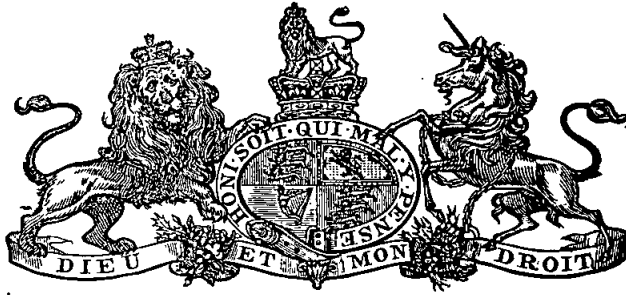

"THE PUBLIC SERVICE ACT 1883."—REGULATIONS.
 CLASSIFICATION OF PROFESSIONAL DIVISION.
 Act No. 773, Section 41, and Sub-section I.

WHEREAS by *The Public Service Act 1883*, section 12, it is enacted that the Professional Division of the Public Service shall include all persons holding those offices, whether now existing or hereafter to be created, which require for their exercise some skill usually acquired only in some profession or other pursuit different from that required in the Clerical or Non-Clerical Division; and also the persons holding the offices of Inspector-General, Assistant Inspector-General, and Inspectors in the Education Department as existing at the time of the passing of the said Act, or thereafter to be created: And whereas by section 17 of the said Act it is enacted that the officers in the Professional Division shall be paid such salaries in accordance with a fixed amount or scale to be determined by Regulation, and as may be provided in the Annual Appropriation Act: And whereas by section 22 of the said Act it is enacted that the Public Service Board shall classify the work performed by all persons employed in offices doing professional work in accordance with regulations to be made by them in that behalf, and that such persons shall thereupon be placed in the Professional Division in the respective classes assigned to the work performed by them: And whereas by section 41 of the said Act it is enacted that the Public Service Board shall make Regulations which shall have full force and effect as soon as approved by the Governor in Council and may, subject to such approval, from time to time repeal, alter, and amend the same:—For the arrangement of the Professional Division into as many classes as the Public Service Board consider expedient or desirable, and for the determination of the order of promotion therein and of the amount to be paid to each of the persons in each of such classes which, in the opinion of the Public Service Board, will be a fair equivalent for the work to be performed by such persons: And whereas the Public Service Board did make Regulations for such purposes, which Regulations were, on the 12th January 1885, approved by the Governor in Council: And whereas the said Regulations were from time to time amended by further Regulations made by the said Public Service Board and approved by the Governor in Council: And whereas it is expedient to alter and amend the said Regulations: Now we, the undersigned, being the Members constituting the Public Service Board, in pursuance of the said powers, do make and declare the following alterations and amendments of the said Regulations, and declare that the same shall commence and come into operation as soon as approved by the Governor in Council as aforesaid:—

ORDER OF THE COUNCIL OF THE SHIRE OF SEYMOUR MADE THE FIRST DAY OF FEBRUARY ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-SEVEN.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by sections 365 and 366 of *The Local Government Act 1874*, the Shire of Seymour do hereby order that the land hereinafter described shall be a public highway from and after the publication hereof in the *Government Gazette*:—

All that piece or parcel of land situate in the parish of Avenel, in the county of Anglesey, in the colony of Victoria, containing one acre and thirty-eight perches, being portion of allotment one, of section C, of the said parish of Avenel, bounded as follows:— Commencing at the south-west corner of allotment one aforesaid; thence for eleven chains by the east side of the one-chain road separating allotments one and six of section C, of parish of Avenel, bearing north to Hughes' Creek; thence north-easterly by Hughes' Creek for three chains eighty links; thence for two chains thirty links by a line bearing south thirty-two degrees fifty-six minutes west; thence for eleven chains thirty-nine links by a line bearing south to a road one chain wide; thence for one chain by aforesaid road bearing west to the point of commencement.

And the said Council do hereby declare that such land shall, from the date of publication, be a public highway in lieu of: All that piece or parcel of land situate in the parish of Avenel aforesaid, containing one acre and sixteen perches, being part of the one-chain road separating allotment four from allotment seven of section C of the said parish, bounded as follows:— Commencing at the south-east angle of allotment four; thence for twelve chains by allotment four bearing north to Hughes' Creek; thence south-easterly by Hughes' Creek to allotment seven; thence for ten chains by allotment seven bearing south to a one-chain road; thence for one chain by the aforesaid one-chain road bearing west to the point of commencement.

"THE FACTORIES AND SHOPS ACT 1885."

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the 29th section of *The Factories and Shops Act 1885* (40 Vict. No. 862), and after due inquiry, I, the Chief Secretary of Victoria, being the responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being administering the said Act, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of the said section 29 in the

SPINNING AND WEAVING MILL OF MESSRS. JAMES MILLER AND COMPANY, MELBOURNE,

for a further period of one month from the 1st June 1887, upon these express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said mill any female or any male under the age of sixteen for more than fifty-four hours in any one week, or more than ten hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That no such female or male under the age of sixteen shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without her or his consent.
3. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such mill for the information of all concerned.

TREATMENT OF CARCASSES OF TUBERCULOUS CATTLE.

THE Central Board of Health has agreed to the following rules for the guidance of its inspectors in dealing with the carcasses of tuberculous cattle:—

- I. Condemn all wasted animals in which even a moderate amount of tubercle is found.
- II. Condemn all animals, no matter what their condition—(a) when tubercles are found in several organs, whether softened or unsoftened, especially if both the chest and the abdomen are affected; (b) when large masses of tubercle in an advanced stage of softening are found even in one organ.
- III. Do not condemn well-nourished animals on account of the presence of tubercles on the serous membrane only, provided that all traces of the disease can be readily and completely removed.
- IV. Condemned carcasses should be destroyed by fire, or where that is impracticable, sprinkled freely with gas-tar, and buried at a depth of not less than two feet.

GULF OF CARPENTARIA.

Leading Lights, Entrance to Norman River.

NOTICE is hereby given that after this date the following Leading Lights will be exhibited at the entrance to the Norman River. These, in conjunction with the Lightship, lead across the Bar and up to Kimberley.

Two lights, the nearer being red and 10 feet above high-water mark, and the back light white and 30 feet above high-water mark, are placed on the bank to the westward of the Elbow Bank. They are 900 yards apart, N.E. by E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. easterly and S.W. by W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W. westerly, and the front light stands on the edge of the bank. These in line lead just to the southward of the Bar Buoy, and up the channel as far as the Elbow Bank.

Two similar lights, the same distance apart, but having the back light 50 feet above high-water mark, are placed on shore at Kimberley on a line bearing E. by S. $\frac{1}{2}$ S. and W. by N. $\frac{1}{2}$ N., and lead from the Elbow Bank up to the sandy beach on the western shore of the river.

Directions.—Vessels intending to enter the river by night should pass about $\frac{1}{2}$ a cable west of the Lightship, and then steer S.E. by E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E., bringing the two leading lights which are placed above the Elbow Bank in line on a N.E. by E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. easterly bearing. These lights should be kept in this position until the leading lights at Kimberley are in line, when the latter should similarly be kept in line until abreast Alligator Point, whence a mid-channel course may be kept up the river.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1884* power is given to the Governor in Council from time to time to make, alter, and rescind rules, regulations, and orders for the various purposes therein specified: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council in exercise of the powers conferred by the above recited Act, and of every other power enabling him in that behalf, orders as follows (that is to say):—

1. Repeal.—The regulations of the Governor in Council bearing date the seventeenth day of March One thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, so far as relates to residence licenses in State Forests, shall be, and the same are hereby rescinded, except as to acts, matters, and things made, done, or commenced thereunder.

STATE FORESTS AND TIMBER RESERVES, SECTIONS 87, 89, 93.

Residence Licenses.

1. There may be issued licenses to occupy sites for residence purposes at an annual fee of Ten shillings. The area of each site shall not exceed one acre.

2. Every such application shall be in the form prescribed in Schedule A hereto, and shall be accompanied by a plan.

3. Residence license shall be in the form prescribed in Schedule B hereto.

4. Upon the expiration of any license for a residence area, a new license may be issued for the same land to the holder of the expired license upon the same or such other terms and conditions as may be deemed necessary, and the District Receiver of Revenue may be authorized to endorse on the back of the expired license a notification in the form of Schedule C hereto, and such endorsement shall have to all intents and purposes the effect of a license.

5. The charge for survey of every residence area shall be One pound ten shillings.

- If in the opinion of the Minister the land in respect of which this license is issued, or any part thereof, be required for railways, roads, telegraph lines, dams, reservoirs, races, catch-water drains, pipe tracks, stone quarries, or any other public purpose, the Governor, upon payment to the licensee of such compensation (if any) as the Minister may think fit, may, at any time during the currency of the license, resume the whole or any part of such land, and thereupon the license shall cease as to such land or the part resumed.
- Any person may at any time, with the written permission of the Minister, enter for the purpose of mining and mine for gold, silver, tin, copper, iron, or the ores thereof, or for auriferous earth, or for coal or lignite, upon the land in respect of which this license is issued or such part thereof as the Minister may by such writing allow, making such compensation to the licensee for the improvements (if any) effected thereon, and for the license and other fees paid in respect thereof as may be agreed upon between him and such licensee, or, in the event of a disagreement, as may be determined by the arbitration of three different persons, or any two of them, one arbitrator to be appointed by the licensee, one by the Minister, and one by the person to whom the permission to mine has been granted, the form of submission to arbitration to be determined by the Governor in Council in case of any differences; and if the licensee obstruct any such person so entering or mining as aforesaid the Governor may revoke his license.
- In case the licensee obstruct any holder of a miner's right so entering or mining as aforesaid, this license may be revoked.
- The publication of a notice in the *Government Gazette* purporting to declare that the Governor has annulled or revoked this license shall be conclusive evidence that the license was annulled or revoked.

HEYWOOD TOWN COMMON.—NEW REGULATIONS.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations for the management of the Heywood Town Common being substituted for those heretofore in force in respect of such common.

In pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons made by the Governor in Council on the 17th March 1885, the Managers of

the Heywood Town Common, having drafted the following Regulations for management thereof, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approval by the Governor in Council, in lieu of the Regulations heretofore in force in respect of such Common.

Regulations.

1. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licenses, or carriers' licenses, and farmers residing within five (5) miles of the common may respectively depasture thereon four (4) head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one (1) head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three (3) head of small cattle.

2. The fees for depasturing stock on the common shall be as follow, and shall be payable quarterly in advance, on the 1st January, 1st April, 1st July, and 1st October in every year:—

For every horse	... Twelve (12s.) shillings per annum.
For every head of other large cattle	... Eight (8s.) shillings per annum.
For every head of small cattle	... Four (4s.) shillings per annum.

3. No person shall depasture on the common stock of which he is not the *bond fide* owner.

4. Persons desiring to depasture stock on the common shall, after payment to the managers of the prescribed fees, deliver the stock to the herdsman, to whom the receipts for such fees shall be produced, if required.

5. Sheep and goats shall be depastured on such portions only of the common as the managers may set apart for the purpose.

6. All stock remaining on the common eight (8) days after the period for which payment has been made shall be liable to be impounded.

7. All persons desiring to remove stock from the common shall give the managers two (2) days' notice thereof in writing.

8. No person shall be allowed to remove stock from the common without first applying to the managers, to whom a receipt shall be given for the stock removed.

9. The herdsman shall, if required, muster the stock on the common on the expiration of every quarter.

10. The managers shall not be responsible for the loss of, or injury to, any stock placed on the common.

11. No animal affected with any contagious disease shall be allowed to depasture on the common; and if any of the stock thereon become so affected and be not removed within twenty-four (24) hours after notice thereof in writing has been given to the owners by the managers or the herdsman, the diseased stock shall be liable to be destroyed at the owner's risk and expense.

12. No bull or entire horse over the age of six (6) months shall be allowed to depasture on the common without the consent in writing of the managers.

13. No pigs shall be allowed to depasture on the common.

14. All stock depasturing on the common shall be branded with the common brand, H.Y.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing Regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20) for each offence.

VERMIN DISTRICTS.—ANNUAL RATES.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Mallee Pastoral Leases Act 1883* it was amongst other things enacted that the Local Committee should within thirty days from its appointment, and thereafter in the month of January in each and every year, recommend to the Governor an annual rate or assessment, specifying the amount thereof to be paid by the owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within its vermin district, in respect of each square mile of land owned, held under lease, or occupied under the provisions of the said Act; and also in respect of the sheep or cattle depasturing thereon: And whereas it was further enacted that such rate or assessment, on being proclaimed by the Governor in Council in the *Government Gazette*, should be the rate payable by the owners, lessees, and occupiers of land within the vermin district for the current year for the purposes of the said Act, and should be paid to the Minister at the same time as the rent payable by such lessees and occupiers: And whereas the Local Committees duly appointed for the undermentioned vermin districts have recommended the rates hereunder specified per square mile upon all lands within the boundaries of the said vermin districts: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the undermentioned annual rates per square mile to be the rates payable by the owners, lessees, and occupiers of lands within the said vermin districts for the current year, that is to say—

Within the boundaries of the Eastern Vermin District—Ten shillings per square mile, or fractional part thereof, on all hold-

ings not exceeding twenty square miles in extent; and Two shillings and sixpence on the area of any one holding over and above the first twenty miles.

Within the boundaries of the Middle Vermin District—Eleven shillings.

Within the boundaries of the Northern Vermin District—Two shillings.

Within the boundaries of the North-Eastern Vermin District—Three shillings.

Within the boundaries of the North-Western Vermin District—Two shillings and sixpence.

Within the boundaries of the Warracknabeal Vermin District—Eight shillings.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this eighteenth day of February, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, and in the fiftieth year of Her Majesty's reign.

As to "the prevention of the burial of night-soil within the boundaries of any township within the Shire of St. Arnaud."

THE Local Board of Health in and for the Shire of St. Arnaud, in the Colony of Victoria, being the municipal council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in "The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883," and every other power enabling the said Local Board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said Local Board, doth hereby make the following bye-law, No. 2, of said Local Board of Health, that is to say:—

1. This bye-law shall be read and be taken with bye-law No. 1 of the said Local Board.

2. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This bye-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the townships within the boundaries of the said Local Board's district, viz., the Shire of St. Arnaud.

4. All night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse shall be conveyed to the manure depot in the night-cart provided by the Local Board, or in a cart of the same kind; and no night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse shall be allowed to be removed and buried within the boundaries of any township within the said Board's district other than in the manure depot so provided.

5. Every person guilty of a breach of this bye-law or of any of its provisions shall be liable, in the discretion of the convicting justices, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings, or in the like discretion to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

As to "Dairies, Dairy Cattle, and Milk."

THE Local Board of Health in and for the Shire of St. Arnaud, in the Colony of Victoria, being the municipal council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in "The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883," and every other power enabling the said Local Board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said Local Board, doth hereby make the following Bye-law, No. 3, of the said Local Board of Health, that is to say:—

1. All former bye-laws on the matters and things herein provided for are hereby repealed.

2. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This bye-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the district of the said Local Board, viz., the Shire of St. Arnaud.

Registration of Cowkeepers, Dairymen, and Purveyors of Milk.

4. Every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall, on the first day of June in every year, register himself with the Local Board of Health in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the Secretary of the Local Board of Health an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall with every such application pay a fee of Five shillings (5s.).

5. Upon receipt of every such application and fee the secretary of the Local Board of Health shall endorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received, and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

6. All paddocks, grounds, lands, and enclosures used as grazing ground for dairy cattle shall, whenever necessary, be inspected by any member or officer of the said local board, or by any person authorized in writing by the chairman or secretary of the said local board, and if on inspection of such paddocks, grounds, or enclosures, or any one of them are or is likely, in the opinion of the officer or person so inspecting, to be prejudicial to health by affecting the milk or otherwise, the said local board may, by an order in writing signed by the secretary, and served personally or left at the dwelling-house of the registered person, or, in the case of an unregistered person, served personally or left at his dwelling-place or posted upon the land, prohibit the use of the same for the purpose of feeding dairy cattle either absolutely or for any time named in such order. All cattle in dairies shall also be similarly inspected by a veterinary surgeon or other competent person, and any cows found to be diseased or which from poverty or weakness are, in the opinion of the inspector, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, shall be forthwith removed from such dairy if ordered by such inspector or other officer as aforesaid; and any such order as aforesaid the said local board may revoke, but upon every fresh inspection a similar order may from time to time be made.

7. All houses, dairies, cowsheds, milk stores, milk shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not, shall be kept in such a state, in respect of cleanliness, as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated, and the drainage of all such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous

to any premises of such person following the trade of a cow-keeper or dairyman, whether registered or not.

8. All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows shall be regularly swept and be kept perfectly clean, and shall, within twenty-four hours of any order to such effect from the health officer or inspector of nuisances, be fumigated, disinfected, or lime-washed as may be in any such order so directed.

9. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily.

10. If any person or any member of the family of any person registered as aforesaid or not so registered, but employed as a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor or member of the family of any visitor to any such person, shall be affected by typhoid fever, or any dangerous infectious disease, the occupier of the house in which such person shall be, or (if he be the person attacked) his wife or other person in charge shall immediately give notice thereof to the Local Board or officer of health, or to the nearest member of the police force who shall immediately inform the Local Board of Health; and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said local board or the officer of health, by order served as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of any such cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk until danger, in the opinion of such Local Board or officer of health, no longer exists. And in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering, or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering, to milk cows or to handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business. Nor, if the person registered or conducting such business be himself the person suffering, shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until, in either case, all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk or of its contamination has ceased.

11. If at any time disease exists in the dairy or among the cows or cattle in any cowshed or dairy, or in the herds of any cowkeeper, dairyman, vendor or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the local board, officer of health, or nearest member of the police force, and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.

12. No cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep, or permit or suffer to be kept, any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking-yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.

13. In the interpretation of this bye-law words imputing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural and the plural the singular, and the word "person" shall include a corporation.

14. Every person guilty of any breach of this bye-law, or any of its provisions, shall be liable, in the discretion of the convicting justices, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings, or in the like discretion to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

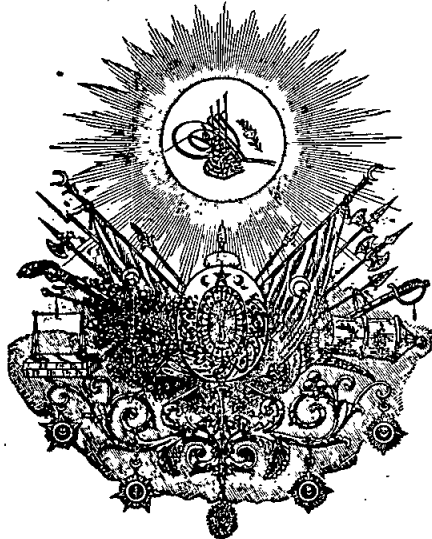
