WITH reference to the advertisement of the 16th March 1886, it is hereby notified that the Government of India are prepared to purchase about 1,750 horses suitable for army purposes during the year 1887-88, classed as follows:—

2. The purchases will be made in Calcutta, Madras, and Bombay, and at the various horse fairs and horse shows in India, by Remount Agents under the orders of the Director of Army Remount Operations for India.

3. The Calcutta Landing and Remount Depot will be open for the reception of horses from the 15th September to the end of the purchasing season, and not from the 15th August. Purchasing to commence as soon after arrival of the shipment as the Remount Agent may direct.

4. Horses and mares of all breeds will be received, but they must be within the prescribed age, 4 to 6 years, except as regards country-breds, and in the case of Australian horses, 14 hands 3 inches to 16 hands high. It is to be distinctly understood that in regard to classes I. and III. remounts three years old and mares in foal will not be purchased.

5. Greys will not be purchased for horse or field artillery.

6. The average price for a Waler remount has been fixed at £50 sterling, which will be paid in rupees at the Indian port of purchase at the current rate of exchange. The average price for all other remounts is Rs. 550. Every horse presented for purchase will be valued separately, and higher or lower prices may be given, provided that the average of the purchases does not exceed the above limits.

DESCRIPTION OF DISTRICT REFERRED TO.

Commencing at the junction of Watts River with the Yarra Yarra River; thence by the latter river upwards to a point opposite the south boundary of the parish of Gruyere; thence west to and by that boundary to the Woori Yaloak Creek; thence by that creek upwards to the junction of Sheppard's Creek; thence south-easterly by the latter creek, following its eastern branch, to a point near the north-east angle of Thomas James' late selection, in the parish of Tonimbuk; thence to the southern boundary of the county of Evelyn in a south-easterly direction; thence easterly by that boundary to the 146th meridian of east longitude; thence north by that meridian to a point due west of the Bald Hill; thence westerly by a direct line to Mount Arnold; thence north-westerly by a direct line to the north-east angle of the parish of Buxton; thence south-westerly by the boundary of that parish to the Acheron River; thence by that river upwards to a point due west of the north-west angle of allotment 1, parish of Granton; thence S. 60° W. by a line to a point on the crest of the Dividing Range, at Mount Saint Leonard; thence southerly by that range to Mount Monda; thence south magnetic by a line to the Watts River aforesaid; and thence by that river downwards to the point of commencement.

Wherever the line so described as aforesaid runs beside or along a river, creek, or road, whether such is specifically mentioned or not, the centre of such river, creek, or road shall be taken to be the boundary line.

COURT OF INSOLVENCY.—AMENDING RULES.

IN pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred by the "*Insolvency Statute 1871*," we, the Honorable Henry John Wrixon, Her Majesty's Attorney-General for Victoria; Hickman Molesworth, Esqre.; and Francis Quinlan, Esqre., being the Law Officer and two of the Judges of the Court of Insolvency, appointed by the Governor in Council under the provisions of the said Statute to frame the Rules of Practice of the said Court for the purposes in the said "*Insolvency Statute 1871*" mentioned, do order and direct that the Rules 41, 75, and 85 be repealed, and that the following shall be the Rule instead of Rule 41 :—

The Taxing Officer of the Court shall be the Chief Clerk of the district in which the proceedings are being prosecuted, and all costs, charges, allowances, or expenses incurred or payable by or to any Trustee shall be taxed by the Taxing Officer.

For the better despatch of the business of the office, the Taxing Officer may call in the assistance of the Prothonotary of the Supreme Court, or of any other Taxing Officer, or may refer the whole or any part of a Bill relating to proceedings other than in Insolvency to him for taxation.

The allocatur upon every bill of costs shall be signed by the Taxing Officer, and the Assignee or Trustee in any estate shall attend or be represented upon the taxation of all costs, charges, allowances, or expenses payable out of the estate which have been incurred by him as Assignee or Trustee thereof.

The following shall be the Rule instead of Rule 75 :—

Every application under Section 133 for a summons shall be in writing, and the Chief Clerk shall file the same and issue a summons, which shall be served personally on the person to whom it is addressed by delivering to him a sealed copy thereof, unless it be proved to the satisfaction of the Court or Judge that the person to whom it is addressed is keeping out of the way to avoid service, or has left Victoria; in which case the Court or Judge may order that service of an office copy of the summons, or any order postponing the same, at the usual or last known place of abode or business of the person to whom it is addressed, by delivering the same and conduct money to some adult person resident thereat, shall be good service upon the person to whom the summons is addressed.

The following shall be the Rule instead of Rule 85 :—

1. The Trustee (*or* Trustees), or in estates in which there is no Trustee the Assignee, shall file the statements mentioned in Section 122 of the Statute on the first days of the months of January, April, July, and October in each year.

Such statement shall be in the form A in the Schedule, and shall be verified by the affidavit of such Trustee (*or* Trustees) or Assignee, and shall state upon its face whether it be an interim or final statement of the estate.

2. In addition to the statement mentioned in Section 122 of the Statute, the Trustee (*or* Trustees), or in estates in which there is no Trustee the Assignee, shall on the first day of the months of January, April, July, and October in each year file a statement of all and singular the assets of the estate which have come to his hands, possession, or knowledge as such Trustee or Assignee, or into the hands of any person on his behalf, and stating opposite each item whether the same has or has not been realized, and, if realized, the amount received for the same; and further showing all moneys received in the estate and the balance in hand which has not been paid away or distributed.

Such statement shall be in the form B in the Schedule, and shall be verified by the affidavit of such Trustee or Trustees or Assignee, and shall state upon its face whether it be an interim or final statement of the receipts and assets of the estate.

3. The Chief Clerk of the Court in each District, upon the expiration of fourteen days from the first days of the months of January, April, July, and October in each year, shall forward a list to the Honorable the Treasurer of the Colony of Victoria of all estates in which the statements mentioned in this Rule, properly verified, have not been filed, unless final statements have been filed in each of the said estates.

And that the following shall be a Rule in addition to the Rules now in force :—

The notice required by the fifty-third Section of the Act shall be given by the Chief Clerk by notice in one issue of the *Government Gazette*, and by one advertisement in not more than two newspapers published in the district in which the estate is sequestrated, and such advertisement shall be in the form C in the Schedule.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1874* (38 Vict. No. 506) it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might, from time to time, make Orders, amongst other things, to subdivide or re-subdivide any municipal district into any number of subdivisions not exceeding eight; and every such Order should be published in the *Government Gazette*, and should take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas a petition purporting to be signed by more than one-fourth of the persons whose names are for the time being inscribed on the municipal roll of the Shire of Kowree has been presented to the Governor in Council, the substance and prayer of which petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the forty-sixth section of the said Act, and no counter petition has been received: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, doth by this present Order subdivide the Shire of Kowree into three separate Subdivisions or Ridings, the names and boundaries whereof shall be as follows, that is to say:—

EASTERN RIDING.—Commencing at a point on the south boundary of the shire in the centre of the Glenelg River, south of the south-west angle of the parish of Harrow; thence north by the west boundary of that parish and of the parishes of Wombelano, Konnepra, and Turandurey to the northern boundary of the shire at the north-west angle of the parish last named; thence following the shire boundary easterly, southerly, and westerly back to the commencing point.

CENTRAL RIDING.—Commencing at a point on the south boundary of the shire at the south-west angle of the parish of Durong; thence north by the west boundary of that parish and of the parishes of Edenhope, Jallakin, and Morea to the northern boundary of the shire at the north-west angle of the parish last named; thence following the shire boundary easterly to the north-west angle of the parish of Turandurey; and thence southerly by

the west boundary of that parish and the parishes of Konnepra, Wombelano, and Harrow (being the west boundary of the Eastern riding) to the Glenelg River which forms part of the southern boundary of the shire; and thence following the shire boundary westerly to the commencing point.

Regulations for Management of the Portland Municipal Common.

IN pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons made by the Governor in Council on 17th March 1885, the Managers of the Portland Municipal Common, having drafted the following Regulations for management thereof, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approval by the Governor in Council, in lieu of the Regulations heretofore in force in respect of such Common.

Regulations.

1. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licenses, or carriers' licenses, and farmers residing within five (5) miles of the common may respectively depasture thereon four (4) head of large cattle, or the equivalent thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one (1) head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three (3) head of small cattle.
2. No person shall depasture on the common stock of which he is not the *bona fide* owner.
3. The fees for depasturing stock on the common shall be as follow, and shall be payable quarterly in advance, on the first day of January, the first day of April, the first day of July, and the first day of October in every year:—
For every horse 10s. (ten shillings) per annum.
For every head of other large cattle 6s. (six shillings) per annum.
For every head of small cattle 2s. (two shillings) per annum.
4. All unregistered stock found on the common shall be deemed to be trespassing thereon, and shall be liable to be impounded.
5. All persons desirous of depasturing stock on the common shall furnish the managers with a written statement of the number and brands of such stock.
6. No entire horse or bull over the age of twelve (12) months shall be allowed to depasture on the common without the written consent of the managers.
7. All cattle placed on the common shall be branded with the common brand, "P."
8. No person shall remove stock from the common without giving notice thereof in writing to the herdsman.
9. The herdsman shall, on the expiration of every quarter, muster the stock on the common.
10. The managers shall not be responsible for damage to, or loss of, any stock placed on the common.
11. No diseased stock shall be allowed to depasture on the common.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing Regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20) for each offence.

The value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c.

Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labor may be required in the packing of stores.

Tenders having alterations or erasures therein will not be entertained.

Security will be required either in Government debentures, bank deposit-receipt in favor of the Deputy Postmaster-General, or cash deposit, as the tenderer may elect.

Tenders must be accompanied by bank notes, or a bank draft in favor of the Deputy Postmaster-General, for the amount of the deposit required (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers. Such deposit to be forfeited in the event of the successful tenderer failing to complete the security within the prescribed period.

The security will be calculated at ten per cent. on the total amount of contract.

The security must be completed within ten days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised, or another tender accepted.

In the event of the contractor failing to carry out the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

Persons failing to take up their contracts will be disqualified from tendering for Government supplies for a period of twelve months.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The Postmaster-General will not be bound to issue orders upon the contractors for all the articles enumerated in the schedules, but only for such articles, and such quantities of those articles, as the Postmaster-General may order from time to time; neither will the Postmaster-General be bound to take from the contractors any larger supply of any of the articles than may be shown upon the orders which have been issued during the year, nor will he be bound to take any of the articles enumerated in the schedules for which orders have not been issued. Should the Postmaster-General require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedules, the contractor will be bound to supply the same at the contract rate.

2. The supplies are to be according to sample, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. In other cases, the supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds of manufacture. A preference will, however, be given to goods of Victorian manufacture, provided the quality be equal to the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule.

3. All orders must accompany the goods on delivery, otherwise the goods will not be received. Delivery, as a rule, is to be of the full quantity ordered.

4. Supplies ordered for delivery in Melbourne and Williamstown districts are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and for the purposes of these contracts, Melbourne district will include a radius of six miles from the General Post Office, and Williamstown district will include the town of Williamstown, Hobson's Bay, and the River Yarra.

5. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the Supervisor of Maintenance, General Post Office.

6. Orders must receive prompt execution; and in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officer named in condition 5, or the head of the department, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account.

7. The contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form simultaneously with delivery of the full quantities of goods ordered, the account being rendered with order to which it relates. The prices quoted in the orders cannot be increased.

8. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer named in condition 5. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof in writing to the officer rejecting the goods.

9. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of. All articles rejected must be immediately replaced by the contractor, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense deducted as in condition 6.

10. The members of boards of survey will be appointed by the Government, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the survey fees and extra expense (if any) will be charged as in condition 6.

11. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or of a delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the Postmaster-General may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in condition 6, or from the contractor's security. It will also be in the power of the Postmaster-General, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

12. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognised.

13. It will be competent either for the contractor on his own behalf, or for the Postmaster-General, to terminate the contract, by giving notice, in writing, of three full calendar months to the opposite party, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the first day of a month, and within the period for which the contract is made.

14. In the event of any alteration in the tariff affecting any of the items included in these contracts, the Postmaster-General, or the contractor, as the case may be, will make a proportionate allowance by way of deduction from, or increase to, the price of the item so affected.

15. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being broken, infringed, or violated by the importation of stores for the Electric Telegraph Service, or by any contracts made by the Imperial Commissariat or the Agent-General for Victoria, or by any contracts or agreements made for any works or supplies by the Department of Public Works, or the Tender Board, or on account of other Governments; or by any article being made at, and supplied for the use of, any Government establishment; or by the consumption of the surplus stock of any Government establishment.

3. The amount of the tender must be stated AT RATE PER ANNUM in words as well as figures.

4. Every tender must bear the *bond fide* signature and address of the tenderor, and bear the names of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the fulfilment of the contract in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of the contract.

5. Every tender must be accompanied by cash, marked cheque, bank draft, or a bank deposit-receipt to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General for a sum equal to TEN PER CENT. of the annual amount named in the tender; this deposit to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete the

usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government within ten days of being notified that the documents are ready for execution. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient.

6. The money or other security deposited by successful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, on the bond and contract being duly signed.

7. The money or other security deposited by unsuccessful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, and on their signing receipts for the respective amounts.

8. In the event of a new line of railway, or a new railway station on an existing line being opened for traffic, and it being decided that the mails shall be conveyed by rail, the Postmaster-General shall have the power of cancelling the contract for any mail service running in the vicinity of the railway without compensation to the contractor, or shall have power to alter the points of arrival and departure of the mails; and in the event of the travelling distance on any mail line being in such manner increased or diminished, all payments for the service subsequent to the alteration shall be computed on the basis of the average mileage-rate of the contract.

9. In the event of it being found necessary, from any cause, to absolutely cancel a contract, the Postmaster-General shall have full power to do so, provided that, unless the contract be cancelled on account of any fault on the part of the contractor, or on account of the opening of a railway line or a new railway station, payment shall be made to the contractor as compensation of a sum equal to ten per cent. of the moneys which would have become due on the unexpired period of the contract if the latter had been continued for the full term of three years.

10. Tenderers are requested to state the mode by which they propose to convey mails, whether by vehicle, on horseback, or by man on foot. If by vehicle, the description of vehicle and number of horses by which it is to be drawn to be given.

11. SHIRE OF WALHALLA.

BYE-LAW No. 1, MADE UNDER "THE PUBLIC HEALTH AMENDMENT STATUTE 1883."

IN pursuance of the powers contained in "The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883," and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, the Local Board of Health for the Shire of Walhalla, being the municipal council thereof, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within its jurisdiction, do hereby make the Bye-law No. 1 following, that is to say:—

Interpretation of terms.—In the construction and for the purposes of this bye-law the following terms shall, if not inconsistent with the context or subject-matter, have the respective meanings assigned to them:—

"House" shall mean and include dwellings of any kind, schools, hotels, licensed public-houses, factories, work-rooms, common or other lodging-houses, or other buildings or premises.

"Cesspool" shall mean any receptacle for night-soil, or for noxious or offensive matter below or above the ground.

"Street" shall mean and include any highway, and any public bridge, and any road, lane, footway, square, court, alley, yard, or passage, whether a thoroughfare or not.

1. All former bye-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed, excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this bye-law coming into operation.

2. The sections of this bye-law, numbered one to twenty-five both inclusive, and section twenty-eight, shall apply to and be in force and have operation on their confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after publication in the *Government Gazette*, in the whole of the Shire of Walhalla.

3. The occupier of any house or premises within the said shire shall cause the yard and ground belonging thereto or occupied in connection therewith to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all filth, dust, mud, or other refuse matter to be from time to time removed from such yard, ground, or premises; and if at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such filth, rubbish, or refuse matter so removed as aforesaid, the Local Board of Health may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier.

4. The occupier of any horse or cattle yard or any land in the said shire on which there shall be erected any stable cow-yard, cattle-shed, or pigsty, shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all soil, dung, or other matters produced or accumulated thereon to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of the same so produced or accumulated shall amount to one cubic yard, or once at least in every week; and if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect or fail to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid, the same may be removed by the Local Board of Health at the expense of such occupier.

5. The occupier of every house, building, or tenement within the said shire shall cause every cesspool already in existence, and until its abolition, to be emptied and cleansed from time to time as soon as the contents of such cesspool shall have accumulated therein or to be within a distance of one foot from the top of the sides, walls, or lining of such cesspool. Provided that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed therefrom except between the hours of One o'clock a.m. and Five o'clock a.m. And provided also that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed therefrom until such contents shall have had mixed therewith carbolic acid or some other efficient deodorizer sufficient in quantity and quality to effectually deodorize and disinfect the same.

6. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall, once at least in every week, empty and cleanse, or cause to be emptied and cleansed, every earth-closet, privy, and place in the nature of an earth-closet for the reception of night-soil, on or belonging to such premises.

7. No person shall burn any bones, skins, offal, hair, wool, woollens, leather, or other offensive matter in any place so as to be a nuisance to any person.

8. No person shall place any dust, mud, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung or soil, or any night-soil or other offensive matter, in any place so as to be a nuisance to any person or injurious to health.

9. No person shall empty any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the reception of night-soil, except by means of a cart, carriage, or means of conveyance, properly constructed and furnished with a sufficient covering, so as to prevent the escape of the contents or any portion thereof or of effluvia therefrom.

10. All night-soil, blood, offal, or other offensive matter or thing shall be removed to and deposited in such place or places only as may be appointed by the Local Board of Health from time to time for the final reception of the same.

11. Every person placing or depositing, or causing or suffering to be placed or deposited or spread, or assisting in placing or depositing or spreading on any land, whether by way of manure or otherwise, any night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter removed from any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or other place shall immediately on the deposit or spreading thereof cover the same or cause the same to be covered, with a layer of earth not less than six inches in thickness.

12. No person shall empty, cause, or permit to be emptied or assist in emptying any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter into any drain or sewer, or so that the contents thereof may find its way or be likely to find its way into any drain or sewer.

13. No person shall place, assist in placing, or cause or permit to be placed in, or so that the same may or may be likely to find its way into any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, any matter or thing likely to endanger the health of any person using such water or drinks, or milk, or other produce of such dairy.

14. No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying any cesspool or place for the deposit of offal, blood, or other refuse matter into any water supplied, used, or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, or so that the contents or any portion of the contents thereof may find its way into any such water.

15. Every accumulation or deposit of offensive matter so situated as to find its way or be likely to find its way into any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or for domestic purposes, or likely to be used in any dairy, shall be deodorized and removed by the owner of the property upon which such accumulation or deposit is situated forthwith on notice being given by the Local Board of Health or by one of its officers to that effect.

16. No person shall keep any animal of any kind so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

17. No person shall keep any animal in such a manner as to pollute any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or for domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy so as to endanger the health of any person using such water or drink, or milk, or other produce of such dairy.

18. Every occupier or licensed person having the management or control of a slaughter-house, slaughter-yard, or abattoir shall cause the same to be supplied with a sufficient quantity of water for all purposes.

19. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of premises used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, or manufactory whatsoever shall cause all rubbish, filth, offal, soil, or other offensive matter, and all waste products of such manufacture or process, from which effluvia may arise, to be removed from such premises once at least in every twenty-four hours, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and so that no noxious or offensive effluvia arise therefrom; and if any such occupier or person shall neglect or fail to have removed any such offensive matter or waste products as aforesaid, the same may be removed by the Local Board of Health at the expense of such occupier or person.

20. Every closet pan shall be constructed of galvanized iron properly riveted and soldered so as to be water-tight, and with handles thereto, and of a capacity not exceeding one and a half cubic feet in measurement.

21. No closet-door or trap shall abut or open on a street, lane, or right-of-way exceeding ten (10) feet in width.

22. *Registration of cowkeepers, dairymen, and purveyors of milk.*—Every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall, on or before the first day of July 1887, and shall, on before the first day of January in every subsequent year, register himself with the Local Board of Health in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the Secretary of the Local Board of Health an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall with every such application pay a fee of Two shillings and sixpence for the unexpired portion of the year ending on the 31st December 1887; and shall pay a fee of Five shillings for each and every such registration as and for the first day of January 1888 for the year ending on the 31st day of December then next ensuing, and also for every subsequent year in like manner:—

Application for registration as a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk (as the case may be).

To the Secretary of the Local Board of Health for the Shire of Walthalla.

23. Upon receipt of every such application and fee, the Secretary for such Local Board of Health shall indorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received, and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

24. *Milk stores and shops to be kept clean.*—Every person following the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman shall cause every milk store or milk shop in his occupation, or under his management or control, and every milk vessel used by him for containing milk for sale, to be kept thoroughly clean.

25. *Dairymen, &c., to report disease to the Health Officer.*—Every person carrying on the trade of cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, and every person having the management of any such trade, shall forthwith report, in writing, to the Health Officer the occurrence of any disease in any of his milk cows, or of any contagious or infectious disease in man or animal upon the premises upon which such trade is carried on.

26. *Receptacles for house refuse and removal of same by the public scavenger.*—This and the next following section shall, on confirmation and publication as aforesaid, have force and operation in that portion of the township of Walthalla hereunder described, viz.:—Commencing at and including the present residence and premises of Mr. Richard Noble at the south end of Main street; thence northerly to the junction of the right and left hand branches of Stringer's Creek; thence north-westerly along the main road to Ratcliffe's Point; thence along the eastern branch of Stringer's Creek to the corporation stone quarry; thence to the junction of Main street and Central road; thence along that road to and including the residence and premises of Mr. Hubert Florance, opposite St. John's Church; thence westerly to the main street; thence southerly to the point of commencement.

27. The occupier of any house or premises within the herebefore prescribed limits shall provide and keep thereon a box or some other receptacle for the temporary deposit of house refuse, which box or receptacle shall be of such dimensions as that the same may, with the contents thereof, when full, be readily and conveniently movable by one man, or so many such boxes or receptacles as may be necessary to contain all the house refuse produced or accumulated on such premises during the week, and shall cause all house refuse to be deposited as soon as conveniently may be in some such box or receptacle, and shall cause every such box or receptacle containing house refuse to be placed in the yard of such house or premises, and close to the entrance thereof, or in the street, lane, or right-of-way contiguous to such house or premises on every Friday morning, commencing at the hour of six o'clock, to be emptied and the contents thereof removed by the public scavenger.

28. *Penalties.*—If any person commit a breach of any of the provisions of this bye-law he shall for each and every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10, or to a penalty not exceeding £5, for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, provided the justices before whom any penalty imposed hereby is sought to be recovered may order the whole or part only (not being less than Five shillings) of such penalty to be paid. And every person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the foregoing penalty notwithstanding that the Local Board of Health may be empowered by this bye-law or otherwise to remedy such breach and whether such Local Board of Health have or have not taken advantage of such powers.

All penalties under this bye-law shall be recovered before one or more justices.

A Regulation of the Borough of Hawthorn, made under the first section of Part 5 of the thirteenth Schedule to the Local Government Act 1874, in force in the Borough, by virtue of a Bye-law of the above-named Borough numbered 24.

IN pursuance of the first section of Part 5 of the thirteenth Schedule of the Local Government Act 1874, adopted by Bye-law No. 24 of the Council of the Borough of Hawthorn, the said Council make the following Regulation, that is to say :—
 Section 34 of Regulation No. 4 of the Council of the Borough of Hawthorn is hereby repealed, and the following new section is adopted and passed in its stead, viz. :—

- B. Buildings of the first or dwelling-house class, and shops of not more than one story, may be built of wood if at a distance of 12 feet from the building line of any road or street, or at a distance of 8 feet from any right-of-way, or if already built, either of wood or any other material, may be added to in wood, subject to the following limitations and provisions :—
- A. All external walls hereafter to be built, and which are not at least four feet distant from land not in the same possession or occupation must be of brick or stone at least 8½ inches in thickness, built on a proper foundation, and projecting at least one inch beyond the face of the wood work.
- B. In case the external walls of such building which are nearest to any land not in the same possession or occupation shall exceed 12 feet in height, then the distance from such land within which it shall not be lawful to erect the external walls of wood shall be increased by a distance equal to such excess.
- C. That if more than one house be erected in one block, a party-wall must be built in manner as required by these

regulations, between each of such houses, and be carried quite through and project at least one inch beyond the face of the wood work.

Regulation No. 4 of the Council of the Borough of Hawthorn and this Regulation shall apply to all lands fronting, adjoining, or abutting on Harcourt street and Kildare street, in addition to the roads, streets, and grove named in the said Regulation No. 4.

And whereas the Council of the City of Richmond, which is the Municipal Council in and for the municipality of the said city, so thinks fit, be it and it is by the said Municipal Council hereby ordered and directed—That every shopkeeper keeping a shop of the class named in the first schedule to this Bye-law, within the City of Richmond, and which is not of the classes named in the third schedule to "The Factories and Shops Act 1885," upon receiving licences to do from the Town Clerk of the said city, which licence the said Town Clerk is hereby empowered by the said Municipal Council, the Council of the City of Richmond, to issue on its behalf, upon application made for the same, may keep open his said shop after the hours in the said Act mentioned, and not later than the hours mentioned in the second schedule hereto.

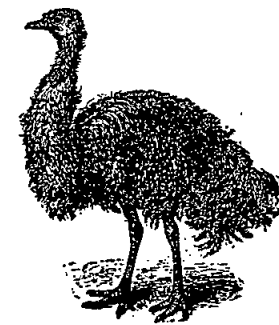

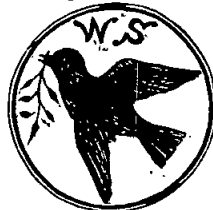
