**REGULATIONS UNDER "THE EDUCATION ACT
1872" AMENDED.**

WHEREAS by the 18th section of *The Education Act 1872* it was enacted that the Governor in Council might from time to time make and rescind regulations for all or any of the purposes therein mentioned: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order direct that section V. of the Regulations under *The Education Act 1872* be amended by the addition thereto of the following clauses that is to say:—

SCIENCE.

25. Certificates for each of the following subjects will be granted upon examination:—

- (a.) Botany.
- (b.) Chemistry.
- (c.) Dynamics and Heat.
- (d.) Electricity and Magnetism.
- (e.) Geology and Mineralogy.
- (f.) Metallurgy.
- (g.) Physiology.
- (h.) Sound and Light.

26. Examinations will be held annually, when all teachers who hold a certificate of competency, or have passed in all the literary subjects required for that certificate, may be permitted to attend.

**THE CENTENNIAL INTERNATIONAL EXHIBITION,
MELBOURNE, 1888.**

THE attached extract from the Rules and Regulations of the Melbourne Centennial Exhibition is published for general information, and for the guidance of the officers of Customs. Importers are also informed that a Customs officer has been placed in charge of the Exhibition arrangements, so far as relates to Customs matters, and will give all information required as to the course to be pursued in bonding goods, &c.

VI.—CUSTOMS.

64. *The Exhibition appointed a bonded warehouse.*—The Exhibition buildings and grounds are appointed a licensed bonding warehouse for the deposit of goods without the payment of duty, and all goods received therein shall be safely and securely kept until cleared thence as hereinafter provided.

65. *Goods to be entered on a bonding warrant.*—All goods imported for exhibition purposes shall be entered by a bonding warrant for the Exhibition bond, and the following declaration made:—

I, (importer, exhibitor, or agent), do hereby declare that I intend to exhibit the goods specified in this entry at the Centennial International Exhibition, to be held at Melbourne in the year 1888.

Witness my hand this day of 18 and the packages containing such goods shall be sent from the wharf on landing, by Customs-licensed carriers only, direct to the Exhibition buildings, where they must be unpacked in the presence of, and under the direction of, officers of Customs duly appointed for the purpose, who will compare goods with invoices and otherwise examine such goods by weighing or measuring as may be required.

66. *Invoices of goods.*—Invoices in duplicate of all goods entered for the Exhibition buildings must be produced to the officers of Customs before such goods are unpacked, and after the goods have been examined and checked therewith, one copy of each of such invoices shall be retained by the officers of Customs until such goods have been removed from the Exhibition buildings. Invoices must state what portion, if any, of the goods described therein is intended for sale. To facilitate examination, foreign invoices should, when practicable, be made out in the English language.

67. *Jewellery, &c., to be examined by Customs officers.*—Jewellery, watches, gold and silver plate, and such like articles must, immediately on arrival at the Exhibition buildings, be conveyed to a room specially provided for the safe custody of such articles, there to be unpacked and examined in the presence, and under the directions of the officers of Customs before being exhibited. And any such articles found exhibited without being first examined as herein provided will be liable to forfeiture, and the owners or exhibitors thereof to prosecution under the Customs Act.

68. *Jewellery, &c., for sale.*—Jewellery, watches, gold and silver plate, and such like articles not intended for sale, must be placed in a show case or other receptacle duly approved by the proper officer of Customs, to be secured by two locks, the key of one such lock to be retained by the exhibitor, and the key of the other to be retained by the officer of Customs, such locks and keys to be provided by the exhibitor and approved by the proper officer of Customs.

69. *Wines, spirits, tobaccos, &c.*—Wines, spirits, beer, tobacco, and cigars not required to be placed in show cases or on show stands, must be stored in a cellar specially set apart for the purpose, to be under the control of the proper officer or Customs.

70. *Clearance of goods.*—Immediately after the close of the Exhibition, exhibitors or their agents must clear all goods, either by export free or duty paid entry, or by transfer to another bonding warehouse, and complete such entries on or before the 31st March 1889. Any goods not cleared as aforesaid may be transferred by the Executive Commissioners to another bonding warehouse at the owner's or exhibitor's risk and expense.

WHEREAS by section 54 of *The Irrigation Act 1886* it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make Regulations providing for the payment to the Commissioners of Irrigation and Water Supply Trusts of such reasonable expenses as may be incurred by them in travelling to and from any Trust meeting: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the said provisions, doth, for the purpose aforesaid, make the Regulations following, that is to say:—

1. A sum not exceeding Fourpence per mile shall be allowed to each Commissioner in respect of every mile necessarily travelled by him in proceeding from his usual place of abode to attend any Trust meeting and in returning again from any Trust meeting to such place of abode.

2. Commissioners must, as far as practicable, avail themselves of ordinary public means of conveyance in travelling to and from Trust meetings, and in such cases they will be recouped the sums actually paid by them for fares, provided that the amount of such fares does not exceed a charge of Fourpence per mile each way.

3. The travelling expenses of Commissioners shall not be chargeable against the loan of any Trust, but shall be wholly paid from Trust revenue.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1874* (38 Vict. No. 506) it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and such land should thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the Shire of Traralgon has requested that the streets hereinafter mentioned, within the township of Morwell, be so declared public highways: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this notice declare the lands acquired or used for the streets hereinafter named and described, and situate in the township of Morwell, to be public highways within the meaning of the said Act, viz:—

The births of 1,077 children, viz., 548 boys and 529 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of December. In the month of November 1,219 births were registered, or 142 more than in the month under review. The births were 285 above the average of the month during the previous ten years, but only 86 above that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in December numbered 917, viz., 509 of males and 408 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 160, or 17 per cent. The deaths outnumbered those in November by 332, and exceeded the average of December during the previous ten years by 323. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have exceeded that average by 174.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was 2.90, and of deaths registered 2.47.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 94.5° on the 13th, and the lowest was 46.1° on the 5th. The mean temperature of the month (66.6°) was nearly four degrees above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (34.1°) took place on the 10th, viz., from a maximum of 90.3° to a minimum of 56.2°. The least range (3.9°) was on the 2nd, viz., from a maximum of 56.9° to a minimum of 53.0°. The mean daily range was 20.0°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.229 inches on the 4th, and the lowest was 29.399 inches on the 6th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.945 inches) was slightly above the average.

Rain fell on 13 days, the amount of rainfall being 5.13 inches. The average rainfall in December during the last ten years was 2.06 inches, or 3.07 inches below that in the month under notice.

Males contributed 56 per cent., and females 44 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 55 per cent. to that mortality, as against 50 per cent. in December 1886, 53 per cent. in December 1885, 46 per cent. in December 1884 and in December 1883, 48 per cent. in December 1882, 51 per cent. in December 1881, 42 per cent. in December 1880, 46 per cent. in December 1879, 48 per cent. in December 1878, and 50 per cent. in December 1877.

The deaths of 35 persons who had attained or exceeded the age of 75 years were recorded during the month, viz.:—Those of a gentleman, aged 75, and a plumber, aged 70, who died of "Bright's Disease"; a female, aged 75, and a gentleman, aged 83, of diarrhoea; a baker, aged 75, and a nurse, aged 78, who were found drowned; a quarryman, aged 78, who was suffocated; a male cook, aged 75, a needlewoman, aged 78, and a female, aged 85, who died of paralysis; a female, aged 75, of gastritis; a female, aged 75, and a gardener, aged 84, of pneumonia; a female, aged 76, a male, of occupation unknown, aged 80, and a female, aged 87, of heart disease; a female, aged 77, of peritonitis; a news-agent, aged 78, of cancer of the jaw and tongue; a female servant, aged 84, of syncope; a laundress, aged 80, of rheumatism; a female, aged 78, of valvular disease of the heart; a laborer, aged 79, and a clerk, aged 86, of apoplexy; a laborer, aged 86, of asthma; a female, aged 89, of bronchitis; a female, aged 75, a laborer, aged 77, a female and a gardener, each aged 80, a female, aged 82, a laborer, aged 83, a gentleman, aged 84, two females, each aged 87, and a needlewoman, aged 95, of old age.

Forty-four deaths were ascribed to external causes during the month, of which 36 were set down to accidents, 1 to homicide, and 7 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A boy, aged 13, was killed through being caught between the buffers of two trucks in a quarry; a carter, aged 19, died of rupture of the liver, a stone falling on him; a laborer, aged

48, of fracture of the spine, part of a wall falling on him; a cordial manufacturer, aged 25, of internal injuries, resulting from being thrown from a buggy; a traveller, aged 70, was killed—being thrown from a gig; a railway porter, aged 33, and a platelayer, aged 53, were passed over by railway trains; a nightman, aged 46, died of internal injuries, caused by a cart passing over his chest; a carter, aged 50, succumbed to injuries received through being crushed between two drays; a carpenter, aged 25, died of fracture of the skull, consequent on a fall from a building; a male, of occupation unknown, aged 37, of fracture of the skull, occasioned by a fall whilst drunk; a market gardener, aged 39, of fracture of the leg, the result of a fall from a cart, the wheel of which passed over his leg; a laborer, aged 40, of fracture of the spine, caused by a fall from a scaffold; and a female, aged 43, of fracture of the leg, caused by falling over a chair. A youth, aged 17, and a female, aged 26, died of tetanus, in the former case the result of a broken leg, and in the latter the result of an injury; 2 male children, aged 2 and 3 years respectively, of burns; a ship's carpenter, aged 40, was burnt to death in his room whilst intoxicated; and a ganger, aged 32, was killed by an explosion of gunpowder. A female infant, aged 9, months, and a laborer, aged 33, died of sunstroke. A girl, aged 5, 3 boys, each aged 8, and a boy, aged 9, were drowned whilst bathing; a draper's assistant, aged 34, was drowned in Hobson's Bay; an enameller, aged 37, was drowned in a bath; and a male, of occupation unknown, aged 40, a french polisher, and a male, of occupation unknown, each aged 45, a laborer, aged 56, a baker, aged 75, and a female, aged 78, were found drowned; and a quarryman, aged 75, was suffocated, consequent on vomited matter being drawn into the trachea. The homicidal death was that of a woolwasher, aged 48, who was thrown into the River Yarra and drowned by a fellow workman. A verdict of "manslaughter" was brought in. Of those who committed self-destruction, a bootmaker, aged 37, shot himself in the head; a wine merchant, aged 35, cut his throat; a clerk, aged 28, and a female, aged 36, poisoned themselves, the former with a narcotic and the latter with belladonna; a female servant, aged 17, and a barmaid, aged 26, drowned themselves; and a laborer, aged 50, hanged himself.

One hundred and thirty-two deaths, or 14 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—62 in the Melbourne Hospital, 15 in the Alfred Hospital, 2 in the Homoeopathic Hospital, 9 in the Children's Hospital, 5 in the Women's Hospital, 6 in the Immigrants' Home, 16 in the Benevolent Asylum, 3 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 6 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 3 in the Austin Hospital, 1 in the Melbourne Gaol, 1 in the Industrial Schools, and 3 in the Infant Asylum.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 505, of which 285, or 56 per cent., were of males, and 220, or 44 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 431 were under one year of age, 46 were between one and two, 14 were between two and three, 9 were between three and four, and 5 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 412. Of these, 224, or 54 per cent., were males, and 188, or 46 per cent., were females; 16 were between five and ten, 11 were between ten and fifteen, 12 were between fifteen and twenty, 23 were between twenty and twenty-five, 41 were between twenty-five and thirty, 28 were between thirty and thirty-five, 31 were between thirty-five and forty, 26 were between forty and forty-five, 33 were between forty-five and fifty, 35 were between fifty and fifty-five, 36 were between fifty-five and sixty, 41 were between sixty and sixty-five, 25 were between sixty-five and seventy, 19 were between seventy and seventy-five, 17 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 18 were upwards of eighty.

As compared with the previous month, deaths from specific febrile or zymotic diseases increased from 76 to 185, and those from local diseases from 262 to 379. Under the former head, deaths from measles rose from 6 to 15, and those from typhoid fever from 6 to 15. The chief increase was, however, in deaths from diarrheal diseases (which usually prevail in the hot weather), which rose from 52 to 142. Under the local head, deaths from affections of the brain and nerves rose from 82 to 110, those from complaints of the throat and lungs from 46 to 55, and those from diseases of the urinary system from 19 to 30. The mortality from diseases of the digestive organs was very high, and deaths under this head rose from 62 to 140. Four deaths of child-bearing women were registered during the month, as against a similar number in November. If these numbers be compared with the births registered during the same months, it will be found that one death of a mother took place to every 269 children born alive in the month under notice, as against 1 to every 304 of such children in the previous month.

DISPOSITION OF CHURCH LANDS ALLOWED.

A STATEMENT of Trusts having been submitted by the head or authorized representative of the denomination of the Church of England in the Diocese of Ballarat, in Victoria, under the provisions of the Act to provide for the Abolition of State Aid to Religion, for allowance by the Governor, the same was allowed by him on the twenty-third day of January 1888, and the following is the form in which such statement of trusts has been allowed—

Description of land.—All those pieces of land in the Colony of Victoria, containing two roads, twenty-one and four-tenths perches, county of Grant, parish of Clarendon, allotments 6 and 7 of section 5, township of Clarendon: Commencing at the west angle, bounded on the north-west by allotment 5, bearing N. 48° 58' east 3 chains 17 links; on the north-east by allotments 18 and 19, bearing S. 41' 2' east 2 chains; on the south-east by allotment 8, bearing S. 48' 58' west 3 chains 17 links; and on the south-west by High-street bearing N. 41' 2' west 2 chains to the point of commencement.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR A RACE-COURSE AND OTHER PURPOSES OF PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE TOWN OF PELLUEBLA.

WE, Thomas Blackwood, James Woods, Charles Edward Morris, Leyman Smith, John Brooks, Andrew O'Neill, and Edward Moloney, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for a Racecourse and other purposes of Public Recreation in the Town of Pelluebla, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 133 of *The Land Act 1884*.

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.
5. No person shall put into the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs.
6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority in writing of the committee of management.
7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth, or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained.
8. No person, except workmen and laborers employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 133 of *The Land Act 1884*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceed-

ing Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).

Printed forms of tender and conditions of contract may be obtained from the Secretary, Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge at any station, by whom also information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per cental of 100 lbs. (net weight), including delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations, notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed, except when otherwise directed by the police; the straw to be wheat or oaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats (Victorian grown) and bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from oaten hay of the best quality; the maize to be of the best quality. The hay tenders must specify whether they are for oaten or wheat hay.

2. The supplies are for police, telegraph, and other horses, and are to be delivered on the order of the officer in charge of the district or station. The quantities stated in the schedule being only approximate, it must be understood that the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned; and should new telegraph stations be formed, or additional horses required to be stationed at any of the stations, the contractor will be required to supply the additional forage. Should the additional number of horses, however, exceed two, the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station under the contract according to the foregoing schedule.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Botanic and Domain Gardens may be called upon to supply any other Government Departments within a radius of six miles from Melbourne, and for which no contracts have been taken, at the same rates.

4. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by the particulars of quantity, showing the net weight, to be endorsed on the back of the order, which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station, for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

5. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and, on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the district, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.

6. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.

8. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 6.

9. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue either to the public service or to the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 6.

10. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or of the delay in delivering or replacing it when required, or refusal to execute orders, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Treasurer of the colony for the time being may direct.
