

## BAR OF MANAWATU RIVER, WEST COAST OF NORTH ISLAND, NEW ZEALAND.

## MURDER.

### ONE HUNDRED POUNDS REWARD.—FREE PARDON TO AN ACCOMPLICE.

**W**HEREAS on Monday the 2nd May ultimo Mrs. Jane Beedham died suddenly at her residence, the Waterloo Hotel, Little Collins street west: And whereas at an inquest a verdict was returned that deceased died from the effects of abortion criminally procured by some person or persons unknown, and that the said person or persons unknown were guilty of the wilful murder of the deceased: Notice is hereby given that a reward of One hundred pounds will be paid by the Government for such information as will lead to the conviction of the person or persons who operated on Mrs. Beedham, whereby the abortion resulted. The Governor will also extend Her Majesty's free pardon to any person concerned in the murder who may give the required information, provided such informant was not actually the principal who performed the operation which caused the abortion.

# PROPOSED REVOCATION OF THE TEMPORARY RESERVATION OF LANDS.
