SATURDAY THE 17TH DAY OF MARCH INSTANT to be observed as a Public and Bank Holiday at Ballarat, Casterton,\* Malmesbury,\* Merino,\* Nagambie, Sandford,\* and Sandhurst, within the Borough of Koroit and the Shires of Bet Bet, Grenville, Huntly, St. Arnaud, and the Eastern and Central Ridings of the Shire of Kowree; and as a Bank Holiday at Tatura and within the Shire of Bright;

MONDAY THE 19TH DAY OF MARCH INSTANT to be observed as a Public and Bank Holiday within the Shire of Kilmore;

WEDNESDAY THE 21ST DAY OF MARCH INSTANT to be observed as a Public and Bank Holiday at Heathcote\* and within the Borough of St. Arnaud;

THURSDAY THE 22ND AND FRIDAY THE 23RD DAYS OF MARCH INSTANT to be observed as Public and Bank Half-Holidays within the United Shire of Beechworth, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon;

FRIDAY THE 23RD DAY OF MARCH INSTANT to be observed as a Public and Bank Holiday within the Shire of Alexandria.

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by the *Foreign Deserters Act 1852* it is provided that whenever it is made to appear to Her Majesty that due facilities are or will be given for recovering and apprehending seamen who desert from British merchant ships in the territories of any foreign Power, Her Majesty may, by Order in Council stating that such facilities are or will be given, declare that seamen, not being slaves, who desert from merchant ships belonging to a subject of such Power when within Her Majesty's dominions, shall be liable to be apprehended and carried on board their respective ships, and may limit the operation of such Order, and may render the operation thereof subject to such conditions and qualifications, if any, as may be deemed expedient.

And whereas it hath been made to appear to Her Majesty that due facilities for recovering and apprehending seamen who desert from British merchant ships in the territories of the Republic of Paraguay will be given, under a Treaty between the Governments of Great Britain and Paraguay, signed at Assumption, on the 16th October 1884.

Now therefore Her Majesty, by virtue of the powers vested in Her by the said *Foreign Deserters Act 1852*, and by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to order and declare, and it is hereby ordered and declared, that, from and after the publication hereof in the *London Gazette*, seamen, not being slaves (and not being British subjects), who desert from merchant ships belonging to the Republic of Paraguay within Her Majesty's dominions, shall be liable to be apprehended and carried on board their respective ships; provided always, that if any such deserter has committed any crime in Her Majesty's dominions he may be detained until he has been tried by a competent Court, and until his sentence (if any) has been fully carried into effect.

And the Secretary of State for the Home Department, the Secretary of State for the Colonies, and the Secretary of State for India in Council are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

A PROCLAMATION.

Whereas by *The Coinage Act 1870* it is (amongst other things) enacted that it shall be lawful for us, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, from time to time by Proclamation to determine the design for any coin.

Now therefore we have, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, thought fit to determine and do order that certain coins called "Sixpences," made and to be made at the mint, and mentioned in the First schedule to the aforesaid Act, of the weight and fineness specified in that schedule, shall bear designs as follows:—

For the obverse impression our effigy with the inscription "Victoria Dei Gratia Britt: Regina F.D.," and for the reverse the words "Six Pence" placed in the centre of the piece, having an olive branch on one side and an oak branch on the other, surmounted by the Royal Crown, and the date of the year between and below the branches, and a graining upon the edge.

And whereas coins of the above description have been coined at our mint, and will be coined there in pursuance of orders which we have given for that purpose, we have, therefore, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, thought fit to issue this Our Royal Proclamation, and we do hereby ordain, declare, and command that the said coins so coined, and to be coined as aforesaid, shall be current and lawful money of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and that this Our Royal Proclamation shall come into operation forthwith on the date thereof.

Given at Our Court at Windsor this twenty-eighth day of November, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, and in the fifty-first year of our reign.

GRANT OF ONE HUNDRED AND FIFTY POUNDS  
(£150) AS PRIZES FOR THE BEST MANAGED  
FARMS IN VICTORIA.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations in connection with the above-named grant:—

REGULATIONS.

1. Two first prizes of Fifty pounds each will be awarded, one for the best farm in the Northern districts of the colony, and one for the best farm in the Southern districts. A second prize of Twenty-five pounds will be awarded for the second best farm in each of the above districts.
2. The work of selecting the most suitable farms for competition will be entrusted to the Agricultural Societies.
3. Notice of nomination must be forwarded to the Secretary for Agriculture, Melbourne, not later than the 3rd October 1888.
4. The notice must contain full particulars as to the name of the owner, and where the farm is situated.
5. The competition is to be restricted to freeholders in occupation and Crown tenants.
6. Upon receipt of information as to the farms selected for competition, the Minister of Agriculture may appoint three judges to decide the merits of such farms, and a decision of a majority of such judges shall be final.
7. The judges will be required to communicate to the Minister of Agriculture their decisions; also to report on the merits of the whole of the farms selected for competition.

## CHARGES ON GOODS ARE FIXED AS FOLLOWS:—

Goods in the Fourth Class, 25 per cent. added to the Tariff or Bye-law Rates.

2. All such Goods will be carried at the owner's risk unless the Consignor shall at the time of consigning give intimation in writing that he requires them carried at the risk of the Commissioners.

PROPOSED SEVERANCE OF AREA.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE PARISH OF WANURP, KNOWN AS THE PINE GROVE RECREATION RESERVE.

WE, Patrick McIntyre, George Greer, William Smith, Thomas Watson, and Samuel Sims, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the reserve for Public Recreation in the parish of Wanurp, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 133 of *The Land Act 1884*:—

## Regulations.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the reserve may be set apart for race meetings, &c., as hereinafter provided.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.
5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs, except as hereinafter provided.
6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority in writing of the committee of management.
7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent in writing of the committee of management first obtained.
8. No person, except laborers or workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
9. No person shall remove any earth from the reserve, or deposit manure or rubbish thereon.
10. The committee of management shall be at liberty to allow any part of the reserve to be depastured by quiet stock: Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
11. The following shall be the scale of fees which may be charged and taken for admission to the reserve and special enclosures therein on such days as the reserve may be set apart for race meetings, &c.:—  
For admission at the gates of every person on foot, such a sum as the committee of management may determine, not exceeding One shilling.  
For admission at the gates of every person on horseback, such a sum as the committee of management may determine, not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence.  
For admission of every vehicle, such a sum as the committee of management may determine, not exceeding Five shillings.  
For admission to the special enclosures in the reserve, such as saddling paddock (including grand stand), such a sum as the committee of management may determine, not exceeding Ten shillings.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 133 of *The Land Act 1884*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the

peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).

## RULES AND REGULATIONS.

1. All the charges must be paid to the sexton when orders are given, or before the ground is broken, or a vault re-opened.
2. On application for permission to make a vault or erect a monument in the cemetery being made to the trustees, a certificate of permission will be granted on payment of the fees set forth in the schedule.
3. Charges may be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such cemetery on the certificate of a minister of religion, or other evidence proving to the satisfaction of the trustees that such person was a pauper, and that the relatives of the deceased were unable to pay the usual fees.
4. Order for interment to be given to the sexton on the previous day, when a form of instruction must be filled up and given to the sexton.
5. The sexton shall dig all ordinary graves, unless otherwise specially ordered, on payment of the proper fee. Parties requiring brick graves or vaults will be required to construct them under the direction of the trustees or any two of them.
6. The time fixed for the funeral must be the time the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.
7. The usual hours for the performance of funerals shall be from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. from September to April inclusive, and from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. in the other four months.
8. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones must be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.
9. Plan of every monument or headstone must be submitted to the trustees for their approval.
10. All persons destroying the fences or in any manner injuring the cemetery will be prosecuted as the law directs.
11. Every coffin in a vault must be bricked in, or cemented, or covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron.
12. A plan of the ground and a register will be kept, which may be examined.
13. The ground will be open daily from sunrise to sunset.
14. The trustees reserve to themselves the right of making any alteration from time to time in these regulations and charges, subject to the approval of His Excellency the Governor in Council.
15. No interments shall be less than six feet in depth for adults and children over seven years of age, nor less than four feet in depth for children under seven years of age.

**Avoirdupois Weights.**

- Each half hundred weight, Fourpence.
- Each quarter hundred weight, Threepence.
- Each stone, Twopence.
- Each under one stone, One penny.

**Troy Weights.**

- Each hundred ounces, One shilling and sixpence.
- Each fifty ounces, One shilling.
- Each thirty, twenty, or sixteen ounces, Sixpence.
- Each under sixteen ounces, Threepence.

**Metal Measures.**

- Each five gallons, One shilling.
- Each four gallons, Ninepence.
- Each three gallons, Sixpence.
- Each two gallons, Fourpence.
- Each one gallon, Twopence.

**Wooden Measures.**

- Each bushel, One shilling and sixpence.
- Each half bushel, One shilling.
- Each under a half bushel, Sixpence.

**Scales and other Weighing Machines (except Weighbridges).**

- Each scale incapable of weighing half hundred weight, Sixpence.
- Each scale capable of weighing over half hundred weight, each hundred weight up to ten hundred weight, Threepence.

Each additional hundred weight over ten hundred weight, Sixpence.

If compared on the premises of the owner, for each hundred weight, One shilling.  
Gold scales, at appointed offices, One shilling and sixpence.  
Gold scales, at owner's premises, Two shillings.

*Weighbridges.*

For testing each weighbridge, Two pounds two shillings, and Two shillings per mile for carriage of weights from the nearest appointed office.

*Measures of Extension.*

Each yard, Twopenny.  
Each additional yard, being part of the same measure, One penny.

For examining weights and scales within twelve months of the time when the same were last tested in this Union, one half only of the above fees shall be charged.

The Inspector shall make one circuit annually throughout the Union, with the authorised copies of the standard weights and measures, for the purpose of making the said comparison therewith, keeping office on the days and at the places following, viz.:

West Charlton, first Monday in December.  
Glenloth, first Tuesday in December.  
Wycheproof, first Wednesday in December.  
Warrimberich, first Friday in December.  
Morton Plains, first Saturday in December.

Donald, second Saturday in December.
