TRIENNIAL GENERAL REGISTRATION OF ELECTORS FOR ELECTORAL LISTS.

(The Electoral Act 1865, No. 279, sec. 62, and the Amending Act 1881, No. 708, sec. 2.)

SPECIAL NOTICE TO HOLDERS OF ELECTORS' RIGHTS.

IT is hereby notified that holders of electors' rights issued on or before the 1st December 1886 must obtain renewed rights in lieu thereof, in order to have their names placed upon the General Lists to be made up on and after the 1st December next.

Neglect of this precaution will result in the omission of the names of the persons so neglecting from the new Lists to be made up as aforesaid.

The old right must in every case be delivered up to the Registrar, but the renewed right will be equally available for any election that may take place before the completion of the new Rolls in January next.

Intending applicants for electors' rights are cautioned to carefully ascertain whether they are fully qualified under the law; inasmuch as a penalty on conviction is imposed upon persons knowingly and wilfully obtaining electors' rights when not qualified.

No person whose name is on, or entitled to be on, any Roll of Ratepaying Electors for any division of a PROVINCE may obtain an elector's right for such province, and no person whose name is already on any Roll of Ratepaying Electors for any division of an ELECTORAL DISTRICT may obtain an elector's right for such District.

Intended light at Solo Rock, N. Astrolabe Reef, Kadaru Island.
NOTICE is hereby given that, on and after the 1st February 1888, there will be exhibited, between sunset and sunrise, from a lighthouse on the above-named rock, a dioptric light of the 3rd order.

The light will be white, and single-flashing at intervals of 30 seconds, and visible 15 miles all round, excepting between the bearings of S. by E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. and S. $\frac{1}{2}$ W., where islands within the Great Astrolabe Reef will intervene.

It will be elevated 96 feet above high water.
The lighthouse will be constructed of iron, tubular, 106 feet in height, and painted in horizontal bands of red and white.

The position of the rock on which it is to be constructed is near the centre of the Circular North Astrolabe Reef, which has an average diameter of 5 miles.

Position—Latitude, 18° 38' 15" S.; longitude, 178° 32' 15" E.
This position is $3\frac{1}{4}$ miles S. $\frac{1}{2}$ W. from that of the double-flashing light at Nasilai, Viti Levu Island.

Intended discontinuance of the Horsburgh Light, Singapore Straits.
ACCORDING to Notice to Mariners, Singapore, 29th June 1887, after the 5th August next the revolving light on the Horsburgh lighthouse will be discontinued during alterations.

Until the new light is exhibited, the lightship *Formosa* will be moored on the north-east end of the reef, one cable's length from the base of the light-tower.

The lightship will exhibit a bright revolving light, in all respects similar to the Horsburgh light, but visible at a distance of only ten miles.

In addition there will be two bright lights shown from the balcony of the lighthouse tower, N. and S., at an elevation of 85 feet, and visible about fifteen miles.

MALACCA STRAIT.

Light vessel marking wreck near Fair Channel Bank.

According to Notice to Mariners No. 159, H. O. Adm., London, 1887, a light vessel has been placed near the steam vessel *Bentan*, lying sunk in 12 fathoms water, near Fair Channel bank, Malacca Strait.

The wreck-marking vessel shows three red lights placed vertically, and by day a wicker beacon, painted red, at the mast-head.

The births of 1,430 children, viz., 730 boys and 700 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of August. This is the highest number ever yet registered in the Metropolitan District in one month, the next highest—viz., 1,325—being in March last. In the month of July 1,192 births were registered, or 238 fewer than in the month under review. The births were 514 above the average of the month during the previous ten years, but only 234 above that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in August numbered 656, viz., 380 of males and 276 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 774, or 118 per cent. The deaths outnumbered those in July by 93, and exceeded the average of August during the previous ten years by 173. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have exceeded that average by only 52.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was 3.85, and of deaths registered 1.77.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 72.1° on the 25th, and the lowest was 33.6° on the 2nd. The mean temperature of the month (50.4°) was more than half a degree (0.7°) below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (27.3°) took place on the 25th, viz., from a maximum of 72.1° to a minimum of 44.8°. The least range (4.0°) was on the 27th, viz., from a maximum of 63.8° to a minimum of 59.8°. The mean daily range was 14.2°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.436 inches on the 11th, and the lowest was 29.374 inches on the 31st. The mean atmospheric pressure (30.125 inches) was slightly above the average.

Rain fell on 11 days, the amount of rainfall being 0.96 inches. The average rainfall in August during the previous ten years was 1.88 inch, or nearly an inch (0.82) more than in the month under notice.

Fog occurred on 4 days during the month.

Males contributed 58 per cent., and females 42 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 36 per cent. to that mortality, as against 30 per cent. in August 1886, 23 per cent. in August 1885, 39 per cent. in August 1884, 30 per cent. in August 1883, 31 per cent. in August 1882, 33 per cent. in August 1881, 43 per cent. in August 1880, 36 per cent. in August 1879, 31 per cent. in August 1878, and 34 per cent. in August 1877.

Deaths of old people were very numerous during the month, no less than 50 having been recorded of persons of 75 years or upwards. Of these, a male servant, aged 75, died of Bright's disease of the kidneys; a female, aged 75, a male, of occupation unknown, aged 77, an ironmonger, aged 78, a laborer and a female, each aged 80, and a female, aged 81, of bronchitis; a police pensioner, aged 75, a builder, aged 80, and a female, aged 85, of congestion of the lungs; a bootmaker, aged 76, of apoplexy; a laborer, aged 76, of nephritis; a female, aged 76, a carpenter, a groom, a leather-dresser, and a female, each aged 77, an accountant and two gentlemen, each aged 78, a laborer, a vine-dresser, and a female, each aged 80, and a bootmaker, aged 82, of heart disease; a female, aged 76, a butcher, aged 77, and two females, each aged 80, of pneumonia; a female, aged 77, of aneurism; a laborer, aged 78, of brain disease; a gentleman, aged 78, of valvular disease of the heart; an architect, aged 81, of inflammation of the bowels; a female, aged 82, of paralysis; a female, aged 83, of ascites; a female servant, aged 88, of diarrhoea; a painter, aged 76, a pedlar and a female, each aged 77, a sawyer, aged 80, a female, aged 81, a seaman and a female, each aged 82, a laborer, aged 85, a farmer and a mariner, each aged 87, a female, aged 88, a laborer, aged 89, a laborer, aged 91, and a female, aged 98, of old age.

Twenty-nine deaths were ascribed to external causes during the month, of which 22 were set down to accident, 2 to homicide, and 5 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A male infant, aged 1, was killed—his mother falling on him whilst in an epileptic fit; a boy, aged 8, died of fracture of the skull, the result of a kick from a horse; a male infant, aged 9 months, of concussion of the brain, caused by a fall; a bricklayer, aged 23, and a jockey aged 28, of injuries occasioned by falling from horses; a female boardinghouse-keeper, aged 40, of fracture of the skull, caused by falling down stairs; a laborer, aged 45, was killed by falling from a "traveller" on which he was working; an inspector of public works, aged 55, by falling from a staging at Prince's Bridge; a farmer, aged 66, by falling from a cart; a shipwright, aged 68, by falling from a bridge whilst at work; a laborer, aged 33, by a "crusher"; a merchant, aged 60, died of fracture of the base of the skull, caused in the Windsor railway accident; a boy, aged 10, of tetanus, consequent on being run over by a tram-car; two female children, each aged 2, of burns; a gas stoker, aged 39, was poisoned with some irritant poison, there being no evidence to show how he procured it; a boy, aged 8, was drowned in Hobson's Bay; a cabdriver, aged 23, a female, aged 51, and a saddler, aged 69, in the River Yarra; a laborer, aged 58, in the Sandridge lagoon; and a laborer, aged 35, was found drowned in the River Yarra. The homicidal deaths were those of a female, aged 38, who was shot by her husband, and of a female, aged 62, who died of injuries to the head; a verdict of wilful murder was brought in in both instances. Of the suicidal deaths—a stonemason, aged 27, and a female, aged 48, poisoned themselves with arsenic; a chemist, aged 27, with prussic acid; and a laborer, aged 32, and a cabinetmaker, aged 67, hanged themselves.

One hundred and thirty deaths, or 20 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—62 in the Melbourne Hospital, 17 in the Alfred Hospital, 2 in the Homoeopathic Hospital, 1 in the Children's Hospital, 2 in the Women's Hospital, 10 in the Immigrants' Home, 11 in the Benevolent Asylum, 5 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 12 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 3 in the Austin Hospital, 2 in the Melbourne Gaol, 2 in the Infant Asylum, and 1 in the Protestant Refuge.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 233, of which 134, or 58 per cent., were of males, and 99, or 42 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 167 were under one year of age, 25 were between one and two, 23 were between two and three, 8 were between three and four, and 10 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 423. Of these, 246, or 58 per cent., were males, and 177, or 42 per cent., were females; 22 were between five and ten, 16 were between ten and fifteen, 17 were between fifteen and twenty, 28 were between twenty and twenty-five, 33 were between twenty-five and thirty, 25 were between thirty and thirty-five, 27 were between thirty-five and forty, 30 were between forty and forty-five, 32 were between forty-five and fifty, 29 were between fifty and fifty-five, 32 were between fifty-five and sixty, 27 were between sixty and sixty-five, 33 were between sixty-five and seventy, 22 were between seventy and seventy-five, 24 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 26 were upwards of eighty.

In August, as compared with the previous month, under the head of specific febrile or zymotic diseases, deaths from measles increased from 2 to 14, and those from septic diseases from 4 to 9. On the other hand, deaths from whooping-cough decreased from 8 to 4, and those from typhoid fever from 15 to 9. Under the head of local diseases, deaths from brain and nerve disorders rose from 63 to 77, those from heart affections from 42 to 53, those from lung and chest complaints from 108 to 129, and those from bowel and stomach diseases from 44 to 53. Only 4 deaths of child-bearing women occurred during the month, the number being identical with that in July. If these numbers be compared with the births registered during the same months, it will follow that 1 death of a mother took place to every 358 children born alive in the month under review, and 1 to every 293 such children in the previous month.

The judges may recommend payment of an amount or amounts the total of which shall not exceed One hundred and fifty pounds (£150) to the inventor or inventors, or his or their agent or agents, of the successful machine or machines, such amounts to be apportioned to the value to the colony of the said invention or inventions.

THE SWAN HILL IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.—ELECTION OF COMMISSIONERS.

REGULATIONS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-sixth day of September 1887.

PRESENT:

WHEREAS by section 63 of *The Irrigation Act 1886*, No. 898, it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, subject to the provisions of the said Act, from time to time make, alter, and repeal regulations relating to any irrigation and water supply trust appointed and created under the said Act for the purposes, among others, following:—

(a) For determining the period for which the commissioners of any trust shall hold office, the time and manner of election, and the order of their retirement from office.

(b) For determining the manner in which elections of any such commissioners shall be held, and the manner of voting thereat.

(c) For determining the manner in which any vacancies in the office of any such commissioners shall be filled up; and

(d) For determining questions as to the due election of any such commissioner.

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the said provisions of the now in part recited Act, doth for the purposes aforesaid, so far as these may relate to a certain irrigation and water supply trust duly appointed and created under the said Act, and known as the Swan Hill Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, make the regulations following, viz:—

1. *Interpretation of terms.*—In these regulations, “the Minister” shall mean the Minister of Water Supply; “the trust” or “the said trust” shall mean the Swan Hill Irrigation and Water Supply Trust; and “the district,” “the said district,” or “the irrigation district” shall mean the lands as defined by the Order in Council appointing and creating the said trust wherein the trust shall have authority.

2. *Period for which commissioners shall hold office.*—Subject to the provisions in reference to the first election of commissioners hereinafter contained, for securing the annual retirement of three commissioners, the period during which the commissioners of the said trust shall hold office shall be three years.

3. *Annual retirement of commissioners.*—Three commissioners shall retire annually, but the retiring commissioners shall, subject to the provisions of the said Act, be eligible for re-election.

4. *Term of office of persons elected commissioners at first election.*—At the first election of commissioners three of the persons elected commissioners shall hold office as such commissioners for the term of three years, three others of such persons shall hold office for the term of two years, and the remaining three persons elected as such commissioners shall hold office for the term of one year, and the particular term for which each such person so elected a commissioner shall hold office shall be determined in manner following, that is to say:—

(a) *How term of office is ascertained when no poll taken.*—If the first election is made without a poll as in the case in these regulations provided, then the particular term for which each candidate elected as a commissioner shall hold office shall immediately upon such election be publicly determined by lot by the returning officer in such manner as to him may seem fit, and the returning officer shall thereupon immediately and publicly announce the term for which each individual candidate elected as a commissioner shall hold office as so determined, and shall report the same to the Minister.

(b) *How term of office ascertained when poll taken.*—If at the first election a poll shall be held as in these regulations provided, then of the nine candidates elected as commissioners the three candidates who shall have received the highest number of votes shall hold office as commissioners for the term of three years, and the three candidates who shall have received the next highest number of votes shall hold office for the term of two years, and the remaining three candidates who shall have been elected shall hold office for the term of one year; and if two or more than two candidates elected shall have obtained the same number of votes, then the returning officer shall determine by lot (as hereinbefore provided in the case of the first election if decided without ballot) the term or terms of three, two, or one year or years during which such candidates shall respectively hold office. But so that no candidate elected shall hold office for a shorter time than the term during which any other candidate who shall have obtained a less number of votes shall hold office. And the returning officer shall publicly declare the respective terms during which the several candidates shall hold office as so determined, and shall report the same to the Minister.

5. *Extraordinary vacancies, how filled, and term of office.*—Should any vacancy in the office of commissioner be occasioned by death, resignation, removal, disqualification, or any other cause whatever, an election shall forthwith be held to fill such vacancy, and the provisions contained in these regulations as to the nomination of candidates, the manner in which elections shall be held, and the mode of voting thereat, shall apply to any election in respect of such vacancy, and the person elected to fill such vacancy shall hold the office of commissioner during the unexpired portion of the term of office of the commissioner whose seat shall have become vacant.

6. *Date of first election of commissioners.*—Date of ordinary annual election.—The first election of commissioners of the said trust shall be held on the twenty-first day of October 1887, and the ordinary annual election shall be held on the twenty-first day of October in each succeeding year. Provided that whenever such date may fall upon a Sunday, or upon any day set apart as a public holiday, such election shall be held upon the day next following.

7. *Voters' list to be prepared.*—For the purposes of the first election of commissioners of the said trust, a voters' list shall be prepared by the persons upon whose petition the said trust has been appointed and created, and the said voters' list shall be forwarded to the Minister.

8. *Form of voters' list.*—First Schedule.—Such voters' list shall be in the form of the First Schedule hereto, and shall contain in regular numerical sequence and alphabetical order of surname the christian name or names, surname, and address, so far as these may be known, of each owner of not less than ten acres of land within the district of the said trust, and shall also specify the extent of, and indicate with reasonable certainty, the land of each such owner, and shall state the number of votes to which, under the provisions of the said Act, each such owner is entitled.

9. *Voting in respect of lands jointly owned.*—In the case of joint owners of land, the name of any one of such owners shall, subject to the provisions of the said Act and of these regulations, be placed in respect of such land upon the voters' list in like manner as if such land were owned solely by such one owner, and the owner so placed upon the said list or lists shall alone be entitled to vote accordingly: Provided always that if such owners jointly, by notice in writing, desire that the number of votes to which, under the said provisions, any one of such owners is so entitled to give as aforesaid may be allotted between such owners in any manner they may jointly indicate, the alteration or alterations so desired to be made in the said list shall, if the same be consistent with the said provisions, be made when the list shall be revised as hereinafter provided, and such owners shall be entitled to vote accordingly.

10. *Copy of voters' list to be available for inspection.*—Second Schedule.—Objections to list to be in writing and forwarded to Minister.—A copy of such voters' list shall be available for inspection, without payment of any fee or charge, at all reasonable hours in the day time, in some convenient place within or near to the district of the trust for a period of seven clear days; and a notice in the form, or to the like effect, of the Second Schedule hereto, setting forth the times and place at which such voters' list may be so inspected, shall be published in some newspaper ordinarily circulating within the said district, and such notice shall state that all objections to the said list must be forwarded in writing to the Minister within the time mentioned in the said notice.

11. *Grounds of objection to be stated.*—All objections to the said list shall be forwarded in writing to the Minister within ten days after the first day of the publication of such notice, and the ground or grounds of objection must be clearly set forth.

12. *Minister to revise and certify lists.*—The Minister shall revise the said list and consider all objections thereto, and make such alterations and amendments therein as to him may seem just, and shall certify the list under his hand as correct, and no objection to the list when so certified shall be allowed.

13. *Certified list to be voters' roll.*—The list so revised and certified shall be the voters' roll for the purposes of the first election of commissioners of the trust, but shall also be available for any election in respect of any extraordinary vacancy occurring within twelve months next after the date of the said first election.

14. *Voters' list to be prepared yearly.*—Before the first day of September in each year the officers of the trust shall prepare a voters' list in the form of the First Schedule hereto, and such list shall contain, in regular numerical sequence and in alphabetical order of surname, the christian name or names, surname, and address (so far as these may be known) of each owner of not less than ten acres of land within the district of the said trust, and shall also specify the extent of, and indicate with reasonable certainty, the land of each such owner, and shall state the number of votes to which, under the provisions of the said Act, each such owner is entitled.

15. *Voting in respect of lands jointly owned.*—In the case of joint owners of land, the name of any one of such owners shall, subject to the provisions of the said Act and of these regulations, be placed, in respect of such land, upon the voters' list in like manner as if such land were owned solely by such one owner, and the owner so placed upon the said list shall alone be entitled to vote accordingly: Provided always that if such owners jointly, by notice in writing, desire that the number of votes to which, under the said provisions, any one of such owners is so entitled to give as aforesaid may be allotted between such owners in any manner they may jointly indicate, the alteration or alterations so desired to be made in the said list shall, if the same be consistent with the said provisions, be made when the list or lists shall be revised as hereinafter provided, and such owners shall be entitled to vote accordingly.

16. *Copy of list to be available for inspection.*—Third Schedule.—A copy of such voters' list shall be available for inspection, without payment of any fee or charge, at all reasonable hours in the day time, at some convenient place within or near to the district of the trust, for a period of seven clear days; and a notice in the form, or to the like effect, of the Third Schedule hereto shall be published in some newspaper ordinarily circulating within the said district, and such notice shall state that all objections to the said list must be forwarded in writing to the chairman of the trust within the time mentioned in the said notice.

17. *Grounds of objections to list to be forwarded in writing to the chairman of trust.*—All objections to the said list shall be forwarded in writing to the chairman of the trust within the time

mentioned in the said notice, and the ground or grounds of objection must be clearly set forth.

18. *Special meeting of trust to be held to revise list.*—List to be certified.—In the month of September in each year a special meeting of the trust shall be held for the purpose of revising the said list; and all objections which may have been forwarded to the chairman under the preceding clause shall be considered by the commissioners then present; and the chairman may make such alterations and amendments in the said list as the commissioners or a majority of the commissioners present may determine to be just and necessary, or such as by these regulations are required to be made; and the list, when so revised, altered, and amended, shall be certified as correct under the hand of the chairman, and no objection to the list when so certified shall be allowed.

19. *Revised and certified list to be voters' roll.*—The list so revised and certified shall be the voters' roll for the purposes of any election (whether ordinary or extraordinary) of trust commissioners to be held within one year from the twenty-first day of October then next, the said day inclusive.

20. *Minister may appoint returning officer for first election.*—*Chairman of trust to be returning officer at subsequent elections.*—For the purposes of the first such election, the Minister may appoint some fit and proper person, not being an owner of land within the district, to be returning officer; but for every subsequent election, whether ordinary or extraordinary, the chairman of the trust for the time being shall be the returning officer; but if at the time of any election the office of chairman of the trust should be vacant, the commissioners of the trust may by resolution appoint one of their number to be returning officer until the office of chairman shall again be filled; and the returning officer may appoint a deputy to assist him or to act in his room at any election, and such deputy may do all or any of the acts or things which the returning officer is hereby authorized or required to do.

21. *Notice of election.*—*Nomination of candidates.*—*Fourth Schedule.*—Fourteen clear days before any election of commissioners under these regulations, the returning officer shall give public notice of such election by advertisement inserted in some newspaper generally circulating in the said district, and by such notice shall require all candidates at such election to be nominated at some place within the said district, to be named in such notice, in manner hereinafter mentioned, between the hours of Eleven o'clock in the forenoon and Two o'clock in the afternoon on some day before a day (hereinafter called the day of nomination) not less than four nor more than seven days after the time of giving such notice, and named therein; and any person desirous of nominating a candidate shall, before Two o'clock in the afternoon of the day next preceding the nomination day, cause to be delivered at the place aforesaid to the returning officer a nomination paper in the form of the Fourth Schedule, or to the like effect, stating therein the christian name and surname of such candidate, together with the other particulars required in and by the said schedule; and such nomination paper shall be signed by not less than six persons duly qualified to vote at such elections, and also signed by the person named therein as a candidate in token of his assent to being so named.

22. *Where number of candidates does not exceed number of commissioners to be elected.*—If at the expiration of the time limited as hereinbefore provided for the nominations of candidates the number of persons who have become candidates as aforesaid does not exceed the number of commissioners to be elected, the returning officer shall then declare such candidates to be duly elected, and they shall be deemed to be then duly elected accordingly.

23. *Where number of candidates exceeds number of commissioners to be elected.*—*Fifth Schedule.*—*Notice of poll.*—*Hours of polling.*—If at the expiration of the time limited for the nomination of candidates the number of candidates exceeds the number of commissioners to be elected, then the returning officer shall forthwith cause ballot-papers to be printed, with the christian names and surnames of all the candidates in full, in the form of the Fifth Schedule hereto, and shall also forthwith give public notice by advertisement in some newspaper generally circulating in the district, stating the names of the persons so nominated, and that a poll will be taken for the election of such commissioners upon the day named in such notice, at such place within the said area as the returning officer shall in and by such notice appoint, and such poll shall take place accordingly, and shall commence at Eleven o'clock a.m. and close at Two o'clock in the afternoon.

24. *Retirement of candidates before polling-day.*—If at any election after a poll shall have been appointed as aforesaid any candidate for such election and two of the persons having signed the paper nominating him as aforesaid are desirous that he should retire from such candidature, such candidate and the persons aforesaid may sign and deliver to the returning officer not later than four clear days before the day of polling a notice in the form of the Sixth Schedule hereto, stating that such candidate so retires, and the said candidate or his agent shall thereupon publish in some newspaper generally circulating in the district a copy of such notice, and the returning officer, on sufficient proof of such publication aforesaid, if the number of candidates is by such retirement reduced to the number of persons to be elected at such election, shall on the day appointed for the election declare the remaining candidates duly elected, and if the said number is not so reduced shall omit the name of the person so retiring from the ballot-papers to be used at the said election, and if such papers are already printed shall erase such name therefrom, and such person shall not be capable of being elected at such election.

25. *Polling-booth may be hired.*—At such election the returning officer shall provide a suitable place for taking a poll, and may, if necessary, cause to be hired and used as a polling-booth any room which he may deem to be suitable at the place appointed for taking the poll, and may divide such room into compartments as to him may seem most convenient.

26. *Returning officer to preside at polling-booth.*—The returning officer, or his deputy, shall preside at the polling-booth for taking the poll.

27. *Scrutineers may be appointed.*—Each candidate shall be entitled to appoint, in writing, one scrutineer to be present in the polling-booth, and the said returning officer, or his deputy, and the said scrutineers, and any voters, not exceeding four in number, actually engaged in voting, shall alone be permitted at any one time to enter or remain in the polling-booth.

28. *Pencils to be provided.*—The returning officer, or his deputy, shall provide pencils in the polling-booth for the use of the voters, and also a locked box, to be called the ballot-box, with a cleft or opening therein capable of receiving the ballot-papers, and such box shall be opened and exhibited to the scrutineers before the polling begins, and the box shall then be locked, and shall stand on a table opposite the returning officer, or deputy returning officer, who shall keep the key of such box.

29. *Mode of voting.*—*Where voter is illiterate.*—The returning officer shall deliver to every voter who requires the same a ballot-paper, or if such voter appears by the roll to be entitled to give more votes than one, then so many ballot-papers as may be equal to the number of votes which such voter so appears to be entitled to give, such ballot-papers being in the form of Schedule Five hereto, and initialed by the returning officer; and every such voter shall, without leaving the booth, strike out from all or any of such papers the name of every candidate for whom he does not intend to vote. And in case any voter is unable to read or write, the returning officer, or his deputy, if so required, shall, in view of such one of the scrutineers as the voter may desire, strike out the name or names of such candidate or candidates as such voter may designate, and after such name or names have been so struck out, the ballot-paper, or ballot-papers, as the case may be, shall forthwith be deposited in the said box. Provided that all the ballot-papers to which any person may be entitled at the polling-booth shall be demanded and received by him at one and the same time, and no person having once demanded and received any such ballot-paper or papers, and voted by the same, shall at the same election receive any further ballot-papers, or exercise any further right of voting.

30. *Ballot-papers to be numbered.*—Before delivering any ballot-paper to the voter, the returning officer or his deputy shall write upon the back of each such ballot-paper, as near as practicable to the lower edge thereof, the number set opposite to the voter's name in the roll, and shall thereupon, upon a copy of such roll, check off such voter's name as having voted, and mark against such name the number of ballot-papers delivered to such voter.

31. *Informal ballot-papers.*—If any voter suffer to remain upon his ballot-paper a greater number of names not struck out than the number of commissioners to be elected, the vote given on and by such paper shall be void and of no effect.

32. *What question may be asked.*—At any election of commissioners, the returning officer may, if he see fit, or if required to do so by any candidate or scrutineer, put to any person tendering his vote the question following:—

“Are you the person whose name appears as (A.B.) in the roll now in force for this trust, being enrolled therein in respect of land in the parish of _____, being (here specify land as described in the roll)?”

And no other question shall be put to any person tendering his vote; and no person who shall refuse to answer such question, or who shall not answer the same absolutely in the affirmative, shall receive a ballot-paper or be permitted to vote.

33. *False answer, polling twice, and personation.*—Every person who shall wilfully make a false answer to the question aforesaid, or who shall poll more than once, or offer to poll more than once at the same election; or who shall depart or attempt to depart from any polling-booth after having received a ballot-paper without having deposited the same in the ballot-box as hereinbefore provided, or who shall personate any other person for the purpose of polling at such election, shall be guilty of a breach of these regulations; but nothing contained in this clause shall apply to any person only by reason of his exercising the right of voting as often as it appears by the roll he is entitled so to do.

34. *Result of polling, how ascertained.*—*Returning officer to have casting vote.*—Immediately upon the close of the poll, the returning officer shall, in the presence of and subject to the inspection of so many of the scrutineers of the candidates as please to be present, proceed to ascertain the number of votes for each candidate; and such returning officer shall abstain from inspecting the number written as aforesaid on any ballot-paper, and take care that the same is not seen by any person before being sealed up as herein provided; and the returning officer shall seal up the ballot-papers deposited in the booth, and as soon as conveniently may be on or after the day of the poll publicly declare the candidates not exceeding the number of vacancies to be filled up who have received the greatest number of votes; and if two or more candidates have received an equal number of votes, the returning officer shall in each case have the casting vote.

35. *Ballot-papers, how disposed of.*—The returning officer shall, in the case of the said first election of commissioners, forthwith after the declaration of the poll endorse with a description of the contents thereof and sign the sealed parcel of ballot-papers, and forward the same to the Minister, who shall, as soon as may be after the first meeting of trust commissioners of the trust, to be by him safely and secretly kept for six months then next ensuing, and then by him caused to be destroyed in the presence of three commissioners of the trust; but in all subsequent elections the parcel of ballot-papers so sealed, endorsed, and signed shall be delivered by the returning officer to the said secretary, to be by him safely and secretly kept for six months after such delivery, and then by him caused to be destroyed in the presence of three of the commissioners of the trust.

36. *Minister to determine questions arising upon first election.*—If any question arise as to the due election of any commissioner at the first election, the returning officer shall, at the request of any voter or candidate, submit such question in writing to the Minister, who shall decide the same, and such decision shall be final and binding.

37. *Questions arising upon subsequent elections to be determined by trust.*—If any question arise as to the due election of any commissioner at any subsequent election, whether ordinary or extraordinary, such question shall be determined by the commissioners of the trust at the first ordinary meeting held after the election; but no commissioner in respect of whose election such question shall have arisen shall act as a commissioner at such meeting, or be entitled to take any part in the proceedings thereof, or in any manner or at any time to act as a commissioner until such question shall have been so determined, and the majority of the commissioners whose election is not in dispute shall form a quorum.

38. *Appeal to Minister from determination of trust.*—In event of any voter or candidate feeling aggrieved by the determination of the trust with reference to any such question as last aforesaid, he may appeal therefrom to the Minister within fourteen days from the date upon which the commissioners shall have determined the question, and the Minister may make such inquiry as to the merits of the question as may appear to him to be necessary, and determine such question in such manner as to him may appear just, and such determination of the Minister shall be final and binding.

39. *Failure to elect deemed to create extraordinary vacancies.*—If at any election of commissioners no vacancies or a number of vacancies less than the whole number which should have been filled up at such election are filled up, then the vacancies which are not so filled shall severally be deemed extraordinary vacancies and to have occurred on the day appointed for such election. Provided always that the commissioners eventually elected to fill such vacancies shall go out of office as if elected at such election.

40. *Expenses of election to be paid by trust.*—The expenses incurred by the returning officer, or under his direction, in connection with any election, shall be defrayed by the trust.

41. *Penalty for breach of regulations.*—These regulations shall also be deemed to be regulations under section 250 of *The Irrigation Act 1886*, and any person guilty of a breach of any of the provisions of these regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, to be recovered in a summary manner before justices of the peace.

42. *Interpretation.*—In these regulations words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, unless there is something in the context repugnant to or inconsistent with this interpretation.

WHEREAS by the *Irrigation Act 1886* it is provided that any Municipal Council or Waterworks Trust or Irrigation Trust, or any two or more together of such Councils or Trusts, or the majority in number of the ratepayers in any proposed district, or the majority in number of the owners of land within any proposed district, such majority being the owners of at least half the land in the proposed district, may petition the Governor in Council to constitute such district an Irrigation and Water Supply District, and to appoint and create a Trust therein. And it is further provided by the said Act that before any district or trust can be constituted or appointed under the said Act upon a petition from any municipal council or waterworks trust, or from any two or more together of any such councils or trusts, or from a majority in number of ratepayers in any proposed district, or upon a petition from a majority of the owners of land within any proposed district, that a petition from owners of land, being an absolute majority of the owners of land within the proposed district, such majority being owners of at least half the land in such proposed district, shall be presented to the Governor in Council, praying that the scheme or plan of works of such first petition as set out in the declaration of the Minister, published under the said Act, may be adopted in part or in whole. And it is further enacted that, after compliance with the provisions in the said Act, the Governor in Council may approve of the scheme proposed, either with or without any alterations, additions, or restrictions, as he may think fit or he may disapprove of the same, and, if he approve of the same, either with or without alterations, he shall make an Order in Council accordingly. And it is further enacted that, if the Governor in Council approve of such proposed scheme, with or without alterations, or additions, or restrictions, he may, by Order

in Council, constitute the proposed district an Irrigation and Water Supply District, and appoint and create an Irrigation and Water Supply Trust to construct, maintain, and continue the works described in the Order.

And whereas the majority in number of the owners of the land within the boundaries of the proposed district, as shown upon the plan accompanying their petition, being the owners of at least half the land within such proposed district, have, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act petitioned the Governor in Council to constitute the proposed district, as shown upon the plan accompanying their petition, an Irrigation and Water Supply District, and to appoint and create a trust therein for carrying out the scheme or plan of works proposed in the said petition: And whereas all the provisions of the Act necessary to precede the declaration in writing of the Minister upon the said petition having been complied with, the Minister duly published his declaration in the *Government Gazette*, on the sixth day of May 1887, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act: And whereas, after due observance of the steps necessary under the said Act to precede such a petition, and, on this 26th day of September 1887, a petition of an absolute majority of the owners of land in the district proposed to be constituted, such majority being the owners of at least half the land in such proposed district, hath been presented to the Governor in Council praying that the scheme or plan of works of such first-named petition as set out in the said delaration in writing of the Minister might be adopted: And whereas, after compliance with all the provisions under the said Act necessary to be observed before approval of the scheme proposed, the Governor in Council has, by an Order in Council dated this twenty-sixth day of September 1887, approved of the said proposed scheme: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in accordance with the provisions of and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Irrigation Act 1886, doth declare, order, and direct:—

1. That the said proposed district shall be and the same is hereby constituted as, from the date of this order, an "Irrigation and Water Supply District" under the said Irrigation Act 1886, and an Irrigation and Water Supply Trust is hereby appointed and created to construct, maintain, and continue the works in this order described, in accordance with the provisions of this order and of the said Act.

2. That the limits and boundaries of the district within which such irrigation and water supply trust shall have authority, and which district shall henceforth be an irrigation and water supply district, shall be those contained within the limits and boundaries of the area of the said Irrigation and Water Supply District hereby constituted, as such limits and boundaries are set out and described in the First Schedule hereto.

3. That the name of the said irrigation and water supply district shall be the "Swan Hill Irrigation and Water Supply District," and the corporate name of the said irrigation and water supply trust shall be the "Swan Hill Irrigation and Water Supply Trust."

4. That the scheme of the said Swan Hill Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall be the diversion of water from the River Murray and the distribution of such water upon the lands of the said Swan Hill Irrigation and Water Supply District, and that the works to be constructed and maintained are those set out in the Second Schedule hereto, all of which works are trust works.

5. That the source from which the said Swan Hill Irrigation and Water Supply Trust is to obtain its supply is the River Murray, and that the quantities of water to be taken from the said River Murray is not to exceed, in summer, that is to say, from the first day of December to the thirtieth day of June, both days inclusive, fifteen hundred cubic feet per minute; and in winter, that is to say, from the first day of July to the thirtieth day of November, both days inclusive, nine hundred cubic feet per minute.

6. That the total amount proposed to be expended in trust works in Nine thousand pounds (£9,000).

7. That the amount of money proposed to be advanced by the Board of Land and Works to the trust, by way of loan, is Nine thousand pounds (£9,000), that the rate of interest to be paid upon such loan is Four pounds ten shillings per centum per annum, being one-half per cent. higher than the rate paid by the Government upon the public loan, out of which such monies are to be advanced; the rate of such interest to be subject to reduction, in accordance with section 146 of the Act, in event of the interest paid by the Government upon such public loan being reduced.

8. That the number of persons to be elected as commissioners of the said Swan Hill Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall be nine, and the period for which such commissioners shall hold office shall be three years.

9. That the amount of monies which may be borrowed by the said Swan Hill Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall not at any time, together with any balances due from the trust to the board, or upon any trust loan, exceed the sum of Nine thousand pounds (£9,000); and no rate made by the said Swan Hill Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall exceed the sum of £50 per cent. upon the annual valuation of the property within the said Swan Hill Irrigation and Water Supply District.

10. That the maximum amount which may be paid out of a loan raised by the said Swan Hill Irrigation and Water Supply Trust in defraying the preliminary costs and expenses of application for this order shall be Fifty pounds (£50).

WHEREAS by the *Irrigation Act 1886* it is provided that any Municipal Council, or Waterworks Trust, or Irrigation Trust, or any two or more together of such Councils or Trusts, or the majority in number of the ratepayers in any proposed district, or the majority in number of the owners of land within any proposed district, such majority being the owners of at least half the land in the proposed district, may petition the Governor in Council to constitute such district an Irrigation and Water Supply District, and to appoint and create a Trust therein. And it is further provided by the said Act that, before any district or Trust can be constituted or appointed under the said Act upon a petition from any Municipal Council or Waterworks Trust, or from any two or more together of any such Councils or Trusts, or from a majority in number of ratepayers in any proposed district, or upon a petition from a majority of the owners of land within any proposed district, that a petition from owners of land, being an absolute majority of the owners of land within the proposed district, such majority being owners of at least half the land in such proposed district, shall be presented to the Governor in Council, praying that the scheme or plan of works of such first petition, as set forth in the declaration of the Minister, published under the said Act, may be adopted in part or in whole. And it is further enacted that, after compliance with the provisions in the said Act, the Governor in Council may approve of the scheme proposed, either with or without any alterations, or additions, or restrictions as he may think fit, or he may disapprove of the same; and, if he approve of the same, either with or without alterations, he shall make an Order in Council accordingly.

And whereas the majority in number of the owners of land within the boundaries of the proposed district, as shown upon the plan accompanying their petition, being the owners of at least half the land in such proposed district, have, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, petitioned the Governor in Council to constitute the proposed district, as shown upon the plan accompanying their petition, an Irrigation and Water Supply District, and to appoint and create a Trust therein for carrying out the scheme or plan of works proposed in the said petition.

And whereas all the provisions of the Act necessary to precede the declaration in writing of the Minister upon the said petition having been complied with, the Minister duly published his declaration in the *Government Gazette* on the sixth day of May 1887 in accordance with the provisions of the said Act.

And whereas after the observance of the steps necessary under the said Act to precede such a petition on this twenty-sixth day of September 1887 a petition of an absolute majority of the owners of land in the district so proposed to be constituted, such majority being the owners of at least half the land in such proposed district, hath been presented to the Governor in Council praying that the scheme or plan of works of such first-named petition as

set out in the said declaration in writing of the Minister might be adopted.

And whereas the Governor in Council, having taken all the circumstances into consideration, and having ascertained and being satisfied that there has been a compliance with all the provisions of the said Act necessary to be observed before the approval of the scheme of the petition for the constitution of the proposed district as an Irrigation and Water Supply District and for the appointment and creation of a Trust therein, has determined to approve of the scheme proposed by such petition.

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in accordance with the provisions of and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said *Irrigation Act 1886*, doth hereby approve of the scheme of the said recited petition for the constitution of the proposed district as an Irrigation and Water Supply District, and for the appointment and creation of a Trust therein, as such scheme is set out in the schedule hereto, in which also are set out the boundaries and area of the proposed district.

SCHEDULE.

The particulars of the scheme of irrigation and of the proposed works as approved in this Order, are—

- a. The irrigation of about fourteen thousand three hundred acres of land, situate within the said district, by means of—

WHEREAS by *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1881* it was amongst other things enacted that, at the expiration of two months after the notice of any application should have been first advertised in the *Government Gazette*, the Minister, if satisfied that the provisions of the now in part recited Act have been substantially complied with, should submit such application, and the general plan and description therein referred to, and all petitions which have been received in respect of such application, to the Governor in Council, together with any recommendations as to the granting of the application, or as to any alterations or additions he might think desirable in the proposed Waterworks; And the Governor in Council might thereupon approve of the construction of such proposed Waterworks, with or without any alterations or additions in the general plan and description thereof, or might disapprove of the construction of such Waterworks, and should make an Order in Council accordingly: And it was further enacted that, if the Governor in Council should approve of the construction of such Waterworks, with or without alterations, or additions, or restrictions of any such general plan and description, a Waterworks Trust should be constituted to construct, maintain, and

continue the whole or any part of the Waterworks therein described, in accordance with the provisions of such Order and of the now in part recited Act: And every Order approving the construction of any proposed Waterworks, and of the constituting of a Waterworks Trust for the purpose, should state—

- (a) The amount of money which the Governor in Council would grant as a loan for the purpose of carrying out the same and paying the cost and expense of the plans and application for the same; and also the rate of interest which would be charged for such loan, such rate being at least One-half per centum more than the rate payable by the Government on the Public Loan out of which such loan might be granted.
- (b) Should proclaim the limits of the lands, whether within or without the municipal districts of the council or councils applying for the proposed Waterworks, within which such Trust should have authority, to be called a Waterworks District.
- (c) Should state what are the principal works to be constructed; and
- (d) Should contain such provisions (not inconsistent with the now in part recited Act) as according to the nature of the application and the facts and circumstances of each case the Governor in Council should think fit.

And it was further enacted by section 79 of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1883*, No. 778, that whenever a Waterworks District was either wholly or with the exception of the Waterworks or proposed Waterworks thereof within one municipal district, the Governor in Council might appoint the municipal council for the time being of such municipal district together with one or more persons not being members of such municipal council to be the Waterworks Trust of such Waterworks District: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Acts, has approved of a general plan and description as set forth in a certain application of the President and Ratepayers of the Shire of Winchelsea for a Loan of Three thousand pounds sterling, to carry out certain Waterworks for the supply of a Waterworks District under the said Act, embracing such portion of the Shire of Winchelsea as is shown on the plan accompanying the said application, together with the general plan and description therein referred to, deposited in the Department of Victorian Water Supply, Melbourne, and doth hereby order and appoint as follows:—

- (1.) The construction of the said Waterworks.
- (2.) The Municipal Council of the Shire of Winchelsea for the time being and one other Commissioner to be the Waterworks Trust of such Waterworks District.
- (3.) That the amount of the loan hereby granted shall be Three thousand pounds sterling, for the purpose of carrying out approved works and paying the cost and expense of the plans and application for the same; and that the interest to be charged for such loan shall be at the rate of Four pounds ten shillings per centum per annum, payable half-yearly.
- (4.) That the limits of the land within which the said Waterworks Trust shall have authority shall be that portion of the Shire of Winchelsea included within the boundaries hereunder described, viz.:—Commencing at the mouth of Stony Creek in the parish of Lorne, county of Colwarth; thence bounded by the said Stony Creek to a point bearing north twenty-six degrees thirty minutes east from the north-west angle of J. A. Wilson's selection, section four of block three, parish of Lorne; thence by the west boundary of the said section four to the south-west angle thereof; thence by the south boundary of the said section four for a length of five chains eighteen links; thence by the west boundary line of blocks twenty and eighteen, township of Lorne, to the south-west angle of said block eighteen; thence by a straight line bearing south-westerly to the north angle of section two of block three, parish of Lorne; thence by the north-west boundary of said section two; thence by the west boundary of section one of block three, parish of Lorne; thence north-westerly by a line situated one chain and fifty links north from the north bank of the River Erskine (being the boundary of the river reserve) to a point formed by the intersection of a line parallel to the west boundary of section twenty-six of portion V, parish of Lorne, and twenty chains west of same; thence by the said line running due south from the last mentioned point to the intersection of the two-chain Government road from the Lorne township; thence south-easterly by the said two-chain Government road (forming the south boundaries of sections twenty-six, twenty-five, twenty-four A and B of portion V, parish of Lorne) to the south-west angle of W. A. Mountjoy's section three of block three, parish of Lorne; thence south to a point one chain east from the north-east angle of section twenty-two of portion V, parish of Lorne; thence south-easterly by a straight line to a point on the west boundary line of Otway street, intersected by a tributary creek to the St. George River (or Fisher's Creek) and near the south-west angle of suburban allotment thirty-five, township of Lorne; thence by the said tributary creek south-westerly to its junction with Fisher's Creek; thence by Fisher's Creek to its mouth; thence by the coast line of Bass Straits and Loutit Bay northward to the commencing point.
- (5.) The principal works to be constructed shall consist of a weir on the Erskine River; a main channel, including fluming, a service reservoir, and a system of pipe reticulation for the Town of Lorne.
- (6.) The name of the Trust shall be the "Shire of Winchelsea Waterworks Trust."

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1874* (38 Vict. No. 506), it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might, from time to time, make Orders, amongst other things, to constitute any part of Victoria containing rateable property capable of yielding upon a rate not exceeding One shilling in the pound on the annual value thereof, estimated under the provisions of the said Act, the sum of Five hundred pounds, a Shire, and it was further enacted that every Order under the provisions of Part I. of the said Act should be published in the *Government Gazette*, and should take effect as from the day of such publication; And whereas a petition has been presented to the Governor in Council in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, signed by not less than fifty inhabitants of the part of Victoria described in such petition (being an outlying district and not in any shire) who possess rateable property therein, praying that such part should be constituted a municipality by the name of the Shire of Healesville: And whereas the substance and prayer of such petition has been published in the manner directed by the said Act, and no counter-petition or petitions in opposition thereto have been presented: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make Order constituting and describing a shire to be named the Shire of Healesville, and defining the boundaries of such Shire in manner following, that is to say:—

SHIRE OF HEALESVILLE.—Commencing at the junction of the Watts and Yarra Rivers; thence southerly and easterly by the Yarra River to a point in same south of the road forming the boundary between allotment 12 and allotments 1B and 11, parish of Gracedale; thence north to and by said road and the boundary between the selections of Alice G. Peal and James Heap to the north-west angle of the last-named selection; thence east by James Heap's north boundary to a point due south of the south-west angle of Benjamin Lathern's allotment; thence north to said angle; thence east by the south boundary of Lathern and Ley Jackson's allotments to the south-east angle of the latter; thence following the eastern boundary of Ley Jackson's, Elizabeth Barbour's, William Goodall's (jun.), and John Green's (jun.) allotments to the Badger Creek; thence by a direct line bearing north-easterly to Mount Arnold; thence by a line north-westerly, being the boundary of the Shire of Alexandra, to the northern angle of the parish of Buxton; thence south-westward by the boundary of this parish to the Acheron River; thence following the Acheron River and the boundary of the Shire of Yea southerly to a point due west of the north-western angle of allotment 1, parish of Granton; thence by a line south-westerly

to Mount St. Leonard; thence by the Dividing Range, being the boundary of the Shire of Eltham to Mount Monda; thence south magnetic to the Watts River; thence following the Watts River down to the starting point.

Wherever the line so described as aforesaid runs beside or along any river, creek, or road, whether such is specifically mentioned or not, the centre of such river, creek, or road, shall be taken to be the boundary line.

The Council of the said Shire of Healesville shall consist of nine members, and such municipal district is not to be subdivided at present.

"The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883."

SHIRE OF CORIO.

BYE-LAW No. 1, AS TO DAIRIES, DAIRY CATTLE, AND MILK.

THE Local Board of Health in and for the Shire of Corio, in the Colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in *The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883*, and every other power enabling the said Local Board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said Local Board, doth hereby make the following bye-law, being Bye-law No. 1 of the said Local Board of Health, that is to say:—

1. All former bye-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed.
2. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.
3. This bye-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the Shire of Corio.

Registration of Cowkeepers, Dairywomen, and Purveyors of Milk.

4. Every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall, on or before the first day of February in every year, register himself with the Local Board of Health in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the Secretary of the Local Board of Health an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall with every such application pay a fee of Two shillings and sixpence (2/6).

5. Upon receipt of every such application and fee, the Secretary for the Local Board of Health shall endorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received, and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

6. All paddocks, grounds, lands, and enclosures used as grazing ground for dairy cattle shall, whenever necessary, be inspected by any member or officer of the said Local Board, or by any person authorized in writing by the Chairman or Secretary of the said Local Board; and if, on inspection, such paddocks, grounds, or enclosures, or any one of them, are or is likely in the opinion of the officer or person so inspecting to be prejudicial to health, by affecting the milk or otherwise, the said Local Board may, by an order in writing signed by the Secretary, and served personally or left at the dwelling-house of the registered person, or in the case of an unregistered person served personally or left at his dwelling-place, or posted upon the land, prohibit the use of the same for the purpose of feeding dairy cattle either absolutely or for any time named in such order. All cattle in dairies shall also be similarly inspected by a veterinary surgeon or other competent person, and any cows found to be diseased, or which from poverty or weakness are, in the opinion of the inspector, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, shall be forthwith removed from such dairy if ordered by such inspector or other officer as aforesaid. And any such order as aforesaid the said Local Board

may revoke, but upon every fresh inspection a similar order may from time to time be made.

7. All houses, dairies, cowsheds, milk stores, milk shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated; and the drainage of all such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not.

8. All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows shall be regularly swept, and be kept perfectly clean, and shall, within twenty-four hours of any order to such effect from the health officer or inspector of nuisances, be fumigated, disinfected, or lime-washed, as may be in any such order so directed.

9. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily.

10. If any person, or any member of the family of any person, registered as aforesaid, or not so registered, but employed as a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor or member of the family of any visitor to any such person, shall be attacked by typhoid fever or any dangerous infectious disease, the occupier of the house in which such person shall be, or (if he be the person attacked) his wife or other person in charge, shall immediately give notice thereof to the Local Board or officer of health, or to the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the Local Board of Health, and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said Local Board or the officer of health, by order served as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of any such cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, until danger, in the opinion of such Local Board or officer of health, no longer exists. And in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering, or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering, to milk cows or to handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business. Nor, if the person registered or conducting such business be himself the person suffering, shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until, in either case, all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk or of its contamination has ceased.

11. If at any time disease exists in the dairy, or among the cows or cattle in any cowshed or dairy, or in the herds of any cowkeeper, dairyman, vendor or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the Local Board, officer of health, or nearest member of the police force; and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.

12. No cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep or permit or suffer to be kept any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.

13. In the interpretation of this bye-law words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural and the plural the singular, and the word "person" shall include a corporation.

14. Every person guilty of any breach of this bye-law or of any of its provisions shall be liable, in the discretion of the convicting justices, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings, or in the like discretion to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings, for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

The foregoing bye-law was duly made, ordered, and passed by the Local Board of Health (being the Municipal Council) in and for the Shire of Corio this twenty-fifth day of August, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-five (1885).
