the alignment of the other buoy and the cable-house.

In consequence of the fore-mentioned alterations, the telegraph buoys northward of Merak have been withdrawn.

It is forbidden to anchor near the cable. If an anchor is let go in case of necessity, it should be carefully weighed as soon as possible. In case the cable is brought up it should be detached and lowered to the bottom carefully to avoid chafe.

Regulation No. 7.

REGULATION No. 3.

Regulation for imposing, levying, and receiving rates for the year 1886 on all the rateable property in that part of the Loddon United Water Trust District hereinafter mentioned.

Whereas the Governor in Council has, by an Order made the second day of August 1886, under the provisions of section 93 of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1883*, divided the Loddon United Waterworks District into divisions, and has directed that the rates necessary for paying interest on all moneys borrowed by the Loddon United Water Trust for the construction and maintenance of their works, or to meet any other expense in connection therewith, shall be levied only in the following divisions, viz.:—The Shire of Marong Division, the Shire of East Loddon Division, the Shire of Gordon East Division, the Shire of Gordon West Division, and the Shire of Korong Division; and has further directed that such rates shall be levied differentially as between such various divisions.

And whereas notice has been given that the Shire of Gordon East Division and the Shire of Gordon West Division are supplied with water under the provisions of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1883*, and which notice was published in the *Government Gazette* of 13th August 1886.

Now therefore the Commissioners of the said Loddon United Water Trust do hereby make the following rates for the year 1886 on all the rateable property in the following divisions (being two of the divisions enumerated in the foregoing Order in Council) of the Loddon United Waterworks District, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rates of the shire within which such divisions are situated, that is to say:—On rateable property within the Shire of Gordon East Division, a rate of One shilling in the pound sterling of such valuation; on rateable property within the Shire of Gordon West Division, a rate of One shilling in the pound sterling of such valuation.

GRANT TO AGRICULTURAL SOCIETIES.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations in connection with the above-named Grant-in-aid, 1886-7, viz. :-

AGRICULTURAL SOCIETIES.

Regulations for the distribution of the sum of Twenty thousand pounds (£20,000) granted by Parliament to Agricultural Societies, 1886-7.

1. That a sum of Sixteen hundred and seventy-nine pounds seven shillings be paid to agricultural societies, in accordance with the provisions of Clause 2 of Regulations gazetted 31st December 1885.

2. Each society shall furnish to the Secretary for Agriculture, on or before the 1st February 1887, a statement in the form marked A, which must be verified by statutory declaration in the form marked E.

3. On receipt of the above-mentioned statement so verified, the Minister of Agriculture may cause to be paid to the treasurer of each society a sum equal to two-thirds of the amount shown to have been awarded and paid away in prizes not exceeding £25 each (except for the exhibits mentioned in the statement above referred to, and such other exhibits the Minister may consider unsuitable), on condition that this sum do not exceed the amount raised by members' subscriptions and private donations; and if it do exceed the same, that it be in that case reduced to a sum equal to the amount so raised.

4. Of the whole grant (£20,000), a sum not exceeding Seven thousand eight hundred and twenty pounds thirteen shillings shall be so divided; and if the sums claimable be in excess of this amount they shall be reduced *pro rata*.

5. A sum not to exceed Five hundred pounds shall be paid to the Shepparton Amalgamated Agricultural Society towards the expenses of its spring show, held on the 26th, 27th, and 28th October 1886, under the patronage of the Department of Agriculture.

6. No society located within twenty miles of any other society shall be entitled to participate in the vote unless the sum awarded and paid away in prizes by such society as hereinbefore specified amounts in the total to One hundred pounds at least.

Instructions.

1. The blank spaces in the declaration, form E, for the sums awarded and paid in prizes and raised by members' subscriptions and private donations, between the 1st January 1886 and the 31st December 1886, must be filled up in words as well as in figures, and the declaration must be made before a justice of the peace by the treasurer of the society.

2. The account, when received, must be signed by the treasurer and be countersigned by the president, or the vice-president, or by two members of the committee of management. It should then be returned to the Secretary for Agriculture, Melbourne.

3. Challenge cups must not be included in the return of prize moneys paid unless such cups have been finally awarded.

NOTE.—The forms B, C, and D are forwarded herewith by way of guidance, but can be made use of at the option of the society. If, however, extra forms be required, the same must be furnished by the applicant, and be of uniform size and pattern.

WHEREAS by The Land Act 1884 power is given to the Governor in Council from time to time to make, alter, and rescind rules, regulations, and orders for the various purposes therein specified: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 136 of the said Act, doth hereby rescind the following schedules to the Land Regulations of the seventeenth day of March 1885, viz.:—Schedule XI., Schedule XXXI., Schedules III. and LXX. so far as the conditions of license are concerned, and Condition 1 of Schedule XLIV., and, with the advice aforesaid, doth make the following schedules and conditions in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

SCHEDULE XI.—(CHAP. VI. s. 2.)

LICENSEE UNDER SECTION 42 OF "THE LAND ACT 1884."

This Indenture made this _____ day of _____ in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty _____ between His Excellency Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria of the one part and _____ of _____ in the said colony hereinafter called "the licensee" of the other part.

WHEREAS the licensee having applied for this license and made the declaration required by the 44th section of The Land Act 1884 the Governor with the advice of the Executive Council has agreed to grant the same on the faith that the applicant does not by becoming the licensee violate or fail to comply with any of the provisions of the said Act: And whereas the Governor with the advice aforesaid has approved of and directed the conditions and provisions hereinafter contained to be inserted in this license framed in accordance with the regulations made in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act: And whereas the licensee has paid half a year's fee for occupation in advance: Now this Indenture witnesseth that in consideration of the payment aforesaid of the fee for occupation hereby reserved and of the agreements by the licensee hereinafter contained the Governor with the advice aforesaid and in exercise of the power given by the said Act doth hereby demise and grant unto the licensee license and liberty to enter upon and personally to occupy in accordance with the provisions of the said Act All that agricultural allotment situate in the parish of _____

county of _____ in the colony of Victoria containing _____ acres more or less and delineated on the plan prepared in accordance with the provisions of the 30th section of the said Act and thereon numbered _____ in the said parish and also delineated on the plan drawn in the margin of these presents and thereon colored yellow for the term of six years from the day of the date of this license: Yielding and paying therefor during the said term a yearly fee for occupation of _____ being calculated at the rate of One shilling per annum for each and every acre or fractional part of an acre contained in the said allotment the said yearly fee to be paid in advance by equal half-yearly payments on the _____ day of _____ and the _____ day of _____ in every year clear of all

deductions the first of the half-yearly payments having been made in conformity with the provisions of the said Act the next of the said half-yearly payments to be made on the _____ day of _____ next and the last of the half-yearly payments to be made on the _____ day of _____ next preceding the expiration of the term of this license: The licensee for himself his heirs executors and administrators hereby agrees with the Governor as follows: To pay the said license fee in moieties in advance at the times and in manner hereinbefore appointed for payment thereof clear of all deductions and also all existing and future rates assessments and taxes for the time being payable by landlord or tenant in respect of the premises: Not during the currency of this license to assign the license nor to transfer his right title and interest therein or in the allotment hereinbefore described and herein comprised or any part thereof nor to sublet the said allotment or any part thereof: To at once and to the satisfaction of the Board of Land and Works commence and continue to destroy and within two years after the issue of this license to have destroyed to the satisfaction of the Board the animals and birds by the said Act included in the term "vermin" or which the Governor with the advice of the Executive Council may by proclamation in the Government Gazette declare to be vermin for the purposes of the said Act upon such land and to keep the same free from such animals and birds to the satisfaction of the said Board during the currency of this license: To enclose within six years from the issue of this license if not sooner called upon under the provisions of The Fences Statute 1874 the land herein comprised with a fence of such kind as shall come within the meaning assigned to the word "fence" by The Land Act 1884 and keep the same in repair during the continuance of this license: Within twelve months after the issue of this license to commence and thenceforward during the continuance of this license without intermission (except for any period specified in a notice registered in conformity with the provisions of the 44th section of the said Act) to occupy personally the said allotment To make and erect on the said allotment before the end of the sixth year from the commencement of this license substantial and

permanent improvements of the value of One pound for every acre and fractional part of an acre of the allotment: At all times during the continuance of this license *bond fide* to comply with all and not to violate any of the provisions of the said Act: The land comprised in this license is subject both during the currency of this license and after the licensee shall have acquired the fee-simple thereof to the right of any person being the holder of a miner's right or of a mining lease to enter therein and thereon and to mine for gold and silver and to erect and occupy mining plant or machinery thereon in the same manner and under the same conditions and provisions as those on which such person had at the time of the passing of the said Act the right to mine for gold and silver in and upon Crown lands provided that compensation shall be paid to the licensee by such persons for surface damage to be done to such lands by reason of mining thereon such compensation to be determined as provided by the 117th section of the said Act and the payment thereof to be a condition precedent to such right of entry and this license is subject to the conditions that the licensee shall at all times during the currency hereof permit every such person to exercise the right aforesaid: The Governor with the advice of the Executive Council or the Board of Land and Works for and on behalf of Her Majesty her heirs and successors may at any time during the currency of this license resume possession of all or any part or parts of the lands comprised in the said allotment which may be required for reserves for public purposes or for the purpose of water supply irrigation works races dams and ditches or for railways roads canals or for tramways or other internal communication or for mining purposes provided that any moneys which may have been paid by the licensee to the Crown in respect of the lands so resumed or expended by him thereupon shall be repaid to him together with such other moneys as compensation for such resumption as to the Governor with the advice of the Executive Council seems fit: The preceding provision shall be construed as independent of and concurrent with the powers conferred by the 68th section of the said Act: In case possession of any part or parts shall be resumed as aforesaid the agreements and conditions herein contained with reference to the whole shall continue in force and apply to such part as shall be left in the possession of the licensee: If and whenever any part of the said fees for occupation shall be in arrear whether the same shall have been demanded or not or if and whenever there shall be a breach of any of the agreements positive or negative by the licensee herein contained or if this license shall be assigned whether by operation of law or otherwise save as in the said Act is otherwise expressly provided or if the said allotment or any part thereof is sublet or in case the licensee do not within twelve months after the issue of this license and thenceforward during the continuance of this license without intermission (except as hereinbefore mentioned) personally occupy the said allotment or in case substantial and permanent improvements certified in writing under the seal of the Board of Land and Works or under the hands of arbitrators as provided by the said Act to be of the value of One pound for every acre and fractional part of an acre of the allotment shall not have been made on the said allotment by the licensee before the end of the sixth year from the commencement of this license or if it shall at any time be shown to the satisfaction of the Governor with the advice aforesaid (and that it has been so shown the production of a copy of the Government Gazette containing a notice purporting to be signed by the responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being administering the said Act or Part III. of the said Act so declaring or notifying or declaring or notifying that this license has become forfeited and void shall be conclusive evidence) that the licensee became such licensee or that he held or continued to hold this license in violation of or non-compliance with any of the provisions of the said Act or that the licensee has committed a breach of or not fulfilled any of the conditions of this license then and in any of such cases this license shall be void and of no effect: And as ancillary and without prejudice to the provisions of the 45th and 121st sections of the said Act it is hereby agreed that immediately upon this license so becoming void and of no effect it shall be lawful for any bailiffs of Crown lands or for any other agents or officers authorized in that behalf without any demand whatever to enter upon the said allotment and the licensee and all persons claiming under him for ever to expel and remove therefrom without any legal process whatsoever and as effectually as any sheriff might do in case Her Majesty had obtained judgment in ejectment or in an action for the recovery of land and a writ of *habere facias possessionem* or writ of possession or other process had issued on such judgment directed to such sheriff in due form of law and that in case of such entry and any action being brought or other proceedings taken for or on account of the same by any person whatsoever the defendants or defendant to such action may plead leave and license thereto and these presents shall be conclusive evidence of the leave and license of the licensee and all persons claiming under him to any bailiff of Crown lands and all persons acting in the matters complained of in such action or other proceeding: It is hereby declared that if the licensee during the said period of six years occupy the said allotment for not less than five years and fence and make the improvements of the nature and value hereinbefore mentioned on the said allotment during the said period of six years and prove to the satisfaction of the Board of Land and Works (to be certified under its seal) by such evidence as the said Board may require that he has complied with the said conditions and with all other conditions hereof he shall be entitled at any time within twelve months after six years from the commencement of this license to demand and obtain from the Governor in Council a Crown grant upon payment of Fourteen shillings for each acre or fractional part of an acre or otherwise he may obtain a lease of the said allotment and such lease shall be for a term of fourteen years at a yearly rental of One shilling for each acre or fractional part of an acre so demised payable in equal parts half-yearly in advance and will contain the usual covenants for the payment of rent and a condition for re-entry on non-payment thereof: And upon payment of the last sum due on account of the rent so reserved or at any time during the term upon payment of the difference between the

amount of rent actually paid and the entire sum of One pound for each acre or fractional part of an acre the lessee or his representatives shall be entitled to a grant in fee of the lands leased and every such grant shall be subject to such covenants conditions exceptions and reservations as the Governor in Council may direct. Provided also that if it be proved to the satisfaction of the responsible Minister of the Crown aforesaid by the licensee that owing to ill-health he is unable to reside on the said allotment or that for any other reason it is expedient to do so the said Minister may cause the said allotment to be put up for sale by auction. Provided also that in the case of the insolvency or death of the licensee during the currency of this license it shall not be obligatory on the assignee or trustee in insolvency or on the executors or administrators of such licensee to comply with the said condition of occupation. Provided also that in the case of the insolvency or death of the licensee during the currency of this license it shall be lawful for the assignee or trustee in insolvency or for the executors or administrators of such licensee to assign such license to any person who is qualified for becoming a licensee under Part III. of the said Act and such person shall thereupon be with respect to such license in the same position as though he had been the original licensee. Except as herein otherwise expressly provided the word "licensee" shall include his executors and administrators and any person or persons in whom this license may under the provisions of the said Act become vested. And the licensee for himself his executors and administrators further covenants and agrees with Her Majesty her heirs and successors in manner following that is to say In the event of any portion of the land hereby demised being at any time or times required by the Commissioners of Railways for the construction of railways railway stations or railway works already or hereafter authorized to be constructed or by the Governor in Council or Administrator of the Government of Victoria by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council thereof hereinafter designated the Governor in Council for any public road or highway to be hereafter set out by the Governor in Council he the said licensee his executors and administrators will upon being allowed by the Commissioners of Railways or Governor in Council one month after receiving notice in writing from the Commissioners of Railways or Governor in Council that the land is so required for the removal by him or them of any buildings erections or fences upon the land so required remove such buildings erections and fences and relinquish possession of the land so required and that neither he nor they will make any claim for compensation whatsoever for the said buildings erections or fences or for any improvements or for any moneys expended upon the said lands or for the cost which he or they may incur in such removal nor will he or they make any claim for compensation for any right or interest which he or they may possess in such land beyond a proportionate reduction in the license fee which shall in all cases be fixed by an officer appointed by the Governor in Council nor in respect of the severance from the other lands occupied by him or them under this license. And it is expressly agreed between the parties hereto that this covenant is to be construed as a release by the said licensee his executors and administrators to Her Majesty her heirs and successors from all or any payment to him or them and from all claims thereto which might otherwise have been made in respect of resumption of any portion of the land hereby demised for railway purposes or for the purposes of a public road or highway under the before contained conditions for resumption by or on behalf of Her Majesty her heirs and successors. And it is hereby lastly declared that the term "Governor" in these presents shall mean the Governor or the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of Victoria for the time being unless such meaning shall be inconsistent with the context.

Excepting also unto Her Majesty her heirs and successors all gold and auriferous earth or stone and all mines containing gold within the boundaries of the said land. construction of railways railway stations or railway works already or hereafter authorized to be constructed or shall be required by the Governor in Council or by any corporation person or persons acting in behalf of the Government of Victoria or by any public Water Trust or Irrigation Trust or body constituted under the present or future laws for the purpose of the making execution construction completion or extension of any such waterworks or irrigation works which they it or he may already or hereafter be authorized to make carry on execute construct complete or extend it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* and by notice in writing to the lessee his executors administrators or transferees or to the occupier of the said land sent through the post office and addressed to the occupier of the said land to set out the part or parts of the said land which shall be so required for any of the said purposes and so soon as the same shall be so set out all interest at law or in equity of the lessee his executors administrators transferees and assigns in such part or parts shall cease but the lessee his executors administrators transferees and assigns shall be entitled to a reduction *pro rata* of the rent herein reserved in respect of the land so required and set out and also to compensation for the land so required and set out at the rate of Two pounds for every acre of such land but no compensation shall be claimed or paid for any damage by reason of the severing of the lands so required taken set out or appropriated from any other lands but he or they shall be entitled to compensation for any actual improvements by him or them on the said land such compensation to be ascertained by an officer to be appointed by the Governor in Council in that behalf. CONDITIONS OF LICENSE TO SCHEDULES III. AND LXX.

1. The issue of this license shall not prevent the land comprised therein or any part or parts thereof being sold, leased, licensed, alienated, or dealt with under any of the provisions of *The Land Act 1884*, except under the 119th section thereof, under which the license is issued, or being resumed by order of the Governor or Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, for any of the purposes for which land may be reserved under section 10 of *The Land Act 1884*, or for mining purposes.

2. In case the said land or any part thereof should be sold, leased, licensed, alienated, dealt with, or resumed as aforesaid, the licensee shall not be entitled to any compensation other than the return of such portion of the license fee paid by him as the responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being administering Part XI. of *The Land Act 1884* may think fit. This license is also subject to the rights of the holders of miners' rights or of mining leases now issued or hereafter to be issued to enter upon the allotment hereby licensed, and to search for gold and to mine therein, and to erect and occupy mining plant and machinery, without making any compensation for surface or other damage.

2a. WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1884* (48 Vict. No. 812, sec. 136) power is given to the Governor in Council from time to time to make, alter, and rescind rules, regulations, and orders for the various purposes therein specified: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the regulation following, that is to say:—

REGULATION.

1. If, in the opinion of the Board of Land and Works, any lands comprised within the boundaries of any allotment open for selection, or about to be leased, under Section 32 of *The Land Act 1884*, are likely to be required for railway purposes, or for public roads or highways, a form of undertaking, as per Schedule A hereto, shall be executed by the proposed lessee before the issue to him of a lease for the said allotment.

2. The form of lease to be used in cases where railway or road undertaking has been executed shall be as prescribed in Schedule IXA to the Land Regulations of this day's date.

Schedule A.

Form of Railway and Road Undertaking.

I, of hereby undertake and agree to accept a lease under Section 32 of *The Land Act 1884* for allotment parish of containing acres, subject to the express stipulations following, that is to say:—

I undertake and agree that the lease shall contain, in addition to the covenants and conditions provided in *The Land Act 1884*, a covenant on my part, in a form to be prepared by the Governor in Council, that, in the event of the said land, or any part thereof, being at any time required by the Commissioners of Victorian Railways for railway purposes, or by the Governor in Council for public roads or highways, to remove any improvements therefrom, and to relinquish and give up possession of the said land, or any part thereof, that may be required for the purposes aforesaid, and that I will not claim any compensation for or in respect of such removal and resumption and severance, and that I release Her Majesty, her heirs and successors, from all or any compensation whatsoever for such removal, resumption, or severance; and I hereby further undertake and agree, in the event of the said allotment, or any part thereof, being granted to me under Section 42 of *The Land Act 1884* as an agricultural allotment, to accept a license therefor, subject to a similar covenant to the foregoing on my part, to be contained in such license, in addition to the usual conditions of such licenses.

in the said parish and also delineated on the plan drawn in the margin of these presents and therein colored yellow together with the appurtenances excepting and reserving unto Her Majesty her heirs and successors all gold and auriferous earth or stone and all mines containing gold in and under the said demised premises together with liberty for Her Majesty her heirs and successors and her and their agents and servants at any time or times during the said term to enter upon the said land and to search and mine therein for gold or to remove therefrom any gold and any auriferous earth or stone and for the purposes aforesaid to sink shafts and do any other things which may be necessary or usual in mining. And also excepting and reserving to Her Majesty her heirs and successors and each and every other lessee of any grazing area and her his and their agents and servants tenants and workmen liberty and right of ingress egress and regress at all times through over and across the premises hereby demised with or without horses cattle and other animals carts waggons and carriages to or from such grazing area or part thereof from and to any public road or track subject to such regulation to be made by the Governor with the advice of the Executive Council as may for the time being be in force. To have and to hold the premises herebefore expressed to be hereby demised unto the lessee his executors administrators and assigns for the term of _____ years and _____ calendar months less three days from the day of the date hereof Yielding and paying therefor during the said term the yearly rent of _____ by two equal half-yearly payments in advance on the first day of _____ and the first day of _____ in every year clear of all deductions the first of the said half-yearly payments having been made as aforesaid the next of the said half-yearly payments to be made on the first day of _____ next and the last of the said half-yearly payments to be made on the first day of _____ next preceding the expiration of the said term. And the lessee doth hereby for himself his heirs executors administrators and assigns covenant with Her Majesty her heirs and successors that he the lessee his executors administrators and assigns will during the said term pay the said rent hereby reserved in advance at the times and in manner herebefore appointed for payment thereof clear of all deductions for payment thereof all existing and future rates assessments and taxes for the time being payable either by landlord or tenant in respect of the said premises. And also will not assign sublet subdivide or part with the possession of the land hereby demised or any portion thereof without the previous consent of the Board of Land and Works signified in writing. And also will at once after the granting of this lease to the satisfaction of the Board of Land and Works commence and continue to destroy and will within three years after the granting of this lease have destroyed to the satisfaction of the Board of Land and Works the animals and birds by the said Act included in the term "vermin" or which the Governor with the advice of the Executive Council may by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare to be vermin for the purposes of the said Act upon such land and will keep the same free of such animals and birds Bathurst burr wild briar and gorse to the satisfaction of the Board of Land and Works during the currency of this lease. And also that every holder of a miner's right or of a mining lease shall have the right and be allowed by the lessee his executors administrators and assigns to enter upon the area hereby demised and search for gold and to mine thereon and to erect and occupy mining plant and machinery without making any compensation to the lessee his executors administrators or assigns for surface or other damage. Printed forms of tender and conditions of contract may be obtained from the Secretary, Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge at any station, by whom also information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per cental of 100 lbs. (net weight), including delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations, notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

Tenders, which should be upon the printed form, will be received for either oats, bran, hay, or straw (the particular kind of hay or straw offered to be stated); but if all be included in one tender it may be accepted for one article only, if advisable. Telegrams will not be entertained.

Tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for one-third of the estimated amount of the contract within ten days after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts amounting to £150 and upwards, and one surety for contracts under £150.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Forage," and deposited in the Tender-Box, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known by *Gazette* notice, and by letter to accepted tenderers.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed, except when otherwise directed by the police; the straw to be wheaten or oats, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats (Victorian grown) and bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from oats of the best quality; the maize to be of the best quality. The hay tenders must specify whether they are for oats or wheaten hay.

2. The supplies are for police, telegraph, and other horses, and are to be delivered on the order of the officer in charge of the district or station. The quantities stated in the schedule being only approximate, it must be understood that the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned; and should new telegraph stations be formed, or additional horses required to be stationed at any of the stations, the contractor will be required to supply the additional forage. Should the additional number of horses, however, exceed two, the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station under the contract according to the foregoing schedule.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Botanic and Domain Gardens may be called upon to supply any other Government Departments within a radius of six miles from Melbourne, and for which no contracts have been taken, at the same rates.

4. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by the particulars of quantity, showing the net weight, to be endorsed on the back of the order, which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station, for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

5. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and, on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the district, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.

6. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.

8. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 6.

9. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue either to the public service or to the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 6.

10. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or of the delay in delivering or replacing it when required, or refusal to execute orders, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Treasurer of the colony for the time being may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

11. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.

12. It will be competent for the Secretary of the Tender Board, on behalf of the Government, or for the contractor on his own behalf, to terminate the contract, by giving, in writing, a notice of three full calendar months to that effect, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the 1st day of a month, and provided that no such notice can be given before the 30th September 1887, and in the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.

"THE WATERWORKS CONSTRUCTION ENCOURAGEMENT ACT 1886."

TENDERS FOR IRRIGATION SETTLEMENT IN THE MALLEE.

Tenders must be placed in the Water Supply Tender-box not later than Twelve noon on Thursday, 3rd March 1887.

TENDERS will be received by the Minister of Water Supply up to Noon of Thursday, 3rd March 1887, from persons prepared to accept and perform the agreement made between the Honorable Alfred Deakin, Chief Secretary and Commissioner of Water Supply in the Colony of Victoria, for and on behalf of Her Majesty's Government of Victoria of the one part, and George Chaffey and William Benjamin Chaffey, of Toronto, in Canada, of the other part, and which has been laid before both Houses of Parliament, under the provisions of Section 7 of the *Act to encourage private enterprise in the construction of works for the Supply of Water for Irrigation and other purposes*, which states that "any person or persons may within two months from the date of the advertising for tenders tender to accept and perform the said agreement, and shall deposit with their tender such sum of money as they may be willing to pay into the Consolidated Revenue by way of premium under this agreement, and that tender shall be accepted upon which the highest amount of premium shall be tendered and paid, whether such tender be made by the said George and William Benjamin Chaffey or by any other person or persons."

1. The agreement, with plan and description of the land and copy of the Act, may be inspected at the Water Supply Offices, Melbourne and Sandhurst, and at the Land Office, Ballarat.

2. The following additional condition is imposed by the Act:—

"Provided also that of the moneys provided to be expended by clause five of the said agreement Ten thousand pounds at least shall be expended during the first year of the contract in carrying out the works to be executed under such agreement; and in the event of such sum of Ten thousand pounds not being so expended to the satisfaction of the Governor in Council, the said agreement and all rights acquired thereunder shall cease and determine, and the premium and all moneys paid under the said agreement shall be forfeited to Her Majesty; and all works and improvements upon any lands acquired, held, or occupied under the said agreement shall become the absolute property of Her Majesty without any claim to compensation from any person whomsoever."

3. Description of Block.—250,000 acres, more or less, counties of Karkaroc and Millewa: Commencing at a point on the south bank of the Murray River bearing N. 41° E. from the north-east angle of sold allotment A, parish of Carwarp, and bounded thence by a line bearing S. 41° W. fifteen miles fifty chains; thence by a line bearing N. 49° W. nineteen miles fifty-five chains; thence by a line bearing N. 32° E. eighteen miles or thereby to the south bank of said river at a high limestone cliff; thence south-easterly by the margin of the flooded country along the south side of the said river, as approximately shown by red color on plan, to the point of commencement. BOROUGH OF NEWTOWN AND CHILWELL.
BYE-LAW No. 1.

For keeping free from noisome matter yards, stables, and places used for noxious trades, slaughter-yards, &c.; and for regulating management of earth-closets, privies, &c., disinfecting and deodorizing nightsoil and other offensive matter, and for regulating its removal and final deposit.

THE Local Board of Health in and for the Borough of Newtown and Chilwell, in the colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in "The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883," and every other power enabling the said Board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said local board, doth hereby make the following bye-law, being Bye-law No. 1 of the said Local Board of Health, that is to say:—

1. All former bye-laws on the matter and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed, excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this bye-law coming into operation.

2. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This bye-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the said borough.

4. The occupier of every house and premises within the said borough shall cause the yard and ground belonging thereto, or occupied in connection therewith, to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all filth, rubbish, and refuse matter to be from time to time removed from such yard and ground; and if at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such filth, rubbish, or refuse matter so removed as aforesaid, the local board may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier.

5. The occupier of any land in the said borough on which there shall be erected any stable, cowyard, cattle-shed, or pig-stye shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all soil, dung, or other manure produced or accumulated therein to be from time to time removed from such premises; and if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid, the same shall be removed by the local board at the expense of such occupier.

6. The occupier of every house, building, or tenement within the said borough shall cause every cesspool already in existence, and until its abolition, to be emptied and cleansed from time to time as soon as any portion of the contents of such cesspool shall have so accumulated therein as to be within a distance of one foot from the top of the sides, walls, or lining of such cesspool. Provided that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom except between the hours of Eleven p.m. and Five a.m.

7. Every occupier and every person having the management and control of any premises shall once at least in every fortnight empty and cleanse, or cause to be emptied and cleansed, every earth-closet, privy, and place in the nature of an earth-closet for the reception of nightsoil on or belonging to such premises.

8. No person shall empty any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the reception of nightsoil except by means of a cart, carriage, or means of conveyance properly constructed, and furnished with a sufficient covering so as to prevent the escape of the contents or any portion thereof or of effluvia therefrom.

9. Every person placing or depositing, or causing or suffering to be placed or deposited or spread, or assisting in placing or depositing or spreading on any land, whether by way of manure or otherwise, any nightsoil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter removed from any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or other places, shall immediately on the deposit or spreading thereof cover the same, or cause the same to be covered, and shall keep the same covered, with a layer of earth not less than six inches in thickness.

10. The occupier of any premises within the borough used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, process, or manufacture whatever, or used for the purpose of slaughtering, whether it be an abattoir or otherwise, shall cause any rubbish, blood, offal, bones, water, liquid, soil, or other offensive matter produced or accumulated thereon to be removed therefrom once in every twenty-four hours, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, or to exhale any offensive effluvia; and if such occupier shall neglect or fail to have removed therefrom any offensive matter whatever, it may be removed by the said local board at the expense of such occupier.

11. Every closet-pan shall be constructed so as to be thoroughly sound and water-tight, and with handles thereto, and of a capacity not exceeding three cubic feet.

12. No closet-door or trap shall shut or open on a street, lane, or right-of-way exceeding ten feet in width.

13. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds for every such breach, or of Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties—such portion not being less than Five shillings—to be paid. And any such person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty, notwithstanding that the Local Board of Health may be empowered by this bye-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such local board has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

BYE-LAW No. 2, AS TO DAIRIES, DAIRY CATTLE, AND MILK.

THE Local Board of Health in and for the Borough of Newtown and Chilwell, in the colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in "The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883," and every other power enabling the said Local Board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said Local Board, doth hereby make the following bye-law, being Bye-law No. 2 of the said Local Board of Health, that is to say:—

1. All former bye-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed.

2. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This bye-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the said borough.

Registration of Cowkeepers, Dairywomen, and Purveyors of Milk.

4. Every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall, on or before the first day of February in every year, register himself with the Local Board of Health in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the Secretary of the Local Board of Health an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall with every such application pay a fee of Five shillings.

To the Secretary of the Local Board of Health for the Borough of Newtown and Chilwell.

I desire to be registered in accordance with the particulars in the schedule hereunder:—

5. Upon receipt of every such application and fee, the secretary for the Local Board of Health shall endorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received, and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

6. All paddocks, grounds, lands, and enclosures used as grazing ground for dairy cattle shall, whenever necessary, be inspected by any member or officer of the said Local Board or by any person authorized in writing by the chairman or secretary of the said Local Board; and if, on inspection, such paddocks, grounds, or enclosures, or any one of them, are or is likely in the opinion of the officer or person inspecting to be prejudicial to health, by affecting the milk or otherwise, the said Local Board may, by an order in writing signed by the secretary, and served personally or left at the dwelling-house of the registered person, or in the case of an unregistered person served personally or left at his dwelling-place, or posted upon the land, prohibit the use of the same for the purpose of feeding dairy cattle either absolutely or for any time named in such order. All cattle in dairies shall also be similarly inspected by a veterinary surgeon or other competent person, and any cows found to be diseased, or which from poverty or weakness are, in the opinion of the inspector, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, shall be forthwith removed from such dairy if ordered by such inspector or other officer as aforesaid. And any such order as aforesaid the said Local Board may revoke, but upon every fresh inspection a similar order may from time to time be made.

7. All houses, drains, cowsheds, milk stores, milk shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated, and the drainage of all such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way

whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman whether registered or not.

8. All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows shall be regularly swept, and be kept perfectly clean, and shall, within twenty-four hours of any order to such effect from the health officer or inspector of nuisances, be fumigated, disinfected, or lime-washed, as may be in any such order so directed.

9. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily.

10. If any person, or any member of the family of any person, registered as aforesaid, or not so registered, but employed as a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor or member of the family of any visitor to any such person, shall be attacked by typhoid or any dangerous infectious disease, the occupier of the house in which such person shall be, or, if he be the person attacked, his wife or any other person in charge, shall immediately give notice thereof to the Local Board, or officer of health, or to the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the Local Board of Health, and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said Local Board or the officer of health, by order served aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of any such cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, until danger, in the opinion of such Local Board or officer of health, no longer exists. And in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering, or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering, to milk cows or to handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business. Nor, if the person registered or conducting such business be himself the person suffering, shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until, in either case, all danger therefrom of communication of infection to the milk or of its contamination has ceased.

11. If at any time disease exists in the dairy or among the cows or cattle in any cowshed or dairy or in the herds of any cowkeeper, dairyman, vendor or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the Local Board, officer of health, or nearest member of the police force, and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatever.

12. No cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep or permit, or suffer to be kept, any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking yards in which any dairy cow may be kept or sheltered.

13. In the interpretation of this bye-law words imputing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural and the plural the singular, and the word "person" shall include a corporation.

14. Every person found guilty of any breach of this bye-law or of any of its provisions shall be liable, in the discretion of the convicting justices, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings, nor in the like discretion to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.
