REGULATIONS.

*At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the fifth day of

WHEREAS by *The Discipline Act 1870* it is provided that the Governor in Council may make rules and regulations for the employment, removal, or dismissal, and for the better government of persons engaged by virtue of the said Act, and for enforcing good order and discipline among them: and otherwise for carrying out the said Act, and from time to time annul, alter, or amend the same or substitute others in lieu thereof: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following alteration in the Regulations for the Victorian Permanent Naval Forces, that is to say :—

SECTION VII.—COMMISSIONS AND PROMOTIONS.

Sub-lieutenants.

Paragraph I.—Add as a footnote to the first two clauses ("Candidates for sub-lieutenants having not less than four years' sea time, and under the age of 25 years")—The officer commanding the Naval Forces may, under special circumstances, recommend a candidate who has less than four years' sea time, or is under the age of 25 years.

And the Honorable John Nimmo, for Her Majesty's Minister of Defence for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

GRANT OF ONE HUNDRED AND FIFTY POUNDS
(£150) FOR INVENTION OF MACHINERY FOR
THRASHING PEASE.

A SUM not exceeding One hundred and fifty pounds may be paid to any person or company who shall, in the opinion of the Minister of Agriculture, produce a machine capable of thrashing within twelve hours eight hundred bushels of pease without injury thereto.

2. The reward shall be paid only to the inventor, or his agent, of such machine as shall most cheaply, efficiently, and rapidly perform the work required, and within the time aforesaid.

3. Persons intending to compete for the reward must give notice in writing of their intention to the Secretary for Agriculture, Melbourne, not later than the 24th November next.

4. One or more trials of the machines shall be made at such place or places and at such times as the Minister may direct.

5. All costs and expenses of forwarding, attendance, and working the machines at the times to be appointed shall be paid by the persons entering the machines for competition.

6. The Minister may appoint three or more judges to report upon the merits of the competing machines, and a decision of a majority of such judges shall be final.

7. The judges may recommend payment of an amount or amounts the total of which shall not exceed One hundred and fifty pounds (£150) to the inventor or inventors, or his or their agent or agents, of the successful machine or machines, such amounts to be apportioned to the value to the colony of the said invention or inventions.

WHEREAS by section 95 of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1883* (No. 778) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time fix a sum which shall be the minimum amount of rates to be paid annually by any owner or occupier of property liable to be rated by any waterworks or irrigation trust: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the now in part recited Act, doth order and direct that the sum of One pound sterling shall be the minimum amount of rates to be paid annually by every owner or occupier of property liable to be rated by: "The Chairman and Commissioners of the Bet Bet Shire Waterworks Trust."

BET BET SHIRE WATERWORKS TRUST.—
REGULATION.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulation made by the Chairman and Commissioners of the Bet Bet Shire Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by *The Victorian Water Conservation Acts, Nos. 716 and 829.*

The Chairman and Commissioners of the Bet Bet Shire Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by *The Victorian Water Conservation Acts 1881-1884*, make the Regulation following :—

REGULATION No. 1.

The following are the rates and charges which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the part of the Waterworks District supplied with water as described in the *Government Gazette* of 24th December 1886, viz., the township of Bealiba, that is to say :—

1. For every house or tenement, the sum of Five pounds per centum per annum on the annual value of such property.

2. Such before-mentioned rates shall be based upon the municipal valuation.

Such rate to be for domestic purposes only. All water supplied for other than domestic purposes shall be by measure, to be charged for at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence per one thousand gallons.

The before-mentioned rate is made for the year commencing on the first day of January 1887 and ending on the thirty-first day of December 1887, and shall be payable on the first day of September 1887. Such persons as the Commissioners of the Bet Bet Shire Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rate.

THE RODNEY SHIRE COUNCIL AND THE UNITED
ECHUCA AND WARANGA WATERWORKS TRUST.
—APPLICATION OF FUNDS.

WHEREAS by section 17 of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1884* it is enacted that any municipal council may, with the consent of the Governor in Council, from time to time apply any portion of the municipal fund towards the payment of interest on and the creation of a sinking fund for the liquidation of any moneys borrowed by any Waterworks Trust: And whereas the Municipal Council of the Shire of Rodney is desirous of applying a portion of the municipal fund of the said shire—that is to say, a sum of Six hundred and eighty-three pounds eleven shillings and six pence—for the purpose of paying interest (from the first day of January 1887 to the thirtieth day of June 1887) on certain moneys borrowed by the United Echuca and Waranga Waterworks Trust:

I therefore recommend His Excellency the Governor in Council to consent to the said sum of Six hundred and eighty-three pounds eleven shillings and six pence being applied by the said Municipal Council of the said Shire of Rodney from the municipal fund thereof for the purpose aforesaid.

"THE PUBLIC SERVICE ACT 1883."—REGULATIONS.**SALARIES—NON-CLERICAL DIVISION.**

Act No. 773, Section 41, Sub-section VIII.

WHEREAS by *The Public Service Act 1883*, section 15, it is enacted that the Non-Clerical Division shall include all persons whose appointment has been determined by priority of registration, in accordance with Regulations to be made as hereinafter provided, and also all persons permanently employed in the Public Service before the passing of this Act who are not included under the other divisions of the Public Service: And whereas by section 17 of the said Act it is enacted that in the Non-Clerical Division the officers shall be paid such emoluments, salaries, allowances, and wages in accordance with a fixed amount or a scale to be determined by Regulation, and as may be provided in the annual Appropriation Act: And whereas by section 41 of the said Act it is enacted that the Public Service Board shall make Regulations which shall have full force and effect as soon as approved by the Governor in Council, and may, subject to such approval, from time to time repeal, alter, and amend the same:—For determining a scale or amount to be paid to the persons employed in the different Departments included in the Non-Clerical Division which, in the opinion of the Board, will be a fair equivalent for the work to be performed by such persons: And whereas the Public Service Board did make Regulations for such purposes, which Regulations were on the 30th January 1885 approved by the Governor in Council: And whereas the said Regulations were from time to time amended by further Regulations made by the said Public Service Board, and approved by the Governor in Council: And whereas it is expedient to alter the said Regulations: Now we, the undersigned, being the Members constituting the Public Service Board, in pursuance of the said powers, do make and declare the following alteration of the said Regulations, and declare that the same shall commence and come into operation as soon as approved as aforesaid:—

SHEEP IMPORTED FOR SLAUGHTER INTO NEW SOUTH WALES FROM VICTORIA.

THE following copy of a Proclamation published in the New South Wales Government Gazette of 22nd July 1887 is published for general information.

WHEREAS by section 29 of an Act passed in the forty-first year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled the *Diseases in Sheep Acts Amendment Act of 1878*, it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time, by Proclamation in the *Gazette*, suspend, for any period not exceeding six months, such of the provisions of the *Sheep Act of 1866* relating to the introduction of imported sheep from the neighbouring colonies as will admit of fat sheep arriving by sea from any colony in which disease is not known or suspected to exist being taken direct to the abattoirs on Glebe Island, Port Jackson, for slaughter, under such regulations as may be set forth in the said Proclamation: And whereas the disease called "Scab in Sheep" is not known or suspected to exist in the colony of Victoria: Now, therefore, I, CHARLES ROBERT, BARON CARRINGTON, the Governor aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby suspend, to the extent and for the purpose aforesaid, the provisions of sections 52, 53, and 54 of the *Diseases in Sheep Act of 1866*, with respect to fat sheep imported from the said colony of Victoria, for the further period of six months from the fourth instant; and I do hereby declare and set forth the following Regulations as those under which such sheep may be so imported and landed for slaughter as aforesaid, namely:—

1st. The owner of such sheep shall give the Inspector for the Port immediate notice of their arrival, and shall produce to him a certificate from the Inspector of the Port from which such sheep were shipped, setting forth that he had examined such sheep, and that to the best of his knowledge and belief they were the produce of the colony from which they were shipped, and were free from disease and infection.

2nd. Such sheep shall not be allowed to leave the vessel by which they arrive until they have been examined by the Inspector.

3rd. Upon being inspected and found free from infection such sheep shall be taken direct to the abattoirs on Glebe Island, and there delivered into the charge of the Inspector of Slaughter-houses, to be slaughtered under his supervision.

4th. Any person failing to comply with or aiding or being concerned in the breach of any of the provisions of these Regulations shall incur a penalty not exceeding £5 for every sheep with respect to which any such penalty is incurred.

Given under my Hand and Seal, at Government House, Sydney, this fourteenth day of July, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, and in the fifty-first year of Her Majesty's Reign.

THE following information, received from Lieutenant and Commander Richards, of H.M.S. *Paluma*, is hereby promulgated:—

Phillips Rock—of small extent, and with 8 fathoms of water close to, lies S. 53° W. 1½ miles from the eastern summit of Acheron Island; the least depth of water on it is 6 feet. "Shoal ground ¼ mile in extent," marked on chart No. 2349, Australia, E.C. sheet 15, does not exist.

Lorne Reef consists of two small rocky patches. The westernmost dries one foot at L. W. springs, and is situated S. 75° W., 1½ miles from the summit of Rattlesnake Island.

3. The sexton shall dig all ordinary graves, unless otherwise specially ordered, on payment of the fee mentioned in Schedule B. Parties requiring brick graves or vaults will be required to construct them under the direction of the trustees, or any two of them.
4. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones must be kept in proper repair and condition at the expense of the owners.
5. Plan of every monument or headstone must be submitted to the trustees for their approval.
6. All persons destroying the fences, or in any manner injuring the cemetery, will be prosecuted as the law directs.
7. Every coffin in a vault must be bricked in or cemented, or covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron.
8. The trustees reserve to themselves the right of making any alteration from time to time in these regulations and charges, subject to the approval of His Excellency the Governor in Council.

5. To enable the company to be appointed and to act as trustee receiver committee or guardian of any lunatic, or guardian of any infant.

7. To enable the company to act as attorney under power.

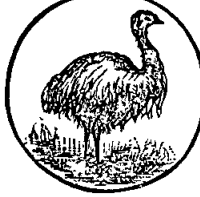
