WHEREAS by The Discipline Act 1870 it is provided that the Governor in Council may make rules and regulations for the employment, removal, or dismissal, and for the better government of persons engaged by virtue of the said Act, and for enforcing good order and discipline among them, and otherwise for carrying out the said Act, and from time to time annul, alter, or amend the same or substitute others in lieu thereof: Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following alteration in the Regulations for the Victorian Permanent Naval Porces, that is to say:—

SECTION VII.--COMMISSIONS AND PROMOTIONS.

Sub-licutenants.

Paragraph I.—Add as a footnote to the first two clauses ("Candidates for sub-lieutenants having not less than four years' sea time, and under the age of 25 years")—The officer commanding the Naval Forces may, under special circumstances, recommend a candidate who has less than four years' sea time, or is under the age of 25 years.

GRANT OF ONE HUNDRED AND FIFTY POUNDS (£150) FOR INVENTION OF MACHINERY FOR THRASHING PEASE.

A SUM not exceeding One hundred and fifty pounds may be paid to any person or company who shall, in the opinion of the Minister of Agriculture, produce a machine capable of thrashing within twelve hours eight hundred bushels of pease without injury thereto.

- The reward shall be paid only to the inventor, or his agent, of such machine as shall most cheaply, efficiently, and rapidly perform the work required, and within the time aforesaid.
- 3. Persons intending to compete for the reward must give notice in writing of their intention to the Secretary for Agricul-ture, Melbourne, not later than the 24th November next.
- 4. One or more trials of the machines shall be made at such place or places and at such times as the Minister may direct.
- 5. All costs and ax such times as the Minister may direct.

 5. All costs and expenses of forwarding, attendance, and working the machines at the times to be appointed shall be paid by the persons entering the machines for competition.

 6. The Minister may appoint three or more judges to report upon the merits of the competing machines, and a decision of a majority of such judges shall be final.
- 7. The judges may recommend payment of an amount or amounts the total of which shall not exceed One hundred and fifty pounds (£150) to the inventor or inventors, or his or their agent or agents, of the successful machine or machines, such amounts to be apportioned to the value to the colony of the said invention or inventions.

BET BET SHIRE WATERWORKS TRUST.-REGULATION.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulation made by the Chairman and Commissioners of the Bet Bet Shire Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by The Victorian Water Conservation Acts, Nos. 716 and

The Chairman and Commissioners of the Bet Bet Shire Water-works Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by The Victorium Water Conservation Acts 1881–1884, make the Regulation following:—

REGULATION No. 1.

The following are the rates and charges which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the part of the Waterworks District supplied with water as described in the Government Gazette of 24th December 1886, viz., the township of Bealiba, that is to

say:—

1. For every house or tenement, the sum of Five pounds per centum per annum on the annual value of such property.

2. Such before mentioned rates shall be based upon the muni-

cipal valuation.

Such rate to be for domestic purposes only. All water supplied for other than domestic purposes shall be by measure, to be charged for at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence per one thousand gallons.

thousand gallons.

The before-mentioned rate is made for the year commencing on the first day of January 1887 and ending on the thirty-first day of December 1887, and shall be payable on the first day of September 1887. Such persons as the Commissioners of the Bet Bet Shire Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rate.

THE RODNEY SHIRE COUNCIL AND THE UNITED ECHUCA AND WARANGA WATERWORKS TRUST.—APPLICATION OF FUNDS.

HEREAS by section 17 of The Victorian Water Consertation Act 1884 it is enacted that any municipal council may, with the consent of the Governor in Council, from time to time apply any portion of the municipal fund towards the payment of interest on and the creation of a sinking fund for the liquidation of any moneys borrowed by any Waterworks Trust: And whereas the Municipal Council, of the Shire of Rodney is desirous of applying a portion of the municipal fund of the said shire—that is to say, a sum of Six hundred and eighty-three pounds eleven shillings and six pence—for the purpose of paying interest (from the first day of January 1887 to the thritisth day of June 1887) on certain moneys borrowed by the United Echuca and Waranga Waterworks Trust:

I therefore recommend Hie Excellency the Governor in Council to consent to the said sum of Six hundred and eighty-three pounds eleven shillings and six pence being applied by the said Municipal Council of the said Shire of Rodney from the municipal fund thereof for the purpose aforesaid.

"THE PUBLIC SERVICE ACT 1883."-REGULATIONS. SALABIES-NON-CLERICAL DIVISION.

WHEREAS by The Public Service Act 1883, section 15, it is enacted that the Non-Clerical Division shall include all persons whose appointment has been determined by priority of registration, in accordance with Regulations to be made as here-inafter provided, and also all porsons permanently employed in the Public Service before the passing of this Act who are not included under the other divisions of the Public Service: And whereas by section 17 of the said Act it is enacted that in the Non-Clerical Division the officers shall be paid such emoluments, salaries, allowances, and wages in accordance with a fixed amount or a scale to be determined by Regulation, and as may be provided in the annual Appropriation Act: And whereas by section 41 of the said Act it is enacted that the Public Service Board shall make Regulations which shall have full force and effect as soon as approved by the Governor in Council, and may, subject to such approval, from time to time repeal, alter, and amend the same:—For determining a scale or amount to be paid to the persons employed in the different Departments included in the Non-Clerical Division which, in the opinion of the Board, will be a fair equivalent for the work to be performed by such persons: And whereas the Public Service Board did make Regulations for such purposes, which Regulations were on the 30th January 1885 approved by the Governor in Council: And whereas the said Regulations were from time to time amended by further Regulations made by the said Public Service Board, and approved by the Governor in Council: And whereas it is expedient to alter the said Regulations. Now we, the undersigned, being the Members constituting the Public Service Board, in pursuance of the said powers, do make and declare the following alteration of the said Regulations, and declare that the same shall commence and come into operation as soon as approved as aforesaid:—

WHEREAS by section 29 of an Act passed in the forty-first year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled the Diseases in Sheep Acts Amendment Act of 1876, it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time, by Proclamation in the Gazette, suspend, for any period not exceeding six months, such of the provisions of the Sheep Act of 1866 relating to the Introduction of imported sheep from the neighbouring colonies as will admit of fat sheep arriving by sea from any colony in which disease is not known or suspected to exist being taken direct to the abstroits on Glebe Island, Port Jackson, for slaughter, under such regulations as may be set forth in the said Proclamation: And whereas the disease called "Scab in Sheep" is not known or suspected to exist in the colony of Victoria: Now, therefore, I, CHARLES ROBERT, BARON CARRINGTON, the Governor aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby suspend, to the extent and for the purpose aforesaid, the provisions of sections 52, 53, and 54 of the Diseases in Sheep Act of 1866, with respect to fat sheep imported from the said colony of Victoria, for the further period of six months from the fourth instant; and I do hereby declare and set forth the following Regulations as those under which such sheep may be so imported and landed for slaughter as aforesaid, namely:—

1st. The owner of such sheep shall give the Inspector for the Part immediate network.

4th. Any person failing to comply with or aiding or being concerned in the breach of any of the provisions of these Regulations shall incur a penalty not exceeding £5 for every sheep with respect to which any such penalty is incurred.


