The births of 1,042 children, viz., 548 boys and 494 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of December 1886. In the month of November 1,134 births were registered, or 92 more than in the month under review. The births were 299 above the average of the month during the previous ten years, but only 140 above that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in December numbered 766, viz., 425 of males and 341 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 276, or 36 per cent. The deaths outnumbered those in November by 101, and exceeded the average of December during the previous ten years by 206. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have only exceeded that average by 86.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was 3.02, and of deaths registered 2.22.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 96.8° on the 26th, and the lowest was 46.7° on the 22nd. The mean temperature of the month (63.4°) was six-tenths of a degree above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (37.7°) took place on the 26th, viz., from a maximum of 96.8° to a minimum of 59.1°. The least range (4.3°) was on the 4th, viz., from a maximum of 59.0° to a minimum of 54.7°. The mean daily range was 19.0°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.228 inches on the 21st, and the lowest was 29.527 inches on the 27th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.889 inches) was slightly above the average.

Rain fell on 10 days, the amount of rainfall being 3.54 inches, or rather more than 3½ inches. The average rainfall in December during the last ten years was 1.85 inch, or 1.69 inch less than that in the month under notice.

Males contributed 53 per cent., and females 45 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 50 per cent. to that mortality, as against 53 per cent. in December 1885, 46 per cent. in December 1884 and in December 1883, 48 per cent. in December 1882, 51 per cent. in December 1881, 42 per cent. in December 1880, 46 per cent. in December 1879, 48 per cent. in December 1878, 50 per cent. in December 1877, and 46 per cent. in December 1876.

The deaths of 23 persons who had attained or exceeded the age of 75 years were recorded during the month, viz.:—Those of a farmer, aged 76, a female, aged 80, a female, aged 82, and a female, aged 84, who died of diarrhoea; a gentleman, aged 77, of exhaustion from disease of the bladder; a contractor, aged 78, and a female, aged 83, of heart disease; a pianoforte maker, aged 78, of bedsores; a female, aged 79, of organic disease of the stomach; a laborer, aged 80, of bronchitis; a female, aged 84, of paralysis; a stonemason, aged 85, of injury to the hip, resulting from a fall; a gentleman, aged 86, of syncope; and a laborer and a female, each aged 78, a rag sorter (an inmate of the Immigrants' Home), aged 82, a male, of no occupation, and a female, each aged 83, a schoolmaster (an inmate of the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor), aged 86, a female, aged 85, a miner and a female domestic servant (inmates of the Benevolent Asylum), aged respectively 87 and 88, and a female, aged 91, of old age.

Forty-seven deaths were ascribed to external causes during the month, of which 39 were set down to accident or negligence, 4 to homicide, and 4 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A male child, aged 1, and a female child, aged 5, died of fractures of the skull, caused by being passed over by carts; a female, aged 45, was passed over by a train; a

boy, aged 11, was killed by being thrown out of a cart; a laborer, aged 24, by being thrown from a horse; a carter, aged 40, died of fracture of the ribs and other injuries resulting from a kick from a horse; a printer, aged 22, of injury to the spine, a male, of occupation unknown, aged 54, of effusion of blood on the brain, a female, aged 73, of fracture of the legs, and a stonemason, aged 85, of injury to the hip—occasionally by falls; a laborer, aged 47, was crushed between a truck and a railway platform, and a laborer, aged 48, died of fracture of the ribs and laceration of the lungs, sustained whilst working on a wharf. A male infant, aged 9 months, and a female, aged 19, died of burns, the latter caused by her clothes catching fire whilst cooking; a male child, aged 3, of scalds; and a printer, aged 17, of sunstroke. A female infant, aged 1, and a female child, aged 3, were drowned in waterholes; a blacksmith and a laborer, each aged 21, were drowned whilst bathing; a waiter, aged 33, was drowned in a bath; two boys, each aged 11, a boy, aged 14, a carpenter, aged 52, and a gentleman and a publican, each aged 55, were drowned in the River Yarra. A boy, aged 10, and a laborer, aged 45, were found drowned in waterholes; a clerk, aged 29, and a male, of occupation unknown, aged 30, were found drowned on Brighton beach; a female, aged 32, was found drowned in Hegarty's Baths, St. Kilda; and a clerk, aged 36, was found drowned in the River Yarra. Four male infants, aged 6 and 9 days, and 4 and 5 months respectively, were suffocated, probably in bed; a girl, aged 15, was suffocated by the inhalation of gas; and a female, aged 50, died of shock after an operation for the removal of an ovarian tumor. Of the homicidal deaths, 2 female infants were destroyed at birth, 1 by suffocation, and the other by fracture of the skull; a male infant, aged 2 months, died of cold and exposure; and a male child, aged 1, had his throat cut by his mother. The suicidal deaths were those of a female, aged 25, and a female, aged 51, who cut their throats whilst of a miller, aged 36, who poisoned himself with carbolic acid; and of a carpenter, aged 38, who hanged himself.

One hundred and twenty-four deaths, or 16 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—56 in the Melbourne Hospital, 20 in the Alfred Hospital, 1 in the Homeopathic Hospital, 3 in the Children's Hospital, 11 in the Women's Hospital, 10 in the Immigrants' Home, 4 in the Benevolent Asylum, 4 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 2 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 4 in the Austin Hospital, 4 in the Melbourne Gaol, 3 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor, and 2 in the Protestant Refuge.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 384, of which 207, or 54 per cent., were of males, and 177, or 46 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 319 were under one year of age, 48 were between one and two, 5 were between two and three, 8 were between three and four, and 4 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 352. Of these, 218, or 57 per cent., were males, and 164, or 43 per cent., were females; 16 were between five and ten, 13 were between ten and fifteen, 16 were between fifteen and twenty, 26 were between twenty and twenty-five, 34 were between twenty-five and thirty, 40 were between thirty and thirty-five, 31 were between thirty-five and forty, 17 were between forty and forty-five, 24 were between forty-five and fifty, 43 were between fifty and fifty-five, 27 were between fifty-five and sixty, 27 were between sixty and sixty-five, 26 were between sixty-five and seventy, 19 were between seventy and seventy-five, 7 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 16 were upwards of eighty.

As compared with the experience of the previous month, deaths from specific febrile or zymotic diseases increased from 137 to 185. Under this head, deaths from typhoid fever rose from 1 to 26, those from whooping-cough from 5 to 10, and those from diarrheal diseases (which are usually present at the setting in of the hot weather) from 111 to 130. Only 3 deaths took place during the month among childbearing women, or 1 death of a mother to every 347 children born alive, a proportion much below the average.

KYNETON SHIRE WATERWORKS TRUST.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined regulation, made in pursuance of the provisions of *The Victorian Water Conservation Acts Nos. 716, 773, and 829.*

REGULATION NO. V.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Kyneton Shire Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an urban district, for the purposes of the *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1883*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by *The Victorian Water Conservation Acts 1881, 1883, and 1884*, make the regulation following:—

A rate of One shilling in the pound sterling shall be imposed and levied on all the rateable property in the waterworks district of the Kyneton Shire Waterworks Trust liable in respect of rates levied by the said Trust according to the valuation for the time being of such rateable property for the municipal rate of the municipal district in which such rateable property is situate, for one year commencing on the first day of January One thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, and ending on the thirty-first day of December One thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven. Such rate shall be payable and collected in two equal portions or instalments, and the first instalment shall be due and payable on the first day of January One thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, and the second instalment on the first day of July One thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven. Such persons as the Commissioners of the Kyneton Shire Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rate.

GRANT TO AGRICULTURAL SOCIETIES.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations in connection with the above-named Grant-in-aid, 1886-7, viz. :—

AGRICULTURAL SOCIETIES.

Regulations for the distribution of the sum of Twenty thousand pounds (£20,000) granted by Parliament to Agricultural Societies, 1886-7.

1. That a sum of Sixteen hundred and seventy-nine pounds seven shillings be paid to agricultural societies, in accordance with the provisions of Clause 2 of Regulations gazetted 31st December 1885.

2. Each society shall furnish to the Secretary for Agriculture, on or before the 1st February 1887, a statement in the form marked A, which must be verified by statutory declaration in the form marked E.

3. On receipt of the above-mentioned statement so verified, the Minister of Agriculture may cause to be paid to the treasurer of each society a sum equal to two-thirds of the amount shown to have been awarded and paid away in prizes not exceeding £25 each (except for the exhibits mentioned in the statement above referred to, and such other exhibits the Minister may consider unsuitable), on condition that this sum do not exceed the amount raised by members' subscriptions and private donations; and if it do exceed the same, that it be in that case reduced to a sum equal to the amount so raised.

4. Of the whole grant (£20,000), a sum not exceeding Seventeen thousand eight hundred and twenty pounds thirteen shillings shall be so divided; and if the sums claimable be in excess of this amount they shall be reduced *pro rata*.

5. A sum not to exceed Five hundred pounds shall be paid to the Shepparton Amalgamated Agricultural Society towards the expenses of its spring show, held on the 26th, 27th, and 28th October 1886, under the patronage of the Department of Agriculture.

6. No society located within twenty miles of any other society shall be entitled to participate in the vote unless the sum awarded and paid away in prizes by such society as hereinbefore specified amounts in the total to One hundred pounds at least.

Instructions.

1. The blank spaces in the declaration, form E, for the sums awarded and paid in prizes and raised by members' subscriptions and private donations, between the 1st January 1886 and the 31st December 1886, must be filled up in words as well as in figures, and the declaration must be made before a justice of the peace by the treasurer of the society.

2. The account, when received, must be signed by the treasurer and be countersigned by the president, or the vice-president, or by two members of the committee of management. It should then be returned to the Secretary for Agriculture, Melbourne.

3. Challenge cups must not be included in the return of prize moneys paid unless such cups have been finally awarded.

NOTE.—The forms B, C, and D are forwarded herewith by way of guidance, but can be made use of at the option of the society. If, however, extra forms be required, the same must be furnished by the applicant, and be of uniform size and pattern.

BYE-LAW NO. 1, AS TO DAIRIES, DAIRY CATTLE, AND MILK.
THE Local Board of Health in and for the Shire of Huntly, in the colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in "The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883," and every other power enabling the said Local Board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said Local Board, doth hereby make the following bye-law, being Bye-law No. 1 of the said Local Board of Health, that is to say:—
1. All former bye-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed.
2. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.
3. This bye-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the said shire.

Registration of Cowkeepers, Dairywomen, and Purveyors of Milk.

4. Every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall, on or before the first day of March in every year, register himself with the Local Board of Health in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the secretary of the Local Board of Health an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall with every such application pay a fee of One shilling.

5. Upon receipt of every such application and fee, the secretary for the Local Board of Health shall indorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received, and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

6. All paddocks, grounds, lands, and enclosures used as grazing ground for dairy cattle shall, whenever necessary, be inspected by any member or officer of the said local board or by any person authorized, in writing, by the chairman or secretary of the said local board; and if on inspection such paddocks, grounds, or enclosures, or any one of them, are, or is likely, in the opinion of the officer or person so inspecting, to be prejudicial to health, by affecting the milk or otherwise, the said local board may, by an order in writing signed by the secretary, and served personally or left at the dwelling-house of the registered person, or in the case of an unregistered person, served personally or left at his dwelling-place or posted upon the land, prohibit the use of the same for the purpose of feeding dairy cattle, either absolutely or for any time named in such order. All cattle in dairies shall also be similarly inspected by a veterinary surgeon or other competent person, and any cows found to be diseased, or which from poverty or weakness are, in the opinion of the inspector, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, shall be forthwith removed from such dairy if ordered by such inspector or other officer as aforesaid. And any such order as aforesaid the said local board may revoke, but upon every fresh inspection a similar order may from time to time be made.

7. All houses, dairies, cowsheds, milk stores, milk shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated; and the drainage of all such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not.

8. All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows shall be regularly swept, and be kept perfectly clean, and shall within twenty-four hours of any order to such effect from the health officer or inspector of nuisances be fumigated, disinfected, or lime-washed, as may be in any such order so directed.

9. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily.

10. If any person, or any member of the family of any person, registered as aforesaid, or not so registered but employed as a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor or member of the family or any visitor to any such person, shall be attacked by typhoid fever or any dangerous infectious disease, the occupier of the house in which such person shall be, or (if he be the person attacked) his wife or other person in charge, shall immediately give notice thereof to the local board or officer of health, or to the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the Local Board of Health, and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said local board or the officer of health, by order served as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of any such cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, until danger, in the opinion of such local board or officer of health, no longer exists. And in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering, or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering, to milk cows or to handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business. Nor, if the person registered or conducting such business be himself the person suffering, shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until, in either case, all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk or of its continuation has ceased.

11. If at any time disease exists in the dairy or among the cows or cattle in any cowshed or dairy, or in the herds of any cowkeeper, dairyman, vendor or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the local board, officer of health, or nearest member of the police force; and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.

12. No cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep, or permit or suffer to be kept, any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking-yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.

13. In the interpretation of this bye-law words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females,

and the singular the plural, and the plural the singular, and the word "person" shall include a corporation.

14. Every person guilty of any breach of this bye-law, or of any of its provisions, shall be liable, in the discretion of the convicting justices, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings, or in the like discretion to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings, for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

This bye-law was made and passed by the Local Board of Health of the Shire of Huntly, which is the Council of the said shire, at the meeting of the said board, held on the seventh day of October 1886, as witnessed the common seal of the corporation, of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Huntly.

SHIRE OF HUNTLY.—PUBLIC HEALTH.

BYE-LAW No. 2.

For keeping free from noisome matter yards, stables, and places used for noxious trades, slaughter-yards, &c.; and for regulating management of earth-closets, privies, &c., disinfecting and deodorizing nightsoil and other offensive matter, and for regulating its removal and final deposit.

THE Local Board of Health in and for the Shire of Huntly, in the colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in "The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883," and every other power enabling the said local board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said local board, doth hereby make the following bye-law, being Bye-law No. 2 of the said Local Board of Health, that is to say:—

1. All former bye-laws on the matter and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed, excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this bye-law coming into operation.

2. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This bye-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the said Shire of Huntly.

4. The occupier of every house and premises within the said Shire of Huntly shall cause the yard and ground belonging thereto, or occupied in connection therewith, to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all filth, rubbish, and refuse matter to be from time to time removed from such yard and ground; and if at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such filth, rubbish, or refuse matter so removed as aforesaid, the local board may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier.

5. The occupier of any land in the said shire on which there shall be erected any stable, cowyard, cattle-shed, or pig-sty shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all soil, dung, or other manure produced or accumulated therein to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of the same so produced or accumulated shall amount to three cubic yards; and if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect or fail to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid, the same shall be removed by the said local board at the expense of such occupier.

6. The occupier of every house, building, or tenement within the said shire shall cause every cesspool already in existence, and until its abolition, to be emptied and cleansed from time to time as soon as any portion of the contents of such cesspool shall have so accumulated therein as to be within a distance of one foot from the top of the sides, walls, or lining of such cesspool. Provided that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom except between the hours Eleven p.m. and Five a.m. And provided also that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom until such contents shall have had mixed therewith carbolic acid, or some other efficient deodorizer, sufficient in quality and quantity to effectually deodorize and disinfect the same.

7. Every occupier and every person having the management and control of any premises shall, once at least in every week, empty and cleanse, or cause to be emptied and cleansed, every earth-closet, privy, and place in the nature of an earth-closet for the reception of nightsoil on or belonging to such premises.

8. No person shall empty any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the reception of nightsoil except by means of a cart, carriage, or means of conveyance properly constructed, and furnished with a sufficient covering so as to prevent the escape of the contents or any portion thereof or of effluvia therefrom.

9. All nightsoil, blood, offal, or other offensive matter or thing shall be removed to and deposited in such place or places only as may be appointed by the local board from time to time for the final reception of the same.

10. Every person placing or depositing, or causing or suffering to be placed or deposited or spread, or assisting in placing or depositing or spreading on any land, whether by way of manure or otherwise, any nightsoil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter

removed from any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or other place, shall immediately on the deposit or spreading thereof cover the same, or cause the same to be covered, and shall keep the same covered, with a layer of earth not less than six inches in thickness.

11. The occupier of any premises within the said shire used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, process, or manufacture whatever, or used for the purpose of slaughtering, whether it be an abattoir or otherwise, shall cause any rubbish, blood, offal, bones, water, liquid, soil, or other offensive matter produced or accumulated thereon to be removed therefrom once in every twenty-four hours, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, or to exhale any offensive effluvia; and if such occupier shall neglect or fail to have removed therefrom any offensive matter whatever, it may be removed by the said local board at the expense of such occupier.

12. Every closet-pan shall be constructed of galvanized iron, properly riveted and soldered, so as to be water-tight, and with handles thereto, and of a capacity not exceeding three cubic feet.

13. No closet-door or trap shall abut or open on a street, lane, or right-of-way exceeding fifteen feet in width.

14. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty of Five pounds for every such breach, or of Two pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties—such portion not being less than five shillings—to be paid. And any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty, notwithstanding that the Local Board of Health may be empowered by this bye-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such local board has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

BYE-LAW NO. 5, AS TO DAIRIES, DAIRY CATTLE, AND MILK.

THE Local Board of Health in and for the Borough of Flemington and Kensington, in the colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in "The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883," and every other power enabling the said local board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said local board, doth hereby make the following bye-law, being Bye-law No. 5 of the said Local Board of Health, that is to say:—

1. All former bye-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed.
2. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.
3. This bye-law shall apply to, and have operation in the whole borough.
4. *Registration of cowkeepers, dairymen, and purveyors of milk.*—Every person carrying on the trade of cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall, on or before the first day of February in every year register himself with the Local Board of Health in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the secretary of the Local Board of Health an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall, with every such application, pay a fee of One shilling.

5. Upon receipt of every such application and fee the Secretary for the Local Board of Health shall endorse the same with a

memorandum of the date on which it is received, and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

6. All paddocks, grounds, lands, and enclosures used as grazing ground for dairy cattle shall, whenever necessary, be inspected by any member or officer of the said local board, or by any person authorized, in writing, by the chairman or secretary of the said local board; and if, on inspection, such paddocks, grounds, or enclosures, or any one of them, are, or is likely, in the opinion of the officer or person so inspecting, to be prejudicial to health, by affecting the milk or otherwise, the said local board may, by an order in writing signed by the secretary, and served personally or left at the dwelling-house of the registered person, or in the case of an unregistered person, served personally or left at his dwelling-place, or posted upon the land, prohibit the use of the same for the purpose of feeding dairy cattle either absolutely or for any time named in such order. All cattle in dairies shall also be similarly inspected by a veterinary surgeon or other competent person, and any cows found to be diseased, or which from poverty or weakness are, in the opinion of the inspector, likely to be unfit for use or dairy purposes, shall be forthwith removed from such dairy if ordered by such inspector or other officer as aforesaid. And any such order as aforesaid the said local board may revoke, but upon every fresh inspection a similar order may from time to time be made.

7. All houses, dairies, cowsheds, milk stores, milk shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall be thoroughly and effectually lighted and ventilated, and the drainage of all such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not.

8. All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows shall be regularly swept and be kept perfectly clean, and shall within twenty-four hours of any order to such effect from the health officer or inspector of nuisances be fumigated, disinfected, or lime-washed, as may be in any such order so directed.

9. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily.

10. If any person or any member of the family of any person registered as aforesaid, or not so registered, but employed as a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor or member of the family of any visitor to any such person shall be attacked by typhoid fever, or any dangerous infectious disease, the occupier of the house in which such person shall be, or (if he be the person attacked) his wife or any such person in charge shall immediately give notice thereof to the local board or officer of health, or to the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the Local Board of Health, and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said local board or the officer of health, by order served as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of any such cowkeeper, dairyman or purveyor of milk until danger, in the opinion of such local board, or officer of health, no longer exists. And in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering, or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering, to milk cows or to handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business. Nor, if the person registered or conducting such business be himself the person suffering, shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until in either case all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk or of its contamination has ceased.

11. If at any time disease exists in the dairy or among the cows or cattle in any cowshed or dairy, or in the herds of any cowkeeper, dairyman, vendor or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the local board, officer of health, or nearest member of the police force, and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.

12. No cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, shall keep or permit or suffer to be kept any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.

13. In the interpretation of this bye-law, words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural and the plural the singular, and the word "person" shall include a corporation.

14. Every person guilty of any breach of this bye-law, or of any of its provisions, shall be liable in the discretion of the convicting justices to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings, or in the like discretion to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

HEALTH BYE-LAW No. 2.

For keeping in a sanitary condition temporary encampments of persons within the Shire, such as camps of laborers and others engaged in the construction of railways or other extensive works.

1. At any time when extensive works are being carried out, or from any other cause whatever, where a number of persons form a temporary encampment within the Shire of Narracan, except within any township in which Bye-law No. 1 of the said Local Board of Health has effect, the contractor or person engaged in the said work shall immediately on forming such encampment cause latrines to be erected, such as are used in military camps, and the said latrines shall be filled in from time to time with earth so as not to be a nuisance. And if at any time the contractor or person in charge of the works or the employer of the persons encamped shall neglect or fail to have such latrines erected, or kept in such condition as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, the same shall be erected or removed by the said Local Board at the expense of such contractor, contractors, or employers aforesaid.

2. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty of £10 for every such breach, or of Five pounds (£5) for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties, such portion not being less than Five shillings, to be paid. And any person shall be liable to the penalty notwithstanding that the Local Board of Health may be empowered by this bye-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such Local Board has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

3. This bye-law shall come into operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after publication in the *Government Gazette*.

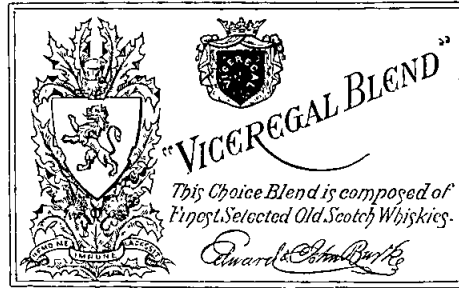

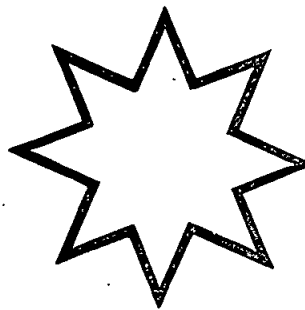

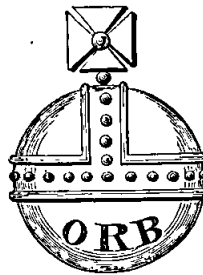
