OF APRIL NEXT
to be observed as Public and Bank Half-Holidays within the Borough of Hamilton, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon on each day.

WHEREAS by an Act passed by the Parliament of Victoria, in the twenty-fifth year of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "*An Act to consolidate and amend the law relating to the distillation, rectifying, and compounding of spirits, to the granting a duty on spirits distilled in Victoria, and to regulate the brewing of beer and the sale of fermented and spirituous liquors in certain cases*," it was amongst other things enacted that any person, except as thereafter excepted, who should carry on the business of a distiller or rectifier and compounder of spirits, or who should have in his possession or who should make use of any still or other utensil for distilling or rectifying and compounding spirits, excepting in such place as the Governor in Council should by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* direct, should be liable to a penalty of not less than One hundred pounds nor more than Five hundred pounds: Now therefore, I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby proclaim the undermentioned place in the parish of South Melbourne as a place wherein the distillation of spirits may be carried on, that is to say:-

Premises known as "The Federal Distillery," situated on allotment 9 of section 54, in the borough of Port Melbourne, parish of South Melbourne, county of Bourke, Victoria: Commencing at the corner of Pickles street; thence running north-west along Pickles street 485 links; thence north-east along Danks street 424 links; thence south-east along Johnston street 485 links; thence south-west along Rouse street 424 links to the commencing point.

To prepare plans and technical descriptions of municipal boundaries, to examine orders and plans submitted under the Act by local councils, to ascertain by mathematical calculation if the areas and boundaries are correct, to examine the title deeds connected with such orders.

To prepare the Orders in Council to give effect to the Minister's recommendation, to see that they are properly gazetted and the parties interested notified.

To schedule for appointment the Government auditors, to instruct and direct them, to ascertain if their duties have been properly performed, to examine their accounts and the municipal balance sheets, and query items of illegal expenditure and call for and deal with the explanations furnished.

To examine the sub-vouchers submitted by the various councils when claiming special grants, and query items of labor or material not chargeable against the votes; to see that the conditions attached to the votes have been complied with, and that the claims are certified by legally qualified persons before being passed for payment.

To visit various municipalities to enquire into disputes between councils, to advise in accordance with the Statutes, and to settle and adjust accounts.

To note required amendments in Statutes as they appear necessary, the reasons for same, and to draft the clauses for future legislation.

No. 506) it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and such land should thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or hereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the Borough of Northcote has requested that the lands within the said borough hereinafter described be so declared public highways: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this notice declare the lands acquired or used for the streets hereinafter named and described, and situate in the Borough of Northcote, to be public highways within the meaning of the said Act, viz:—

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act Amendment Act 1883*, sec. 32, it was enacted that the Governor in Council, at the request of the council of any municipality, might, by Order to be published in the *Government Gazette*, direct that any portion of a street or road in the municipal district should be a Tree Reserve, so that the portion of such street or road remaining available for traffic upon both sides of such Tree Reserve, including footpaths, should in no place be reduced by any such Tree Reserve to less than forty-six feet, and so that no such Reserve be a greater length than ten chains, and the Governor in Council might revoke any such Order: And whereas on the sixteenth day of February, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, the Council of the Shire of Yea requested that certain portions of High street, in the township of Yea, be declared Tree Reserves: Now therefore the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the said in part recited Act, and in compliance with the request made as aforesaid, doth by this Order declare the portions of the street hereinafter mentioned to be Tree Reserves within the meaning of the 32nd section of the said Act, that is to say:—

And the Honorable John Nimmo, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

MOONEE VALLEY RACES, ON SATURDAY, 2ND APRIL.

In addition to the ordinary trains, special trains will leave Melbourne for Moonee Ponds at 12.40, 1.5, and 1.25 p.m., returning from Moonee Ponds at 3.15 and 3.29 p.m. These specials will start from the main line departure platform at Spencer street. They will not stop at any intermediate station on either journey.

EASTER HOLIDAYS.

Holiday excursion tickets will be issued to and from all stations (suburban lines excepted) from the 4th to the 16th April, both dates inclusive, available for return for one calendar month from date of issue. Example:—An excursion ticket issued on the 6th April will be available till the 6th May. When the last day falls on a Sunday the ticket will be available till next day. The journey must be commenced on the day the ticket is issued, but, after a distance of fifteen miles has been travelled, the journey may be broken at the discretion of the passenger.

Sydney Excursion Tickets.—From the 4th to the 16th April inclusive, return tickets will be issued at Melbourne for Sydney. Fares:—1st class return, £5 6s. 6d.; 2nd class return, £4 1s. These tickets will be available by ordinary trains only for two months. Passengers cannot travel by the express on the New South Wales line. Return tickets will also be issued at Sydney for Melbourne.

Adelaide and South Australian Excursion Tickets.—From the 4th to the 15th April inclusive, the fares by the express train will be reduced. Tickets will be available for two months, and the through journey may be broken at stopping stations. Reduced fare:—Melbourne and Adelaide—1st class return, £1 2s. 6d.; 2nd class return, £2 12s. 6d. Fares to and from other intercolonial stations at similar reductions.

Luggage.—Excursion passengers to and from stations in Victoria will only be allowed to carry such luggage free as can be stowed under the seat without inconvenience to other passengers. Those who have luggage for the van are required to be early at the station, and pay stamped parcels rate for it.

Horses and Vehicles.—From the 6th to the 16th April, the Department cannot engage to forward horses and vehicles by passenger train, unless accommodation can be provided by special arrangement.

Commercial Travellers' Samples.—From the 7th to the 16th April, both dates inclusive, samples will not be taken to or from roadside stations except by mixed or goods trains.

LOWAN SHIRE WATERWORKS TRUST.—REGULATIONS.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations made in pursuance of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1884* (No. 829).

REGULATIONS.

THE Commissioners of the Lowan Shire Waterworks Trust District, portion of which district has been proclaimed an "Urban District," viz., the Town of Nhill, for the purposes of the Victorian Water Conservation Acts of 1883-4, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the Victorian Water Conservation Acts 1881-4, make the Regulations following:—

The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the said urban district, otherwise than by measure, with water for domestic purposes, that is to say, that the following rates and charges which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by this Trust in the said Nhill Urban District, that is to say:—

I.—(1.) For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of Twenty pounds stg. annual value or under, the sum of One pound five shillings per annum.

(2.) For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of more than Twenty pounds annual value, an amount equal to One shilling and threepence stg. in the pound on the amount of the municipal valuation.

(3.) For every water-trough not exceeding 12 feet in length supplied with water by the Trust, the sum of Two pounds ten shillings per annum; and for every additional 5 feet or fractional part thereof in length of such trough, a further sum of Twenty-five shillings per annum.

(4.) Every trough situated in a paddock shall be supplied through a meter affixed by the consumer according to the directions of the Trust, provided nevertheless that the minimum charge for the water supplied to such trough shall not be less than the charge made for troughs supplied under the preceding clause.

(5.) For every steam-boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, One pound per annum on each inch diameter of the cylinder.

II.—(1.) For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, Three shillings per 1,000 gallons (or at such price as may be specially agreed upon); and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of gardens and lawns or other lands where water is supplied by the Trust for the purpose of irrigation or ornamental purposes shall be as follows:—

One-sixteenth of an acre and less, per annum, 8,000 gallons.

Exceeding one-sixteenth of an acre but not exceeding one-eighth of an acre, per annum, 12,000 gallons.

Exceeding one-eighth of an acre but not exceeding one-quarter of an acre, per annum, 16,000 gallons.

Exceeding one-quarter of an acre but not exceeding half an acre, per annum, 28,000 gallons.

Exceeding half an acre but not exceeding one acre, per annum, 40,000 gallons.

And at the rate of 40,000 gallons per acre for every additional acre, and proportionately according to the foregoing scale for every fractional part of an acre.

In livery and carriers' stables supplied by the Trust with water by measurement, the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 2,000 gallons per stall used for stabling horses. In open sheds used for above purposes, each space of 5 feet shall be charged for as a stall.

(2.) That each syphon-pump must have a meter affixed, and that Two shillings and sixpence be charged per thousand gallons for all water registered at such meter.

That the before-mentioned rate is made for one year, commencing on the first day of January 1887, and ending on the thirty-first day of December 1887, and shall be payable half-yearly in advance on the first of January and on the first of July 1887; such persons as the Commissioners of the Lowan Shire Waterworks Trust may from time to time approve of for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rate.

(3.) Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

(4.) Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust who shall take or carry away from any drinking tap, trough, or public or private service-pipe any water shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

(5.) The Trust may cause a meter or meters to be affixed in any case where they may consider it necessary; such meter or meters to be provided and fixed at the expense of the consumer, and the water supplied to be charged for by measurement at the aforesaid rate.

No meter shall be affixed unless the dial on same is capable of registering One million gallons.

(6.) No person shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, nor shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of a duly authorized officer of the Trust appointed for the purpose; and any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach.

(7.) The Trust may contract with any owner or occupier of any lands or tenements, who is entitled to be supplied with water from its works, or who is desirous of being supplied, for the provision and laying of a service-pipe from the pipes of the Trust to the boundary of such land or tenement abutting upon the street or road in which are pipes of the Trust.

(8.) No person supplied with water by the Trust shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, and any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for such breach.

(9.) No person shall connect any service-pipe, or branch service-pipe with any steam-boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without at first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter, under a penalty of Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence, to a penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice from the Trust.

(10.) Overflow-pipes to private baths will not be permitted.

(11.) No person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter, or repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipe of the Trust, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Trust, until he shall have obtained from the Trust a license in that behalf to execute such works. And any unlicensed person affixing, altering, or repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

(12.) Before any license shall be granted by the Trust, the person applying for the same shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent plumber. The Trust shall have the power of cancelling such license at any time.

(13.) Any person, whether licensed or not, who shall offend by opening any ground, so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the Trust, without giving two days' notice to the Trust of his intention so to do, or who shall in any ways tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Trust, without the permission of the Trust in writing being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve-pipe, work or engine, the property of the Trust, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

(14.) If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the Trust that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as the Trust may seem fit, unless the necessary repair shall have been effected. The service-pipes from the main being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupier, if any, and if none, the owner shall in every instance in which damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky, or otherwise out of repair or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

(15.) Before any licensed person shall break up any footpath for the purpose of laying on water from the main to any house or premises, he shall deposit with the Trust the sum of Two pounds, and in case he shall not immediately after laying on the water as aforesaid make good and restore the said footpath to the satisfaction of the Trust, then the said sum of Two pounds shall be absolutely forfeited to the Trust, which shall be at liberty to expend the same in making good and restoring the said footpath or otherwise as the Trust may seem best.

(16.) Any person watering any street or footpath by means of a hose, except under the direction of the officers of the Trust, shall be liable to a penalty of Two pounds for each offence.

(17.) If any person supplied with water by the Trust does, or causes or permits to be done, anything in contravention of these regulations, or fails to pay his rates or any lawful charge imposed by the Trust when due, or fails to do anything which under any of these regulations ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied, or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of complaint remains, or is not remedied.

(18.) The water supplied in the waterworks district of the Trust shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with these regulations, and not otherwise, through pipes and meter, laid, placed, and being in accordance with the said regulations, and not otherwise.

(19.) In the construction of these regulations, the word *person* shall extend to and be deemed to include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole, and the word Trust shall mean The Lowan Shire Waterworks Trust.

- (2.) For every house or tenement above the annual value of Ten pounds and not exceeding the annual value of Eighty pounds, the sum of Ten pounds per centum per annum on the annual value of such property.

- (6.) Such before-mentioned rates shall be based upon the municipal valuation.
- (7.) Such rate is hereby made for the year 1887, commencing on the 1st of January 1887, and terminating on the 31st of December 1887, and shall be payable—the one moiety on the 1st January, and the other moiety on the 1st of July of such year.
- (8.) Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Wimmera United Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and recover such rates.

NO. 8.—URBAN DISTRICT OF WARRACKNABEAL.

The following are the rates and charges which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Wimmera United Waterworks Trust within the Urban District of Warracknabeal—that is to say, in regard to houses or tenements fronting any streets in which pipes for water supply are laid:—

- (1.) For every house or tenement of Ten pounds annual value or under, the sum of One pound per annum.
- (2.) For every house or tenement above the annual value of Ten pounds per annum, the sum of Ten pounds per centum per annum on the annual value of such property.
- (3.) For all tenements in the said Urban District situate otherwise than on streets in which pipes for the supply of water have been laid down and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the before-mentioned rates; and where such tenements are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe and within half a mile thereof, one fourth of the before-mentioned rates.
- (4.) Such before-mentioned rates shall be based upon the municipal valuation.
- (5.) Such rate is hereby made for the year 1887, commencing on the 1st of January 1887, and terminating on the 31st of December 1887, and shall be payable—the one moiety on the 1st January, and the other moiety on the 1st of July of such year.
- (6.) Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Wimmera United Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and recover such rates.

THE RABBIT SUPPRESSION ACTS 1880 AND 1884.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Rabbit Suppression Act 1884* it was amongst other things enacted that it shall be the duty of the council of any municipal district, in addition to the duties imposed upon such council by the Rabbit Suppression Acts 1880 and 1884, to commence, on any day required by the Governor in Council, simultaneously with the council or councils of other municipal districts, to dig out burrows, suppress and destroy rabbits, and perform all acts required of them by the Rabbit Suppression Acts 1880 and 1884, and to continue to do so until the municipal district of such council shall be certified to be practically free of rabbits by any Government inspector: And if any such council neglect or refuse to commence simultaneously with the council or councils of any other municipal districts, the Governor in Council might proclaim such municipal district a rabbit infested district, and might appoint a local committee thereof: And whereas, by an Order in Council dated the 30th day of January 1885, made by the Governor of the Colony of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the same, the Governor in Council did require the Council of the Municipal District of Winchelsea to commence, on the 10th day of February 1885, simultaneously with the municipal districts mentioned in the schedule to such Order in Council, to dig out burrows, suppress and destroy rabbits, and perform all acts required of them by the Rabbit Suppression Acts 1880 and 1884, and to continue to do so until the municipal district of the corporation should be certified to be practically free of rabbits by any Government inspector to be appointed under the 19th section of *The Rabbit Suppression Act 1884*: And whereas on the said 30th day of January 1885 similar Orders in Council were made against the councils mentioned in the said schedule to the said recited Order: And whereas the said recited Order in Council and the Orders last recited were duly served upon the said councils: And whereas the Winchelsea Shire Council has neglected to comply with the said recited Order in Council, dated the thirtieth day of January 1885, directed to it, and has neglected to commence, simultaneously with the councils of the other municipal districts mentioned in the schedule to such recited Order in Council, to dig out burrows, suppress and destroy rabbits, and perform all acts required of it by the Rabbit Suppression Acts 1880 and 1884, and continue to do so until the Municipal District of Winchelsea should be certified to be practically free of rabbits by any Government inspector:

REGULATIONS FOR COMMONS.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations for the undermentioned Commons.

Regulations for Management of the Browns and Scarsdale Borough Common.

IN pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons made by the Governor in Council on the 17th March 1885, the Council of the Borough of Browns and Scarsdale, having drafted the following Regulations for management of the Browns and Scarsdale Borough Common, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approval by the Governor in Council, in lieu of the Regulations heretofore in force in respect of such Common.

Regulations.

1. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licensees, or carriers' licenses, and farmers residing within five (5) miles of the common may respectively depasture thereon four (4) head

of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three (3) head of small cattle.

2. The fees for depasturing stock on the common shall be as follow, and shall be payable quarterly in advance, on the first day of January, the first day of April, the first day of July, and the first day of October in every year:—

For every horse	10s. per annum.
For every head of other large cattle	4s. per annum.
For every sheep or goat	2s. per annum.
Progeny under six months' old of stock legally depasturing on the common	Free.

3. All stock upon which the prescribed fees shall remain unpaid for a period of twenty-one (21) days shall be liable to be impounded.

4. Sheep shall be depastured on such portions only of the common as the managers may set apart for the purpose, and any sheep found depasturing on any other portion of the common shall be liable to be impounded.

5. No bull, entire horse, ram, or he-goat shall be depastured on the common without the permission, in writing, of the managers.

6. The managers of the common shall appoint certain times and places for registering and branding stock, and shall give due notice thereof, and the managers or the herdsman shall attend at such times and places for the purpose aforesaid; and all persons desirous of depasturing stock upon the common shall be in attendance therewith at the times and places appointed, for the purpose of giving a full and correct description of such stock and assisting to brand the same, and shall pay the prescribed fees for such stock before the same are branded with the common brand, or registered.

7. All stock without the common brand found upon the common shall be deemed to be trespassing thereon, and shall be liable to be impounded forthwith by the herdsman.

8. No person shall be allowed to remove any stock from the common without first having given notice to and obtained permission so to do from the managers or herdsman.

9. The managers shall not be responsible for loss of or injury to any stock depasturing on the common, but shall by their herdsman take every possible care of such stock, and in the event of loss thereof or injury thereto shall give to the owners of such stock every information and assistance.

10. The managers shall cause to be removed from the common all diseased stock, or stock which by a competent person shall be deemed to be diseased and dangerous to the health of the other stock on the common, and the owner of such diseased stock shall be required to keep the same off the common; and should the owner refuse or neglect so to do, the managers shall cause such diseased stock to be forthwith destroyed, and the owner thereof shall not be entitled to compensation therefor.

11. Any person travelling with stock shall be at liberty to encamp therewith upon the common for the space of twenty-four hours free of charge, but should such stock remain upon the common after the expiration of the said twenty-four hours they shall be deemed to be trespassing thereon, and shall be liable to be impounded; provided always that the managers may, if they think fit, grant permission for such stock to remain upon the common on payment in advance being made to them, or to the herdsman, of the fees following, that is to say—For every horse, Threepence per day; for every head of horned cattle, One penny and a halfpenny per day.

12. No person shall wilfully injure, or destroy, or unnecessarily disturb or drive away any stock legally depasturing upon the common.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing Regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20) for each offence.

Regulations for Management of the Condah Swamp Common.

In pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons made by the Governor in Council on the 17th March 1885, the Managers of the Condah Swamp Common, having drafted the following Regulations for management thereof, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approval by the Governor in Council.

Regulations.

1. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licenses, or carriers' licenses, and farmers residing within five miles of the common may respectively depasture thereon four head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on the common one additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten acres of such land cultivated by him.

2. No person shall depasture on the common stock of which he is not the *bonâ fide* owner.

3. The fees for depasturing stock on the common shall be as follow, and shall be payable quarterly in advance, on the first

day of January, the first day of April, the first day of July, and the first day of October in every year:—

For every horse	18s. per annum.
For every head of other large cattle	12s. per annum.
For every head of small cattle	4s. per annum.

4. All stock upon which the prescribed fees shall remain unpaid for fourteen days shall be liable to be impounded.

5. Sheep shall be depastured on such portions only of the common as the managers may set apart for the purpose.

6. All persons desirous of depasturing stock on the common shall furnish the managers with a written statement of the number and brands of such stock.

7. No entire horse over the age of ten months, and no bull over the age of six months, shall be allowed to depasture on the common without the consent, in writing, of the managers.

8. All horses and cattle placed on the common shall be branded with the Common brand C.

9. No person shall wilfully disturb or injure stock on the common, nor remove therefrom stock of which he is not a *bonâ fide* owner; and no stock registered in the books of the managers shall be removed from the common by the owner unless notice of his intention so to do be first given to the herdsman, who shall obtain a receipt from the owner for the stock removed.

10. The herdsman shall muster the stock on the expiration of every quarter, if required.

11. The managers shall not be responsible for the loss of or injury to any stock placed on the common.

12. No animal affected with any contagious disease shall be allowed to depasture on the common, and should any of the stock thereon become so affected, and be not removed within twenty-four hours after notice thereof, in writing, has been given to the owner by the managers or the herdsman, the diseased stock shall be liable to be destroyed at the owner's risk and expense.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing Regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £20 (twenty pounds) for each offence.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The Government will not be bound to order from the contractor all the articles enumerated in the schedules, but only those articles, and such quantities of those articles, as it may be found necessary to order. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedules, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. The supplies are to be according to sample and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. In other cases the supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture. A preference will, however, be given to goods of Victorian manufacture, provided the quality is equal to the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule.

3. All orders for supplies will emanate from the departments requiring the goods, and be transmitted through the Stores and Transport Department, except in the case of supplies for the Local Military Department, the Naval Forces, the Harbor Department, and for Works and Buildings. From these departments the order will be sent direct to the contractor. All orders must accompany the goods on delivery, otherwise the goods will not be received. Delivery, as a rule, is to be of the full quantity ordered.

4. Supplies ordered for delivery in Melbourne and Williamstown districts are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and, for the purposes of these contracts, Melbourne district will include a radius of six miles from the General Post Office; and Williamstown district will include the town of Williamstown, Hobson's Bay, and the River Yarra.

5. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the officers ordering the goods.

6. Orders must receive prompt execution; and, in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other

time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officers named in condition 5, or the head of the department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account.

7. The contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form simultaneously with delivery of the full quantities of goods ordered, the account being rendered with the order to which it relates. The prices quoted in the orders cannot be increased.

8. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officers issuing the orders. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof in writing to the officer rejecting the goods.

9. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of. All articles rejected must be immediately replaced by the contractor, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense deducted as in condition 6.

10. The members of boards of survey will be appointed by the Treasurer of the colony for the time being, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the survey fees and extra expense (if any) will be charged as in condition 6.

11. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or of delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the said Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in condition 6, or from the contractor's security. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

12. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited, and in addition the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

THIRD DIVISION.—226 SERVICES.

TENDERS are hereby invited, and will be received until Noon on Tuesday the 19th day of April 1887, for the Conveyance of Post Office Mails, viz., Letters, Packets, Parcels, and Newspapers, as undermentioned, FOR THREE YEARS, from the 1st July 1887 to 30th June 1890.

1. Tenders are required to be written on a form, printed copies of which may be had gratuitously on application at any post office in the colony, and are to be forwarded (if by post, PREPAID AND REGISTERED) for receipt at the General Post Office by the hour and date first above mentioned, addressed to the Honorable the Postmaster-General, with the words "Tender for Mail Service No. " endorsed on the cover, or placed in the tender-box at the General Post Office.

2. Tenderers are requested to describe by their numbers, as below, the mail services for which they tender.

3. The amount of the tender must be stated AT RATE PER ANNUM in words as well as figures.

4. Every tender must bear the *bonâ fide* signature and address of the tenderer, and bear the names of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the fulfilment of the contract in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of the contract.

5. Every tender must be accompanied by cash, marked cheque, bank draft, or a bank deposit-receipt to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General for a sum equal to TEN PER CENT. of the annual amount named in the tender; this deposit

to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government within ten days of being notified that the documents are ready for execution. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient.

6. The money or other security deposited by successful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, on the bond and contract being duly signed.

7. The money or other security deposited by unsuccessful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, and on their signing receipts for the respective amounts.

8. In the event of a new line of railway, or a new railway station on an existing line being opened for traffic, and it being decided that the mails shall be conveyed by rail, the Postmaster-General shall have the power of cancelling the contract for any mail service running in the vicinity of the railway without compensation to the contractor, or shall have power to alter the points of arrival and departure of the mails; and in the event of the travelling distance on any mail line being in such manner increased or diminished, all payments for the service subsequent to the alteration shall be computed on the basis of the average mileage-rate of the contract.

9. In the event of it being found necessary, from any cause, to absolutely cancel a contract, the Postmaster-General shall have full power to do so, provided that, unless the contract be cancelled on account of any fault on the part of the contractor, or on account of the opening of a railway line or a new railway station, payment shall be made to the contractor as compensation of a sum equal to ten per cent. of the moneys which would have become due on the unexpired period of the contract if the latter had been continued for the full term of three years.

10. Tenderers are requested to state the mode by which they propose to convey mails, whether by vehicle, on horseback, or by man on foot. If by vehicle, the description of vehicle and number of horses by which it is to be drawn to be given.

11. Tenderers are informed that from the 1st of July this year the Department will, in addition to the carriage of English and Indian parcels as at present, institute a Victorian parcel post system, and undertake to carry parcels up to 7 lbs. in weight by all services for which tenders may be accepted for conveyance of mails by vehicle.

12. Tenderers for services to and from Post Offices and Railway Stations are required to name a lump sum per annum for the number of trips specified in the call for tenders, and also state a rate per trip as a basis of payment for additional trips, or for reduction in the payment, should the number of trips be increased or lessened during the currency of the contract.

A "trip" to mean a journey from the Post Office to the Railway Station, and from the Railway Station to the Post Office, carrying mails each way.

The carriage of mails one way, viz., either from a Post Office to a Railway Station, or from a Railway Station to a Post Office, shall be regarded as half a trip, and payment made accordingly. Where tenders are invited for a service to and from a Post Office and Railway Station "as often as required," tenderers are required to name a lump sum per annum for the work, and such sum shall not be liable to alteration either through increase or diminution in the number of trips. TENDERS FOR THE ERECTION OF VERMIN PROOF FENCE ON THE SOUTH AUSTRALIAN BORDER.

TENDERS endorsed as above are invited for the erection of one hundred and eleven (111) miles of Vermin Proof Fencing, consisting of wooden strainers and posts, wrought-iron standards, and galvanized wire netting, on the boundary line with South Australia, extending from the north-west angle of mullee block number 40 to the River Murray, as per sample erected at Dimboola.

2. Standards 10 feet apart, with straining posts at every 100 yards. Straining posts to be of pine, box, or gum, 7 feet 9 inches in length, and measuring 8 inches in diameter at the small end, and sunk 3 feet in the ground. Posts, also 100 yards apart, of pine, box, or gum, 6 feet 3 inches in length, measuring 7 inches x 4 inches or 6 inches round, sunk 2 feet in the ground: both strainers and posts to be charred for full depth in the ground. Round side of posts and strainers to be placed against netting. Iron standards to be 1 foot 6 inches in the ground, and one wire and two barbed wires run through standards where bored and notched also through posts. Wire netting to be sunk 6 inches in the ground, leaving 3 feet out of the ground. The line to be cleared (including porcupine) 20 feet on either side of the fence.

The trench in which netting is sunk must be sunk perpendicularly to allow netting to run in a straight line with posts. Trench to be afterwards filled up. Netting and barbed wires to be stapled to posts and strainers in same manner as sample fence at Dimboola. Netting to be attached to a number 10 wire running along the top edge. Netting and barbed wires to be braced twice between each standard with number 14 wire. Netting to be fastened with number 14 wire to iron standards 6 inches from ground.




