EXTENSION TO GREECE OF THE PROVISIONS OF THE "FOREIGN DESERTERS ACT 1852."

13 July 1887. SIR,—I have the honor to transmit to you, for publication in the Colony under your Government, a copy of an Order of Her Majesty in Council, extending the provisions of *The Foreign Deserters Act 1852* to Greece.

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by the *Foreign Deserters Act 1852*, it is provided that, whenever it is made to appear to Her Majesty that due facilities are or will be given for recovering and apprehending seamen who desert from British merchant ships in the territories of any Foreign Power, Her Majesty may, by Order in Council stating that such facilities are or will be given, declare that seamen, not being slaves, who desert from merchant ships belonging to a subject of such Power, when within Her Majesty's Dominions, shall be liable to be apprehended and carried on board their respective ships, and may limit the operation of such Order, and may render the operation thereof subject to such conditions and qualifications, if any, as may be deemed expedient:

And whereas it has been made to appear to Her Majesty that due facilities will be given for recovering and apprehending seamen who desert from British merchant ships in the dominions and possessions of His Majesty the King of the Hellenes:

Now therefore, Her Majesty, by virtue of the power vested in Her by the said *Foreign Deserters Act 1852*, and by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to order and declare, and it is hereby ordered and declared, that from and after the publication hereof in the *London Gazette*, seamen, not being slaves, and not being British subjects, who within Her Majesty's Dominions, desert from merchant ships belonging to subjects of His Majesty the King of the Hellenes, shall be liable to be apprehended and carried on board their respective ships: Provided always that if any such deserter has committed any crime in Her Majesty's Dominions, he may be detained till he has been tried by a competent court, and until his sentence, if any, has been carried into effect.

And the Secretary of State for the Home Department, the Secretary of State for the Colonies, and the Secretary of State for India in Council, are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

Regulation No. 47 of Part II. of the Regulations made by the Commissioners on the fourth day of December 1884 is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof the following shall be substituted, and shall be read with and as forming part of the said Regulations, viz.:—

RATE OF SPEED.

"190. No steamship shall be navigated between the Falls Bridge and the Outlet Canal leading from North Melbourne Swamp, or when passing works in progress on the banks of the river, vessels at anchor or aground, tug steamers with trains in tow, sunken vessels, or vessels moored at any wharf, at a greater rate of speed than a maximum rate of four nautical miles per hour *over the ground*. No steamship shall be navigated in the river between the Outlet Canal and the Black Buoy at the entrance of the River Yarra Yarra at a greater rate of speed than a maximum rate of seven nautical miles per hour *over the ground*, or within any other part of the port at a greater rate of speed than a maximum rate of eight nautical miles per hour *over the ground*."

This Regulation shall not apply to steam lighters, steam launches, or small steamers drawing less than seven feet of water, and whose engines are under twenty-five horse-power nominal.

LICENSE FEES.

"181. The words in Regulation No. 167 of Part II. of the Regulations made by the Commissioners on the fourth day of December 1884, viz.: For every ballast lighter or other craft 'per annum £1 1s.' are hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof the following shall be substituted, and shall be read with and as forming part of the said Regulation, viz.:—For every ballast lighter or other craft of 40 tons and under, £1 1. For every additional ton per annum, 3d."

REGULATIONS RESPECTING THE NEW CHANNEL ACROSS FISHERMAN'S BEND.

179.—"1. No vessel shall be navigated in or through the New Channel at a greater rate of speed than five nautical miles per hour over the ground.

"2. No vessel shall anchor in the New Channel, or moor or make fast to the warping piles on its banks, and should any vessel from any cause whatever be detained in the New Channel, the master must immediately procure a steam tug and cause such vessel to be removed therefrom.

"3. No rafts or logs of timber shall be anchored or made fast in the New Channel.

"4. No sailing vessel of any description shall enter the New Channel unless there shall be a commanding breeze which will enable such vessel to navigate the New Channel without tacking or luffing up.

"5. No vessel shall track or pole up or down the New Channel.

"6. Clause No. 108 of part 2 of the regulations made by the Commissioners, on the 4th day of December 1884, shall be deemed to apply to and include the New Channel, and shall also apply to and include a procession of boats.

"7. These regulations shall be read and construed together with the regulations of the Commissioners made on the 4th day of December 1884, the 31st day of July 1885, and the 22nd day of July 1886, respectively."

Intending excursionists from stations other than those mentioned above, within a radius of 100 miles from Melbourne, Geelong, Ballarat, Ararat, Stawell, Murtosa, Horsham, Dimboola, Nhll, and Serviceton, can obtain Jubilee tickets at the same fares from the nearest station issuing such tickets, but they will require to travel by ordinary train (without extra charge) to the nearest station at which the Jubilee excursion train stops; thence to Adelaide and back by the special to stations at which the trains stop; thence by ordinary trains to destination. Excursionists from stations outside the radius of 100 miles will require to pay ordinary fares by ordinary trains to and from the stations within the radius whence the Jubilee tickets will be available as set forth above. GRANT OF ONE HUNDRED AND FIFTY POUNDS (£150) FOR INVENTION OF MACHINERY FOR THRASHING PEASE.

A SUM not exceeding One hundred and fifty pounds may be paid to any person or company who shall, in the opinion of the Minister of Agriculture, produce a machine capable of thrashing within twelve hours eight hundred bushels of pease without injury thereto.

2. The reward shall be paid only to the inventor, or his agent, of such machine as shall most cheaply, efficiently, and rapidly perform the work required, and within the time aforesaid.

3. Persons intending to compete for the reward must give notice in writing of their intention to the Secretary for Agriculture, Melbourne, not later than the 24th November next.

4. One or more trials of the machines shall be made at such place or places and at such times as the Minister may direct.

5. All costs and expenses of forwarding, attendance, and working the machines at the times to be appointed shall be paid by the persons entering the machines for competition.

6. The Minister may appoint three or more judges to report upon the merits of the competing machines, and a decision of a majority of such judges shall be final.

7. The judges may recommend payment of an amount or amounts the total of which shall not exceed One hundred and fifty pounds (£150) to the inventor or inventors, or his or their agent or agents, of the successful machine or machines, such amounts to be apportioned to the value to the colony of the said invention or inventions.
