## "THE FACTORIES AND SHOPS ACT 1885."

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the 29th section of *The Factories and Shops Act 1885* (49 Vict. No. 862), and after due inquiry, I, the Chief Secretary of Victoria, being the responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being administering the said Act, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of the said section 29 in the

BAKEHOUSE OF MR. JAMES LONG, VICTORIA STREET,  
BALLARAT EAST,

for a period of one month from the date hereof, upon these express conditions, that is to say:-

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said bakehouse any boy or female for more than sixty-five and a half hours in any one week in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That no boy or female shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without his or her consent.

I may observe that the alterations in the duties are understood to be in the direction of a reduction of duty in each case.

[Ratifications exchanged at Bucharest, December 31, 1886.]

Presented to both Houses of Parliament by Command of Her Majesty, February 1887.

*English Text.*

Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and His Majesty the King of Roumania, having found it expedient to revise the text of Articles III and XI of the treaty of commerce and navigation, signed at Bucharest, on the 24th March (5th April) 1880, have with this object determined to conclude a treaty, and have named as their respective Plenipotentiaries, that is to say:

Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Percy Sanderson, Esquire, a Companion of Her Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Her Consul-General in Roumania and Chargé d'Affaires at Bucharest; And His Majesty the King of Roumania, M. Michel Phérékyde, His Minister Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, Grand Officer of His Order of the Star of Roumania, &c., &c.;

Who, after having communicated to each other their respective full powers, found in good and due form, have agreed upon and concluded the following Articles:—

## ARTICLE I.

The provisions of Article III of the Treaty of the 24th March (5th April) 1880 are replaced by the following stipulations:—

In conformity with Article 5 of the Roumanian Customs Law, the weight liable to duty shall be established at the option of the person presenting the goods, either by weighing the goods divested of their packing material, or by deducting from the gross weight the percentage which constitutes the legal tare, as set forth in the Roumanian General Tariff.

## ARTICLE II.

The treaty of the 24th March (5th April) 1880 (of which the provisions that are not modified by the clauses of the present Treaty remain in force), as well as the present Treaty, shall continue in force until the 28th June (10th July) 1891.

In case neither of the two contracting parties shall have notified, twelve months before the said date, its intention of putting an end to the present Treaty, and to the Treaty of the 24th March (5th April) 1880, they shall remain binding until the expiration of one year from the day on which either of the contracting parties shall have given such notice.

## ARTICLE III.

The ratifications of the present Treaty shall be exchanged at Bucharest as soon as possible.

In witness whereof, the respective Plenipotentiaries have signed the present Treaty and affixed thereto their seals.

Done in duplicate at Bucharest the fourteenth (twenty-sixth) day of November One thousand eight hundred and eighty-six.

## REGULATION UNDER “THE EDUCATION ACT 1872.”

WHEREAS by the 18th section of *The Education Act 1872* it was enacted that the Governor in Council might, from time to time, make and rescind regulations for all or any of the purposes therein mentioned: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this Order direct that sub-section I. of section IX. of the Regulations under *The Education Act 1872* be rescinded, and that in lieu thereof the following sub-section be substituted, that is to say:—

## REGULATION IX.—EXHIBITIONS.

1. Exhibitors will be selected upon competitive examinations held during the last three months of each year. No competitor will be permitted to attend any such examination unless he shall have been classified in the sixth class of his school from at least the first day of July immediately preceding, or be the holder of a scholarship awarded by the Minister under the Regulation re-

garding scholarships, and shall have produced a certificate of birth showing that he will have completed his twelfth, but will not have completed his fourteenth, year before the first day of January succeeding the examination; and no competitor will be selected unless he shall, during the two years immediately preceding the latter date, have been continuously on the rolls of, and in attendance at, a State School, or, if the holder of a scholarship, one of the schools approved for scholars.

THE following copy of a circular issued by the Board of Trade to officers in British Possessions abroad, on the subject of the extension, by Order in Council, of the provisions of section 8 of *The Merchant Shipping (Colonial) Act 1869* to first and second-class certificates of competency granted to Engineers by the Minister of Marine and Fisheries in the Possession of Canada, and of the Order in Council referred to, which has been received by His Excellency the Governor from the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies, is published for general information.

INSTRUCTIONS TO OFFICERS IN BRITISH POSSESSIONS ABROAD.

*Merchant Shipping (Colonial) Act 1869.*

The provisions contained in section 8 of *The Merchant Shipping (Colonial) Act 1869* have been now extended by Order in Council (copy of which is appended) to first and second-class certificates of competency granted to Engineers by the Minister of Marine and Fisheries.

As the colonial certificates of competency referred to in the said Order in Council are to have the same force as the similar certificates granted by the Board of Trade in the United Kingdom, such a colonial certificate must be accepted as occupying in every respect the place of one of the latter, and as entitling its *bonâ fide* holder to act in the capacity stated in it, or any inferior (but not a superior) capacity in any British ship all over the world without the possession of a Board of Trade certificate.

Colonial certificates will have to be used, produced, and delivered at the times and on the occasions at and on which Imperial certificates of competency would have to be used, produced, and delivered.

When it appears from a certificate (Imperial or Colonial) officially produced to the officer that its owner possesses other certificates, their production also should be required, and if they are not produced their owner's explanation in writing should be demanded and forwarded to the Registrar-General of Seamen with the least possible delay.

Officers in the British Possessions abroad are empowered by Regulation 9 attached to the Order in Council to demand, and if necessary retain, any such colonial certificate which they have reason to believe has been improperly issued, or has been forged, altered, cancelled, suspended, or to which the person using it is not justly entitled.

Whenever this power is exercised a report of the facts and circumstances must be sent by the officer, with the least possible delay, to either the Board of Trade or the Government of the Possession in which the certificate was originally granted or may purport to have been granted, accordingly as communication may be easier and quicker.

As the withdrawal of a certificate would in some cases entail inconvenience, not only upon its possessor but also upon the owners of the ship and cargo, it is scarcely necessary to caution officers that the exercise of this power should only be resorted to when the evidence is perfectly clear; and if the ship is bound to the United Kingdom, and the report above mentioned has been sent to the Possession in which the certificate was originally granted, the Board of Trade should nevertheless be informed of the facts.

Every case of death of a colonial certificate holder which may come to the officer's knowledge should be reported without delay to the Government of the Possession in which the certificate was granted.

The attention of officers and functionaries in the Possessions abroad engaged in the conduct of official inquiries in wreck and discipline cases is directed to the fact that the certificates to which the Order in Council applies will be liable to cancellation and suspension in precisely the same way as certificates granted by the Board of Trade under the Merchant Shipping Acts, and by the same boards, courts, and tribunals. The provisions of *The Merchant Shipping Act 1854*, and *The Merchant Shipping Act Amendment Act 1862*, as to Courts of Inquiry will therefore be applicable to the colonial certificates in question, with the exception of the provisions specified in the Order in Council.

It will be noticed that regulation 8 in the Order in Council provides that the cancellation or suspension of a certificate shall involve cancellation or suspension of all the other certificates (if any) possessed by its owner. With the view of carrying this regulation strictly into effect, it will be desirable that the court should endeavour to ascertain, and should specify in their decision, the particulars of all the certificates possessed by any person whose conduct is the subject of an investigation by them.

In cases of cancellation or suspension of such colonial certificates, copies of the report of the court and of the evidence, together with the respective certificates, should be sent to the Governments of the British Possessions by whom the several certificates possessed by the offender were originally granted. A full report upon the case and the evidence should, at the same time, be sent to the Board of Trade, as required by the Act, and the sentence, giving the number of each certificate dealt with, and the Possession in which it was granted, should be mentioned in it.

The holders of colonial certificates which are cancelled or suspended should be referred to the Government of the Possession in which the certificate was originally granted, instead of to this Board, if they desire to appeal from the sentence or to apply for a mitigation of it.

These instructions must be understood as having reference only to the certificates referred to in the said Order in Council.

The amended conditions and regulations referred to in Article 4 of the annexed Canadian Order, and set out in the schedule thereto, are applicable to all certificates of competency hitherto or hereafter to be granted under the provisions of the Order in Council of the 29th day of June 1882, to persons intending to act as Masters, Mates, or Engineers in the British Possessions of—

THE QUEEN'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the *Merchant Shipping (Colonial) Act 1869* it is (among other things) enacted that, where the Legislature of any British possession provides for the examination of, and grant of certificates of competency to, persons intending to act as masters, mates, or engineers on board British ships, and the Board of Trade reports to Her Majesty that they are satisfied that the examinations are so conducted as to be equally efficient as the examinations for the same purpose in the United Kingdom under the Acts relating to merchant shipping, and that the certificates are granted on such principles as to show the like qualification and competency as those granted under the said Acts, and are liable to be forfeited for the like reasons and in the like manner, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty by Order in Council:—

1. To declare that the said certificates shall be of the same force as if they had been granted under the said Acts.
2. To declare that all or any of the provisions of the said Acts which relate to certificates of competency granted under those Acts shall apply to the certificates referred to in the said Order.
3. To impose such conditions and to make such regulations with respect to the said certificates, and to the use, issue, delivery, cancellation, and suspension thereof, as to Her Majesty may seem fit, and to impose penalties not exceeding Fifty pounds for the breach of such conditions and regulations.

And that upon the publication in the *London Gazette* of any such Order in Council as last aforesaid, the provisions therein contained shall, from a date to be mentioned for the purpose in such Order, take effect as if they had been contained in the Act, and that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty in Council to revoke any Order made as aforesaid:

And whereas by the *Merchant Shipping Acts 1854 to 1876* it is provided that Her Majesty may, by Order in Council, revoke, alter, or add to any Order in Council made by Her under the said Acts:

And whereas by Order in Council dated the 29th day of June 1882, Her Majesty has been pleased to declare that (subject to certain conditions and regulations therein contained) the colonial certificates of competency granted by the duly constituted authorities in the British possessions of Bengal, Bombay, Malta, New South Wales, New Zealand, Queensland, South Australia, Tasmania, and Victoria, to persons intending to act as masters, mates, and engineers of British ships, and by the Governor of Newfoundland and the Minister of Marine and Fisheries in the possession of Canada, to persons intending to act as masters or mates on board British seagoing ships shall be of the same force as if they had been granted under the said Acts relating to merchant shipping:

And whereas the Legislature of the British possession of Canada has by *The Steamboat Inspection Act 1882*, and by *An Act further to amend the Steamboat Inspection Act 1882*, further provided for the examination by the Board of Steamboat Inspection in the said possession of persons intending to act as first class engineers and second class engineers on board British ships, and for the grant to such persons by the Minister of Marine and Fisheries in the said possession of certificates of competency as first class engineers and second class engineers for sea-going British ships, which certificates are hereinafter also denominated colonial certificates of competency, and the Board of Trade have reported to Her Majesty that they are satisfied that the said examinations are so conducted as to be equally efficient as the examinations for the same purpose in the United Kingdom under the Acts relating to merchant shipping, and that the certificates are granted on such principles as to show the like qualifications and competency as those granted under the said Acts to first and second class engineers, and are liable to be forfeited for the like reasons, and in the like manner:

And whereas it has been made to appear to Her Majesty that it is expedient that the said recited Order in Council of the 29th day of June 1882 should be altered by the revocation of the conditions and regulations set out in the schedule thereto, and the substitution therefor of the conditions and regulations set out in the schedule hereto:



Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers vested in her by the first recited Act, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased—

1. To declare that the said colonial certificates of competency granted by the Minister of Marine and Fisheries in the possession of Canada on and after the 1st day of January 1887 to persons intending to act as first class engineers and second class engineers of sea-going British ships shall be of the same force as if they had been certificates of competency granted under the said Acts to first or second class engineers.
2. To declare that all the provisions of the said Acts which relate to certificates of competency for the foreign trade granted under those Acts, except so much of the 139th section of *The Merchant Shipping Act 1854*, and the 10th section of *The Merchant Shipping Act Amendment Act 1862*, as requires the delivery by the Board of Trade to any master, mate, or engineer of a copy of any certificate to which he appears to be entitled as therein mentioned, so much of the third paragraph of the 23rd section of the said last-mentioned Act as requires at the conclusion of a case relating to the cancelling or suspending of a certificate, such certificate, if cancelled or suspended, to be forwarded to the Board of Trade, and the whole of the provisions of the fourth paragraph of the same section shall apply to such colonial certificates of competency.
3. To impose and make the conditions and regulations set out in the schedule hereto, numbered 1 to 10 respectively, with respect to the said colonial certificates of competency, and to the use, issue, delivery, cancellation, and suspension, thereof, and to impose for the breach of such conditions and regulations the penalties therein mentioned.
4. To revoke the conditions and regulations numbered 1 to 10 respectively, set out in the schedule to the Order in Council of the 29th day of June 1882, and to substitute therefor the conditions and regulations set out in the schedule hereto numbered 1 to 10 respectively, and to declare that from and after the date hereof, the conditions and regulations set out in the schedule hereto shall apply to all colonial certificates that may have been or shall be hereafter granted under the said Order in Council of the 29th day of June 1882, or that may have been granted under any of the Orders in Council revoked by the said last recited Order, as though they had been imposed and made by the said Orders.

#### Schedule.

Conditions and Regulations with respect to the use, issue, delivery, cancellation, and suspension of Colonial certificates of Competency.

*Interpretation Clause.*—In the construction and for the purposes of these conditions and regulations, the following terms shall have the respective meanings hereinafter assigned to them, that is to say:—

“Colonial certificate of competency” shall mean a certificate of competency authorized to be granted by the legislative authority of a British possession to persons intending to act as masters, mates, or engineers of British ships on similar principles and conditions as those granted under the Imperial Acts relating to merchant shipping.

“Authority” shall mean the Governor, Lieutenant-Governor, Administrator, head of the Government, Minister, Board, Body, or Corporation of or in any British possession for the time being authorized by the Legislature of such possession to grant colonial certificates of competency.

#### Conditions and Regulations.

##### *Form of certificate.*

1. A colonial certificate of competency shall be on parchment, and as nearly as possible similar in shape and form to the corresponding certificate of competency for the foreign trade granted by the Board of Trade under the Acts relating to merchant shipping.

##### *Name of possession to be inserted.*

2. A colonial certificate of competency shall have the name of the British possession in which the same is granted inserted prominently on its face and back.

##### *Certificates to be numbered consecutively.*

3. The colonial certificates of competency granted in each British possession shall be numbered in consecutive order. *Lists of certificates granted, cancelled, &c., to be sent to Registrar-General of Seamen.*

4. The authority in each British possession shall furnish the Registrar-General of Seamen in London, from time to time, with accurate lists of all such colonial certificates of competency as may be granted therein or as may for any cause whatsoever be cancelled, suspended, renewed, or re-issued; and shall also furnish him with duplicates of the applications for examination made by the persons to whom such certificates are granted.

*Certificates to be granted only upon proof of service at sea.*  
5. A colonial certificate of competency shall be granted only upon proof that the previous service at sea of the person applying for the same has been such as is required by the regulations for the time being in force in the United Kingdom with respect to certificates of the like grade.

Certificates of competency granted contrary to this regulation, or upon any false, incorrect, or insufficient proof, certificate, or report of service, qualification, conduct, or character shall be regarded as improperly granted.

##### *Certificates not to be granted when former are cancelled.*

6. A colonial certificate of competency shall not be granted to any person who may have had a certificate, whether granted by

the Board of Trade or by the Government of a British possession, cancelled or suspended under the provision of the said Acts or of any Act for the time being in force in any part of Her Majesty's dominions, unless the period of suspension has expired, or unless intimation has been received from the Board of Trade, or the authority by whom the cancelled or suspended certificate was originally granted, to the effect that no objection to the grant of such colonial certificate is known to exist, or unless a new certificate has been granted to him by such board or authority; and in the last-named event no such colonial certificate of competency shall be for a higher grade than the certificate so last granted as aforesaid.

Colonial certificates of competency granted contrary to this regulation shall be regarded as improperly granted.

*Certificates improperly granted may be cancelled without formal investigation.*

7. A colonial certificate of competency which appears from information subsequently acquired, or otherwise, to have been improperly granted, whether in the above or in any other respect, may be cancelled by the authority by which the same was granted, or by the Board of Trade in the United Kingdom, without any formal investigation under *The Merchant Shipping Act 1854*, and the holder of such certificate shall thereupon deliver it to the Board of Trade or such authority or as they or either of them may direct, and in default thereof shall incur a penalty not exceeding fifty pounds, which shall be recoverable in the same manner as penalties imposed by the Acts relating to Merchant Shipping are thereby made recoverable.

*Cancellation, &c., of a certificate shall involve cancellation of all the other certificates possessed by its owner.*

8. Every decision with respect to the cancellation or suspension of a certificate pronounced by any board, court, or tribunal under the provisions of the said Acts, shall extend equally to all the colonial certificates at the time possessed by the person in respect of whom the decision is made, as well as to all certificates granted to him under any of the Acts relating to Merchant Shipping, and whether such certificates be specified in such decisions or not.

##### *Certificates believed to be fraudulent may be demanded.*

9. Any officer of the Board of Trade, or the Registrar-General of Seamen, or any of his officers, or a superintendent of a mercantile marine office, or a consular officer, or duly appointed shipping officer in a British possession, may demand the delivery to him of any colonial certificate of competency which he has reason to believe has been improperly issued, or is forged, altered, cancelled, or suspended, or to which the person using it is not justly entitled, and may detain such certificate for a reasonable period for the purpose of making inquiries respecting such issue, forgery, alteration, cancellation, suspension, or possession, and any person who, without reasonable cause, neglects or refuses to comply with such demand shall incur a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds or its equivalent in local currency, which shall be recoverable in the same manner as penalties imposed by the Acts relating to Merchant Shipping are thereby made recoverable.

*Suspended certificates to be re-issued only by Colony by which originally granted.*

10. A colonial certificate of competency, which has from any cause been cancelled or suspended, shall be renewed or re-issued only by the authority by which the same was originally granted.

Reefs North of the Island Nias.

THE following information has been given by the commander of H.N.M.S. *de Ruijter* concerning the undermentioned reefs north of the Island Nias:—

1. The reef, marked on the chart W. of Oedjoeng Tanah Nasi, lies N.N.W.  $1\frac{1}{2}$  mile from that point. This shoal, with probably 1-2 fathoms on it, is 650 to 760 yards long, N.N.W.-S.S.E., and 110 yards wide. The sea was breaking heavily on it.
2. On the reef W. of Poeloe Pandjang some rocks are above water, which are covered now with low shrubbery.

As appears from the breakers, on the east and north-east side of this islet shoal-ground extends for a distance of 550 to 650 yards.

3. The reef fringing Poe. Babi extends the most to the N.W. and W.N.W. (1,740 yards from the island); to the south it extends 550 yards and to the north 330 yards.

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria passed in the twenty-seventh year of the reign of Her present Majesty called *The Weights and Measures Statute 1864*, it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council might at any time, if he think fit, and should at the request of not less than half the councils or boards constituting any union proclaimed under the said Act dissolve the same by proclamation: And whereas the Borough of St. Arnaud and the Shire of St. Arnaud were proclaimed a Union on the sixth day of December One thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven; and whereas the Council of the Borough of St. Arnaud and the Council of the Shire of St. Arnaud, which respectively represent the Borough of St. Arnaud and the Shire of St. Arnaud, have requested that the said Union may be dissolved: Now, therefore, I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my proclamation dissolve the Union of the Borough of St. Arnaud and the Shire of St. Arnaud for the purposes of the said Act.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-sixth day of April, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, and in the fiftieth year of Her Majesty's reign.

The births of 1,325 children, viz., 678 boys and 647 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of March. In the month of February 1,041 births were registered, or 284 less than in the month under review. The births were 466 above the average of the month during the previous ten years, but only 250 above that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in March numbered 829, viz., 477 of males and 352 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 496, or 60 per cent. The deaths outnumbered those in February by 7, and exceeded the average of March during the previous ten years by 276. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have exceeded that average by 135.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was 3.57, and of deaths registered 2.23.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 93.0° on the 6th, and the lowest was 42.0° on the 28th. The mean temperature of the month (65.0°) was one and a half degrees above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (40.3°) took place on the 28th, viz., from a maximum of 82.3° to a minimum of 42.0°. The least range (8.3°) was on the 15th, viz., from a maximum of 66.4° to a minimum of 58.1°. The mean daily range was 20.5°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.333 inches on the 27th, and the lowest was 29.558 inches on the 25th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.926 inches) was slightly below the average.

Rain fell on 7 days, the amount of rainfall being .785 inch. The average rainfall for the last ten years was 2.80, or about 2 inches above that of the month under notice.

Males contributed 58 per cent., and females 42 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 44 per cent. to that mortality, as against 46 per cent. in March 1886, 41 per cent. in March 1885, 42 per cent. in March 1884, 37 per cent. in March 1883, 43 per cent. in March 1882 and 1881, 47 per cent. in March 1880 and 1879, and 49 per cent. in March 1878 and 1877.

The deaths of persons who had attained or exceeded the age of 75 numbered 34, viz.:—Those of a female, aged 75, who died of senile gangrene; a laborer, aged 75, of heart disease; a plasterer and a female, each aged 75, of paralysis; a bookkeeper, aged 75, 2 gentlemen, aged 76 and 78 respectively, and a female, aged 84, of bronchitis; 2 females, aged 75 and 79 respectively, of pneumonia; a draper, aged 76, and a female, aged 76, of liver disease; a female, aged 76, of internal hæmorrhage; a female, aged 77, of apoplexy;

a carpenter and a female, each aged 77, of cancer; a farmer, aged 78, of nephritis; a female, aged 79, of diarrhoea; a gentleman and a female, each aged 75, a builder, a farmer, and a widow, each aged 76, a tinsmith, aged 77, a female, aged 78, a gardener, a laborer, a printer, and a female, each aged 80, a female, aged 83, a female, aged 84, a cook, aged 87, a female, aged 89, and a female, aged 94, of old age.

Twenty-four deaths were ascribed to external causes during the month, of which 18 were set down to accident, 1 to homicide, and 5 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A boy, aged 15, died of injury to the brain, occasioned by a fall from a lift; a seaman, aged 40, of injuries received through falling down the hold of a ship; a boy, aged 7, of fracture of the skull, caused by a garden roller crushing him whilst playing; a boy, aged 11, of fracture of the skull, an iron pipe rolling upon him; a jockey, aged 24, of injuries received by a horse falling on him; a builder, aged 69, was killed by a derrick falling on him; a carter, aged 22, died of rupture of the liver, and a hatter, aged 51, of rupture of the bladder, caused by being thrown from carts; a financial agent, of fracture of the skull, through being thrown from a buggy; a boy, aged 12, was killed, the wheel of a meat truck passing over him; a clerk, aged 23, was killed in a collision; a solicitor, aged 44, died of fracture of the leg; and a female, aged 45, of fracture of the ribs—how caused not stated. A Chinaman, aged 52, accidentally shot himself with a revolver; a blacksmith, aged 39, died of burns; and a lamp-trimmer, aged 28, a female, aged 35, and a male, of occupation unknown, aged 50, were drowned. The homicidal death was that of a newly-born female infant, who was suffocated. Of the suicidal deaths—a carpenter, aged 26, and a shipwright, aged 61, cut their throats; an engineer, aged 55, and a male, of occupation unknown, aged 65, poisoned themselves, the former with chlorodyne; and a clothing manufacturer, aged 50, drowned himself.

One hundred and twenty-five deaths, or 15 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—43 in the Melbourne Hospital, 29 in the Alfred Hospital, 4 in the Homeopathic Hospital, 6 in the Children's Hospital, 2 in the Women's Hospital, 17 in the Immigrants' Home, 4 in the Benevolent Asylum, 3 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 8 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 2 in the Austin Hospital, 4 in the Melbourne Gaol, 1 in the Infant Asylum, and 2 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 368, of which 218, or 59 per cent., were of males, and 150, or 41 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 272 were under one year of age, 79 were between one and two, 9 were between two and three, 3 were between three and four, and 5 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 461. Of these, 259, or 56 per cent., were males, and 202, or 44 per cent., were females; 11 were between five and ten, 11 were between ten and fifteen, 33 were between fifteen and twenty, 36 were between twenty and twenty-five, 39 were between twenty-five and thirty, 39 were between thirty and thirty-five, 19 were between thirty-five and forty, 28 were between forty and forty-five, 49 were between forty-five and fifty, 32 were between fifty and fifty-five, 44 were between fifty-five and sixty, 30 were between sixty and sixty-five, 39 were between sixty-five and seventy, 17 were between seventy and seventy-five, 23 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 11 were upwards of eighty.

As compared with the experience of the previous month, there was a decrease of 53 in deaths from specific febrile or zymotic diseases. Under this head, deaths from typhoid fever fell from 70 to 59, and those from diarrhoeal diseases from 113 to 78. There was, however, an increase of 16 in deaths from constitutional diseases, and of 42 in deaths from local diseases. Under the constitutional head, deaths from cancer rose from 12 to 26, and those from phthisis from 62 to 88; but deaths from tabes mesenterica fell from 21 to 12, and those from tubercular meningitis from 16 to 5. Under the local head, deaths from brain and nervous diseases rose from 83 to 104, those from heart affections from 36 to 40, and those from lung and chest complaints from 51 to 65. Six deaths of child-bearing women occurred during the month, as against 14 in February. If these numbers be compared with the births registered during those months, it follows that 1 death of a mother took place to every 221 children born alive, as against 1 to every 74 such children in the previous month.

WHEREAS by section 95 of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1885*, No. 778, it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time fix a sum which shall be the minimum amount of rates to be paid annually by any owner or occupier of property liable to be rated by any Waterworks or Irrigation Trust:

And whereas by an Order made by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and bearing date the twenty-ninth day of March 1887, the sum of One pound ten shillings sterling was fixed as the minimum amount of rates to be paid annually by every owner or occupier of any house or tenement liable to be rated by the Echuca Borough Water Trust where the valuation in respect of such house or tenement should not exceed the sum of Twenty pounds sterling per annum:

And whereas it is expedient to revoke the said Order: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby revoke the said Order bearing date the twenty-ninth day of March, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, and in lieu thereof doth hereby order and direct that the sum of One pound ten shillings sterling shall be the minimum amount of rates to be paid by every owner or occupier of any house or tenement liable to be rated by the said Water Trust.

## THE UPPER MACEDON WATERWORKS TRUST.

## REGULATION No. II.

A Regulation of the Upper Macedon Waterworks Trust made under the 44th section of "The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1881" for the imposing, levying, and receiving of rates.

IN pursuance of the powers granted or conferred by section 44 of "The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1881," the Commissioners of the Upper Macedon Waterworks Trust make the following Regulation:—

1. A rate of One shilling in the pound sterling shall be imposed and levied on all the rateable property in the Waterworks District of the Upper Macedon Waterworks Trust according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the Municipal Rate of the Municipal District in which such lands and tenements are situate.

2. All water supplied by the said Trust by measurement shall be charged for at the rate of Two shillings for one thousand gallons, or at such price as shall be specially agreed upon.

#### REGULATION.

THE Commissioners of the Swan Hill Shire Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 20 of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1884*, do make the following Regulation:—

#### No. 5.

*Regulation for making a Rate on the several Lands and Tenements to be supplied otherwise than by measure with Water for Domestic Purposes in the Urban Districts of Kerang and Castle Donnington.*

1. A rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling on the annual value of the several lands and tenements to be supplied with water for domestic purposes in the Urban Districts of Kerang and Castle Donnington, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements comprised within the said urban districts of Kerang and Castle Donnington for the municipal rates of the Shire of Swan Hill, is hereby made for the year commencing on the first day of January 1887 and ending on the 31st day of December 1887.

2. For every house or tenement of Ten pounds annual value or under, the sum of One pound per annum shall be due and payable.

3. Such rate is hereby made payable in two equal instalments, the first of which instalments shall be due and payable on the first day of May 1887, and the second instalment shall be due and payable on the first day of July 1887.

4. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust shall from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rate.

The foregoing Regulation, No. 5, was made by the Commissioners of the Swan Hill Shire Waterworks Trust, under and by virtue of sub-section 4 of section 44 of *The Water Conservation Act 1884*, on the first day of February 1887, and confirmed by the said Commissioners on the first day of March 1887.

#### "THE IRRIGATION ACT 1886."

IN the matter of the Petition of John Wyse and others, being the owners of lands situate within the parishes of Castle Donnington and Tyntynier, in the county of Derbyshire, in the colony of Victoria, praying for the constitution of a certain district comprising the said lands, as an Irrigation and Water Supply district within the meaning of the said *Irrigation Act 1886*, and for the appointment and creation of a Trust for such district.

(b.) A pumping plant to be erected on the banks of the River Murray;

(c.) About nine miles of main channel;

(d.) Minor distributory channels, regulators, bridges, and crossings.

2. That the whole of the works shall be Trust works.

3. That the amount of money which it is proposed that the Board of Land and Works shall advance, by way of loan to the Trust for the purposes of the works thereof as hereinbefore mentioned, is Nine thousand pounds sterling (£9,000).

4. That the rate of interest to be paid by the Trust upon such loan shall be Four pounds ten shillings per centum per annum.

5. That the source of supply will be the River Murray, and that the quantities of water which the Trust is to take therefrom shall be, in summer, that is to say,—from the first day of December to the thirtieth day of June, both days inclusive, fifteen hundred cubic feet per minute; and in winter, that is to say,—from the first day of July to the thirtieth day of November, both days inclusive, nine hundred cubic feet per minute.

6. The powers of rating to be given to the Trust shall not exceed the sum of ten shillings in the £ upon the annual value of the property rated.

**RULES AND REGULATIONS.**

1. All fees and charges shall be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.

2. Any person making a vault, or erecting and placing a monument or tombstone in the cemetery, by and with the permission of the trustees, and upon payment of the proper fees and charges, shall be entitled to have, maintain, and keep such vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the terms of such permission, to and for the sole and separate use of his or her representatives for ever.

3. Application for such permission to be made at the office of the trustees. A certificate of permission will be granted to the party applying for such permission on payment of the proper fees and charges.

4. The fees and charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such cemetery upon an order signed by a justice of the peace, or on a certificate of a minister of religion, or other evidence proving to the satisfaction of the trustees that such person was a pauper, or that his or her friends and relatives are unable to pay the fees and charges.

5. Orders for interment must be given at the office of the trustees during the day previous to that on which it is intended to take place.

6. The name, age, last place of residence, and probable cause of death of deceased, must be stated at the time of giving the order.

7. The time fixed for the funeral to be the time when the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.

8. The hour fixed for the performance of funerals shall be from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. in the months from September to April inclusive, and from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. in the other months of the year.

9. All monuments, vaults, graves, tombstones, and fences, or any other erection, shall be maintained and kept in repair and proper condition by and at the expense of the owners.

10. Every coffin in a vault or bricked grave shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron.

11. The cemetery shall be open daily to the public from sunrise to sunset.

12. A plan of the cemetery, showing the distribution of the land, compartments, situations, and numbers of the graves, and registry of all grants, and certificates of right of burial, shall be kept at the office of the secretary to the trustees, where they may be inspected.

13. The depth of graves or vaults shall not be less than 6 feet, and, in cases of re-opening for additional interment, no coffin to remain less than 4 feet from the surface.

14. All monuments, tombstones, or fences, or any other erection, shrubberies, &c., shall be protected from drainage, and the cemetery shall be maintained in general good order, under the supervision of the trustees.

15. Any person putting up any erection or placing any inscription or epitaph in any part of the cemetery without the permission of the trustees shall be liable to the penalties imposed by the Act for so doing, and to be further dealt with as the law directs, for trespassing.

16. The trustees shall not (except authorized by law) permit the removal of any corpse from any grave for re-interment, either in said or any other cemetery.

17. No smoking shall be allowed within the cemetery, nor any fireworks discharged therein.

18. Any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower, border, or any erection, or otherwise infringing the Act, or any rule, regulation, or bye-law made for protecting the cemetery, shall be prosecuted as the law directs.

19. No dogs shall be allowed to enter the cemetery, and any found there are liable to be destroyed.

20. The trustees reserve the right to make alterations from time to time in the fees and charges, and in these rules and regulations.

Should the Postmaster-General require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedules, the contractor will be bound to supply the same at the contract rate.

2. The supplies are to be according to sample, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. 4. 5. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the Supervisor of Maintenance, General Post Office.

6. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof in writing to the officer rejecting the goods.

9. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of. All articles rejected must be immediately replaced by the contractor, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense deducted as in condition 6.

10. The members of boards of survey will be appointed by the Government, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the survey fees and extra expense (if any) will be charged as in condition 6.

11. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or of a delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the Postmaster-General may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in condition 6, or from the contractor's security. 5. Every tender must be accompanied by cash, marked cheque, bank draft, or a bank deposit-receipt to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General for a sum equal to TEN PER CENT. of the annual amount named in the tender; this deposit to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government within ten days of being notified that the documents are ready for execution. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient.

6. The money or other security deposited by successful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, on the bond and contract being duly signed.

8. 9.
