PORT ADELAIDE, SEMAPHORE ANCHORAGE.—LEADING LIGHTS.

Referring to Notice No. 12 of 1888, as to the removal of the *Beatrice*, mariners are now hereby informed that, on and after the 1st of December 1888, two red lights will be exhibited ashore—one from the Time-ball Tower, and the other from the flagstaff at the shore end of Semaphore Jetty.

These lights in line, bearing S.E. $\frac{1}{4}$ S., lead through the deepest water in the Semaphore Anchorage, and up to the Ocean Steamers' Mooring Buoy.

DIRECTIONS.

By night.—Vessels approaching the anchorage should not bring the Port Adelaide light to the north of N.E. until the above lights are in line; then steer in on that line with the lead going until the requisite water is found, or the Mooring Buoy is picked up. When the red light, east of the Lighthouse, is just closing with the Bright Light on No. 11 Beacon, the vessel will be close to the Mooring Buoy.

The leading lights will not show south of the Bell Buoy on the Wonga Shoal, so that vessels of suitable draught, which do not intend to use the Mooring Buoy, may steer in for any part of the anchorage as soon as the two red lights are visible.

By day.—Keep the Lighthouse on the same bearing until the Time-ball Tower and the Water Tower are in line; then proceed as above.

Masters and pilots making vessels fast to the Mooring Buoy are requested to pay out from ten to fifteen fathoms cable to enable vessels to ride easier, and to prevent damage to the moorings.

Entrance to McArthur and Roper Rivers.

MARINERS are hereby informed that Fairway Buoys have been moored at the entrance to the McArthur and Roper Rivers, and the channels have been beaconed off.

McArthur River Entrance.—The Fairway Buoy is moored in 11 feet L.W.S. on the following bearings:—Centre of small island lying between South West Island and Centre Island (local name, Mangrove Island), N. 37° W.; S.E. point of Centre Island (local name, Red Nose Point), N. 59° E. After passing the buoy, steer for the outer black beacon (which bears from the buoy S. 50° W.), then steer between the black and red beacons for the entrance to the river. GRANT OF ONE HUNDRED AND FIFTY POUNDS (£150) FOR INVENTION OF MACHINERY FOR THRESHING PEASE.

REGULATIONS.

1. A sum not exceeding £150 may be paid to any person or company who shall, in the opinion of the Minister of Agriculture, produce a machine capable of threshing, within twelve hours, eight hundred bushels of pease without injury thereto.
2. The reward shall be paid only to the inventor, or his agent, of such machine as shall most cheaply, efficiently, and rapidly perform the work required, and within the time aforesaid.
3. Persons intending to compete for the award must give notice in writing of their intention to the Secretary for Agriculture, Government Offices, Melbourne, not later than 31st December 1888.
4. One or more trials of the machines shall be made at such place or places, and at such times, as the Minister may direct.
5. All costs and expenses of forwarding, attendance, and working the machines at the times to be appointed shall be paid by the persons entering the machines for competition.
6. The Minister may appoint three or more judges to report upon the merits of the competing machines, and the decision of a majority of such judges shall be final.
7. The judges may recommend payment of an amount or amounts, the total of which shall not exceed £150, to the inventor or inventors, or his or their agent or agents, of the successful machine or machines, such amounts to be apportioned to the value to the colony of the said invention or inventions.

NOTE.—During the third quarter of 1888 the excess of registered births over registered deaths was 5,422, viz., 2,490 males and 2,932 females; and the excess of recorded arrivals over recorded and unrecorded departures (the latter being estimated) was 9,728, viz., 5,824 males and 3,904 females. The total gain to the population was thus 15,150, viz., 8,314 males and 6,836 females, as shown in the table.

The total allowance for unrecorded departures since the census of 1881 was taken has been 39,850, viz., 31,804 males and 8,046 females. Had no such allowance been made, the apparent population at the end of September would have been 1,115,419, viz., 601,437 males and 510,982 females.

The increase of population during the third quarter of 1887 was 8,643, or 6,507 less than in the corresponding quarter of the present year (15,150). The increase during the first nine months of last year was 24,706, or 14,744 less than in the first nine months of the current year (39,450). It should, however, be pointed out that the larger increases during 1888 are partly due to the influx of persons connected with, and of visitors to, the Melbourne Centennial International Exhibition.

The total excess of recorded arrivals over recorded departures during the quarter under review was 10,774, the greatest gain to the population being from the United Kingdom (2,941), the next from New Zealand (2,853), then from Tasmania (2,818), New South Wales (922), South and Western Australia (787), and Foreign Ports (453). It should be mentioned that all the arrivals and departures referred to are by sea, and the population estimate is based upon the assumption that the numbers entering and leaving the colony over its borders are equal.

WHEREAS by section 99 of *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, No. 946, it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time fix a sum which shall be the minimum amount of rates to be paid annually by any owner or occupier of property liable to be rated by any Waterworks Trust; Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the now in part recited Act, doth order and direct that the sum of ten shillings shall be the minimum amount of rates to be paid annually by every owner or occupier of any house or tenement liable to be rated by the Benalla Waterworks Trust where the valuation in respect of such house or tenement shall not exceed the sum of Ten pounds sterling per annum.

And the Honorable Alfred Deakin, Her Majesty's Minister of Water Supply for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by *The Irrigation Act 1886* it is provided that any Municipal Council, or Waterworks Trust, or Irrigation Trust, or any two or more together of such Councils or Trusts, or the majority in number of the ratepayers in any proposed district, or the majority in number of the owners of land within any proposed district, such majority being the owners of at least half the land of the proposed district, may petition the Governor in Council to constitute such district an Irrigation and Water Supply District, and to appoint and create a Trust therein. And it is further provided by the said Act that, before any district or Trust can be constituted or appointed under the said Act upon a petition from any Municipal Council or Waterworks Trust, or from any two or more together of any such Councils or Trusts, or from a majority in number of the ratepayers in any proposed district, or upon a petition from the majority of the owners of land within any proposed district, that a petition from owners of land, being an absolute majority of the owners of land within the proposed district, such majority being owners of at least half the land in such proposed district, shall be presented to the Governor in Council, praying that the scheme or plan of works of such first petition, as set forth in the declaration of the Minister, published under the said Act, may be adopted in part or whole. And it is further enacted, after compliance with the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council may approve of the scheme proposed, either with or without any alterations, or additions, or restrictions, as he may think fit, or he may disapprove of the same; and, if he approve of the same, either with or without alterations, he shall make an Order in Council accordingly.

And whereas the majority in number of the owners of certain lands situate within the parishes of Meering, Meran, and Dartbrook, in the county of Tatchera, in the colony of Victoria, and within the boundaries of a proposed district (shown upon the plan accompanying their petition) being the owners of at least half the land within such proposed district have, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, petitioned the Governor in Council to constitute the proposed district, as shown upon the plan accompanying their petition, an Irrigation and Water Supply District, and to appoint and create a Trust therein for carrying out the scheme or plan of works proposed in the said petition.

And whereas all the provisions of the Act necessary to precede the declaration, in writing, of the Minister of Water Supply, upon the said petition having been complied with, the said Minister duly published his declarations in the *Government Gazette* on the thirtieth day of April 1888, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act.

And whereas after due observance of the steps necessary under the said Act to precede such a petition, on this tenth day of December 1888 a petition of an absolute majority of the owners of the land in the district so proposed to be constituted, such majority being owners of at least half the land in such proposed district, hath been presented to the Governor in Council, praying that the scheme or plan of works of such first-named petition as set out in the said declaration, in writing, of the Minister might be adopted.

And whereas the Governor in Council, having taken all the circumstances into consideration, and having ascertained and being satisfied that there has been a compliance with all the provisions

of the said Act necessary to be observed before the approval of the scheme of the petition for the constitution of the proposed district as an Irrigation and Water Supply Trust District, and for the appointment and creation of a Trust therein, has determined to approve of the scheme proposed by such petition.

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in accordance with the provisions of and in the exercise of the powers conferred by *The Irrigation Act 1886* aforesaid, doth hereby approve of the scheme of the said recited petition for the constitution of the proposed district as an Irrigation and Water Supply District, and for the appointment and creation of a Trust therein, as such scheme is set out in the schedule hereto, in which also are set out the boundaries and area of the proposed district.

SCHEDULE.

Scheme and plan of proposed works, as approved by this Order.

A supply channel to Kow Swamp, with headworks; regulating works at the outlet of Kow Swamp storage basin, a weir on the Pyramid Creek, a channel thence to the River Loddon, and the improvement of the Box and Pyramid Creeks, together with minor collateral works, a weir on the Loddon at McKay's, conveyance and distributory channels and minor works.

WHEREAS by *The Irrigation Act 1886* it is provided that any Municipal Council, or Waterworks Trust, or Irrigation Trust, or any two or more together of such Councils or Trusts, or the majority in number of the ratepayers in any proposed district, or the majority in number of the owners of land within any proposed district, such majority being the owners of at least half the land in the proposed district, may petition the Governor in Council to constitute such district an Irrigation and Water Supply District, and to appoint and create a Trust therein. And it is further provided by the said Act that, before any district or Trust can be constituted or appointed under the said Act upon a petition from any Municipal Council or Waterworks Trust, or from any two or more together of such Councils or Trusts, or from a majority in number of ratepayers in any proposed dis-

trict, or upon a petition from a majority of the owners of land within any proposed district, that a petition from owners of land, being an absolute majority of the owners of land within the proposed district, such majority being the owners of at least half the land in such proposed district, shall be presented to the Governor in Council praying that the scheme or plan of works of such first petition as set out in the declaration of the Minister, published under the said Act, may be adopted in part or in whole. And it is further enacted that after compliance with the provisions in the said Act, the Governor in Council may approve of the scheme proposed, either with or without any alterations, additions, or restrictions, as he may think fit, or he may disapprove of the same; and if he approve of the same, either with or without alterations, he shall make an Order in Council accordingly. And it is further enacted that, if the Governor in Council approve of such proposed scheme, with or without alterations, or additions, or restrictions, he may, by Order in Council, constitute the proposed district an Irrigation and Water Supply District, and appoint and create an Irrigation and Water Supply Trust to construct, maintain, and continue the works described in the Order.

And whereas the majority in number of the owners of certain land in the parishes of Meering, Meran, and Dartgook, in the county of Tatchera, and within the boundaries of a proposed district (shown upon the plan accompanying their petition), being the owners of at least half the land within such proposed district, have, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, petitioned the Governor in Council to constitute the proposed district, as shown upon the plan accompanying their petition, an Irrigation and Water Supply District, and to appoint and create a Trust therein for carrying out the scheme or plan of works proposed in the said petition: And whereas all the provisions of the Act necessary to precede the declaration in writing of the Minister upon the said petition having been complied with, the Minister duly published his declaration in the *Government Gazette* on the thirteenth day of April 1888, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act: And whereas after due observance of the steps necessary under the said Act to precede such a petition, and on this tenth day of December 1888, a petition of an absolute majority of the owners of land in the district proposed to be constituted, such majority being the owners of at least half the land in such proposed district, hath been presented to the Governor in Council, praying that the scheme or plan of works of such first-named petition, as set out in the said declaration in writing of the Minister might be adopted. And whereas after compliance with all the provisions under the said Act necessary to be observed before approval of the scheme proposed, the Governor in Council has, by an Order in Council dated this tenth day of December 1888, approved of the said proposed scheme: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in accordance with the provisions of and in exercise of the powers conferred by *The Irrigation Act 1886* aforesaid, doth declare, order, and direct:—

1. That the said proposed district shall be and the same is hereby constituted as, from the date of this Order, an "Irrigation and Water Supply District" under the said *Irrigation Act 1886*; and an Irrigation and Water Supply Trust is hereby appointed and created to construct, maintain, and continue the works in this Order described, in accordance with the provisions of this Order and of the said Act.

2. That the limits and boundaries of the district within which such Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall have authority, and which district shall henceforth be an Irrigation and Water Supply District, shall be those contained within the limits and boundaries of the area of the said Irrigation and Water Supply District hereby constituted as such limits and boundaries are set out in the First Schedule hereto.

3. That the name of the said Irrigation and Water Supply District shall be the "Marquis Hill Irrigation and Water Supply District" and the corporate name of the said Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall be the "Marquis Hill Irrigation and Water Supply Trust."

4. That the scheme of the said Marquis Hill Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall be the construction of a supply channel to Kow Swamp, with head works, regulating works at the outlet of Kow Swamp storage basin, a weir on the Pyramid Creek, a channel thence to the River Loddon, and the improvement of the Box and Pyramid Creeks, together with minor collateral works, a weir on the Loddon at McRavey's, channels for the conveyance and distribution of the water in the Trust district, and all minor works connected therewith. The Kow Swamp storage, with supply channel thereto, and channels of conveyance therefrom, and collateral works shall be National works; McRavey's weir, and portion of the supply channel therefrom, shall be joint works; all the other works shall be Trust works. And the works to be constructed and maintained are those set out in the Second Schedule hereto.

5. That the source from which the Trust is to obtain its supply shall be the Murray River, *via* Kow Siding, and Macorna Channel, and the rate at which the Trust shall pay for water supplied from National works shall be a proportion of the total charges for interest, maintenance, and management of such works, equivalent to the proportion of the water from such works delivered to the Trust; and, as far as can be at present ascertained, about £603 per annum for a supply of six hundred and thirty-two cubic feet per minute from 1st November to 30th April, and two hundred and ninety-seven cubic feet per minute from 1st July to 31st October in each year. The proportion of water to be delivered to the Trust from the Kow Swamp National works to be about two-fifteenths of the whole supply available from the storage.

6. That the total amount of money proposed to be expended by the said Marquis Hill Irrigation and Water Supply Trust on Trust works and joint works is Twelve thousand nine hundred pounds sterling (£12,900).

7. That the amount of money proposed to be advanced by the Board of Land and Works to the said Marquis Hill Irrigation and Water Supply Trust by way of loan is Twelve thousand nine hundred pounds sterling (£12,900); that the rate of interest to be paid upon such loan is Four pounds ten shillings per centum per annum, being one-half per cent. higher than the rate paid by the Government upon the public loan out of which such moneys are to be advanced, the rate of such interest to be subject to reduction in accordance with section one hundred and forty-six of the said Act, in event of interest paid by the Government upon such public loan being reduced.

8. That the number of persons to be elected as Commissioners of the said Marquis Hill Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall be six, and the period for which such Commissioners shall hold office shall be three years.

9. That the amount of moneys which may be borrowed by the said Marquis Hill Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall not at any time, together with any balance due from the Trust to the Board of Land and Works, or upon any Trust loan, exceed the sum of Twelve thousand nine hundred pounds sterling (£12,900); and no rate made by the said Marquis Hill Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall exceed the sum of Five shillings in the £ upon the annual value of the property rated within the Trust district.

10. That the maximum amount which may be paid out of a loan raised by the said Marquis Hill Irrigation and Water Supply Trust in defraying the preliminary costs and expenses of application for this Order shall be Fifty pounds (£50).

Whereas the Governor in Council has, by an order made the thirteenth day of April 1886, under the provisions of section 93 of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1883*, divided the Wimmera United Waterworks District into divisions, and directed that the necessary rates for paying interest on all moneys borrowed by the Wimmera United Waterworks Trust for the construction and maintenance of their waterworks, or to meet any other expenses in connexion therewith, shall be levied in the following only of such divisions, viz.:—The Shire of St. Arnaud division, the Shire of Kara Kara division, the Shire of Dunmunkle division, the shire of Stawell division, the shire of Wimmera division, and the shire of Dimboola A division; and has further directed that such rates be levied differentially as between such said several divisions, and that the proportion in which such several divisions shall be rated respectively one to another shall be as follows, that is to say, that the respective ratings in the pound sterling on the annual value of rateable property rated for municipal purposes in the said several divisions shall be—Shire of St. Arnaud division, seven pence; Shire of Kara Kara division, fifteen pence; Shire of Dunmunkle division, fourteen pence; Shire of Stawell division, nine pence; Shire of Wimmera division, thirteen pence; Shire of Dimboola A division, twenty-four pence.

And whereas the Governor of the colony of Victoria, by proclamation dated 25th June 1886, proclaimed certain areas in and around the townships of Murtoa and Warracknabeal to be respectively Urban Districts under the provisions of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1883*, No. 778.

And whereas by further proclamation, dated the 29th December 1887, the Governor of the colony of Victoria proclaimed certain areas in and around the townships of Donald and Dimboola to be respectively Urban Districts, under the provisions of *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, No. 946.

And whereas the Governor in Council by an Order dated the 13th day of December 1886, diminished the extent of the said Wimmera United Waterworks District by excising therefrom the territory described above as the Shire of Wimmera division.

The following rate is made on the annual value of all the rateable property in the said several divisions of the Wimmera United Waterworks District, excepting in the said parishes of Hindmarsh, Joop, Jeparit, Batyik, Tarranyurk, Willenabrana, Yellangip, Katyil, and Dimboola, and in the said Urban Districts of Murtoa, Warracknabeal, Donald, and Dimboola, according to the valuation for the time being on all such lands and tenements for the municipal rates of the Shires of St. Arnaud, Kara Kara, Dunmunkle, Stawell, and Dimboola respectively—that is to say, on rateable property within the Shire of St. Arnaud division, a rate of seven pence in the pound sterling of such valuation on rateable property; in the Shire of Kara Kara division, a rate of fifteen pence in the pound sterling of such valuation; in the shire of Dunmunkle division, a rate of fourteen pence in the pound sterling of such valuation; in the Shire of Stawell division, a rate of nine pence in the pound sterling of such valuation; and in the Shire of Dimboola A division, a rate of twenty-four pence in the pound sterling of such valuation.

NO. 21.—URBAN DISTRICT OF DONALD.

The following are the rates which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied for domestic purposes by the Wimmera United Waterworks Trust within the urban district of Donald—that is to say, in regard to houses or tenements fronting any streets in which pipes for water supply are laid, or which houses or tenements if not on such streets are supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes:—

(1.) For every house or tenement of Ten pounds annual value or under, the sum of One pound per annum.

(2.) For every house or tenement above the annual value of Ten pounds per annum, the sum of Ten pounds per centum per annum on the annual value of such property.

(3.) For all tenements in the said urban district situate otherwise than on streets in which the pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the before-mentioned rates; and where such tenements are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe, and within half a mile thereof, one-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.

(4.) Such before-mentioned rates shall be based upon the municipal valuation.

(5.) Such rate is hereby made for the year 1889, commencing on the 1st of January 1889, and terminating on the 31st of December 1889, and shall be payable—the one moiety on the 1st of January and the other moiety on the 1st of July of such year.

NO. 22.—URBAN DISTRICT OF DIMBOOLA.

The following are the rates which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied for domestic purposes by the Wimmera United Waterworks Trust within the urban district of Dimboola—that is to say, in regard to houses or tenements fronting any streets in which pipes for water supply are laid, or which houses or tenements if not on such streets are supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes:—

(1.) For every house or tenement of Ten pounds annual value or under, the sum of One pound per annum.

(2.) For every house or tenement above the annual value of Ten pounds per annum, the sum of Ten pounds per centum per annum on the annual value of such property.

(3.) Printed forms of tender and conditions of contract may be obtained from the Secretary, Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge at any station, by whom also information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

As much forage as can be stored at any station, where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per cental of 100 lbs. (net weight), including delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations, notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

Tenders, which should be upon the printed form, will be received for either oats, bran, hay, or straw (the particular kind of hay or straw offered to be stated); but if all be included in one tender it may be accepted for one article only, if advisable. Oaten hay will be preferred. If sheaf hay be tendered for, it must be so stated in the tender.

Telegrams or tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for one-third of the estimated amount of the contract within ten days after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts amounting to £150 and upwards, and one surety for contracts under £150.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Forage," and deposited in the Tender-Box, Pay Office Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known by *Gazette* notice, and by letter to accepted tenderers.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed, except when otherwise specified in the contract; the straw to be wheaten or oat, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats (Victorian grown) and bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from oaten hay of the best quality; the maize to be of the best quality. The hay tenders must specify whether they are for oaten or wheaten hay.

2. The supplies are for police, telegraph, and other horses, and are to be delivered on the order of the officer in charge of the district or station. The quantities stated in the schedule being only approximate, it must be understood that the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned; and should new telegraph stations be formed, or additional horses required to be stationed at any of the stations, the contractor will be required to supply the additional forage. Should the additional number of horses, however, exceed two, the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station under the contract according to the foregoing schedule.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Botanic and Domain Gardens may be called upon to supply any other Government Departments within a radius of six miles from Melbourne, and for which no contracts have been taken, at the same rates.

4. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by the particulars of quantity, showing the net weight, to be endorsed on the back of the order, which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station, for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

5. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and, on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the district, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.

6. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.

8. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 6.

9. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue either to the public service or to the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 6.

10. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or of the delay in delivering or replacing it when required, or refusal to execute orders, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Treasurer of the colony for the time being may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

11. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.

12. It will be competent for the Secretary of the Tender Board, on behalf of the Government, or for the contractor on his own behalf, to terminate the contract, by giving, in writing, a notice of three full calendar months to that effect, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the 1st day of a month, and provided that no such notice can be given before the 30th September 1889, and in the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.

TENDERS FOR GRAZING LANDS.

Tenders must be sent in on proper form, which can be obtained on application to the Lands Department, Melbourne, or any of the Survey Offices in the country

Tenders must be placed in the Crown Lands Office Tender-box not later than Twelve noon on Friday, 28th December 1888.

NOTE.—The fee for the period from 1st January 1889 to 31st December 1889, and fee of Five shillings for license, must accompany each tender.

TENDERS will be received by the Board of Land and Works, up to Noon of Friday, 28th December 1888, for the occupation for Grazing purposes only of the following unappropriated portions of land, subject to the Regulations approved by the Governor in Council and also the subjoined special conditions.

Every license granted under section 119 of *The Land Act 1884* shall be subject to the conditions set forth in the schedule hereto, and to such special conditions and payment in advance of such fee as the Minister may determine, and shall be issued by an officer of the Department of Lands and Survey duly authorized in that behalf.

Under sections 3 and 4 of *The Rabbit Suppression Act Amendment Act 1884*, all licensees under the section for which these licenses will issue are liable for the destruction of rabbits within the boundaries of their licenses.

Conditions:

1. The issue of this license shall not prevent the land comprised therein, or any part or parts thereof, being sold, leased, licensed, alienated, or dealt with under any of the provisions of *The Land Act 1884*, except under the 119th section thereof, under which the license is issued, or being resumed by order of the Governor or Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, for any of the purposes for which land may be reserved under section 10 of *The Land Act 1884*, or for mining purposes.
2. In case the said land, or any part or parts thereof, shall be sold, leased, licensed, alienated, dealt with, or resumed as aforesaid, the licensee shall not be entitled to any compensation other than the return of such portion of his license fee paid by him as the responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being administering Part XI. of *The Land Act 1884* may think fit. This license is also subject to the rights of the holders of miners' rights or of mining leases now issued or hereafter to be issued to enter upon the allotment hereby licensed, and to search for gold, and to mine therein, and to erect and occupy mining plant and machinery, without making any compensation for surface or other damage.
- 2a. Subject to these conditions, the licensee shall be entitled to use the land for the purposes for which the license has been granted, until notice has been given in the *Government Gazette* that such land, or any part thereof, has been sold, leased, licensed, alienated, dealt with, or resumed as aforesaid; and, immediately upon such notice being given, all the interest of the licensee in the licensed land described in such notice shall cease and be determined, and any person entitled to occupy the licensed land, or any part thereof, may lawfully make entry upon and hold the same, without the permission or sanction of the licensee, or any one claiming under her, him, or them.
3. No land comprised in roads from time to time surveyed and marked out within the boundaries of the land comprised in this license shall be deemed within its operation.
4. This license entitles the holder thereof, during the period for which it is granted, to use the land therein comprised for depasturing purposes only, but does not confer any right to build thereon, or to cultivate, or to fence any portion thereof.
5. If the licensee desire a renewal of this license, notice to that effect must be given to the responsible Minister aforesaid one month prior to the expiration thereof, but nothing herein contained shall be deemed to confer the right to any renewal.
6. The interest in this license may not be transferred without the consent of the Minister aforesaid and the payment of a fee of £1.
7. No claim whatever shall be made or entertained by reason of the license not being renewed or transferred.
8. This license is to be used under and in accordance with the regulations made or to be made under the provisions of the said Act and for the time being in force.
9. This license may be forfeited if the licensee commit a breach of or neglect to comply with any of these conditions.
10. The publication of a notice in the *Government Gazette* purporting to declare that the Governor or Administrator, with the advice aforesaid, has forfeited this license, shall be conclusive evidence that the license is forfeited.

Special Conditions:

1. The period of occupation will be from 1st January 1889 to 31st December 1889.
 2. The license fee must be paid in advance. The fee for the period from 1st January 1889 to 31st December 1889—for which the license will be issued—must accompany the tender, or be paid by the successful tenderer or his agent immediately on the declaration of the acceptance of the tender, otherwise the offer of the next highest tenderer who may be prepared to comply with this condition may be accepted.

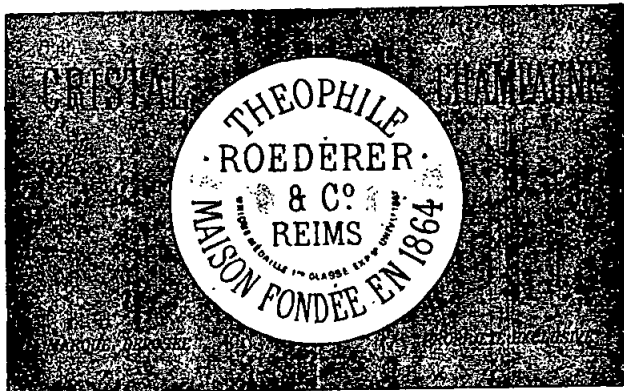

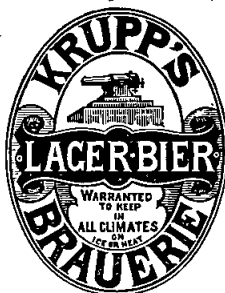
