Note.—The apparent increase of population—or that obtained by adding the excess of registered births over registered deaths to the excess of recorded arrivals over recorded departures—in the first half of 1887 was 19,516, as against 17,884 in the first half of 1886. An estimate, however, has been made for unrecorded departures during the first two quarters of the present year, amounting in the aggregate to 3,453, viz., 2,723 of males and 730 of females, whereby the apparent increase in the first half of 1887 is reduced to 16,063.

The allowance made for supposed unrecorded departures during the whole period since the census of 1881 was taken has been 33,453, viz., 26,723 of males and 6,730 of females, and the apparent population has been reduced by these numbers. Had no reduction been made in the estimate, the population would apparently now have amounted to 1,052,559, viz., 567,677 males and 484,882 females.

The stream of immigration to Victoria from the adjacent colonies appears to have received a check, since, during the quarter under review, the arrivals from New South Wales exceeded the departures therefor by only 9, as against 1,916 in the previous quarter, and the arrivals from South Australia exceeded the departures therefor by only 645, as against 2,573 in the previous quarter.

the previous quarter.

An estimate of the population of New South Wales has recently been issued by the Registrar-General of that colony, the numbers being 1,055,050, viz., 592,207 males and 462,783 females. In this estimate no reduction has been made for unrecorded departures, which, between the date of the census of 1881 and the end of 1886, are estimated by the Government Statistician to have amounted to 26,935, and probably now amount to 32,300. Comparing the numbers as they stand with the apparent population of Victoria (unreduced), the excess in favor of New South Wales is found to be 2,491, the males in New South Wales exceeding those in Victoria by 24,590, the females in Victoria exceeding those in New South Wales by 22,099.

In both colonies no account is or can be taken of the overland

In both colonies no account is or can be taken of the overland migration of the population, and the population estimates are based upon the assumption that the numbers going from and coming to each colony over its borders are equal.

No. 1.—REGULATIONS AS TO ORDINARY AND SPECIAL MEETINGS.

- 1. Ordinary meetings.—The ordinary meetings of the commissioners shall be held at Horsham on the first Wodnesday in each month, at the hour of Four o'clock in the afternoon, and such meetings may be adjourned from time to time if the commissioners see fit.
- 2. - 13. Nature of motion to be stated.—Any commissioner desirons of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the Trust thereon.

A SUM not exceeding One hundred and fifty pounds may be paid to any person or company who shall, in the opinion of the Minister of Agriculture, produce a machine capable of thrashing within twelve hours eight hundred bushels of pease without injury thereto.

- The reward shall be paid only to the inventor, or his agent, of such machine as shall most cheaply, efficiently, and rapidly perform the work required, and within the time aforesaid.

BYE-LAW No. 2.

For keeping free from noisome matter yards, stables, and places used for nozious trades, slaughter-yards, &c.; and for regulating management of enth-closets, prives, &c., disinfecting and developing night-soil and other offensive matter, and for regulating its removal and final deposit.

its removal and final deposit.

THE Local Board of Health in and for the Shire of Berwick, in the Colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in The Public Health Amendment Statute 1833, and every other power enabling the said Local Board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Local Board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Local Board, doth hereby make the following Bye-law No. 2 of the said Local Board of Health, that is to say:—

- 1. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the Government Gazette.
- 2. This bye-law shall apply to, and have operation in, the whole of the Shire of Berwick.
- 3. The occupier of every house and premises within the said Shire of Berwick shall cause the yard and ground belonging thereto, or occupied in connection therewith, to be kept so as not to be a muisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all filth, rubbish, and refuse matter to be from time to time removed from such yard and ground. And if at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such filth, rubbish, or refuse matter so removed as aforesaid, the Local Board may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier.
- same to be removed at the expense of such occupier.

  4. The occupier of any land in the said shire, on which there shall be erected any stable, cow-yard, cattle-shed, or pig-sty, shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state, in respect of cleanliness, as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all soil, dung, or other manure produced or accumulated therein to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of the same so produced or accumulated shall amount to three cubic yards. And if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect or fail to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid, the same shall be removed by the Local Board at the expense of such occupier.

  5. The occupier of every house building, or tenement within

The occupier of every house, building, or tenement within the said Shire of Berwick shall cause every cosspool already in existence, and until its abolition, to be emptied and cleansed from time to time as soon as any portion of the contents of such esspool shall have so accumulated therein as to be within a distance of one foot from the top of the sides, walls, or lining of such esspool. Provided that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom except between the hours of Eleven p.m. and Five a.m. And provided also that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom until such contents shall have had mixed therewith carbolic acid or some other efficient deodorizer sufficient in quality and quantity to effectually deodorize and disinfect the same.

  6. Every occupier and every nerson having the management.

- 6. Every occupier and every person having the management and control of any premises shall, once at least in every week, empty and cleanse, or cause to be emptied and cleansed, every earth-closet, privy, and place in the nature of an earth-closet for the reception of night-soil on or belonging to such premises.
- 7. No person shall empty any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the reception of night-soil except by means of a cart, carriage, or means of conveyance properly constructed and furnished with a sufficient covering so as to prevent the escape of the contents or any portion thereof, or of effluvia therefrom.
- 8. All night-soil, blood, offal, or other offensive matter or thing shall be removed to and deposited in such place or places only as may be appointed by the Local Board from time to time for the final reception of same.

- 9. Every person placing or depositing, or causing or suffering to be placed or deposited or spread, or assisting in placing or depositing or spreading on any land, whether by way of manure or otherwise, any night-soil, offal, blood, or other reinse matter removed from any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or other place, shall immediately on the deposit or spreading thereof cover the same, or cause the same to be covered, and shall keep the same covered, with a layer of earth not less than six inches in thickness.
- ness.

  10. The occupier of any premises within the said shire used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, process, or manufacture whatever, or used for the purpose of slaughtering, whether it be any abattoir or otherwise, shall cause any rubbish, blood, offal, bones, water, liquid, soil, or other offensive matter produced or accumulated thereon to be removed therefrom once in every twenty-four hours, and to be in the meantine kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, or to exhale any offensive effluvia. And if any such occupier shall neglector fail to have removed therefrom any offensive matter whatever, it may be removed by the said Local Board at the expense of such occupier.
- 11. Every closet-pan shall be constructed of galvanized iron, properly riveted and oldered so as to be water-tight, and with handles thereto, and of a capacity not exceeding three cubic feet.
- 12. No closet door or trap shall abut or open on a street, lane, or right-of-way exceeding fifteen feet in width.
- lane, or right-of-way exceeding fifteen feet in width.

  13. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty of Five pounds for every such breach, or of Two pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties, such penalty not being less than Five shillings, to be paid. And any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty, notwithstanding that the Local Board of Health may be empowered by this bye-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such Local Board has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

# PUBLIC HEALTH.—CITY OF MELBOURNE.

Bye-law No. 91. For regulating the management of earth-closets and the deodoriza-tion of the night-soil contained therein, being of the Local Board of Health Bye-law No. 5 (47 Vict. No. 782, sections 20-29).

THE Mayor, Aldermen, and Councillors of the Council of the City of Melbourne, acting as and being the Local Board of Health of the said city, under and by virtue of The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883, make the Bye-law following, viz.:—

- 1. Closets to be rentilated.—The owner of every house or premises within the said city in or upon which any earth-closet is, shall cause the same to be so constructed and ventilated as not to become a nuisance.
- Decolorant to be kept.—The occupier of every house or premises as aforesaid shall at all times keep or cause to be kept in every earth-closet a sufficient supply of dry powdered earth or other efficient deedorizing material, so that the contents of such closet may be thereby kept completely deodorized.
- 3. Person using closet to use decolorant.—Every person using any earth-closet shall completely cover the excrement immediately upon its deposit with such a quantity of the decolorizing material provided in the closet as shall thoroughly and efficiently decolorize the same.
- 4. Penalty.—Every person who shall commit a breach of this bye-law shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings, and to a further penalty not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

This bye-law was made and passed by the Local Board of Health of the City of Melbourne, which is the Council of the said city, at the meeting of the said Council of the 23rd day of May 1887.
