The births of 1,041 children, viz., 541 boys and 500 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of February. In the month of January 1,209 births were registered, or 168 more than in the month under review. The births were 338 above the average of the month during the previous ten years, but 161 above that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in February numbered 822, viz., 434 of males and 388 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 219, or 27 per cent. The deaths were fewer than those in January by 134, and exceeded the average of February during the previous ten years by 307. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have exceeded that average by 178.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was 2.80, and of deaths registered 2.21.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 99.6° on the 9th, and the lowest was 46.7° on the 20th. The mean temperature of the mouth (67.9°) was nearly 2 degrees above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (38.6°) took place on two occasions, viz., the 7th and 11th; in the first instance from a maximum of 88.2° to a minimum of 49.6°; and in the second instance from a maximum of 98.7° to a minimum of 00.1°. The least range (7°0') was on the 23rd, viz., from a maximum of 68.0° to a minimum of 61°0'. The mean daily range was 19.5°. The highest atmospheric pressure (29.936 inches) was slightly below the average.

Rain fell on 8 days, the amount of rainfall being 2.67 inch. The average rainfall in February for the previous ten years was 1.41 inch, or rather more than 11 inch below that of the month under notice.

Males contributed 53 per cent., and females 47 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 52 per cent. to that mortality, as against 48 per cent. in February 1886, 49 per cent. in February 1885, 40 per cent. in February 1885, 40 per cent. in February 1880, 45 per cent. in February 1881, 42 per cent. in February 1871, 52 per cent. in February 1872, 52 per cent. in February 1873, and 51 per cent. in February 1877.

The deaths of 33 persons who had attained or exceeded the age of 75 years were recorded during the month:—Of these, a shoemaker, aged 75, died of dysentery; a female, aged 75, of hydatids; a carpenter, aged 75, of asthma; a painter (an inmate of the Benevolent Asylum), aged 75, and a Sheemaker, aged 75, of asthma; a painter (an inmate of the Benevolent Asylum), of pneumonia; a laborer, aged 75, and a baker (an inmate of the Benevolent Asylum), of pneumonia; a laborer, aged 75, and a baker (an inmate of the Benevolent Asylum), aged 84, of injuries accidentally received; 2 females, aged 76 and 70 respectively, of apoplexy; 2 females, each aged 77, of heart diseas; a male inmate of the Benevolent Asylum, aged 77, of bronchitis; a female, aged 78, of diarrhea; a bricklayer, aged 78, and a baker (a patient in the Kew Lunatic Asylum), aged 79, of softening of the brain; a male patient in the Kew Lunatic Asylum, aged 82, of brain disease; a female, aged 88, of cholera; and a general dealer and 2 females, each aged 77, a block and mast maker and an engineer, each aged 73, a gentleman, aged 79, a female aged 80, a gentleman and a laborer (an inmate of the Immigrants' Home), each aged 82; a female, aged 83, a gardener (an inmate of the Immigrants' Home), and 2 females, aged 84 and 87 respectively, of old age.

Of the deaths recorded during the month, 38 were ascribed to external causes, of which 32 were set down to accident, 1 to homicide, and 5 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A male child, aged 1 year and 4 months, died of psoas abscess; two laborers, each aged 29, of injury to the spine and fracture of the skull respectively, and a carter, aged 58, of injuries—all resulting from falls. A jockey, aged 14, died of laceration of the brain, caused by falling from a horse; a dairyman, aged 53, of fracture of the spine, and a fencer, aged 59, of gangrene of the arm, occasioned by falling from carts. Two boys, aged 7 and 15 respectively, died from the effects of kicks from horse; a staughterman, aged 17, of an injury to the brain and fracture of the skull, caused by being thrown on his head by a sheep running against him; a scenic artist, aged 26, was killed by a ballast train; a laborer, aged 20, was crushed between two buffers of railway carriages; a cointentmaker, aged 50, was passed over by a railway train, and an engine-driver, aged 50, was crushed between the boom of a ship and a donkey-engine. A carpenter, aged 20, died of fracture of the spine, a laborer, aged 57, of injury to the spine, and a baker (an immate of the Benevolent Asylum), aged 84, of exhaustion consequent on fracture of the left hip-joint—the cause of accident not being stated in each of these cases. A female, aged 18, died of tetanus, caused by thrusting her hand through a glass door; a male child, aged 1 year, of scalds; three females, aged 20, died of plumbism. A boy, aged 12, was poisoned with carbolic acid, and a male, of occupation unknown, aged 26, died of plumbism. A boy, aged 11, was drowned in a quarry-hole, a coach painter, aged 39, in the Maribyrnong River, a male, of occupation unknown, aged 40, and a merchant, aged 64, in the River Yarra; a male, of occupation unknown, aged 26, died of plumbism. A boy, aged 12, was poisoned with carbolic acid, and a male, of occupation unknown, aged 56, poisoned

One hundred and twenty-one deaths, or 15 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—50 in the Melbourne Hospital, 20 in the Alfred Hospital, 5 in the Homecopathic Hospital, 4 in the Children's Hospital, 8 in the Women's Hospital, 8 in the Immigrants' Home, 8 in the Benevolent Asylum, 6 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 6 in the Merbourne Gaol, 1 in the Infant Asylum, and 1 in the Protestant Refuge.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 427, of which 222, or 52 per cent., were of males, and 205, or 48 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 305 were under one year of age, 93 were between one and two, 17 were between two and three, 6 were between three and four, and 6 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 395. Of these, 212, or 54 per cent., were males, and 183, or 46 per cent., were females; 16 were between five and ten, 12 were between ten and fifteen, 21 were between fifteen and twenty, 36 were between therety, 36 were between the thirty-five, 60 were between trenty-five and thirty, 42 were between thirty-five and thirty-five, 24 were between thirty-five and forty, 15 were between forty and forty-five, 22 were between forty-five and fifty-five, 28 were between fifty-five and sixty, 28 were between sixty and sixty-five, 21 were between sixty-five and seventy, 7 were between seventy-five, 22 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 11 were upwards of eighty.

As compared with the experience of the previous month, under the head of specific febrile or zymotic diseases, deaths from measles fell from 3 to nil, and those from diarrheal diseases from 149 to 113. To counterbalance this decrease, the mortality from typhoid fever was the highest ever yet recorded in any one month, the deaths rising from 40 to 70. In 1886, there were 294 such deaths, and in the present year 110 deaths have already taken place. Under the head of constitutional diseases, deaths from cancer fell from 25 to 12, and those from phthisis from 82 to 62. Fourteen deaths occurred among child-bearing women during the month as against 8 in January. If these numbers are compared with the births registered in the same periods, it follows that 1 death of a mother took place to every 74 children born alive, as against 1 to every 151 such children in the previous month.

- xv. Overflow pipes to private baths will not be permitted, the inlet-pipes to which must be visible and accessible, and attached to the bath above the bottom thereof, and the bath provided with a proper well-fitted and watertight ground outlet, plug or cock.
- XVI. All water-troughs must be fitted with approved self-acting taps to prevent overflow.
- xVII. Water closets will not be allowed to be supplied direct from the main, but from a cistern only, so constructed that the water cannot flow continuously, and that not more than two gallons can escape at each flush.
- xvIII. No hose or pipe is to be applied to any pipes or taps for the purpose of watering the ground, or trees, or washing houses and walls, or for any similar purpose, unless the water is charged for by measure.

By His Excellency Sir Henry Brougham Locu, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by The Land Act 1884 it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor might sub-divide any county into parishes and townships, and by proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette might define the boundaries of such parishes or townships, and might distinguish each by a name; after such proclamation the territory comprised within the boundaries of any of the said divisions should thenceforward be recognised as a parish or township by the name so given as aforesaid: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby define the boundaries of the township bereinafter described, and do distinguish the same by the name prefixed thereto, that is to say:—
