SPECIAL NOTICE TO HOLDERS OF ELECTORS' RIGHTS.

IT is hereby notified that holders of electors' rights issued on or before the 1st December 1886 must obtain renewed rights in lieu thereof, in order to have their names placed upon the General Lists to be made up on and after the 1st December next.

Neglect of this precaution will result in the omission of the names of the persons so neglecting from the new Lists to be made up as aforesaid.

The old right must in every case be delivered up to the Registrar, but the renewed right will be equally available for any election that may take place before the completion of the new Rolls in January next.

Intending applicants for electors' rights are cautioned to carefully ascertain whether they are fully qualified under the law; inasmuch as a penalty on conviction is imposed upon persons knowingly and wilfully obtaining electors' rights when not qualified.

GRANT OF ONE HUNDRED AND FIFTY POUNDS
(£150) FOR INVENTION OF MACHINERY FOR
THRASHING PEASE.

A SUM not exceeding One hundred and fifty pounds may be paid to any person or company who shall, in the opinion of the Minister of Agriculture, produce a machine capable of thrashing within twelve hours eight hundred bushels of pease without injury thereto.

2. The reward shall be paid only to the inventor, or his agent, of such machine as shall most cheaply, efficiently, and rapidly perform the work required, and within the time aforesaid.

3. Persons intending to compete for the reward must give notice in writing of their intention to the Secretary for Agriculture, Melbourne, not later than the 24th November next.

4. One or more trials of the machines shall be made at such place or places and at such times as the Minister may direct.

5. All costs and expenses of forwarding, attendance, and working the machines at the times to be appointed shall be paid by the persons entering the machines for competition.

6. The Minister may appoint three or more judges to report upon the merits of the competing machines, and a decision of a majority of such judges shall be final.

7. The judges may recommend payment of an amount or amounts the total of which shall not exceed One hundred and fifty pounds (£150) to the inventor or inventors, or his or their agent or agents, of the successful machine or machines, such amounts to be apportioned to the value to the colony of the said invention or inventions.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

SANDFORD RACECOURSE AND RECREATION RESERVE.—REGULATIONS.

WE, James McCormack, James Andison, the elder, Edwin Portman Woodland, Thomas Francis McCormack, and John Stewart Anderson, a majority of the members of the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Sandford Racecourse and Recreation Reserve, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 133 of *The Land Act 1884*.

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days as the reserve may be set apart by the committee of management for the holding therein of fêtes or sports.
2. No person shall enter the reserve on any day set apart for sports or fêtes, nor be permitted to bring therein any horse, carriage, or vehicle, except on production of a ticket issued by the committee of management duly authorizing the admission of such person, horse, carriage, or vehicle; but no such ticket of admission shall be of any avail except on the date printed thereon, nor shall it authorize the holder thereof to enter any building, erection, enclosure, or cultivated plot within the reserve; and every such ticket shall be surrendered on demand to the gatekeepers or other persons authorized by the committee of management to collect the same.
3. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
4. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, or light fires therein.
5. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, or stick bills thereon, or in any way damage any of the buildings, gates, fences, or other property in the reserve, nor leave, throw, or roll stones therein, nor pollute any of the waterholes, nor remove any soil, sand, or manure from the reserve.

WEST MELBOURNE RECREATION RESERVE.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE PARISH OF DOUTTA GALLA, KNOWN AS THE "WEST MELBOURNE RECREATION RESERVE."

WE, James William Peirce, Richard Bowen, John Litty, Arthur Stephenson, Francis Gunn, Francis James Dickson, and John Illman, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Public Recreation in the parish of Doutta Galla, hereinafter designated "West Melbourne Recreation Reserve," having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 133 of *The Land Act 1884*—

Regulations.

1. The "West Melbourne Recreation Reserve" shall be divided as follows:—

- (1.) The grand stand, pavilion, members' and ladies' reserves.
- (2.) The playing ground.
- (3.) The remainder of the reserve.

2. All persons shall be admitted to the third division free of charge from sunrise to sunset, except on days whereon international, intercolonial, cup, or other important cricket or football matches shall be played, or on days on which sports shall be held in the "West Melbourne Recreation Reserve." Provided always that the number of days upon which fees for admission to the "West Melbourne Recreation Reserve" may be charged and collected shall not exceed more than fifty-two (52) in any one (1) year.

3. No person shall enter at any time into any part of the first division except on production of a ticket, issued by the committee of management, duly authorizing such person in that behalf.

4. Every person paying for admission to the third division or any part thereof, or to the grand stand, shall be supplied with a ticket of admission, which he shall upon demand produce, and if required surrender to any gatekeeper or other person having authority from the committee of management to demand production or surrender of same; and no such ticket of admission shall be of any avail except on the day for which it is issued.

5. Persons renting or hiring any stand, buildings, erection, or enclosure for the occasion of any cricket or football match or sports may be required to deposit any sum not exceeding Ten pounds, which the committee of management may determine, by way of guarantee that due care will be taken of such stand, buildings, erection, or enclosure, and the committee of management may make repairs or make good any damage or loss sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or any thing contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by any person by way of guarantee; and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these regulations and by any order given by the committee of management in reference to the reserve, buildings, erections, or enclosures for the time being thereon.

6. No person shall enter or remain in the "West Melbourne Recreation Reserve" who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

7. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the "West Melbourne Recreation Reserve," nor shall fires be lighted therein.

8. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, or stick bills thereon, or cut names on or in any way damage any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the "West Melbourne Recreation Reserve," nor leave or deposit any glass or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones therein.

9. No person shall put in the "West Melbourne Recreation Reserve" any cattle, sheep, goats, or other animals.

10. No person shall bring into the "West Melbourne Recreation Reserve" any dog, unless led by a chain or cord.

11. No person shall erect any dwelling in the "West Melbourne Recreation Reserve," nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained.

12. No persons, except workmen employed in the "West Melbourne Recreation Reserve," shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for the plantation of young trees or shrubs.

13. Any person committing in the "West Melbourne Recreation Reserve," or in any of the buildings or erections for the time being thereon, any of the following offences shall be liable to be removed from the reserve, notwithstanding such person may have purchased and shall or may be in possession of a ticket of admission to the reserve or any part thereof:—

- (a) Being drunk or using profane, indecent, or obscene language.
- (b) Assaulting any person, making use of any abusive, threatening, or insulting expressions, or behaving in an improper or riotous manner.
- (c) Crossing or trespassing upon the playing ground during a cricket or football match or sports, or during practice at cricket, or when crossing or trespassing upon the ground would be injurious to it as a cricket ground.
- (d) Being found in any part of the 1st, 2nd, or 3rd divisions of the "West Melbourne Recreation Reserve" and not producing, on demand, or surrendering, if required, to any gatekeeper, or other person duly authorized, a ticket for the admission of such person to the place wherein he or she may be found, unless such person shall forthwith

satisfy the committee of management, or any person deputed by it, that he or she has paid the proper charge for admission to such place, and that the ticket of admission supplied to such person has been lost.

(e) Obtaining admission to any part of the 1st, 2nd, or 3rd division when not entitled to such admission under these regulations.

14. The maximum scale of charges for admission to the 3rd division and grand stand shall be as follows:—

(a) For admission of each person to the 3rd division during any international, intercolonial, cup, or other important cricket or football match or sports, such a sum as the committee of management may determine, not exceeding 2s. 6d.

(b) For admission of each person to the grand stand, such a sum as the committee of management may determine, not exceeding 5s.

Provided always that the committee of management may exempt any person wholly or partially from the payment of all or any of such charges or fees.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 133 of *The Land Act 1884*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

REGULATIONS.

WE, Molesworth Richard Greene, William Hamilton McFarland, Thomas Cain, James Elijah Crook, and John Simpson, junr., the duly appointed trustees of the reserve for a Racecourse in the parish of Parwan, known as "Bacchus Marsh Racecourse Reserve," having framed the following regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and also for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by sec. 133 of *The Land Act 1884*—

Regulations.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public, free of charge, from sunrise to sunset, except on such days as the reserve may be set apart for races, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling (1s.) may be charged and taken for admission of every adult to the reserve; and a further sum not exceeding Ten shillings (10s.) for admission of every adult to the grand stand or such other enclosures as the trustees may from time to time determine.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein without the permission, in writing, of the trustees first obtained.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.

5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, sheep, horses, or pigs, without the permission, in writing, of the trustees first obtained: Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the trustees first obtained.

7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the trustees first obtained.

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8. No person, except laborers or workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

9. No person shall erect any circus or other tent, merry-go-round, or any kind or sort of stand in the reserve, or be allowed to conduct or carry on any game for profit in or upon the reserve without the permission, in writing, of the trustees first obtained.

10. No person shall enter the reserve for the purpose of occupying, residing in, or sleeping in any of the buildings or other erections thereon, or the enclosures surrounding them.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with sec. 133 of *The Land Act 1884*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly or wilfully offends against any such regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the

peace; and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

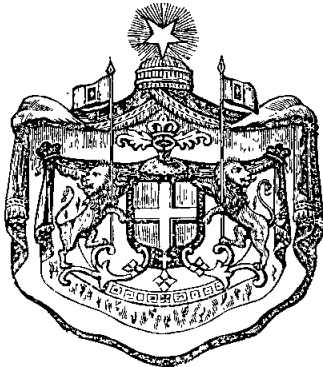
