## "FOREIGN DESERTERS ACT 1852."—EXTENSION OF PROVISIONS TO THE INDEPENDENT STATE OF THE CONGO.

I have the honor to transmit to you, for publication in the 10th Aug. 1888. colony under your Government, a copy of an Order of Her Majesty in Council, extending the provisions of the *Foreign Deserters Act 1852* to the Independent State of the Congo.

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by the *Foreign Deserters Act 1852* it is provided that whenever it is made to appear to Her Majesty that due facilities are or will be given for recovering and apprehending seamen who desert from British merchant ships in the territories of any foreign power, Her Majesty may, by Order in Council stating that such facilities are or will be given, declare that seamen, not being slaves, who desert from merchant ships belonging to a subject of such power when within Her Majesty's dominions, shall be liable to be apprehended and carried on board their respective ships, and may limit the operation of such Order, and may render the operation thereof subject to such conditions and qualifications, if any, as may be deemed expedient:

And whereas it has been made to appear to Her Majesty that due facilities will be given for recovering and apprehending seamen who desert from British merchant ships in the territories of the Independent State of the Congo:

Now therefore Her Majesty, by virtue of the power vested in Her by the said *Foreign Deserters Act 1852*, and by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to order and declare, and it is hereby ordered and declared, that from and after the publication hereof in the *London Gazette* seamen, not being slaves and not being British subjects, who within Her Majesty's dominions desert from merchant ships belonging to citizens of the Independent State of the Congo, shall be liable to be apprehended and carried on board their respective ships: Provided always that if any such deserter has committed any crime in Her Majesty's dominions he may be detained till he has been tried by a competent court, and until his sentence, if any, has been carried into effect.

And the Secretary of State for the Home Department, the Secretary of State for the Colonies, and the Secretary of State for India in Council are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Additional Regulation relative to the sale of goods within the Exhibition premises, made by the Commissioners of the Centennial International Exhibition, Melbourne, 1888, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 4 of *The Victorian Exhibitions Act 1878*.

THE CENTENNIAL INTERNATIONAL EXHIBITION, MELBOURNE,  
1888.

In pursuance of the *Exhibitors Protection Act 1872* and of *The Victorian Exhibitions Act 1878*, the "Exhibition Commissioners" appointed as Commissioners for the Centennial International Exhibition, Melbourne, 1888, make the following Regulation, namely:—

1. While the Exhibition is in progress, no goods brought into the Exhibition premises or manufactured therein shall, without the special authority of the Executive Commissioners of the said "Exhibition Commissioners," be sold and delivered or disposed of to any person within the Exhibition premises, or be removed therefrom or from the place allotted to the exhibitor for his exhibits.

2. Any person who, while the Exhibition is in progress and without having such special permission as aforesaid, sells and delivers or disposes of any goods brought into or manufactured within the Exhibition premises, or who removes or attempts to remove any such goods therefrom or from the place allotted to the exhibitor for his exhibits, shall be liable to a penalty for every offence not exceeding Ten pounds; and any person found offending against this Regulation may also be summarily expelled from the Exhibition premises.

3. The Executive Commissioners may at any time order the goods of any exhibitor to be removed from the Exhibition, if in their opinion the exhibitor, or his agent or representative, has himself violated this Regulation, or has permitted or suffered any person entrusted with the care of any of his exhibits to violate the same; and if the said goods be not removed in accordance with such order, the Executive Commissioners may themselves remove the same at the risk and expense of the exhibitor.

1. A sum not exceeding £150 may be paid to any person or company who shall, in the opinion of the Minister of Agriculture, produce a machine capable of threshing, within twelve hours, eight hundred bushels of pease without injury thereto.
2. The reward shall be paid only to the inventor, or his agent, of such machine as shall most cheaply, efficiently, and rapidly perform the work required, and within the time aforesaid.
3. Persons intending to compete for the award must give notice in writing of their intention to the Secretary for Agriculture, Government Offices, Melbourne, not later than 31st December 1888.
4. One or more trials of the machines shall be made at such place or places, and at such times as the Minister may direct.
5. All costs and expenses of forwarding, attendance, and working the machines at the times to be appointed, shall be paid by the persons entering the machines for competition.
6. The Minister may appoint three or more judges to report upon the merits of the competing machines, and the decision of a majority of such judges shall be final.
7. The judges may recommend payment of an amount or amounts, the total of which shall not exceed £150, to the inventor or inventors, or his or their agent or agents, of the successful machine or machines, such amounts to be apportioned to the value to the colony of the said invention or inventions.

The regulating works upon the River Loddon shall be National works. The Leaghur weir, the main supply channel to the point of diversion of the supply, between the Leaghur and Meering Trust and the Wandella Trust hereby constituted, and the regulating works shall be joint works. The other works of the scheme shall be Trust works.

5. That the source from which the said Wandella Irrigation and Water Supply Trust is to obtain its supply of water shall be the

River Loddon when regulated by the said National works; the quantity of water that the said Wandella Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall be entitled and required to take from the said River Loddon, after such river shall have been regulated by means of the regulating works hereinbefore mentioned, shall be six hundred and seventy cubic feet per minute, from the first day of July to the thirty-first day of October, and one hundred and thirty-four cubic feet per minute from the first day of November to the thirtieth day of April in each year; and that the proportion of water to be delivered to the said Wandella Irrigation and Water Supply Trust from the regulated Loddon River shall be  $\frac{144}{100}$ , after providing for compensation water.

6. That the rate of payment to be made by the said Wandella Irrigation and Water Supply Trust for the water supplied shall be a proportion of the total charges for interest, maintenance, and management of the National works hereinbefore mentioned equivalent to the proportion of the water from such works delivered from the said National works to the said Wandella Irrigation and Water Supply Trust.

- (a) For determining the period for which the commissioners of any trust shall hold office, the time and manner of election, and the order of their retirement from office.
- (b) For determining the manner in which elections of any such commissioners shall be held, and the manner of voting thereat.
- (c) For determining the manner in which any vacancies in the office of any such commissioners shall be filled up, and
- (d) For determining questions as to the due election of any such commissioner.

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the said

provisions of the now in part recited Act, doth, for the purposes aforesaid, so far as these may relate to a certain irrigation and water supply trust duly appointed and created under the said Act, and known as the Wandella Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, make the regulations following, viz:—

1. *Interpretation of terms.*—In these regulations, "the Minister" shall mean the Minister of Water Supply; "the trust" or "the said trust" shall mean the Wandella Irrigation and Water Supply Trust; and "the district," "the said district," or "the irrigation district" shall mean the lands as defined by the Order in Council appointing and creating the said trust wherein the trust shall have authority.

2. *Period for which commissioners shall hold office.*—Subject to the provisions in reference to the first election of commissioners hereinafter contained, for securing the annual retirement of two commissioners, the period during which the commissioners of the said trust shall hold office shall be three years.

3. *Annual retirement of commissioners.*—Three commissioners shall retire annually, but the retiring commissioners shall, subject to the provisions of the said Act, be eligible for re-election.

4. *Term of office of persons elected commissioners at first election.*—At the first election of commissioners one of the persons elected commissioners shall hold office as such commissioner for the term of three years, two others of such persons shall hold office for the term of two years, and the remaining three persons elected as such commissioners shall hold office for the term of one year, and the particular term for which each such person so elected a commissioner shall hold office shall be determined in manner following, (that is to say):—

(a) *How term of office is ascertained when no poll taken.*—If the first election is made without a poll, as in the case in these regulations provided, then the particular term for which each candidate elected as a commissioner shall hold office shall immediately upon such election be publicly determined by lot by the returning officer in such manner as to him may seem fit, and the returning officer shall thereupon immediately and publicly announce the term for which each individual candidate elected as a commissioner shall hold office as so determined, and shall report the same to the Minister.

(b) *How term of office ascertained when poll taken.*—If at the first election a poll shall be held as in these regulations provided, then of the six candidates elected as commissioners the candidate who shall have received the highest number of votes shall hold office as commissioner for the term of three years, and the two candidates who shall have received the next highest number of votes shall hold office for the term of two years, and the remaining three candidates who shall have been elected shall hold office for the term of one year; and if two or more than two candidates elected shall have obtained the same number of votes, then the returning officer shall determine by lot (as hereinbefore provided in the case of the first election if decided without ballot) the term or terms of three, two, or one year or years during which such candidates shall respectively hold office. But so that no candidate elected shall hold office for a shorter time than the term during which any other candidate who shall have obtained a less number of votes shall hold office. And the returning officer shall publicly declare the respective terms during which the several candidates shall hold office as so determined, and shall report the same to the Minister.

5. *Extraordinary vacancies, how filled, and term of office.*—Should any vacancy in the office of commissioner be occasioned by death, resignation, removal, disqualification, or any other cause whatever, an election shall forthwith be held to fill such vacancy, and the provisions contained in these regulations as to the nomination of candidates, the manner in which elections shall be held, and the mode of voting thereat, shall apply to any election in respect of such vacancy, and the person elected to fill such vacancy shall hold the office of commissioner during the unexpired portion of the term of office of the commissioner whose seat shall have become vacant.

6. *Date of first election of commissioners.*—Date of ordinary annual election.—The first election of commissioners of the said trust shall be held on the twelfth day of December 1888, and the ordinary annual election shall be held on the twelfth day of December in each succeeding year. Provided that whenever such date may fall upon a Sunday, or upon any day set apart as a public holiday, such election shall be held upon the day next following.

7. *Voters' list to be prepared.*—For the purposes of the first election of commissioners of the said trust, a voters' list shall be prepared by the persons upon whose petition the said trust has been appointed and created, and the said voters' list shall be forwarded to the Minister.

8. *Form of voters' list.*—*First Schedule.*—Such voters' list shall be in the form of the First Schedule hereto, and shall contain in regular numerical sequence and alphabetical order of surname, the christian name or names, surname, and address, so far as these may be known, of each owner of not less than ten acres of land within the district of the said trust, and shall also specify the extent of, and indicate with reasonable certainty, the land of each such owner, and shall state the number of votes to which, under the provisions of the said Act, each such owner is entitled.

9. *Voting in respect of lands jointly owned.*—In the case of joint owners of land, the name of any one of such owners shall, subject to the provisions of the said Act and of these regulations, be placed in respect of such land upon the voters' list in like manner as if such land were owned solely by such one owner, and the owner so placed upon the said list or lists shall alone be entitled to vote accordingly. Provided always that if such owners jointly, by notice in writing, desire that the number of votes to which, under the said provisions, any one of such owners is so entitled to give as aforesaid may be allotted between such owners in any manner they may jointly indicate, the alteration or alterations so desired to be made in the said list shall, if

the same be consistent with the said provisions, be made when the list shall be revised as hereinafter provided, and such owners shall be entitled to vote accordingly.

10. *Copy of voters' list to be available for inspection.—Second Schedule.—Objections to list to be in writing and forwarded to Minister.*—A copy of such voters' list shall be available for inspection, without payment of any fee or charge, at all reasonable hours in the day time, in some convenient place within or near to the district of the trust for a period of seven clear days; and a notice in the form, or to the like effect, of the Second Schedule hereto, setting forth the times and place at which such voters' list may be so inspected, shall be published in some newspaper ordinarily circulating within the said district, and such notice shall state that all objections to the said list must be forwarded in writing to the Minister within the time mentioned in the said notice.

11. *Grounds of objection to be stated.*—All objections to the said list shall be forwarded in writing to the Minister within fourteen days after the first day of the publication of such notice, and the ground or grounds of objection must be clearly set forth.

12. *Minister to revise and certify lists.*—The Minister shall revise the said list and consider all objections thereto, and make such alterations and amendments therein as to him may seem just, and shall certify the list under his hand as correct, and no objection to the list when so certified shall be allowed.

13. *Certified list to be voters' roll.*—The list so revised and certified shall be the voters' roll for the purposes of the first election of commissioners of the trust, but shall also be available for any election in respect of any extraordinary vacancy occurring within twelve months next after the date of the said first election.

14. *Voters' list to be prepared yearly.*—Before the 12th day of November in each year the officers of the trust shall prepare a voters' list in the form of the First Schedule hereto, and such list shall contain, in regular numerical sequence and in alphabetical order of surname, the christian name or names, surname, and address (so far as these may be known) of each owner of not less than ten acres of land within the district of the said trust, and shall also specify the extent of and indicate with reasonable certainty the land of each such owner, and shall state the number of votes to which, under the provisions of the said Act, each such owner is entitled.

15. *Voting in respect of lands jointly owned.*—In the case of joint owners of land, the name of any one of such owners shall, subject to the provisions of the said Act and of those regulations, be placed in respect of such land upon the voters' list in like manner as if such land were owned solely by such one owner, and the owner so placed upon the said list shall alone be entitled to vote accordingly. Provided always that if such owners jointly, by notice in writing, desire that the number of votes to which, under the said provisions, any one of such owners is so entitled to give as aforesaid may be allotted between such owners in any manner they may jointly indicate, the alteration or alterations so desired to be made in the said list shall, if the same be consistent with the said provisions, be made when the list or lists shall be revised as hereinafter provided, and such owners shall be entitled to vote accordingly.

16. *Copy of list to be available for inspection.—Third Schedule.*—A copy of such voters' list shall be available for inspection, without payment of any fee or charge, at all reasonable hours in the day time, at some convenient place within or near to the district of the trust for a period of seven clear days; and a notice in the form, or to the like effect, of the Third Schedule hereto shall be published in some newspaper ordinarily circulating within the said district, and such notice shall state that all objections to the said list must be forwarded in writing to the chairman of the trust within the time mentioned in the said notice.

17. *Grounds of objections to list to be forwarded in writing to the chairman of trust.*—All objections to the said list shall be forwarded in writing to the chairman of the trust within the time mentioned in the said notice, and the ground or grounds of objection must be clearly set forth.

18. *Special meeting of trust to be held to revise list.—List to be certified.*—In the month of November in each year a special meeting of the trust shall be held for the purpose of revising the said list; and all objections which may have been forwarded to the chairman under the preceding clause shall be considered by the commissioners then present; and the chairman may make such alterations and amendments in the said list as the commissioners or a majority of the commissioners present may determine to be just and necessary, or such as by those regulations are required to be made; and the list, when so revised, altered, and amended, shall be certified as correct under the hand of the chairman, and no objection to the list when so certified shall be allowed.

19. *Revised and certified list to be voters' roll.*—The list so revised and certified shall be the voters' roll for the purposes of any election (whether ordinary or extraordinary) of trust commissioners to be held within one year from the twelfth day of December then next, the said day inclusive.

20. *Minister may appoint returning officer for first election.—Chairman of trust to be returning officer at subsequent elections.*—For the purposes of the first such election, the Minister may appoint some fit and proper person, not being an owner of land within the district, to be returning officer; but for every subsequent election, whether ordinary or extraordinary, the chairman of the trust for the time being shall be the returning officer; but if at the time of any election the office of chairman of the trust should be vacant, the commissioners of the trust may by resolution appoint one of their number to be returning officer until the office of chairman shall again be filled; and the returning officer may appoint a deputy to assist him or to act in his room at any election, and such deputy may do all or any of the acts or things which the returning officer is hereby authorized or required to do.

21. *Notice of election.—Nomination of candidates.—Fourth Schedule.*—Twenty-one clear days before any election of commissioners under these regulations, the returning officer shall give public notice of such election by advertisement inserted in

some newspaper generally circulating in the said district, and by such notice shall require all candidates at such election to be nominated at some place within the said district to be named in such notice, in manner hereinafter mentioned, between the hours of Ten o'clock in the forenoon and Four o'clock in the afternoon, on some day before a day (hereinafter called the day of nomination) not less than seven nor more than ten days after the time of giving such notice, and named therein; and any person desirous of nominating a candidate shall, before Four o'clock in the afternoon of the day next preceding the nomination day cause to be delivered at the place aforesaid to the returning officer a nomination paper in the form of the Fourth Schedule, or to the like effect, stating therein the christian name and surname of such candidate, together with the other particulars required in and by the said schedule; and such nomination paper shall be signed by not less than four persons duly qualified to vote at such elections, and also signed by the person named therein as a candidate in token of his assent to being so named.

22. *Where number of candidates does not exceed number of commissioners to be elected.*—If at the expiration of the time limited as hereinbefore provided for the nominations of candidates the number of persons who have become candidates as aforesaid does not exceed the number of commissioners to be elected, the returning officer shall then declare such candidates to be duly elected, and they shall be deemed to be then duly elected accordingly.

23. *Where number of candidates exceeds number of commissioners to be elected.—Fifth Schedule.—Notice of poll.—Hours of polling.*—If at the expiration of the time limited for the nomination of candidates the number of candidates exceeds the number of commissioners to be elected, then the returning officer shall forthwith cause ballot-papers to be printed, with the christian names and surnames of all the candidates in full, in the form of the Fifth Schedule hereto, and shall also forthwith give public notice by advertisement in some newspaper generally circulating in the district stating the names of the persons so nominated, and that a poll will be taken for the election of such commissioners upon the day named in such notice, at such place within the said area as the returning officer shall in and by such notice appoint, and such poll shall take place accordingly, and shall commence at Nine o'clock in the forenoon and close at Four o'clock in the afternoon.

24. *Retirement of candidates before polling-day.*—If at any election after a poll shall have been appointed as aforesaid any candidate for such election and two of the persons having signed the paper nominating him as aforesaid are desirous that he should retire from such candidature, such candidate and the persons aforesaid may sign and deliver to the returning officer not later than four clear days before the day of polling a notice in the form of the Sixth Schedule hereto, stating that such candidate so retires, and the said candidate or his agent shall thereupon publish in some newspaper generally circulating in the district a copy of such notice, and the returning officer, on sufficient proof of such publication aforesaid, if the number of candidates is by such retirement reduced to the number of persons to be elected at such election, shall on the day appointed for the election declare the remaining candidates duly elected, and if the said number is not so reduced, shall omit the name of the person so retiring from the ballot-papers to be used at the said election, and if such papers are already printed shall erase such name therefrom, and such person shall not be capable of being elected at such election.

25. *Polling-booth may be hired.*—At such election the returning officer shall provide a suitable place for taking a poll, and may, if necessary, cause to be hired and used as a polling-booth any room which he may deem to be suitable at the place appointed for taking the poll, and may divide such room into compartments as to him may seem most convenient.

26. *Returning officer to preside at polling-booth.*—The returning officer, or his deputy, shall preside at the polling-booth for taking the poll.

27. *Scrutineers may be appointed.*—Each candidate shall be entitled to appoint, in writing, one scrutineer to be present in the polling-booth, and the said returning officer, or his deputy, and the said scrutineers, and any voters, not exceeding four in number, actually engaged in voting, shall alone be permitted at any one time to enter or remain in the polling-booth.

28. *Pencils to be provided.*—The returning officer, or his deputy, shall provide pencils in the polling-booth for the use of the voters, and also a locked box, to be called the ballot-box, with a cleft or opening therein capable of receiving the ballot-papers, and such box shall be opened and exhibited to the scrutineers before the polling begins, and the box shall then be locked, and shall stand on a table opposite the returning officer, or deputy returning officer, who shall keep the key of such box.

29. *Mode of voting.—Where voter is illiterate.*—The returning officer shall deliver to every voter who requires the same a ballot-paper, or if such voter appears by the roll to be entitled to give more votes than one, then so many ballot-papers as may be equal to the number of votes which such voter so appears to be entitled to give, such ballot-papers being in the form of Schedule Five hereto, and initialed by the returning officer; and every such voter shall, without leaving the booth, strike out from all or any of such papers the name of every candidate for whom he does not intend to vote. And in case any voter is unable to read or write, the returning officer, or his deputy, if so required, shall, in view of such one of the scrutineers as the voter may desire, strike out the name or names of such candidate or candidates as such voter may designate, and after such name or names have been so struck out, the ballot-paper or ballot-papers, as the case may be, shall forthwith be deposited in the said box. Provided that all the ballot-papers to which any person may be entitled at the polling-booth shall be demanded and received by him at one and the same time, and no person having once demanded and received any such ballot paper or papers, and voted by the same, shall at the same election receive any further ballot-papers, or exercise any further right of voting.



30. *Ballot-papers to be numbered.*—Before delivering any ballot-paper to the voter, the returning officer or his deputy shall write upon the back of each such ballot-paper, as near as practicable to the lower edge thereof, the number set opposite to the voter's name in the roll, and shall thereupon, upon a copy of such roll, check off such voter's name as having voted, and mark against such name the number of ballot-papers delivered to such voter.

31. *Informal ballot-papers.*—If any voter suffer to remain upon his ballot-paper a greater number of names not struck out than the number of commissioners to be elected, the vote given on and by such paper shall be void and of no effect.

32. *What question may be asked.*—At any election of commissioners the returning officer may, if he see fit, or if required to do so by any candidate or scrutineer, put to any person tendering his vote the question following:—

“Are you the person whose name appears as (A.B.) in the roll now in force for this trust, being enrolled therein in respect of land in the parish of \_\_\_\_\_, being (here specify land as described in the roll)?”

And no other question shall be put to any person tendering his vote; and no person who shall refuse to answer such question, or who shall not answer the same absolutely in the affirmative, shall receive a ballot-paper or be permitted to vote.

33. *False answer, polling twice, and personation.*—Every person who shall wilfully make a false answer to the question aforesaid, or who shall poll more than once or offer to poll more than once at the same election, or who shall depart or attempt to depart from any polling-booth after having received a ballot-paper without having deposited the same in the ballot-box as herein-before provided, or who shall personate any other person for the purpose of polling at such election, shall be guilty of a breach of these regulations; but nothing contained in this clause shall apply to any person only by reason of his exercising the right of voting as often as it appears by the roll he is entitled so to do.

34. *Result of polling, how ascertained; returning officer to have casting vote.*—Immediately upon the close of the poll the returning officer shall, in the presence of and subject to the inspection of so many of the scrutineers of the candidates as please to be present, proceed to ascertain the number of votes for each candidate; and such returning officer shall abstain from inspecting the number written as aforesaid on any ballot-paper, and take care that the same is not seen by any person before being sealed up as herein provided; and the returning officer shall seal up the ballot-papers deposited in the booth, and as soon as conveniently may be on or after the day of the poll publicly declare the candidates not exceeding the number of vacancies to be filled up who have received the greatest number of votes to have been duly elected commissioners of the trust; and if two or more candidates have received an equal number of votes, the returning officers shall in each case have the casting vote.

35. *Ballot-papers, how disposed of.*—The returning officer shall, in the case of the said first election of commissioners, forthwith after the declaration of the poll endorse with a description of the contents thereof and sign the sealed parcel of ballot-papers, and forward the same to the Minister, who shall, as soon as may be after the first meeting of trust commissioners shall have been held, forward such sealed packet to the secretary of the trust, to be by him safely and secretly kept for six months then next ensuing, and then by him cause to be destroyed in the presence of three commissioners of the trust; but in all subsequent elections the parcel of ballot-papers so sealed, endorsed, and signed shall be delivered by the returning officer to the said secretary, to be by him safely and secretly kept for six months after such delivery, and then by him caused to be destroyed in the presence of three of the commissioners of the trust.

36. *Minister to determine questions arising upon first election.*—If any question arise as to the due election of any commissioner at the first election, the returning officer shall, at the request of any voter or candidate, submit such question in writing to the Minister, who shall decide the same, and such decision shall be final and binding.

37. *Questions arising upon subsequent elections to be determined by trust.*—If any question arise as to the due election of any commissioner at any subsequent election, whether ordinary or extraordinary, such question shall be determined by the commissioners of the trust at the first ordinary meeting held after the election; but no commissioner in respect of whose election such question shall have arisen shall act as a commissioner at such meeting, or be entitled to take any part in the proceedings thereof, or in any manner or at any time to act as a commissioner until such question shall have been so determined, and the majority of the commissioners whose election is not in dispute shall form a quorum.

38. *Appeal to Minister from determination of trust.*—In event of any voter or candidate feeling aggrieved by the determination of the trust with reference to any such question as last aforesaid, he may appeal therefrom to the Minister within fourteen days from the date upon which the commissioners shall have determined the question, and the Minister may make such inquiry as to the merits of the question as may appear to him to be necessary, and determine such question in such manner as to him may appear just, and such determination of the Minister shall be final and binding.

39. *Failure to elect deemed to create extraordinary vacancies.*—If at any election of commissioners no vacancies or a number of vacancies less than the whole number which should have been filled up at such election are filled up, then the vacancies which are not so filled shall severally be deemed extraordinary vacancies and to have occurred on the day appointed for such election. Provided always that the commissioners eventually elected to fill such vacancies shall go out of office as if elected at such election.

40. *Expenses of election to be paid by trust.*—The expenses incurred by the returning officer, or under his direction, in connection with any election, shall be defrayed by the trust.

41. *Penalty for breach of regulations.*—These regulations shall also be deemed to be regulations under section 250 of *The Irrigation Act 1836*, and any person guilty of a breach of any of the provisions of these regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, to be recovered in a summary manner before justices of the peace.

42. *Interpretation.*—In these regulations words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, unless there is something in the context repugnant to or inconsistent with this interpretation.

having been complied with, the Minister duly published his declaration in the *Government Gazette* on the seventh day of September 1888, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act. And whereas after due observance of the steps necessary under the said Act to precede such a petition, and on this first day of November 1888 a petition of an absolute majority of the owners of land in the district proposed to be constituted, such majority being the owners of at least half the land in such proposed district, hath been presented to the Governor in Council, praying that the scheme or plan of works of such first-named petition as set out in the said declaration in writing of the Minister might be adopted. And whereas, after compliance with all the provisions under the said Act necessary to be observed before approval of the scheme proposed, the Governor in Council has, by an Order in Council dated this first day of November 1888, approved of the said proposed scheme. Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in accordance with the provisions of and in exercise of the powers conferred by *The Irrigation Act 1836* aforesaid, doth declare, order, and direct:—

1. That the said proposed district shall be and the same is hereby constituted as, from the date of this Order, an "Irrigation and Water Supply District" under the said *Irrigation Act 1836*; and an Irrigation and Water Supply Trust is hereby appointed and created to construct, maintain, and continue the works in this Order described, in accordance with the provisions of this Order and of the said Act.

2. That the limits and boundaries of the district within which such Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall have authority, and which district shall henceforth be an Irrigation and Water Supply District, shall be those contained within the limits and boundaries of the area of the said Irrigation and Water Supply District hereby constituted as such limits and boundaries are set out in the Second Schedule hereto.

3. That the name of the said Irrigation and Water Supply District shall be the "Werribee Irrigation and Water Supply District," and the corporate name of the said Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall be the "Werribee Irrigation and Water Supply Trust."

4. That the scheme of the said Werribee Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall be the construction of a weir across the Werribee River; a pumping plant adjoining the weir site to pump the water into a head channel for conveyance to the proposed Irrigation and Water Supply District, over which district the water will be distributed by means of a reticulation system. All the works shall be Trust works. And the works to be constructed and maintained are those set out in the First Schedule hereto.

5. That the source from which the Trust is to obtain its supply shall be the Werribee River. The quantity of water which the said Trust shall be entitled to take, after allowing not less than one-fifth of the total natural volume of the river and not less than one hundred and twenty cubic feet per minute at all times to pass their off-take, shall be for three years from the date hereof three hundred cubic feet per minute during the months of May to September inclusive, and four hundred cubic feet per minute during the months October to April inclusive in each year; subject, however, to such right as may by Order in Council be granted to the Bacchus Marsh Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, in pursuance of an application now being considered; subject to all prior existing rights and subject to the condition that the Trust when constituted shall *bona fide* use the whole of such available supply for the irrigation of land within its Trust district. On the expiry of the period of three years, for which a water-right is hereby granted, such right is to be subject to review, and to be reduced or otherwise modified as circumstances may then seem to require. But the said Trust's water-right will not be reduced below one hundred cubic feet per minute throughout the winter season, and one hundred and thirty-three cubic feet per minute throughout the summer season, subject to the like provisions for compensation water; subject also to the rights of the Bacchus Marsh Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, and to all prior existing rights as hereinbefore stipulated.

6. That the total amount of money proposed to be expended by the said Werribee Irrigation and Water Supply Trust on Trust works is Thirty thousand four hundred and fifty-five pounds (£30,455) sterling, but no portion of such money shall be advanced by the Board of Land and Works by way of loan to the Trust.

7. That the number of persons to be elected as Commissioners of the said Werribee Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall be six, and the period for which such Commissioners shall hold office shall be three years.

8. That the amount of moneys which may be borrowed (otherwise than from the Board of Land and Works) by the said Werribee Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall not at any time exceed the sum of Thirty thousand four hundred and fifty-five pounds (£30,455).

9. No powers of rating shall be given to the said Trust.

#### FIRST SCHEDULE.

##### *Scheme and plan of proposed works.*

A weir across the Werribee River; a pumping plant adjoining the weir site to pump the water into a head channel for conveyance to the proposed Irrigation and Water Supply District, over which the water will be distributed by means of a reticulation system.

#### SECOND SCHEDULE.

*Boundaries of Irrigation and Water Supply District constituted in and by this Order.*

Portion 1. Commencing at the intersection of the western boundary of allotment 3, section 8, parish of Tarneit, with the Werribee River; thence northerly and easterly by west and north boundaries of allotment B to the north-east angle thereof; thence southerly by a road to a point on east boundary of allotment B in a line with north boundary of allotment A, section 7; thence

easterly by a line to the north-west angle of allotment A, of last-named section; thence further easterly by a road to the north-east angle of allotment C; thence southerly by a road to the south-east angle of allotment F; thence easterly by a road to the north-east angle of allotment F; thence southerly by a road to the south-east angle of allotment G, all in section 7; thence westerly by a road to the north-east angle of allotment H, of section 1; thence southerly by a road and westerly by south boundary of allotment H to the south-west angle thereof; thence southerly by a road to the south-east angle of allotment D of same section; thence westerly by south boundary of allotment D to its intersection with the Werribee River; thence northerly easterly northerly and north and westerly by the Werribee River to the commencing point.

Portion 2. A strip of land six chains in width (being three chains on each side of the centre line of the river): Commencing at the intersection of the eastern boundary of allotment B, section 17, parish of Tarneit, with the Werribee River; thence extending up the river a distance of ten chains, measured along its course.

Portion 3. A strip of land two chains in width: Commencing at the intersection of the eastern boundary of allotment B, of section 17, parish of Tarneit, with the Werribee River: thence easterly, southerly, south-easterly easterly and north-easterly through allotments A, D, E, and F of section 16, and allotment A of section 8, to a point on the east boundary of allotment A about twenty-five chains south of the north-east angle of allotment A, section 8, parish of Tarneit, all of which boundaries are as shown on the Order in Council plan of Trust district deposited in the office of the Minister of Water Supply, Melbourne.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Shire of Bacchus Marsh Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an urban district for the purposes of *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of

the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the Regulations following:—

1. For every house or tenement of £20 annual value or under, the sum of £1 per annum.
2. For every house or tenement above the annual value of £20 used wholly or partly as a domicile, 5 per cent. on the annual value.
3. For every house or tenement above the annual value of £20, not being a domicile,  $3\frac{1}{2}$  per cent. on the annual value—minimum £1.

THE following are the rates and charges which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Bet Bet Shire Waterworks Trust, within the district supplied with water, as described in the *Government Gazette* of 24th December 1886, viz., the township of Bealiba, that is to say:—

1. For every house or tenement the sum of Five pounds per annum on the annual value of such property.

#### LOCAL BOARD OF HEALTH FOR THE SHIRE OF CRANBOURNE.

##### BYE-LAW No. 1.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in *The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883*, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, the Local Board of Health for the Shire of Cranbourne, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within its jurisdiction, doth hereby make the following Bye-law, that is to say:—

1. *Interpretation of terms.*—In the construction and for the purpose of this bye-law the following terms shall, if not inconsistent with the context or subject matter, have the respective meanings hereby assigned to them.

"House" shall mean and include dwellings of any kind, schools, hotels, licensed public-houses, factories, work-rooms, common or other lodging-houses, or other buildings or premises.

"Cesspool" shall mean any receptacle for night-soil or for noxious or offensive matter below or above the ground.

"Street" shall mean and include any highway and any public bridge, and any road, lane, footway, square, court, alley, or passage, whether a thoroughfare or not.

2. *Premises to be kept so as not to be a nuisance.*—Every occupier or person having the management or control of any house or premises shall cause the same to be kept in such a state as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

3. *Removal of refuse from houses.*—Every occupier of a house or premises shall remove therefrom all dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, or such other refuse matter produced or accumulated thereon once every week, and in case of the default of such occupier the Local Board of Health may remove the same.

4. *Removal of refuse from places where animals are kept.*—Every occupier of land on which is erected any stable, shed, sty, yard, or other place for the keeping of animals, shall from time to time remove from such premises all dung, soil, or other manure produced or accumulated thereon as often as the same shall amount to two cubic yards, or once at least every week; and in case of the default of such occupier the Local Board may remove the same.

5. *Power to use refuse as manure.*—Nothing contained in the foregoing sections of this bye-law shall be taken to prevent the occupier of any premises from causing any dung, soil, or other refuse matter produced or accumulated on any premises to be at any time removed, or to be used as manure on any garden or land, or to be kept for the purpose of being used on any garden or land contiguous to such premises as manure, so that the same be not so removed, kept, or used as to contravene any bye-law of the Local Board of Health, or so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

6. *Removal of refuse from places where noxious or offensive trades are carried on.*—Every occupier and every person having the management or control of premises used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, or manufactory whatsoever, shall cause all rubbish, filth, offal, soil, or other offensive matters, and all waste products of such manufacture from which effluvia may arise, to be removed from such premises once at least in every twenty-four hours, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and so that no noxious or offensive effluvia arise therefrom; and if any such occupier or person shall neglect or fail to have removed any such offensive matter or waste products as aforesaid, the same may be removed by the Local Board of Health.

7. *Removal of blood from places where animals are slaughtered.*—Every occupier, licensee, or person having the management or control of an abattoir, slaughter-house, or place where any cattle or other animals are killed, shall cause all the blood from the animals killed therein, as soon as conveniently may be, to be collected in a fit receptacle to be provided for that purpose, and to be effectually deodorized by mixing therewith commercial sulphate of iron or chloride of lime, in the proportion of 1 lb. to the gallon, or some other efficient deodorizer sufficient to effectually deodorize the same, and to be removed from the premises within twenty-four hours after such blood is shed.

8. *Removal of offal.*—Every occupier of any premises on which may be any offal shall forthwith effectually deodorize the same, and remove the same from the premises within twenty-four hours.

9. *Construction of privies.*—No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any privy except in the form of an earth-closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor whereof is at no point less than three inches above the surface of the adjoining ground; and every such building shall be constructed with proper openings or flues to provide sufficient means of ventilation, and shall be provided with a suitable pan or other movable receptacle for night-soil, the contents whereof does not exceed three cubic feet, and with the requisite apparatus for the application of dry earth or some other deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan or receptacle and the contents thereof, and emptying and cleansing the same. Every privy attached to any school, hotel, licensed publichouse, factory, workroom, or common lodging-house, and every public privy, shall be flagged or paved with some non-absorbent material having a fall or inclination towards the door or other opening of at least half-an-inch to the foot.

10. *Supply of deodorizing material to earth-closets.*—Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall cause to be kept in every earth-closet belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in any pan or other receptacle in each earth-closet to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan or other receptacle.

11. *Emptying receptacles for night-soil.*—Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises, once at least in every week, shall empty or cleanse, or cause to be emptied or cleansed, every earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil on or belonging to such premises.

12. *Construction of cesspools.*—Every cesspool shall be furnished with a water-tight cover or roof, and every cesspool formed or made below the surface of the ground shall be constructed with water-tight walls or sides, which project on all sides at least six inches above the surface of the ground.

13. *Emptying of cesspools.*—Every occupier of premises and every person having the management or control of premises on which there shall be any cesspool, shall cause the same to be emptied once at least in every week.

14. *Disposal of refuse and offensive matter.*—No person shall place or deposit any dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, blood, offal,

manure, dung, or soil, or any night-soil or other offensive matter, in any place so as to be a nuisance to any person, or injurious to health.

15. *Night-soil, &c., removed from any earth-closet, &c. and deposited anywhere to be covered with earth.*—Every person placing or depositing, or suffering to be placed or deposited, or assisting in placing or depositing, on any land, whether by way of manure or otherwise, any night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter removed from any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or other place of deposit, shall, immediately on the deposit thereof, cover the same or cause the same to be covered, and shall keep the same covered, with a layer of earth not less than six (6) inches in thickness, and before doing so such person shall obtain the written permission of the Local Board or Officer of Health.

16. *Earth-closets, &c., not to be emptied into drains or sewers.*—No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying, any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter, into any drain or sewer, or so that the contents thereof may find its way, or be likely to find its way, into any drain or sewer.

17. *Prevention of pollution of water.*—No person shall place, or assist in placing, or cause or permit to be placed in, or so that the same may or may be likely to find its way into any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, any matter or thing likely to endanger the health of any person using such water or drinks or milk or other produce of such dairy.

18. *Cesspools not to be emptied into water used for drinking or domestic purposes.*—No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying, any cesspool or place for the deposit of offal, blood, or other refuse matter, into any water supplied, used, or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, or so that the contents or any portion of the contents thereof may find its way, or be likely to find its way, into any such water.

Every accumulation or deposit of offensive matter so situated as to find its way or to be likely to find its way into any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or likely to be used in any dairy, shall be doodorized and removed by the owner of the property upon which such accumulation or deposit is situated, within one week of notice given by the Local Board or by one of its officers.

19. *Keeping of animals.*—No person shall keep any animal of any kind so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

20. *Animals not to be so kept as to pollute water.*—No person shall keep any animal in such a manner as to pollute any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, so as to endanger the health of any person using such water or drinks, or milk, or other produce of such dairy.

21. *Supply of water to slaughter-houses.*—Every occupier or licensee or person having the management or control of a slaughter-house or abattoir shall cause the same to be supplied with a sufficient quantity of water for all purposes.

22. *Drainage of new buildings.*—Every person erecting or causing to be erected any new building shall cause the foundations thereof, and the ground over which such building is to be placed, to be rendered dry, sound, and well drained, so that no water soakage or damp shall lodge there.

23. *Drainage of existing buildings.*—Every owner of a building shall cause the same to be provided with proper and sufficient drains, so constructed as to prevent any nuisance arising therefrom, and to secure the healthfulness of the inmates of such building; and every tenant of a building under a lease, of which fourteen years or upwards is unexpired, shall be deemed an owner within the meaning of this section.

24. *Registration of cowkeepers, dairymen, and purveyors of milk.*—Every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall, on or before the first day of January in every year, register himself with the Local Board of Health in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the Secretary of the Local Board of Health an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall, with every such application, pay a fee of Five shillings (5s.).

25. *Application for Registration as*

Upon the receipt of every such application and fee, the Secretary for the Local Board of Health shall indorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

26. *Milk stores and shops to be kept clean.*—Every person following the trade of cowkeeper or dairyman shall cause every milk store or milk shop in his occupation, or under his management or control, and every milk vessel used by him for containing milk for sale, to be kept thoroughly clean.

27. *Dairymen, &c., to report disease to Health Officer.*—Every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, and every person having the management of any such trade, shall forthwith report in writing to the Health Officer the occurrence of any disease in any of his milch cows, or of any contagious or infectious disease in man or animal upon the premises upon which such trade is carried on.

28. *Extent of application of bye-law.*—The foregoing clauses of this bye-law numbered 3, 11, and 15 respectively shall apply to and have operation in the township of Cranbourne only, and the remainder of the foregoing clauses of this bye-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the Shire of Cranbourne.

29. *Penalties.*—If any person commit a breach of any of the provisions of any of the sections of this bye-law he shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10) or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued: Provided the justices before whom any penalty imposed hereby is sought to be recovered may order the whole, or part only (not being less than Five shillings of such penalty), to be paid; and every person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the foregoing penalty, notwithstanding that the Local Board of Health have or have not taken advantage of such powers.

**PUBLIC HEALTH.—SHIRE OF SHEPPARTON LOCAL BOARD OF HEALTH.**

**BYE-LAW No. 7, FOR REGULATING THE REMOVAL AND FINAL DEPOSIT OF NIGHTSOIL AND OTHER OFFENSIVE MATTER, AND FOR THE USE OF CLOSET-PANS.**

THE Local Board of Health in and for the Shire of Shepparton, in the colony of Victoria, being the municipal council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in *The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883*, and every other power enabling the said Local Board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said Local Board, doth hereby make the following bye-law, being Bye-Law No. 7 of the said Local Board of Health, that is to say:—

1. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. This bye-law shall apply to, and have operation in, the whole of the Shepparton riding of the said Shire of Shepparton.

3. Clauses eight, nine, ten, and twelve of bye-law No. 1, made and ordered by the said Local Board, shall be and are hereby repealed, excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this bye-law coming into operation.

4. All nightsoil, blood, offal, or other refuse or offensive matter or thing shall be removed to and buried as hereinafter provided in the manure depot appointed by the Local Board from time to time for the final reception of the same, and in no other place.

5. No person shall place, deposit, spread, or bury, or cause or suffer to be placed or deposited or spread or buried, or assist in placing, depositing, spreading, or burying in any place except the manure depot to be from time to time appointed by the said Local Board, any nightsoil, offal, blood, or other refuse or offensive matter or thing, whether by way of manure or otherwise.

6. Any person or persons removing nightsoil, blood, offal, or other refuse or offensive matter or thing to the manure depot to be appointed by the Local Board from time to time as aforesaid shall bury the same in a trench, to be dug out or excavated by such person or persons in such place in said manure depot as shall be appointed by the inspector of the said Local Board, which trench shall not be less in measurement than three feet deep by one foot six inches in width by six feet in length, and such person or persons shall cover the nightsoil, blood, offal, or other refuse or offensive matter or thing buried in such trench with at least eighteen inches of soil at the same time as such burial takes place; any surplus earth from such excavation after the burying of such nightsoil, blood, offal, or other refuse or offensive matter or thing, and covering the same with eighteen inches of soil, shall be spread evenly and regularly on the surface of such trench.

7. No person shall empty any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the reception of nightsoil except by means of a cart, carriage, or other conveyance, properly constructed, and furnished with a sufficient covering, so as to prevent the escape of the contents, or any portion thereof, or of any effluvia therefrom. No such cart, carriage, or other conveyance shall be so used until the same has been approved of in writing by the inspector of the said Local Board.

8. Every closet pan shall be constructed of galvanized iron, properly riveted and soldered so as to be watertight, and with handles thereto, and of a capacity not exceeding three cubic feet. No receptacle other than such closet-pan shall be used in connection with any premises, and the owner, or the person or persons having the management and control of any premises shall furnish every privy or closet in connection with such premises with such a closet-pan.

9. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds for every such breach, or of Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties, such portion not being less than Five shillings, to be paid. And any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty, notwithstanding that the Local Board of Health may be empowered by this bye-law, or otherwise, to remedy such breach, and whether such Local Board has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

#### REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF RICHMOND PARK.

WHEREAS by the Crown grants issued in favour of the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Richmond, and their successors, in respect of Richmond Park, it is provided and declared that the land thereby granted, and the buildings for the time being thereon, shall be maintained and used as and for a public park and place of recreation, and offices and conveniences connected therewith, under and in accordance with such Regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Governor or other officer for the time being administering the government of the Colony of Victoria, with the consent of the Executive Council thereof, and in the meantime under and in accordance with such rules, orders, by-laws, and regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the said City of Richmond; Now therefore the Board of Land and Works and the Council of the City of Richmond do hereby make in lieu of the Regulations made by the said Board on 12th May 1874 in respect of the said Richmond Park the Regulations following for the care, protection, and management thereof and for the preservation of good order and decency therein.

#### REGULATIONS.

1. No person shall interfere with the trees, shrubs, birds, fish, soil or other property in the park, or throw stones or other missiles, or leave therein any bottles, orange peel, paper, cast off clothing or any litter.
  2. Any person found in a state of intoxication, or behaving in a disorderly manner or using obscene language, or creating or taking part in any disturbance, or making harangues whereby a crowd is collected, or committing any act of indecency in the park, shall be liable to be forthwith removed by any authorized officer or servant of the trustees or by a constable, and shall be liable to prosecution for an offence against these regulations.
  3. No person, except those in the employ of, or authorized by the trustees shall bring into the park any horse or vehicle, or enter plots of ground therein enclosed for plantations or other purposes.
  4. No person shall hawk or offer for sale in the park, any goods or articles of any description without having previously obtained written permission from the Trustees.
  5. No person shall bring into the park any dog for coursing or other purposes of sport, and all dogs so brought in, and all goats and poultry found within the park, shall be liable to be destroyed.
  6. No person shall light any fires within the park without permission.
  7. Permits for temporary occupation of sites within the park, and for any other special privilege in connexion therewith, shall if issued be subject to such terms and conditions as may from time to time be approved by the Trustees, and no person shall occupy any site within the park or enjoy any special privilege therein unless the consent of the Trustees has been first obtained.
  8. No person shall stick bills on the fences or gates, in and around the park, or otherwise deface the same.
- Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 133, of *The Land Act 1884*, on conviction before any Justice forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who, knowingly and wilfully offends against any such regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any officer or servant of the Trustees, or by any constable, does not desist from so offending, may forthwith be apprehended by such officer or servant of the Trustees or constable, and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

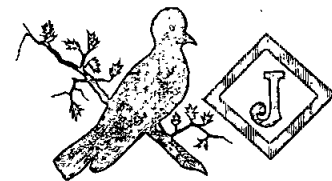

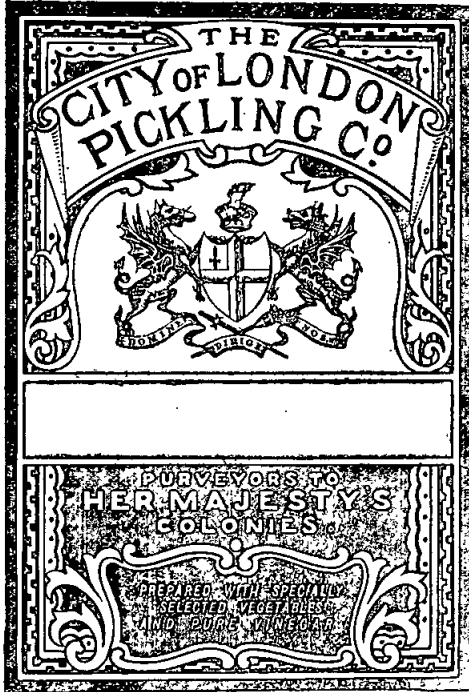

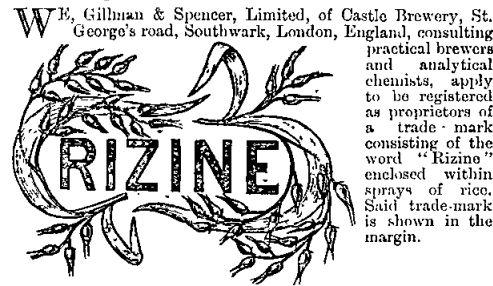
