PUBLIC AND BANK HOLIDAYS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in the eighty-eighth section of *The Public Service Act 1883*, and the fifth section of *The Bank Holidays Act 1873*, I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation appoint

THURSDAY THE 20TH DAY OF JANUARY INSTANT

to be observed as a Public and Bank Holiday at Avoca;

WEDNESDAY THE 2ND DAY OF FEBRUARY NEXT

a special day to be observed as a Bank Holiday at Rochester;

THURSDAY THE 3RD DAY OF FEBRUARY NEXT

to be observed as a Public and Bank Holiday at Warrnambool.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this eleventh day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, and in the fiftieth year of Her Majesty's reign.
