  - (1.) For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of Twenty pounds annual value or under, the amount which at the rate levied for the year would be payable in respect of a tenement of Twenty pounds annual value.
  - (2.) For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of more than Twenty pounds annual value, the amount payable in respect of such at the rate levied for the year.

VI. Every person who is supplied by the Trust with water by measure shall, at his or her own expense, provide a meter (which meter shall be submitted to and examined by the proper officer of the Trust, who, if he shall find the same correct and in a proper working order, shall give his certificate to that effect), which when fixed shall be maintained and kept in proper working order by such person. The meter must be so placed as to be open for inspection and so as to be protected from injury, and with means of access thereto; the keys of the meter shall be in possession of the Trust. No meter shall be connected with more than one separate and distinct inlet-pipe, unless otherwise permitted by order of the Trust.

VII. All service-pipes with the necessary stop-cocks shall be supplied and fixed at the cost of the person or persons requiring the same, under the direction and supervision of such officer or servant as the Trust may appoint.

viii. All delivery-cocks to be of high pressure, and of strong hard brass, and in all exposed places to be open and shut by a movable key or handle.

IX. Plumbers or other persons employed to lay on service-pipes and to fix meters, or to refix or relay the same, must satisfy the proper officer of the Trust that they are competent to perform the same in a workmanlike manner.

x. No meter shall be affixed unless the dial of the same is capable of registering one million (1,000,000) gallons.

xi. The Trust may contract with any owner or occupier of premises, or of any lands or tenements who is entitled to be supplied with water from its works, or who is desirous of being so supplied, for the provision and laying on of a service-pipe from the pipes of the Trust to the boundaries of such land, premises, or tenements abutting on the street or road in which are the pipes of the Trust.

XII. If any person shall waste water of the Trust by neglecting to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person after having received notice from any officer of the Trust that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as to the Trust may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected. shall have been effected.

XIII. No person supplied with water by the Trust shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, and any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach.

XIV. No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter.

Xv. Overflow-pipes to private baths will not be permitted, the inlet-pipes to which must be visible and accessible, and attached to the bath above the bottom thereof, and the bath provided with a proper well-fitted and watertight ground outlet, plug or cock.

xvi. All water-troughs must be fitted with approved self-acting taps to prevent overflow.

IVII. Water closets will not be allowed to be supplied direct from the main, but from a cistern only, so constructed that the water cannot flow continuously, and that not more than two gallons can escape at each flush.

XVIII. No hose or pipe is to be applied to any pipes or taps for the purpose of watering the ground, or trees, or washing houses and walls, or for any similar purpose, unless the water is charged for by measure.

IIX. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from his or her premises, or shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

XX. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust, who shall take or carry away water from any drinking tap, trough, or private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

xXI. No person shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, without first receiving permission, and giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, nor shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of a duly authorised officer of the Trust appointed for the purpose, and any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each breach.

XXII. The service-pipes for conveying water from the pipes of

- 5. No person shall put or bring into the reserves any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals, or poultry, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management; provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserves, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
- 6. No person shall bring into the reserves any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the committee of management.
- 7. No person shall camp in the reserves or erect thereon any dwelling or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- No person, except laborers and workmen employed in the reserves, shall enter any plots therein which may be set apart for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
- 9. No person shall enter the reserves on any day set apart for sports or fêtes, nor bring therein any horse, carriage, or other vehicle, except on production of a ticket issued by the Committee of Management, duly authorizing the admission of such person, horse, carriage, or other vehicle; but no such ticket of admission shall be of any avail except on the date printed thereon, nor shall it authorize the holder thereof to enter any building, erection, enclosure, or cultivated spot within the reserves; and every such ticket shall be surrendered on demand to the gatekeepers or other persons authorized by the Committee of Management to collect the same.
- 10. Any person being drunk or disorderly, or assaulting any other person, shall be liable to removal from the reserves, notwith-standing such person may have purchased a ticket of admission.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 183 of *The Land Act 1854*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman, whether regis-

following the trace of a cowkeeper or unityman, whether registered or not.

6. All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows shall be regularly swept, and be kept perfectly clean, and shall, within twenty-four hours of any order to such effect from the health officer or inspector of nuisances, be funigated, disinfected, or lime-washed, as may be in any such order as discated.

7. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily.

7. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily.

8. If any person, or any member of the family of any person registered as aforesaid, or not so registered, but employed as a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor or member of the family of any visitor to any such person, shall be attacked by typhoid fever or other dangerous infections disease, the occupier of any house in which such person shall be, or (if he be the person attacked) his wife or other person in charge, shall immediately give notice thereof to the local board or officer of health, or to the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the Local Board of Health, and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said local board or the officer of health, by order as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of any such cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, until danger, in the opinion of such local board or officer of health, no longer exists. And in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering, or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering, or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business be himself the person registered or conducting such business be himself the person suffering, shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until, in either case, all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk or of its contamination has ceased.

For keeping free from noisome matter yards, stables, and places used for noxious trades, slaughter-yards, dc.; and for regulating management of earth-closets, privies, dc., disinfecting and deodorizing nightsoil and other offensive matter, and for regulating its removal and final deposit.

THE Local Board of Health in and for the Shire of Barrabool, in the colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in "The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883," and every other power enabling the said local board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said local board, doth hereby make the following bye-law, being Bye-law No. 2 of the said Local Board of Health, that is

being Bye-law No. 2 of the said Local Board of Health, that is to say:—

1. All former bye-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed, excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this bye-law soming into operation.

2. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the Government Gazette.

3. This bye-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the said shire of Barrabool.

4. The occupier of every house and premises within the said 4. The occupier of every house and premises within the said shire shall cause the yard and ground belonging thereto, or occupied in connection therewith, to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all filth, rubbish, and refuse matter to be from time to time removed from such yard and ground; and if at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such filth, rubbish, or refuse matter so removed as aforesaid, the local board may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier.

same to be removed at the expense of such occupier.

5. The occupier of any land in the said shire on which there shall be erected any stable, cow-yard, cattle-shed, or pig-sty shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all soil, dung, or other manure produced or accumulated therein to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of the same so produced or accumulated shall amount to one cubic yard; and if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect or fail to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid, the same shall be removed by the said local board at the expense of such occupier.

such occupier.

6. The occupier of every house, building, or tenement within the said shire shall cause every cesspool already in existence, and until its abolition, to be emptied and cleansed from time to time as soon as any portion of the contents of such cesspool shall have so accumulated therein as to be within a distance of one foot from the top of the sides, walls, or lining of such cesspool. Provided that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom except between the hours of Eleven p.m. and Five a.m. And provided also that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom until such contents shall have had mixed therewith carbolic acid, or some other efficient deodorizer, sufficient in quality and quantity to effectually deodorize and disinfect the same.

7. Every occupier and every person having the management

7. Every occupier and every person having the management and control of any premises shall, once at least in every week, empty and cleanse, or cause to be emptied and cleansed, every earth-closet, privy, and place in the nature of an earth-closet for the reception of nightsoil on or belonging to such premises.

8. No person shall empty any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the reception of nightsoil except by means of a cart, carriage, or means of conveyance properly constructed and furnished with a sufficient covering so as to prevent the escape of the contents or any portion thereof or of effluvia therefrom.

9. All nightsoil, blood, offal, or other offensive matter or thing shall be removed to and deposited in such place or places only as may be appointed by the local board from time to time for the final reception of the same.

final reception of the same.

10. Every person placing or depositing, or causing or suffering to be placed or deposited or spread, or assisting in placing or depositing or spreading on any land, whether by way of manure or otherwise, any nightsoil, offal, blood, or other retuse matter removed from any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or other place, shall immediately on the deposit or spreading thereof, over the same, or cause the same to be covered, and shall keep the same covered, with a layer of earth not less than six inches in thickness.

ness.

11. The occupier of any premises within the said shire used for

11. The occupier of any premises within the said shire used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, process, or manufacture whatever, or used for the purpose of slaughtering, whether it be an abattoir or otherwise, shall cause any rubbish, blood, offal, bones, water, liquid, soil, or other offensive matter produced or accumulated thereon to be removed therefrom once in every twenty-four hours, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, or to exhale any offensive effluvia; and if such occupier shall neglect or fail to have removed therefrom any offensive matter whatever, it may be removed by the said local board at the expense of such occupier. 12. Every closet-pan shall be constructed of galvanized iron, properly riveted and soldered, so as to be water-tight, and with handles thereto, and of a capacity not exceeding three cubic feat. 13. No closet-door or trap shall abut or open upon a street, lane, or right-of-way exceeding ten feet in width.

14. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds for every such breach, or of Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties—such portion not being less than Five shillings—to be paid. And any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty, notwithstanding that the Local Board of Health may be empowered by this bye-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such Local Board has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

6. No person shall smoke in the baths except in the apartment set apart for that purpose.

7. No person shall be admitted to the baths who shall be under the influence of liquor, or who shall have been guilty of disorderly conduct in the said baths.

8. No dogs shall be allowed within the precincts of the baths. Any person offending against this bye-law will be liable, under section 514 of the Act No. 506, to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.
