SHEPPARTON GAOL.—ALTERATION OF BOUNDARIES.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Statute of Gaols 1864* (27 Vict. No. 219), it was amongst other things enacted, that all buildings, erections, houses, enclosed places, and premises thereafter to be erected, built, enclosed, purchased, enlarged, or maintained at the public expense, as and for public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, and penal establishments within Victoria, which were from time to time proclaimed by the Governor in Council, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, as such public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, or penal establishments, should, from and after the publication of such notice, be severally deemed and taken to be the public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, and penal establishments (thereinafter called "gaols") respectively of the place or district where the same are situated, and should be subject to the several provisions made for the regulation, discipline, management, and care of the public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, and penal establishments already erected (also thereinafter called "gaols"), and of the prisoners confined within the same; and it was also enacted that, except where it was otherwise proclaimed by the Governor in Council, every gaol should be and be taken for all purposes as being equally a house of correction and a prison for debtors, and also every house of correction should be taken to be a prison: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the fifth day of March One thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, the buildings and premises therein described and situate at Shepparton were proclaimed a public gaol, prison, and house of correction: And whereas it is expedient to revoke the said Proclamation, and to re-define the site on which such gaol is situate, and to re-proclaim the same: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, in exercise of the power and authority conferred by the said Act and all other powers enabling me in this behalf, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the hereinbefore mentioned Proclamation, and do by this notice proclaim, declare, and notify that the buildings and premises situate at Shepparton, and hereinafter described, are and shall be a public gaol, prison, and house of correction within the meaning and in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, that is to say :—

SHEPPARTON GAOL.—Comprising all buildings, erections, houses, enclosed places, and premises erected, built, or enclosed on the following site, viz., allotment 1 and part of allotment 3, section B, township of Shepparton, containing three rods: Commencing at the north-western angle of allotment 1 at the intersection of Welsford and High streets; thence southerly along Welsford street three hundred links; thence easterly two hundred and fifty links; thence northerly three hundred links to High street; thence westerly two hundred and fifty links along High street to the point of commencement.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this fifth day of November, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, and in the fifty-second year of Her Majesty's reign.

EXAMINATIONS FOR THE CIVIL SERVICE OF INDIA.—OPEN COMPETITION OF JUNE 1889.

IT is notified, at the request of the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies, that, on the 1st June 1889, an examination, open to all qualified persons, will be held in London.

- (iii.) That he has no disease, constitutional affection, or bodily infirmity unfitting him, or likely to unfit him, for the Civil Service of India.
- (iv.) That he is of good moral character.

Beacon on Buccaneer Rock, Dampier Creek, Roebuck Bay.

A beacon has been erected by the Inspector of Pearl Shell Fisheries on the Buccaneer Rock, in Dampier Creek, Roebuck Bay.

The beacon consists of an iron telegraph pole, sunk in the rock and stayed, with an iron drum on the top, and is placed on the east side of the rock, being seven feet (7ft.) above high water spring tides (springs rise 28 feet).

Buccaneer Rock is half a mile from the townsite of Broome. A buoy has also been placed by Captain Pincombe, of the *Olway*, in 24 fathoms on end of spit, opposite Channel Rock, off Entrance Point, to be left to starboard on going in.

Bank lying off 80-mile Beach, N.W. Australia.

The Inspector of Pearl Shell Fisheries reports that, having sounded the bank lying off the eighty-mile beach, he finds that it extends in a N. Ely. and S. Wly. direction for about 30 miles in length, forming a narrow ridge with 3 to 7 fathoms L.W.S. on the bank, and 12 to 15 fathoms on each side of it.

The position of S.W. end of bank is lat. 19° 14' S., long. 121° 02' E.; and it is evidently a continuation of Patterson Shoal, of which the position is marked “doubtful” on the chart.

THE Commissioners of the Nagambie Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an urban district for the purposes of *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the power and authorities conferred by *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, section 119, make the following Regulation:—

Regulation making a Rate.

1. The births of 1,376 children, viz., 688 boys and 688 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of September. In the month of August 1,471 births were registered, or 95 more than in the month under review. The births were 451 above the average of the month during the previous ten years, but only 211 above that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in September numbered 613, viz., 342 of males and 271 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 763, or 124 per cent. The deaths were fewer than those in August by 14, but exceeded the average of September during the previous ten years by 172. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have exceeded that average by 58.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district, the proportion of births registered was 3·51, and of deaths registered 1·57.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 80·1° on the 14th, and the lowest was 34·4° on the 5th. The mean temperature of the month (54·2°) was exactly half a degree above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (35·2°) took place on the 14th, viz., from a maximum of 80·1° to a minimum of 44·9°. The least range (7·9°) was on the 19th, viz., from a maximum of 57·8° to a minimum of 49·9°. The mean daily range was 16·7°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30·378 inches on the 4th, and the lowest was 29·642 inches on the 22nd. The mean atmospheric pressure (30·032 inches) was slightly above the average.

Rain fell on 8 days, the amount of rainfall being 1·28 inch. The average rainfall in September during the previous ten years was 2·17 inches, or nearly one inch more than that in the month under notice.

Fog occurred on 2 days during the month.

Males contributed 56 per cent., and females 44 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 29 per cent. to that mortality, as against 28 per cent. in September 1887, 34 per cent. in September 1886, 27 per cent. in September 1885, 38 per cent. in September 1884, 32 per cent. in September 1883, 33 per cent. in September 1882, 28 per cent. in September 1881, 36 per cent. in September 1880, 31 per cent. in September 1879, and 30 per cent. in September 1878.

Thirty-one deaths of persons who had attained or exceeded the age of 75 years were recorded during the month. Of these, a female, aged 75, died of disease of the brain; a female, aged 75, of strangulated umbilical hernia; a laborer, aged 75, of disease of the liver; a dealer, aged 75, and a storekeeper, aged 81, of obstruction of the intestines; a gentleman, aged 76, of malignant disease of the scrotum; a sailmaker, aged 76, of valvular disease of the heart; a male, of no occupation, aged 76, an engineer and a female, each aged 78, a quarryman, aged 79, and a female, aged 86, of bronchitis; a barrister, aged 80, of "Bright's" disease of the kidneys;

a female, aged 81, and a male, of occupation unknown, aged 83, of paralysis; a female, aged 84, of disease of the heart; a messenger, aged 78, a female aged 75, a gardener, aged 76, a carpenter, a ropemaker, and two females, each aged 77, a tailor, aged 79, a female, aged 80, two females, each aged 83, a female, aged 84, a female, aged 85, a gardener, aged 86, and a female, aged 91, of old age.

Twenty-nine deaths were ascribed to external causes during the month, of which twenty-three were set down to accident, one to homicide, and five to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A boy, aged 5, and a carpenter, aged 49, died of injuries resulting from falls; a female, aged 41, of concussion of the brain, caused by falling from a gig; a laborer, aged 45, of injury to the spine, caused by falling from a dray; a carter, aged 15, of injuries resulting from a dray wheel having passed over him; a gardener, aged 60, of compound fracture of the leg, occasioned by a cart falling on him; a laborer, aged 48, was killed by a fall of clay; a girl, aged 12, and a carriage cleaner, aged 30, were passed over by railway trains; a female infant, aged 1, died of scalds; a bootmaker, aged 66, was poisoned with chlorodyne, taken to obtain sleep; a girl, aged 12, died from the effects of chloroform, properly administered; a male child, aged 1½, a tanner, aged 40, and a fisherman, aged 41, were accidentally drowned, the latter in Hobson's Bay; a seaman, aged 23, a tinsmith, aged 30, a fireman, aged 40, a carpenter, aged 54, and a blacksmith, aged 62, were found drowned; a female infant was suffocated shortly after birth; a male infant, aged 3 months, and a female infant, aged 4 months, were overlain. The homicidal death was that of a male infant, which was murdered by the mother at birth—a verdict of manslaughter being brought in against her. Of those who committed suicide, a clerk, aged 22, a civil servant, aged 34, and a female, aged 37, shot themselves; and two females, each aged 18, drowned themselves.

One hundred and thirty-six deaths, or 22 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—61 in the Melbourne Hospital, 22 in the Alfred Hospital, 2 in the Homoeopathic Hospital, 1 in the Children's Hospital, 6 in the Women's Hospital, 8 in the Immigrants' Home, 10 in the Benevolent Asylum, 8 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 9 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 4 in the Austin Hospital, 2 in the Melbourne Gaol, 1 in the Industrial Schools, 1 in the Infant Asylum, and 1 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 175, of which 95, or 54 per cent., were of males, and 80, or 46 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 118 were under one year of age, 27 were between one and two, 12 were between two and three, 11 were between three and four, and 7 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 438. Of these, 247, or 56 per cent., were males, and 191, or 44 per cent., were females; 20 were between five and ten, 9 were between ten and fifteen, 20 were between fifteen and twenty, 24 were between twenty and twenty-five, 30 were between twenty-five and thirty, 27 were between thirty and thirty-five, 24 were between thirty-five and forty, 37 were between forty and forty-five, 37 were between forty-five and fifty, 37 were between fifty and fifty-five, 36 were between fifty-five and sixty, 39 were between sixty and sixty-five, 42 were between sixty-five and seventy, 25 were between seventy and seventy-five, 18 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 13 were upwards of eighty.

In September, as compared with the previous month, whilst deaths from typhoid fever fell from 9 to 7, deaths from cancer from 20 to 14, and deaths from phthisis from 69 to 60, deaths from diphtheria increased from 11 to 19, and deaths from heart affections from 50 to 71. Nine deaths of child-bearing women occurred during the month, as against 12 in August. If these numbers be compared with the births, it will be found that 1 death of a mother took place to every 153 children registered as born alive in the month under notice, and to 123 so registered in the previous month.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

1. The Rules and Regulations numbered 1 to 32 shall be the Rules and Regulations of the Ballaarat General Cemetery, and after the publication hereof in the *Government Gazette* all Rules and Regulations and Scales of Fees heretofore made shall be rescinded.

2. The office of the Trust shall be open daily (Sundays, Christmas Day, and Good Friday excepted) from Ten a.m. to Four p.m.

3. No burial shall under any circumstances be permitted in the cemetery until an application has been made, name, age, late place of residence, occupation, and probable cause of death of the deceased given at the office of the Trust, an order in the form Schedule A obtained, and the fees where not remitted paid.

4. The fees mentioned in Schedule B shall be the fees payable under the Act, and shall be paid at time of making application for any order.

5. A burial right, Schedule C, shall give the holder and his representatives for ever the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right, on obtaining the permission of the trustees as hereafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection therein.

6. A permit, Schedule D, will, on application of the holder of a burial right, and deposit of a plan, design, or drawing of the proposed erection, or a copy of the proposed inscription or epitaph thereon, be granted to construct a vault or grave, and to erect a monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection thereon if approved by the trustees, and subject to such terms and conditions as they may see fit to impose.

7. Any application for ground exceeding twelve feet in width shall be reserved for the special decision of the trustees.

8. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but any person having paid the fee for a private grave, and requiring a grave or vault, shall be permitted to construct same, subject to the approval of the trustees. Every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron securely cemented.

9. Any tomb, monument, or material requiring to be removed on re-opening a grave or vault must be removed and re-erected or replaced by the owner.

10. No person other than the owner or his agent, duly authorized in writing, shall be permitted to interfere in any way whatever with a grave or enclosure unless by special direction of the trustees.

11. Every grave, vault, tombstone, or other erection shall be maintained and kept in repair and proper condition by and at the expense of the owner.

12. Any grave may, on approval of the trustees, be converted into a private grave on payment of the fees or balance of fees provided for herein.

13. Every grave shall be six feet deep for an adult's body, and not more than two adults, unless the grave be of greater depth or of extra width, shall be interred in each, two infants being considered equal to an adult.

14. Notice of any burial shall be given at the cemetery eight working hours prior to the time fixed for the burial.

15. Before a private grave shall be re-opened, the consent in writing of the person entitled to give the same shall be given.

16. No order for burial shall be issued until there has been deposited at the Trust office a certificate from a coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths; and in case of re-interment on removal from another cemetery, verified copies of such certificate, and of the license of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf, and on payment of the usual fees.

17. The hours for burial, unless by special permission of the trustees, shall be:—On week days, September to April inclusive, Ten a.m. to Six p.m.; May to August inclusive, Ten a.m. to Four p.m. On Sundays, throughout the year, from Eight to Ten a.m. or from Two to Five p.m.

18. The time fixed for any burial shall be the time when the funeral is to be at the cemetery, and the same shall be punctually observed.

19. Hearse and mourning carriages only are allowed within the cemetery, and the drivers are to observe such directions of the trustees, their officers, and servants as may be found necessary from time to time for the regulating of the traffic.

20. Every coffin shall have on the lid a lead plate with the distinguishing number of the Order for burial stamped thereon.

21. No catacomb or wooden erection shall be allowed within the cemetery.

22. No tree or shrub shall be planted in any portion of the cemetery except as approved by the trustees.

23. Licensed exhumations shall be made between the hours of Six and Eight a.m., and in all cases of exhumation the trustees may, where necessary, impose special conditions, any non-compliance therewith being a breach of these rules.

24. An additional fee, according to the circumstances of the case, shall be paid for any exhumation or sinking involving extra labor.

25. No smoking shall be allowed nor any firearms discharged within the cemetery.

26. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower, or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the cemetery unless by authority of the trustees first had and obtained.

27. No dogs shall be allowed within the cemetery.

28. The cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from sunrise to sunset daily throughout the year, but the trustees shall have the right by themselves, their officers, and servants to remove from the cemetery all persons misconducting themselves, or violating the rules of propriety or decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any erection or tree, shrub, flower, or border, or otherwise infringing the Act 201 or any Act made or to be made amending the same.

29. No person employed by the trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of his duty, nor shall be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment or special authority from the trustees.

30. Any workman employed in the cemetery, though not in the employment of the trustees, shall be required to comply with such general directions of the trustees or their secretary as may be necessary for the control and good order of the cemetery.

31. Sculptors, stonemasons, and others desirous of erecting tombstones, monuments, tablets, or railings, or of constructing vaults, or of placing inscriptions and epitaphs, shall obtain licenses, in the form of Schedule E, from the trustees.

32. All material required in the completion of any stone or other work shall be fully prepared before being taken into the cemetery. Stones, refuse, and rubbish remaining after the work is completed shall be removed at once by the person employed on the work.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

1. All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.

2. Any person making a vault or erecting a monument in the cemetery, by and with the permission of the trustees, and upon payment of the proper charges, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep a vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the terms of such permission, to and for the sole use of such person and his or her representatives for ever.

3. Application for such permission to be made at the office of the trustees. A certificate of permission will be granted to the party applying for such permission, on payment of the proper charges.

4. The charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such cemetery upon an order signed by a justice of the peace, or on a certificate of a minister of religion, or other evidence proving to the satisfaction of the trustees that such person was a pauper, or that the friends and relations of the deceased are unable to pay the charges.

5. Orders for interment must be given at the office of the trustees, during the day previous to that on which it is intended to take place.

6. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death of the deceased must be stated at the time of giving the order.

7. The time fixed for the funeral to be the time when the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.

8. The time fixed for the performance of funerals will be from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. in the months from September to April inclusive, and from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. throughout the remainder of the year.

9. All monuments, vaults, graves, gravestones, and fences to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners, and no wood will be allowed in their construction.

10. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron.

11. The cemetery will be open to the public daily from sunrise to sunset.

12. A plan of the cemetery, showing the situation of the purchased and other graves, and register of all grants, will be kept at the office of the secretary, at the Shire Hall, Bulla, where they may be inspected.

13. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these charges and regulations.

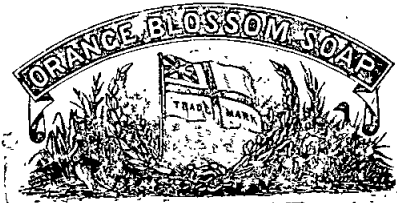
