GRANT OF ONE HUNDRED AND FIFTY POUNDS (£150) AS PRIZES FOR THE BEST MANAGED FARMS IN VICTORIA.

REGULATIONS.

1. Two first prizes of Fifty pounds each will be awarded :—One for the best farm in the Northern districts, and one for the best farm in the Southern districts of the colony. A second prize of Twenty-five pounds will be awarded for the second best farm in each of the above districts.
2. The work of selecting the most suitable farms for competition will be entrusted to the Agricultural Societies.
3. Notice of nomination must be forwarded to the Secretary for Agriculture, Government Offices, Melbourne, not later than the 30th November 1888.
4. The notice must contain full particulars as to the name of the owner, and where the farm is situated.
5. The competition is to be restricted to freeholders in occupation and to Crown tenants.
6. Upon receipt of information as to the farms selected for competition the Minister of Agriculture may appoint three judges to decide the merits of such farms, and the decision of a majority of such judges shall be final.
7. The judges will be required to communicate to the Minister of Agriculture their decisions; and also to report on the merits of the whole of the farms selected for competition.

GRANT OF ONE HUNDRED AND FIFTY POUNDS (£150) FOR INVENTION OF MACHINERY FOR THRESHING PEASE.

REGULATIONS.

1. A sum not exceeding £150 may be paid to any person or company who shall, in the opinion of the Minister of Agriculture, produce a machine capable of threshing, within twelve hours, eight hundred bushels of pease without injury thereto.
2. The reward shall be paid only to the inventor, or his agent, of such machine as shall most cheaply, efficiently, and rapidly perform the work required, and within the time aforesaid.
3. Persons intending to compete for the award must give notice in writing of their intention to the Secretary for Agriculture, Government Offices, Melbourne, not later than 31st December 1888.
4. One or more trials of the machines shall be made at such place or places, and at such times, as the Minister may direct.
5. All costs and expenses of forwarding, attendance, and working the machines at the times to be appointed shall be paid by the persons entering the machines for competition.
6. The Minister may appoint three or more judges to report upon the merits of the competing machines, and the decision of a majority of such judges shall be final.
7. The judges may recommend payment of an amount or amounts, the total of which shall not exceed £150, to the inventor or inventors, or his or their agent or agents, of the successful machine or machines, such amounts to be apportioned to the value to the colony of the said invention or inventions.

COUNTY COURT RULES, 1888.

RULES relating to the Procedure on Applications to Sign Final Judgment under the provisions of The Administration of Justice Act 1885.

General Procedure.

1. The plaintiff must file the affidavit upon which he relies with the Registrar within seven days of the notice of defence being lodged, and thereupon the Registrar shall issue a summons calling upon the defendant to show cause before a Judge of the County Court by affidavit why the plaintiff should not be at liberty to sign final judgment for the amount claimed in the action, and costs, and stating that unless the defendant, by affidavit or otherwise, satisfy such Judge on or before the day of [date to be filled in by the Registrar, his local knowledge guiding him as to what would be a reasonable time for defendant to show cause], being not less than three days from the date of the service of the summons, that the defendant has a good defence to the action, or disclose such facts as may be deemed sufficient to entitle him to defend, the Judge may make an order empowering the plaintiff to sign final judgment for the amount claimed, or for as much thereof as may appear to be due from the defendant to the plaintiff.

2. A copy of the affidavit shall accompany the summons and be served therewith.

3. Upon the return of the summons the plaintiff's and defendant's affidavits, together with all the papers, shall be forwarded by the Registrar to the Judge, who will make such order thereon as he may consider proper.

4. If the defendant fail to show cause, or what the Judge may consider to be sufficient cause, the plaintiff may be empowered to sign judgment; or if the affidavits disclose facts which the Judge thinks could be better elucidated by an oral examination, the Judge may require the parties and their witnesses to appear before him at a time and place to be there stated. In other cases the action will be allowed to proceed.

Practice in Chambers.

(1.) All applications in reference to proceedings in Chambers must be made to the Registrar of the Court having cognizance of the matter.

(2.) All affidavits or papers upon which it is intended to move must first be filed with the Registrar, and by him placed before the Judge. Where it may be necessary to expedite business the papers may be forwarded to the Registrar of some other court, where the Judge may then be acting.

(3.) Unless previously authorised by a Judge, every summons shall be made returnable at the Court whence the summons was issued by its Registrar.

ENTRANCE TO MANUKAU HARBOR.

THE Harbor-master at Manukau reports that since the last survey of the South Channel, at the entrance to the Manukau Harbor, by Captain Johnson, the banks have much changed, and the charts issued in 1855 and 1878 are no longer reliable. The Heron Spit having extended southward about three-quarters of a mile, the South Head Beacons have to be brought in line on a bearing of N. by E. ½ E. to clear it and lead in; when abreast of the Spit a depth of 5 fathoms will be found at low-water spring-tides, gradually shoaling to 2½ fathoms between the inner shoals, and then again deepening to 3½ fathoms when the beacons on the North Head are brought in line. As the line of approaches is constantly changing, masters of vessels should pay the greatest attention to the steering-signals shown from the flag-staff by the pointing of the semaphore-arm, which will guide vessels through the deepest water.

SHIRE OF BRAYBROOK.

BYE-LAW No. 2.—AS TO DAIRIES, DAIRY CATTLE, AND MILK.

THE Local Board of Health in and for the above Shire, in the Colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in *The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883*, and every other power enabling the said Local Board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said Local Board, doth hereby make the following bye-law, being Bye-law No. 2 of the said Local Board of Health, that is to say:—

1. All former bye-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed.

2. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This bye-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the Local Board's District.

Registration of Cowkeepers, Dairymen, and Purveyors of Milk.

4. Every person carrying on the trade of cowkeeper, dairymen, or purveyor of milk shall, on or before the first day of January in every year, register himself with the Local Board of Health in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the secretary of the Local Board of Health an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall with every such application pay a fee of Two shillings and sixpence sterling.

Application for Registration as

To the Secretary of the Local Board of Health for the Shire of Braybrook.

Sir,—I desire to be registered in accordance with the particulars in the schedule hereunder:—

Every place within the jurisdiction of the Local Board of Health at which such trade or any part of it is to be carried on, including a full description of all paddocks, grass lands, grounds, and enclosures occupied or used or intended to be used by the applicant	
Period of time for which registration is desired ...	Year commencing the 1st day of January 18 ...

5. Upon receipt of every such application and fee, the secretary for the Local Board of Health shall endorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received, and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

6. All paddocks, grounds, lands, and enclosures used as grazing ground for dairy cattle shall, whenever necessary, be inspected by any member or officer of the said Local Board, or by any person authorized in writing by the chairman or secretary of the said Local Board; and if, on inspection, such paddocks, grounds, or enclosures, or any of them, are or is likely, in the opinion of the officer or person so inspecting, to be prejudicial to health, by affecting the milk or otherwise, the said Local Board may, by an order in writing signed by the secretary, and served personally or left at the dwelling-house of the registered person, or in the case of an unregistered person served personally or left at his dwelling-place, or posted upon the land, prohibit the use of the same for the purpose of feeding dairy cattle either absolutely or for any time named in such order. All cattle in dairies shall also be similarly inspected by a veterinary surgeon or other competent person, and any cows found to be diseased, or which from poverty or weakness are, in the opinion of the inspector, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, shall be forthwith removed from such dairy if ordered by such inspector or other officer as aforesaid. And any such order as aforesaid the said Local Board may revoke, but upon every fresh inspection a similar order may from time to time be made.

7. All houses, dairies, cowsheds, milk stores, milk shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cowkeeper, or dairymen, whether registered or not, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated; and the drainage of all such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cowkeeper or dairymen, whether registered or not.

8. All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows shall be regularly swept, and be kept perfectly clean, and shall, within twenty-four hours of any order to such effect from the health officer or inspector of nuisances, be fumigated, disinfected, or lime-washed, as may be in any such order so directed.

9. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily.

10. If any person, or any member of the family of any person, registered as aforesaid, or not so registered, but employed as a cowkeeper, dairymen, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor or member of the family of any visitor to any such person, shall be attacked by typhoid fever or any dangerous infectious disease, the occupier of the house in which such person shall be, or (if he be the person attacked) his wife or other person in charge, shall immediately give notice thereof to the Local Board or officer of health, or to the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the Local Board of Health, and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said Local Board or the officer of health, by order served as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of such cowkeeper, dairymen, or purveyor of milk until danger, in the opinion of such Local Board or officer of health, no longer exists. And in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering, or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering, to milk cows or to handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business. Nor, if the person registered or conducting such business be himself the person suffering, shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until, in either case, all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk or of its contamination has ceased.

11. If at any time disease exists in the dairy, or among the cows or cattle in any cowshed or dairy, or in the herds of any cowkeeper, dairyman, vendor, or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge (as the case may be) shall immediately give notice to the Local Board, officer of health, or nearest member of the police force; and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.

12. No cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep or permit or suffer to be kept any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.

13. In the interpretation of this bye-law words imputing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural and the plural the singular, and the word "person" shall include a corporation.

14. Every person guilty of any breach of this bye-law, or of any of its provisions, shall be liable, in the discretion of the convicting justices, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings, or in the like discretion to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

BYE-LAW No. 4/88.

THE Local Board of Health in and for the Shire of Nunawading, in the Colony of Victoria, being the municipal council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in *The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883*, and every other power enabling the said Local Board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said Local Board, doth hereby make the following bye-law, being Bye-law No. 4/88 of the said Local Board of Health, that is to say:—

1. Section No. 8 of Bye-law No. 3/86, made and ordered by the said Local Board on the second day of August 1886, and confirmed on the twenty-fourth day of September 1886, shall be and the same is hereby repealed, excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this bye-law coming into operation; and section No. 3 of this bye-law shall be read in lieu thereof.

2. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. No person shall empty any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the reception of night-soil except by means of a cart, carriage, or conveyance, properly constructed, and furnished with a sufficient covering, so as to prevent the escape of the contents or of any portion thereof, or of effluvia therefrom. Whenever any nightman is duly licensed for the removal of night-soil such nightman shall be employed by the occupier of any premises which are now or may be hereafter situated within a radius of half a mile of the following railway stations, that is to say:—Surrey Hills, Box Hill, Blackburn, and Mitcham respectively, and no other person shall remove the same.

4. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds for every such breach, or of Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties, such portion not being less than Five shillings, to be paid. And any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty, notwithstanding that the Local Board of Health may be empowered to remedy such breach, and whether such Local Board has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1874* (38 Vict. No. 506) it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and such land should thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the Borough of Essendon has requested that the streets herein-after mentioned be so declared public highways: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this notice declare the lands acquired or used for the streets hereinafter named and described, and situate in the Borough of Essendon, to be public highways within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

SHIRE OF NUMURKAH.

PROPOSED SEVERANCE OF AREA AND CONSTITUTION OF NEW SHIRE.

IN pursuance of the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1874* (No. 506, sec. 46), the substance and prayer of a Petition, in accordance with the 44th section of the said Act, which has been presented to His Excellency the Governor, are published, viz.:—

The petitioners purport to constitute a majority of the rate-payers in the portion of the Shire of Numurkah which is described in their petition, and they desire that the area so described may be severed from the Shire of Numurkah, and constituted a new shire under the name or title of "The Shire of Nathalia."

Area described in the petition (as amended):—

Commencing at a point on the south-east angle of the parish of Waiaia; thence north by the east boundary of that parish and the parish of Yalea to the Murray River; thence westerly by that river to a point on same due north of the north-west angle of the parish of Picola; thence south to and by the western boundary of that parish and of the parish of Narioka to the south-west angle of the parish last named; and thence east by the south boundary of the parishes of Narioka, Barwo, and Waiaia, to the point of commencement.

Petitioners state that the Shire of Numurkah is too large for one engineer to work; that the representation of the shire in the council is unequal; that owing to the distance of Numurkah the members of the Western Riding are frequently compelled to occupy three days in attending council meetings; that all tenders are opened at Numurkah, where contractors have to attend to inspect plans, and on account of the distance many persons are unable to tender; such distance also prevents the engineer from speedily inspecting the works when completed, causing loss and delay.

They therefore pray—

"That the area above described may be constituted a separate municipality, that the number of the councillors be six (6), and that the shire be subdivided into two ridings, to be called the Northern and Southern Ridings."

AMENDED REGULATIONS FOR THE CONSTITUTION
OF LOCAL PROSPECTING BOARDS FOR RECOM-
MENDING THE BETTER DISTRIBUTION OF THE
MONEYS VOTED BY PARLIAMENT FOR PRO-
SPECTING FOR GOLD.

WHEREAS the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, did, on the 29th day of October 1886, make "Regulations for the Constitution of Local Prospecting Boards for recommending the better distribution of the moneys voted by Parliament for Prospecting for Gold," which said Order in Council was published in the *Government Gazette* of the said 29th day of October 1886: And whereas it is now deemed expedient to alter the said Regulations to the extent hereinafter mentioned: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby cancel clause 16 of the said Regulations, and doth order that the following be substituted therefor, and be read as and taken to be clause 16 of the said Regulations, that is to say:—

16. *Appointment and election of members of Board.*—The members of each of the said Local Prospecting Boards shall be nominated and elected in the manner following, that is to say:—

(a) The Governor in Council will nominate a mining surveyor as a member of the Board.

(b) *Election of representative of Mining Board.*—The Secretary for Mines shall, ten days at least before the day of election, publish in the *Government Gazette* and in such newspapers circulating in the district as he may consider necessary, a notice to the Chairman of the Mining Board of each of the Mining Districts requiring him to take the necessary steps to convene a special meeting of the members of the Mining Board, of which he is chairman, on the first Wednesday in the month of December next following such notice, for the purpose of electing one of the members of the said Board to represent such Board as the member appointed by the Mining Board of the district upon the Local Prospecting Board of the district. The chairman of the said Mining Board shall take the necessary steps accordingly, and shall within three days after the day of election forward to the Secretary for Mines the result of such election. In the event of there being at any such election an equality of votes for two or more persons as such representative, the chairman shall have a casting vote in addition to his vote as a member.

(c) *Election of representative of "owners."*—The Secretary for Mines shall, ten days at least before the day of election, publish in the *Government Gazette* and in such newspapers circulating in the district as he may consider necessary, a notice to the members of the Mine Owners' Association, if any, having its head office in the district; and, if there be no such Mine Owners' Association in such district, then to the mining managers of the registered companies owning mines in such district, calling upon the members of such Mine Owners' Association, or upon such mining managers, as the case may be, to meet upon the day of election at such place and hour within the mining district as the Secretary for Mines shall in such notice appoint, to elect a person to represent the "owners" upon the Prospecting Board of the mining district. The meeting of which notice shall have been so given shall be presided over by a police magistrate (selected by the Governor in Council) in the same manner, or as near thereto as may be, as at meetings of justices, the police magistrate to have a casting vote in the case of an equality of votes of the electors present for any two or more persons proposed as representatives, and in the event of any question or dispute arising as to whether any person attending at such meeting is or is not entitled to vote, or in any manner interfere or take part in such meeting, or in any other matter affecting such election, the police magistrate presiding at such meeting shall decide such question or dispute, and shall allow or refuse permission to such person to vote, and the decision of the said police magistrate shall be final and conclusive, and he shall within three days after the day of election forward to the Secretary for Mines the result of such election.

(d) *Election of representative of Miners' Association.*—The Secretary for Mines shall, ten days at least before the day of election, publish in the *Government Gazette*, and in such newspapers circulating in the district as he may consider necessary, a notice to the secretary of each of the branches of the Amalgamated Miners' Association within each of the mining districts, calling upon the members of such branch of the Association to appoint a representative of such branch to attend upon the day of election at such place and hour within the mining district as the Secretary for Mines shall in such notice appoint, to elect a person to represent the various branches of the Amalgamated Miners' Association within such district upon the Local Prospecting Board of the mining district, and each of such branches of the Amalgamated Miners' Association within each of such districts shall appoint a representative accordingly. The meeting of the representatives so appointed, of which meeting notice shall have been so given, shall be presided over by a police magistrate (selected by the Governor in Council) in the same manner, or as near thereto as may be, as at meetings of justices, and the police magistrate shall have the casting vote in the case of an equality of votes of the representatives of

such branches of the Association present for any two or more persons proposed as representatives on the Board, and in the event of any question or dispute arising as to whether any person attending at such meeting is or is not entitled to vote or in any manner to interfere or take part in such meeting or in any other matter affecting such election, the police magistrate presiding at such meeting shall decide such question or dispute, and allow or refuse permission to such person to vote, and the decision of the said police magistrate shall be final and conclusive, and he shall within three days after the day of election forward to the Secretary for Mines the result of such election.

(e) *Election of representative of municipalities.*—The Secretary for Mines shall, ten days at least before the day of election, publish in the *Government Gazette*, and in such newspapers circulating in the district as he may consider necessary, a notice to each city, borough, and shire council (outside a radius of ten miles from the General Post Office, Melbourne) within each of the mining districts, calling upon each of such councils to appoint a representative of such council to attend upon the day of election at such place and hour within the mining district as the Secretary for Mines shall in such notice appoint to elect a person to represent the city, borough, and shire councils within such mining district upon the Local Prospecting Board of the mining district, and each of the said councils shall appoint a representative accordingly; and in the event of any city, borough, or shire being partly within one mining district and partly in another mining district, then the council of such city, borough, or shire shall appoint a representative of the council at the election of the Local Prospecting Board of that mining district only in which the greater extent of the municipal territory of such city, borough, or shire shall be situated. Such mining district shall be indicated in the said notice of the place and hour of election by the Secretary for Mines to the council of such city, borough, or shire. The meeting of the representatives so appointed, of which meeting notice shall have been so given, shall be presided over by a police magistrate (selected by the Governor in Council) in the same manner, or as near thereto as may be, as at meetings of justices, and the police magistrate shall have the casting vote in the case of an equality of votes of the representatives of the councils present for two or more persons as representatives on the Board, and in the event of any question or dispute arising as to whether any person attending at such meeting is or is not entitled to vote or in any manner to interfere or take part in such meeting or in any matter relating to such meeting, the police magistrate presiding at such meeting shall decide such question or dispute, and allow or refuse permission to such person to vote, and the decision of the said police magistrate shall be final and conclusive, and he shall within three days after the day of election forward to the Secretary for Mines the result of such election.

And the Honorable Duncan Gillies, Her Majesty's Minister of Mines for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

FORCES.

WHEREAS by *The Discipline Act 1870* it is provided that the Governor in Council may make rules and regulations for the employment, removal, or dismissal, and for the better government of persons engaged by virtue of the said Act, and for enforcing good order and discipline among them, and otherwise for carrying out the said Act, and from time to time amend, alter, or amend the same, and substitute others in lieu thereof: And whereas the Governor in Council has from time to time, in pursuance of the said provision, made certain rules and regulations for the said purposes: And whereas it is expedient to amend the same and to make further regulations:

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby order the following additions to the Regulations for the Victorian Naval Forces made on the eighth day of October 1888, that is to say:—

At the end of paragraph 4 of section II. of the regulations for the Permanent Naval Forces add—

But the Governor in Council may nevertheless, on the recommendation of the Commandant, require any officer who would otherwise so retire, notwithstanding his age, to continue to perform his duty.

At the end of paragraph 5 of the same section, and after paragraph 12, section VIII., of the regulations for the Naval Brigade, add—

A step of honorary rank, with permission to wear uniform, will be given to Lieutenants or Lieutenant-Commanders on retirement, provided they have eight years' service not under the rank of lieutenant.

And the Honorable Sir James Lorimer, Her Majesty's Minister of Defence for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

(a) Increase or diminish the extent of the Waterworks District of such Waterworks Trust; and

(b) Repeal any of the provisions of any previous Order in Council relating to such Waterworks Trust.

And whereas by an Order in Council bearing date the 14th day of August 1882, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 18th day of August 1882 (page 1994), a Waterworks Trust known and incorporated as "The Kyneton Shire Waterworks Trust" was duly constituted; and the boundaries of the lands comprising the Trust District were, in and by clause 4 and parts 1, 2, and 3 of the said Order in Council, described and limited.

NAGAMBIE WATERWORKS TRUST.

THE Commissioners of the Nagambie Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an urban district for the purposes of *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the power and authorities conferred by *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, section 119, make the following Regulation:—

Regulation making a Rate.

1. A rate of Two shillings in the £1 sterling shall be imposed and levied on all the rateable property in the Waterworks district of the Nagambie Waterworks Trust liable in respect of rates levied by the said Trust, according to the valuation for the time being of such rateable property for the municipal rate of the municipal district in which such rateable property is situated for one year, commencing on the first day of January One thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, and ending on the thirty-first day of December One thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight. Such persons as the Commissioners of the Nagambie Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rate.

Printed forms of tender and conditions of contract may be obtained from the Secretary, Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge at any station, by whom also information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per cental of 100 lbs. (net weight), including delivery at the stations; and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations, notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

Tenders, which should be upon the printed form, will be received for either oats, bran, hay, or straw (the particular kind of hay or straw offered to be stated); but if all be included in one tender it may be accepted for one article only, if advisable. Oaten hay will be preferred. If sheep hay be tendered for, it must be so stated in the tender.

Telegrams or tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for one-third of the estimated amount of the contract within ten days after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts amounting to £150 and upwards, and one surety for contracts under £150.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Forage," and deposited in the Tender Box, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known by *Gazette* notice, and by letter to accepted tenderers.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed, except when otherwise specified in the contract; the straw to be wheat or oat, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats (Victorian grown) and bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from oat hay of the best quality; the maize to be of the best quality. The hay tenders must specify whether they are for oaten or wheaten hay.

2. The supplies are for police, telegraph, and other horses, and are to be delivered on the order of the officer in charge of the district or station. The quantities stated in the schedule being only approximate, it must be understood that the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned; and should new telegraph stations be formed, or additional horses required to be stationed at any of the stations, the contractor will be required to supply the additional forage. Should the additional number of horses, however, exceed two, the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station under the contract according to the foregoing schedule.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Botanic and Domain Gardens may be called upon to supply any other Government Departments within a radius of six miles from Melbourne, and for which no contracts have been taken, at the same rates.

4. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by the particulars of quantity, showing the net weight, to be endorsed on the back of the order, which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station, for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him tendered in support of his account.

5. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and, on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the district, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.

6. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the forage at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the board is to be considered final.

8. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 6.

9. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue either to the public service or to the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 6.

10. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or of the delay in delivering or replacing it when required, or refusal to execute orders, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Treasurer of the colony for the time being may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

11. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.

12. It will be competent for the Secretary of the Tender Board, on behalf of the Government, or for the contractor on his own behalf, to terminate the contract, by giving, in writing, a notice of three full calendar months to that effect, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the 1st day of a month, and provided that no such notice can be given before the 30th September 1889, and in the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.

In case the said land, or any part or parts thereof, shall be sold, leased, licensed, alienated, dealt with, or resumed as aforesaid, the licensee shall not be entitled to any compensation other than the return of such portion of his license fee paid by him as the responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being administering Part XI. of *The Land Act 1884* may think fit. This license is also subject to the rights of the holders of miners' rights or of mining leases now issued or hereafter to be issued to enter upon the allotment hereby licensed, and to search for gold, and to mine therein, and to erect and occupy mining plant and machinery, without making any compensation for surface or other damage.

2a. Subject to these conditions, the licensee shall be entitled to use the land for the purposes for which the license has been granted, until notice has been given in the *Government Gazette* that such land, or any part thereof, has been sold, leased, licensed, alienated, dealt with, or resumed as aforesaid; and, immediately upon such notice being given, all the interest of the licensee in the licensed land described in such notice shall cease and be determined, and any person entitled to occupy the licensed land, or any part thereof, may lawfully make entry upon and hold the same, without the permission or sanction of the licensee, or any one claiming under him, or them.

3. No land comprised in roads from time to time surveyed and marked out within the boundaries of the land comprised in this license shall be deemed within its operation.

4. This license entitles the holder thereof, during the period for which it is granted, to use the land therein comprised for depasturing purposes only, but does not confer any right to build thereon, or to cultivate, or to fence any portion thereof.

5. If the licensee desire a renewal of this license, notice to that effect must be given to the responsible Minister aforesaid one month prior to the expiration thereof, but nothing herein contained shall be deemed to confer the right to any renewal.

6. The interest in this license may not be transferred without the consent of the Minister aforesaid and the payment of a fee of £1.

7. No claim whatever shall be made or entertained by reason of the license not being renewed or transferred.

8. This license is to be used under and in accordance with the regulations made or to be made under the provisions of the said Act and for the time being in force.

9. This license may be forfeited if the licensee commit a breach of or neglect to comply with any of these conditions.

10. The publication of a notice in the *Government Gazette* purporting to declare that the Governor or Administrator, with the advice aforesaid, has forfeited this license, shall be conclusive evidence that the license is forfeited.

Special Conditions:

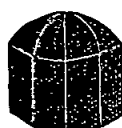

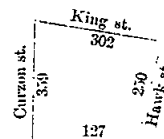
