And whereas the Governor in Council by an Order dated the 18th day of December 1886, diminished the extent of the said Wimmera United Waterworks District by excising therefrom the territory described above as the Shire of Wimmera division. The following rate is made on the annual value of all the rateable property in the said several divisions of the Wimmera United Waterworks District, excepting in the said parishes of Hindmarsh, Joop, Jeparit, Batyik, Tarranyurk, Willensbrina, Yellangip, Katyil, and Dimboola, and in the said Urban Districts of Murtoa and Warracknabeal, according to the valuation for the time being on all such lands and tenements for the municipal rates of the Shires of St. Arnaud, Kara Kara, Dunmunkle,

Stawell, and Dimboola respectively, that is to say—on rateable property within the Shire of St. Arnaud division, a rate of Seven pence in the pound sterling of such valuation on rateable property; in the Shire of Kara Kara division, a rate of Fifteen pence in the pound sterling of such valuation; in the Shire of Dunmunkle division, a rate of Fourteen pence in the pound sterling of such valuation; in the Shire of Dimboola A division, a rate of Twenty-four pence in the pound sterling of such valuation; and in the Shire of Dimboola A division, a rate of Twenty-four pence in the pound sterling of such valuation.

WHEREAS by section 123 of "The Irrigation Act 1886" it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, from time to time, subject to the provisions of the said Act, make, alter, repeal, or amend regulations for the purpose of regulating the mode and terms of any grant of any lease or license under Part IX. of the said Act, or the exercise of any other of the powers or duties conferred or imposed by the said part of the said Act upon the Governor or the Minister by and generally for any of the purposes of the said part of the said Act, or for the imposing of penalties for any breach of any regulations authorized by the said section, such penalties not to exceed for any offence the sum of Five pounds: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth, in excresse of the authority conferred by the said section of the said Act, and for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of Part IX. of the said Act, make the regulations following, that is to say:—

Repeal of previous regulations.—These regulations are in substitution of existing regulations, and all existing regulations in reference to the matters herein, except as to acts done under them and rights conferred, are hereby repealed.

Interpretation of terms.—"Governor in Council" shall mean the Governor acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council.

"Minister" shall mean the responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being administering "The Irrigation Act 1886."

"The Act" or "the said Act" shall mean "The Irrigation Act 1886."

"Trust" shall mean any waterworks trust, water supply trust, irrigation trust, or irrigation and water supply trust.

"Applicant" or "intending applicant" shall respectively mean any person or body corporate applying for, or intending to apply for, any lease or license under these regulations. Words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed to include females, and the singular to include the plural, unless the contrary as to number or gender is expressly provided.

Computation of time.—In all cases in which any particular number of days is prescribed in these regulations, the same shall be reekoned exclusively of the last day, unless the last day shall fall upon a Sunday or holiday, in which case the time shall be reckoned exclusively of that day also.


