They will be visible in clear weather about six miles. The lights will be shifted seawards as the work advances, and will be seen from seaward where not interrupted by Taiaroa Head to the eastward and Hayward Point to the westward. The present position of the lights is—from Hayward Point, E. by S.  $\frac{3}{4}$  S., and from extreme of Taiaroa Head, W.  $\frac{1}{4}$  N. (magnetic).

### NAGAMBIE WATERWORKS TRUST.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has approved of the subjoined Regulations made by the Nagambie Waterworks Trust, under the provisions of The Victorian Water Conservation Acts.

### RATING REGULATIONS.

- I. A water rate for the urban district of Nagambie shall be made by the Trust for each year, and shall be payable half-yearly in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July in each year.
- II. The following rates are those which the owners and occupiers of land and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the urban district, that is to say:—
  - (1.) For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of Twenty pounds annual value or under, the amount which at the rate levied for the year would be payable in respect of a tenement of Twenty pounds annual value.
  - (2.) For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of more than Twenty pounds annual value, the amount payable in respect of such at the rate levied for the year.

### GENERAL REGULATIONS.

IIB. For water supplied by measure (except in cases of special agreement) from the works of the Trust, Two shillings for every one thousand gallons shall be charged.

III. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case when the water is supplied by measure shall be—

- (1.) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge at Two shillings per thousand gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(2.) If for other than domestic purposes only. Thirty thound gallons per half-year, excepting as follows:—

rate.

VI. Every person who is supplied by the Trust with water by measure shall, at his or her own expense, provide a meter (which meter shall be submitted to and examined by the proper officer of the Trust, who, if he shall find the same correct and in a proper working order, shall give his certificate to that effect), which when fixed shall be maintained and kept in proper working order by such person. The meter must be so placed as to be open for inspection and so as to be protected from injury, and with means of access thereto; the keys of the meter shall be in possession of the Trust. No meter shall be connected with more than one separate and distinct inlet-pipe, unless otherwise permitted by order of the Trust.

VII. All service-pipes with the necessary stop-cocks shall be supplied and fixed at the cost of the porson or persons requiring the same, under the direction and supervision of such officer or servant as the Trust may appoint.

VIII. All delivery-cocks to be of high pressure, and of strong hard brass, and in all exposed places to be open and shut by a movable key or handle.

- IX. Plumbers or other persons employed to lay on service-pipes and to fix meters, or to refix or relay the same, must satisfy the proper officer of the Trust that they are competent to perform the same in a workmanlike manner.
- x. No meter shall be affixed unless the dial of the same is capable of registering one million (1,000,000) gallons.
  xi. The Trust may contract with any owner or occupier of premises, or of any lands or tenements who is entitled to be supplied with water from its works, or who is desirous of being so supplied, for the provision and laying on of a service-pipe from the pipes of the Trust to the boundaries of such land, premises, or tenements abutting on the street or road in which are the pipes of the Trust.

- XII. If any person shall waste water of the Trust by neglecting to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person after having received notice from any officer of the Trust that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as to the Trust may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected.
- XIII. No person supplied with water by the Trust shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, and any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach.
- xiv. No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter.
- xv. Overflow-pipes to private baths will not be permitted, the inlet-pipes to which must be visible and accessible, and attached to the bath above the bottom thereof, and the bath provided with a proper well-fitted and watertight ground outlet, plug or cock.

  XVI. All water-troughs must be fitted with approved self-acting
  taps to prevent overflow.

  XVII. Water closets will not be allowed to be supplied direct
  from the main, but from a cistern only, so constructed that the
  water cannot flow continuously, and that not more than two
  gallons can escape at each flush.
- XVIII. No hose or pipe is to be applied to any pipes or taps for the purpose of watering the ground, or trees, or washing houses and walls, or for any similar purpose, unless the water is charged for by measure.
- XIX. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from his or her premises, or shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
- XX. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust, who shall take or carry away water from any drinking tap, trough, or private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

No person shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, without first receiving permission, and giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, nor shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of a duly authorised officer of the Trust appointed for the purpose, and any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each breach.

  or is not remedied.
- xxv. In the foregoing regulations, wherever the words "officer" or "servant" appears, the same shall be deemed to be taken and mean an officer or servant of the Trust duly authorised in that behalf.

A Regulation of the Upper Macedon Water Works Trust made under the 44th section of "The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1881" for the imposing, levying, and receiving of rates.

IN pursuance of the powers granted or conferred by section 44 of "The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1881," the Commissioners of the Upper Macedon Water Works Trust make the following Regulation:—

1. A rate of One shilling in the pound sterling shall be imposed and levied on all the rateable property in the Water Works District of the Upper Macedon Water Works Trust according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for

the Municipal Rate of the Municipal District in which such lands and tenements are situate.

2. All water supplied by the said Trust by measurement shall be charged for at the rate of Two shillings for one thousand gallons, or at such price as shall be specially agreed upon.

3. The above-mentioned rate is for one year, commencing on the 1st January 1887 and ending on 31st December 1887, and shall be payable by two equal instalments on the 1st of April and the 1st of October.

Such person as the Commissioners of the Upper Macedon Water Works Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive, collect and recover the said rates.

"The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883." UNITED SHIRE OF NEWHAM.—LOCAL BOARD OF HEALTH.

BYE-LAW No. 1.

For keeping free from noisome matter yards, stables, and places used for nozious trades, slaughter-yards, &c.; and for regulating management of earth-closets, privies, &c., disinfecting and deodorizing night-soil and other offensive matter, and for regulating its removal and final deposit.

THE Local Board of Health in and for the United Shire of Newham, in the Colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in "The Public Health Act 1883," and everyother power enabling the said Local Board in their behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said local board, doth hereby make the following bye-law, being Bye-law No. 1 of the said Local Board of Health, that is to say:—

1. All former bye-laws on the matter and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed, excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this bye-law coming into operation.

2. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and innucliately after its publication in the Government Gazette.

3. This bye-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the township of Woodend within the United Shire of Newham.

Newham.

4. The occupier of every house and premises within the said township shall cause the yard and ground belonging thereto, or occupied in connection therewith, to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all filth and refuse matter to be from time to time removed from such yard and ground. And if at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such filth, rubbish, or refuse matter so removed as aforesaid, the local board may cause the same to be removed at the expense of the occupier.

5. The occupier of any land in the said township on which there shall be erected any stable, cow yard, cattle shed, or pigsty, shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state, in respect to cleanliness, as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all soil, dung, or other manure produced or accumulated therein to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of the same shall amount to three cubic yards. And if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect or fail to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid, the same shall be removed by the said local board at the expense of the occupier.

6. The occupier of every house, building, or tenement within the said township shall cause every cesspool already in existence, and until its abolition, to be emptied and cleansed from time to time as soon as any portion of the contents of such cesspool shall have so accumulated therein as to be within a distance of one foot from the top of the sides, walls, or liming of such cesspool. Provided that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom except between the hours of Eleven p.m. and Five a.m. And provided also that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom except between the hours of Eleven p.m. and Five a.m. And provided also that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom until such contents shall have had mixed therewith carbolic acid or such other efficient deodorizer sufficient in quality and quantity to effectually deodorize and disinfect the same.

7. Every occupier and every person having the management and control of any premises shall, once at least in every week, empty and cleanse, or cause to be emptied and cleansed, every earth-closet, privy, and place in the nature of an earth-closet for the reception of night-soil on or belonging to such premises.

8. No person shall empty any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the recep

handles thereto, and of a capacity not exceeding three cube feet.

12. No closet door or trap shall abut or open upon a street, lane, or right-of-way exceeding ten feet in width.

13. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this bye-law shall for every such breach he liable to a penalty of Ten pounds, or Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order a portion only, such portion not being less than Five shillings, to be paid. And any person committing any such breach shall be liable to the penalty, notwithstanding that the "Local Board of Health" may be empowered by this bye-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such local board has or has not taken advantage of such powers.
