RATING REGULATIONS.

I. A water rate for the urban district of Nagambie shall be made by the Trust for each year, and shall be payable half-yearly in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July in each year.

II. The following rates are those which the owners and occupiers of land and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the urban district, that is to say:—

(1.) For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of Twenty pounds annual value or under, the amount which at the rate levied for the year would be payable in respect of a tenement of Twenty pounds annual value.

(2.) For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of more than Twenty pounds annual value, the amount payable in respect of such at the rate levied for the year.

GENERAL REGULATIONS.

III. For water supplied by measure (except in cases of special agreement) from the works of the Trust, Two shillings for every one thousand gallons shall be charged.

III. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case when the water is supplied by measure shall be—

(1.) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge at Two shillings per thousand gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(2.) If for other than domestic purposes only Thirty thousand gallons per half-year, excepting as follows:—

(3.) All charges for water supplied by measure to be paid monthly.

IV. Tenements situated within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe, chargeable with half-rate.

v. Tenements exceeding one quarter, but not exceeding one half a mile distant from a stand-pipe, chargeable with one-fourth rate.

vi. Every person who is supplied by the Trust with water by measure shall, at his or her own expense, provide a meter (which meter shall be submitted to and examined by the proper officer of the Trust, who, if he shall find the same correct and in a proper working order, shall give his certificate to that effect), which when fixed shall be maintained and kept in proper working order by such person. The meter must be so placed as to be open for inspection and so as to be protected from injury, and with means of access thereto; the keys of the meter shall be in possession of the Trust. No meter shall be connected with more than one separate and distinct inlet-pipe, unless otherwise permitted by order of the Trust.

vii. All service-pipes with the necessary stop-cocks shall be supplied and fixed at the cost of the person or persons requiring the same, under the direction and supervision of such officer or servant as the Trust may appoint.

viii. All delivery-cocks to be of high pressure, and of strong hard brass, and in all exposed places to be open and shut by a movable key or handle.

ix. Plumbers or other persons employed to lay on service-pipes and to fix meters, or to refix or relay the same, must satisfy the proper officer of the Trust that they are competent to perform the same in a workmanlike manner.

x. No meter shall be affixed unless the dial of the same is capable of registering one million (1,000,000) gallons.

xi. The Trust may contract with any owner or occupier of premises, or of any lands or tenements who is entitled to be supplied with water from its works, or who is desirous of being so supplied, for the provision and laying on of a service-pipe from the pipes of the Trust to the boundaries of such land, premises, or tenements abutting on the street or road in which are the pipes of the Trust.

xii. If any person shall waste water of the Trust by neglecting to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person after having received notice from any officer of the Trust that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as to the Trust may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected.

xiii. No person supplied with water by the Trust shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, and any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach.

xiv. No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter.

xv. Overflow-pipes to private baths will not be permitted, the inlet-pipes to which must be visible and accessible, and attached to the bath above the bottom thereof, and the bath provided with a proper well-fitted and watertight ground outlet, plug or cock.

xvi. All water-troughs must be fitted with approved self-acting taps to prevent overflow.

xvii. Water closets will not be allowed to be supplied direct from the main, but from a cistern only, so constructed that the water cannot flow continuously, and that not more than two gallons can escape at each flush.

xviii. No hose or pipe is to be applied to any pipes or taps for the purpose of watering the ground, or trees, or washing houses and walls, or for any similar purpose, unless the water is charged for by measure.

xix. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from his or her premises, or shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

xx. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust, who shall take or carry away water from any drinking tap, trough, or private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

xxi. No person shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, without first receiving permission, and giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, nor shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of a duly authorised officer of the Trust appointed for the purpose, and any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each breach.

xxii. The service-pipes for conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of consumers, shall each have a stop-cock at the main, and shall in no case exceed one half-inch diameter for the domestic supply of premises.

xxiii. The water supplied in the urban district of the Trust shall be received and used under and in accordance with these regulations, and the Victorian Water Conservation Acts 1881-1885, and such parts of the Public Works Statute 1865 as are incorporated herewith.

xxiv. If any person whether supplied with water by the Trust or otherwise, shall commit a breach of these regulations, such person shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence, and such person, if supplied with water by the Trust, shall be liable to have the supply of water cut off from his premises, either by cutting the pipes by or through which such water is supplied or otherwise as the Trust may think fit, and such supply shall cease so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.

xxv. In the foregoing regulations, wherever the words "officer" or "servant" appears, the same shall be deemed to be taken and mean an officer or servant of the Trust duly authorised in that behalf.

No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management; provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
8. No person, except laborers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 133 of *The Land Act 1834*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE BENALLA RECREATION RESERVES.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserves, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserves, nor remove any soil or sand therefrom.
5. No person shall put or bring into the reserves any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals, or poultry, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management; provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserves, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
6. No person shall bring into the reserves any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the committee of management.
7. No person shall camp in the reserves or erect thereon any dwelling or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
8. No person, except laborers and workmen employed in the reserves, shall enter any plots therein which may be set apart for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
9. No person shall enter the reserves on any day set apart for sports or fêtes, nor bring therein any horse, carriage, or other vehicle, except on production of a ticket issued by the Committee of Management, duly authorizing the admission of such person, horse, carriage, or other vehicle; but no such ticket of admission shall be of any avail except on the date printed thereon, nor shall it authorize the holder thereof to enter any building, erection, enclosure, or cultivated spot within the reserves; and every such ticket shall be surrendered on demand to the gatekeepers or other persons authorized by the Committee of Management to collect the same.
10. Any person being drunk or disorderly, or assaulting any other person, shall be liable to removal from the reserves, notwithstanding such person may have purchased a ticket of admission.
11. All net proceeds of sports or fêtes, other than those given for the benefit of public charitable institutions, shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserves.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 133 of *The Land Act 1834*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

Schedules as above, giving an estimate of the articles required, and printed forms of tender may be obtained from the Secretary to the Tender Board, by whom also the samples will be shown and any information or explanation afforded to persons tendering.

Separate tenders will be received for each schedule, but they must include the whole of the articles therein mentioned, and a separate price must be stated for each article. The value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c. The net weight or quantity only will be paid for.

Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labor may be required in the packing of stores.

The prices must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and total amount of tender stated.

Tenders having alterations or erasures therein will not be entertained.

Tenders must be accompanied by the preliminary deposit as shown above in bank notes, or a bank draft in favor of the Secretary of the Tender Board (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers. Such deposit to be forfeited in the event of the successful tenderer failing to complete the security within the prescribed period.

Security will be required either in Government debentures, bank deposit-receipt in favor of the Secretary of the Tender Board, or cash deposit, as the tenderer may elect.

The security is calculated at Ten per cent. upon contracts not exceeding £1,000, and at Five per cent. over that sum; but no deviation will be allowed from the amounts above stated.

The security must be completed and contract signed within ten days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised, or another tender accepted.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

Persons failing to take up their contracts will be disqualified from tendering for Government supplies for a period of twelve months.

Tenders, enclosed in a separate envelope, and having the words "Tender for —" (as the case may be) written thereon, must be deposited in the Tender-box at the Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The Government will not be bound to order from the contractor all the articles enumerated in the schedules, but only those articles, and such quantities of those articles, as it may be found necessary to order. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedules, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. The supplies are to be according to sample and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. In other cases the supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture. A preference will, however, be given to goods of Victorian manufacture, provided the quality is equal to the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule.

3. All orders for supplies will emanate from the departments requiring the goods, and be transmitted through the Stores and Transport Department, except in the case of supplies for the Local Military Department, the Naval Forces, the Harbor Department, and for Works and Buildings. From these departments the order will be sent direct to the contractor. All orders must accompany the goods on delivery, otherwise the goods will not be received. Delivery, as a rule, is to be of the full quantity ordered.

4. Supplies ordered for delivery in Melbourne and Williamstown districts are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and, for the purposes of these contracts, Melbourne district will include a radius of six miles from the General Post Office; and Williamstown district will include the town of Williamstown, Hobson's Bay, and the River Yarra.

5. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the officers ordering the goods.

6. Orders must receive prompt execution; and, in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officers named in condition 5, or the head of the department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account.

7. The contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form simultaneously with delivery of the full quantities of goods ordered, the account being rendered with the order to which it relates. The prices quoted in the orders cannot be increased.

8. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officers issuing the orders. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof in writing to the officer rejecting the goods.

9. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of. All articles rejected must be immediately replaced by the contractor, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense deducted as in condition 6.

10. The members of boards of survey will be appointed by the Treasurer of the colony for the time being, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the survey fees and extra expense (if any) will be charged as in condition 6.

11. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or of delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the said Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in condition 6, or from the contractor's security. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

12. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited, and in addition the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

13. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

14. It will be competent either for the contractor on his own behalf, or for the Secretary of the Tender Board on behalf of the Government, to terminate the contract, by giving notice, in writing, of three full calendar months to the opposite party, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the first day of the month, and within the period for which the contract is made, and under no other circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract.

15. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being broken, infringed, or violated by the importation of stores for the Government service, or by any contracts or purchases made by the Imperial Commissariat or the Agent-General for Victoria, or by any contracts or agreements made for any works or supplies by the Departments of Public Works and Defence, or on account of other Governments, or for the Telegraph or Railway Departments, or for Rabbit Extirpation, or for supplies to the Aborigines; or by any article being made at and supplied for the use of any Government establishment; or by the consumption of the surplus stock of any Government establishment.

1. Tenders are required to be written on a form, printed copies of which may be had gratuitously on application at any post office in the colony, and are to be forwarded (if by post, PREPAID AND REGISTERED) for receipt at the General Post Office by the hour and date first above mentioned, addressed to the Honorable the Postmaster-General, with the words "Tender for Mail Service No. " endorsed on the cover, or placed in the tender-box at the General Post Office.

2. Tenderers are requested to describe by their numbers, as below, the mail services for which they tender.

3. The amount of the tender must be stated AT RATE PER ANNUM in words as well as figures.

4. Every tender must bear the *bona fide* signature and address of the tenderer, and bear the names of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the fulfilment of the contract in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of the contract.

5. Every tender must be accompanied by cash, marked cheque, bank draft, or a bank deposit-receipt to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General for a sum equal to TEN PER CENT. of the annual amount named in the tender; this deposit to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government within ten days of being notified that the documents are ready for execution. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient.

6. The money or other security deposited by successful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, on the bond and contract being duly signed.

7. The money or other security deposited by unsuccessful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, and on their signing receipts for the respective amounts.

8. In the event of a new line of railway, or a new railway station on an existing line being opened for traffic, and it being decided that the mails shall be conveyed by rail, the Postmaster-General shall have the power of cancelling the contract for any mail service running in the vicinity of the railway without compensation to the contractor, or shall have power to alter the points of arrival and departure of the mails; and in the event of the travelling distance on any mail line being in such manner increased or diminished, all payments for the service subsequent to the alteration shall be computed on the basis of the average mileage-rate of the contract.

9. In the event of it being found necessary, from any cause, to absolutely cancel a contract, the Postmaster-General shall have full power to do so, provided that, unless the contract be cancelled on account of any fault on the part of the contractor, or on account of the opening of a railway line or a new railway station, payment shall be made to the contractor as compensation of a sum equal to ten per cent. of the moneys which would have become due on the unexpired period of the contract if the latter had been continued for the full term of three years.

11. BYE-LAW No. 1.—A BYE-LAW FOR THE REGISTRATION OF COWKEEPERS, DAIRYMEN, AND PURVEYORS OF MILK.

THE Local Board of Health in and for the Shire of Barrabool, in the colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in "The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883," and every other power enabling the said local board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said local board, doth hereby make the bye-law following, being Bye-law No. 1, of the said Local Board of Health, that is to say:—

1. All former bye-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed.

2. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*, and shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the said Shire of Barrabool.

3. Every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall, on or before the first day of May in every year, register himself with the Local Board of Health in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the secretary of the Local Board of Health an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall with every such application pay a fee of Two shillings and sixpence.

4. Upon receipt of every such application and fee the secretary of the Local Board of Health shall endorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received, and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

5. All houses, dairies, cowsheds, milk stores, milk shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated; and the drainage of all

such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not.

6. All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows shall be regularly swept, and be kept perfectly clean, and shall, within twenty-four hours of any order to such effect from the health officer or inspector of nuisances, be fumigated, disinfected, or lime-washed, as may be in any such order so directed.

7. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily.

8. If any person, or any member of the family of any person registered as aforesaid, or not so registered, but employed as a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor or member of the family of any visitor to any such person, shall be attacked by typhoid fever or other dangerous infectious disease, the occupier of any house in which such person shall be, or (if he be the person attacked) his wife or other person in charge, shall immediately give notice thereof to the local board or officer of health, or to the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the Local Board of Health, and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said local board or the officer of health, by order as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of any such cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, until danger, in the opinion of such local board or officer of health, no longer exists. And in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering, or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering, to milk cows or to handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business. Nor, if the person registered or conducting such business be himself the person suffering, shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until, in either case, all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk or of its contamination has ceased.

9. If at any time disease exists in the dairy or among the cows or cattle in any cowshed or dairy, or in the herds of any cowkeeper, dairyman, vendor or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the local board, officer of health, or nearest member of the police force; and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.

10. No cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep, or permit or suffer to be kept, any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking-yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.

11. In the interpretation of this bye-law words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural, and the plural the singular, and the word "person" shall include a corporation.

12. Every person guilty of any breach of this bye-law, or of any of its provisions, shall be liable, in the discretion of the convicting justices, to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds nor less than five shillings, or in the like discretion to a penalty not exceeding five pounds nor less than five shillings, for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

The foregoing bye-law was duly made, ordered, and passed by the Local Board of Health (being the Municipal Council) in and for the Shire of Barrabool this thirty-first day of December, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-six.

BYE-LAW No. 2.

For keeping free from noisome matter yards, stables, and places used for noxious trades, slaughter-yards, &c.; and for regulating management of earth-closets, privies, &c., disinfecting and deodorizing nightsoil and other offensive matter, and for regulating its removal and final deposit.

THE Local Board of Health in and for the Shire of Barrabool, in the colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in "The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883," and every other power enabling the said local board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said local board, doth hereby make the following bye-law, being Bye-law No. 2 of the said Local Board of Health, that is to say:—

1. All former bye-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed, excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this bye-law coming into operation.
2. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.
3. This bye-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the said shire of Barrabool.

4. The occupier of every house and premises within the said shire shall cause the yard and ground belonging thereto, or occupied in connection therewith, to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all filth, rubbish, and refuse matter to be from time to time removed from such yard and ground; and if at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such filth, rubbish, or refuse matter so removed as aforesaid, the local board may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier.

5. The occupier of any land in the said shire on which there shall be erected any stable, cow-yard, cattle-shed, or pig-sty shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all soil, dung, or other manure produced or accumulated therein to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of the same so produced or accumulated shall amount to one cubic yard; and if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect or fail to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid, the same shall be removed by the said local board at the expense of such occupier.

6. The occupier of every house, building, or tenement within the said shire shall cause every cesspool already in existence, and until its abolition, to be emptied and cleansed from time to time as soon as any portion of the contents of such cesspool shall have so accumulated therein as to be within a distance of one foot from the top of the sides, walls, or lining of such cesspool. Provided that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom except between the hours of Eleven p.m. and Five a.m. And provided also that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom until such contents shall have had mixed therewith carbolic acid, or some other efficient deodorizer, sufficient in quality and quantity to effectually deodorize and disinfect the same.

7. Every occupier and every person having the management and control of any premises shall, once at least in every week, empty and cleanse, or cause to be emptied and cleansed, every earth-closet, privy, and place in the nature of an earth-closet for the reception of nightsoil on or belonging to such premises.

8. No person shall empty any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the reception of nightsoil except by means of a cart, carriage, or means of conveyance properly constructed and furnished with a sufficient covering so as to prevent the escape of the contents or any portion thereof or of effluvia therefrom.

9. All nightsoil, blood, offal, or other offensive matter or thing shall be removed to and deposited in such place or places only as may be appointed by the local board from time to time for the final reception of the same.

10. Every person placing or depositing, or causing or suffering to be placed or deposited or spread, or assisting in placing or depositing or spreading on any land, whether by way of manure or otherwise, any nightsoil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter removed from any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or other place, shall immediately on the deposit or spreading thereof, cover the same, or cause the same to be covered, and shall keep the same covered, with a layer of earth not less than six inches in thickness.

11. The occupier of any premises within the said shire used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, process, or manufacture whatever, or used for the purpose of slaughtering, whether it be an abattoir or otherwise, shall cause any rubbish, blood, offal, bones, water, liquid, soil, or other offensive matter produced or accumulated thereon to be removed therefrom once in every twenty-four hours, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, or to exhale any offensive effluvia; and if such occupier shall neglect or fail to have removed therefrom any offensive matter whatever, it may be removed by the said local board at the expense of such occupier.

12. Every closet-pan shall be constructed of galvanized iron, properly riveted and soldered, so as to be water-tight, and with handles thereto, and of a capacity not exceeding three cubic feet.

13. No closet-door or trap shall abut or open upon a street, lane, or right-of-way exceeding ten feet in width.

14. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds for every such breach, or of Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties—such portion not being less than Five shillings—to be paid. And any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty, notwithstanding that the Local Board of Health may be empowered by this bye-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such Local Board has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

A Bye-Law of the Shire of Moorabbin, made under Section 481 of "The Local Government Act 1874," and numbered 8, for the Management of the Corporation Baths.

IN pursuance of the provisions of the "Local Government Act 1874," the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Moorabbin, order as follows:—

1. The baths situate on the Port Phillip Bay, at Mentone and Mordialloc, in the said shire, shall be known as the Mentone Baths, and the Mordialloc Baths.
2. The baths shall be open for the use of the public daily, from daylight until dark (or at such other times as the council shall appoint), subject to the payment of the charges set forth in the Schedule hereto appended, or of such other charges as the council from time to time may direct.
3. The hours of bathing, ladies (denoted by white flag) from 8.30 a.m. to 1 p.m., and from 3 p.m. to 5 p.m.; gentlemen (denoted by red flag) from daylight to 8.30 a.m., and from 1 p.m. to 3 p.m., and from 5 p.m. until dark.
4. The time for bathing for each person shall not exceed 40 minutes.
5. No person shall use obscene language, or deface the walls or doors of the said baths by writing or drawing thereon, or commit any nuisance in the baths.
6. No person shall smoke in the baths except in the apartment set apart for that purpose.
7. No person shall be admitted to the baths who shall be under the influence of liquor, or who shall have been guilty of disorderly conduct in the said baths.
8. No dogs shall be allowed within the precincts of the baths. Any person offending against this bye-law will be liable, under section 514 of the Act No. 506, to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.
